# **Border Flares Up In Jammu**

BSF Man, Civilian Injured In Pak Shelling

New Delhi: The BSF on Friday said the unprovoked firing by Pakistan Rangers along the International Border in Jammu targeting Indian posts and civilian areas continued for close to seven hours.

In an official statement, the Border Security Force (BSF) said the Pakistan Rangers fired mortars and used heavy machine guns, leading to two non-fatal casualties.

BSF Constable Basva Raj suffered minor splinter injuries in both hands due to shelling. A local, Rajni Devi of Arnia, suffered minor injuries, it said.

The force said the Pakistani firing continued for close to seven hours, starting around 8 pm on Thursday and extending up to 2:45 am on Friday.

"BSF continues to monitor the developments closely while assessing the situation and remains alert to respond as necessary to ensure the safety and security of the border and its residents," the force said.

It said following the start of unprovoked firing, BSF troops retaliated and subsequently Pak Rangers extended their firing to target its border posts adjacent to Arnia prompting retaliation from its forward defence posts in these areas.

At approximately 9:15 pm on Thursday, Pakistan Rangers started mortar firing targeting border outposts and civilian areas, the BSF said, adding some of the shells landed in Arnia town, resulting in minor injuries to a civilian. "Around 10:40 pm on

# MoU Contained Some Deficiencies

RINAGAR: In a candid admission, the chief minister, Dr Fa¬rooq Abdullah, today said the Centre had taken him for a ride when the former union energy Minister P K Kumaramanglam, obtained his signatures on the memorandum of understanding (MoU) whose contents later turned out to be detrimental to the state's interests

According to a CNS report Dr Abdullah told the state assem¬bly during an obituary reference to the late Kumaramanglam that a MoU had been signed between him and union minister. However, when the documents were prepared the union energy minister allegedly with malafide intentions, obtained his signa¬tures on such papers which, on closer scrutiny later revealed that these were against the interests of the state.

However an official handout issued today said the chief min¬ister had said "the MoU signed by him with the then union en¬ergy minister had been signed in good faith to benefit the State." However the handout said "Later on the state officials pointed out some deficiencies." He said he immediately up the matter with Kumaramanglam who "readily agreed". But before correc-tion could be effected, the union Minister passed away. "These clauses have to be modified to protest the interests of the State''' Dr. Abdullah added.

When contacted the principal secretary power development department Ajit Kumar told Observer News Service, the 'defi-ciencies pertained to the state's claim for reimbursement of the expenditure it had already incurred on the power projects. The MoU did not mention this. However, Kumar said the Centre had agreed to reimburse the expenditure and necessary modifica-tions would be incorporated in the MoU shortly.

# **Indian Troops Need To** Leave Maldives, Says **Incoming President**

Maldives intends to be "ful-ly independent" and will ask Indian troops stationed in the island nation to leave, says President-elect Mohamed Muizzu, as New Delhi and Beijing both vie for influence in the region



In a heated election campaign, Muizzu had accused incumbent Ibrahim Solih of allowing India unchecked sway over the island nation's affairs and of surrendering the country's sovereignty by allowing Indian troops to be stationed there.

"It happens to be Indian foreign military presence here," Muizzu, the newly elected head of the Indian Ocean archipelago, said in a wide-ranging interview to Bloomberg TV. He added that his reaction would be the same if the troops were of any other country.

Around 70 Indian military personnel maintain New Delhisponsored radar stations and surveillance aircrafts. Indian warships help patrol Maldives' exclusive economic zone.

Muizzu said he has already begun negotiations with the Indian government on removing its military presence, calling those talks "very successful already."

"We want a bilateral rela-tionship that's mutually beneficial," Muizzu said, adding that Indian soldiers won't be replaced by troops from other countries. Asking India to re-move military personnel no way indicates "that I'm going to allow China or any other country to bring their military

troops here," he said. Muizzu's win extends the tug-of-war between China and India for influence over the strategically located Indian Ocean. Successive governments have tilted either toward India or China. Both Asian powerhouses have invested heavily in upgrading Maldives infrastructure and extended loans, as they compete with each other.

The US and its allies such as Japan and Australia are looking to isolate an increasingly assertive and assured Beijing and have invested heavily in propping-up New Delhi as a regional counterweight and key partner in Asia. That seemed to pay off as Muizzu's predecessor, Solih steered the country closer to India.

## **SEEKING COOPERATION**

Muizzu now promises to change tack by removing India troops and addressing the adverse trade balance with the South Asian neighbor.

"We want assistance, cooperation with all the countries," Muizzu said, dismissing the notion that the elections were a referendum on closer ties with either China or India.

# **Odisha: 14-Year-Old-Girl Pedals Trolley 35 Km To Carry Injured Father To Hospital**

BHADRAK: A 14-year-old girl pedalled a trolley rickshaw 35 km to take her injured father to the district headquarters hospital (DHH) in Odisha's Bhadrak.

The incident happened on October 23 but came to light on Thursday when some local people and journalists spotted the girl near Mohatab Chhak in Bhadrak town while she was taking her father back home on the trolley.

The girl Sujata Sethi (14) of Nadigan village took her injured father to Dhamnagar hospital, about 14 km away from her village, pedalling her father's trolley.

However, doctors asked her to shift her father to Bhadrak DHH. She pedalled the trolley 35 km to bring her father to the district hospital on October 23. Her father Sambhunath was injured in a group clash on October 22, sources said.

According to Sujata, doctors at Bhadrak DHH advised her to go back and come after a week for an operation. "I neither have money to hire a

private vehicle nor a mobile phone



to call the ambulance. So, I used my father's trolley to bring him (Sambhunath) to the hospital," she said.

After getting information about the incident, Bhadrak MLA Sanjib Mallick and former Dhamnagar MLA Rajendra Das reached the girl and extended necessary help. Bhadrak Chief District Medical Of-

ficer (CDMO) Santanu Patra said the patient was admitted on October 23 for treatment. He was advised for an operation after a week.

'We have no provision for ambulance service to return the patients to home ... He will remain in the hospital till the end of the treatment," Patra said.

# **Centre Lacks Courage To** Hold Polls In J&K: Omar

**JAMMU:** The BJP government at the Centre lacks the courage to hold polls in Jammu and Kashmir and even the parliamentary elections would not be held here had it not been a

matter of compulsion, National Conference leader Omar Abdullah has claimed.

"In the Supreme Court, they (BJP-led Central government) said that elections to urban local bodies and panchayats will be held.

But there is no notification. The challenges encountered in Kargil (LAHDC-Kargil) polls would extend across Jammu and Kashmir," he said.

"The last Assembly elections were held in 2014. We have been under the governor's rule for five years. There have been claims of significant improvements post-2019. If so, why the delay in elections?" Abdullah posed.

The NC leader claimed that the reluctance to hold elections stems from the BJP's apprehension about facing the electorate. The BJP exudes confidence in the public but a palpable fear lies within their ranks, he asserted.

"They are well aware of the public's sentiment. Conducting parliamentary elections is their compulsion. If they weren't com-

pelled, they wouldn't even hold a parliamentary election," Abdul-lah told reporters in Poonch district on Thursday evening.

"They shy away from facing the people. There will be no Panchayat, BDC, DDC, urban local body or assembly elections before the parliamen-

tary polls," he said. "LAHDC-Kargil poll results proved their apprehensions. The NC-Congress alliance

secured 22 out of 26 seats. Even the two Independent candidates who won in the polls extended their support for us,"

the NC leader said. Abdullah assured daily wagers in Jammu and Kashmir that elections were inevitable and they would be regularised

once the NC came to power. "Rest assured, elections will be held sooner or later. Once the NC government assumes power, we will move towards regularizing the status of daily wagers," he affirmed.

Abdullah alleged that the MP from Jammu never prioritised the welfare of the people.

"It is now our duty to carefully select the NC candidate. I will engage with every segment across the 16 to 17 assembly segments in this parliamentary seat, ensuring everyone's voice is heard.

**SRINAGAR:** There is a constant endeavour from across the Line of Control (LoC) to disturb peace and vitiate the security environment in Jammu and Kashmir as normalcy has not gone down well with the inimical elements, a senior army officer said on Friday.

Addressing a press conference on Operation Shikanja launched along the LoC in Machil sector in north Kashmir's Kupwara, where five mili-

tants were killed while trying to infiltrate, General Officer Commanding (Vajr Division) Major General Girish Kalia said the security forces are committed to defeat any attempt of the enemy to disrupt the security situation in the Union territory.

"Normalcy and prosperity in Kashmir have not gone down well with the inimical elements. That is why there is a constant endeavour from across the LoC to disturb peace and vitiate the security envi-ronment in J-K," Maj Gen Kalia

told reporters at Kupwara. "In the last eight months, we have had 10 such attempts in our divisional area of responsibility, which have resulted in the elimination of 27 terrorists, and recovery of a large quantity of war-like



stores," he said.

The GoC said the security forces have also recovered a huge quantity of narcotics which establishes a deep nexus between defence establishments in Pakistan and terrorist groups.

They are all determined to create disturbance in the valley and impact the future generations in Jammu and Kashmir, he added.

Maj Gen Kalia said the security forces are working in complete synergy and are committed to defeat any attempt of the enemy to disrupt the security situation in the Kashmir valley with firm resoluteness and steadfast commitment.

# Wullar Lake Phase-II **Rs. 59.59 Cr Allocated For Conservation, Tourism promotion**

SRINAGAR: An allocation of Rs. 59.59 crore for Phase-II has been approved by the Wullar Conservation and Management Authority (WUCMA) to support the Integrated Management plan for Conservation of Wullar Lake, with the goal of attracting tourists, enhancing the lake's beauty, and restoring its former grandeur

Deputy Commissioner Bandipora, Dr Owais Ahmad said that comprehensive efforts have been taken to safeguard and protect Wullar Lake, with the government having sanctioned a work program with a budget of Rs. 59.59 crore for the fiscal year 2023-24.

"Key initiatives within this program included water management, the completion of Wullar Walkway Phase-II, the implementation of various eco-development projects, the creation of a cycling track around the lake, the introduction of water sports, and the inclusion of Shikara boats," he added.

He stated that a holistic ecotourism plan for Wullar Lake is in progress, reflecting the government's commitment to position the lake as a prominent tourist destination, and officials are dedicated to executing the conservation work plan with a focus on benefiting local communities.

Regarding the selection of locations for lake beautification, the DC said that the picturesque Zurimanz village, often referred to as "Bangladesh," has been chosen as an idyllic destination for both domestic and foreign tourists. This choice includes plans for introducing water sports activities and

various other initiatives. "An enchanting pedestrian pathway is currently under development around the lake, poised to captivate an increasing number of

#### tourists. Further enhancements are planned for this phase," he added.

Over the past 30 years, Wular Lake has faced a decline in its carrying capacity due to deforestation and encroachment, leading to water quality deterioration caused by the disposal of untreated sewage and solid waste, alongside issues like blocked inlet and outlet channels and forest degradation in the catchment areas.

Although the Wullar Conservation and Management Authority (WUCMA) was established for lake conservation in September 2012, substantial progress began only in May of the previous year. The project's first phase, focused on ecotourism development, involves an expenditure of ₹200 crore from the Union Territory's fund, with a total estimated project cost of ₹1,600 crore.

In addition to land and water resource management, WUCMA focused on preserving biodiversity, promoting ecotourism, creating a lake shoreline, establishing recreational parks, bird-watching spots, and constructing the Wular Boulevard.

Recently, the second meeting of the WUCMA was chaired by Principal Secretary for Forest, Ecology, and Environment, Dheeraj Gupta. The meeting included a review of progress on various wetland conservation projects, notably the Integrated Management Plan for Conservation of Wular Lake.

Principal Secretary Gupta instructed WUCMA officers to implement all necessary measures for the preservation and conservation of Wular Lake while emphasizing the significance of wetlands in maintaining ecological balance, playing roles in water purification, flood control, biodiversity habitat, and contributing to J&K's economy as popular tourist destinations.

Words fail to express our shock and horror with regard to the on-going war in our land. Sadly, the actions and double standards of some Christian leaders have gravely hurt their Christian witness and have severely distorted their moral judgment with regards to the situation in our land.

We come alongside fellow Christians in condemning all attacks on civilians, especially

defenseless families and children. Yet, we are disturbed by the silence of many church leaders and theologians when it is Palestinian civilians who are killed. We are also horrified by the refusal of some western Christians to condemn the ongoing Israeli occupation of Palestine, and, in some instances, their justification of and support for the occupation. Further, we are appalled by how some Christians have legitimized Israel's ongoing indiscriminate attacks on Gaza, which have, so far, claimed the lives of more than 3,700 Palestinians, the majority of whom are women and children. # ISRAEL-HAMAS Conflict At Time Of New Geopolitical Divisions Could Worsen Economic Outlook

G lobal geopolitical tensions often play a pivotal role in shaping people's perceptions of economic growth. Research shows concern about such issues can cause people and businesses to become more cautious about spending and investing, which can ultimately lead to economic recession.

The recent escalation of the Israel-Palestine conflict is no different. Investors around the world are worried about the repercussions of this war – particularly in light of an already bleak picture for global economic growth. Hamas's October 7 attack on southern

Hamas's October 7 attack on southern Israel is the latest chapter of a cycle of violence that has been going on in this region for decades and, sadly, seems to have no end in sight. While the reasons behind these events are complex, the conflict's potential immediate and long-term economic ramifications are easier to grasp.

After all, if the Russia-Ukraine war has taught us one thing, it's that we should be mindful of the intricate interdependencies that shape the global economic and geopolitical landscape.

#### How conflicts can affect the economy

Internal and inter-state conflicts often have a significant effect on stock market indices, exchange rates, and commodity prices – sometimes even sending prices higher in the lead-up to hostilities. The longer-term economic impact is typically more complicated to assess, however. The lasting effects of even seemingly dramatic events on investor behaviour can be hard to predict. Conflicts in the Middle East tend to lead

Conflicts in the Middle East tend to lead to spikes in oil prices – think of the OPEC oil embargo of 1973-1974, the Iranian revolution of 1978-1979, the Iran-Iraq War initiated in 1980, and the first Persian Gulf War in 1990-91. Since the region accounts for nearly a third of global oil supply, any instability can create market uncertainty based on concerns about interruptions to global oil supply.



This uncertainty is reflected in the risk premium in oil markets. This is the price paid for oil traded ahead of time in the futures markets versus the real-time price of oil. It reflects the profits that speculators expect to receive from buying and selling oil during a time of conflict, as well as the hedging needs of businesses that produce and consume oil and their concerns about supply and demand.

and their concerns about supply and demand. And so, the effect of the latest Israel-Hamas conflict on global financial markets will depend on the involvement of other major regional powers. If the conflict remains between Israel and Hamas, the effect will probably be limited and arguably exclusive to countries with direct trade exposure to Israel or Palestine.

But if the conflict spreads to major oilproducing nations in the region such as Iran, the global economy could face severe repercussions as energy costs for businesses and households could spike if supply is interrupted.

Higher energy prices would hamper central banks' efforts to tame inflation pressures in most advanced and emerging economies. If this leads to a "higher for longer" monetary policy that keeps interest rates elevated, it would push up the cost of borrowing and refinancing by governments, companies and people.

History can offer some insights into how the impact on the global economy could unfold under these different scenarios. For instance, the 50-day war between Israel and Hamas in 2014, which killed 2,200 people, mostly civilians, had no significant effect on the global economy or financial markets. Yet, when Israel and Hezbollah clashed in Lebanon in 2006, oil prices surged globally due to fears of a broader conflict in the Middle East.

#### What to expect this time

Unfortunately, there is another factor to consider at the moment. The escalation of the Israel-Palestine conflict has happened alongside the realignment of various global alliances. This slow creep of "deglobalisation" can be seen in a shift in trade policies in recent years.

Countries such as the US and UK are relocating economic activity including sourcing or manufacturing products from different countries out of concern about relying on suppliers in potentially hostile regions, as well as the impact of imports from low-wage countries on struggling local labour markets

At the moment, these shifts can also be seen in the reactions to the Hamas attack on Israel. A two-state solution) to the Israel/ Palestine conflict was initially laid out by the United Nations in 1947 and reaffirmed in 1974, with almost unanimous support around the world.

But there has been some nuance in the international reactions to the attack. With most western countries quickly voicing support for Israel's right to defend itself, while countries like China and Russia called for a ceasefire without taking a stance on Hamas.

This suggests that the issue of Israel-Palestine could tie in with the broader trend towards the new geopolitical divisions that were already starting to emerge before Hamas's attack.

A prolonged conflict between Israel and Palestine, especially with the involvement of major regional powers, could further accelerate this global realignment and have detrimental consequences for global economic growth.

Under these circumstances, investors are already bracing for increased financial volatility across the board – from stocks and government bonds to commodity markets. So-called safe-haven assets like gold are typically used as protection against overwhelming economic uncertainty. The price of gold has shot up following the latest escalation in the Israel-Palestine conflict.

Financial markets will continue to monitor the conflict between Israel and Hamas for signs of escalation. Anything that pushes oil prices up further will reignite fears of higher inflation.

Unfortunately, this is happening just as many countries were starting to see inflation slow again after two years of persistently high consumer prices.

# What is the Hunza diet? Is it realistic? Why is the Western world so obsessed with it?

n a lecture delivered to the University of Pittsburgh in 1921, a colonial medical researcher in British India named Dr Robert McCarrison first made reference to a "Himalayan" people he had encountered. According to him, this group of people had exceptional physiques and low susceptibility to illness, leading them to live for an unusually long time. Later that year, McCarrison published Studies in Deficiency Disease. In the book, he confirmed that the Himalayan people he was discussing were the Hunzakuts (henceforth "Hunzas", but these days referred to as the Burusho people) who lived in Gilgit, northwest India (now Pakistan).

McCarrison attributed their longevity to the region's traditional diet, which he claimed was made up of "grains, vegetables, and fruits, with a certain amount of milk and butter, and goat's meat only on feast days". Crucially, the Hunzas consumed simple foodstuffs, unlike the processed and mass-produced food which McCarrison asserted to be commonly eaten in Britain at the time. By McCarrison's reckoning, this diet prevented the "tribe" from suffering the kinds of ailment to which supposedly "civilised" peoples were prone.

Dr Guy Wrench, a British doctor and advocate of preventative medicine, was inspired by McCarrison's work to pen The Wheel of Health (1938). Never having visited Hunza himself, he relied upon Mc-Carrison's claims to espouse the supposed health benefits of organic vegetables and to warn against industrialised food production. He also drew on selected European travel accounts and second-hand anecdotal evidence to make complementary claims regarding the Hunzas' physical strength, endurance and intelligence. Like McCarrison, he claimed that these traits stemmed from their dietary choices and agricultural practices. Wrench averred that the Hunzas were predominantly



lactovegetarians who consumed large quantities of fruit, wheat chapatis, pulses, vegetables, dried apricots, milk and milkbased products. Moreover, they either ate vegetables raw or ensured that they did not overboil them, gaining the maximum minerals and vitamins from the plants. Hunzas, according to Wrench, did not

consume foodstuffs and beverages like tea and sugar which were popular in Britain. A common thread running through Wrench's account is that the Hunzas did not consume foods that had been imported from elsewhere or had undergone any mechanised process or chemical adulteration. Such processing, he believed, would have diminished the food's nutritional properties.

Wrench deployed the Hunzas strategically to argue that Britain and other Western industrialised nations should return to the unprocessed and unrefined diets of yesteryear, in order to obtain a higher standard of health for their populations. The Hunzas, in Wrench's account, were traditional agricultural practitioners. They collected their own faeces and manure from their cattle, and returned them to the soil to ensure its fertility. In this respect, The Wheel of Health resonated with the embryonic organic movement that was developing in Britain at this time. Leading figures from this movement, such as the writer and politician Gerard Wallop and the aristocrat Lord Northbourne, as well as the agricultural scientists Albert Howard and Eve Balfour, subsequently hailed the Hunzas as a people who testified to the benefits of holistic farming practices and organic diets.

The idea was also picked up by Jerome Rodale in the United States of America, who repeated many of the same claims in his The Healthy Hunzas (1948). Rodale's narrative, however, was further influenced by James Hilton's novel Lost Horizon (1933), which depicted a fictional mountainside location in Tibet where people lived on average for several hundred years in a state of contentment, peace and perfect health. Rodale constructed Hunza as a veritable Shangri-La where its people experienced similarly high standards of physical health.

In addition, Hunzas were said to suffer from none of the social or psychological problems that prevailed in the USA, such as crime, divorce, juvenile delinquency and anxiety. Rodale attributed this, once again, to the Hunzas' dietary habits and farming practices. In the 1960s came a series of travel accounts by North American authors. These writers were inspired to visit Hunza and spill much ink about this Shangri-La. Book-length examples include Hunza Land (1960), Hunza Health Secrets for Long Life and Happiness (1964), Hunza: 15 Secrets of the World's Healthiest and Oldest Living People (1968), and Yoga: The Art of Living: Hunza Way to Health (1969). All these narratives confirmed the notion that Hunza was a paradise on earth, and progressively more exaggerated claims were made during this period. Indeed, the books claimed some of

these Hunzas as the oldest inhabitants of the planet. Renee Taylor in Hunza Health Secrets for Long Life and Happiness even stated that she encountered a 145-yearold man energetically playing volleyball. She also asserted that the Hunzas were consummate meditators, expert breathers and yoga practitioners.

It is important to remember that these travellers all came under the sway of the Mir of Hunza Jamal Khan, who ruled Hunza as a semi-autonomous kingdom between 1945 and 1974. Jamal Khan hosted them and supplied them with information during their stays in Hunza. They were always chaperoned during their tours by a member of the Mir's family or his entourage. Since they could not understand the native language Burushaski, they were dependent upon their accompanying translators when seeking to obtain information. The Mir was keen for his own reasons to keep an eye on foreign visitors. Although the North American authors presented The Hunza Diet and the Mir as firmly in control of Hunza, his situation was actually more precarious in postcolonial Pakistan.

In 1947, when India was partitioned, Mir Jamal Khan opted to join the State of Pakistan as a semi-autonomous kingdom. However, he was also conscious after Pakistan's Independence that the Pakistani central government would seek to exert greater control over Hunza and take away more of his powers. Yet Jamal Khan was keen to maintain control and autonomy in the wake of external pressures. Consequently, he was invested in catering to the orientalist preconceptions of these North American authors that Hunza was an idyllic region uncontaminated by the deleterious effects of modernisation. Indeed, he sought to promote the notion that any interference from outside could threaten this supposed Shangri-La.

# How Eggs Of Dengue-Carrying Mosquito Survive Found

ggs of the mosquito that carries the viruses responsible for dengue and Chikungunya can survive extreme dehydration by altering their metabolism, according to a study that offers potential new ways to control the spread of the diseases.

Researchers at the Institute for Stem Cell Science and Regenerative Medicine in Bengaluru and the Indian Institute of Technology, Mandi noted that cells are made mostly of water, and desiccation is a potentially fatal event for any organism, since the structures of many proteins and other cellular molecules are dependent on adequate hydration.

While many types of microbes have evolved mechanisms to survive drying out, only a few animals have. Among them is the mosquito Aedes aegypti, the carrier of a variety of viral diseases, including, Zika, dengue, yellow fever, and Chikungunya.

Originally found in North Africa, Aedes aegypti has expanded globally, and is now a threat in warm, moist regions



throughout the world.

Aedes eggs require from 48 to 72 hours to hatch into larvae, and the researchers found that they must be at least 15 hours old to survive desiccation. Eggs that were dried out before this stage failed to hatch when rehydrated.

"Given the importance of Aedes aegypti as a primary vector for numerous viral dis-

eases that affect nearly half the world's population, as well as the rapid geographical expansion of this mosquito vector, these results provide a foundation for reducing Aedes egg survival and global spread," said Sunil Laxman from the Institute for Stem Cell Science and Regenerative Medicine.

"Additionally, some of the

specific inhibitors described here that reduce desiccation resistance in Aedes aegypti eggs, as well as new ones affecting other steps in the egg desiccation tolerance pathway, may prove useful as vector-control agents," Laxman said.

The team compared the proteomes of viable eggs that had and had not been desiccated, and

found multiple major changes in metabolic pathways within the desiccated eggs.

These included increases in the levels of those enzymes that promote fat metabolism, and a decrease in those which together shunted cellular metabolism towards the production and use of fatty acids.

Overall, the level of metabolism was reduced, while the levels of the amino acids arginine and glutamine were increased. In addition, enzymes that reduce the damaging effects of oxidative stress, a known consequence of dehydration, were also increased.

When linked together, arginine molecules form polyamines, which are known to help protect nucleic acids, proteins, and membranes from damage.

The researchers showed that the eggs accumulate polyamines, suggesting that they may be a key aspect of desiccation tolerance.

To test this, they fed egg-laying female mosquitoes an inhibitor of polyamine synthesis. The eggs that they laid were significantly less able to survive desiccation than eggs from untreated females.

A second inhibitor, this one of fatty acid metabolism, also reduced egg viability after desiccation.

Finally, the researchers showed that this fatty acid inhibitor reduced polyamine synthesis, indicating that one role of the increase in fatty acid breakdown is to supply the energy needed for production of protective polyamines.

"Aedes mosquito eggs can indefinitely survive after drying up completely, and hatch into viable larvae. The embryos rewire their metabolism upon drying, to protect themselves through desiccation, and revive after water becomes available again," Laxman added.

# Concerning Level Of Lead, Cadmium In Chocolate, Finds Study

Reports said on Consumer Wednesday it had found "concerning" levels of lead and cadmium in a third of various chocolate products it tested recently, and called on Hershey to reduce the amounts of heavy metals in its chocolate.

The non-profit consumer group said 16 of the 48 products from various makers that its scientists tested contained potentially harmful levels of lead, cadmium or both.

Consumer Reports tested prodts in seven categories: dark

The US Food and Drug Administration told the nonprofit that experts consider chocolate a

The Goods and Services Tax (GST) council, comprising central and state finance ministers, had earlier this month clarified on the taxability of corporate guarantee, saying it would be subject to 18 per cent GST.

# **Govt Extends Deadline For Halal Certification Body Accreditation And Export Unit Registration Press Trust Of India**

NEW DELHI: The government on Friday extended the time period for accreditation of halal certification bodies and registration of export units by six months till April 5, 2024.

On April 6 this year, the Di-rectorate General of Foreign Trade (DGFT) notified policy conditions for halal certification process for meat and meat products while directing the existing bodies to seek accreditation from National Accreditation Board for Certification Bodies (NABCB) for i-CAS (Indian Conformity Assessment Scheme) Halal in six months. "Time period for accredita-

tion of halal certification bodies and registration of export units have been extended by a period of six months i.e., up to April 5, 2024," the DGFT said in a notification.

DGFT is an arm of the ministry which deals with exports and import-related issues.

As per the guidelines, meat and its products are allowed to be exported as 'halal certified' only if they are produced, pro-cessed and packaged in a facility having a valid certificate issued by a body accredited by a board of the Quality Council of India.

They have to seek accreditation from NABCB.

Products covered under the notification include meat of bovine animals, fish and chilled meat of sheep and goats; and sausages and similar meat

products.

To streamline the certification of meat and meat products as halal from the country, a scheme titled 'India Conformity Assessment Scheme (i-CAS)' has been developed.

Earlier, there was no mandatory halal certification system in India regulated by the government as the country does not have a national regulation for the certification.

The global halal food market reached a value of USD 1978 billion in 2021. Looking ahead, the market is projected to reach USD 3,907.7 billion by 2027.

In India, the country's halal industry is still in its infancy. There are no specific labelling requirements for halal food products imported to India.

Halal certification is given by many private companies in the country, marking the food or products as permissible.

The major halal-certifying organisations in the country include Halal India Pvt Ltd and Jamiat Ulama-i-Hind Halal Trust. The International Halal Accreditation Forum (IHAF) is an international network of accreditation bodies mandated to enforce halal standards in their

**MUMBAI:** Equity benchmark indices Sensex and Nifty on Friday reversed their six-session losing streak and rebounded more than 1 per cent on valuebuying in auto, IT, financial and energy stocks.

Better-than-expected quarterly financial results of corporates also boosted investor sentiments even as uncertainties persisted over the escalating tensions in the Middle East, according to analysts.

In a largely range-bound trade, the 30-share BSE Sensex rose 634.65 points or 1.01 per cent to settle at 63,782.80 points. During the session, it swung between a high of 63,913.13 points and a low of 63,393.37 points.

Likewise, the wider gauge Nifty surged 202.45 points or 1.07 per cent to 19,059.70 points.

"Domestic equities ended higher following positive global cues. The US Q3 GDP data came in at a two-year high of 4.9 per cent, which was better than the expectation of 4.2 per cent and shows strong US economy resilience.

"Even on the domestic front,

heavyweights like Maruti, Cipla and Dr Reddy came out with robust results during the session, which boosted investor sentiments," Siddhartha Khemka, Head - Retail Research, Motilal Oswal Financial Services Ltd, said.

Axis Bank was the biggest gainer in the Sensex pack, rising 3.07 per cent, followed by HCL Tech. SBI, NTPC, Tata Motors, Nestle India, and Infosys.

Shares of index heavyweight Reliance Industries witnessed heavy buying as it surged 1.75 per cent to close at Rs 2,265.25 apiece. The company will announce its quarterly financial

numbers after market hours. Maruti Suzuki India on Friday reported a whopping 80.3 per cent increase in net profit at Rs 3,716.5 crore in the July-September quarter driven by better sales, softening commodity prices, cost reduction efforts and higher non-operating in-

"The domestic market recovered well compared to yesterday's sharp corrections, due to

restrained FII selling, along with moderation in currency and global bond yield volatility.

"To date, the Q2 results outcome is decent, which is in line with the buoyant estimate. Yet, the market is not enthusiastic as we are at the cusp of earnings downgrade in anticipation of a further slowdown in the world economy due to elevated interest rates and geopolitical risk," Vinod Nair, Head of Research at Geojit Financial Services, said. In the broader market, the

BSE midcap gauge gained 1.70 per cent, and the smallcap index rose 1.89 per cent. All the sectoral indices ended

in the green, utility gained 2.22 per cent, power jumped 2.04 per cent, services (1.79 per cent), industrial (1.63 per cent), realty (1.63 per cent) and IT (1.36 per cent).

JAMMU: Income Tax Department and the office of the Deputy Commissioner on Friday organised an outreach and sensitisation program to promote awareness and understanding of taxation and financial matters.

During the program, Deputy Commissioner Income Tax Jammu, Dr. Mohnish Digra, along with Income Tax Officer Jammu, Rajneesh Gupta, led an interactive session with the Drawing and Disbursing Officers and Assistant Accounts Officers representing different departments.

Dr. Mohnish Digra, emphasised the importance of financial literacy and underscored India's aspiration to become a developed nation by 2047. He highlighted the consistent increase in net Direct Tax collections and the number of income tax return filed over the years.

Furthermore, Dr. Mohnish Digra, addressed the audience regarding a concerning trend of claiming wrongful deductions to secure fraudulent refunds, leading to losses for the government. DDOs were sensitised about their role in verifying the legitimacy of such deductions by employees, with a reminder that the Income Tax Department closely

Rajneesh Gupta, stressed the serious consequences of claiming fraudulent refunds, including scrutiny of cases, tax recovery and the imposition of penalties under section 270A, amounting to 200% of the evaded tax. He noted that such actions can lead to prosecution under section 276C of the Income Tax Act, potentially resulting in rigorous imprisonment of up to seven years.

Gupta also informed the audience about the available remedies for rectifying errors, such as filing updated returns under section 139(8A) of the IT Act for Assessment Years 2021-22 and 2022-23, with the payment of 50% and 25% penalties, respectively, in addition to the tax. Revision of ITR for Assessment Year 2023-24 can be done without any penalty.

Throughout the program, interactions took place, addressing various issues related to the accurate filing of ITRs, the utilisation of the Income Tax chatbot, different deductions available under the Income Tax Act of 1961 and the benefits of tax calculation under both the old and new tax regimes.

the power scenario is adding to the losses every day," he said.

Meanwhile, Principal Secretary Power Development Department (PDD), H Rajesh Prasad said that the electricity to the consumers is being supplied as per the power demand in both the divisions of Jammu & Kashmir.

The Principal Secretary said that the power demand at present in Kashmir is 1200 MWs while in Jammu it is 1100 MWs, which fluctuates, but the supply is being ensured as per the demand.

Compared to last year, adequate electricity being supplied to the people at this time

"We had forgotten about the cross-border shelling... now we are in panic as the underground bunkers are not in proper condition," he said.

Vijay Kumar, a soldier who had come to his village on leave said, "We had to leave our village as we cannot take shelter in underground bunkers which have not been used for a long time. How long will we tolerate shelling from Pakistan?'

He said since this is the season of weddings, people initially took the sound of firing as the bursting of firecrackers but as the intensity grew, they fled for safety.

Highlighting the need for upkeep of the underground bunkers, Vijay Kumar said these have turned into dens of snakes and poisonous insects.

These shelters must be cleaned immediately and must have an electricity supply, he said.

Rupali Devi, who along with her husband also left their village, said all the people residing in the border areas do not have access to underground bunkers.

"We have not thought of a situation where we have to leave our homes again. While I am outside the village, many of my family members are there. Thankfully they are safe," another local Sohan said.

#### **Students Take**

Pakistan last night.

"The school falls within the range of Pakistani shelling and most of the 50-odd students did not turn up in view of the tense situation. However, those who did were accommodated inside the underground bunker within the school premises," Anju Seth, a teacher from the school, said. In all, 15 students took classes in the bunker.

She said the school got numerous phone calls from panic-stricken parents since morning. "We told them that it was their call whether they wanted to send their wards to the school, and that the management had decided to hold the classes in the bunker for the safety of the students for the time being."

Sethi said the government has built underground bunkers for the border residents for a purpose and "we are using the facility for the benefit of the children."

Himankshi Devi, a class 8 student, said her family decided to move to a safer place after the heavy shelling by Pakistan.

"We were frightened by the shelling but I motivated them to stay back. I want to attend my school otherwise my studies will get impacted," she said, adding, "my fear was gone when I reached the school and our classes

"Everyone knows what happened during the 2G (telecom spectrum allocation during the UPA government). During our government, 4G was expanded but there was no stain on us," he said. "I am confident that India will lead the world in 6G technology."

"This generally happens when drug users exchange needles or other related equipment while injecting drugs, and when their judgment is clouded by drugs and they engage in unprotected intercourse with an infected partner," he said.

"His brain and behavior are severely affected by drug addiction to the point that a drug addict loses self-control. Drug abuse can accelerate the spread of HIV and aggravate its symptoms, particularly in the brain. A drug addict is sexually more active than an average person and being high on drugs they don't even bother to use protection while having an intercourse, he added.

Expressing serious concern over the rising drug menace among youngsters in the Valley, renowned virologist and president Doctors Association of Kashmir (DAK), Dr Nisar-ul-Hassan said the drug abusers are more vulnerable to viral infections, including HIV and hepatitis B and C.

'Needles and syringes are potential sources of Hepatitis C for a drug addict. The Hepatitis C virus is more likely to spread when needles and syringes are shared or reused because they can hold more blood after use than syringes with fixed needles," Dr Nisar told Kashmir Observer. Hepatitis B virus (HBV), he said, uses both

direct and indirect processes to help in the development of hepatocellular carcinoma (HCC).

"Living with a chronic infection of either the hepatitis B or hepatitis C virus raises chances of developing liver cancer. Hepatitis B infectionrelated inflammation can result in cirrhosis, or significant liver scarring, which can compromise the liver's capacity to function," the DAK president added.

He said that SMHS hospital receives an increased number of Hepatitis B and C patients on a daily basis who use drugs, and that any laxity on the patient's side vis-à-vis treatment might result in his premature and unexpected death

"A drug user is more susceptible to HIV-AIDS in addition to hepatitis C and B because they inject drugs more often using contaminated syringes. Hepatitis C and B are on the rise in the Kashmir Valley, with worrisome rates," he said. **ECI Orders**

**BARCELONA:** Jude Bellingham has blossomed into a clinical scorer since joining Real Madrid. Now his team hopes Bellingham will be fully fit when he faces his first "clasico" match at Barcelona on Saturday.

The England midfielder is on scoring streak with 11 goals in 12 matches so far this campaign, compared to 14 goals in all of last season for German side Borussia Dortmund.

Bellingham appeared to be bothered by a leg problem when he was substituted after scoring his latest goal in a 2-1 win at Braga in the Champions League on Tuesday. Coach Carlo Ancelotti, however, said immediately after the victory that

it was nothing serious. "He's all right," Ancelotti said. "He was feeling it a little bit in his abductors because it was a soft pitch. He's a little tired but that's to be expected." Madrid tops the Spanish league level on points with Girona, with Barcelona one point

behind in third place going into

the game between the fierce rivals. Atletico Madrid is also fourth at three points back. If he is in top form, Belling-

ham should once again be the focus of an attack that has been prolific despite losing Karim Benzema this summer.

Barcelona also has several injury doubts. Top scorer Robert Lewandowski, who has six goals overall, has missed the last three games with an ankle injury, while midfielders Pedri Rodríguez and Frenkie de Jong, winger Raphinha and Jule Koundé have also been sidelined.

Coach Xavi Hernández would not say if he expects to have these players back on Saturday.

"We won't force anyone (to come back too soon). They have to be 100 percent ready,' Xavi said after Barcelona beat Shakhtar Donetsk 2-1 in the Champions League on Wednesday.

The absences of those regular starters has had an upside: it has allowed Barcelona to give opportunities to the latest



young talents to emerge from its La Masia youth academy. Midfielder Fermín López,

20, was the team's best player against Shakhtar, scoring a goal and hitting the woodwork twice. That came four days after 17-year-old Marc Guiu became the second-youngest player this century to score on his league debut when he netted in a 1-0 win over Athletic Bilbao.

Locking all the doors, they sat down in front of a screen in a darkened upstairs bedroom with their two dogs and dozing kids, ages 10 and 12, following the shooting deaths of at least 18 people at a bowling alley and bar-restaurant.

With the suspect still on the run, Green, a 40-year-old software engineer who spoke to AFP in front of his house, said he and his partner "took turns" sleeping, in order to keep watch until the morning. "Where is he now? Is he here?

That's a terrible feeling," Green said, clearing his throat to hide emotion. Like many of his neighbors on

his quiet, tree-lined street, he is struggling to process what happened. On Thursday, Lewiston was

practically a ghost town, with residents ordered to stay indoors and schools closed following the Wednesday evening shooting rampage.

A high school parking lot was



taken over by police officers in fatigues, armed to the teeth. Streets near the targeted establishments were cordoned off with crime scene tape.

Pharmacies, restaurants and the overwhelming majority of businesses were closed. A few cars passed by from time to time, but the trash has not been collected and no children play outside on slides and swings.

A sign in the city center flashes the message: "Shelter in place."

Debra Wright was just sitting down to eat Wednesday evening when she heard police and ambulance sirens wailing. Schemengees, the bar restaurant targeted by the shooter, is just a three-minute drive from her home. "When we found out I was ter-

rified," the 71-year-old told AFP from behind the wheel of her car.

'You know, Maine isn't usually like this. I've lived here all my life, she said, adding "I will never feel safe like I have.

Since she will probably spend the night alone at home, Wright said she couldn't help but be worried but was reassured by the thought that she had deadbolts installed on her doors.

Plus, "I have my dogs in my house," she said.

In this normally quiet city, the shootings came as a shock.

"It's different when this type of tragedy happens in your hometown," Anthony Nadeau, a 45-year-old state employee who had just finished smoking a cigarette on his porch, told AFP.

He is friends with the owners of the bowling alley, Just-in-Time, and has spent many an evening at Schemengees.

He added that "Maine and a lot of states... could do a little bit more considering the history of gun violence in the United States."

Green, who staged the movie night with his family, is not optimistic.

"I'd love to tell you that maybe this is the one that spurs some sort of action," he said, but then added: "It won't be."

"It will be treated like every other mass casualty event."

# Thousands Of Wild Horses To Be Shot In Australia, Here's Why

Sydney, Australia: Australia approved on Friday the aerial shooting of wild horses in one of the country's largest national parks, resuming a contentious practice that authorities described as "essential" to protect native wildlife. An estimated 19,000 wild horses -- known locally as "brumbies" -live in Kosciuszko National Park, a number that has increased by a third in the last two years.

New South Wales state authorities want to cut the population to 3,000 by mid-2027.

The national park already traps, re-homes and shoots horses from the ground, but the state's environment minister Penny Sharpe said this was not enough.

"Threatened native species are in danger of extinction and the entire ecosystem is under threat," she said. "We must take action.

"This was not an easy decision -- no one wants to have to kill wild horses," she added.

Aerial shooting from helicopters was used for a brief period in 2000, when more than 600 wild horses were shot over three days. But a fierce public backlash

resulted in the method being banned. Those against culling say the

horses are part of Australia's



stockmen and women worked in the country's rugged Snowy Mountains. Brumbies are thought to have descended from horses that escaped or were abandoned around the early 1800s.

A storied rugby team in the country's capital Canberra is named after the animal.

They were celebrated by the Australian "bush poet" Banjo Paterson, who waxed lyrical about a "wild, unhandled" creature who roamed the mountains "neath moon and star

as pests that ruined fences and competed with livestock for feed. It is a view echoed by conservationists, who say the horses de-

stroy native plants through grazing and trampling, increase soil erosion, foul waterholes, and cause the collapse of wildlife burrows. "The unique and complex ecosystems of the Australian Alps

have been trampled for too long," said Jacqui Mumford, head of the Nature Conservation Council, an environmental group. She said brumbie

fauna species, including the iconic corroboree frog, the broad-toothed rat and rare alpine orchids".

Australia has up to 400,000 feral horses, according to the Invasive Species Council, a conservation group that has welcomed the decision to resume aerial shooting.

The group's advocacy manager, Jack Gough, said the brumby population in New South Wales was growing at a rate of between 15 and 18 percent a year.

# Secret Underground City Beneath Gaza, With Bunkers, Storage, Booby Traps

Jerusalem/London: What lies in wait for Israeli ground troops in Gaza, security sources say, is a Hamas tunnel network hundreds of kilometres long and up to 80 metres deep, described by one freed hostage as "a spider's web" and by one expert as the "Viet Cong times 10".

The Palestinian Islamist group has different kinds of tunnels running beneath the sandy 360-sqkm coastal strip and its borders - including attack, smuggling, storage and operational burrows, Western and Middle East sources familiar with the matter said.

The United States believes Israel's special forces will face an unprecedented challenge having to battle Hamas militants while try-

ing to avoid killing hostages held below ground, a U.S. official said. U.S. Defense Secretary Lloyd Austin noted that Iraq's ninemonth-long battle to retake the city of Mosul from Islamic State might prove to have been easier than what awaits the Israelis - likely to be "a lot of IEDs (improvised explosive devices), a lot grinding activity".
