Citing the example of doors and windows in homes in Srinagar and other parts of Kashmir, Mir told Kashmir Observer: "Forget about

architectural nitty-gritties like insulated walls or glazed windows which are ideal for a cold climatic zone such as Kashmir, doors and windows have wide crevices that are responsible for a lot of heat loss.'

According to him, the SMC has been trying hard to convince people to make good use of natural resources like solar energy and design their homes properly. For example, he said, the installation of solar lights is a precondition for handing out building permits. But, independent More on P6

Mercury Hovers Near Freezing Point In Kashmir

Srinagar: Minimum temperatures in most places of the Kashmir Valley dropped close to the freezing point or below it on Monday days after the region witnessed snowfall and rain.

While the minimum temperature in Srinagar City and Kokernag town in south Kashmir stayed margin-ally above the freezing point, Pahalgam and Gulmarg continued to reel under sub-zero temperatures, weather department officials said.

Pahalgam in south Kashmir's Anantnag district, which serves as one of the base camps for the Amarnath Yatra, saw the mercury settling at minus 3.4 degrees Celsius, making it the coldest in the Valley on Sunday night.

Gulmarg in Baramulla district recorded a low of minus 3 degrees Celsius, the officials said, adding the minimum temperature in Srinagar was 0.7 degrees Celsius. Qazigund | More on P6

Srinagar: Six Kashmiri labourers were killed and as many sustained injuries when the vehicle they were travelling fell into a gorge near Sunni in Shimla district on Monday morning, police said.

The mishap took place at Kudharghat, about 35 km from Shimla, when the driver of the ill-fated pickup truck lost control of the vehicle, police said.

Of the 12 occupants, nine were from Kulgam district of Jammu and Kashmir, working as labourers in Himachal Pradesh. They were on their way to

treatment at the Indira Gandhi College Medical Hospital (IGMCH), police said.

2 Months On BSNL Landline Service Remains **Suspended At Boulevard**

Services Will Be Soon Restored, Say Officials

Srinagar: Scores of business establishments along iconic Boulevard Road in Srinagar are incurring huge losses due to poor response of Bharat Sanchar Nigam Ltd (BSNL) authorities to their repeated complaints for restoration of fixed landline services and broadband facility for the last over two months.

Subscribers say their BSNL landline service along with Broadband facility was snapped after cables were cut during digging of the road more than two months back.

Kashmir Observer received a number of calls from aggrieved customers who said their repeated complaints have fallen on the deaf ears and wanted the BSNL to restore the service at the earliest.

"Two months have elapsed since the road was dug up and the landline service along with broadband got snapped due to subterranean cables being severed", said Firdous Ali who runs business at Ghat No 6", he said, adding no one takes cognizance of our complaints forcing us to switch over to private services.

When contacted Public Relation Officer (PRO) BSNL, Masood Bala said: "Services will be restored shortly". He also advised the affected subscribers to forward their numbers in order to facilitate an early restoration of services.

"Now that we are aware of the issue, we will look into the issue and make sure landline service is restored as soon as possible," Bala told Kashmir Observer.

Srinagar Records 53 Incidents Of Fire In November

Awareness Campaign Reduces Incidences By 30% In 2023: F&ES Dy Director

rinagar: With the onset of winter season in Kashmir, the fire incidents have witnessed a rise in the summer capital of Jammu & Kashmir-Srinagar, which recorded 53 incidents in the month of November 2023.

Official data prepared by the Fire and Emergency Services (F&ES) department revealed that 53 fire incidents have been reported across Srinagar in the month of November.

However, the officials said the number of incidents compared to the previous years have declined after the concerned department organized the awareness events and programs across the Valley in a bid to sensitize the people about the measures.

Deputy Director F&ES Commandant Srinagar, Aqib Ahmad Mir said the preparations by the department are always equal during summers as well as in winters, but during the winter months, the alertness remains high in wake of the frequent fire incidents. "We keep the men and machinery at the disposal during the winter months," he said

"The number of fire incidents cannot be reduced at the level of Fire and Emergency Services, but at the level of the general public. It has been observed that the use of Bukharis, heaters and other heating gadgets are the primary

sources of fire incidents during winters. Until and unless the people will not use the gadgets judiciously, the situation cannot be tackled; the people must follow dos and don'ts while using such gadgets," he said.

"The general public has an immense role in this regard and taking the safety measures should be their top priority," he added.


Asked about the measures taken by the department to reduce the fire incidents, he said F&ES has organized thousands of awareness events and programs across Jammu and Kashmir so far, which has helped in reducing the number of such incidents.

"If we see the previous figures, the fire incidents have gone up to even 2900 in one year, but this year such incidents have reduced by nearly 20-30 per cent as 1900 cases were reported till October this year," he said.

BJP's Triple Victory

he assembly election results in the Hindi-speaking states of Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, and Rajasthan have left the political landscape in India reeling, challenging the expectations of pundits, analysts, and pollsters alike. Forecasts that confidently predicted Congress victories in Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh, along with a close fight in Rajasthan, were confounded by the stunning surge of the BJP in Madhya Pradesh and unexpected turns in other states.

Surprisingly, the BJP's resounding victory in Madhya Pradesh defied projections, with only a few prescient exit polls foreseeing this outcome. It was widely assumed that the Congress had a stronghold in the state, particularly given the perceived disarray within the BJP and speculation about the future leadership. Yet, Shivraj Singh Chouhan, often discounted, emerged as an important figure behind the BJP's historic win.

This triumph echoes the BJP's earlier success in Gujarat and holds even greater significance considering the absence of a clear excuse for the Congress's loss in Madhya Pradesh. Unlike Gujarat, where the Aam Aadmi Party presence divided votes, Madhya Pradesh's bipolar nature makes the BJP's performance after 18 years in power nothing short of remarkable, prompting a call for deeper examination into the BJP's strategies.

Chhattisgarh, presumed to be a cakewalk for the Congress, turned into the party's biggest shock. The unanimous expectation of a Congress victory was shattered by the election results, casting doubt on the solid foundation of prevailing opinions regarding governance models and political strategies.

In Rajasthan, where Ashok Gehlot led a commendable government, the Congress faced an unexpected defeat despite positive perceptions about his administration. The long-standing rift between Gehlot and Sachin Pilot, unresolved until late in the election cycle, might have contributed to the setback, reflecting the party's inability to address internal conflicts.

Despite these losses in the Hindi-speaking belt, the Congress can find solace in its victory in Telangana, challenging the notion that once lost to a regional party, regaining a state is impossible.

Lessons from these elections are plentiful. The BJP's dominance in North India, bolstered by strong organizational prowess and leadership, is reminiscent of the Congress's past glory during the Nehru-Indira Gandhi era. However, the Congress's struggle to counter the BJP's momentum, especially with the Narendra Modi factor, remains evident.

Moreover, the limited impact of certain Congress schemes in different states highlights the crucial factor of trust in leadership, where Modi continues to enjoy people's confidence. The Congress's attempt to mimic BJP's Hindu-centric projection has minimal resonance, underlining the need for a distinct identity.

For the opposition, especially the INDIA alliance, this election serves as a stark reminder that unity alone won't suffice against the BJP's formidable force led by the PM Modi. Innovative approaches and a coherent alternative vision are imperative for any chance in the upcoming 2024 elections.

Kashmiri Weddings Are Losing Their Soul and Simplicity

planning of marriage celebrations is changing fast. These wedding plans are hugely loaded with fat budgets making it a bigger and an extravagant affair. Today, the concept of destination weddings, sustainable weddings ,themed weddings and luxury weddings have become an integral part of any wedding plan and the demand is ever growing. All this has revolutionised the wedding industry with a never-seen-before inflow of money. This changing dynamics of the wedding industry has hugely impacted the Kashmiri weddings as well.

A glance at the Kashmiri weddings unveils a metamorphosis, making headway into lavish and elaborate affairs that extend over several days. While this trend is not entirely new, as Kashmiri weddings have historically been marked by ecstasy and celebration for generations, the dynamics of the festivities have intensified. Both pre and post preparations leading up to the final day have consistently held significant importance.

Recent Kashmiri weddings, however, have embraced a more extravagant and fanfare-driven approach in comparison to other parts of the country where weddings have become extravagant not merely to showcase opulence but with the genuine intention of enjoying the occasion.

While the contemporary Kashmiri weddings mirror a broader trend of copying celebration styles from various regions be it east, west, north, south ,all amalgamated into one. It is a chaos and confusion of traditions. Unfortunately, in this attempt of adulteration of diverse elements, the unique cultural pride that once defined Kashmiri traditions is slowly breathing its last.

Let's take a trip down memory lanes to the Kashmiri weddings before the millennium where the essence of weddings was pure joy. During this era, Kashmiri weddings had a distinctive charm characterised by jubilation, celebrations, and an embrace of simplicity.

A Rich Past

The focus was on enriching a whole hearted connection between of seemingly superfluous customs families. Though the rituals and ceremonies were few, the pre-wedding preparations traversed years for both the bride and the groom's families. The weddings were notably simple affairs, where the bride and groom were not meant for ostentatious displays. The weddings were more of a private affair than a public spectacle. I recall my grandmother recounting that in the very olden davs, with limited means of transport and luxurious cars missing the mode of transportation was tongas. When the bride was brought from her home to her husband's home, the tonga was covered on all sides to prevent any glimpse of the bride. In roval families, the bride would be conveyed in a Zampaan, resembling a doli, which would land directly in her designated room for rest.

People take out loans that they don't have the ability to repay. So it pushes them further down the class pyramid just to meet the demands of contemporary weddings.

The weddings seem like a manicured series of events that nurtures several sectors like catering, photography, drones ,decoration,mehendi ,choreography ,event managers,DJS,flowers ,designer clothes and jewellery.

Today, one wouldn't even mind being invited at the last minute of the wedding ceremony, and that too through a quick message on phone or through a whatsapp card.

The surprising part? Not a single person will raise an eyebrow. So no objections, no boycott threats either.

The cutting of a cake, a tradition rooted in English and Celtic cultures, has evolved into a mandatory ritual for the bride and groom, observed religiously during various stages of the wedding. The once simple Nikah ceremony has undergone a significant transformation, now adorned with grandiosity. Every moment is rigorously captured, with cameras and lights turning the ceremony into a spectacle. The private ritual of Namaaz and reading the Quran, a deeply personal affair, is now documented extensively, extending to the bride and bridegrooms room, where every detail is videographed during the Nikhah ceremony.

The couple, amidst the ceremony, finds themselves immersed in a constant photo session, with lights and cameras shadowing their every move. There is little respite as the camera person follows them like paparazzi, turning a private event into a mediacovered affair. Unnecessary video interviews, seemingly borrowed from Bollywood, add an element of drama. However, the climax is reached when the wedding videos are made public property i.e uploaded on social media, leaving no detail undisclosed all presented in black and white. In this ongoing drama, the crucial characters, the groom and the bride often fade into the background, losing significance. Amidst the lively band, baja, and baraat, the bride finally arrives at her husband's house. Unfortunately, there is no one at home to welcome the bedecked couple; the relatives, friends, and neighbours have already left after the scrumptious wedding meal and won't be seen again until the next wedding or another celebration hosted by the family. No doubt, contemporary Kashmiri weddings have evolved into a flourishing industry, but when juxtaposed against the backdrop of traditional ceremonies, they often fall short of preserving and enhancing our rich cultural heritage and values. To conclude, it is heartening to see the wedding industry flourishing at the back of luxurious wedding celebrations, adding to the overall growth of the economic wheel. But at the same time, this kind of extreme spendthrift has been draining down the household budgets. In most cases, this modern era wedding planning is pushing them into a debt trap. Since it's all voluntary expenditure and no force is making it mandatory spending, it's only up to us to save ourselves from falling into this kind of debt trap. Only you can save the simplicity of wedding ceremonies.

Decisive wins

rue, the Congress's consolation prize in Telangana is remarkable, beating back a regional party that had sought to become synonymous with the struggle for Statehood. But to regain support in the Hindi-speaking States in time for the Lok Sabha election next year seems an uphill struggle for the party. The overall electoral map now suggests a divergence between the BJP strongholds in the north and the west, and peninsular India where non-BJP parties are in power. But the party's performance in Telangana where it won eight seats compared to just one last time is notable. The setback to the Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) in Telangana is not ordinary anti-incumbency, but a pointed rejection of its dynastic reign devoid of any ideological content. The BJP campaign had pivoted around Prime Minister Narendra Modi, relegating its regional leaders, including sitting Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan of Madhya Pradesh, to the background. This was a highly risky strategy, considering the party's defeat in Karnataka in May after it antagonised regional satraps and caste groups. In the end, the party won 115 out of 199 (one yet to be held) seats in Rajasthan, 164 of 230 in Madhya Pradesh, and 54 of 90 in Chhattisgarh.

These decisive numbers give the BJP central leadership the latitude to have its way in government formation in all three States. The lion's share of the credit for the victories belongs to Mr. Modi, reinforcing his authority ahead of 2024 when he will be seeking a third straight term. Mr. Chouhan chose not to raise his profile in the campaign, allowing the central leadership to take full responsibility in Madhya Pradesh, just as in Rajasthan and Chhattisgarh. Rajasthan Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot fought a spirited battle, and though he lost, prevented a complete washout of the Congress. In Chhattisgarh, the party collapsed in the storm of allegations of corruption and under the weight of botched social engineering that isolated the tribal communities. All three heartland States have exposed many a chink in the Congress armour, particularly its two prongs of social justice and welfare schemes. These are essential but not sufficient tools for victory. Trust in leadership, representation of social groups, astute selection of candidates, effective campaigning, ideological clarity and, above all, organisational cohesion are required, especially to retain power. As for other wedding preparations, the Wazwaan, an indispensable central element, without which a Kashmiri wedding is unimaginable. It used to be a yearlong process for families to

scrupulously decide on the rates and acquire the finest quality of rice, mustard oil, spices, and condiments like shallots(Pran) and garlic required in the preparation of the final feast of the celebration ,the wazwan. The planning involved ascertaining as when to purchase these essentials, followed by storing them and cleaning them a month before the weddings. As the wedding dates approached, women from the neighbourhood, relatives, and friends would gather to participate in the cleaning process, singing songs on the occasion. This ritual, known as "Tamul Zhtaun" (winnowing and handpicking of rice) was a vibrant tradition that

my late father played a pivotal role. He promptly contacted the offended family, explaining that the mistake wasn't made by an educated family member, but rather by a local scribe hired for the task. Apolo-

gies were tendered, and my father personally delivered a corrected card. The new card began with the heading, Dr./Prof. xyz, Head of the Department, Kashmir University,'

accompanied with a sincere apology. This strategic move worked like magic; the boycott was called off, and the family enthusiastically participated in the wedding festivities, leaving no further grudges. Such was the time and its simplicity.

There were few bakery outlets back then, and even if they were, Kashmiri baker "Kandur "held a prominent position for the special events of the families. The provision of kulchas and various breads was not only for the wedding ceremony, but also for the pre and post-wedding events .

As the tradition went, all the guests would stay at the marriage home before and after the wedding, continuing until the wedding celebrations reached their conclusion. It was during these times that the bride would make her final transition to settling with her in-laws. Parallel rituals followed at the bride's home, where guests remained until the bride was fully settled in her new home. These occasions where both near and extended family members came together to provide comfort, dividing the workload and supporting the bride's or groom's parents, known as "gobur" or "kauri maul," through active participation. The foundational elements in these oc-

ble before the much-anticipated wedding day.

Then, there were singing sessions at special occasions during the ceremony, like Wanwun, bacha nagma, and sufi chants. But. let me tell you, Wanwun was like the superstar of the show! It was a big deal, especially when the groom showed up, and this magical tent was where the groom, his squad, and all the friends and family gathered.

And guess what? All of this fun happened right within the four walls of the house or in the neighbour's backyard if the space wasn't big enough for all the guests.

Broadly, wedding ceremonies in that era held a purpose beyond the union of two individuals. They were a sacred bond meant to unite not just two souls but two families. These unions proved a powerful source of togetherness, love and care that would set an example for others to follow.



Loneliness Beyond Friendship

What Brain And Biology Tell Us

umans are a deeply social ani-Hmal. According to Edward O. Wilson, one of the most celebrated evolutionary biologists of modern time, humans can actually be characterized as "eusocial." Eusocial species are "true" social species, or those that are social at their baseline state. Wilson gained fame at first studying ant colonies, and the way that coordinated action of ants allows the colonies to flourish. An ant alone can't accomplish much. In colonies, they have grown to have an estimated 100 trillion individuals. A similar logic might be applied to humans: a single person alone is limited. People working together can flourish in any environment on the earth, and have grown to over 8 billion individuals.

WILSON LAID OUT SEVERAL CRITERIA FOR "TRUE SOCIAL" SPECIES:

- They live in multigenerational communities
- They have a division of labor (different individuals do different work for the community)
- They are ready to sacrifice at least some of their per-sonal interests to those of the group

In this account of human nature, people are successful because they are much more cooperative than other animals. We have evolved to live and work in groups, and these groups can accomplish more through coordination than people can accomplish alone.

I recently published an article on loneliness, and I've ended up having quite a few conversations with people about it. My colleagues and I found that feelings of loneliness are roughly stable-and low-for people who spend anywhere from 25% to 75% of their day alone. It's sort of counter-intuitive to think that someone who spends 75% of their time alone is no more likely to feel lonely than someone who spends 75% of their time around other people. But a larger message that comes from this analysis is that loneliness is really about perceptions. Lonely people want a kind of connection that they aren't getting, not just to be "around people" more.

So what do we really need out of other people? One first thought is close friendship or intimacy. Having people you care about and trust feels good. But rereading a paper by one of my co-authors this weekend, I'd like to suggest that people want more than just a few deep friendships. People also want to be part of a community.

Jim Coan and Dave Sbarra (who worked on the loneliness paper with me) wrote an article outlining neuroscience and physiological evidence in favor of social baseline theory. This theory takes seriously Wilson's claim that we are a "true social" species, and says that humans have evolved to expect to live in community with others. According to social baseline theory, people don't just want the joy that deep friendships can bring. We need people to help us solve problems and meet goals all up and down Maslow's hierarchy (or the

- evolutionary version).
 Being part of a community provides security, as friends and family typically show up to help you if you're in danger-or if you need to recover from injury.
 - Being part of a community provides information, as social networks (in person, not just online!) share information that's important for navigating the wider world.
- Being part of a community provides recognition for ac-



complishments, which often adds feelings of meaning to what you've done.

Being part of a community means you have a group of people who can become your close friends or romantic partners. Dating apps aside (and there are no friendship apps!), it's easiest to start deeper relationships with

people who already know you-or know people you know.

Being part of a community means you have help with child care, if you choose to have children. Raising children would be much more difficult if parents didn't get breathers from family, babysitters, and other parents hosting playdates.

COAN AND SBARRA EMPHASIZE TWO OTHER MECHANISMS: RISK DISTRIBUTION AND LOAD SHARING.

Risk distribution means that, if everyone in the group is on the lookout for threatsand then they communicate about those threats to everyone else in the group-then

it's less likely that a threat will slip by unnoticed. When it comes to vigilance, dozens of heads are better than one. Load sharing means working together towards shared goals. Think of an old fashioned barn raising: everyone in a community coming together to build or rebuild one person's barn. It's much faster for everyone to work together on a barn, and then reciprocate when the next person's turn comes up, than to have everyone try to put up their barns alone.

At the level of neuroscience, Coan and Sbarra review evidence showing that the brain is closer to an "at rest" state when people know others are around and available than when people perceive themselves as cut off from others. For example, the brain has a weaker threat response when the person perceiving the threat (in the brain scanner) is holding someone else's hand.

From this perspective, loneliness isn't just about not having satisfying, deep conversations. It's about not feeling like you have the kinds of social resources our species has evolved to rely on.

Being lonely likely reflects a feeling that the kinds of support and opportunities you want-support managing risks, solving problems together, finding out important information, and opportunities for recognition and forming deeper connections-aren't available. Reducing loneliness, therefore, is likely to mean thinking beyond just making a few friendships deeper and more meaningful. It's also likely to involve becoming more closely connected to a community of people who have vour back.

Is It Safe? Why Housing

experts said that more than energy conservation the fallacies in housing infrastructure in the valley are more so a concern in terms of peoples' vulnerability to disasters such as earthquakes and floods.

Experts said that despite availability of some policy guidelines about the housing infrastructure, Kashmir's picturesque landscape conceals "a troubling reality" because of lack of infrastructural preparedness for mitigation of disasters given that seismic and hydrological hazards continue to threaten this region.

In terms of susceptibility to earthquakes, Kashmir and other Himalayan regions fall under Zone V (as per the seismic zoning map of Bureau of Indian Standards) which is a high-risk earthquake zone. The valley is also prone to floods which are expected to increase in frequency in the Himalayan region including Kashmir as per various climate change projections made by Inter-governmental Panel on Climate Change. The region has witnessed catastrophic earthquakes and floods in the past, underscoring the urgent need for earthquake-resistant and flood-resistant structures. However, experts say, a significant portion of housing stock remains vulnerable to disasters.

Saleem Beg, regional head of Indian National Trust for Art and Cultural Heritage (INTACH) in Jammu and Kashmir, said that the infrastructure that has come up in the past threefour decades across Kashmir is neither in tandem with the safety nor services requirements. Sooner or later, Beg said, there has to be a building audit to fix these problems.

"The instructions should flow from the government -- both for fixing the existing problems and ideal planning for the new constructions. For example, the concept of hollow bricks was introduced here, but it was never taken forward at policy level. There has to be some consistency," Beg said.

"Earlier, we didn't have many safety oncerns as our infrastructure v organically designed. The masons and carpenters had an unstated art to build homes. Such kind of infrastructure-building was abandoned in the 1980s," Beg said. The houses and government buildings in those years, he said, would have adequate exposure to sun, less windows and double-glazed windows. "The architecture would also provide earthquake resistance. The Dajji Dewari system of construction (braced timber frames filled with brickwork) was one such example," he said. "Architecture changes everywhere and we have also witnessed the change here. But, it is high time to revisit that architecture, of course with some modifications," Beg said and added: "It is very important considering the challenges we face." According to Beg, most houses in Kashmir did not have required mix of iron and concrete. "Ideally, we should think of retro-fitting measures for such structures to make them secure. Earthquakes don't kill, the buildings do. Most people died in the 2005 earthquake because they were trapped in the government buildings," he said and added that most of the residential areas were inundated during the 2014 floods and other flooding events in recent years because they were built in flood prone areas without considering flood preparedness while creating infrastructure in those areas. Beg said that it is a well-known fact that Kashmir is prone to floods and a large population of Srinagar city lives in the flood plains. "Such infrastructure is not safe for obvious reasons. Even some government buildings are in flood plains," he said According to Beg and other experts, rapid urbanization and unplanned development exacerbate the vulnerability, with informal settlements mushrooming in hazard-prone areas.

from under a pile of rubble. Men struggled with their bare hands to move a chunk of the concrete that had crushed the child.

Later they chanted "God is greatest" and wept as they marched through the ruins carrying the body in a bundle, and that of another small child body wrapped in a blanket.

"We were asleep and safe, they told us it was a safe area, Rafah and all," said Salah al-Arja, owner of one of the houses destroyed at the site.

"There were children, women and martyrs," he said. "They tell you it is a safe area, but there is no safe area in all of the Gaza Strip, it is all lies and manipulations.

Gaza's health ministry said on Monday that at least 15,899 Palestinians, 70% of them women and children, have now been killed in ferocious Israeli air and artillery bombings on the enclave since Oct. 7. Thousands more are missing and feared buried under rubble.

As many as 80% of Gaza's 2.3 million people have fled their homes in the Israeli bombing campaign that has reduced much of the crowded coastal strip to a desolate wasteland.

According to Sameer Maithel --a mechanical engineer who works on building design, building materials and renewable energy and has worked in Kashmir for several years --use of insulation on walls and roof is crucial for reducing loss of heat during the

This form of energy mally by residents for heating water - must be popularised in Kashmir because of intensive consumption during the winter season, Drabu observed. "We can make good use of it even in winter, though solar energy needs to be augmented with electric power," he said.

Industrial use of electricity is minimal in Kashmir, with electric energy primarily consumed domestically for heating, cooling, cooking, lighting, etc. Heating, as Drabu explained, accounts for a considerable percentage of electricity consumption in the region, known for its long and harsh winters spanning over five months.

Drabu also suggested retro-fitting in institutional buildings like hospitals, which he said can help conserve energy significantly. "I hope steps have been taken in that direction. But, if it is yet to be done, it should be initiated as soon as possible. Huge savings can be achieved in initial capital cost of heating and in running costs. We can recover the costs of retro-fitting in three-four years," he said.

An engineer who has worked in the power development Department for over three decades, but preferred to stay anonymous, said that using energy-saving appliances in homes is another parameter which people in Kashmir need to fulfil in order to make judicious use of energy. He said that the choice of devices can play a big role in saving energy as a lot energy can be saved using energy-friendly devices like water heating by geysers which have a thermostat and 3-staror 5-star-efficient appliances for conservation of energy in the case of refrigerators, air-conditioners, washing machines, etc.

He said that around 50-60 per cent electricity is misused across Kashmir because people don't follow the norms of electricity consumption as most people usually keep their heating devices switched on for hours, even if they needed to use the device to heat water for two hours.

HME Dept Refutes News Reports On AIDS Surge In J&K

JAMMU: Health and Medical Education (H&ME) Department (H&ME), has rebutted the news carried out by some sections of media regarding rising trend in AIDS cases in Jammu and Kashmir due to tourism and influx of migrant labourers.

As per a communication received in this reference, the H&ME department has termed the news as baseless and manipulated. "Prevalence of HIV in Jammu

and Kashmir is lowest in the country with 0.06% as per India HIV Estimates 2021 which is very much below the National prevalence of 0.21% and this has been possible due to the efforts of J&K AIDS Control Society. JKACS provides a comprehensive package of Care, support and treatment to patients", clarifies the department.

The 6305 HIV positive cases mentioned in the news are a total since inception of JKACS (1998). Till date, 1,452 HIV positive patients have died while 3583 patients are alive on Anti-Retroviral Therapy (ART) while 521 patients have left follow up treatment.

No doubt, J&K is a tourist destination which receives huge influx of different categories of people including truck drivers, migrant labourers and high concentration of forces, which may be few of the contributing factors for risk of HIV transmission, but not the only reason,

there are many other reasons for the spread of HIV/AIDS. The increase in number of HIV cases which is being projected by some unverified news items as rising trend is in fact due to the greater coverage, testing, counselling and reduction in the stigma and discrimination due to the dedicated efforts and awareness by J&K AIDS Control Society. These cases are actually the detection

of hidden "At-risk populations"

in different areas of J&K. Due to strenuous efforts towards case detection, the testing capacities in the entire UT of J&K have been increased manifold as a result of which the number of tests conducted among the general population has increased three times between the financial years 2020-21 and 2022-23. During the current financial year, more than seven lakh fifty thousand tests are expected to be conducted for HIV screening against six lakh tests conduct-

ed last year. Similarly, every effort is being made to ensure that expecting mothers undergo the compulsory HIV screening during their ANC (anti-natal checkup) in the first trimester. Furthermore, High Risk Groups (HRGs) like Female Sex Workers (FSWs), Injecting Drug Users (IDUs), Truckers, Migrant Labourers (MLs) are also being screened for HIV through in-creased community outreach.
