"For time being, it has been postponed. We will work more on this issue since the public has many apprehensions about the





With Empty Coffers & Closed Fist Centre Govt Orders Austerity Measures, Bans Purchases

rinagar-With New Delhi having made it clear that it would be paying only for the day to day expenditure of the state, thus putting a virtual brake on the developmental plans, the state government today ordered austerity mea sures in departmental expenditures "with immediate effect."

Austerity measures in departmental spendings had become imperative following re-ported failure of talks between the Centre and the state in New Delhi recently on the release of funds to the state, dependent completely on New Delhi.

The order, which would be applicable to all Public Sector Undertakings and Autonomous Bodies, has been taken "in view of the continuing tight resources position of the state." There will be an across the board cut of ten percent on the budget provision under the head maintenance and re-pairs, purchase of material and supplies, machinery and equipment.

The order says that the newly installed offices can buy fresh furniture that too subject to the concurrence of Finance Department, while blanket ban has been imposed on purchasing of furniture for the already existing ones. The ban has also been imposed on purchase of new vehicles of all kinds by all departments.

The measures announced by the state government today will virtually put brakes on all the developmental programmes as there is alarming cash crunch in the state. The Centre will be paying the state a sum of rupees 250 crores only, which is not even sufficient for running day today expenditures

The expenditure on telephone has been ordered to be restricted within the available provisions and no liability on the account would be allowed to be carried over. No additional pro-vision would be made for purchase of office equipment like photo copiers, fax machines etc. No purchase should be placed beyond December 31, 1998 for any item and purchase contracts should be finalized before the said date.

The government have ordered that there shall be no official dinners and no lunches except those hosted by the Chief Minister and the ministers.

The expenditure on maintenance of government buildings, residential quarters should be restricted to most essential items only. Improvements to existing floorings, wall painting etc., to cater to personal preferences has been totally prohibited and there should be no additions to the residential quarters

There will be no increase in the current level of grant-in-aid to institutions.

US Fears Canada-India Row Could Upend China Strategy

WASHINGTON: The Biden administration is nervously watching a dispute between Canada and India, with some officials concerned it could upend the U.S. strategy toward the Indo-Pacific that is directed at blunting China's influence there and elsewhere.

Publicly, the administration has maintained that Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau's allegations that the Indian government may have been involved in the killing of a Sikh separatist near Vancouver are a matter between the two countries.

But U.S. officials have also repeatedly urged India to cooperate in the investigation. Those calls have been ignored thus far by India, which denies the allegations.

Behind the scenes, U.S. officials say they believe Trudeau's claims are true. And they are worried that Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi may be adopting tactics to silence opposition figures on foreign soil akin to those used by Russia, Iran, Saudi Arabia and North Korea, all of which have faced similar accusations.

Perhaps of more concern, though, is that the Canada-India dispute could have major implications for one of the administration's main foreign policy priorities: the Indo-Pacific strategy, which seeks to counter China's increasing assertiveness in the region, according to numerous U.S. officials who spoke on condition of anonymity due to the extreme

sensitivity of the matter. Both Canada, a Pacific country and key NATO ally that shares with the United States the longest undefended border in the world, and India are critical to U.S.-led efforts to present a united and democratic front against growing Chinese assertiveness. Aside from countering Russia's war in Ukraine, the administration has been most focused on dealing with China as a competitor and the potential international threat it poses. To that end it has boosted its diplomatic efforts in the Indo-Pacific, including by creating a leadership group that brings together Australia, Japan, India and the United States. President Joe Biden has hailed the formation of the so-called Quad as a key part of that effort.

"Our commitment to Israel's right to defend itself remains unwavering," Defence Secretary Lloyd Austin said in a statement, adding that his agency would work "to ensure that Israel has what it needs to defend itself and protect civilians from indiscriminate violence and terrorism."

"We are at war," Israel's Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said, vowing severe retaliation after the surprise assault by the Palestinian militant group Hamas Here is a round-up of the reactions from around the

world: USA The United States con-demned the attack by "Hamas

terrorists" against Israel. "The United States unequivocally condemns the

unprovoked attacks by Hamas terrorists against Israeli civilians," a White House statement said, adding that National Security Advisor Jake Sullivan was in close contact with Israeli officials.

"We stand firmly with the government and people of Israel and extend our condolences



for the Israeli lives lost in these attacks," it added.

A senior adviser to Iran's supreme leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei expressed support for the attack, calling it a "proud operation".

"We support this operation," Yahya Rahim Safavi said, quoted by ISNA news agency. Safavi expressed backing for the Palestinian militants "until

UN Urges Halt to Pakistan's **Forcible Returns of Afghan Migrants**

ISLAMABAD: The United Nations agencies for migration and refugee protection Saturday jointly appealed to Pakistan to suspend plans to deport undocumented Afghan immigrants, warning they could be at imminent risk back in Afghanistan. The appeal comes after Paki

Migration and the U.N. High Commissioner for Refugees. 'Such plans would have serious implications for all who have been forced to leave the country and may face serious protection risks upon return," it added.

Immigrants facing deportation included hundreds of thousands of families who fled Afghanistan after the hardline



stan Tuesday ordered all immigrants in the country illegally, including some 1.7 million Afghan nationals, to leave by Nov. 1 or face deportation to their native countries. Many families have already left for Afghanistan to avoid arrest and forcible deportation, with the Pakistani information ministry issuing a daily countdown to remind those covered by the policy that days are running out for them.

"Afghanistan is going through a severe humanitarian crisis with several human rights challenges, particularly for women and girls," said a joint statement from the International Organization for

Taliban returned to power in Kabul in August 2021 and imposed sweeping restrictions on women's access to education and work.

The U.N. statement recognized Islamabad's "sovereign prerogative" over its domestic policies, the need to manage populations on Pakistani territory, and its obligations to ensure public safety and security. The IOM and UNHCR, while

IAMMU: In a major move aimed at efficient cadre management, the Jal Shakti Department issued regularization orders of 396 engineers in various ranks here on Friday, with another 411 in the pipeline pending essential clearances.

Many of those benefited by resultant pay fixation are retired officers who had been drawing pensions in lower ranks. Since September 2022, 1969

engineers have been regularized, promoted and recommended, right from the rank of Junior Engineer to Superintendent Engineer. Officers had been working in incharge capacity, i.e. on adhoc basis, for years together, without substantive promotions. In many a cases, the regularization has taken place after more than twenty two years of the adhoc placement.

The proactive and transparent processes steered by the Public Service Commission (PSC) have enabled the department to address these long pending issues.

The recommendations of the Departmental Promotion Committee in the PSC has resulted in orders of promotion of 70 Executive Engineers to Superintending Engineers, 129 Assistant Executive Engineers to Executive Engineers, 415 Assistant Engineers to the role of Assistant Executive Engineers

and 665 Junior Engineers to Assistant Engineers while another 690 officers have been cleared subject to essential clearances which are in process.

Also, in another first, since September 2022, the department has strived to man all the posts in the department with competent officers by timely posting and placement of 19 l/c Chief Engineers, 28 I/c Superintending Engineers, 56 I/c Executive Engineers.


All District Hospitals In Kashmir Lack MRI Scan Facility

SRINAGAR: All the district hospitals in Kashmir Valley are facing a severe shortage of Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) scan facilities, leaving the patients with no choice but to turn to overburdened hospitals in Srinagar.

According to reports, the absence of MRI services in government hospitals has created significant



agnostic centres. They a r e forced to endure long waits for their turn due to the overwhelming rush in Super-Speciality Hospital Shireen Bagh and SKIMS Soura.

Patients from various parts of Kashmir have expressed their grievances, citing the inconvenience caused by the long-distance travel and overcrowding in hospitals in Srinagar

They said that health issues, especially for economically disadvantaged people, should not be overlooked by the authorities. Officials acknowledge the

challenges faced by patients travelling from remote areas such as Macchil, Keran, Tangdhar, Gurez, Uri, Kangan, Keller, Aripal, DH Pora, Pahalgam, and others. They urge the government to prioritise this matter and actively pursue solutions at the highest level, and ensure that patients do not suffer.

Financial constraints should not impede the allocation of necessary funds for these vital healthcare services, they said. Doctors have noted that the absence of MRI facilities in district hospitals compels patients to travel to Srinagar or private

diagnostic centres, leaving the financially weak patients with no choice but to wait endlessly at government hospitals. "This delay in diagnosis and treatment has proven to be fatal for many," said a doctor.

Spokesperson for the Directorate of Health Services Kashmir, Dr Mir Mushtaq acknowledged the government's commitment to enhancing healthcare facilities for the people.

"While MRI services are presently unavailable in district hospitals, these services are accessible in tertiary hospitals in Srinagar," Dr Mushtaq said.

He expressed hope that in the future, such crucial facilities would be extended to new medical colleges and major district-level hospitals—(KNO)

India's Pressing Need for a Caste Census

he caste question of India needs to be dealt with urgently, otherwise, we will have to pay a heavy price not only socially, but also politically and economically and we will lag in development as well.

Caste census means castewise tabulation of the population belonging to all castes of India, mainly Other Backward Classes (OBCs), and not just SCs and STs.

The first separate data on Scheduled Castes (SC) and Scheduled Tribes (ST) was published in the 1952 census. The first caste census data was released in 1931. Despite the caste census being conducted in the 2011 census, the data was not released. Reservation in educational institutions and government jobs is provided based on caste identity. The absence of fresh caste census data means that caste estimates from 1931 are being projected to formulate welfare policies in 2021. Which is redundant. The highest reservation mandate of 27% for Other Backward Classes (OBC) is caste-based as the BP Mandal Commission has found backwardness to be based on caste. Caste system is a curse in India and has severely restricted the country's ability to realize its immense potential and become a great nation in science, technology, knowledge, arts, sports, and economic prosperity. Studies show that 94% of marriages in India are endogamous; 90% of small jobs are done by disadvantaged castes, while the figure is reversed in white-collar jobs. This gross lack of caste diversity, especially at the decision-making level in various sectors - media, judiciary, higher education, bureaucracy, or the corporate sector – is weakening these institutions and their performance. It is indeed strange that while caste plays such a prominent role in our social, economic, and political life, no reliable and comprehensive caste data exists for more than half of our country's population. The purpose of the caste census is not to focus only on the issue of reservation; The caste census will indeed bring out a large number of issues that need to be addressed by any democratic country, especially the number of people

who are marginalized, or who are underprivileged.

Caste census will allow policymakers to develop better policies, and implementation strategies and will also enable more rational debate on sensitive issues. It will also highlight the privileged class of the society. Caste is not only a source of disadvantage but also a very important source of privilege and advantage in our society. We have to stop thinking of caste as applying only to underprivileged people, poor people, and people who are disadvantaged in some way or the other. The contrary is also true, caste has created advantages for some communities and these also need to be recorded. No outline of all castes has been made in India since 1931. Since then, caste has

the marginalized ones. With accurate caste data, the most backward castes can be identified. Some people have benefited greatly over the years, while there are also people in this country who have not benefited at all. The Supreme Court has repeatedly asked governments to provide data related to castes; However, this has not been possible due to the unavailability of such data. As a result, our national life is plagued by mutual distrust and misunderstandings between different castes. All such commissions have had to depend on the date of the last caste census (1931). Caste has an emotional element and thus caste census has political and social implications. There have been concerns that counting caste may help strengthen or rigidify

Is. This data provides a mirror to the state and society in which they can look at themselves and make decisions to improve. With each passing day and increasing social awareness, the need to abolish the caste system is increasingly being felt. The Science Behind Work-Life-Balance

Finding the right work-life balance is by no means a new issue in our society. But the tension between the two has been heightened by the pandemic, with workers increasingly dwelling over the nature of their work, its meaning and purpose, and how these affect their quality of life.

Studies suggest people are leaving or planning to leave their employers in record numbers in 2021 – a "great resignation" that appears to have been precipitated by these reflections. But if we're all reconsidering where and how work slots into our lives, what should we be aiming at?

It's easy to believe that if only we didn't need to work, or we could work far fewer hours, we'd be happier, living a life of hedonic experiences in all their healthy and unhealthy forms. But this fails to explain why some retirees pick up freelance jobs and some lottery winners go straight back to work.

Striking the perfect work-life balance, if there is such a thing, isn't necessarily about tinkering with when, where and how we work – it's a question of why we work. And that means understanding sources of happiness that might not be so obvious to us, but which have crept into view over the course of the pandemic.

Attempts to find a better work-life balance are well merited. Work is consistently and positively related to our wellbeing and constitutes a large part of our identity. Ask yourself who you are, and very soon you'll resort to describing what you do for work.

Our jobs can provide us with a sense of competence, which contributes to wellbeing. Researchers have demonstrated not only that labour leads to validation but that, when these feelings are threatened, we're particularly drawn to activities that require effort – often some form of work – because these demonstrate our ability to shape our environment, confirming our identities as competent individuals.



Work even seems to makes us happier in circumstances when we'd rather opt for leisure. This was demonstrated by a series of clever experiments in which participants had the option to be idle (waiting in a room for 15 minutes for an experiment to start) or to be busy (walking for 15 minutes to another venue to participate in an experiment). Very few participants chose to be busy, unless they were forced to make the walk, or given a reason to (being told there was chocolate at the other venue).

Yet the researchers found that those who'd spent 15 minutes walking ended up significantly happier than those who'd spent 15 minutes waiting – no matter whether they'd had a choice or a chocolate or neither. In other words, busyness contributes to happiness even when you think you'd prefer to be idle. Animals seem to get this instinctively: in experiments, most would rather work for food than get it for free.

Eudaimonic happiness

The idea that work, or putting effort into tasks, contributes to our general wellbeing is closely related to the psychological concept of eudaimonic happiness. This is the sort of happiness that we derive from optimal functioning and realising our potential. Research has shown that work and effort is central to eudaimonic happiness, explaining that satisfaction and pride you feel on completing a gruelling task.

On the other side of the work-life balance stands hedonic happiness, which is defined as the presence of positive feelings such as cheerfulness and the relative scarcity of negative feelings such as sadness or anger. We know that hedonic happiness offers empirical mental and physical health benefits, and that leisure is a great way to pursue hedonic happiness.

But even in the realm of leisure, our unconscious orientation towards busyness lurks in the background. A recent study has suggested that there really is such a thing as too much free time – and that our subjective wellbeing actually begins to drop if we have more than five hours of it in a day. Whiling away effortless days on the beach doesn't seem to be the key to long-term happiness.

This might explain why some people prefer to expend significant effort during their leisure time. Researchers have likened this to compiling an experiential CV, sampling unique but potentially unpleasant or even painful experiences – at the extremes, this might be spending a night in an ice hotel, or joining an endurance desert race. People who take part in these forms of "leisure" typically talk about fulfilling personal goals, making progress and accumulating accomplishments – all features of eudaimonic happiness, not the hedonism we associate with leisure. The real balance

This orientation sits well with a new concept in the field of wellbeing studies: that a rich and diverse experiential happiness is the third component of a "good life", in addition to hedonic and eudaimonic happiness.

Across nine countries and tens of thousands of participants, researchers recently found that most people (over 50% in each country) would still prefer a happy life typified by hedonic happiness. But around a quarter prefer a meaningful life embodied by eudaimonic happiness, and a small but nevertheless significant amount of people (about 10-15% in each country) choose to pursue a rich and diverse experiential life.

Given these different approaches to life, perhaps the key to long-lasting wellbeing is to consider which lifestyle suits you best: hedonic, eudaimonic or experiential. Rather than pitching work against life, the real balance to strike post-pandemic is between these three sources of happiness.

Novel 3D Printing Method Shows Promise For Repairing Brain Injuries

cientists have developed a new 3D printing technique that they say could provide tailored repairs for those who suffer brain injuries.

The researchers at the University of Oxford in the UK demonstrated for the first time that neural cells can be 3D printed to mimic the architecture of the cerebral cortex, the outer layer of the human brain.

Brain injuries, including those caused by trauma, stroke and surgery for brain tumours, typically result in significant damage to the cerebral cortex, leading to difficulties in cognition, movement and communication.

The researchers noted that each year, around 70 million people globally suffer from traumatic brain injury (TBI), with 5 million of these cases being severe or fatal.

Tissue regenerative therapies, especially those in which patients are given implants derived from their own stem cells, could be a promising route to treat brain injuries in the future, the researchers said.

However, till now there has been no method to ensure that implanted stem cells mimic the architecture of the brain, they said.

In the study published in the journal Nature Communications, the researchers fabricated a two-layered brain tissue by 3D printing human neural stem cells.

When implanted into mouse brain slices, the cells showed convincing structural and functional integration with the host tissue, they found.

"This advance marks a significant step towards the fabrication of materials with the full structure and function of natural brain tissues," said study lead author, Yongcheng Jin, from the Department of Chemistry, University of Oxford.

"The work will provide a unique opportunity to explore the workings of the human cortex and, in the long term, it will offer hope to individuals who sustain brain injuries," Jin said.

The cortical structure was made from human induced pluripotent stem cells (hiPSCs), which have the potential to produce the cell types found in most human tissues.

A key advantage of using hiPSCs for tissue repair is that they can be easily derived from cells harvested from patients themselves, and therefore would not trigger an immune response.

The hiPSCs were differentiated into neural progenitor cells for two different layers of the cerebral cortex, by using specific combinations of growth factors and chemicals. The cells were then suspended in solution to generate two 'bioinks', which were then printed to produce a two-layered structure.

In culture, the printed tissues maintained their layered cellular architecture for weeks, as indicated by the expression of laver-specific biomarkers. When the printed tissues were

The implanted cells also showed signalling activity, which correlated with that of the host cells, indicating that the human and mouse cells were communicating with each other, demonstrating functional as well as structural integration, they said.

The researchers said they now intend to further refine the droplet printing technique to create complex multi-layered cerebral cortex tissues that more realistically mimic the human brain's architecture. Besides their potential for repairing brain injuries, these engineered tissues might be used in drug evaluation, studies of brain development, and to improve our understanding of the basis of cognition, they added.

GST Council Decides To Levy 18% GST On Corporate **Guarantee For Subsidiaries**

NEW DELHI: The GST Council on Saturday clarified that guarantees provided by corporates to their subsidiaries will attract an 18 per cent GST, while no tax will be levied if a personal guarantee is given by a director to the company.

The council, chaired by Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman and comprising state ministers, also cut the GST rate on molasses to 5 per cent from 28 per cent. It also ceded the right to tax

Extra Neutral Alcohol (raw product for making alcohol for human consumption) to the states. Accordingly, ENA used for

human consumption will be exempt from Goods and Services Tax (GST), while ENA for industrial use will be taxed at 18 per cent.

52nd GST council meeting, Sitharaman said the reduction in GST on molasses will benefit sugarcane farmers and enable their dues to be cleared faster because more money will be left in the hands of the mills.

Briefing reporters after the

"The council and we all feel that it will also lead to a reduction in the cost of manufacturing cattle feed, which will be a major development," she said.

Revenue Secretary Sanjay Malhotra said the council has decided that when the corporate guarantee is given by a director to a company, then the value of service will be deemed to be zero and hence, no GST will be applicable.

"When a corporate guarantee is given by a company to its subsidiary company, then it will be deemed that the value is 1 per cent of the corporate guarantee. So, it will attract GST at 18 per cent on 1 per cent of the total amount guaranteed by the parent company," Malhotra said. The GST Council also de-

cided to levy a lower 5 per cent tax on millet-based flour when sold in pre-packaged and labelled form. Flour, containing at least 70

per cent millets, will attract zero per cent GST if sold loose and 5 per cent if sold prepackaged and labelled.

The council also decided to cap the maximum age of GST Appellate Tribunal (GSTAT) President and members.

The GSTAT President will have a maximum age cap of 70 years, while the limit for members will be 67 years.

This is a change from the earlier age limit of 67 and 65 years, respectively, for the GSTAT President and members.

Online Gaming, Casinos Liable To 28% GST Since Beginning: Revenue Secy

NEW DELHI: As states like Delhi and Goa raised the issue of tax demand on online gaming companies and casinos retrospectively, Revenue Secretary Sanjay Malhotra on Saturday reiterated that 28 per cent GST was levied on online gaming and casinos even before.

"Certain members had raised the issue of retrospective taxation. It was informed to them that this is not retrospective, and this was the law earlier. These liabilities already existed because money online games played with bets...

GST was to be implemented. "An industry whose revenue is Rs 23,000 crore, you are slapping a tax notice of Rs 1.5 lakh crore...this is to kill the industry. This shows an unsafe erratic investment environment in Indian startups," Atishi said.

The GST Council in its meetings in July and August had decided to clarify the levy of 28 per cent GST on full

The amendments to Central GST and Integrated GST were approved by Parliament and were notified by the central government effective October 1. States were also required to pass amendments to state GST (SGST) laws. So far, 18 states have passed the amendments either in their assembles or through ordinance. The remaining 13 states would also be passing the amendments, with effect from October 1 in due course.

Institutional Investments In Real Estate Down 21% **In Jul-Sep: Colliers**

NEW DELHI: Institutional investments in real estate declined 21 per cent in July-September period to \$793.4 million due to lesser inflows in office assets, according to Colliers India.

Institutional inflows stood at \$1,002.1 million in the year-ago

period. Real estate consultant Colliers India on Saturday released the data that showed a sharp fall of 89 per cent in investment in office assets to \$79.1 million during July-September from \$694.3 million in the corresponding period of last year. Funds inflows in mixed-use assets too dipped 73 per cent to \$27.2 million during July-September period from \$100.8 million in the year-ago period. However, the institutional investments in residential properties rose 47 per cent to \$274.6 million in the third

quarter of this calendar year from \$187 million in the yearago period. Industrial & warehousing

assets attracted \$340.3 million during July-September as against mere \$20 million in the year-ago period. Investments in alternate as-

sets, which include data centres, student housing, senior housing, holiday homes and life sciences, stood at \$72.2 million during July-September

period as against zero inflows in the year-ago period. Despite fall in institutional investments in real estate dur-

July-September period, Colliers India data showed that the inflows during January-

September were up 27 per cent to \$4,558.1 million as against \$3,578.5 million in the yearago period.

Foreign investments contributed 77 per cent in the total institutional inflows.

Across asset classes, institutional investments in office assets have risen 60 per cent to \$2,886.9 million during January-September period from \$1,802.8 million in the year-ago period.

Inflows in housing assets jumped more than two-fold to \$707.9 million from \$276.5 million.

Similarly, investments in industrial and warehousing assets jumped more than three-fold to \$690.6 million in January-September from \$199.8 million in the year-ago period.

However, inflows in alternate investments fell 42 per cent to \$230.4 million from \$398.8 million.

Investments in mixed-use properties plunged 90 per cent to \$42.3 million from \$408.8 million.

11 Travel Agents Arrested **In Delhi For Sending People Abroad Illegally**

NEW DELHI: The Delhi Police on Friday said it has arrested at least 11 people for allegedly duping people on the pretext of sending them to foreign countries.

The matter came to fore on September 3 at the IGI Airport where a team of security officials caught a passenger -Deepak Verma - who had travelled to London on someone else's passport and returned to India. On being questioned, Deepak Verma disclosed that his journey was arranged by a travel agent, Barinder Singh from Punjab's Fatehgarh Sahib, on payment of ₹17 lakh. He was sent to the UK in 2021.

A case under sections 419 (cheating by impersonation) and 420 (cheating) of the Indian Penal Code and provisions of the Passports Act was registered at the IGI Airport and a team was formed to nab Barinder Singh.

On September 5, Barinder Singh was arrested from Capitol Hills Hotel in Greater Kailash, Delhi by a team from the IGI police station. Barinder Singh disclosed that he used to send people abroad through illegal means and took money for them for the same. He came in contact with Deepak Verma in 2021 and offered to send him to the UK and took a total ₹17 lakh from him. Following this case, the IGI Airport police conducted a drive and subsequently, arrested around 10 other such agents, who are allegedly involved in immigration frauds, in the last 30 days.

According to a police officer, Satnam Singh alias Jaggi, Jaskaran Singh, Gurdeep Singh alias Bitto, Sushil Kumar Kaushik, Sandeep Singh, Randeep Singh, Pishora Singh, Sumit Kumar Yadav, Mohammad Suhail, and Anjali were further arrested on separate occasions for sending the passengers to various countries fraudulently.

India Offers Lot Of Opportunities To Aviation Sector: DFS Secy

NEW DELHI - India offers a lot of opportunities to the aviation industry, and the government has taken many initiatives to promote investment in the sector, Financial Services Secretary Vivek Joshi said on Saturday.

Addressing a roundtable conference on the airport sector organised by IIFCL, Joshi said the launch of the 'Ude Desh ka Aam Nagarik' (UDAN) scheme has led to significant development of the sector in the past 7-8 years.

As a result, the number of airports has almost doubled from 74 in 2014 to 148 in 2023, giving a boost to regional connectivity.

The government has additionally given in-principle approval for setting up 21 greenfield airports across the country, he noted.

Further, he said, two big airports coming up in Noida and Navi Mumbai will add to the capacity of the airports in the country.

India's aviation industry has seen a remarkable boost in recent years facilitated by the government's investor-friendly legislation, supportive ecosystem and growing demand. The aviation industry in India is the third-largest and fastest-growing in the world, expanding at a rate of about 10 per cent during the last decade, roughly 2.5 times the global av-

erage. To give a further boost to the aviation sector, Joshi said, the Ministry of Corporate Affairs earlier this week issued a notification excluding transactions involving aircraft, plane engines, airframes and helicopters from the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (IBC).

"The ministry has exempted the aircraft leasing from Section 14 of IBC, which I think will be a great help for this sector," Joshi said.

Section 14 of the IBC deals with the power of adjudicating authority (NCLT) to issue a moratorium when admitting a company to the insolvency resolution process.

Once the moratorium on asset transactions is imposed, activities like the institution of suits, continuation of pending suits, execution of judgments, transferring/ disposing of assets and recovery or enforcement of security interest are prohibited.

Delivering a welcome address India Infrastructure Finance Company Ltd Managing Director PR Jaishankar said IIFCL is one of the major financiers of airports in India and has supported airports with a total project outlay of about Rs 74,000 crore in the country.

India has witnessed a multi-fold jump in domestic and international passenger traffic with the improvement in civil aviation infrastructure, Jaishankar said.

Amit Shah Justifies Need To Replace IPC, Says Any Law Becomes Obsolete' After 50 Years

Dehradun: Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Saturday justified the need to replace the IPC, CrPC and the Evidence Act saying any law becomes "obsolete" after 50 years.

"There has been no change in the IPC, CrPC or the Evidence Act since 1860. Any law becomes obsolete' after 50 years. The scale of crime has changed, and so has the method of committing them but there has been no change in the method of dealing with them," Shah said.

Addressing the 49th All India Police Science Congress, he said this has had a crippling effect on the country's criminal justice system.

Speaking of the three new legislations -- the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (to replace IPČ), Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha



Sanhita (to replace CrPC) and Bharatiya Sakshya (to replace the Evidence Act) -- under consideration of a parliamentary panel, he said they will replace the three old codes once passed by the Parliament.

It will expedite disposal of cases as they won't get inordinately delayed, Shah added. He said numerous reforms

on the ground. The All India Police Science Congress covers six subjects, including policing in the 5G era, narcotics, challenges of social media, community policing, internal security, coordination between police and the Central

Armed Police Forces, Shah said. The scope of the subjects taken up completely cover the country's internal security, law and order, and border security, the Union home minister said. Drawing a comparison be-

tween ten years of the UPA and nine years of the Modi government, Shah cited the substantial decline in incidents of violence in three hot spots - Jammu and Kashmir, left extremist-affected

states and the north-east.

"The number of violent incidents in the three hot spots from 2004 to 2014 were 33,200, which reduced to 12,358 in nine years from 2014-2023. Even deaths of security personnel and civilians in these areas recorded a substantial decline from 11,947 to 3,240," Shah said.

Shah called for a strong and collective endeavour to achieve the prime minister's vision of making India one of the leading countries in the world by 2047, the 100th year of its independence.

"We have to work as hard as it gets in every field to achieve that goal. But the first pre-condition for development is a sound law and order scenario, internal security and the safety of our borders," he said.

IAF to unveil new ensign at Air Force Day parade on Sunday

New Delhi: The IAF will unveil its new ensign at the annual Air Force Day parade at Prayagraj on Sunday to better reflect its values, 72 years after a similar exercise was undertaken.

The Indian Air Force's move comes over a year after the Navy made changes in its ensign shedding its colonial past.

"October 8 will go down as a momentous day in the annals of IAF history. On this historic day, the Chief of Air Staff will unveil the new IAF ensign," the IAF said.

In the new ensign, the Indian Air Force crest will be in the top right corner.

The Indian Air Force was officially established on 8 October, 1932. In view of its professional efficiency and achievements during World War II, the force was bestowed with the prefix "Royal" in March 1945. So, it became the Royal Indian Air Force (RIAF).

In 1950, the IAF dropped its

cremation and burial grounds were exempted from payment of property tax.

Pertinently, the J&K was the only state in the country which was exempted from property tax. However, post abrogation of Article 370, the central laws were extended to the newly created UT and all the laws became applicable automatically.

Meanwhile, the announcement to postpone imposition of property tax has brought much sought relief to the common masses.

"This is indeed a welcome step. Our business isn't doing well because of back-to-back lockdowns. Even now the market is down," said Bilal Ahmad Mir, a shopkeeper from Karan Nagar area of Srinagar.

The massive surprise attack on Israel by Hamas on Saturday is a "Pearl Harbor type of moment" for the country, former Israel Defense Forces international spokesperson Ionathan Conricus told CNN.

"The entire system failed. It's not just one component. It's the entire defense architecture that evidently failed to provide the necessary defense for Israeli civilians," he said of the early morning attack. "This is a Pearl Harbor type of moment for Israel, where there was reality up until today, and then there will be reality after today."

The attack, in which Palestinian fighters entered Israel and infiltrated military bases, towns and farms and took hostages, is unprecedented in Israeli history since town-bytown fighting in the 1948 war of

Al-Quds Brigades military wing of Islamic Jihad, another major Palestinian faction also declared that its fighters have joined the operation as Hamas called on Palestinians ev-

erywhere to fight. "We are part of this battle, our fighters are side-by-side with their brothers in the Qassam Brigades until victory is achieved," said Islamic Jihad armed wing spokesman Abu Hamza on a post on Telegram.

"This storm which started from Gaza will spread to the West Bank and outside the country and all the places where our people and nation are present," Hamas politburo chief Ismail Haniveh said.

"The enemy besieging Gaza has planned to surprise it and escalate the aggression against our people in the Gaza Strip, in addition to the settlement and aggression that continues every moment in the West Bank, which seeks to uproot our people and expel them from their land, and the crimes of the occupation against our people in the 1948s, as it stands beĥind all the killing and assassination operations there, and the occupation's continuation of detaining our prisoners for decades, and reneging on agreements when he re-arrested those liberated from the swap deal," Haniyeh said.

For its part, Hezbollah issued a statement congratulating the Gaza resistance for the "heroic operation," calling it "a decisive response to the continuing crimes of the occupation ... and a [clear reminder] that the will of the Palestinian people and the rifle of resistance are the only options in the face of aggression and occupation and a message to the Arab and Islamic world and the entire international community, especially those seeking normalization.

The escalation comes against a backdrop of surging violence between Israel and Palestinians in the West Bank, which together with the Gaza Strip is part of the territories where Palestinians have long sought to establish a state.

It also comes at a time of political upheaval in Israel, which has been riven by deep divisions over moves to overhaul the judiciary, and as Israel cuts power supply to Gaza

Israeli Energy Minister Yisrael Katz signed an order that would disconnect the Gaza Strip from the Israeli electricity grid on Saturday evening.


The massive stadium here is one of the venues of the ongoing cricket World Cup. Additional Commission-

fervor and intensity, presenting a spotlight on the remarkable athletic prowess of these young participants. Their skills and sportsmanship added thrill and excitement to the entire day.



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Outpost Top Medical Body Suggests Dos And Don't For Doctors' Signboards, Prescriptions

New Delhi: A doctor should not use an unusually large signboard and write on it anything other than his name, qualifications, titles, specialty or registration number, the National Medical Commission (NMC) has suggested, saying his prescription papers should also have the same contents.

It is improper to affix a signboard on a chemist's shop or in places where he does not reside or work, the NMC's Ethics and Medical Registration Board (EMRB) said in its E-Book: "Professional Conduct Review – Lessons from Case Archives".

The book also highlighted that trust deficit in the doctor-patient relationship leads to litigation against the doctors and emphasised that the most common cause of complaints against doctors is due to a communication gap.

The commission stated that care should be taken not to mislead the public through signboards, visiting cards, announcements etc.

Medical practitioners may acquire skills and training in various areas related to a particular field,



but the use of the title 'consultant/specialist' should be restricted to those who are qualified in the particular speciality, it said.

Amid India Vs Bharat Row, Shashi Tharoor Says You Can't Use 'Hindu' Either

Bengaluru: Congress MP Shashi Tharoor on Friday took a swipe at those who have a problem with the term 'India' but are comfortable calling themselves 'Hindu', although both the words, India and Hindu, are derived from the same etymology, which is river Sindhu. Dwelling on the origin of the term 'Hindu' during the launch of 'Nanu Yaake Hindu', the Kannada version of his book 'Why I am a Hindu', the Thiruvananthapuram MP said both the words were given by foreigners to describe people beyond the river Sindhu or Indus.

Mr Tharoor's book has been translated from English to Kannada by Congress leader Prof K E Radhakrishna.

In the midst of the 'India versus Bharat' debate, Mr Tharoor said, "It's very ironic when I hear some people in the ruling party objecting to the use of the word 'India' saying that it is not authentic and the same people



shout slogans saying 'Garv Se Kaho Hum Hindu Hain'."

"Well, 'India' and 'Hindu' are derived from the same etymology. If you don't want to use 'India', you can't use 'Hindu' either. They both come from the same source, from the river Sindhu," he explained.

Mr Tharoor said it is still interesting that Hindus call themselves by a label that they did not invent themselves in any of their own languages, but "adopted it cheerfully when others began to refer to them by that word".

Noting that some Hindus prefer an altogether different term, 'Sanatana Dharma', he said Hinduism is just a name that foreigners gave for what they saw as the indigenous religion of India. Hinduism, according to the Congress MP, embraces an eclectic range of doctrines and practices, which believes in religion

tices, which believes in reincarnation and in the caste system. "But none of these constitutes an obligatory credo for a Hindu. We have no compulsory dominance. And this is why I'm

so comfortable with the tenets

of Hinduism, much more than I would be with those of the other faiths that I know," Mr Tharoor underlined.

The Congress MP said the great sages first came up with the original idea of the divine Brahma, which was very much similar to the Islamic idea of God -- that is a God without shape, without form, without gender.

The rishis or seers then realised that this was not good enough for ordinary people as they found them worshipping mountains, trees and rivers because they needed something to focus on. Thus was born the idea of worshipping the divine with a form, Mr Tharoor explained.

Everybody was free to imagine the divine in whatever form or shape he or she chose, he said. "You want to imagine God

as a 10-handed woman riding a tiger, you're welcome to do that. You want to imagine God as a potbelly figure with an elephant's head, you're welcome to do that.



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US: Nearly 1,000 Songbirds Die After Crashing Into Chicago Building Windows

Around 1,000 songbirds died recently during night-time after they suffered a crash into US' McCormick Place Lakeside Center's windows amid a deadly conflux of prime migration conditions, rain and the low-slung exhibition hall's lights and windowlined walls. David Willard, the person who had been checking the grounds of Chicago's lakefront exhibition center for dead birds for nearly 40 years told the news agency Associated Press, "It was just like a carpet of dead birds at the windows there."

Willard is a retired bird division collections manager at the Chicago Field Museum. His duties included administering, preserving and cataloguing the museum's collection of 500,000 bird specimens along with searching for bird strikes as part of migration research. While talking about this event, Williard said that he had never seen anything remotely close to such a scale in his past 40 years of working. He added that a normal night would be when zero to 15 birds would die in such a manner but this was a shocking outlier for even him, reported AP News. A senior conservation ecologist at the Field Museum of Natural History, Douglas Stotz, told CBS News "It was an unbelievable kill that happened, and there were over 900. I think the final total was 961 birds just at McCormick Place."



them. So the combination of lights and windows is deadly." As per the estimate of researchers, hundreds of millions of birds die each year in the US in window strikes. A study was released by Scientists with the Smithsonian Conservation Biology Institute and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in 2014 according to which around 365 million to 988 million birds die annually, AP reported. The AP reported that window strike is an issue in almost every major US city. The reason behind it being such a common issue is that birds are not able to see clear or reflective glass and they don't understand it's a lethal barrier. When they see plants or bushes through the windows or see them being reflected in them then they head straight for them and in the process, they end up

killing themselves. Birds that migrate during the night rely on the stars to navigate.

night rely on the stars to navigate. The bright lighting on the buildings attracts the birds and confuses them which increases the crashes or leaves birds flying around until they die from exhaustion. This phenomenon is known as fatal light attraction, reported AP.

Stotz added, "When birds are migrating, they don't understand that they can't fly through windows, and lights attract According to a report of the Al-Arabiya, an avian ecologist at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, named Anna Pidgeon said that window strikes and fatal light attraction are easily preventable. Pidgeon added that building managers can simply dim their lights, and architects can design windows with markings on the glass that the birds would recognise easily. She further said that people can add screens, paint their windows or apply decals to the glass as well.

Popular weight loss drugs linked to higher risk of stomach paralysis

WASHINGTON: Drugs like Ozempic, which have become increasingly popular for losing weight, heighten the risk of certain severe gastrointestinal problems including stomach paralysis, according to a large study published Thursday.

The paper, published in the Journal of the American Medical Association (JAMA), looked at a class of drugs called GLP-1 agonists that includes the brands Wegovy, Ozempic, Rybelsus and Saxenda.

It then compared the rate of serious side effects to another class of weight loss drug, bupropion-naltrexone.

The GLP-1 agonists were associated with an almost four times increased risk of stomach paralysis, a nine times higher risk of pancreatitis and four times greater risk of bowel obstruction.

These conditions can cause hospitalization and require surgery, depending on their severity.

"Given the wide use of these drugs, these adverse events, although rare, must be considered by patients thinking about using them for weight loss," said lead author Mohit Sodhi, a medical student at the University of British Columbia in Canada, in a statement.

"The risk calculus will differ depending on whether a patient is using these drugs for diabetes, obesity or just general weight loss," he added. "People who are otherwise healthy may be less willing to accept these potentially serious adverse events."

Originally developed for managing Type 2 diabetes, GLP-1 agonists have soared in popularity in recent years as a means to lose weight, mainly through "off-label" use.

Saxenda and Wegovy were approved for weight loss in 2020 and 2021, but the clinical trials used to greenlight them involved too few people with too short a follow-up time to detect very rare events, the researchers said.

Epidemiologist and co-author Mahyar Etminan said that while there had been anecdotal reports of some patients using these drugs for weight loss and

then having repeated episodes of nausea and vomiting as a result of stomach paralysis, the current study was the first to examine the question at a larger scale.

The authors trawled through US patient records searching for people prescribed liraglutide or semaglutide – the two main GLP-1 agonists – or bupropion/ naltrexone, a non GLP-1 weight loss medication, to see how many went on to develop certain gastrointestinal conditions.

Their analysis included patients with a recent history of obesity, but excluded those with diabetes or who had been prescribed another antidiabetic drug. Just over 5,400 records were included in the final analysis.

"The results from this study highlight how important it is that patients access these drugs only through trusted medical professionals, and only with ongoing support and monitoring," said Simon Cork, a senior lecturer at Anglia Ruskin University, who was not involved in the research.

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
