Security Boosted In Srinagar On President's Visit

Srinagar: Security has been beefed up in Srinagar and adjoining areas ahead of President Droupadi Murmu's visit to Kashmir on Wednesday during which she will attend the convocation ceremony of Kashmir University, officials said here.

Security forces, including police and paramilitary CRPF, have been deployed in adequate numbers around Kashmir University a day ahead of Murmu's arrival in the valley, the officials said.

Murmu is scheduled to deliver the 20th convocation lecture at the Kashmir University as chief guest during her maiden visit to the Valley after assuming the office of the president of India in July last year.

Elaborate security arrangements have been put in place in Srinagar, especially around the Kashmir University, which is the main venue for the high profile event.

The Varsity, they said, underwent extensive sanitization as part of the stringent security measures devised for the President of India's visit, even as no specific intelligence inputs



regarding potential strike by terrorists have been received.

In addition, a thorough intelligence analysis is being done to scrutinize the backgrounds of those attending the convocation, irrespective of their role during the event, scheduled to be held on Wednesday.

In addition to drone monitoring around the venue, sources said policemen in civvies have been stationed in and outside Varsity to keep an eye on suspicious individuals.

Some Plants May Worsen Air Pollution On A Warming Planet: Study

On a warming planet, plants like oaks and poplars will emit more of a compound that exacerbates poor air quality, contributing to problematic particulate matter and low-atmosphere ozone, a study shows.

The same compound, called isoprene, can also improve the quality of clean air while making plants more resistant to stressors including insects and high temperatures.

"Do we want plants to make more isoprene so they're more resilient, or do we want them making less so it's not making air pollution worse? What's the right balance?" said Tom Sharkey, a professor at Michigan State University in the US.

"Those are really the funda-

mental questions driving this work. The more we understand, the more effectively we can answer them," Sharkey said.

Isoprene from plants is the second-highest emitted hydrocarbon on Earth, only behind methane emissions from human activity. Yet most people have never heard of it, the researchers said.

Isoprene interacts with nitrogen oxide compounds found in air pollution produced by coalfired power plants and internal combustion engines in vehicles. These reactions create ozone, aerosols and other byproducts that are unhealthy for both humans and plants, they said.

Prior to the latest study published in the journal Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences, the researchers


understood that certain plants produce isoprene as they carry out photosynthesis.

They also knew the changes that the planet is facing were having competing effects on isoprene production.

Increasing carbon dioxide in the atmosphere drives the rate down, while increasing temperatures accelerate the rate. One of the questions behind the MSU team's new publication was essentially which one of these effects will win out, the researchers said.

"We were looking for a regulation point in the isoprene's biosynthesis pathway under high carbon dioxide," said Abira Sahu, the lead author of the new report and a postdoctoral research associate in Sharkey's research group.





Srinagar's Tele-MANAS: A Beacon Of Hope For Mental Health Support

'27,000 Calls Received In 11 Months; 200 Youngsters Counseled'

Srinagar: The groundbreaking Tele Mental Health Assistance and Networking Across States (Tele-MANAS) cell, operational at the Institute of Mental Health and Neurosciences (IMHANS) Srinagar, has emerged as a lifeline for individuals grappling with stress, drug addiction and anxiety-related issues in Jammu and Kashmir.

Since its inception eleven months ago, the first-of-its-kind mental health helpline has received an overwhelming response, with approximately 27,000 calls being made.

Launched on November 4, 2022, this unique three-tier system incorporates mental health counselors, clinical psychologists, and psychiatrists, ensuring a comprehensive support network for those in need.

A senior health official informed that the helpline has handled over 26,700 calls, addressing concerns ranging from stress and drug addiction to suicidal tendencies and anxiety.

Notably, around 700 distressing calls involving suicidal tendencies were timely and effectively counseled, demonstrating the critical role Tele-MANAS plays in crisis intervention. The recent introduction of In-

dia's first Tele-MANAS chatbot in Jammu & Kashmir has further extended the reach of mental health support. Designed to engage with individuals in distress, the chatbot provides 24/7 access to health counselors, clinical psychologists, and consultants. This digital initiative not only ensures roundthe-clock assistance but also encourages individuals to seek help

from the comfort of their homes, addressing privacy concerns and enhancing accessibility.

The toll-free helpline number for Tele MANAS Cell J&K is 14416/1-800-891-4416, and for the Tele MANAS Chatbot, it is 9797600601. The helpline operates 24x7, offering mental health services and drug de-addiction services to the general public.

In light of previous studies conducted by the Institute of Mental Health and Neurosciences (IMHANS), it is evident that Kashmir faces a significant mental health challenge. A study in 2016 revealed that 11.3 percent of the adult population in the valley suffers from mental illness. Another study in 2015 by Medicines Sans Frontiers and IMHANS indicated that nearly one in five individuals in Kashmir exhibits symptoms of post-traumatic stress disorder.

Russia's Putin says Israel-Gaza conflict shows US 'failure' in Middle East

MOSCOW: Russian President Vladimir Putin said Tuesday the Israel-Gaza conflict showed the "failure" of Washington's Middle East policy and called the creation of "an independent sovereign Palestinian state" a "necessity."

The Russian leader made the comments while meeting Iraq's Prime Minister Mohammed Shia Al-Sudani in Moscow, days after Hamas launched a massive attack on Israel.

"I think many people would agree with me that it's a clear example of the failure of US politics in the Middle East," Pu-

He spoke of the "necessity to implement the decisions of the UN Security Council on the creation of an independent sovereign Palestinian state."

Putin said the US had "tried to monopolize regulating (the conflict) but, unfortunately, were not preoccupied with looking for compromises that would be acceptable for both sides."

The West had "not taken into account the fundamental interests of the Palestinian people,"

A day earlier, Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov said the creation of a Palestinian state was the "most reliable" solution for peace in Israel.

The Kremlin said earlier on Tuesday that a visit by Palestinian president Mahmud Abbas, planned before the Hamas attack on Israel, to Moscow was in preparation but did not give a date.

Moscow has said it was concerned that a foreign player could enter the conflict after the US moved warships closer

4 AMU Students Booked For Marching in Support of Palestine

ALIGARH: Police here on Monday lodged a case against four Aligarh Muslim University (AMU) students for taking out a protest march on the campus to express solidarity with Palestinians, a senior officer said. SP City R Shekhar Pathak in a statement said police have booked several students in the matter only four of whom are named.

The students have been booked under sections 153 A (promoting enmity between different groups on grounds of religion, race, place of birth, language, etc), 188 (disobedience to order duly promulgated by public servant), and 505(statements inducing pub-

lic mischief) of the IPC. Students took out the protest march Sunday night from Duck Point to Babey Sir Syed Gate on the AMU campus.

Police said the protestors had

not taken any prior permission for their march. The FIR says the students marched in "support" of a "terrorist group." Aatif, Khalid, Kaamran, and Naved Chaudhry are the four students named in the FIR. Pathak said

BJP MP from Aligarh, Satish Gautam, in a statement, said he had asked police and the AMU acting vice Chancellor to take stringent action against the protesters.

Gaza Under Fiercest Israeli Bombardment Ever

GAZA: Israel pounded the Gaza Strip on Tuesday with the fiercest air strikes in its 75year conflict with the Palestinians, razing whole districts to dust despite a threat from Hamas militants to execute a captive for each home hit.

Across the barrier wall surrounding the strip, Israeli soldiers were collecting the last of the dead four days after Palestinian fighters rampaged through towns in by far the deadliest attack in Israel's history.

Israel has vowed to take "mighty revenge", calling up hundreds of thousands of reservists and placing Gaza, crowded home to 2.3 million people, under total siege.

Israel's embassy in Wash-

ington said the death toll from weekend's stunning Palestinian operation had surpassed 1,000.

The victims were both civilians inhabiting illegal settlements and military personnel, gunned down in homes, on streets or at a dance party. Estimated hundred Israelis and some foreigners were captured and taken to Gaza as hostages, some paraded through the streets.

Gaza's health ministry said Israel's retaliatory strikes had killed at least 770 peo-

ple and wounded more than 4,000. The victims are overwhelmingly civilians, including women and children. The air strikes, already the heaviest ever, intensified on Tuesday night, shaking the ground and pouring columns of smoke and flames into the

morning sky. The United Nations said more than 180,000 Gazans had been made homeless, many huddling on streets or

At the morgue in Gaza's Khan Younis hospital, bodies were laid on the ground on stretchers with names written on their bellies. Medics called for relatives to pick up bodies quickly because there was no more space for the dead.

A municipal building was hit while being used as an emergency shelter; survivors there spoke of many dead.

"There is an extraordinary number of martyrs, people are still under the rubble, some friends are either martyrs or wounded," said Ala Abu Tair, 35, who had sought shelter there with his family after fleeing Abassan Al-Kabira near the border. "No place is safe in Gaza, as you see they hit everywhere.'

Radwan Abu al-Kass, a boxing instructor and father of three, said he had been one of the last to evacuate his fivestorey building in the Al Rimal district after the area came under attack. He finally left when a missile hit the building, which was destroyed by a bigger strike after he got out.

"The whole district was just erased," he said.

Three Gaza journalists were killed when an Israeli missile hit a building while they were outside reporting, bringing the number of journalists killed to six.

U.N. High Commissioner for Human Rights Volker Turk said civilians had been harmed in Israeli strikes on tower blocks, schools and U.N. buildings.

"International humanitarian law is clear: the obligation to take constant care to spare the civilian population and civilian objects remains applicable throughout the attacks," he said.

TRAIL OF BLOOD

In Israel, there has still been no complete official count of the dead and missing from Saturday's attacks. In the southern town of Be'eri, where more than 100 bodies have been retrieved, volunteers in yellow vests and face masks solemnly carried the dead out of homes on stretchers.

NewsClick Founder Prabir Purkayastha Sent To 10-Day **Judicial Custody**

NEW DELHI: Delhi court Tuesday sent to 10-day judicial custody NewsClick founder Prabir Purkayastha and human resources department head Amit Chakravarty, arrested in a case lodged under anti-terror law UAPA over allegations that the news portal received money to spread pro-China propaganda. The two were produced before Additional Sessions Judge Hardeen Kaur around 2:50 PM

The prosecution sought 10 days judicial custody for the duo, which was firmly opposed by Mr Purkayastha's counsel, who asserted "prima facie" no case was made out against his client.

"What terrorist act have I committed? How can I as a journalist commit such an act? What is the allegation in the FIR? That we have done critical reporting of (government's) Covid policy and farmers protest. Is that terrorism?" the lawyer said.

The counsel said if there was even an iota of doubt about their guilt, sending them to judicial custody will be a "travesty of justice".

The counsel for Mr Chakravarty argued he was not a journalist nor had he received any payment.

"There is no such allegation that there is a map of India, published by Newsclick, that shows India without Kashmir and Arunachal Pradesh," he

Countering the arguments, the Special Public Prosecutor (SPP) Atul Shrivastava said the case was at a stage when evidence was still being collected and the prosecution has sought judicial custody for the accused in all "fairness"

The Special Cell of Delhi Police had arrested Mr Purkayastha and Mr Chakravarty on October 3. Police also sealed NewsClick's office in Delhi.

According to the FIR, a large amount of funds to the news portal came from China to "disrupt the sovereignty of India" and cause disaffection against the country. It also alleged Mr Purkay-

astha conspired with a group -- People's Alliance for Democracy and Secularism (PADS) -- to sabotage the electoral process during the 2019 Lok Sabha

Iran's Leader: Israel to Receive 'Heavier Slap' for Gaza Massacre TEHRAN: Iran's Supreme

Delhi LG Okays Prosecution Of Roy, Kashmir Prof

NEW DELHI: Delhi Lt Governor V K Saxena has accorded sanction for the prosecution of author Arundhati Roy and a former Kashmiri professor in a 2010 case related to alleged provocative speeches, Raj Niwas officials said on Tuesday.

The FIR against Roy and former professor Sheikh Showkat Hussain was registered following the orders of the Court of Metropolitan Magistrate, New Delhi, they added.

"LG V K Saxena noted that prima facie a case is made out against Roy and Dr Hussain, former Professor, International Law, Central University of Kashmir, for commission of offence under sections 153A (promoting enmity between different groups on grounds of religion, race, place of birth, maintenance of harmony), 153B (imputations, assertions prejudicial to national-integration) and 505 (statements conducing to public mischief) of Indian Penal Code for their speeches at a public function in the national capital." a Rai Niwas official said on Tuesday.

Under Section 196(1) of the Code of Criminal Procedure (CrPC), a valid sanction for prosecution from the state government is a prerequisite for certain offences such as hate speech, hurting religious sentiments, hate crimes, sedition, waging war against state and promoting enmity among others.

Two other accused -- Kashmiri separatist leader Sayed Ali Shah Geelani and a Delhi University lecturer Syed Abdul Rahman Geelani, who was acquitted by the Supreme Court in Parliament attack case on technical grounds -- died during the pendency of the case.

Sushil Pandit, a social activist from Kashmir, had filed a complaint on October 28, 2010 with the Tilak Marg Station House Officer against various people and speakers involved in delivering "provocative speeches" in public in a conference organised by 'Committee for release of Political Prisoners (CRPP) under the banner of "Azadi - The only Way", on October 21.

The complainant had alleged that the issue discussed and propagated was "Separation of Kashmir from India"

It was also alleged the speeches were provocative in nature, thus jeopardising public peace and security.

'Restoration Of Democratic Rights'

Opposition Parties Stage Protest In Jammu

JAMMU: The main opposition parties in Jammu and Kashmir, including the National Conference, Congress and PDP, on Tuesday staged a nearly threehour-long dharna for restoration of democratic and constitutional rights in the Union Territory.

This was the first major protest here since the revocation of the special status to Jammu and Kashmir in 2019.

The protest at Maharaja Hari Singh Park in the heart of Jammu was supposed to be led by National Conference president Farooq Abdullah, but he could not make it to the heavily guarded venue due to "ill health."

However, senior party leaders led by provincial president Rattan Lal Gupta participated in the protest.

Likewise, PDP president and former chief minister Mehbooba Mufti also did not participate in the protest but almost all senior leaders of the party in Jammu, including vice presi-

dent Abdul Hameed Choudhary and former MLC Firdous Tak, were part of the protest.

National Conference vice president Omar Abdullah on Monday said the election commission not announcing the poll schedule for the Jammu and Kashmir Assembly can push people to take to streets for their right to have an elected government.

"It seems like we are being pushed to a situation where we have to protest even for our democratic rights," Abdullah had told reporters in Srinagar on Monday, shortly after the election commission announced the poll schedule for five states - Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Rajasthan, Telangana and Mizoram.

Hundreds of leaders and workers of various parties including CPI(M). National Panthers Party (NPP), Awami National Conference, Shiv Sena (UBT), Awami National Conference and social organisations turned up for the protest.

"The opposition parties

have come together to demand immediate restoration of statehood, democratic and constitutional rights," Pradesh Congress Committee president Vikar Rasool Wani said.

"We will continue our test for the rights of the people and safeguarding their interests," he further said.

Wani alleged the BJP is delaying elections deliberately, knowing fully that it, along with its allies like the Democratic Progressive Azad Party and the Apni Party, will face the rout in the electoral battles.

CPI(M) leader M Y Tarigami said they have no hope from the BJP-led central government as all its promises have proved "false".

PDP's Tak termed the joint protest as a "positive sign" for the people of Jammu and Kashmir and said the message from this platform to the country is that all opposition parties need to stand up against the "divisive politics" of the present dispensation to safeguard the secularism and the "idea of India."

Encroachment Of Forests

HC Seeks Govt Response Without 'Failure'

SRINAGAR: The High Court of J&K and Ladakh has asked the government to file "without fail" response to a Public Interest Litigation alleging that various forest areas have been indiscriminately encroached upon and used for commercial purposes in Jammu and Kashmir.

"Response has not been filed. Let the same be filed without fail, considering the importance of the issues raised, as it has been alleged that various forest areas have been indiscriminately encroached upon and used for commercial purposes," a division bench of Chief Justice N. Kotiswar Singh and Justice Moksha Khajuria Kazmi said. The court has directed the government to file the response by or before No-

The order by the court comes nearly a fortnight after it granted four weeks time to CBI to inform it whether the sanction has been granted from the concerned authority for filing the charge sheet, if not and assign the reasons there for if it is not filed regarding illegal constructions at Patnitop.

On December 31, 2019, the court had directed Director Central Bureau of Investigation to conduct in-depth enquiry into encroachment on forest land and other public land; illegal change of use and misuse of the land in violation of the permitted user; raising of illegal constructions; failure of the authorities to take action and fix the responsibility.

Closes PIL On Parks

SRINAGAR: J&K and Ladakh High Court has closed a Public Interest Litigation pertaining to lack of green space and parks especially in twin capitals of Srinagar and Jammu.

...this Court is ...satisfied that the authorities are doing the needful for maintenance and preservation of the green space and parks," a Division Bench of Chief Justice N. Kotiswar Singh and Justice Moksha Khajuria Kazmi said while closing the PIL initiated in 2017.

"We are of the view that it may not be necessary for us to monitor the same at this stage and accordingly, the present PIL is closed with the above observations," the court said, adding, "However, it goes without saying that if the authorities do not continue with or fail to maintain and preserve the green space and parks, liberty is granted to the petitioner for reactivation of the PIL."

The court's orders followed perusal of status reports filed by the authorities, highlight the various measures taken to maintain and preserve parks and gardens in and around the city of Srinagar as well as in Jammu

The authorities submitted that they successfully completed the Tulip Show with The Tulin garden, they said. in the World Book of Records

(London). "This has been a monumental recognition of the Union territory of Jammu and Kashmir hailing the Tulip garden as Asia's largest tulip paradise, adorned with 1.5 million tulip bulbs," they said.

They also submitted that four Mughal Gardens namely Nishat, Shalimar, Cheshmashahi and Pari Mahal have been placed in the tentative list of UNESCO's World Heritage Sites. They said that a pilot project has been undertaken by the department of Floriculture and JSWF (a public charitable trust) wherein a Memorandum of Understanding has been signed on 28 July 2021 for a collaborative partnership for the conservation and maintenance work at the select sites of Shalimar Bagh and Nishat Bagh.

Similarly, Director Floriculture submitted that the department is presently maintaining 64 Parks and Gardens in the Jammu Division having an area of 1898.74 Kanals. The Director said single use plastic and other plastic material has been strictly prohibited in all the existing parks and Gardens maintained by the Department. Win for NC-Congress

'n a largely predictable result, the National Conference (NC) and Congress alliance swept the elections to Ladakh Hill Development Council (LAHDC) of Kargil district. The alliance secured 22 seats, while the BJP managed to win only two seats, with two going to Independent candidates. The result is being read as a sign of dissatisfaction with the policies of the BJP-led central government post-2019.

The NC and Congress see this election victory as a triumph for the newly formed INDIA Alliance, comprising Congress and the NC. However, it's essential to recognize that this win is localized and may not significantly impact the upcoming national elections. Still, it underlines the need for the central government to listen to the voices of the people in Ladakh and address their concerns, lest the discontent continues to simmer.

Over the past four years, Ladakh has been nursing a deepening sense of grievance against New Delhi. Following the revocation of Article 370 on August 5, 2019, and which incidentally was celebrated in Leh district, the region has sought constitutional protections from the central government to ensure its land and jobs were reserved only for local residents. Before the reorganization of Jammu and Kashmir, Ladakh had four MLAs and two MLCs in the then state Assembly, providing a stronger voice for the region. Now, one Member of Parliament democratically represents the region.

The region is now directly ruled by the central government through a Lieutenant Governor, which its residents think renders the democratically elected LAHDCs, both in Leh and Kargil, somewhat redundant. This sense of disempowerment has united the people of Leh and Kargil, who are now advocating together for statehood and the protection of their rights.

Earlier also, the LAHDC has demanded statehood, the extension of the sixth schedule, separate Lok Sabha seats for Leh and Kargil, and the establishment of a Public Service Commission. Significantly, the Apex Body Leh (ABL) and the Kargil Democratic Alliance (KDA) have displayed rare political unity, jointly protesting and organizing strikes to advocate for their demands.

The question that looms now is how the newly formed NC-Congress coalition, leading the LAHDC-Kargil, will press for statehood. The NC's stated policy includes the reversal of Article 370, but its actions within the LAHDC will determine the path forward. As for the victory being seen as that of INDIA Alliance, it is a stretch at this time. Both Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh have very little sway in national politics. One thing we expect the new LAHDC to do is to ensure better governance to the local population as primarily their role is of a civic nature.

Original Sin

he unprecedented surprise attack by Hamas on Israel on Saturday, killing some 700 people, should serve as a reminder of the unsustainability of the situation in the occupied and blockaded Palestinian territories and the dangers that non-state actors such as Hamas pose to Israel, no matter how strong their military and intelligence agencies are. Tensions have been flaring in the West Bank for months, but nobody expected such a coordinated, low-tech yet lethal incursion from Gaza. The West Bank has seen violence on a daily basis in recent months. Before Saturday's attack, some 200 Palestinians and 30 Israelis were killed this year alone. The Benjamin Netanyahu government largely ignored the violence, and went ahead with its other policy preferences, including the overhaul of the judiciary. The Israeli military described the situation in Gaza as "stable instability", noting that the situation, though volatile, was under control. And then came the Hamas attack, reminiscent of the 1973 Yom Kippur war when Egypt and Syria shook Israel. Hamas, an Islamist militant organisation that carried out suicide attacks in the 1990s and early 2000s, showed no distinction between civilians and soldiers, dealing the bloodiest blow to Israel in recent history.

The attack raises moral and pragmatic questions. Hamas's indiscriminate violence against Israeli civilians is repugnant and is not going to help the Palestinian cause in any way. On the contrary, it will put more Palestinian lives at risk as Israel, equally disregarding civilian casualties, is pounding the besieged enclave. But at the same time, Palestinian territories, under the yoke of the longest occupation in modern history, have been a fuming volcano. There is no peace process. Israel has continued to build settlements in the West Bank, raising security barriers and checkpoints, limiting Palestinian movements, and never hesitating to use force or collective punishment to keep organised Palestinians under check. This status quo has only turned Palestinians more radical and Hamas even stronger. Israel has now declared war. But past attacks — ground invasions and air strikes — have done little to weaken Hamas. West Asia has also witnessed geopolitical realignments in recent years – from the Israel-Arab reconciliation to the Iran-Saudi détente. But these changes have conveniently sidestepped the occupation of Palestine, West Asia's original sin, letting the status quo prevail. But the status quo cannot prevail without consequences. If Israel and other regional and international players want lasting peace and stability in the region, their focus must turn to finding a solution to the question of Palestine. The military operations without addressing the core issue would only be cosmetic interventions.

he real estate sector in India saw a huge growth in the last 20 years. The returns from investments in the real estate sector have been huge as compared to other sectors. This is the reason people have preferred to invest in this sector. There has been a downfall also during the last five to six years in some cities but still this sector is performing better. The property buyers however have been concerned about lack of accountability in this sector. In Spite of being such a huge sector with billions of rupees being invested all over the country the real estate sector was not guided by a separate legislation. There have been several instances wherein the builders delayed in giving possession to the customers.

As these cases rose to a great level, the Govt decided to streamline the sector by protecting rights of property buyers and to boost the real estate investments as well. The legislative process to enact a law began during Congress led UPA Government in 2013. On 14th August 2013 the Real Estate (Regulation and Development) Bill was introduced in Raiva Sabha. On 9th September 2013 this bill was referred to the Standing Committee on Urban Development. Lots of deliberations took place between different stakeholders in October and November 2013 which included Govt, representatives from real estate sector, NGOs etc.

In Feb 2014, the Standing Committee and Urban Development Ministry submitted its report to the Parliament. On 7th April 2015, the Union Cabinet headed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi gave approval for making new amendments in this bill which was introduced in Rajya Sabha on 6th May 2015 and referred to the standing committee with 21 Rajya Sabha members. The committee made some changes and 20 amendments were introduced and finally the bill was passed by Rajya Sabha on 10th March 2016. The Lok Sabha also passed this bill on March 15th and on March 25th 2016 President of India gave his assent to the bill. From May 1st 2016 The Real Estate Regulatory and Development Act -RERA came into force across the country except Jammu & Kashmir.

As Real Estate Regulatory and Development Act 2016 could not be extended to J&K in view of Article 370, the J&K Government headed by the then Governor Satya Pal Malik on December 16th 2018 gave assent to enact a similar state law in J&K called Jammu & Kashmir Real Estate (Regulation and Development) Act 2018. This was the time when BJP had taken back its support from PDP and the erstwhile state was put under President's rule. Finally the Govt of India in October 2020 implemented Real Estate (Regulatory & Development) Act (RERA) in the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir through a Gazette notification issued by the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA). The order issued on Gazette of India, under provisions of the Union Territory (UT) of Jammu & Kashmir (J&K) Reorganisation (Adaptation of Central Laws), said:

'The Real Estate (Regulation and Development) Act (RERA), 2016 will now be applicable in the UT and Section 86- In sub-section (2), for -the Union territory Government of Puducherry occurring at both the places, substitute,-the Union Territory Government of Puducherry or the Union territory Government of Jammu and Kashmir"

Builders in J&K are not following the Real Estate Law as they make massive constructions without anyone to take action against them. The builders, as per media reports, go for more floors in the buildings especially around Jammu and such constructions are made which are not approved in the original plans. Like other states many customers are not given possession in time by the builders and there is nobody to hear their grievances

After 4 months, J&K Government in February 2021, initiated the process for constitution of the Real Estate Regulatory Authority (RERA) under the provisions of the Real Estate (Regulation and Development) Act, 2016.

The J&K Housing and Urban Development Department issued an open advertisement inviting applications from eligible/desirable persons for selection to the post of Chairperson and Member(s) of the RERA. On August 1st 2022 after almost 2 years of extension of this central law (RERA) to the UT of J&K, a Retired IAS officer and former Chief Secretary Goa, Rai was appointed as the first chairperson of the Jammu and Kashmir Real Estate Regulatory Authority (RERA) on August 1, 2022.

"In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 22 of the Real Estate (Regulation and Development) Act, 2016, the J&K government appoints Parimal Rai, IAS (retired), as Chairperson of the J&K Real Estate Regulatory Authority (RERA),' read the notification issued by the then Principal Secretary Housing and Urban Development Department Dheeraj Gupta. After 50 days of his appointment Parimal Rai resigned from the post of RERA Chairperson. The Govt accepted his resignation with effect from August 12 th 2022.

"In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 24 of the Real Estate Regulation and Development) Act. 2016, the Government of Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir hereby accepts the resignation of Parimal Rai, IAS (retired), from the post of Chairperson Jammu and Kashmir Real Estate Regulatory Authority (RERA), w.e.f., August 12, 2022," read the order issued by Principal Secretary J&K Housing and Urban Development Department J&K Government.

Importance of RERA

As explained above, the Real Estate Regulation and Development Act (RERA) was enacted by the Parliament to regulate the real estate industry in India and safeguard home buyers' rights. Before this law was enacted the property buyers especially flat or homebuyers in India frequently complained that the real estate sector was tilted in the favour of the builders and developers. That was the main reason the Govt of India came up with RERA to make real estate transactions between the homebuyers, customers and real estate dealers more transparent and equitable. The preamble of this act says that this act is to establish the Real Estate Regulatory Au thority for regulation and promotion of the real estate sector and to ensure sale of plot, apartment or building, as the case may be, or sale of real estate project, in an efficient and transparent manner. It further reads:

'To protect the interest of consumers in the real estate sector and to establish an adjudicating mechanism for speedy dispute redressal and also to establish the Appellate Tribunal to hear appeals from the decisions, directions or orders of the Real Estate Regulatory Authority and the adjudicating officer and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.'

The main objectives of the Real Estate (Regulation and Development) Act 2016 are listed as un-

To set up a Real Estate Regulatory Authority -RERA in every state and union territory of India which will protect the rights and interests of the homebuyers in India

To maintain transparency in real estate transactions & to ensure the accurate flow of information between developers and homebuyers

To impose greater responsibilities on builders well as buyers and to uplift the credibility of the real estate sector in India and attract investors

In the past, I have written extensively on non -implementation of central laws in J&K particularly Right to Information Act (RTI), Right to Education Act (RTE), Forest Rights Act (FRA), Consumer Protection Act, Fair Compensation Act. The Real Estate Regulation and Development Act 2016 is another progressive law that is not being enforced on the ground. I filed a detailed video report about this issue in Kashmir Observer's digital platform some months ago.

At a time when the government wants more investments in the real estate sector in J&K it is a matter of concern that the Real Estate Regulatory Authority-RERA is yet to be constituted under the Real Estate Regulation and Development Act 2016.

Builders in J&K are not following the Real Estate Law as they make massive constructions without anyone to take action against them. The builders, as per media reports, go for more floors in the buildings especially around Jammu and such constructions are made which are not approved in the original plans. Like other states many customers are not given possession in time by the builders and there is nobody to hear their grievances.

The government must hold an audit of all the progressive central laws applicable in J&K post article 370 abrogation. In-fact, this issue was raised by this author before the Union Home Minister Mr Amit Shah in November 2021 at Raj Bhavan Srinagar during his Kashmir visit. The Union Minister in front of the entire administration had shown seriousness about the issue and gave assurance to ensure better implementation of progressive central laws. It is now around 2 years since that meeting but we see many central laws not being enforced which includes Real Estates Regulation and Development Act -2016.

Yes, it's the sheer negative idiosyncrasy that is looming large onto the art and foil of present literary canon known to the outside world as Kashmir; Cashmerethe refin'd, posh, and delicate one in every aspect, so does in the dimension of beaux arts as well. But from the past few years, the flux of wannabe-scribblers conclusion has contorted the linear-shape of its literary dome.

Dabblers writing in English, or some in their vernacular don't give a damn to look into the standard writing parameters, meters like editing, proof-reading, re-checking for typos and other such blunders to put straight before making the work of art public. Besides, the rush of self-publishing has totally camouflaged the entire scene, several of these impatient neophytes [so I would like to refer them here] are in the run trying to garner themselves a place in literary circles sans having the fiber to bake themselves in an oven of écriture that demands scarification of time and energy. That is to say, after quick-fame and prestige these novices do not give a whim to the protocols which needs to be followed in t'is sublime pursuit, neither do they hark to the bell of their conscience which keeps donging by reminding them what they are doing, is it really worthwhile to do so? Or, should they need to sell some more time, energy, and velocity at workshops; colleges, and universities to hone their writing-caliber in tune with t'is business' ethical codes and morals, so as to carve for themselves a niche in world literature today.

This syndrome is in vogue in general these days, save in some exceptional cases that are maneuvering genuinely to build t'is vale some iota of reputation in the world academia today. Anyway, anyone who yearns to pursue writing as a career should nurture an ever burning flame within, a flame to read voraciously, burn his/'er mid-night oil to study queries different profusely, to develop a habit of empirical-research even in the field of social sciences and humanities, and above all, should listen to his/'er inner voice which separates evil from good, further, shouldn't stop unless and until, one gets puff'd up with a true-lore, knack and craft of a good writer, hmm, there is a lot of discrepancy b'twixt to read and to study. For example, when one reads one gets merely the cognizance of cover info of a book, that is just the repetition of writer's lines, but when one commences to study, one delves into the unknown realms of writer's being.



and that is where one starts to enjoy and to learn about different things, which lies beyond the compass of one's mental range. Yes, imagination starts to bounce in leaps and bounds, the mind initiates to touch the peripheries of extreme horizons.

Howbeit, a person who is going to write anything, or about something, should be a nitpick, should pay attention to details, a term 'caviler' would be appropriate rather, and above all, the person who is head over heels into writing [has to be indispensably so 'bout it, anyhow] should be his/'er own critic, ere someone else might fetch out his/'er asterisks into public eye. A good writer is always neat and in utmost unison with his thought-process, and always does away from the hypocrisy, plagiarism, and abstruser-musings of any sort. The bugs which oft confound the readership in a subtle woolgathering which to a certain extent dwindles the power of curiosity of a reader to know what's actually there to know in a book. Presumably, a prospective penner should avoid the aid of baroque intricacy of idioms and phrases, cliched terminology, age old jargons, and far-fetch'd similes and metaphors. Hitherto, I think, I have put too many imperatives and conditions for an amateur to acquire and to be the consummate master of escrita, [Portuguese word for Writing] thereof. Nevertheless, these stipulated prescriptions are yet to dominate the mise en scène of the current writing system which is gaining currency in Kashmir day in and day out, like the solfatara of ignorance in ancient Arabia ere the eminent splurging of the Clement One,

over the one and sundry alike.

Well, the different version of the same ailment making itself visible before us is the production of Facebook-literature which at present is so immense and large that one finds it hard to promulgate even a single syllable valid in substance and structure onto the forefront of a literary platform before the mass proliferation of the junk literary corpus- sprouting in plethora on social media handles like Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, Goodreads, Pinterest, LinkedIn, YouTube, just to name a few, and via the stunt of self-publishing. But, just remember, of t'is menace we collectively shall be accountable for it and it will earn us a blemish spot up and down in the annals of history. Because, the current œuvre d'art is at large, stretching in furlongs from the domain of standard writing parameters, but seriously needs an overhaul by an alchemy of objet d'art of past architectonic pillars of linguists and litterateurs. Rather, an intervention from superior reformers is in regard to surfactant the genres; poetry, essays, short stories, sermons, discourses, narratives, translation works, fiction, nonfiction et cetera, to stop t'is culture of faux pas in literature from becoming a cult, else it would seriously get the second language acquirers or, rather aspirers of Saxon's tongue, into the rutting ground of castigation and humiliation in a long run, more especially in the langue and parole. Hence, shooting up contaminated literature for flexing', without proper investigation and editing, publishing without penetrating scrutiny shall bore us negative outcomes in

near future. We should cleanse t'is foul propriety from emerging writing of Kashmir, writing in second-language or in the vernacular asap, also, we should learn to cordon off our sentences, words, letters, very closely ere making them public.

However, the production of junk-yard literature like effervescent micelles of soap and detergent, should be dissuaded at every way possible, unless and until, the subject doesn't meet all the angles of writing. So, that it follows all the aesthetics of writing properly and should indispensably carry on its dos and do nots to further its optimum positive growth. Thus, the process might help to straighten the clenching of social sentences and poetic-passages with lexemes of ostentatiously major but evidently minor significations from becoming a craze. Hence, qué será será. I'm just a slave of my Lord, the master of my naïve narrative.

In addition to t'is, we desperately need to unfurl radical thoughts in our writing, also, we should cling fast to our traditional values, anchor to our age-old prerogative-the resistance culture but unto time with discipline, and guard ourselves from an extravagant flattery of pseudo-nationalism. But opposite to that, we have dilettante[s] who seek 'bubble-reputation' overnight, for a dozen Facebook-likes and comments [which to me is a mere buffoonery, indeed], are ready to festoon those rooks with garlands and myrtles, who strip them naked in a broad daylight.

A good writer needs appreciation and that we necessarily should do in order to recognise his/'er efforts behind his/'er workmanship, but we should not do unnecessarily so. Because, that would stunt the growth of imagination of our writers from becoming genuine tale-tellers of the nation. And our nation would become pregnant with a fabricated mass, a heap of junk- litterateurs, whose work will neither have any merit, afterwards, nor any value of any kind.

Yet, another bug which keeps bugging in the writing system of current aspiring writers today is that the language they employ in their writing is often grammatically contaminated. It's great to write in another language which one has mastered via learning, listening, reading, and writing itself, and yet it's not so easy to master it in a day or two. For every portion one needs to spare a great amount of his/'er time to exercise on every single aspect to excel smoothly. Sometimes, it demands from us rugged labor in order to be the godfather of a single aspect of any subject.

Habits of a good writer and an eloquent speaker which I have conjectured so far; a person has to have an eclectica- a heterogeneous reading taste, with that he\ she has to be a good listener to pioneer dexterously in these artistic forms. One has to have a nerve and a potential to bear with the prognostic advice of anyone, anyhow. A great speaker, it has been assumed, was a profound listener once. Tis thought often reminds me of a piece of advice of Polonius to his son Laertes in William Shakespeare's acclaimed play "Hamlet" before bidding him farewell to France: "Give every man thy ear, but few thy voice. Take every man's censure, but reserve thy judgment". Rather, it is quite easier to enunciate than to put all t'is counselling into practice. But one who does it, rocks it.

Yet, with an advancement of AI tools-ChatGPT, Caktus, AI Art, Chess, Go, and other such tools which rendered writers, scholars, researchers, painters docile, is another gigantic hindrance which needs to be addressed. Because, the generation of art and literature by Artificial Intelligence is in abundance these days. The machine generated output is in absolute vie with humans to surpass them in creativity and make them [us] mere bones and flesh, without a power to reason, a faculty to imagine and a capacity to create. These tools, if guaranteed full space might reduce men into nothingness, would be a major onslaught on human-intelligencia. Every human being sent on t'is planet does have a purpose to live. But that purpose one realises when one uses the faculty, Almighty has endowed us with; the senses, without which we are no different from animals. It is through t'is faculty called senses we become aware of ourselves, we set our goals, and realise our true potential that what are we capable of, and it has been proclaimed that one who has recognized oneself has rightly identified his creator. But, with the advancement of Artificial Intelligence, human imagination starts to shrink greatly. In a race to become savvy, technological-apparatuses have enlarged our miseries, encircled us like a crocodile does its prey in enchant-full tears. By and large, humans became imbecile, both physically and mentally. Here, we aren't ready to accept yet, because, we know if we're to challenge anything, we need to come out from the cocoon of our sloth and infirmity, that doesn't allow us to speak up against t'is turtle which races from times immemorial with steady steps to prevail onto us over and drape us once and for all. Nonetheless, now is the time we should yoke ourselves in togetherness, and fight with t'is beast of hypocrisy and let the natural order of the world prevail against t'is gag-order put by machines to hamper the progress of human-intelligencia.

How Female Sex Hormones 'Rewire' Brain During Pregnancy, Prepare For Motherhood, New Study Reveals

ow female sex hormones 'rewire' the brain during pregnancy and prepare it for motherhood, scientists reveal by study-

The hormones, oestrogen and progesterone, acted on certain specific neurons in the brain region associated with parenting by making them more sensitive and enriching their network, the researchers at the Francis Crick Institute, UK, observed. The hormones are majorly produced in the ovary and responsible for typical female sexual characteristics, including fertility.

In this brain region, called the medial preoptic area (MPOA) and located in the hypothalamus, oestrogen made the neurons or nerve cells more excitable, whereas progesterone enhanced the communication by adding more connections between these neurons, called synapses, the researchers found by analysing brain recordings.

Further, the mice did not display maternal behaviour both during pregnancy and after giving birth, when the researchers prevented the sex hormones from impacting the MPOA neurons by desensitising the neurons.

This led the researchers to conclude that there is a critical period during pregnancy when these hormones take effect. They have published their findings of their study in the journal Science.

These changes in the brain effected by the sex hormones resulted in stronger and more selective responses to pups, the researchers said. They added that while some changes lasted for a month following birth, others seemed permanent, suggesting that pregnancy can lead to long-term rewiring of the female brain.

Previously, it was thought that hormones released at the time of giving birth were most

In this brain region, called the medial preoptic area (MPOA) and located in the hypothalamus, oestrogen made the neurons or nerve cells more excitable, whereas progesterone enhanced the communication by adding more connections between these neurons, called synapses, the researchers found by analysing brain recordings.

author and Group Leader of the State-Dependent Neural Processing Laboratory at the Crick.

'We've demonstrated that there's a window of plasticity in the brain to prepare for future behavioural challenges. These neurons receive a large number of inputs from elsewhere in the brain, so now we're hoping to understand where this new information comes from," said Rachida Ammari, postdoctoral fellow at the Crick, and co-first author.

In humans too, the brain may be rewired similarly during pregnancy, as the same hormonal changes are expected to effect the same brain regions, which could influence parental behaviour along with environmental and social cues, the researchers said.

Indian Banks Pursue Unpaid Loans By Singapore's GVK In UK Court

LONDON: A trial involving six Indian banks pursuing unpaid loans amounting to an estimated USD 2 billion, including interest accrued, from GVK Coal Developers (Singapore) Pte Ltd and associated companies opened in the High Court here on Tuesday.

Judge Dame Clare Moulder presided over the hearing at the Commercial Court division to hear the case brought by Bank of Baroda (acting by its Ras Al Khaimah branch), Bank of India (London branch), Canara Bank (London branch), ICICI Bank Ltd (acting by its Bahrain, Dubai and Off-Shore Banking branches), Indian Overseas Bank (Corporate Branch, India) and Axis Bank Ltd.

The case dates back to 2011 and 2014, when loan facilities were made available to the company, which the banks say are long overdue other than USD 83 million from the proceeds of the sale of a Bengaluru airport and certain amounts not in dispute.

According to court documents, the banks have been pursuing the case at the High Court in London since 2020.

GVK's legal representatives had successfully applied for an adjournment in June last year to prepare Indian law expert reports for the trial.

The case is now slated for a two-week trial starting Tues-



day, even as GVK was only represented by an Indian advocate having reportedly disengaged their UK legal firm in the weeks leading up to the trial.

The banks are represented by international law firm Reed Smith, who have instructed Indian-origin barrister Karishma Vora of 39 Essex Chambers London to argue the matter before the Commercial Court in London.

The other GVK group companies named as defendants in the case include Black Gold Ventures Pte Ltd, Cool Water Ventures Pte Ltd, Harmony Waters Pte Ltd, GVK Natural Resources Pvt Ltd, GVK Power and Infrastructure Ltd, GVK Resources (Singapore) Pte Ltd, GVK Coal Resources (Singapore) Pte Ltd, GVK Coal Infrastructure (Singapore) Pte Ltd and GVK Coal Exploration & Production Pte Ltd mostly Singapore companies with a couple from Telangana.

The banks are seeking repayment of the two loans borrowed in 2011 and 2014, with England as the jurisdiction applying in the case.

The GVK Group has been approached for a comment.

IMF Raises India's GDP Growth Forecast Marginally To 6.3% For FY24

NEW DELHI: International Monetary Fund (IMF) on Tuesday raised India's GDP projection marginally by 0.2 per cent to 6.3 per cent even as it slashed the global growth forecast to 3 per cent.

IMF in July had estimated India's GDP forecast at 6.1 per cent for 2023-24. However, this is lower than the RBI's latest estimate of 6.5 per cent for the current financial year.

However, India's growth is projected to be higher than China's, the second-largest economy in the world.

IMF's World Economic Outlook' revised China's growth forecast downward by 0.2 percentage points for 2023 and by 0.3 percentage points for 2024 to 5 per cent and 4.2 per cent, respectively.

With the property market crisis in that country, lower investment is the main contributor to the revision, it said.

"Growth in India is projected to remain strong, at 6.3 per cent in both 2023 and 2024, with an upward revision of 0.2 percentage point for 2023, reflecting strongerthan-expected consumption during April-June," the 'World Economic Outlook' said.

Monetary policy projections are consistent with achieving the Reserve Bank of India's inflation target over the medium term, it noted.

The government has mandated the RBI to keep CPI



inflation at 4 per cent with a margin of 2 per cent on either side

Observing that the food security concerns prompted recent export restrictions in the world's largest rice exporter India, it said, risks to prices are tilted to the upside, stemming mostly from the ramifications of the end of the Black Sea Grain Initiative and

uncertain effects of El Nino, possibly exacerbated by the proliferation of food export restrictions.

On the oil import, it said about 35 to 40 per cent of India's crude oil imports came from Russia during April-June 2023, a stark rise from less than 5 per cent before the war in Ukraine.

"While India's oil exports (mostly petroleum products) are small relative to its oil imports (mostly crude oil), India increased its oil exports to the European Union substantially," it said.

Last week, the World Bank retained India's growth forecast at 6.3 per cent for the current financial year on the back of robust service activities despite global headwinds.

In India, which accounts for the bulk of the South Asia region, growth is expected to remain robust at 6.3 per cent in 2023-24, India Development Update of the World Bank said.

The World Bank had projected 6.3 per cent GDP growth in its April report as well. India recorded 7.2 per cent growth in 2022-23.

Last month, Asian Development Bank (ADB) marginally lowered India's growth forecast to 6.3 per cent for the current financial year.

The Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) in its latest report upped the GDP growth projection for India to 6.3 per cent from the previous estimate of 6 per cent.

India's Unemployment Rate At 6-Year Low Of 3.2% During Jul 2022-Jun 2023: Govt Data

NEW DELHI: India's unemployment rate for persons aged 15 years and above was recorded at a six-year low of 3.2 per cent during July 2022-June 2023, as per the Periodic Labour Force Survey Annual Report 2022-2023 released by the National Sample Survey Office.

Joblessness or unemployment rate is defined as the percentage of unemployed persons in the labour force.

Considering the importance of the availability of labour force data at more frequent time intervals, the NSSO launched the Periodic Labour Force Survey (PLFS) in April 2017

The reference period here is from July 2022 to June 2023. The Unemployment Rate (UR) in usual status for persons of age 15 years and above at the all-India level came down to 3.2 per cent in 2022-23 from 4.1 per cent in 2021-22.

The UR was 4.2 per cent in 2020-21, 4.8 per cent in 2019-20, 5.8 per cent in 2018-19 and

6 per cent in 2017-18, showed the PLFS data released on Monday.

The usual status means that the employment (status of a person) is determined based on the reference period of 365 days preceding the date of the survey.

The statement on the data said that 2022-23 refers to the period of July 2022 to June 2023 and likewise for 2021-22, 2020-21, 2019-20, 2018-19 and 2017-18.

"In rural areas, UR decreased from 5.3 per cent in 2017-18 to 2.4 per cent in 2022-23 while for urban areas it decreased from 7.7 per cent to 5.4 per cent. The UR for male in India decreased from 6.1 per cent in 2017-18 to 3.3 per cent in 2022-23 and corresponding decrease in UR for females was from 5.6 per cent to 2.9 per cent," it stated.

The survey also showed that the Labour Force Participation Rate (LFPR) in usual status for persons of age 15 years and above increased to 57.9 per cent from 49.8 per cent in

Jammu Central Cooperative Bank's Bad Loan Falls To Rs 72 Crore In 2023

JAMMU: Jammu Central Cooperative Bank (JCCB) turned profitable after a gap of three decades, registering a profit of Rs 0.28 crore in the financial year 2022-23, and reduced its bad loan to Rs 72 crore in 2023 from Rs 110 crore in 2021.

"The bank's net profit has also shown upward trends as it was making a loss of Rs 12.40 crore till March 2021. However, at the end of financial year 2022-23, the bank registered a profit of Rs 0.28 crore after a gap of three decades," Reetu Sharma, a senior official of JCCB, said.

She said that in the last two years, the investment figures have also increased from Rs 856.20 crore in March 2021 to Rs 1,015.61 crore in September 2023.

According to officials, the

recovery of Non-Performing Assets (NPAs) has been exceptional, which helped in reducing the bad loans from Rs 110 crore (37 per cent of total advances) in March 2021 to Rs 81.00 crore (29 per cent) in March 2023 and to Rs 72.00 crore in September 2023.

The bank has recovered Rs 3 crore from primary agriculture societies with the help of cooperative department officials under the guidance of commissioner, they said.

The management said that there is a plan to revamp the financial health of all the district central cooperative banks

of the Union Territory.
Officials also informed that the Jammu and Kashmir government released Rs 366.00 crore in 2022 as part of the recapitalization package, which had been pending since 2014.

IMF Outlook Worsens For A 'Limping' World Economy. Mideast War Poses New Uncertainty

BANGKOK: The world economy has lost momentum from the impact of higher interest rates, the invasion of Ukraine and widening geopolitical rifts, and it now faces new uncertainty from the war between Israel and Hamas militants, International Monetary Fund warned Tuesday.

The IMF said it expects global economic growth to slow to 2.9 per cent in 2024 from an expected 3 per cent this year. The forecast for next year is down a notch from the 3per cent it predicted back in July.

The deceleration comes at a

The deceleration comes at a time when the world has yet to fully mend from a devastating but short-lived COVID-19 recession in 2020 and now could see fallout from the Middle East conflict particularly to oil prices.

A series of previous shocks, including the pandemic and Russia's war in Ukraine, has slashed worldwide economic output by about USD 3.7 trillion over the past three years compared with pre-COVID trends.

"The global economy is limping along, not sprinting," IMF chief economist Pierre-Olivier Gourinchas said at a news conference during the organisation's annual meeting in Marrakech, Morocco.

The IMF expectation of 3 per cent growth this year is down from 3.5 per cent in 2022 but unchanged from its July projections.

It's "too early" to assess the

impact on global economic growth from the days-old war between Israel and the militant Palestinian group Hamas in Gaza, Gourinchas said. He said the IMF was "monitoring the situation closely"

and noted that oil prices have risen by about 4per cent in the past several days. "We've seen that in previous crises and previous conflicts. And of course, this re-

ous crises and previous conflicts. And of course, this reflects the potential risk that there could be disruption either in production or transport of oil in the region," he said.

If sustained, a 10 per cent increase in oil prices would reduce global economic growth by 0.15 per cent and

increase global inflation by 0.4 per cent, Gourinchas said.
"But again, I emphasise that it's really too early to jump to any conclusion here," he added.

So far, the increase in oil prices has been "fairly muted," said Commerzbank commodities analyst Carsten Fritsch.

He noted the absence of declarations of support for Hamas from key oil producers Saudi Arabia, the United Arab Emirates, Kuwait and Iraq, which would make it unlikely that they would restrict supply in response to the war.

So far, the world economy has displayed "remarkable resiliency," Gourinchas said, at a time when the US Federal Reserve and other central banks worldwide have aggressively raised interest rates to combat a resurgence in inflation.

The hikes have helped ease price pressures without putting many people out of work. That combination, he said, is "increasingly consistent" with a so-called soft landing the idea that inflation can be contained without causing a recession.

35L Refund Cases 'Held Up' For Various Reasons; I-T Dept Call Centre Working To Resolve: CBDT Chairperson

NEW DELHI: Around 35 lakh cases for issuance of refunds are currently "held up" with the Income-Tax Department owing to mismatch and validation of the taxpayers' bank accounts and the taxman is reaching out such assessees via

a special call centre, CBDT Chairperson Nitin Gupta said on Tuesday.

The direct taxes body chief said the department was "in correspondence" with such taxpayers and it is their aim to expeditiously resolve these issues.

"We want to credit the refunds to the correct bank accounts of the taxpayers quickly," he said.

Asked during an interaction about instances where refunds are stuck as taxpayers were getting old demands pertaining to years around 2010-11, Gupta said the department had undergone a technology shift around 2011 -- from paperbased registers to computers -- and hence some of those old

demands were showing up in the accounts of the assessees.

"We have started a unique demand management facilitation system about a year back for all such cases where refunds are held up due to a variety of reasons. An email is triggered to the taxpayer saying they will get a call three days from the

dispatch of the email from a particular number and following this conversation, the issues are being resolved," he told reporters here.

"We have resolved 1.4 lakh such entries over the last year fol-

lowing this Mysuru-based call centre interaction and the taxpayer can either accept the demand or contest it," the Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT) head said.

Initially, this call centre was working for four of our ranges of Karnataka and Goa, Mumbai, Delhi and the north-west region but we plan to expand it further to other regions and cities, he said.

The CBDT is the administrative body for the I-T Department.

Sensex, Nifty Rebound Up To 1 Pc On Gains In Financial, Auto Shares

MUMBAI: Benchmark indices Sensex and Nifty rallied nearly 1 per cent on Tuesday following gains in financials, auto and IT shares after recent sharp losses and positive global trends.

The 30-share Sensex spurted by 566.97 points or 0.87 per cent to close at 66,079.36 as 26 of its constituents ended in the green and four declined. The index opened sharply higher by 400 points and surged further to touch the day's high of 66,180.17.

The broader Nifty of the National Stock Exchange jumped 177.50 points or 0.91 per cent to settle at 19,689.85, driven by gains in Coal India, Adani Ports and Bharti Airtel.

According to analysts, moderation in US bond yields on expectations that interest rates are likely to remain stable in the short term revived demand for rate-sensitive shares even as the Israel-Hamas conflict escalated.

Stock markets had dropped sharply on Monday with benchmark indices tanking up to 1 per cent as the attack by Hamas on Israel raised fears of a broader conflict.

"The Indian market completely recovered yesterday's losses, which were mainly due to the Hamas-Israel conflict. Moderation in crude prices and positive global cues on account of dov-



ish remarks from Fed officials, which restrained US bond yields, aided the rebound," Vinod Nair, Head of Research at Geojit Financial Services said.

The domestic market's primary focus is currently on the approaching result season, with optimistic expectations on earnings, Nair added.

Among Sensex gainers, Bharti Airtel rose the most by 2.9 per cent. Kotak Bank jumped 2.15 per cent, Tata Motors by 2.14 per cent and JSW Steel by 2.09 per cent.

ICICI Bank, Axis Bank, Infosys, M&M, Tech Mahindra, Tata Steel, SBI and Maruti were also among the gainers. On the other hand, IndusInd Bank,

Following the attacks Palestinian fighters on Saturday morning in the southern areas of the Jewish state, backed by a barrage of rockets that hit even the central parts of the country, Israeli warplanes have pounded downtown Gaza City, home to Hamas' centres of government.

"The sounds of bombardment are too scary and the whole house shakes. It is a very, very scary situation," Shaboo said

Shaboo, who is living with her husband, Nedal Toman, and youngest daughter, Karima, in Gaza, said the "water supply was officially cut off" in addition to electricity. Her two elder children live and study in Cairo, Egypt.

Internet connection in Gaza is also poor and only those with their limited net packs are able to establish contact with people outside. Israel's defence minister Yoav Gallant on Monday ordered a "complete siege" of the Hamas-ruled Gaza Strip. "I have given an order - Gaza will be under complete siege. There will be no electricity, food or fuel [delivered to Gaza]. We are fighting barbaric [terrorists] and will respond accordingly," Gallant said.

The Kashmiri woman said that she hadn't seen anything like this before and has currently two families living with them who had to run away after bombardment in the bordering areas

"We are not able to go anywhere because there is no safe place for us anywhere and the Gaza Strip is too small and it is closed from every side. There are no exit points over here," Lubna said.

"I have already asked for help from the Representative office of India in Ramallah to help me get to a safer place along with my husband and my daughter," she said in a video message sent to PTI. The only exit route from Gaza, the Rafah crossing with Egypt, was shut down on Monday practically closing all possibilities of escape for Gaza residents.

The Representative Office of India in Ramallah said they "are in touch and are trying to help all Indians but the situation on the ground constrains our options.'

In addition, the Indian embassy in Tel Aviv is also actively looking for ways to assist all the Indians in the affected areas.

Earlier, Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said in a nationally televised address: "We have only started striking Hamas. What we will do to our enemies in the coming days will reverberate with them for generations."

NEW DELHI: Recovering from a bout of dengue fever, Shubman Gill has been discharged from a hospital in Chennai but the India opener will most likely miss the marquee World Cup clash against Pakistan on Saturday in Ahmedabad.

Gill had to be admitted to a hospital on Sunday night after his platelet count dropped below one lakh. It has been learnt that Gill was admitted to well-known multi-care speciality hospital 'Kauvery' and the Indian team's doctor Rizwan moni-

tored his progress. He had tested positive for the vial infection upon his arrival in Chennai last week and ended up missing Indian team's World Cup opener

against Australia on October 8. Gill is also set to miss Wednesday's game against Afghanistan in Delhi. He is required to rest for at least one more week and that effectively rules him out of match against Pakistan. He might miss the match against Bangladesh in Pune on October 19.

"Shubman Gill was on drip at the Chennai team hotel for the last couple of days. His platelet count dropped to 70,000 and he was admitted to a medical facility as a precautionary measure. He was admitted for all mandatory tests on Sunday night when India played Austra-lia but by Monday evening he was discharged," a BCCI source told PTI on conditions

of anonymity. A bout of dengue weakens the body considerably and even elite athletes take time to recover completely.

"But after 2014 Indian athletes are getting the best training, facilities and competitions abroad," said Modi.

The Asian Games haul, he added, was a good marker for the future of sport in the country.

Eden Hazard Retires From Football

BRUSSELS: Eden Hazard is putting an end to a 16-year injury-hit career marked by great success at club level and unfulfilled promise with the Belgium national team's

"Golden Generation." 32-year-old Hazard announced his retirement from all soccer on Tuesday after more than matches and two Premier League titles during his time with Chelsea. Before injuries slowed him

down, Hazard was often unstoppable on the field with his quick pace, creativity and super dribbling skills.

The widely admired player had already retired from international soccer after his country's aging generation of players was elimi-nated from the World Cup in the

group stage last year. 'You must listen to yourself and say stop at the right time," said Hazard, who had been without a club since his contract with Real Madrid expired in June. "I was able to realize my dream. I have played and had fun on many pitches around the world.' Hazard won eight trophies with

Madrid, including the Champions League and two Spanish League titles, but his time in Spain was marred by injuries — including a fracture in his right foot during his first season — and coincided with his

decline. After starting his professional career with French club Lille, where he won the league and cup double, Hazard moved to Stamford Bridge in 2012. He spent seven seasons with Chelsea, becoming

Palestine Football Team Withdraws From Malaysia Tournament

The Palestine soccer team has withdrawn from a tournament in Malaysia after a fresh crisis broke out between Israel and the Palestinian Islamist group Hamas over the weekend, disrupting the team's travel arrangements, the Football Association of Malaysia (FAM) said

The Palestine national football team had been scheduled to compete in the Merdeka Cup - an international friendly tournament in Malaysia - from Oct. 13-17 along with India, Tajikistan and host country, Malaysia.

Hilal said the players' plans had been disrupted by the repeated closure of a crossing connecting Jordan to the Palestinian territories, through which they



"The withdrawal came due to players being unable to travel because of the events and circumstances that the Palestinian territories are going through," Firas Abu Hilal, secretary-general of the Palestinian Football Association, told Reuters.

would have travelled to Malaysia. The Palestine team are due to play 2026 World Cup qualifying matches against Lebanon and Australia in November. They have also qualified for next year's edition of the Asian Cup in Qatar, which will run from Jan. 12 to Feb. 10.

UEFA Names Euro 2028 & 2032 Hosts

The United Kingdom and Ireland will host the 2028 Championship, European while Italy and Turkey will stage the 2032 edition of the tournament, UEFA announced on Tuesday.

By accepting a joint Italy-Turkey bid for Euro 2032 last week, and with Turkey withdrawing from the race for Euro 2028, the hosts for both tournaments were already all but assured. Turkey's withdrawal from the 2028 race left England, Northern Ireland, Ireland, Scotland and Wales as the sole joint bidders for that tournament.

Both sets of bids, however, still needed final approval from UEFA's executive committee that convened on Tuesday. "Nothing is ever a formality even right until the last minute," said Debbie Hewitt, chair of the English Football Association (FA). "We took nothing for granted."

Hewitt said efforts to organise the tournament had united the five soccer associations. "There's so many things that you might think might divide, but actually it has really unified," she said. "I think that will be something that we all feel very proud of.'
