ears, and the recent violence is not an isolated incident. The state is composed of various demographic groups, with the Meiteis, mostly Hindus, dominating the political landscape. The Nagas and Kukis, both predominantly Christian minorities, have long-standing grievances with the Meitei community. The situation escalated in May when the Manipur High Court issued a ruling in favor of Meitei demands for tribal status, which would grant them land rights and other protections. However, the Kukis, who already have tribal status, opposed of their land. This sparked widespread protests and retaliatory attacks on homes and villages, further retaliatory attacks on homes and villages, further
escalating the conflict. The video has ignited outrage across India. Prime describing it as "shameful" and an "insult" to the country. Manipur Chief Minister Biren Singh has promised a thorough investigation and strict action against the perpetrators, potentially even capital punishment. Protesters across the nation have voiced their anger, highlighting the targeting of women during communal clashes as a form of retribution.
