"In exercise of the powers conferred by proviso to subsection (3) of section 36 of the Jammu and Kashmir Panchayati Raj Act, 1989, the Lieutenant Governor is pleased to appoint Braj Raj Sharma, IAS (Retd.) as State Election Commissioner for the Union territory of Jammu and Kashmir under the said Act," reads an order issued by the General Administration Department (GAD) on Friday.

The order issued by Sanjeev Verma, Commissioner Secretary, GAD further reads that Sharma shall hold the position of State Election Commissioner till he attains the age of sixty five years.

"The appointment of State Election Commissioner shall take effect from the date he assumes the charge," it reads

Killing Of 4 IAF Officers **Court Issues Production** Warrant Against Nanaji

Srinagar: A local court on Friday deferred the hearing in a case related to the killing of four IAF officers by militants in 1990 after one of the key accused, Mohammad Rafig Pahloo alias 'Nanaji', was arrested by the Srinagar police along with nine others for conspiring to revive separatist activities in Jammu and Kashmir.

The special TADA court Jammu has issued warrants for the presence of Nanaji on the next date of hearing which was set for August 19, CBI chief prosecutor Monika, Kohli said.

Besides Pahloo, others accused in the killing of IAF personnel include JKLF chief Yasin Malik, Ali Mohammed Mir, Manzoor Ahmed Sofi alias Mustafa, Javed Ahmed Mir alias 'Nalka', Showkat Ahmed Bakshi and Javed Ahmed Zargar.

As the proceedings of the much publicized case started Friday, the court was informed by both sides (prosecution and defence) that one of the accused, Nanaji, was arrested by the Srinagar police on Monday and is not available. He is presently in police remand.

"A prosecution witness was present in the court but could not record his statement due to non-availability of Nanaji, who is on bail and used to appear on every date. The court was informed that according to the information, he was among some people who were arrested in Srinagar," Kohli, who is also More on P10

HC Repair Order Brings Cheers To Houseboat Owners In Kashmir

Srinagar: The order of the Jammu and Kashmir High Court allowing repairs of houseboats has come as a relief to the owners of these floating dwellings in the city's water bodies, but many claim that the delay has pushed them into penury with no means to undertake the costly works.

Manzoor Ahmed Pakhtoon, president Houseboat Owners' Association, said the order was a welcome step.

"It was a prolonged pending issue due to which a large number of houseboats need to be repaired. Every houseboat now needs major



and minor repair work. We are very thankful to the High Court and to the Lieutenant Governor as after this judgement many people associated with houseboats got relief," Pakhtoon said.

He said after the lifting of the ban on repairs, the people associated with houseboats have regained interest in carrying out their businesses.

"Now we are hopeful that the

pending houseboats that are in the pipeline for repairs and renovation may get the order soon for refurbishing and we are hopeful that the existing ones will be maintained," he added.

In 1988, the then Farooq Abdullah-led government had banned the building of new houseboats and repair and renovation of the existing ones in Kashmir due to pollution concerns. Then, the government wanted to reduce the number of houseboat to save environment.

Pakhtoon said only 750 to 800 houseboats were left in four water bodies -- Dal Lake, Nigeen Lake, Chinar Bagh and Jhelum river -- in the city. He claimed that the number was around 2,000 in early 1990.

"We request for a comprehensive policy for houseboats as whatever is left there must be saved," he added.

A houseboat owner, Ghulam Qadir Gassi, said he is thankful for the order but rued that it has come a little late.

"We are very thankful to the government if the ban had been lifted earlier, I wouldn't have been suffering now. My house boat sank into the river Jhelum and I lost all my property and belongings. We are homeless now," Gassi said. More on P10

New App Can Help Identify Autistic Children In India: Study

A new app can identify children with autism and related neurodevelopmental disorders in India, a study conducted in Delhi has found. Autism -- also referred to as

autism spectrum disorder -- constitutes a diverse group of conditions related to development of the brain. Autism affects about 1 in 100

children globally, according to the World Health Organisation (WHO). The results, published on Friday

in the journal Autism, could open the door to help millions of children with autism spectrum conditions to get earlier screening quickly and inexpensively, leading to life-changing support.

Researchers from India, the UK and US tested the app, called START (Screening Tools for Autism Risk using Technology), with 131 two- to seven-year-olds living in low-re-

source neighbourhoods of Delhi. The tests were carried out at the homes of the children, by nonspecialist healthcare workers, edu-

cated to high school level. Through a series of simple games, questions, images and activities on a tablet computer -- such as popping bubbles and looking at patterns and images -- the app measured the social preference,

sensory interests and motor skills of the children.

The app was 86 per cent accurate in identifying children with any neurodevelopmental disorders, and 78 per cent accurate in specifically identifying autism, the researchers said. This performance is significant-

ly higher than standard screening assessments for neurodevelopmental disorders used by non-specialists, they said.

"Autism is diagnosed by highly trained professionals, but most autistic people live in parts of the world that harbour few or no such autism specialists, and with little autism awareness," said Professor

Bhismadev Chakrabarti, from the University of Reading, UK.

"So many autistic people go undiagnosed, misdiagnosed or misunderstood, so we designed the START app to identify autism and related conditions anywhere," said Chakrabarti, who led the study.

The team included researchers from the All India Institute of Medical Sciences, Indian Institute of Technology Bombay, Indian Institute of Public Health Bengaluru, Child Development Group Sangath, the universities of Cambridge, East Anglia, and Reading, UK, and Harvard University in the US.

Azad's Move Against Corruption Politicians Come Under SVO Scanner

RINAGAR- After getting the go ahead from the chief minister, the state vigilance organization (SVO) has formally initiated moves to gather details about the assets of Valley politicians. The SVO is planning to put its plan into action very soon.

During a departmental conference of the SVO, the chief minister. Ghulam Nabi Azad had indicated that the organisation could extend its reach to politicians, and later it got the formal nod.

The SVO is learnt to have begun compiling details of the incomes of the state's politicians, political functionaries and workers with a view to determine their movable and immovable property.

Sources said that the SVO would try to gather information about the property of these politicians before and after they assumed public office.

The SVO has formulated several teams and put them to work under cover. The teams will gather data about the incomes of politicians holding office in government departments and on the basis of this record the SVO will tighten the ring around wrongdoers.

Speaking on the condition of anonymity, a top officer of the SVO said that though the organization had intended to lay its hands on politicians as well, it was waiting for the green signal from the government.

"And that finally came from the chief minister," he said. According to reports, several politicians are feeling the ground slipping beneath their feet at the chief minister's decision, and have begun to transfer their property to other names. They have begun the process of shifting valuables and luxurious items to the homes of their relatives.

STOCKHOLM: Swedish police on Friday said they had granted a permit for a protest which would include burning holy texts outside the Israeli embassy in Stockholm, sparking condemnation from Israel and Jewish organizations.

The controversial protest, scheduled for Saturday, comes weeks after a man set fire to pages of the Qur'an outside Stockholm's main mosque leading to widespread outrage and condemnations around the world.

The demonstration would include a burning of the Torah and the Bible, was in response to the Qur'an burning protest and would be an expression in support of freedom of speech, according to the application to police.

In a comment to AFP, Stockholm police stressed that in line with Swedish legislation they granted permits for people to hold public gatherings and not for the activities conducted during them.

"The police does not issue permits to burn various religious texts – the police issues permits to hold a public gathering and express an opinion," said Carina Skagerlind, press officer for Stockholm police. "An important distinction,"

Delhi Races to Open Jammed Flood Gates as River Surge Halts City

NEW DELHI: New Delhi officials were racing to open some jammed flood gates at a barrage on the swollen river Yamuna on Friday to help drain out floodwater that has brought traffic to a standstill in parts of India's capital and swamped historical monuments.

The river's levels were at their highest in 45 years this week following unusually heavy rainfall in New Delhi and hilly northern states, forcing the evacuation of hundreds of people as the Yamuna, which runs through the city, breached

its banks. Army and disaster relief personnel were also trying to repair a broken drain regulator near the country's Supreme Court from where water was flowing on to a

key road, authorities said. "To prevent water from flowing into the city, we are trying to create a dam," said Saurabh Bharadwaj, Delhi's flood control and irrigation minister, adding that sacks would be stacked up to

achieve this. Television footage showed water engulfing the walls of the historic Red Fort earlier in the day, with trucks and buses abandoned in several places, leaving just their windshields and roofs showing above the water. Police reported at least three deaths due to drowning.

The roads around the Rajghat memorial to India's apostle of non-violence, Mahatma Gandhi, were inundated too, with some water flowing into the memorial area as well.

fall 91% above-normal this monsoon season that began June 1. It has received 309 mm (12 inches) of rainfall so far in July, which is the third highest for the month for at least 12 years, according to the India Meteorological Department.

Extreme Heat Can Cause Flight Delays. Here's Why

WASHINGTON: The summer travel season got a rocky start in late June when thunderstorms, coupled with airport staff shortages across the US, caused as many as 7,700 flight delays and 2,200 cancellations in a single day.

But a lightning strike isn't the most likely way travel plans get snarled. Passengers are learning the hard way this summer that high temperatures can be as disruptive to on-time departures as visibly inclement weather.

This week extreme heat has rippled across much of the US and Europe. Cities experiencing record-breaking temperatures have included Miami; Tampa; Portland, Oregon; San Antonio; and New Orleans. In Phoenix, July 12 marked the area's 12th consecutive day of temperatures reaching over 110 degrees. The heat wave is said to have affected a quarter of the American population. Federal Aviation Administra-

tion data show that for many airports summer weather is responsible for far more delays that winter weather-partially because it takes a less extreme weather event to send operations into a tailspin. Chicago O'Hare, for instance, had almost

twice as many weather delays from June to August 2022 as it did from January to March 2023. At New York's LaGuardia. there were 35% more weather delays in summer 2022 than the following winter.

Additional data from aviation analytics firm FlightAware shows that from January to March 2023 there were 402,881 flight delays in the US-representing 19.6% of all scheduled departures-whereas in the summer months of June to August 2022, there were 544,462 delays, or 23.3% of the country's flights.

Winter storms can cause more widespread havoc, however. Of a dozen events that caused mass disruptions to US flights in the last 12 or so years, 8 stemmed from winter storms; only 3 related to hurricanes. (The 12th was Covid-19.) Heat waves may not result in large-scale breakdowns in service but are instead a constantly humming engine of daily disruption in which season-long impacts can add up.

"When temperatures exceed 39 degrees centigrade [102F], it becomes really problematic for airlines," says Bijan Vasigh, professor of economics and finance at Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University in Daytona Beach, Florida.

Will Hand Over Government To Caretaker Set-Up In August: Pak PM

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has said that he will be handing over the government to a "caretaker set-up" in August, once the term of the assembly ends, Dawn reported on Thursday.

Sharif made a similar announcement yesterday as well, in which he declared that the term of his government would end on August 14.

However, Sharif did not make it clear whether the coalition partners would go for the normal dissolution of the National Assembly (NA) on completion of its term on August 12 or he would advise the president for an early dissolution.

The five-year term of the NA commenced under the then-PTI government on August 12, 2018 and will be completed under a PM-Shehbaz-led ruling coalition following the



ouster of former premier Imran Khan through a no-confidence vote in April last year.

At the outset of an address – broadcast on television - PM Sharif said he was given the "sacred responsibility" of running the country and "working for its welfare" in April last year. "We will hand over this re-

sponsibility to the caretaker set-up in August 2023," Dawn quoted Sharif as saying.

He claimed that the incumbent government, in mere 15 months of its brief tenure, cleaned the "rubble of destruc-

tion", which he said was a "work of the PTI" over the last four years

Sharif added that during the past few months, his government "sacrificed politics to protect the state".

Earlier on Wednesday, Shehbaz Sharif said that the coalition government's tenure will end on August 14 and the date for the next polls will be announced by the Election

Commission of Pakistan (ECP) either in "October or November", Geo News reported.

"Our government's tenure will end on August 14, the election commission will decide when the polls will take place – whether in October or November," Geo News quoted

Sharif as saying. added, "Whosoever He forms the next government after elections, their top priority should be education so they can make this nation great".

Earlier, Interior Minister Rana Sanaullah had also said the assemblies could be dissolved earlier than the scheduled date of August 13 to "facilitate" the ECP.

The Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) has also demanded the elections take place at their stipulated time as it is eyeing "its victory" in the upcoming polls, Geo News reported.

The government continues to be under pressure as the country is undergoing its worst economic crisis, inflation is at record highs and the prices not coming down despite all the claims by the authorities.

Citing recent surveys, Geo News reported that the Pakistan Democratic Movement (PDM) – the ruling coalition government in Pakistan – has lost much of its popularity and faces an uphill task to win the confidence of the people in the upcoming polls.

Singer Lisa Marie Presley's Death Linked To Weight Loss Surgery

LOS ANGELES: The death of Lisa Marie Presley, the singer-songwriter and only child of rock and roll legend Elvis, was caused by a bowel obstruction related to a prior weight loss surgery, medical examiners said.

Presley, who led a tumultuous life in the sprawling shadow of her world-famous father, died in January at age 54 after being discovered unresponsive in her home and rushed to the hospital.

Her cause of death was determined to be "a small bowel obstruction caused by scar tissue that developed after a previous bariatric surgery years ago. The manner of death is natural," the County of Los Angeles Department of Medical Examiner said in a statement Thursday. Bariatric surgery is a stomwhere she was put in an induced coma on life support before dying, TMZ reported at the time.

In addition to Keough, whom she divorced in 1994, Presley had also been married to Nicolas Cage, Michael Jackson and actor-composer Michael Lockwood.

Lisa Marie was Elvis's only child. She previously controlled Elvis Presley Enterprises, although she sold the bulk of shares in the company to a private equity firm in 2005.

She retained control of Graceland, the estate her father owned and where he was found unconscious in August 1977.

Elvis' widow Priscilla Presley reached a settlement in May, following a dispute over an amendment removing her from her daughter's will.

SIA Takes Custody Of Rafiq Lala In Drugs, Weapon **Recovery Cases**

JAMMU: The State Investigation agency (SIA) on Thursday took the custody of Mohd Rafiq, who is named in cases related to anti-national activities and narcotics seizure, from jail authorities in Jammu and Kashmir's Poonch district, official sources said.

The agency intends to interrogate the accused in connection with several cases related to drug recovery and hawala racket, they said. Rafiq, arrested under the

Public Safety Act (PSA), is named in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act cases as well as cases-related to anti-national activities, the sources said.

He was arrested on March 3 following an operation by security forces in Sathra (Dana Dohian) in Mandi's police station jurisdiction. During the search opera-



tion, information was received regarding the presence of narcotics, arms, ammunition, and illegal cash at Rafi's residence, they said.

The search was conducted in the presence of an executive magistrate, lambardaar, chowkidaar and member of the panchayat and it yielded a significant seizure, including seven kilograms of heroin, one pistol with a magazine containing 10 rounds, seven rounds of 7.62mm ammunition, one khokri (a traditional knife), and Rs 2.30 crore, the sources said. Following this, a case was registered and transferred to the SIA. Today, the SIA team has tak-

en custody of Rafiq from the district jail authorities, they said.

DAK Raises Concern As WHO Links Artificial Sweetener With Cancer Risk

SRINAGAR: With World Health Organization (WHO) declaring that artificial sweetener aspartame widely used in diet drinks could cause cancer, Doctors Association Kashmir (DAK) on Friday said it is a matter of serious concern.

"Diet drinks have become routine part of people's lives and the cancer link to these drinks is alarming," said DAK President Dr Nisar ul Hasan.

Dr Hassan said the International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC) which is the cancer research arm of WHO has linked sweetener aspartame to increased risk of liver cancer. The conclusion is based on

three large human studies conducted in the US and Europe that examined artificially sweetened beverages

"The risk is particularly high in those who are taking excess

of these soft drinks," he said. The DAK President said concerns about rising rates of obesity and diabetes have resulted in an explosion of no or lowsugar foods and beverages

Aspartame, a low-caloric artificial sweetener is used in Diet Coke, Pepsi zero sugar and other diet sodas as a substitute for sugar with the aim that the sweetener can help consumers manage body weight and reduce the risk of non-communicable diseases.

"However, research has found that replacing free sugar with non-sugar sweetener like aspartame does not help with weight control in the long term," he said adding "artificial sweeteners have also been linked with higher risk of developing diabetes mellitus and cardiovascular disease, as well as of dying.'

mediately pause for at least 6 months the training of AI systems more powerful than GPT-4."

This 6-month moratorium would be better than no moratorium. I have respect for everyone who stepped up and signed it. It's an improvement on the margin.

I refrained from signing because I think the letter is understating the seriousness of the situation and asking for too little to solve it.

The key issue is not "humancompetitive" intelligence (as the open letter puts it); it's what happens after AI gets to smarter-than-human intelligence. Key thresholds there may not be obvious, we definitely can't calculate in advance what happens when, and it currently seems imaginable that a research lab would cross critical lines without noticing.

Many researchers steeped in these issues, including myself, expect that the most likely result of building a superhumanly smart AI, under anything remotely like the current circumstances, is that literally everyone on Earth will die. Not as in "maybe possibly some remote chance," but as in "that is the obvious thing that would happen." It's not that you can't, in principle, survive creating something much smarter than you; it's that it would require precision and preparation and new scientific insights, and probably not having AI systems composed of giant inscrutable arrays of fractional numbers.

Without that precision and preparation, the most likely outcome is AI that does not do what we want, and does not care for us nor for sentient life in general. That kind of caring is something that could in principle be imbued into an AI but we are not ready and do not currently know how.

Absent that caring, we get "the AI does not love you, nor does it hate you, and you are made of atoms it can use for

something else."

The likely result of humanity facing down an opposed superhuman intelligence is a total loss. Valid metaphors include "a 10-year-old trying to play chess against Stockfish 15", "the 11th century trying to fight the 21st century," and "Australopithecus trying to fight Homo sapiens"

To visualize a hostile superhuman AI, don't imagine a lifeless book-smart thinker dwelling inside the internet and sending ill-intentioned emails. Visualize an entire alien civilization, thinking at millions of times human speeds, initially confined to computers-in a world

of creatures that are, from its perspective, very stupid and very slow. A sufficiently intelligent AI won't stay confined to computers for long. In today's world you can email DNA strings to laboratories that will produce proteins on demand, allowing an AI initially confined to the internet to build artificial life forms or bootstrap straight to postbiological molecular manufacturing.

If somebody builds a too-powerful AI, under present conditions, I expect that every single member of the human species and all biological life on Earth dies shortly thereafter.

There's no proposed plan for how

we could do any such thing and survive. OpenAI's openly declared intention is to make some future AI do our AI alignment homework. Just hearing that this is the plan ought to be enough to get any sensible person to panic. The other leading AI lab, DeepMind, has no plan at all.

An aside: None of this danger depends on whether or not AIs are or can be conscious; it's intrinsic to the notion of powerful cognitive systems that optimize hard and calculate outputs that meet sufficiently complicated outcome criteria. With that said, I'd be remiss in my moral duties as a human if I didn't also mention that we have no idea how to determine whether AI systems are aware of themselves-since we have no idea how to decode anything that goes on in the giant inscrutable arrays-and therefore we may at some point inadvertently create digital minds which are truly conscious and ought to have rights and shouldn't be owned.

The rule that most people aware of these issues would have endorsed 50 years earlier, was that if an AI system can speak fluently and says it's self-aware and demands human rights, that ought to be a hard stop on people just casually owning that AI and using it past that point. We already blew past that old line in the sand. And that was probably correct; I agree that current AIs are probably just imitating talk of self-awareness from their training data. But I mark that, with how little insight we have into these systems' internals, we do not actually know.

If that's our state of ignorance for

GPT-4, and GPT-5 is the same size of giant capability step as from GPT-3 to GPT-4, I think we'll no longer be able to justifiably say "probably not self-aware" if we let people make GPT-5s. It'll just be "I don't know; nobody knows." If you can't be sure whether you're creating a self-aware AI, this is alarming not just because of the moral implications of the "self-aware" part, but because being unsure means you have no idea what you are doing and that is dangerous and you should stop.

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Why are Dogs the New Devils in Kashmir?

In Conversation With An Award Winning Veterinarian To Decode Increasing Dog Bite Incidents And Understanding Solutions

In the quaint streets of Batamaloo, where laughter of children once thrived with a vibrant pulse, a mournful stillness now envelops the air. It was amidst these familiar streets that Ahmad, a 10-year-old boy found himself in a harrowing chase with a stray dog, that tragically culminated in his untimely demise after a 13-day battle in hospital.

Nearly two months before this incident, in April, another eight-year-old boy was mauled when a stray dog attacked him in Awantipora area of South Kashmir's Pulwama district, leaving his lung and other vital organs injured.

Such incidents of stray dog aggression resulting in injuries or fatalities have been reported in various parts of Kashmir, taking the number of dog-bite cases to 60,000 over the decade. According to the data by Anti-Rabies Clinic (ARC) at the Shri Maharaja Hari Singh (SMHS) Hospital Srinagar, Kashmir recorded a total of 5,629 bite victims, mostly dog bites in the last one year. Srinagar, specifically, had the highest number of reported cases, with 4,264 incidents of dog bites.

While it is crucial to acknowledge people's concerns and experiences of stray dog bites, it is equally important to understand the circumstances that lead to such incidents. In a recent interview with Kashmir Observer, Dr. Qazi Mudasir, a veterinarian at the Central Veterinary Hospital in Srinagar, talks about the growing concern of stray dog-related issues from an animal welfare standpoint.

In your professional opinion, what are the main reasons stray dogs resort to biting humans?

Stray dogs may resort to biting humans due to a variety of reasons, which can include fear, territoriality, protection of resources, pain or illness, maternal instincts, or previous negative experiences.

Dogs compete for food, mating partners, living space etc. When the population of dogs increases, the available resources may become limited. Stray dogs may become more aggressive with other animals or even people who approach them around food sources, potentially leading to dog bites in defense of their perceived territory or resources. Also, female dogs may become protective when they have puppies nearby. On top of this, improper disposal of day to day kitchen wastes can contribute to dog bites by attracting stray dogs to populated areas in search of food.



One important factor that I believe is contributing to the increasing number of dog-bite cases in Kashmir is less humandog interaction or lack of socialization. Positive human interactions build trust between dogs and humans, and here people don't typically interact with stray dogs. Kashmiris traditionally used to keep extra food, such as rotis for dogs outside their homes, but this trend has diminished to a large extent. It has been seen that in areas where there is minimal interaction be-

tween humans and stray dogs, it becomes increasingly challenging to address the aggression or fear these dogs exhibit.

Are there specific triggers that lead to aggressive behavior in dogs?

Triggers that can lead to aggressive behavior in dogs, including strays, include threats or perceived threats. Dogs can generalize negative experiences and develop fear, mistrust or aggression towards humans based on past traumatic encounters. If a dog has been mistreated, harmed or stoned by someone, it can associate that experience with humans in general and may perceive all humans as potential threats. It has also been observed that sometimes puppies on roadsides get hurt or killed by rash human driving and their mothers later on chase every vehicle on road owing to their previous traumatic experience.

Are there any specific signs or warning signals that people should be aware of, indicating any potential danger from stray dogs? And what behaviors should people avoid when encountering a stray dog?

Firstly, it is important to recognize that stray dogs are not wild animals that are inherently prone to attack. While some stray dogs may exhibit aggressive behavior, the majority of stray dogs tend to be fearful or wary of humans and will avoid conflict. In situations where a dog actively attacks, people may not have the opportunity or presence of mind to look for specific warning signs. However, stray dogs may exhibit signs such as growling or baring their teeth, or when a dog's hair on the back of its neck and along the spine stands up, known as raised hackles, it can be an indication that the dog feels threatened or territorial, and it is essential to keep a safe distance.

In Islam also, there is a strong emphasis on the rights and wellbeing of animals. It is undeniable that the recent cases of dog bites, which tragically resulted in deaths, have instilled fear and anger within the region; however, I will again reiterate that it is essential to approach stray dogs with kindness and a non-threatening demeanor. Avoid provoking, taunting or chasing them, as it can escalate their behavior and create a potentially dangerous situation. dog would disrupt the natural balance of the ecosystem and have unintended consequences.

Talk us through the potential health risks associated with stray dog bites?

Rabies is one of the most significant health concerns associated with dog bites. India accounts for about 36% of the world's rabies deaths. Rabies is a kind of disease that is 100 percent preventable and 0 percent curable. Rabies virus is present in the saliva of the rabid animal and if such an animal bites and post bite vaccination schedule is not followed then there are chances of manifestation of rabies. The disease affects the central nervous system and is almost fatal once symptoms develop.

that each and every animal gets vaccinated at proper time.

Many feel that the rules of animal welfare law that prohibit killing and shifting of stray dogs from one place to another are worsening the stray dog problem. What do you feel about it?

Killing a dog, or for that matter, any animal, is not an alternative. It is not an ethical or effective solution to reduce dog bite cases. Plus, the shifting of dogs to other localities will only aggravate the problem. It will give rise to territorial conflicts and adjustment issues among dogs, which can further lead to humans getting bitten.

How often do you get to treat stray dogs in your hospital?

We witness approximately 150 to 200

What role does the lack of proper waste management play in proliferation of the canine population?

Srinagar city generates hundreds of tons of waste daily, and leaving that garbage or food waste in open areas can attract stray dogs. They find a consistent food source and are more likely to reproduce and thrive, leading to larger numbers of strays. We often see that in Kashmiri weddings people don't follow the SOP for proper food waste disposal. No doubt, Municipal Corporation has its own duty to implement proper waste management practices that include secure disposal of garbage and the regular collection and disposal of waste in designated containers or landfill, but people also need to have some civic sense regarding proper waste disposal.

As per 2011 dog census, there were around 90,000 street dogs in Srinagar city alone. It is estimated that this population is now more than double. Do you believe sterilization is sufficient to deal with the current crisis?

Srinagar Municipal Corporation (SMC) has started the sterilization of dogs under the Animal Birth Control (ABC) program, and the data regarding the number of dogs being sterilized lies with them. Hopefully, very soon the changes will be visible on the ground. This is a humane and effective way to prevent unchecked reproduction and the subsequent increase in the number of strays. Neutering alone may not completely eliminate dog bites, but if done on a mass scale it will definitely reduce the competition and the subsequent aggressive behavior.

However, 100% sterilization of dogs is not recommended. Sterilizing every single

How important is vaccination of dogs in reducing the risk of rabies?

It is very important, both for the dogs themselves and for other animals or humans who may come into contact with them. That's why the Animal Birth Control (ABC) is coupled with the Anti-Rabies Vaccination (ARV) program to prevent rabies.

You received an international award for your pioneering work in rabies control. Tell us about it?

I was awarded by the Global Alliance for Rabies Control (GARC) – a renowned US and UK based Alliance for Rabies Control – in recognition of my efforts towards rabies prevention in animals. The incidence of rabies in animals has been significantly reduced in Kashmir Valley through educating animal caregivers about strictly following both the prophylactic and post-bite anti-rabies vaccine schedule.

It's worth mentioning that the Department of Animal Husbandry, Kashmir provides the anti-rabies vaccines on subsidized rates of around Rs 4.70, while in the market each dose can cost upto Rs 300. The Department has kept both prophylactic and post bite anti Rabies Vaccination available in all the districts of Kashmir valley so cases on a daily basis, out of which nearly 30 are stray animals. People who are compassionate towards animals bring injured or sick stray dogs to the hospital for treatment. The Department has also kept provisions for providing free treatment to stray and destitute ownerless animals that are in desperate need of help and medical care.

Many non-governmental animal welfare organisations have come up in Kashmir in recent years. How do you see that with respect to the current crisis?

The emergence of animal welfare organisations that not only rescue but also rehabilitate injured and sick stray animals is undeniably a positive development. Among these organisations the pioneer ones are Kashmir Animal Welfare Foundation & Animal Rescue Kashmir. Both these organizations and other NGO's rescue many stray cases on a daily basis and bring them to the Central Veterinary Hospital Srinagar for immediate treatment and surgical corrections. It shows that despite the challenges and hardships faced in the current crisis, there are individuals and groups who are committed to addressing issues related to animals with compassion.

From evaluating goals and needs regularly to considering a two- or three- to fiveyear tenure, these experts share their experiences and advice on finding the right balance in your career journey.

ANALYZE GOALS AND NEEDS REGULARLY

I recently left a position at a company I'd been with since 1998—nearly 25 years. I stayed because of the variety of opportunities. My mentors and leaders advised me, pushed me, and identified opportunities for growth and development. During that period, I held at least 10 very different roles, each of them a terrific learning experience. Of equal importance was the leadership's commitment to values, culture, and a mission that I felt was important.

Deciding how long to stay at a job involves one's risk tolerance, personal goals, cultural alignment, and desire for growth. No one cares more about your career than you, and you are the driver, not a passenger. Take a look at your goals and needs every six months. Decide how well your current role satisfies them. Evaluate the opportunity for growth and also how the culture is shifting in the face of industry trends, the needs of the market, and changes in leadership. When you are staying only for comfort, it's likely time to move.

FOCUS ON RESULTS-ORIENTED GROWTH

I've been at my job for one and a half years, a small amount of what I'd like to spend. This is my first job out of graduate school and I really enjoy it, particularly my coworkers and the amount I learn each day. But this is rare. DON'T STAY IN A WRONG-FIT JOB

The longest I stayed with the same employer was four years, but I should have left earlier. I don't believe in staying in a job for a year or two if you know it's not the right place for you. You are delaying your career development and opportunities to grow.

When people say you should stay in a job for two years, I recommend reflecting on your circumstances before you make any decision. If you are in a toxic environment, enduring two years is unsustainable. If you are not seen and heard at work, staying for two years can impact your mental health.

You can still acquire skills and discuss your career goals in a job interview even if you stayed in a job for eight months. No job is secure. Continue to advocate for your career and take your skills, knowledge, and experience with you anywhere.

younger, are likely to be swifter and display lower anxiety and depression than typical older adults, according to new research published in The Lancet Healthy Longevity journal.

Superagers have been seen to avoid the natural deterioration of memory with age.

The observational study from Spain aimed to find out if this was because superagers were resistant to or if they had coping mechanisms empowering them to overcome age-related memory decline better than their peers.

"Our findings suggest superagers are resistant to these processes, though the precise reasons for this are still unclear," said first author Marta Garo-Pascual of the Queen Sofia Foundation Alzheimer Centre, Madrid, Spain.

For the study, 64 superagers and 55 typical older adults, performing cognitively well but not displaying superager memory ability, were chosen. They were aged 79.5 years or older and were picked from The Vallecas Project cohort, Madrid. The cohort comprising 1,213 participants aged 69-86 years with no neurological or severe psychiatric disorders was recruited between 2011 and 2014.

Superagers' MRI scans showed more grey matter, the brain tissue vital for normal functioning, in key parts separately involved in memory and movement. Their overall grey matter was also seen to degenerate more slowly over the 5-year follow-up period than in typical older adults.

Swifter movements and enhanced mental health were the factors most associated with superagers, the authors found using a machine learning model, that included 89 demographic, lifestyle, and clinical predictors of the participants.

Superagers were also found to fare better on mobility and fine motor function tests, indicating a mobility, agility and balance superior to those of typical older adults, despite no differences in the two groups' self-reported exercise levels.

In clinical tests measuring anxiety and depression levels, superagers scored lower than typical older adults.

They also registered lower levels of neurodegeneration biomarkers, blood sample analysis revealed.

"Though superagers report similar activity levels to typical older people, it's possible they do more physically demanding activities like gardening or stair climbing.

"From lower blood pressure and obesity levels to increased blood flow to the brain, there are many direct and indirect benefits of being physically active that may contribute to improved cognitive abilities in old age," said senior author Bryan Strange, Universidad Politecnica de Madrid.

Wholesale Inflation Falls To 8-Year Low Of (-) 4.12% In June

NEW DELHI: The deflation in the wholesale price continued for the third month in a row in June, with WPI contracting to a nearly eight-year low at (-) 4.12 per cent on account falling prices of food products, fuel and basic metals, according to official data released on Friday. The Wholesale Price Index

(WPI) based inflation stood at (-) 3.48 per cent in May and at 16.23 per cent in June 2022. The lowest WPI was recorded at (-) 4.76 per cent in October 2015.

The decline in WPI is in contrast with June retail inflation which inched up to 4.8 per cent in June from 4.3 per cent in May.

"The decline in the rate of inflation in June 2023 is primarily due to fall in prices of mineral oils, food products, basic metals, crude petroleum and natural gas and textiles," the Ministry of Commerce and Industry said in a release.

As per the data, the index for fuel and power contracted by

12.63 per cent in June, primary articles by 2.87 per cent, and manufactured products by 2.71

per cent. The food index shrank by 1.24 per cent.

In June, the prices of nonfood articles compared to May contracted by 2.40 per cent, crude petroleum and natural gas by 3.01 per cent, and minerals by 4.32 per cent.

Also, prices of mineral oils (-2.30 per cent) and electricity (- 2.96 per cent) declined in June on a sequential basis.

manufactured Regarding products, the release said 11 groups witnessed a decrease in prices while 9 groups saw an increase in prices in June.

The decrease in prices was mainly due to basic metals; chemical and chemical products; textiles; rubber and plastic products; and paper and paper products, among others. Some of the groups that witnessed an increase in prices include tobacco products; computer, electronic and optical products; leather and related products; and motor vehicles.

Price Rise, Short Supply And Modern Farming Techniques Help Tomato Farmers In Budgam

BUDGAM: Tomato farmers in Budgam district have seen their income double this year, thanks to a sharp rise in the crop's prices and the modern farming techniques they have employed, leading to a bumper harvest.

Khursheed Ahmad Bhat, who set up a tomato farm in Narkara village of Budgam district more than a decade ago, said this year he is not having to worry about whether his produce will fetch him the right price. "There is a scarcity of toma-

toes in the market, and people have been directly approaching me to buy them. I have been offered a higher price since tomatoes are in short supply, but I am selling at a fixed price of Rs 150 per kg," Bhat told PTI. Bhat said apart from the current market scenario surrounding the crop, the department

of agriculture deserves a fair share of the credit for the profits he is earning now. "I have been into farming for over 10 years. Four years ago, I underwent a training session

in Bengaluru that was organised by the department of agriculture. I learnt about modern techniques such as polyhouse farming," he said.

"In 2020, shortly after I returned, Covid-19 hit, and I started implementing the new techniques on a trial basis. In my very first trial, one plant yielded 4-5 kg of tomatoes. After seeing the results, I built more poly-



houses. In the first year, I built 2500-square feet polyhouse which helped me earn around Rs 1 lakh. This was far more than the Rs 25,000-30,000 I used to earn in a kanal (5,440 square feet), following traditional farming methods," Bhat said.

'This year, because of the unavailability in the market, tomato prices have sky-rocketed. But my tomato produce is booming and I am earning good profits," he said.

lavid Mohiuddin Dar. circle officer, Budgam district, department of agriculture, said Bhat was among of the farmers who followed a 'holistic agriculture programme' of which high-tech polyhouse farming is a part.

"Many farmers are enrolling themselves under the project. Bhat adopted high-tech vegetable farming techniques while farming tomato crops. In this method of farming, one plant yields 15 kilograms of tomatoes as these are of hybrid quality. One polyhouse consists f 850 plants," Dar said.

Mohammad Shameem Akhter, who works at Bhat's farm, said while the crop yield this year was good and the demand has also been high.

Govt's Discount Sale Of Tomatoes Starts In Delhi-NCR, Patna

NEW DELHI: Cooperatives NCCF and NAFED on Friday started selling tomatoes at a discounted rate of Rs 90 per kg in Delhi-NCR and Patna in a bid to provide relief to consumers amid high prices of the key kitchen staple.

RBI To Soon Issue Guidelines To Banks For Resolution Of Certain Rupee Trade Issues: Official

NEW DELHI: The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) will soon issue guidelines for banks for the resolution of certain issues being faced by exporters while undertaking rupee trade with other countries, a senior government official said on Friday.

The official said that as far as the rupee trading mechanism is concerned, initially there were some teething troubles but in many of these areas the transactions have started.

Some exporters had approached the commerce ministry that there are some issues with regard to generation of e-BRC (electronic bank realisation certificate).

"So we have taken this issue with the RBI. So the RBI is in the process of issuing a detailed SOP (standard operating procedure) to all the banks so that e-BRC generation becomes smooth. That SOP has been vetted by us and the RBI should be releasing it in the next 2-3 days," the official said. However, the official added that the limitation with rupee trade is that it can only work as a barter currency.

Four Homeowners Arrested For Failing To Provide Tenant Information To Police In Samba

Jammu: Police on Friday arrested four homeowners and filed FIRs against them for allegedly not furnishing tenant information as per the district magistrate's order in Jammu and Kashmir's Samba district, officials said.

The individuals taken into custody have been identified as Ghulam Nabi, Maqbool Hussain, Abdul Rashid and Tarvinder Singh, all residents of Bari Brahmana in Samba, they said.

Police said four separate cases have been registered at the Bari Brahmana Police Station. The homeowners defied the order despite repeated appeals, they said, adding investigations are underway. Samba Senior

Superintendent of Police Benam Tosh has urged all house owners, as well as owners of business and industrial establishments, construction companies, and makeshift dwellings, to promptly provide mandatory information about tenants, external workers, domestic helpers, and guests to the respective police stations.

The information should be provided on a declaration form signed by both the owner and the tenant, in compliance with the order issued by the district magistrate of Samba under section 144 CrPC.

Failure to adhere to this directive may result in legal action against the defaulters under Section 188 of IPC (deliberate disobedience of an order by a public servant), police said.

AMARNATH YATRA Five More Pilgrims Die Since July 13 Morning Death Toll 24

Srinagar: Five Amarnath pilgrims died in the past 36 hours, taking the death toll during this year's yatra in the south Kashmir Himalayas to 24, officials said on Friday.

The five victims who died in since Thursday morning included a sadhu, they said.

Most of the pilgrims died of cardiac arrest, the officials added.

While four people died on the Pahalgam axis of the yatra, one death occurred on the Baltal route, they said.

The pilgrims belonged to Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Haryana and Gujarat. One victim is yet to be identified.

These five deaths have taken the toll during the yatra so far this year to 24. Among the victims are an Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP) officer posted on yatra duty, a sadhu and a sevadar, according to the

officials.

Cardiac arrest triggered by low oxygen concentration at high altitudes is one of the most common causes of fatalities among Amarnath pilgrims and security forces posted there.

So far, 1,62,569 (1.62 lakh) pilgrims have visited the cave shrine to glimpse the natural ice lingam formation.

The 62-day annual pilgrimage to the 3,888-metrehigh cave shrine in the south Kashmir Himalayas commenced from the twin tracks of Pahalgam in Anantnag district and Baltal in Ganderbal district on July 1. The yatra is scheduled to conclude on August 31.

Several digital devices were seized and scrutinised by the agency as part of its investigations in the case, it said.

"They were working as OGWs of the terrorists and had been actively involved in transporting weapons and funds from one place to another on the directions of Pakbased commanders/handlers, as part of a bigger conspiracy," the federal agency said. The conspiracy had been hatched by cadres and OGWs of various proscribed organisations with their Pakistan-based commanders, the NIA said. These cadres and OGWs were actively involved in the collection and distribution of huge consignments of narcotics, cash, small arms or weapons, IEDs and other types of IEDs, including remote-controlled sticky bombs or magnetic bombs, it said. Such hardware and IEDs are either delivered over drones or also assembled locally for militant attacks in Jammu and Kashmir, the investigations revealed, the NIA added. The militant conspiracy was aimed at disturbing peace and communal harmony by carrying out militant acts and waging a war against the Government of India. According to the investigations, the militant outfits were involved in targeting minorities, migrants and security personnel. The conspiracy had been hatched both physically and through cyberspace by using secured encrypted social media apps, the NIA said in its statement.

Djokovic Eases Past Sinner To Reach Wimbledon Final

LONDON: Novak Djokovic barely got out of second gear as he swept past a subdued Jannik Sinner at Wimbledon, easing into a record 35th Grand Slam final with a whirlwind 6-3 6-4 7-6(4) victory on Friday.

Djokovic has turned Centre Court into his own personal fiefdom having not lost there in 10 years, and the Serbian is now one win away from a record-equalling eighth title at the grasscourt major to match the mark of Roger Federer. The 21-year-old Sinner, who was aiming to become the youngest man to reach the Wimbledon final since 2007, was outclassed, falling flat on the big

occasion and allowing Djokovic to turn the screw at key moments in the contest.

He let break points slip through his fingers, including two set points in the third, while Djokovic was clinical as usual, applying constant pressure on the Italian eighth seed's serve and pouncing on opportunities when they arose. He wrapped up the match when Sinner dumped a backhand into the net, leaving the Serbian to accept the applause of the Centre Court crowd, who had vociferously backed his opponent throughout, teeing up a final against either top seed Carlos Alcaraz or Russian Daniil Medvedev who play later on Friday.

India To Play All Three Formats On South Africa Tour

JOHANNESBURG: India will play traditional Boxing Day and New Year test matches in South Africa in the 2023-24 season, preceded in December by six white-ball fixtures, officials said on Friday. The first test will start on Dec. 26 in Pretoria, with the second on Jan. 3 at Newlands in Cape Town.

LONDON: Arsenal have signed Netherlands defender Jurrien Timber on a long-term contract from Ajax Amsterdam, both clubs said on Friday. Arsenal did not specify the length of the contract, with British media reporting he has signed a five-year deal. 'Ajax and the English club agreed on a 40 million euros (\$44.88 million) transfer fee. That amount can increase to 45 million euros through variables," Ajax said in a statement. Timber started his youth career at Feyenoord, moving to Ajax's

He broke into the first team in the 2019-20 season, before making 50 league appearances across Ajax's Eredevisie-winning campaigns in 2021 and 2022. The 22-year-old has been capped 15 times by the Netherlands since his debut in 2021.

Arsenal finished second behind champions Manchester City last season, and have qualified for the Champions League for the first time since the 2016-17 campaign. The north London club have signed German forward Kai Havertz from Chelsea and are also looking to strengthen their midfield with West Ham United's Declan Rice among the main targets.

ICC Banking On T20 For Cricket's Inclusion In Olympics

DUBAI: International Cricket Council (ICC) chief executive Geoff Allardice on Friday said that they are pushing for the T20 format's inclusion at the 2028 Los Angeles Olympics.

The ICC is seeking cricket's entry at the LA Games and its fate would be decided in a couple of months' time, he stated.

"The Olympics want to stage a format that has its World Championship. Given that, we will be proposing the shortest format for Olympic inclusion -- that would be T20 cricket,' said the ICC CEO in a media round table on the sidelines of the Board meeting here.

Thursday the marked launch of the much-anticipated Major League Cricket in the USA with six franchise includ-

ing four owners from the IPL. While Kolkata Knight Riders own the Los Angeles side, Mumbai Indians have New York, Delhi Capitals have Seattle Orcas, while the Texas franchise is owned by Chennai Super Kings.

The ICC chief executive said MLC would draw a lot of attention to the sport.

'There are a number of developments in the USA that are helping to raise the awareness of the game. Start of the MLC is one of them, they draw a lot of attention to the sport."

He further said that the Men's T20 World Cup 2024 will be co-hosted by USA Cricket and Cricket West Indies, contrary to speculations that it would move to the UK.

"It's bringing a lot of content to venues, broadcasters, fans and it's able to reach a much broader range of people than just international cricket. So the emergence of franchise leagues is one way to promote our sport.

"There has been an increase in activity in that area and one of those discussions is to bring a balance in the calendar, what the international cricket should look like.

"The staging of a domestic league with the top players of that country is a very good way to promote cricket. We have made strides in a number of territories. It is changing the dynamics of the game and a lot of that has been positive," he added.

Chandrayaan-3: India Launches Rocket To Land **Spacecraft On Moon**

ndia's space agency has launched a rocket that will at-Letter to land a spacecraft at the lunar south pole, an unprecedented feat that would advance India's position as a major space power.

Television footage on Friday showed the Indian Space Research Organisation's (ISRO) LVM3 launch rocket blast off from the country's main spaceport at Sriharikota in the southern state of Andhra Pradesh, leaving behind a plume of smoke and fire.

The Chandrayaan-3 mission – "moon vehicle" in Sanskrit – is designed to deploy a lander and rover near the moon's south pole on about August 23.

Applause and cheers swept through mission control at Satish Dhawan Space Centre, where the ISRO engineers and scientists celebrated as they monitored the launch of the spacecraft.

Thousands of Indians cheered outside the mission control centre and waved the national flag as they watched the craft rise into the sky.

'Congratulations India. Chandrayaan-3 has started its journey towards the moon," ISRO Direc-

tor Sreedhara Panicker Somanath said shortly after the launch. Only three other space agencies - the United States, the former Soviet Union and China the moon's surface.

Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who is currently visiting France, tweeted that the mission was carrying the "hopes and dreams of our nation".

The third Chandrayaan includes a two-metre-tall lander designed to deploy a rover near the lunar south pole, where it is expected to remain functional for two weeks running a series of experiments.

ISRO's Chandrayaan-2 mission in 2020 successfully deployed an orbiter but its lander and rover were destroyed in a crash near where the Chandrayan-3 will attempt a touchdown.

Upon touchdown, the rover will roll off the lander, named Vikram, which means valour in Sanskrit and explore the nearby area, gathering images to be sent back to Earth for analysis. The rover, named Pragyan, the

Sanskrit word for wisdom, has a mission life of one lunar day or 14 Earth days.

India Eyes New Drugs Law After Deaths Linked To **Country-Made Cough Syrups**

New Delhi: A new drugs bill will be taken up for consideration next week on rules for importing, manufacturing and selling medicines in India, according to a parliamentary notice on Thursday.

This comes after cough syrups made in India were linked to the death of at least 89 children in Gambia and Uzbekistan last year.

The bill is aimed at ensuring "quality, safety, efficacy, performance and clinical trial of new drugs...with the objective of highest possible regulatory standards and a transparent regulatory regime," the notice said. It was not immediately clear what the changes were in the new Drugs, Medical Devices and Cosmetics Bill, 2023, which will replace an earlier drugs law if passed by the Parliament when it reconvenes after a break on July 20.

The \$41 billion pharmaceutical industry in India is one the largest in the world and has for years helped provide cheaper alternatives to Western products, especially to poor and developing nations.

But the recent cough syrup-related deaths and at least one other instance of an India-made eye drop being linked to three deaths in the United States, has cast a shadow on the industry's image.

The country has made tests mandatory for cough syrup exports since last month. Companies that manufactured the syrups linked to deaths in Gambia and Uzbekistan have denied any wrongdoing.



Universe Could Be Twice As Old As Currently Estimated To Be, New Research Says

ur universe could be twice as old as current estimates, according to a model proposed by a new study from the University of Ottawa, Canada.

"Our newly-devised model stretches the galaxy formation time by a several billion years, making the universe 26.7 billion years old, and not 13.7 as previously estimated," said study author Rajendra Gupta, adjunct professor of physics in the Faculty of Science at the university.

The research team said that their model challenges the dominant cosmological models of calculating our universe's age, which largely involve measuring the time elapsed since the Big Bang and studying the oldest stars based on the redshift of light coming from distant galaxies. Redshift refers to an observed elongating of wavelength of light from distant galaxies, generally interpreted as evidence of the universe expanding.

In 2021, the current or standard cosmological model, called the Lambda-CDM concordance model, estimated the age of our universe to be 13.797 billion years old. of stars like the Methuselah, one

The Lambda-CDM model assumes that the universe was cre-
