On Day 4 Forces Launch Massive Mortar Assault

Army's Northern Commander Reviews Operational Situation, Police In Kishtwar Put On Alert

forces Srinagar: Security launched a massive assault with mortar shells to flush out terrorists responsible for the killing of four security forces personnel from a hilly for-est in Jammu and Kashmir's Anantnag district on Saturday, officials said.

The Army's northern commander Lieutenant General Upendra Dwivedi reviewed the operational situation near the site of the gunfight that has been going on for four days.

Security forces have been chasing the terrorists, believed to be two or three in number, since Wednesday.

On the fourth day of the operation, drones and helicopters were used to track and neutralise the terrorists, officials said.

The drones and helicopters were deployed to keep surveillance in the hilly terrain and pinpoint the locations of the terrorists in the forest in

Gadole in the Kokernag area of the south Kashmir district, the officials said.

As the assault was resumed on Saturday morning, the security forces fired several mortar shells towards the forest, they

said. They said there were several cave-like hideouts in the forest area and drones were being used to pinpoint their locations to carry out attacks on them. Drone footage showed a

militant running for cover after one such hideout was hit by shells fired by security forces on Friday.

The Army's northern commander on Saturday visited the site of the gunfight to take stock of the operational situation.

Lt Gen Dwivedi was briefed by the ground commanders on the high-intensity operations, in which hi-tech equipment is being used for surveillance and delivery of firepower, along with the high impact of precision fire being used by the forces.

#LtGenUpendraDwivedi #ArmyCdr, Northern Command reviewed the operational situation on the ongoing operations at #Kokernag forest area in #Anantnag," the Army's Northern Command said in a post on X.

The commander inspected the drone which has been used to survey the area and track the terrorists, the officials said.

He also interacted with troops deployed in the operation, they added. » More On P10

IISc Scientists Develop New Approach To Potentially Detect And Kill Cancer Cells

Scientists at the Indian Institute of Science (IISc) have developed a new approach to potentially detect and kill cancer cells, especially those which form a solid tumour mass.

They have created hybrid nanoparticles made of gold and copper sulphide, which can kill cancer cells using heat, and enable their detection using sound waves, according to a study published in 'ACS Applied Nano Materials'.

Early detection and treatment are key in the battle against cancer, noted the Bengaluru-based IISc in a statement on Monday. Copper sulphide nanopar-



ticles have previously received attention for their application in cancer diagnosis, while gold nanoparticles, which can be chemically modified to target cancer cells, have shown anti-cancer effects.

Madhavi Tripathi and Swathi Padmanabhan are co-first authors. When light is shone on these hybrid nanoparticles, they absorb the light and generate heat, which can kill cancer cells. These nanoparticles also produce singlet oxygen atoms that are toxic for the cells, the release pointed out. Srinagar: The Food Safety Wing of Drugs & Food Control Organization today conducted massive raids in Srinagar city on the trade and sale of illicit cigarettes.

During the raids many stores and vendors were found selling cigarettes without the mandatory pictorial warnings on packets thereof. Huge cache of such cigarettes worth Rs 101850 were seized from various markets during the inspections, under section 7 of the Cigarettes and Other Tobacco Products (Prohibition of Advertisement and Regulation of Trade and Commerce, Production, Supply and Distribution) Act, 2003

(COTPA).

As per the act, 40% of the front of all tobacco product packages be covered with pictures of health warnings intended to alert people to the potential dangers of using such products.

Commissioner, FDA, J&K has issued strict instructions to all the officers of food safety to crackdown on such violators and offenders in their respective Jurisdictions, to ensure effective Implementation of **COTPA 2003.**

All the Food Business vendors are informed that sale of any kind of the Tobacco products, without pictorial and statutory warning is a punishable Offence with an imprisonment up to 6 months.

Srinagar: Residents of Kathi Darwaza, Rainawari and its adjoining areas on Saturday staged a protest against the authorities, demanding immediate rollback of the order, directing people not to visit Badamwari Park during morning and evening hours.

Dozens of people including those visiting the park on a daily basis staged a protest here against the order, which they described as arbitrary. They urged the administration to immediately revoke the order for the larger interest of the public. 'We frequently visit this park

for morning and evening walks,

however the recent order directing people not to visit the Badamwari during morning and evening hours came as a shocker for everyone. We want immediate rollback of the order," a protester was heard saying in a viral video outside Badamwari Park.

He said on one hand the authorities make tall claims of healthy drugs free Kashmir, while on the other hand elderly people are barred from morning and evening brisk walks.

'We failed to understand as to what made the authorities to issue such an order which is unacceptable to everyone. Why should we stop visiting Badamwari, does the government think that people

CM Strips Ministers Of Security

Srinagar-: The State Chief Minister, Dr. Farooq Abdullah has ordered his ministers and senior officers of the administration not to use pilot jeeps, except when they are on tour outside Jammu and Srinagar cities.

The Chief Minister also ordered the measures to economise manpower and to reduce inconvenience to general public. The CM's order states there shall be only one escort jeep for ministers and chief secretary while other senior officers shall be given only a PSO and a gunman for their security.

"Sirens on official vehicle would not be used henceforth," an official press release said here this evening. The ministers and senior officers have been asked not to use flags within Jammu and Srinagar cities.

Only the vehicles of ministers and chief secretary would use red lights. The CM has also directed to ensure smooth flow of traffic in the interest of general public with due regard to security aspect.

Canada Hits Pause On Trade Mission To India After Tensions At G20 Summit

anada has announced it would postpone an October trade mission to India, in the midst of strained relations between the two countries.

A spokesperson for Canadian Trade Minister Mary Ng confirmed the change on Friday, though no reason was offered for the delay.

"At this time, we are postponing the upcoming trade mission to India," the spokesperson, Shanti Cosentino, said.

Earlier in the day, anonymous Indian officials also told reporters that negotiations over a trade deal were on hold, due to objections over "political developments in Canada".

In May, Ng and her Indian counterpart, Piyush Goyal, had issued a joint statement saying they hoped to boost trade and investment between their two countries by the year's end.

But those talks have hit several high-level snags. Most recently, during last weekend's Group of 20 (G20) summit in New Delhi, Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi chose not to hold a formal bilateral meeting with Canadian leader Justin Trudeau, a decision many perceived to be a snub.

Modi also pulled Trudeau aside to criticise Canada's handling of recent Sikh protests. Videos circulated in June

showing a controversial parade float in Brampton, Ontario, that was themed after the assassination of Indira Gandhi. The former Indian prime minister had been killed by her Sikh bodyguards in 1984 after she ordered military action against

Sikh separatists at the Golden Temple in the state of Punjab. The parade float sparked furore in the Indian government, which called the display a celebration of separatist violence. On Sunday, in a press release after Modi's encounter with Trudeau, the Indian government reiterated its "strong concerns about continuing anti-India activities" in Canada. "Extremist elements" in the country, the press release said, were "inciting violence against Indian diplomats, damaging diplomatic premises, and threatening the Indian community in Čanada".

However, since his election in 2014, Modi has been accused of overseeing a rising tide of conservative Hindu nationalism in India, while minority groups in the country raise concerns about threats to their human rights.

Canada, meanwhile, has the largest Sikh population outside of Punjab. Among them are separatists who hope to create an independent Sikh state called Khalistan in northern India

Wet-Hot Extreme Weather To Become Frequent Due To Climate Change: Study

NEW DELHI: Simultaneous rainfall and heat extremes will become more frequent, severe and widespread due to climate change, more so than dry-hot

conditions, scientists say. For every 1 degree Celsius rise in temperature, the air's capacity to hold moisture increases by 6 to 7 per cent. The hot-and-humid air,

thus, makes more water available to fall as rain, making wet-hot extremes likelier, the scientists said in their study published in the journal Earth's Future. Events such as floods and

landslides could become frequent because, under wet-hot conditions, the heat waves first dry out the soil, thereby reducing its ability to absorb water. Subsequent rainfall has a

harder time penetrating the soil and instead runs along the surface, contributing to flooding, landslides and ruining crop yields, they said. Wet-hot extremes will also

cover a larger area and be more severe than dry-hot extremes, they projected. While regions such as South

Africa, the Amazon and parts of Europe are expected to become drier, many regions, including the eastern United States, eastern and southern Asia, Australia and central Africa, will receive more precipitation, the researchers found using climate models under the current emissions scenario.

The regions likely to be hit hard by such "compound climate extremes" include many heavily populated areas already prone to geologic hazards, such as landslides and mudflows, and which produce many of the world's crops.

"These compound climate extremes have attracted considerable attention in recent decades due to their dispro-

The European floods of 2021 are an example of the world already experiencing wet-hot extremes.

That summer, record-high temperatures dried out the soil. Soon after, heavy rainfall poured across the parched soil's surface and triggered massive landslides and flash floods, washing away houses and claiming lives.

Climate adaptation strategies should thus account for wet-hot conditions.

"If we overlook the risk of compound wet-hot extremes and fail to take sufficient early warning, the impacts on water-food-energy security would be unimaginable," said Haijiang Wu.



Congress says Bharat Jodo Yatra 2.0 from east to west 'under consideration'

HYDERABAD: The Congress on Saturday said Bharat Jodo Yatra 2.0 is "under consideration" with some CWC members requesting that it be undertaken from the eastern part of the country to the west.

Addressing a briefing on the deliberations of the first meeting of the reconstituted Congress Working Committee (CWC) here, senior Congress leader P Chidambaram said members of the party's top decision-making body have requested to organise a "Bharat Jodo Yatra 2.0 from

east to west". "That matter is under consideration," he said in response to a question about organising the second edition of the Bharat Jodo Yatra. Former Congress president Rahul Gandhi had undertaken the Bharat Jodo Yatra from Kanyakumari to Kashmir from September 7, 2022, to January 30 this year.

The Congress leaders have said the 136-day march, covering 4,081 kilometres in 12 states and two Union territories, 75 districts and 76 Lok Sabha constituencies, left an indelible impression on people's minds. During the course of the yatra, Gandhi addressed 12

public meetings, more than 100

street-corner meetings and 13 press conferences. He had over 275 planned walking interactions and more than 100 sitting interactions.

Several experts had said a big takeaway from the yatra for the Congress had been Gandhi's image transformation.

With over 4,000 kilometres under his belt, Gandhi had managed to catch the attention of his supporters as well as detractors. Gandhi said he, through his lawyer, has also filed a complaint in the district and sessions court in Shivaji

(for not filing a case against Bhide). Since no action was taken on our application, we had to approach the court and file a complaint of defamation against Bhide," he said.

Gandhi, along with his advocate and some others, had visited the Deccan Gymkhana police station and filed a complaint against the right-wing leader, seeking registration of a case against him under IPC sec-

tions 153A (promoting enmity between different groups), 499 (defamation) and 505 (statements conducing public mischief). "Bhide made derogatory remarks not just against Bapu, but also against his family," Gandhi had then said. Bhide is accused of making offensive remarks about Mahatma Gandhi's lineage while speaking at a programme in Amravati district in eastern Maharashtra in the last week of July. Following his remarks, first information reports (FIRs) were registered in Amravati and Nashik against Bhide, the founder of the Shri Shiv Pratishthan Hindustan outfit.

Pak Court Objects to Reopening of **Bhagat Singh's Sentencing Case**

LAHORE: A Pakistani court on Saturday raised an objection on a plea to reopen the case of Independence war hero Bhagat Singh's sentencing in 1931 and to set it aside by exercising the principles of review and honour him with posthumous state awards.

Historic India Club Calls Last Orders In London

LONDON: The India Club in London, with its early roots in the Indian independence movement as a hub for nationalists and a home away from home for Indians in the country over the years, will close permanently on Sunday.

With its walls adorned with photographs of prominent Indians such as former prime ministers, the Club's founding member was Krishna Menon - who went on to become the first High Commissioner of independent India to the UK. As well as housing one of the UK's early Indian restaurants, India Club quickly transformed into a hub for a rapidly growing British South Asian community in the aftermath of Indian independence.

"We have been completely rushed off our feet since the public found out we were closing on September 17," said Phiroza Marker, the manager of

the Club. "We are closing but looking for new premises in the vicinity to relocate to," she said.

Parsi-origin Yadgar Marker has been running the establishment with his wife Freny and daughter Phiroza since they rescued it from ruin in 1997 as the director of Goldsand Hotels Limited

The family had launched a "Save India Club" appeal and won an initial battle to prevent the building from partial demolition a few years ago when they were served a notice by the landlords to make way for a more modernised hotel. However, with the rents being hiked exponentially amid a cost-of-living crisis, it has spelt the end of the road for the venue.

Nostalgic visitors who have been frequenting this little slice of India in central London, offering hot dosas and pakoras within a dwelling steeped in history, feel bereft at the loss.



'It's simply heart-breaking. A slice of Indian history on the Strand will be lost forever," said British Indian historian and journalist Shrabani Basu. "As an Indian journalist

based in London, it was our

watering hole. There will be no more beer and pakoras at the historic bar. We will miss it," she said

Smita Tharoor, the Londonbased daughter of one of the other founder members of India Club - journalist Chandran Tharoor, has been a regular visitor with her brother Congress MP Shashi Tharoor, and other family members.

"Many of the former leaders and founders of the In-

dia League created the India Club to offer a home away from home for Indians living in London. My father regaled us with its stories when we were growing up in India," she shared.

"For me, the closure of the club is something very emotional and sad because it is the end of my father's memories that have been kept alive for so many years and where I could visit whenever I missed him. He died very young at the age of 63 in 1993. This is not just a place to eat Indian food. This is a place that gives us stories of the past," she said.

Ms Tharoor recalls how the Club has counted the likes of Dr Rajendra Prasad, the first President of independent India, and Lord Mountbatten - the last Viceroy of India - among its many distinguished visitors, and has been a little corner of India for many living in or visiting the UK capital. "Menon intended the India

Indian professionals living on a shoestring could afford to eat, discuss politics, and plan their futures," noted Parvathi Raman, Founding Chair of the Centre for Migration and Diaspora Studies at the School of Oriental and African Studies (SOAS), when she worked on the exhibition 'A Home Away from Away: The India Club' in 2019, curated by the UK's conservation charity National Trust.

The Club has functioned as an Indian restaurant since 1946 on the first floor of the 26room Strand Continental Hotel. The freeholder of the building, Marston Properties, had earlier put in an application with Westminster City Council for a "partial demolition" to create a new hotel. The application was unanimously turned down by the Council in August 2018, noting the venue's importance as a cultural institution in the heart of London.

Inching Towards Policy Of Zero Terrorism In J&K: DGP

Homage Paid To Martyrs Of Anantnag, **Rajouri** Operations

SRINAGAR: Stating that terrorism in Union Territory is at its lowest level with the killing of around 49 terrorists this year so far, the Director General of police (DGP) Dilbag Singh said

on Saturday that "we are moving inch by inch" towards the policy of zero terrorism in Jammu and Kashmir.

Speaking at the 3rd Regional Northern Police Coordination Committee meeting held at the Confer-

ence Hall of Police Headquarters here on Saturday, the DGP said that there was a time when security forces were pelted with stones every Friday.

"Now that is over. The J&K security team has been able to ensure zero violation of human rights and there has not been a single civilian casualty in any law & order engagement over the last few years," he said.

"We are moving inch by inch towards the policy of zero terrorism in Jammu and Kashmir", he added.

The meeting chaired by J&K DGP was attended by senior officers of Police departments of Northern States/Union Territories and officers of Central armed police forces (CAPFs/ CPOs). The meeting was aimed to enhance Inter-State Police coordination besides addressing various policing issues effectively across the North-Indian States/UTs.

Maintaining that terrorism in J&K is at its lowest level, the DGP said that this year J&K security team has been able to neutralize around 40 foreign terrorists and 9 local terrorists.

"Local involvement in terrorist activities has drastically come down. Optimum synergy among the forces have pushed terrorists out of villages & cities to mountains," he added.

Expressing gratitude to the people for their cooperation to the forces, the DGP said that 'enforcement of rule of law was one single guideline for the security team of J&K.

"Action has been taken against the people involved in any anti national activity as well as against instigators," he said

The DGP said that the officers have made very good recommendations which will be taken up with the government at higher level for incorporation while planning and framing policies for law enforcement. The officers who attended the

He said that the DGP Chandigarh, Spl DG CID J&K, Spl DG Crime J&K, ADGP Jammu, Director SKPA Udhampur, ADGP Kashmir, ADGP L&O Haryana, ADGP L&O Uttarakhand, IG NIA New Delhi, DIG Training NCRB New Delhi, SSP Chandigarh & DySP Uttarakhand gave Power-Point presentations on different topics in which various policing practices on crime control, narco smuggling, joint training, anti terror actions, cyber crime, sharing of information/intelli-

gence were discussed. "Besides this the police leadership also discussed a wide range of topics related to terrorism, drug menace, increasing trend in cybercrime, drone usage for dropping drugs & contrabands from across the border," the spokesperson said.

He said that threadbare discussions were also held on topics like creation of Inter-State database and Communication channels between Police forces, sharing of intelligence about organised crime, human trafficking for better coordination.

DRY WEATHER CONDITIONS **Water Level In Jhelum Drops To 70-Year Low**



Water Level At Sangam Dips To 0.09 Feet; 2.15 Feet At Ram Munshibagh: I&FC Agencies

SRINAGAR: The persisting dry weather across the valley has brought down the water level in Jhelum to 70 -year low in

the month of September. The valley has been witnessing dry weather for more than a month, which has complicated the problems of water scarcity and irrigation for the farmers.

While the southern parts of the valley have recorded rainfall on Friday and Saturday, central and north parts of the valley continue to reel under dry weather conditions.

As per the data shared by the Irrigation and Flood Control Department, the water level at Sangam has dropped to 0.09 feet.

They said it was the lowest water level recorded in the water body in the last 70 years in the month of September. Sangam as per the officials

is the guiding factor to determine the water level in River Jhelum, which is the main waterway of Kashmir.

Official records also suggest that the water level at Ram Munshi Bagh had dropped to 2.15 feet.

At Asham, the current water level is 1.6 feet. Officials said the water level at both these points is also lowest recorded in the recent past.

Officials said the lowest water level recorded in Jhelum in the month of September so far has been 0 feet in the year 2019 and 2021.

They said the valley has not received sufficient rainfall for the last two months due to which the water body has almost dried up.

"In July, we received good rainfall and at the time a flood alert was issued. The valley has been witnessing a dry now for

the last three months. Ihelum, which is the main water body, has almost dried up at many places," officials said

Chief Engineer Irrigation and Flood Control Department Naresh Kumar said the valley has witnessed one of the driest September this year.

"September never used to be drier like this before. The valley has not recorded rains for a long time now, which affected Jhelum drastically," he said.

The residents who are living along banks and in houseboats also said they have witnessed this phenomenon for the first time.

"During autumn and winter, the water level drops in Jhelum but this is probably the lowest water level we have witnessed so far. Currently, the surface of the river is visible," said Mohammad Monis, a resident of Rajbagh.

Pertinently, the weather man has predicted hot and dry weather to continue in Jammu and Kashmir for a week ahead—(KNO)

Pak-Sponsored Terrorism On Last Legs In Kashmir: BJP Leader

JAMMU: Senior BJP leader Devender Singh Rana on Saturday said Pakistan-sponsored terrorism is on its last legs in Jammu and Kashmir and slammed valley-based politicians advocating a dialogue with the

neighbouring country. Rana, a former legislator, said the people of Jammu and Kashmir are now realising the dividends of peace more than before.

National Conference presi-dent Farooq Abdullah on Wednesday said militancy in Jammu and Kashmir will not

end until India and Pakistan hold a dialogue to find a lasting solution to all conflicts, while Congress leader Saifud-din Soz said the doors of dialogue should be opened to end the bloodshed in the valley.

The two leaders made the remarks in the aftermath of the recent encounters that left five security personnel including an army colonel, a major and a deputy superintendent of police dead in south Kashmir's Anantnag and Rajouri in Jammu region.

"The Centre has, time and again, made its policy of terror and talks not going together very clear and still those trying to carve out an unsolicited role for themselves, for whatever reason, by jumping the line, should understand that India cannot engage itself with a country that sprouts terrorism," Rana said in a statement here. Questioning the sensibilities

of the "self-proclaimed votaries" of India-Pakistan talks and their sense of proportion, he expressed surprise and anguish over unwarranted rants of engaging Islamabad in dialogue even before the last rites of the bravehearts were held.

"The insensitive terror ecosystem should learn a lesson from the common man in Kashmir who took to the streets and joined the candle march to pay their tributes to valiant martyrs, who offered supreme sacrifice to maintain the prevailing momentum of normalcy in the valley," Rana said.

He said the anger against the recent terror acts in the valley, as elsewhere in the country, is a mute reminder to the "rejected and frustrated political elite who seize such opportunities to play dirty politics in the mistaken belief of

remaining relevant to politics". He said they forget that Kashmir has transformed and stands for peace and this urge has become predominant during the last four years that have witnessed near normalcy, leading to buzzing economic activity and humming tourist influx.

"The dubious role of the terror ecosystem to run politics over the graves and the miseries of common people has now become obsolete, which is why the people are up in arms against the cult of violence and disruption.

"The people of Jammu and Kashmir are realising the dividends of peace now more than before," he said.

G20 Is In Need Of Genuine Reform

India being the host country, the triumphalist tom-toming that G20 summit on September 9-10 was a "success" is both understandable and probably justifiable. Certainly, Indian diplomacy was in full cry. The negotiation of the G20 Declaration is no mean achievement in a highly polarised environment.

That said, in a forward-looking perspective, the geopolitical factors that were at work in the Delhi summit will continue to remain the critical determinants for the G20's future as a format to forge new directions in economic strategies. In a world torn apart, many imponderables remain.

The geopolitical factors can be attributed largely to the fact that the G20 summit took place at an inflection point in the Ukraine war, an event that is, like the tip of an iceberg, a manifestation of the tensions building up between the Western powers and Russia in the post-cold war era.

The heart of the matter is that the Cold War ended through negotiations but the new era was not anchored in any peace treaty. The void created drift and anomalies — and security being indivisible, tensions began appearing as the NATO embarked on an expansion eastward into the former Warsaw Pact territories in the late 1990s.

With great prescience, George Kennan, the choreographer of Cold War strategies, forewarned that the Bill Clinton administration, seized of the "unipolar moment," was making a grave mistake, as Russia would feel threatened by NATO expansion, which would inexorably complicate the West's relations with Russia for a long, long time to come.

But NATO kept expanding and slouching toward Russia's western borders in an arc of encirclement. It was an unspoken secret that Ukraine was set to become ultimately the battleground where the titanic forces would clash.

Predictably, following the regime change in Ukraine backed by the West in 2014, an anti-Russian regime was installed in Kiev and the NATO embarked on a military build-up in that country alongside a concerted plan to induct it into the western alliance system.

Suffice to say, the "consensus" evolved at the G20 summit last week regarding Ukraine war is, in reality, a passing moment in the geopolitical struggle between the US and Russia, as embedded within it is the existential crisis Russia faces.

There is no shred of evidence that the US is willing to concede the legitimacy of Russia's defence and security interests or to give up its notions of exceptionalism and world hegemony. If anything, a very turbulent period lies ahead. Therefore, do not exaggerate the happy tidings out of the Delhi summit, much as one may savour the moment.

Washington's climbdown at the summit regarding Ukraine has been both a creative response to the mediatory efforts by the three BRICS countries — South Africa, India and Brazil — as much as, if not more, in its self-interest to avert isolation from the Global South.

Evidently, while Moscow is profusely complimenting India and Modi, the opposite is the case in the western opinion where the compromise on Ukraine has not gone down well at all. The British newspaper Financial Times, which is wired into government thinking, has written that Delhi Declaration refers only to the "war in Ukraine," a formulation that supporters of Kiev such as the US and NATO allies have previously rejected, as it implies both sides are equally complicit, and "called for a 'just and durable peace in Ukraine' but did not explicitly link that demand to the importance of Ukraine's territorial integrity."

Indeed, feelings are running high and, no doubt, as the Ukraine war enters the next brutal phase, they will boil over at the prospect of a Russian victory.

Again, there is no question that the West feels challenged by the dramatic surge of BRICS — more to the point, the group's seductive appeal among the developing countries, the so-called Global South, unnerves the West.

The West can never hope to gain entry into the BRICS tent, either. Meanwhile, the BRICS is moving with determination in the direction of replacing the international trading system which provided underpinning for western hegemony. The US' weaponisation of sanctions — and the seizure of Russian reserves arbitrarily — has created misgivings in the minds of many nations.

Plainly put, the US has forgotten its solemn promise when dollar replaced gold as the reserves in the early 1970s that its currency will be freely accessible for all countries. Today, the US turned that promise upside down and exploits dollar's primacy to print the currency as much as it wants and live beyond its means.

The growing trend is toward trading in local currencies, bypassing dollar. The BRICS is expected to accelerate these shifts. Make no mistake, sooner or later, BRICS may work on an alternative currency to replace dollar.

Best, Most Creative Ideas Came From Humans, While Chatbots More Creative Than Average Human: Study

he best, most creative ideas came from humans, said researchers who analysed responses of humans and ChatGPT in a creative task

Artificial intelligence (AI)based chatbots might, however, outperform the average human at creative thinking, the researchers said in their study published in the journal Scientific Reports.

They found that while the humans' ideas were wide-ranging, and included the best and the worst from the entire output, AI models' ideas were consistently better than the average human creative ideas.

The results also suggested that generating creative ideas may not be a feature unique to conscious human beings, their study said.

For the study, the researchers from Finland and Norway used the Alternate Uses Test (AUT), whereby the test-takers, including AI-chatbots ChatGPT-3, ChatGPT-4 and Copy.AI, were asked to imagine uncommon and creative utilities, including silly and strange ones, for everyday objects such as "rope", "box", "pencil" and "candle".

AUT is a widely used measure in assessing divergent thinking, studied to play a role in activities like brainstorming and mind-mapping and thought to be key to creativity.

"Divergent thinking tests are perhaps the most widely recognised tools for gauging everyday creativity. They challenge participants to generate a varietv of ideas in reaction to given stimuli, which can be either visual or verbal," Simone Grassini, the study's corresponding author, told PTI in an email.

The team recruited 256 participants aged 19-40 years, 44 of whom were students. Each subject's creative output was finally scored based on the count of ideas (fluency), flexibility in uses suggested, originality and elaboration (level of detail in responses).

The clearest weakness in the humans' performance lay in the relatively high number of low-quality ideas, possibly arising due to failures in their exec-

utive functions, the study said of its human subjective ratings results, according to which, ChatGPT-4's performance was adjudged the most superior.

"It is difficult to pinpoint specific mechanisms," said Grassini, who referred to the internal functioning of AI models as a "black box".

"We could, however, hypothesise that either the model

Hailing the new National Education Policy as one of the revolutionary steps taken by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Singh said it supplements the start-up ecosystem, promises new careers and entrepreneurship opportunities for students and the youth.

said, if the country achieves a seven per cent rate of growth continuously over the next two decades and

more, it will make a substantial change to the level of the economy and India may almost touch the status of a developed economy

India needs to absorb the new technologies that have emerged and that will emerge and skilled manpower which is consistent with this development though the new technologies may lower the employment elasticity with respect to output, he stressed.

'Employment must come out of increased growth. Employment enhancement without growth is not sustainable. That is why we must aim at least at a sustained growth of 7 per cent," Rangarajan pointed out.

Militancy Reviving In Kashmir, Govt Should Take Concrete Steps To Curb It: JKPCC Chief

Srinagar: The Jammu and Kashmir unit of the Congress Saturday said militancy was reviving in the valley, and demanded the government to take concrete steps by framing a comprehensive policy to curb it.

Jammu and Kashmir Pradesh Congress Committee (JKPCC) president Vikar Rasool Wani condemned the killing of three security force officers in a gunfight with militants in Kokernag area on Wednesday. Major Ashish Dhonchak, 19

Rashtriya Rifles Commanding Officer Col Manpreet Singh, Deputy Superintendent of Jammu and Kashmir Police Humayun Bhat, and a soldier were killed in the encounter with the militants on Wednesday.

The gunfight entered into its fourth day on Saturday.

"We condemn it in no uncertain terms. It is a very sad incident. The situation is that militancy has not ended as the Government of India or the LG administration claims. I think they should frame a comprehensive policy to curb the militancy so that people come out of a life of distress which they have been living for the last 35 years," Wani told PTI here.

Wani said the party will not indulge in politics over the issue, and said it is pained by the killings. "There was an incident in Rajouri as well, there is firing in Uri as well, so I think, militancy is again reviving and the government should take some concrete steps (against it)," he added.

The JKPCC president said the ground situation in the valley was different from what the BJP was projecting in the rest of the country.

"They use it in other states, to make speeches, when the ground situation is different. When Article 370 was



abrogated, they made it sound like Jammu and Kashmir was previously an area under Pakistan, which is totally wrong.

"They use militancy politically to try to make the ground favourable. Congress and other like-minded parties see such issues in the national interest and have never indulged in politics on such issues or martyrs. They (BJP) sought votes in the name of Pulwama martyrs, which is very wrong," Wani said.

Earlier, addressing a press conference, Wani said the Congress will start a protest programme from next week against the "anti-people measures" of the government.

He said from September 19 to 28, protests would be held by the party daily in two districts one each in Kashmir and Jammu province.

Referring to the alleged scam in the Jal Shakti department, Wani demanded a CBI inquiry into the matter.

He said the protest would also target the continuous installation of pre-paid smart metres and forceful recovery of electric tariffs from the people. "Removal of additional du-

arrangements etc. To maintain cleanliness, the Jammu Municipal Corporation (JMC) was entrusted with sanitation and garbage clearance in the vicinity of Air Force Station. The CEO Cantonment Board was directed to oversee cleanliness and bush cutting within his jurisdiction.

Ensuring smooth traffic flow around the venue, SSP Traffic was instructed to formulate a comprehensive traffic management plan and identify suitable parking areas. Additionally, the Traffic Department will issue a Traffic Advisory to avoid inconvenience to commuters. To attract a wide audience, the Tourist Department was mandated to carry out extensive publicity, printing of invitation cards, and making seating arrangements.

The Information Department was assigned the task of installing Public Address Systems (PAS) and managing media coverage during the event. LED screens

Sprightly showers cheer Delhiites; min temp 26.9 deg Celsius

New Delhi: Rain lashed parts of the national capital on Saturday, giving a respite from the heat as the minimum temperature settled at 26.9 degrees Celsius, two notches above the season's average, the weather department said.

Waterlogging and traffic congestion were also reported in several parts of the city.

According to the India Meteorological Department (IMD), the maximum temperature settled at 33.8 degree Celsius, normal during the season.

Delhi recorded 0.6 mm of rain in the last 24 hours which ended at 8:30 am on Saturday. The relative humidity was recorded at 85 per cent at 8:30 am.

The IMD further stated that light to moderate intensity rain and gusty winds with speed of 30-40 Km/h would occur over and adjoining areas of entire Delhi and NCR (Loni Dehat, Bahadurgarh, Ghaziabad, Indirapuram, Noida, Dadri, Greater Noida, Gurugram, Faridabad, Manesar, Ballabhgarh) etc. during the next two hours.

The IMD has predicted generally cloudy skies with light rain for Sunday. The maximum and minimum temperatures are likely to settle at 33 and 25 degrees Celsius respectively.

The commuters wrote on X about the traffic situation in the national capital.

One of them said that he thought Bangalore's traffic was bad but today, he realised that Delhi is also giving a tough competition to it.

Others said the traffic was heavy from Surya Nagar to Anand Vihar and Madipur to New Multan Nagar, a complete chaos.

Delhi's Air Quality Index (AQI) stood at 87 around 5 pm. An AQI between zero and 50 is considered "good", 51 and 100 "satisfactory", 101 and 200 "moderate", 201 and 300 "poor", 301 and 400 "very poor", and 401 and 500 "severe".

Meanwhile, adequate forces have been deployed in the upper reaches of Kishtwar to watch out for any terrorist movement from across the Pir Panjal Range, a senior police officer said on Saturday.

"For the last three days, adequate personnel of police and army are deployed in the higher reaches of Singhpora and we are dominating the area," Kishtwar Senior Superintendent of Police Khalil Poswal said.

Singhpora connects Kishtwar with Kokernag but the road between the two sides of the Pir Panjal usually remains cut off during the winter owing to heavy snowfall at the 12,500-foot-high Sadna top. At present, a 10.3-km Vailoo-Singhpora tunnel has been under construction since 2009 to ensure round-the-year connectivity.

The SSP said police and army are working in close coordination to tackle any situation. "If there is any movement (of terrorists from the Kokernag side), we are active on that front," he said.

"If these proclaimed offenders fail to surrender within 30 days, the proceedings to attach their properties under section 83 of the CrPC will be initiated," the SSP told PTI.

In the proclamation notices served to the absconding terrorists at their birth places, Additional District and Sessions Judge (fasttrack court) Doda Sudesh Sharma said the warrants of arrest issued by the court of additional sessions judge, Jammu were returned with the report that the accused could not be found.

"It has been shown to my satisfaction that the said accused has absconded or is concealing himself to avoid the service of the said warrant. Proclamation is hereby made that the accused is required to appear before this court within the period of 30 days from the date of publication of proclamation, failing which proceedings under section 83, CrPC shall be launched against him," the identical notices issued on Thursday read.

The officials said the proclamation was issued, among others, against Shahnawaz Kanth alias "Umer" of Hullar, Nayeem Ahmed alias "Amir" of Jamia Masjid Kishtwar, Mohammad Iqbal alias "Bilal" from a place near the Kichloo market, Shahnawaz alias "Nayeem" of Chirool and Javid Hussain Giri alias "Muzamil" of Kundali Pochal.

The list also included Bashir Ahmed Mughal, Gazi-ul-Din and Sattar Din alias "Saifullah" of Jugna Keshwan, Imtiyaz Ahmed alias "Dawood" of Banderna, Shabir Ahmed of Kither Bonjwah, Mohammad Rafig Keen of Patnazi Bonjwah, Muzaffer Ahmed of Zewar and Azad Hussain of Affani Padder, they added.

Kashmiri students, he said, have been protesting since 2020, but the DBU administration despite assurances have failed to address their genuine concerns.

The DBU, he said, has an intake capacity of only 60 students while 140 students have illegally been enrolled for various paramedical courses, thus putting the future of these students at risk.

"The paramedical courses we pursue at Sardar Lal Singh College are not recognized by INC or PNRC as the college lacks approval of both the bodies that frame policies for nursing courses. We were ruthlessly beaten by the police and the staff. 22 girl students fell unconscious after being injured in the police action, while 3 boys were seriously hurt," the student alleged.

Despite repeated texts and calls, Vice-Chancellor Desh Bhagat University Punjab Dr Harsh Sadawarti could not be contacted.

However a senior official at DBU, wishing not to be named, told Kashmir Observer that the Punjab government has taken serious cognizance of the issue.

"The students have appraised the administration about their issues and that they have assured action in case their allegations of assault and illegal transfer to an unapproved college proved genuine. Talks between the administration and student representatives are on at the moment," he added.

Meanwhile Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) president and former chief minister, Mehbooba Mufti has condemned baton charge on female students protesting against the DBU's decision to transfer Kashmiri students without their consent.

"Lathi charging Kashmiri students and misbehaving with girls for protesting against a university that's wrecked their future is completely uncalled for. Request @ BhagwantMann ji to kindly look into this matter. Such actions alienate Kashmiris even further," Mehbooba Mufti wrote on X, formerly Twitter.

Several Sikh organizations in Kashmir have expressed solidarity with Kashmiri students pursuing various paramedical courses in DBU Punjab and condemned in strong words the police action against female students.

Can India End 5-Year Trophy Drought Vs Sri Lanka?

COLOMBO: Rohit Sharma's Indian team will be firm favourites to end its five-year trophy draught in multi-nation events, when it squares off against a depleted Sri Lanka in the final of the Asia Cup here on Sunday despite a few niggling questions still remaining unanswered.

While Axar Patel is an important component in the Indian set-up and his multiple injuries remains a concern, Sri Lanka will in fact miss their premier spinner Maheesh Theekshana way more due to his right hamstring injury.

A glance at India's trophy cabinet will reveal the uncomfortable truth of them not winning any titles in the last five years, and Sunday will be a good opportunity for them to snap that unhappy streak.

Not to forget a win before getting into the World Cup mode will be the ideal boost for a side which hasn't yet fully ticked all boxes but is showing way more

solidity than one would have thought a few months back.

India's last title, across the three formats, came in 2018 when the Rohit's side beat Bangladesh in the Asia Cup by three wickets in Dubai.

Since that victory, India's inability to master crunch matches and occasions has been startling.

India reached semifinals of the 50-over World Cup in 2019 and the T20 World Cup in 2022, besides losing against New Zealand and Australia in the WTC finals in 2019 and 2023 respectively.

The Men in Blue also failed to make their presence felt in last year's Asia Cup, which was won by Sri Lanka. That event was played in T20 format.

Any whichever one looks at it, this is a seriously underwhelming record for a team that prides in its cricketing tradition and wants to set some new trends under head coach Rahul Dravid and skipper Rohit.

However, India will believe



that they have a brilliant chance to add a trophy to their glittering collection come Sunday.

India are certain to recall the five players who were rested for the Super Four match against

Bangladesh on Friday, which they eventually lost by six runs. The return of Virat Kohli and Hardik Pandya for the summit

clash will certainly add meat to their batting unit, which strug-

gled against the array of Bangladesh spinners.

Opener Shubman Gill made a top class hundred, but the rest of the batsmen could not rotate strike effectively in the middle

overs, leaving the late order with a tall task.

The match also revealed another area India needed to address - the lack of consistency in bundling out a side after making early inroads.

India had reduced Bangladesh to 59/4, but the bowlers gave away too many runs in the death overs, allowing their neighbours to post a healthy 265.

But India will hope that the issue will be solved once pacers Jasprit Bumrah, Mohammed Siraj and left-arm wrist spinner Kuldeep Yadav make their comeback for tomorrow's game.

India will keep a watch on Axar's right hand which received multiple beatings in the match against Bangladesh, suffering niggles on his little finger and forearm along with hamstring injury.

Nasa Appoints New Director Of Research For A Scientifically **Rigorous Look At UFOs**

Diedging a new, transparent, scientifically rigorous look at UFOs, Nasa on Thursday said it had appointed a director of research on the topic – and then kept the name of the director a secret for about seven hours.

The new position is part of Nasa's response to recommendations made by an independent study team that the agency had convened. The panel looked at how to better gather and study information about "unidentified anomalous phe-nomena", or UAP – the modern term for UFOs.

The panel's report, released on Thursday, did not attempt to provide a definitive answer to whether galaxy-trotting



extraterrestrials are zipping through Earth's skies. But it does propose a bigger role for Nasa in tackling the question.

On Thursday evening, the agency identified the director as Mark McInerney. He previously served as Nasa's liaison with the defence department for UAP issues. In the news release, Nasa said he had also worked in various positions at Nasa's Goddard Space Flight Center in Maryland.

Princess Diana's Sheep Sweater Smashes Records To Sell For \$1.1 Million

red sweater adorned with a flock of sheep worn by the young Princess Diana has sold at auction for USD 1.1 million, many times its presale estimate and a record for an item owned by the late royal. The playfully patterned wool jumper featuring a single black sheep in a grid of white ones was bought by an unidentified bidder at Sotheby's online Fashion Icons sale.

The auction house had valued it at between USD 50,000 and USD 80,000 ahead of two

weeks of bidding that ended Thursday. With 15 minutes left until the sale closed, the highest offer stood at USD 190,000, but leapt to USD 1.1 million after a final flurry of bids.

The previous record for a piece of Diana memorabilia was USD 604,800 for a Victor Edelstein-designed ballgown sold by Sotheby's in January.

The sale also smashed the existing auction record for a sweater, the USD334,000 paid in 2019 for Kurt Cobain's green cardigan from Nirvana's MTV Unplugged concert.

Historic India Club In London To Close Doors Permanently After 70 Years On September 17

The India Club in London, with its early roots in the Indian independence movement as a hub for nationalists and a home away from home for Indians in the country over the years, will close permanently on Sunday.

With its walls adorned with photographs of prominent Indians such as former prime ministers, the Club's founding member was Krishna Menon - who went on to become the first High Commissioner of in-dependent India to the UK. As well as housing one of the UK's early Indian restaurants, India Club quickly transformed into a hub for a rapidly growing British South Asian community in the aftermath of Indian independence.

"We have been completely rushed off our feet since the public found out we were closing on September 17," said Phiroza Marker, the manager of the Club. "We are closing but looking for new premises in the vicin-

ity to relocate to," she said. Parsi-origin Yadgar Marker has been running the establishment with his wife Freny and daughter Phiroza since they rescued it from ruin in 1997 as the director of Goldsand Hotels Limited.

The family had launched a "Save India Club" appeal and won an initial battle to prevent the building from partial demolition a few years ago when they were served a notice by the landlords to make way for a more modernised hotel. However, with the rents being hiked exponentially amid a cost-of-living crisis, it has spelt the end of the road for the venue.



Nostalgic visitors who have been frequenting this little slice of India in central London offering hot dosas and pakoras within a dwelling steeped in history feel bereft at the loss.

"It's simply heart-breaking. A slice of Indian history on the Strand will be lost forever," said British Indian historian and journalist Shrabani Basu.

"As an Indian journalist based in London, it was our watering hole. There will be no more beer and pakoras at the historic bar. We will miss it," she said.

Smita Tharoor, the Londonbased daughter of one of the other founder members of India Club – journalist Chandran Tharoor, has been a regular visitor with her brother Congress MP Shashi Tharoor and other family members.

"Many of the former leaders and founders of the India League created the India Club to offer a home away from home for Indians living in London. My father regaled us with its stories when we were growing up in India," she shared.

"For me, the closure of the club is something very emotional and sad because it is the end of my father's memories that have been kept alive for so many years and where I could visit whenever I missed him. He died very young at the age of 63 in 1993. This is not just a place to eat Indian food. This is a place that gives us stories of the past," she said.

Tharoor recalls how the Club has counted the likes of Dr Rajendra Prasad, the first President of independent India, and Lord Mountbatten – the last Viceroy of India - among its many distinguished visitors and has been a little corner of India for many living in or visiting the UK capital.

"Menon intended the India Club to be a place where young Indian professionals living on a shoestring could afford to eat, discuss politics, and plan their futures," noted Parvathi Raman, Founding Chair of the Centre for Migration and Diaspora Studies at the School of Oriental and African Studies (SOAS), when she worked on the exhibition 'A Home Away from Away: The India Club' in 2019, curated by the UK's conservation charity National Trust.

Iran To Host 150 Muslim Luminaries, Including AI Scientists, Next Month

he central Iranian city of Isfahan is scheduled to host the 5th Mustafa Prize ceremony next month, with reports saying 150 luminaries from across the Muslim world attending the prestigious biennial event for their scientific excellence.

Hossein Rabbani, the head of Isfahan's Elites Foundation, said the 5th Mustafa Prize ceremony will be held on October 2, when high-profile scien-tists in the field of Artificial Intelligence convene in Isfahan from 57 Islamic countries.

The prestigious ceremony will also host the 9th round of Science and Technology Exchange Program (STEP), which is a platform organized by Mustafa Science and Technology Foundation to expand the scientific network among the Islamic world's scholars by holding international events and laying the groundwork for enhancing scientific synergy and cooperation. "Awarding a prize is regarded as a way of identifying outstanding people in scientific fields and brings to the fore the existing capacities in different areas of science," Rabbani said.

"An international award, like the Mustafa Prize, has profound impacts given its media aspect," he said, adding that it conveys the message that the Muslim world pays attention to science and technology.

Mustafa Prize was estab-lished in 2012 as one of the symbols of scientific excellence and has been held biennially since 2015, recognizing leading researchers and scientists of the Islamic world.

The laureates are awarded \$500,000, which is financed through the science and technology endowment. They will also be adorned with Mustafa Medal and Honorary Diploma. The prize is awarded in the

four categories of Information and Communication Science and Technology, Life and Medical Science and Technology, Nanoscience and Nanotechnology, and All Areas of Science and Technology. In 2016, the Science Magazine called the prize
