We also emphasize that freedom of religion or belief, freedom of opinion or expression, the right to peaceful assembly, and the right to freedom of association are interdependent, inter-related and mutually reinforcing and stress the role that these rights can play in the fight against all forms

SIA Announces Rs 10L Bounty For Killers Info

Srinagar: The State Investigation Agency (SIA) probing assassination of noted lawyer Babar Qadri has announced Rs 10 lakh reward for any information leading to the arrest of the killers of the well-known television debater, nearly three years ago.

Advocate Babar Qadri, a wellknown television debater, was shot dead from point blank range inside his house in the Hawal area of the downtown here on September, 2, 2020.

The announcement of the cash reward was made by SIA in a notice.

"A cash reward of Rs 10,00000 (Rupees Ten lacs) is announced for those providing information leading to the arrest of the persons involved in the killing of Senior Advocate of I&K High Court Late Babar Oadri S/O Sh. Mohd Yasin Qadri R/O Zahidpora, Hawal, Srinagar who was killed by terrorists on 24.09.2020 at his residence.," it reads.

The SIA further announced that the identity of the in-former shall be kept highly confidential. The agency also provided contact details of Mobile/WhatsApp/Telegram/ Signal number 9103998467 for passing on the information.

Ghazipur (UP): Jammu and Kashmir Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha Saturday said it was a matter of pride for the country that Prime Minister Narendra Modi's voice was being heard all over the world through the G20

Speaking at a function here after unveiling the statue of Ramnath Yadav, leader of Mohammadabad Ghazipur's area, Sinha called upon people to reject those who make politics a business and instead support those who serve the country.

Speaking about the ongoing G20 Summit at the national capital, the LG said, "It is a matter of pride for our country that Prime Minister Narendra Modi's voice is being heard all over the world. Foreign heads of state are praising India and the prime minister. The countrymen are also happy that their country is moving towards progress. The public is appreciating the government."

He said the prime minister "initiated the politics of serving the country" and would take the country to greater heights.

"Reject those who make politics a business and support those who serve the country and countrymen through politics, so that India can maintain its highest position in the world," Sinha said.

He added that those doing "politics of casteism and familism" and trying to defame the country will be taught a lesson.

"Both in India and outside, they are trying to disintegrate India. Exclude such elements from politics," Sinha exhorted the gathering. >> More On P10

PM Identified As Leader Representing Bharat At G20

New Delhi: Prime Minister Narendra Modi was identified as the leader representing 'Bharat' at the G20 Summit here on Saturday as he made his opening remarks at the beginning of the two-day meeting.

The government has used 'Bharat', a name used in the Constitution for the country along with India, in several official G20 documents. Official sources have said it is a conscious decision.

The name card in front of Modi as he addressed the gathering at the Bharat Mandapam, the venue of the Summit, said 'Bharat'.

A dinner invite has been sent to G20 delegates and other guests from 'President of Bharat', a move which ignited



a political row with opposition parties claiming the government is trying to drop 'India' from the country's name. They also linked the move to their decision to name their alliance INDIA.

The ruling BJP has cheered the use of Bharat, citing the ancient Hindi name's cultural roots. Some leaders claimed the English name 'India' is a colonial legacy. → More On P10

KARGIL HILL COUNCIL POLLS

Election Dept To Set Up 278 Polling Stations

Kargil: A total 278 polling stations will be set up for the upcoming Ladakh hill council elections, the majority of which are either sensitive or hypersensitive, a senior government official here said on Saturday.

The election to the fifth Ladakh Autonomous Hill Development Council (LAHDC)-Kargil will be held on October 4. The votes will be counted on October 8, according to a fresh notification issued by the election department.

"A total 278 polling stations will be set up across all 26 constituencies for the October 4 election. Of these, 114 are hypersensitive, 99 sensitive and 65 normal," Deputy Commissioner (Kargil) Shrikant Suse, flanked by Senior Superintendent of Police Anayat Ali Chowdhary, told reporters.

He said the polling stations were categorised jointly by the civil and the police authorities and security and polling personnel will be deployed accordingly.

Microsoft Reveals How China-Based Hackers Stole Its Consumer Email Key

■hina-backed hackers stole a digital consumer key from Microsoft to gain unfettered access to US government emails and the tech giant has detailed how the cyber criminals pulled off one of the biggest heists in the corporate and government circles.

China-based threat Storm-0558, used an acquired Microsoft account (MSA) consumer key to forge tokens to access OWA (Outlook Web App) and Outlook.com.

"Our investigation found that a consumer signing system crash in April of 2021 resulted in a snapshot of the crashed process (crash dump). The crash dumps, which redact sensitive information, should not include the signing key," the company said after a technical investigation.

In this case, a race condition allowed the key to be present in the crash dump (this issue has been corrected). "The key material's presence in the crash dump was not detected by our systems (this issue has been corrected)," said Microsoft.

The hackers used that digital skeleton key to break into both the personal and enterprise email accounts of government officials hosted by Microsoft.

"We found that this crash dump, believed at the time not to contain key material, was subsequently moved from the isolated production network



We found that this crash dump, believed at the time not to contain key material, was subsequently moved from the isolated production network into our debugging environment on the internet connected corporate network

into our debugging environment on the internet connected corporate network," explained the company.

After April 2021, when the key was leaked to the corporate environment in the crash dump, the Storm-0558 actor was able to successfully compromise a Microsoft engineer's corporate account. This account had access

to the debugging environment containing the crash dump which incorrectly contained the key.

"Due to log retention policies, we don't have logs with specific evidence of this exfiltration by this actor, but this was the most probable mechanism by which the actor acquired the key," Microsoft added.

rinagar- Most of the cable television operators in the Srinagar city have decided to block music and movie channels following threats by unidentified persons. "We have collectively decided to stop feeding of moral and unethical television channels like MTV, Star Movies, Star World etcetra to our customers," a press release of Cable Net-work Association said here on today.

There have been reports of threats to Cable operators in certain areas of Srinagar city by unidentified persons, asking them to dose down their businesses. "We have been receiving let-ten from unidentified persons asking us to dose down the cable networks," the press release said.

The association appealed the separatist political amalgam, Hurriet Conference to intervene in the matter. "It is our humble appeal to Freedom Conference and militant groups to direct us what we have to do." the statement said.

The association urged the separatist leaders to take a sympathetic view of their case as they have invested huge sums in establishing their businesses in Srinagar, after selling off their

'We are unemployed youth and will be turned jobless if we are forced to close our business," the release said.

Till the militants and the Hurriet Conference decide on the future of over two dozen cable operators in Srinagar, and many more in other towns, the Association has decided to close down their operations upto September 13.

The association has also decided to block the transmission of national and international music and movie channels. "We will not be providing obscene channels," the release said. "but only those channels which will provide moral and developmental programmes. In early 1990 militants had banned the use of dish .anten-

nas and forced the closure of cinema halls and bars in Kashmir.Cable networks started their operations in Kashmir since early this year. This month most of the cable operators said they have received threatening letters. However, no militant group has openly asked for the closure of these networks.

At various places in Srinagar the cables running through lanes and by lanes of Srinagar were damaged by unknown persons and at-least two grenade attacks were reported on structures housing cable television networks in Srinagar this month.

G20 Leaders Adopt Declaration On First Day Of Summit



NEW DELHI: The Group of 20 nations adopted a consensus declaration on the opening day of a summit on Saturday that avoided condemnation of Russia for the war in Ukraine but called on all states to refrain from the use of force to seize

Minister Narendra Modi of host India announced that the declaration had been adopted on the first day of the weekend summit.

The consensus came as a surprise as the group is deeply divided over the war in Ukraine, with Western nations earlier pushing for strong condemnation of Russia in the Leaders' Declaration, while other countries demanded a focus on broader economic issues.

'We call on all states to uphold the principles of international law including territorial integrity and sovereignty, international humanitarian law, and the multilateral system that safeguards peace and stability," the declaration said.

"We ... welcome all relevant and constructive initiatives that support a comprehensive, just, and durable peace in Ukraine.

'The use or threat of use of nuclear weapons is inadmissible," the statement added.

The declaration also called for the implementation of the Black Sea initiative for the safe flow of grain, food and fertilizer from Ukraine and Russia. Moscow pulled out of the agreement in July over what it

called a failure to meet its de mands to implement a parallel agreement easing rules for its own food and fertilizer exports.

"On the back of the hard work of all the teams, we have received consensus on the G20 Leaders Summit Declaration. I announce the adoption of this declaration," Modi told the leaders in New Delhi, including US President Joe Biden and heads of government and state from across the world.

The differing views on the war had prevented agreement on even a single communique at ministerial meetings during India's G20 presidency so far this year.

The declaration said the group agreed to address debt vulnerabilities in low and middle-income countries "in an effective, comprehensive and systematic manner," but did not make any fresh action plan.

It said countries pledged to strengthen and reform multilateral development banks, while it accepted the proposal for tighter regulations of cryptocurrencies.

It also agreed that the world needs a total of \$4 trillion of low-cost financing annually for the energy transition, with a high share of renewable energy

in the primary energy mix. The statement called for accelerating efforts toward a phasedown of unabated coal power, but said this had to be done "in line with national circumstances and recognizing the need for support toward just transitions.'

It's For China To Explain Why Xi **Skipped G20 Summit: US Official**

NEW DELHI: Only China can explain the reason for the absence of President Xi Jinping from the annual G20 summit in New Delhi this weekend, a U.S. official said on Saturday.

The summit had been seen as affording a venue for a possible meeting between Xi and U.S. President Joe Biden following months of efforts by the n world nowers to mend ties frayed by trade and geopolitical tensions

"It's incumbent upon the Chinese government to explain" why its leader "would or would not participate", Jon Finer, the U.S. deputy national security adviser, told reporters in the Indian capital.

Although the United States was often called upon to explain the actions of the Chinese government, that was not its role, he said, adding that it was "unfortunate" if China was not com-



mitted to the success of the bloc. "Some have speculated China's absence indicates that it is giving up on the G20, building an alternative world order, that it will privilege groupings like the BRICS," Finer said.

Premier Li Qiang is leading China's delegation in the national capital. Also absent from the summit is President Vladimir Putin of Russia, which is being represented instead by Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov.

Last Sunday, reacting to news that Xi would not attend the G20 summit, Biden said he was "disappointed" but would "get

G20 Presidency Made India 'World-Ready' And The World 'India-Ready,' Says S Jaishankar

NEW DELHI: The G20 has contributed to making "India world-ready and the world India-ready", External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar said on Saturday as he underlined that India's presidency of the grouping prioritised addressing urgent concerns of the Global South.

Addressing a press briefing on the G20 Summit outcomes, Jaishankar said the African Union became a member of the grouping under India's presidency which was in keeping with the priority that the country attaches to addressing urgent concerns of the Global South.

'You would recall that at the beginning of our presidency, at Prime Minister Narendra Modi's initiative, 125 nations were consulted to express voice of the Global South," he said.

"In terms of organisation and programme, the Indian



has been exceptional. Events have been spread across 60 cities which are truly across the length and breadth of India. There has been a popular participation and a societal involvement of an extraordi-

nary degree," Jaishankar said. The interest in G20 proceedings have been particularly strong among the youth and it has been an opportunity to showcase India's culture, traditions and heritage, the external affairs minister said. "The G20 has contributed to making India world-ready and

the world India-ready," he said. The declaration that the leaders have agreed on focuses on promoting strong, sustainable, balanced and inclusive growth, seeks to accelerate progress on SDGs, envisages a green development pact for a sustainable future and endorses high-level principles on lifestyle for sustainable development, Jaishankar said.

Over 1,000 Dead As Powerful Earthquake Hits Morocco Near Marrakesh

▲ magnitude 6.8 earthquake Ahas hit Morocco killing at least 1,037 people, injuring more than 1,200, damaging ancient buildings, and sending terrified residents fleeing their homes into the streets for safety.

Morocco's state television reported the death toll on Saturday, citing the Ministry of Interior. Of those injured, 205 were in a critical condition.

Montasir Itri, a resident of the mountain village of Asni near the epicentre, said most houses there were damaged. "Our neighbours are under the rubble and people are working hard to rescue them using available means in the village," he said.

Residents of Marrakesh, the nearest big city to the epicentre, said some buildings collapsed in the old city, a UNES-CO World Heritage site. Local television showed images of a fallen mosque minaret with rubble lying on smashed cars.

The Interior Ministry urged

calm saying in a televised statement the quake hit the provinces of Al Haouz, Ouarzazate, Marrakesh, Azilal, Chichaoua and Taroudant.

The temblor hit shortly after 11pm local time (22:00 GMT) on Friday evening, according to the United States Geological Survey (USGS) The USGS estimated the

epicentre occurred in the Atlas Mountains, some 75km (44 miles) from Marrakesh, the fourth largest city in the

Search teams frantically collansed buildings scoured for those trapped.

"The Royal Armed Forces, local authorities, security services and civil protection ... continue to mobilise and harness all means and capabilities in order to intervene, provide the necessary assistance, and assess the damage," the interior ministry said.

Noureddine Journalist Bazine from Marrakesh described the situation as an "horrific night".

"It was chaos the moment

the earthquake happened, we're still try to process what happened because it was so sudden," he told Al Jazeera. "In Marrakesh, the most damage was in the old city because the buildings are prone to collapse because of their fragile

Eid al-Tarazi, a professor of seismology in Jordan, told Al Jazeera "hundreds of aftershocks could happen".

"People will need to stay away from the buildings that are not strong because they are prone to collapse. We expect the aftershocks could continue for three to four weeks," he said.

Local media reported roads leading to the mountain region around the epicentre were jammed with vehicles and blocked with collapsed rocks, slowing rescue efforts.

Abderrahim Ait Daoud, the head of a town in the area, told the Moroccan news site 2M that several homes nearby had partly or totally collapsed, and electricity and roads were cut off in some places.

African Union Joins G20 After PM Modi Hugs Chief, **Offers Him Seat At Table**

NEW DELHI: The African Union (AU) on Saturday became a permanent member of the Group of 20 largest economies (G20) of the world with Prime Minister Narendra Modi announcing its entry into the top global body.

In his opening remarks at the inaugural session of the two-day G20 Summit, PM Modi made the announcement welcoming the 55-nation AU as the new member of the grouping.

Shortly after the announcement, Union of Comoros President and AU chairperson Azali Assoumani took the seat as a full member of the G20.

"In keeping with the sentiment of sabka saath (with everyone), India had proposed that the African Union should be given permanent membership of the G20. I believe we all are in agreement on this proposal. With your agreement (he banged the gavel thrice)...," PMModi said.

"Before we start our work. I invite the AU president as a permanent member to take his position," he said.

In the last few years, India has been positioning itself as a leading voice flagging con-cerns, challenges and aspira-

tions of the Global South or the developing nations, especially the African continent.

Prime Minister Modi has been leading from the front on the issue of the AU's membership of the G20. In June, PM Modi wrote to the G20 leaders pitching for according the AU the full membership of the grouping at its New Delhi summit.

Weeks later, the proposal was formally included in the draft communique for the summit during the third G20 Sherpas meeting that took place in Karnataka's Hampi in July.

The AU is an influential organisation comprising 55 member states that make up the countries of the African continent.

In an exclusive interview to PTI earlier this month, PM Modi said Africa is a "top priority" for India and that it works for the inclusion of those in global affairs who feel their voices are not being heard.

The G20 was founded in 1999 in response to several world economic crises.

The G20 member countries represent around 85 per cent of the global GDP, over 75 per cent of the global trade and about two-thirds of the world

Government Hiding Poor People And Animals From G20 Dignitaries: Rahul Gandhi

President Putin may have stayed away, but Prince Potemkin has been in full display with slums being either covered up or demolished, rendering thousands homeless. Stray animals have been cruelly rounded up and mistreated, only to burnish the PM's image," Ramesh said in a statement.

In addition to the video of slums being covered up, the opposition party shared videos of cruelty towards stray dogs and animals ahead of the C20 Summit

"The government considers us insects. Are we not humans, said a slum resident, whose video the Congress shared.

"Before G20, Modi government has covered their houses with curtains to hide its failure. Because the king hates the poor," the opposition party said on its X handle.

officer said.

Police checked the video clips recorded by the drone camera and seized the device, they added.

A case has been registered against Harmanjeet Singh at Patel Nagar police station for violation of the prohibition on the use of drones and other flying objects.

He has been booked under section 188 (disobedience to order duly promulgated by public servant) of the Indian Penal Code, the officer said.

The Delhi Police had prohibited the flying of sub-conventional aerial platforms like paragliders, hang-gliders and hot air balloons in Delhi from August 29 to Sep-

SIA Jammu Arrests Key Accused In Narco-Terror Case

JAMMU: The Special Investigation Agency (SIA) of Jammu and Kashmir Police has arrested a key accused in a terrorfunding case involving a former minister, an official said on Saturday.

The chargesheet against former minister Jatinder Singh alias "Babu Singh" and two others were already filed in the case here in September last year.

Singh, chairman of Nature-Mankind Friendly Global Party, was arrested on April 9, last year, within days after he went underground following the arrest of his worker Mohammad Shareef Shah, a resident of south Kashmir's Kokernag, along with Rs 6.90 lakh hawala money in Jammu.

Shah had revealed that he was tasked by Singh, a resident of Kathua district, to collect the money, intended to be used for the anti-national activities, from Srinagar.

In another major success in the case, the official said Mohd Sharief Chechi, one of the wanted accused, was arrested by SIA Jammu from border township of Uri in north Kashmir's Baramulla district.

After taking over the investigation of the case, the official said SIA busted the modus operandi adopted by the accused including Chechi who used to collect narcotics from across the Line of Control to generate proceeds for terror funding.

"There is a well organized syndicate including Mohd Rafiq Najar and Farooq Ahmad Naikoo operating from Dubai who were infusing narcotics into the Indian territory for generating terror funds, to fuel subversive activities challenging the sovereignty, integrity and security of India," the official said.

Further investigation into aspects of cross LoC operation of this narco smuggling and terror funding syndicate is ongoing at SIA Jammu, the official said.

The case was initially registered at Gandhi Nagar police station in Jammu following arrest of Shah on specific information that he along with the former minister were working under the directions of Pakistan's ISI and their agents to fund Jammu-based separatists to carry out subversive activities.

Bogus Claims, Bogus Caste:Marriage Infested by Caste in Kashmir

What right does this shallow system have to deny people their will to choose their partners for their personal life, and their happiness?

Socio-cultural factors such as caste, socio-economic status, and communal homogeneity are so deeply ingrained that some individuals in Kashmiri culture opt for remaining single instead of pursuing inter-caste marriages. In this particular context, Kashmiri culture diverges from religious and ethical guidelines regarding marriage and marital customs

'hy are marriages on an unhealthy pause and delay in Kashmir? Are there reasons that cannot be helped or is our ignorance the elephant in the room? Why can't people marry within other castes if they really want to? Why does marrying into 'lower' castes feel worse than death itself for the 'higher' castes? Why is Kashmir enveloped by buzzing utterings like "Aes roazov ne kaensi buth haavnas layakh' "Lukh kya vanan" "Aes chhu panun aezzat". Why are we enslaved by a hollow system running on bolstered arrogance and ego, both of which are the mites that eat away at the moral fabric of society through manifestations of superiority as prejudice and discrimination? Allah says in the Quran: "It will be said to them, "Enter the gates of Hell, to stay there forever." What an evil home for the arrogant!"

In Kashmir, like in many other societies, there is a complex system of social hierarchy among Muslims. In theory, Islam opposes caste barriers, emphasizing equality among all people. An individual's status should be determined by piety and virtuous qualities, not descent or heredity. However, in practice, the Muslim community in Kashmir, like in other parts of India, remains divided and influenced by caste distinctions. Certain castes are considered superior, while others are viewed as inferior. Many Kashmiri youth are unmarried when their biologically, socially and preferentially sound age has passed. and all this due to a construct which is basically just a rotten carcass. People cannot marry exercising their free will but have to go down the predetermined (by ignorance and arrogance, of course) path of separation. This almost-blasphemous sense of superiority stems from pride which is strongly denounced in Islam. The Hadith narrated on the authority of 'Abdullah b. Mas'ud that the Messenger of Allah () observed: "...none shall enter Paradise who has in his heart the weight of a mustard seed of pride."(Sahih Muslim) is enough for us to introspect and retrospect. When Islam doesn't condone pride how can we even claim to be Godfearing and abiding Muslims when we have so much pride and prejudice in our hearts?

In the past, groups like Syeds, Peers, and Ulemas held significant influence due to their lineage tracing back to Prophet Muhammad and their religious knowledge, while others like the Wattals, Wagays, and Dums are at the lower rungs because of their occupation and perceived ignorance. However, modernisation, education, secularisation, and economic progress have challenged their monopoly. People now follow them partially, as others have gained better religious knowledge. Additionally, interaction and economic prosperity have reduced the distance between upper and lower castes, although some caste-based distinctions persist, particularly in marriage customs. The sole instance where lineage distinctions remain relevant is during the arrangement of marriages for their children. Specifically, Syeds prefer not to form marital connections with individuals from lower castes. There were no reported marriages between high-caste boys and girls with counterparts from lower castes according to a study.

In fact, research suggests that one of the potential causes behind marriage delay in the context of Kashmir is the caste and family background the families resort to extremes that are they either do not compromise a bit over caste and family match or they do a huge compromise by joining the poles apart in terms of the caste and family atmosphere (Ifraat o Tafreet).

Caste inherently represents a hierarchical system of graded inequality, wherein individuals within the hierarchy are both subject to oppression from those above them and may perpetrate oppression upon

those below them.

The practice of caste as a determinant in marriage alliances in India dates back 1900 years, coinciding with the cessation of intermarriage between individuals from North and South India. In light of these findings, a study conducted by the Department of Sociology at the University of Kashmir reveals that 55% of the valley's population remains unmarried, with caste-based discrimination emerging as a primary factor contributing to this phenomenon.

So many Kashmiris remain

unmarried beyond the appropriate age due to their inability to find a 'suitable match' within their caste. The prevalence of endogamy, the practice of marrying within specific social, religious, caste, or ethnic groups, is widespread among Muslim societies. This practice not only results in delayed marriages but also fosters sentiments of animosity, disdain, oppression, psychological distress, remorse, substance abuse, post-marital discord, and strained relationships. Allah says, in the Quran, "O humanity! Indeed, We created you from a male and a female, and made you into peoples and tribes so that you may get to know one another. Surely the most noble of you in the sight of Allah is the most righteous among vou...". This verse emphasizes that Allah has directed His message to all of humanity to discourage biases stemming from factors such as race, skin colour, language, place of origin, or nationality. Hence, in Islam, discrimination based on caste is strictly prohibited. A person's worthiness is determined by their moral character, regardless of their race, nationality, or caste. Those who lack such moral character are invariably considered inferior, irrespective of whether they are black or white, Syed or Andrabi, Rather or Ganie. All individuals are equal in the eyes of Allah. In general matters and especially in the matters of marriage, we need to be humble and think of everyone as well as ourselves as servants of God with no ranks or entitlements. The Quran says, "The true servants of the Most Compassionate are those

who walk on the earth humbly..."

The truth of the caste system is that it is a bogus socio-economic construct whether we are talking about caste in the generic Indian or in the specific, local context of Kashmir. It is an organised system, perpetuated skilfully by the influential groups to define their identity through the way of power.

Narendra Jadhav's article rings a bell here in which he says, "I sincerely believe that the caste system in India is the most brilliantly administered scam in the history of human society. It is so intricate and well-designed that it has continued for ages."

The various castes of Kashmir are mere scams and social constructs because the caste system in Kashmir is not mentioned in any ancient Kashmiri texts. The earliest mention of the caste system in Kashmir is found in the writings of Persian and European travellers from the 16th and 17th centuries. This suggests that the system was not indigenous to Kashmir, but was introduced by outsiders. Furthermore, the caste system in Kashmir is not based on any religious doctrine. The Hindu concept of varna, which is the basis of the caste system in other parts of India, is not relevant to Kashmir.

Attempting to integrate caste into existing institutional frameworks could be misleading because caste is a complex and ambiguous institution. This ambiguity is reinforced by its deep connection to sacred beliefs and experiences, resulting in strong emotional reactions when it is violated. Consequently, it diminishes agency for some individuals while empowering others.

The explicit rejection of the

popular notion of "essentialism," which ascribes unchangeable identities to social groups like race, gender, or caste, and perpetuates enduring power imbalances among these groups has been reiterated by many scholars. For example, essentialism portrays 'lower' castes as 'inferior' and 'uncivilised' due to their 'inherent inferiority' or 'impurity', reinforcing the idea that the 'higher' castes are inherently 'pure and scholarly.' While categorising caste as an institution, they consider it a "guarded institution," one that is morally accepted and inviolable, with its practices vigorously defended by influential elites. These practices include perpetuating caste through discreet means, such as arranged endogamous marriages, using caste-specific last names, and embedding caste distinctions in everyday interactions like touch, gaze, voice, and silence. This is exactly how the 'higher' castes like how the Syeds and Peers in Kashmir have been propagating their ideology as a sanctified, inviolable, rather 'untouchable' caste system.

Caste's influence extends beyond individual perspectives, sometimes arising from market relationships or becoming embedded in other systems of interaction. It's the adaptability of caste, rather than the perpetuation of a specific cultural or social institution, that explains its lasting presence. What distinguishes individuals from privileged castes from those in lower castes is the opportunity for the former group to experience the relative insignificance of caste in their lives. They can leverage their accumulated caste privilege to access resources without their caste being a defining factor. In contrast, the lower castes carry an inescapable caste identity that overshadows all other aspects of their identity, making them highly visible in their claims for justice.

Rightfully, we only have one criterion for choosing a spouse, and that is the attribute of religiousness in a person. It was narrated from Abu Hurairah that: the Prophet said: "A woman may be married for four things: Her wealth, her lineage, her beauty or for her religion. Choose the religious, may your hands be rubbed with dust (i.e., may you prosper)." (Sunan Ibn Majah). We should not condemn intercaste marriages as there are no Islamic rulings to condemn them. Shaykh 'Abd al-'Azeez ibn Baaz said, "What every Muslim must do is not accept customs blindly, rather he should measure them against shari'ah...Whatever Allah and His Messenger have permitted is permissible, and whatever Allaah has forbidden must be abandoned, even if it is the people's custom."

If two people consensually want to marry and are religiously upright, there can be no valid reason, whether personal or societal, for their guardians to disallow the marriage. The best step for such folks would be to marry straightaway! This claim can be substantiated by a narration from Ibn Abbas that: the Messenger of Allah said: "There is nothing like marriage, for two who love one another." (Sunan Ibn Majah).

Now that caste has been deconstructed into just the ruins of an exploitative skit, we come back to ask the question with even more anger and bitterness-What right does this shallow system have to deny people their will to choose their partners for their personal life, and their happiness? In this day and age, with all the resources of knowledge on religion, justice, equality and ethics— deen and dunya at our fingertips, we cannot afford to be as ignorant and regressive as our ancestors who lived in the darkness of oblivion. We need to see the truth behind the constructed and brilliantly orchestrated caste system, deemed falsely as a cultural asset, which it most definitely is not. In fact, in following and propagating it, we are going against the basic principles of humaneness and even our respected religion. It's high time we let go of the suspension of disbelief, tear the fourth wall down, see things for what they are and refuse to be strangled by hollow shackles. We need to become responsible for all the knowledge we have been using recklessly as power till now. It is impertinent that we preach the right things first and foremost, then practice what we preach to its core, with honour and perseverance.

Monolithic Madness: How Comfortable Are You With Difference?

From time immemorial, both macro and micro power structures have utilised the idea of a homogeneous society to maintain control, gain wealth and demonise anything that threatens such endeavours. Whether it be through fashion trends and other commodities, state-dictated school curriculums or moral values, we've been conditioned to subconsciously fall in line, with our 2.4 children in tow. Anyone that goes against the grain is rebellious, uncivilised, dangerous or just plain weird.

We needn't look much further than social media's heavily filtered faces or the weather-independent rainbows that bombard our senses through every social media platform to see that this obsession with a societal monolith is evident in every corner of our present day affairs. Often masked as the epitome of individual autonomy, our socially accepted uniform is consistently being refashioned at the whim of those who make the decisions, with criminalisation or ostracization the fate of those who don't agree. Whites are superior, women are property and moustaches are cool. Until suddenly, they're not.

Where do Muslims stand?

As Muslims, our stance against homogeneity is two-fold. By default, our religion makes us at variance from the global-secular status quo that has rapidly gained fervour post European enlightenment. However, we are also one body that comes in varying shades, cultures, opinions, socioeconomic and political situations. We dress in the traditionally bright Kente weaves of Ghana, the Baju Kurungs of Malaysia and the Zara culottes of London. We navigate life as Muslim-minorities, Muslim-majorities,

under democracies and dictatorships, with varying degrees of religious opinion and manifestation.

Externally, we don't fit into the global societal monolith. Internally, a Muslim monolithic ideal simply can't exist. Our very essence has been created with diversity at its core, and living in a multicultural and pluralistic global society, we're certainly no stranger to Allah's Divine words:

"O mankind, indeed We have created you from male and female and made you peoples and tribes that you may know one another. Indeed, the most noble of you in the sight of All h is the most righteous of you. Indeed, All h is Knowing and Aware." (Surah Al Hujurat 49:13)

"...To each of you We prescribed a law and a method. Had All h willed, He would have made you one nation, but [He intended] to test you in what He has given you." (Surah Al Ma'idah 5:48)

Given the innateness of diversity in Allah's creation, surely Muslims aren't naïve enough to have internalised the world's monolithic obsessions, or have we? We certainly pay lip service to Allah's oft-quoted verses promoting diversity, tolerance and harmony, but whether or not we've actually internalised these values in our everyday lives is a different kettle of fish. Unfortunately, the biggest cracks often appear when we consider our day to day lives and circles of interaction within our own Muslim communities. For many of us (especially those of us growing up in a multicultural society or those possessing a brand new zeal for religiosity), our barriers often transcend externally identifiable differences and instead pertain to ideas, choices and strategies of approach.

From the way converts are bundled together in isolation – overseeing the magnitude of their differences and the beautiful



practises of our beloved Prophet who paired the ansar and muhajireen together in order to build brotherhood – to the 'are you Sufi/Salafi/ Tablighi/Ikhawani?' questions that precondition our communication, collaboration and support. We are deep within a cancel culture (1), and this isn't just limited to the hands of the takfir yielding men of speakers corner, but more subtlety by the exclusivity of our gatherings and the singular narrative of those we spend time with.

Breaking our echo-chambers

Research suggests as humans we commonly seek information that supports our own views, thereby being more likely to ignore information that doesn't confirm our existing opinions. This confirmation bias (2) acts as a barrier, making it harder for us to

beneficially interact with alternative modes of thought. Whilst human nature dictates that we are most comfortable surrounding ourselves with those who validate our choices and share similar sentiments, there are ample benefits to be had from breaking our algorithmic echo-chambers (3). This effort certainly isn't easy, but it's an effort very much worth taking.

By isolating ourselves amongst agreeable minds, we run the risk of becoming insular, ill-informed and unable to digest alternative perspectives (irrespective of their truth). This manifests itself in individuals and groups that are diametrically cut off from an avenue of potential growth and development. Exposing and familiarising ourselves with divergent views and opinions helps us grow by affording us ample opportunity to practise a vastness in love, tolerance, mercy and compassion. It's easy to be good with those just like us, but the real test is in exhibiting the beautiful characteristics of the Prophet

with brothers and sisters whose opinions differ from our own. This is also aside from the fact that we might actually gain a novel insight that brings benefit to our lives; we might expand our worldview, or we might strengthen our pre-existing ideas.

Moreover, exposure to divergent thinking (4) forces us to come up with breakthrough ideas that allows us to unite as an ummah in those issues that really matter. Being familiar with difference means it's no longer viewed as a threat, and this makes room for the innovative, harmonious collaboration that is needed for a unified Muslim community working for a collective wellbeing. You and I might never end up in exactly the same head space, but we need to find ground-breaking ways to work together in sisterhood, cooperation and unity for the

As Carl Jung once remarked, 'where your fear is, there is your task'.

A Prophetic example

We know that understanding other people's perspectives is a key leadership skill (5) and one that our beloved Prophet Muhammad exemplified time and time again. In this spirit, it's worth ending on a prophetic anecdote that beautifully encapsulates our Beloved's approach to navigating difference through co-operation. Commonly cited as a paradigm of conflict resolution, before prophethood, the Prophet tasked with mediating a dispute that arose amongst the clans of Mecca. It had been decided that the Kaaba would be rebuilt after being destroyed by floods, but each clan believed they had the right to put the black stone back in its rightful place. This dispute became so serious that the threat of bloodshed became imminent. The Prophet innovatively suggested that the black stone be placed in a large cloak and collectively carried into place. Each clan representative took hold of a portion of the cloth, in unison they lifted the stone in place and each fulfilled a right they believed to be theirs.

As Muslims, our unity does not entail uniformity. Working with and embracing our differences can have beautiful results both for us as individuals and as one ummah. So, next time you interact with your friends, attend a gathering, or choose where to spend your time, look around and genuinely ask yourself: am I exposing myself to diverse perspectives and the growth that it affords or am I fearfully trapped in a monolithic echo chamber?

Study Puts Forth New Bajra Cultivation Map, **Triggered By Changing Climate, Crop Yield**

esearchers are urging for a reappraisal of the pearl millet, or 'bajra', cultivation map of India, triggered by climate change. Amidst shifting weather patterns and evolving agricultural priorities, they are calling for a timely revision of the classification criteria governing pearl millet cultivation zones, originally established

They have put forth their proposed changes in the study by the International Crops Research Institute for the Semi-Arid Tropics (ICRISAT), Hyderabad, and the Indian Council of Agricultural Research - All India Coordinated Research Project on Pearl Millet (ICAR-AICRP), using data from ICRISAT's District Level Database (DLD). It is published in the journal Agronomy.

The changes suggest re-evaluating

the A zone, shown in the map as covering semi-arid regions in North and Central India. While A1 covers arid regions in Rajasthan, B denotes semi-arid regions with heavy soils in South India. These zones are currently based on rainfall and soil type, the study said.

"The existing A zone can be broken down into three distinct subzones: G, AE1, and AE2, covering the states in North and Central India. The G zone encompasses Gujarat, AE1 covers East Rajasthan and Haryana, and AE2 covers Uttar Pradesh," said Vincent Garin, Post-Doctoral Fellow at ICRISAT and one of the study authors.

"The proposed new zones take into account the complexity of the system in response to changing climate conditions. While the existing zoning for the A1 and B zones is generally still applicable, the suggestion is to modify the A zone," said Garin.



According to the new zoning framework, it identifies 'AE1' as the core of

India's pearl millet production, where favourable climate and soil conditions,

along with improved pearl millet varieties, have led to significant yield increases, the

Further, 'AE2' shows promising yield progress and better farming practices, offering potential for export-oriented gains,

The G zone is experiencing more rainfall due to climate changes, which may lead farmers to shift towards cash crops and limit pearl millet cultivation to the summer season, it added.

"This new classification system aims to optimize pearl millet production, to effectively assist policymakers, researchers, and farmers make better evidence-based decisions," said Jacqueline Hughes, Director General of ICRISAT.

The study used digital technology and crop models to re-evaluate the zones, helping design crops and strategies tailored to the current and future climate conditions of each region

India's \$3.8 Trillion Market Moment As G-20 Leaders Meet At Delhi

NEW DELHI: A record stockmarket valuation and surging foreign inflows make for a great backdrop as Prime Minister Narendra Modi looks to tout India's growing prominence to world leaders at this weekend's Group of 20 summit in New

Boosted by one of the world's fastest growing economies, solid corporate earnings and an unprecedented retail investing boom, India's equity benchmark is also approaching an alltime high.

The milestones are a stark contrast to many emergingmarket peers, not least to neighbouring China, whose economic woes and struggling financial markets have become a source of frustration for global investors. In fact, troubles at its biggest EM rival have only burnished India's appeal. Developing-market money managers are now most overweight on India in their Asia portfolios as a "safe place to hide," while China ranks among their largest underweights, Goldman Sachs Group Inc. analysts wrote in a

"Strong domestic growth prospects, ongoing policy reforms as well as robust credit growth are tailwinds contributing to the outperformance of Indian equities," said Audrey Goh, investment strategist at Standard Chartered Bank SG Ltd. "The shift to a multi-polar world would also likely benefit India," with the government moving to make doing business in India more attractive. India's stock market hit an

all-time high valuation of \$3.8 trillion this week, a perfectly timed billboard for PM Modi as the G-20 summit gives him another opportunity to showcase the nation's potential as a geopolitical juggernaut. With the West looking to curb China's influence, PM Modi has rolled out a mix of tariffs and incentives to lure companies to make in India and firms including Apple Inc. and Samsung Electronics Co. are among those expanding production in the nation.

Foreign investors have bought more than \$16 billion worth of Indian stocks on a net basis so far in 2023, set to be the biggest inflow in three years. The na-

tion stood out in August, when overseas funds sold shares in almost every other Asian emerging market amid a global selloff. Onshore Chinese stocks saw a record outflow last month as Beijing's attempts to restore market confidence fell flat with investors amid persistent worries over a property crisis.

"My favorite market in Asia remains India," Chris Wood, the global head of equity strategy at

Jefferies LLC, said in a Bloomberg Television interview this week. Wood described India as the "market I want to be in Asia for the next 10 years," foreseeing strong growth in corporate earnings led by a rejuvenating private investment and real estate cycle.

Having nearly tripled its value since the pandemic low for global equities in March 2020, India is now the world's fifthlargest stock market, data compiled by Bloomberg show. The US has seen its market capitalization about double in the pe-

Milan-based Generali Investments is bullish on India for its economic growth and earnings outlook, according to Michele Morganti, the firm's senior equity strategist. Generali reduced its overweight on China last month as policymakers opt

for limited measures to help companies and boost sentiment over an all-out stimulus plan,

To be sure, there are several risks on the horizon for India.

Resurgent crude oil prices threaten to worsen inflation dynamics for the central bank, which is already troubled by a surge in prices of everyday items from tomatoes to onions. Rupee meanwhile is hovering near a record low.

Investors have to navigate a general election in April-May that some strategists say has the potential to swing markets. In the longer term, market watchers will also closely scrutinize India's ability to build fast and adequate infrastructure, lift education standards and create enough jobs for a burgeoning young population amid a rising threat from the increased use of artificial intelligence.

Aperture Investors ranks among the holdouts that aren't boosting exposure. India needs years of improvements in its infrastructure and private-sector buildout before it can replace China in portfolios, said Peter Marber, the New York-based head of emerging markets at the firm.

"Just because financial investors are retreating from Chinese stocks and bonds doesn't lead to a complete shift to India," Marber said. "There aren't nearly the number of investable companies and assets in India versus in China.'

For now though, markets are looking at the positives. The NSE Nifty 50 Index has jumped almost 6% in dollar terms over the past three months, beating the broader MSCI Emerging Markets Index by more than 7 percentage points.

India is one of the biggest equity overweights at Columbia Threadneedle Investments, which also expects countries including Indonesia, Mexico and Poland to benefit from the near-shoring boom as the US relocates supply chains away from China. The money manager is also bullish on Indian local-currency government bonds and dollar corporate debt as well as the rupee.

"On a relative basis, India could be the biggest winner,' said Gordon Bowers, a Londonbased analyst at the firm.

Taxmen Can Seek Details Of ITRs Filed By Investors In Startups

NEW DELHI: Income tax officials can seek details about ITRs filed by startup investors to ascertain if the amount invested is commensurate with the income shown in their personal ITRs, the I-T department

Replying to a post of former BharatPe co-founder Ashneer Grover on X on Friday, where he flagged that a number of startups have received tax notices in the last one month asking to furnish information about their shareholders, the I-T department said the Finance Act 2012 mandates that the source of funds from a resident shareholder in startup has to be also explained by an investor.

"In the present case, it appears that the AO has sought to examine the genuineness of the transaction and source of investment by the shareholderinvestor, to verify if the amount invested is commensurate with the income shown in the ITRs of the investors.

"Alternatively, if the PANs of the investors are shared with the AO by the company, he can verify the ITRs of the investors," the I-T department said. Section 68 of the I-T Act under

which the Assessing Officer (AO) has made the enquiry about creditworthiness of the shareholder/investor, places initial onus on the assesseecompany (start up in this case) to prove -- identity of the investor, creditworthiness of the investor and genuineness of the transaction.

"Finance Act, 2012 mandated that the nature and source of any sum credited as share capital, share premium etc., in the books of a closely held company (excluding venture capital fund or a venture capital company registered with Sebi) shall be treated as explained u/s 68 only if the source of funds from a resident shareholder is also explained by investor," the I-T department said.

Grover in his post had said that the I-T department is asking startup companies to furnish three-year ITR of all shareholders.

"1) How and why will companies have ITR of shareholders ! 2) Why would a shareholder/individual share their ITR with a private company ?," Grover had posted, adding it's a case of an investor buying equity in a startup and not a case of a startup giving loan to its shareholders

G20 Summit: PM Modi Announces Launch Of Global Biofuel Alliance

NEW DELHI: India on Saturday announced the launch of the Global Biofuel Alliance and urged G20 nations to join the initiative with a plea to take ethanol blending with petrol globally to 20 per cent. Speaking at the G20 Sum-

mit session on 'One Earth', Prime Minister Narendra Modi also proposed to launch the 'G20 Satellite Mission for Environment and Climate Observation' and urged leaders to start working on 'Green Credit Initiative'.

"Today, the need of the hour



is that all countries should work together in the field of fuel blending. Our proposal is to take an initiative at a global-level to take ethanol blending in petrol up to 20 per cent," he said.

"Or alternatively, we could work on developing another blending mix for the greater global good, one that ensures a stable energy supply while also contributing to climate security," PM Modi said at the session attended by US President Joe Biden, Saudi Arabia Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman, UK Prime Minister Rishi Sunak among others.

Income Tax Dept Slaps Notices On Startups Seeking Creditworthiness Of Investors

NEW DELHI: The Income Tax Department has slapped notices on some startups seeking information on creditworthiness of their investors as it looked to verify if the amount invested was commensurate with the income declared by the investors.

The tax department replying to a social media post of BharatPe co-founder and former MD Ashneer Grover, said under the law, the onus was on the assessee-company to provide the identity and creditworthiness of the investors as well as the genuineness of the transaction.

"In the last one month, a number of startups (a few in my portfolio as well) have received Income Tax notices asking to furnish information about shareholders," Grover had said on a post on X, formerly Twitter, on September 8.

"Bahut interesting hai (it is very interesting) - they are asking start-up companies to furnish a 3 year ITR [income tax return of all shareholders."

He went on to ask how and why the startup would have ITR of shareholders. "Why would a shareholder/individual share their ITR with a private company?'

He went on to state that the reason given is to 'to establish creditworthiness of shareholders'. "Why," he asked. Company shareholders aren't given loans and instead are putting equity in the firm, he added, asking the Union Ministry of Finance to look into this.

Replying to him, the Income Tax Department in a post on X said, "Section 68 of Income-tax Act, 1961 (the Act) under which the Assessing Officer (AO) has made the enquiry about creditworthiness of the shareholder/ investor, places initial onus on

the assessee-company to prove the following: a) Identity of the investor, b) Creditworthiness of the investor and c) Genuineness of the transaction."

It went on to state that the "Finance Act, 2012 mandated that the nature and source of any sum credited as share capital share premium etc. in the books of a closely-held company (excluding Venture Capital Fund or a Venture Capital Company registered with SEBI) shall be treated as explained u/s 68 only if the source of funds from a resident shareholder is also explained by investor.'

On the cases raised by Grover, it said: "In the present case, it appears that the AO has sought to examine the genuineness of the transaction and source of investment by the shareholder-investor, to verify if the amount invested is commensurate with the income shown in the ITRs of the inves-

G20 Leaders Decide On Swift Implementation Of Crypto Reporting Framework

NEW DELHI: The G-20 leaders on Saturday decided on swift implementation of the reporting framework for crypto assets, saying a significant number of member nations want information exchange on such non-financial assets to start by 2027.

The Crypto Asset Reporting Framework (CARF) or template is being developed to make sure that such non-financial assets are not used by tax evaders to conceal their unaccounted wealth.

"We call for the swift implementation of the CryptoAsset Reporting Framework ("CARF") and amendments to the CRS. We ask the Global Forum on Transparency and Exchange of Information for Tax Purposes to identify an appropriate and coordinated timeline to commence exchanges by relevant jurisdictions," said the G20 Leaders' declaration, which was adopted by consensus.

The leaders of 20 developing and developed nations have reaffirmed the commitment to continue cooperation towards a globally fair, sustainable and modern international tax system appropriate to the needs of the 21st century.

"We remain committed to the swift implementation of the two-pillar international tax package. Significant progress has been made on Pillar One including the delivery of a text of a Multilateral Convention (MLC), and work on Amount B (framework for simplified and streamlined application of the arm's length principle to incountry

baseline marketing and distribution activities) as well as



the completion of the work on the development of the Subject to Tax Rule (STTR) under Pillar Two," the declaration said.

Briefing reporters after the summit, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman said the G20 countries have made substantial progress on the two-pillar solution.

"Work has happened on exchange of information on immovable property transactions between countries. There is a launch of the pilot programme of the South Asia academy for tax and financial crime investigation in collaboration with the OECD," Sitharaman said.

Under the global tax deal, about 140 countries, including India, have agreed to an overhaul of global tax norms to ensure that multinationals pay taxes wherever they operate and at a minimum of 15 per cent rate. However, some vexed issues still need to be ironed out before its implementation.

The G20 countries called on the OECD to develop an inclusive framework to swiftly resolve the few pending issues relating to the MLC (multilateral convention) with a view to preparing the MLC for signature in the second half of 2023 and completing the work on Amount B by the end of 2023.

Double murder case: SC awards life term to former MP Prabhunath Singh, says state assisted accused

New Delhi: The Supreme Court has awarded life imprisonment to former Lok Sabha MP from Bihar Prabhunath Singh for the killing of two persons on polling day during assembly elections in Saran district in 1995, observing that the state had not prosecuted the case fairly and rather assisted the accused throughout.

On August 18, the apex court convicted Singh in the case, overturning the orders of the trial court and the Patna High Court that had acquitted him.

While sentencing Singh, an apex bench headed by Justice Sanjay Kishan Kaul also imposed a total fine of Rs 25 lakh on the RJD leader.

Referring to Section 357 of the Code of Criminal Procedure (CrPC), which deals with the order to pay compensation, the apex court noted that Clause (a) provides for defraying the expenses incurred in the prosecution.

"We are not inclined to grant any such expenses to the state considering the fact that the state in fact did not prosecute the case fairly, rather through-out assisted the accused," the bench, also comprising justices Abhay S Oka and Vikram Nath, said in its judgement delivered on September 1.

It said considering the conduct



of the state and also the amount of trauma and harassment faced by the victim's family, it is of the view that in addition to the damages awarded under section 357 of CrPC, further compensation be awarded under section 357-A of CrPC.

"The state of Bihar will compensate the legal heirs of the two deceased and the injured if alive otherwise her legal heirs in the like amount of the fine awarded above i.e. Rs 10 lakh each to the legal heirs of the deceased Rajendra Rai and Daroga Rai and Rs five lakhs to the injured Devi or her legal heirs, as the case may be," it said.

"Considering the facts and circumstances of the case and the findings recorded by us and also taking into consideration the fact that the incident is of the year 1995, almost 28 years old, awarding death sentence would not be appropriate and as such we award imprisonment for life to respondent no.2 (Singh) under section 302 (murder) IPC along with fine of Rs 20 lakh," the bench said in its September 1 verdict.

The bench, which also sentenced Singh to seven years imprisonment for the offence of attempt to murder along with a fine of Rs five lakh, said

both the sentences would run concurrently.

It said a fine of this magnitude has been awarded considering the "shocking facts and circumstances" of the case which were considered in detail and findings were recorded in the August 18 judgment.

The apex court directed the fine awarded to be paid as damages and Rs 10 lakh each be given to the legal heirs of the deceased.

It said the trial court will get a preliminary enquiry conducted with regard to the legal heirs of the two deceased and the amount will be disbursed to them as per law of succession.

The bench said a fine amount of Rs five lakh would be disbursed in the same manner by the trial court to the injured victim, if she is alive, and if not, to her legal heirs.

It said the amount of fine and compensation be deposited with the trial court within two months, failing which the same shall be recovered as arrears of land revenue by the trial court.

While convicting Singh, the apex court had observed that it was dealing with a case which was an "exceptionally painful episode of our criminal justice system".

The top court had observed

there was not even an iota of doubt that Singh was instrumental in making all possible efforts to "wipe out" the evidence

against him. It had observed the three main stakeholders in a criminal trial -- the investigating officer, the public prosecutor and the judiciary -- have "utterly failed" to discharge the duties and responsibilities cast upon them.

It had noted that an FIR was registered on March 25, 1995 at Chapra on the statement of Rajendra Rai, who said that he along with eight-nine other villagers was returning after casting their votes when a car pulled over.

It was alleged that Singh, who was then contesting the assembly elections as a candidate of the Bihar People's Party, was sitting in the car and enquired as to who they had voted for.

The FIR alleged when Rai answered that they had cast their votes in favour of another political party, Singh opened fire from his rifle and injured three

The offence of murder under section 302 of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) was added later as two out of the three injured, including Rajendra Rai, died during treatment.

The top court had delivered its August 18 verdict on an appeal challenging the December 2021 judgement of the Patna High Court which had dismissed a revision petition and confirmed the trial court order acquitting the accused in the case.

The apex court had not disturbed the acquittal of other accused in the case, saying their names were not reflected either in the dying declaration of Rajendra Rai or in the statement of his mother, who was a court witness.

Singh is currently lodged in Hazaribagh jail after his conviction in the murder of Janata Dal MLA Ashok Singh at the latter's residence in the high-security zone of the Bihar capital in 1995.

One proposed project would link railway and port facilities across the Middle East -including the United Arab Emirates, Saudi Arabia, Jordan and Israel -- potentially speeding trade between India and Europe by up to

Pramit Pal Chaudhuri, South Asia practice head at the Eurasia Group, said a shipping container that today travels from Mumbai, through the Suez Canal to Europe could in the future go by rail from Dubai to Haifa in Israel and on to Europe, saving both money

At present, the Suez Canal is a major bottleneck to world trade, handling roughly 10 percent of global maritime trade but often beset by disruptions.

In March 2021, the giant container ship Ever Given caused a nearly week-long stoppage in Suez traffic after it became lodged diagonally in the waterway. 'Game changer'

At the same time, the plan neatly aligns with several of Washington's goals in the Middle East, and officials say the United States is keen to see the projects take flight.

Biden's administration is actively prodding Riyadh, a major oil producer and security partner, to normalise ties with Israel after decades of conflict and closed borders.

Saudi Arabia has never officially recognised

US involvement could also help mend deeply damaged ties between Riyadh and Washington, which frayed after the US-Iran nuclear deal and the 2018 murder of dissident iournalist Jamal Khashoggi.

According to details seen by AFP, the economic corridor would develop infrastructure to enable the production and transport of "green hydrogen".

It would also strengthen telecommunications and data transfers through a new undersea cable connecting the region.

French President Emmanuel Macron said work was now needed to make the plan "real". All the projects could also help oil-soaked Middle Eastern states wean their economies off dependence on fossil fuels.

Michael Kugelman, South Asia Institute director at The Wilson Center, said the plan could be a significant response to China's much-vaunted Belt and Road Initiative.

The so-called BRI has spread Chinese influence, investments and commerce across Europe, Africa, Asia and Latin America.

"If finalised, it would be a game changer that strengthens connectivity between India and the Middle East and would aim to counter BRI," Kugelman posted on X, formerly known as Twitter.

"We are laying a strong foundation for a developed India. Through PGII (Partnership for Global Infrastructure and Investment), we can play a key role in filling infrastructure gap in Global South countries. India does not limit connectivity into regional borders. We believe connectivity can also play a key role in strengthening mutual trust," he said.

Modi stressed on respecting sovereignty

and integrity of all nations. He also stressed on promoting financial viability rather than debt burden as well as on following all environmental guidelines.

"With such a major step on connectivity, we are sowing the seeds for future growth,' he said.

US President Joe Biden said he was proud to announce that they have finalised a "historic agreement" for the new India-Middle East-Europe Economic Corridor. "This is a big deal," said Biden. "This is a really big deal."

"As key part of this corridor, we are investing in ships and rails, that extends from India to Europe connected by the UAE, Saudi Arabia, Jordan and Israel. It will make it far easier to trade. I want to thank sponsors and particularly Prime Minister Modi and (Saudi Crown Prince) Mohammed bin Salman," he said.

European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen hailed the agreement on the corridor, saying this is nothing but historic. "It will be the most direct connection to date between India, the Arabian Gulf and Europe with a rail link that will make trade between India and Europe 40 per cent faster," she said.

"The Board while issuing the notification (directions all schools to implement books by it) is right in observing that the practice of prescribing textbooks from different private publishers by different private schools results in non-uniformity in curriculum being taught and even instances of controversial content finding way in some textbooks cannot be ruled out," the court said, adding "Therefore, the decision of the Board in prescribing the textbooks published by it for use by the schools and students cannot be interfered with by this Court."

The court held that the Board has the power to prescribe the courses of instructions, prepare curricula and detailed syllabi and also prescribe text books for the Pre-primary, elementary, secondary school and High Secondary (School graduation) and school examinations and Elementary Teachers Training

"It is true that power of the Board to prescribe courses of instructions, prepare curricula, syllabi and to prescribe text books has to be subject to broad educational policies and directions on the subject by the Government but the power of the Board to prescribe books which would include publication of text books, cannot be diluted or taken away."

The only requirement is that these prescribed text books have to be in consonance with the Education Policy in operation as also in conformity with the National Curriculum Framework, the court said.

"The broad educational policies and the instructions of the Government from time to time on the subject guide the Board in prescription of the textbooks."

the Supreme Court, the Ladakh election department rescheduled the local body elections in Kargil from September 10 to October 4. It also reserved the 'plough' symbol for the National Conference.

Holding that the National Conference is entitled to the 'plough' symbol, a Supreme Court bench of Justice Vikram Nath and Justice Ahsanuddin Amanullah on Wednesday dismissed the Ladakh administration's plea opposing its allotment.

The apex court also imposed a cost of Rs 1

lakh on the administration. Earlier, High Court of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh dismissed the Ladakh administration's plea against a single-bench order allowing National Conference candidates to contest the polls on the party symbol.

According to the fresh notification, the process for filing nomination papers for 26 of the total 30-member Ladakh Autonomous Hill Development Council (LAHDC)-Kargil will start on September 9. The last date to file nominations is September 16.

Four councillors with voting rights are nominated by the administration.

The nomination papers will be scrutinised on September 18 while the last date to withdraw candidates is September 20, according to the notification read.

The polling will be held from 8 am to 4 pm. The existing council headed by the National Conference's Feroz Ahmad Khan will complete its full five-year term on October 1. The National Conference and the Congress

have already announced an alliance for the elections -- the first such exercise in the district after Ladakh was declared a Union Territory in August 2019. Assuring free, fair and transparent elec-

India Seek Answer To Middle Order Ahead Of High-Voltage Pakistan Clash

COLOMBO: The Indian team management's predicament to choose between KL Rahul and Ishan Kishan will be the dominating theme amid the usual edgy emotional quotient, when they face arch-rivals Pakistan in the most-awaited Super 4 match of the Asia Cup here on Sunday.

Alongside focusing on the team goals, the Indian management will want to assemble the best possible 11 in the park against Pakistan, whom the Rohit Sharma-led outfit is facing for the second time in the event.

But for that, they need to find answers for the aforementioned puzzle, and hope that rains will stay away despite adding a controversial reserve day to the match on Monday.

The return of Rahul to the squad has widened the pool of players to select from, but that has also given them a happy headache.

Kishan has impressed ev-

eryone in the last month or so, smashing four fifties in as many matches – three against the West Indies and one against Pakistan in the Asia Cup Group A match at Pallekele last week.

So, it seems that Kishan has everything going for him. But Rahul's claim for the No. 5 position is hard to ignore despite the fact that the Bengaluru cricketer has not played an ODI since March this year, courtesy a thigh injury and the ensuing phase of postsurgery convalescence.

The 31-year-old remains one of India's steadiest ODI batters since 2019. In that year, he made 572 runs from 13 matches at 47.67.

While that decision is important for the team to achieve the desired balance, they will also be eager to start the Super 4 with a win notwithstanding the combination they field.

Pakistan have already bagged two points after beating Bangladesh by 7 wickets at Lahore, and another win will



place them comfortably on th way to the final.

So, India will also want to enter the log sheet but they will have to counter a potent Pakistan bowling attack that can make an impact irrespective of the nature of the pitch.

Of course, Rohit and other Indian batters will be wary of the high-paced incoming deliveries of Shaheen Shah Afridi, but the Pakistan bowling unit has other equally explosive performers.

Haris Rauf, with his express pace, is currently topping the Asia Cup bowling chart with 9 wickets from three matches, and seemed to have emerged from the shadows of Afridi (7 wickets).

While Naseem Shah also has taken 7 wickets, ensuring no let off point for opposition batters. Pakistan has an edge on paper in this department, but India will

believe that they have the ammunition to strike back in kind. The return of Jasprit Bumrah, who skipped the league match against Nepal, will bolster India's bowling, while Mohammed Siraj and Shardul Thakur can play the efficient support

But once these two teams enter the arena, factors like playing 11, form, past records etc go irrelevant. It will be a storm force collision on the field.

Bangladesh Board Contradicts Its Own Coach, Terms Indo-Pak 'Reserve Day' Decision As 'Unanimous'

COLOMBO: The Bangladesh Cricket Board has termed Asian Cricket Council's decision to have an exclusive reserve day for India versus Pakistan 'Super Four' game as "unanimous" and taken only after getting consent from all four cricket boards.

Expressing his displeasure, Sri Lanka head coach Chandika Hathurusingha on Friday had termed "not ideal" as Sri Lanka coach Chris Silverwood also had expressed his surprise on the eve of their Super 4 clash.

But hours after their coach's comments, BCB made a surprising announcement saying that the precautionary measure had, in fact, received unanimous approval from all four participating teams in the Super 4 stage.

"A reserve day for India Pakistan contest in Super 11 Asia Cup Super 4 stage has been added that effectively revised the Asia Cup playing condition," BCB posted on their social media account 'X', formerly twitter.

"To clarify on the position, the decision was taken with the consent of all four participating teams and ACC," it added. The Asian Cricket Council

on Friday announced that the much-anticipated Indo-Pak clash could resume on Monday if the rain plays spoil-sport on Sunday.

However, the other matches will not have a reserve day though rain is predicted in the Sri Lankan capital through the Super 4s.

But Hathurusingha was clearly miffed at the late decision to add a reserve day. "It is not ideal, and we also

"It is not ideal, and we also would have liked to have an extra day. But I don't have any more comment on this because they have already made a decision and had they



consulted us earlier we would have given our opinion," he said on Friday at pre-match

presser.

"Little surprised when I first heard," Sri Lanka coach Silverwood had said about ACC's decision to have differ-

ent playing conditions.

The 'Rain God' had its say when the two teams initially clashed in the Asia Cup, re-

sulting in a washout in their opening fixture at Pallekele on September 2.

Rain once again made an appearance during India's first international match against Nepal at the same venue. However, this time, the rain was less persistent, permitting a 23-over chase, which India successfully navigated to secure Super Four berth.

Making mockery of the tournament: Prasad

Former India seamer Venkatesh Prasad, a very vocal social media critic of this current Indian team and the cricket board, also came out hard at the decision and termed it absolute "shamelessness" from the organisers.

"If true this is absolute shamelessness this. The organ-

isers have made a mockery and it is unethical to have a tournament with rules being different for the other two teams.

"In the name of justice, will only be fair if it is abandoned the first day, may it rain harder on the second day and these malicious plans not succeed," Prasad posted on X.

In an advisory the ACC had on Friday stated that a reserve day was incorporated for the Asia Cup 2023 Super 4's match between Pakistan and India.

"If adverse weather suspends play during the Pakistan vs India game, the match will continue on 11th September 2023 from the point it was suspended".

"In such an eventuality, ticket-holders are advised to hold on to their match tickets which will remain valid and will be utilised for the reserve day," the advisory stated.

Opening the International Conference on Combating Sand and Dust Storms, Iran's President Ebrahim Raisi called on countries in the region to create "a fund" to pursue common solutions.

According to meteorologists, sand and dust storms are expected to increase in the countries most vulnerable to climate change.

"About two billion tons of dust enters the atmosphere each year, affecting more than 350 million people," Food and Agriculture Organization Assistant Director-General AbdulHakim Elwaer told the meeting.

New Flaw In Apple Devices Led To Spyware Infection, Researchers Say

Researchers at digital watchdog group Citizen Lab said on Thursday they found spyware they linked to Israeli firm NSO that exploited a newly discovered flaw in Apple devices.

While inspecting the Apple device of an employee of a Washington-based civil society group last week, Citizen Lab said it found the flaw had been used to infect the device with NSO's Pegasus spyware, it said in a statement.

"This shows that civil society is once again serving as the early warning system about really sophisticated attacks," said John Scott-Railton, senior researcher at Citizen Lab, which is based at the University of Toronto's Munk School of Global Affairs and Public Policy.

Citizen Lab did not provide further details on the affected individual or the organization.



The flaw allowed compromise of iPhones running the latest version of iOS (16.6) without any interaction from the victim, the digital watchdog said.

Apple issued new updates on its devices after investigating the flaws reported by Citizen Lab. An Apple spokesperson said it had no further comment, while Citizen Lab urged consumers to update their devices.

A NSO spokesperson said it did not have any immediate comment on the Citizen Lab research. The Israeli firm has been blacklisted by the US government since 2021 for alleged abuses, including surveillance of government officials and journalists.

Cost of building an artificial intelligence product like ChatGPT can be hard to measure

DES MOINES, Iowa: The cost of building an artificial intelligence product like ChatGPT can be hard to measure.

But one thing Microsoftbacked OpenAl needed for its technology was plenty of water, pulled from the watershed of the Raccoon and Des Moines rivers in central Iowa to cool a powerful supercomputer as it helped teach its Al systems how to mimic human writing.

As they race to capitalize on a craze for generative AI, leading tech developers including Microsoft, OpenAI and Google have acknowledged that growing demand for their AI tools carries hefty costs, from expensive semiconductors to an increase in water consumption.

But they're often secretive about the specifics. Few people in lowa knew about its status as a birthplace of OpenAl's most advanced large language model, GPT-4, before a top Microsoft executive said in a speech it "was literally made next to cornfields west of Des Moines."

Building a large language model requires analyzing patterns across a huge trove of human-written text. All of that computing takes a lot of electricity and generates a lot of heat. To keep it cool on hot days, data centers need to pump in water — often to a cooling tower outside its warehouse-sized buildings.

In its latest environmental report, Microsoft disclosed that its global water consumption spiked 34% from 2021 to 2022 (to nearly 1.7 billion gallons, or more than 2,500 Olympic-sized swimming pools), a sharp increase compared to previous years that outside researchers tie to its Al

"It's fair to say the majority of the growth is due to AI," including "its heavy investment in generative AI and partnership with OpenAI," said Shaolei Ren, a researcher at the University of California, Riverside who has been trying to calculate the environmental impact of generative AI products such as ChatGPT.

Rescuers May Try To Remove Sick American Researcher From 3,000 Feet Down In A Turkish Cave

TASELI PLATEAU (Turkey): An American researcher who fell ill almost 1,000 meters (more than 3,000 feet) below the entrance of a cave in Turkey has recovered sufficiently for rescue teams to start the process of moving him out, an operation that could last three or four days, a Turkish official was quoted as saying on Friday.

Mark Dickey, a 40-year-old experienced caver, suddenly became ill with stomach bleeding during an expedition with a handful of others in the Morca cave in southern Turkey's Taurus Mountains. Rescuers from across Europe have rushed there to help treat Dickey and to



extract him from the cave.
"The doctors we sent down
were very successful in treating him," Cenk Yildiz, a regional

official from Turkey's disaster relief agency, AFAD, told the IHA news agency. "We are now in a position to evacuate him." "This is a difficult operation. It would take a (healthy) person 16 hours to come out. This operation will last at least three or four days," Yildiz said. "Our priority is health. Our aim is to conclude this operation without anyone coming under any danger.

coming under any danger.
Another Turkish official said rescuers were waiting for doctors to give the go-ahead for the difficult operation to begin.

Recep Salci, the head of AFAD's search and rescue department, told HaberTurk TV that the plan was to lift Dickey on a stretcher but to use a "security belt" system to lift him through the cave's narrow openings.

"We are trying to expand the narrow areas by making small explosions, by breaking some areas," Salci said.

Doctors gave Dickey IV fluids and 4 liters of blood inside the cave, he said. More than 30 rescuers were inside the cave on Friday afternoon, and teams comprised of a doctor and three or four others take turns staying with the American at all times, Salci said.

"Our aim is to bring him out and to have him hospitalized as soon as possible," he said.

More than 170 people, including doctors, paramedics and experienced cavers, are involved in the rescue operation.
