

AIIMS In Jammu 'People Won't Need To Seek Treatment Outside'

Jammu: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday inaugurated the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) here, saying the people of Jammu will no longer have to leave for Delhi to avail specialised medical treatment. The hospital, sprawling across 226.84 acres along National Highway 44 in Vijaypur area of Samba district, was established under Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojana (PMSSY) to address regional healthcare imbalances, encourage evidence-based research and elevate medical education standards. Addressing a public rally after

launching and laying foundation stone of projects worth over Rs 32,000 crore, the prime minister said the number of medical colleges in J&K has increased from four to 12 in the last 10 years. Fastest-Growing Black Hole And Brightest Object In Universe Discovered

New Delhi- Astronomers have discovered the fastest-growing black hole ever recorded -- the most luminous known object in the universe that is devouring the equivalent of one Sun every day.

The researchers at The Australian National University (ANU) noted that the black hole with a mass roughly 17 billion times that of the Sun, has set a record that may not ever be beaten.

"The incredible rate of growth also means a huge release of light and heat," said study lead author Christian Wolf, Associate Professor at ANU.

"So, this is also the most luminous known object in the universe. It is 500 trillion times brighter than our sun," Wolf said in a statement.

A black hole is a region of spacetime where gravity is so strong that nothing, including light, can escape it.

Christopher Onken, co-author of the study published in the journal Nature Astronomy, noted that it was a surprise that the blackhole remained undetected until now, given what we know about many other, less impressive ones.

The blackhole was first detected using a 2.3 metre telescope at the ANU Siding Spring Observatory near Coonabarabran in New South Wales (NSW).

The research team then turned to one of the largest telescopes in the world the European Southern Observatory's Very Large Telescope in Chile to confirm the full nature of the black hole and measure its mass.

"The light from this black hole has travelled over 12 billion years to reach us," said Professor Rachel Webster from the University of Melbourne said.

PM's visit

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday emphasized the critical role played by the abrogation of Article 370 in unlocking the true potential of Jammu and Kashmir. Addressing a rally in Jammu during his visit to the union territory, the PM said the revocation of the special constitutional provision marked a watershed moment in its history.

The region, he said, has experienced balanced development across various sectors since its transition to a Union Territory. This move, he asserted, has opened the doors to unprecedented opportunities and has enabled the government to reach the people's doorstep, signaling a new era of governance. The PM assured the people of Jammu and Kashmir of his commitment, stating, "This is Modi's guarantee, and this will continue."

The visit also witnessed the launch and foundation stone laying for several key projects, spanning education, railways, aviation, and road sectors. The projects worth over 32,000 crore for Jammu and Kashmir were inaugurated, among them the first Electric Train and the train service between Sangaldan station and Baramulla station.

The PM's visit came ahead of the parliamentary polls scheduled to be held by May-June. It will thus go a long way in shoring up the BJP's position in the union territory. The party already looks favourite to win the polls in the Jammu region and given its current formidable political standing in the country could be a force to reckon with in the Kashmir Valley. More so, considering the fact that the INDIA Alliance in J&K is finding it increasingly difficult to stick together. Already the National Conference has decided to go solo in the upcoming elections for parliamentary seats in Kashmir Valley. It remains to be seen how the PDP and the Congress would respond to this and whether the three parties would still be able to work out an electoral arrangement that doesn't fragment anti-BJP votes.

It also remains to be seen whether the centre would also hold Assembly polls alongside parliamentary elections. The last Assembly elections date back to 2014, which makes for a prolonged absence of a democratic governance in the UT. J&K has not had an elected government since June 2018 when Governor's rule was imposed after the PDP-led coalition government lost its majority following the withdrawal of support by the BJP. As of now, there is no clarity on this. The PM also stopped short of indicating any possibility of holding Assembly simultaneously with general elections. However, the visit has both its development and political spin-offs and the latter will play out in the weeks and months to come.

Casteist Society, Casteist Comments

DFO Langate has apologised but this disease is prevalent in Kashmiri society

Not only untouchability but differentiating on the basis of caste or profession is a social killer. We might have heard and read about discrimination against Dalits, which is still prevalent in Indian social fabric. We must also be aware of the fact that our own Kashmiri society is also afflicted with this disease.

In many states of the country, especially in rural India, there is a tradition of two tumbler systems in tea shops, denial of temple entry, denial of use of public property, discrimination in schools and other institutions. Infact, the Dalit Panchayat members in many villages are denied access to spaces and are not even allowed to sit on the chair during panchayat meetings. Infact, Dalit grooms aren't even allowed to ride on a horse during their own marriage functions in the village if it is dominated by so-called 'upper caste' people.

Untouchability or casteism has prevailed in Kashmiri society as well in the past for over 50 to 60 years but it was not so severe. Infact, things have changed a lot in Kashmir over the years but discriminating against people on the basis of caste or profession is still widely prevalent.

In our government establishments or private institutions, we find many officers and professionals making casteist remarks against their employees. Even during our social gatherings or family functions, we make utterances which are derogative and casteist in nature. Many times this is unintentional but on many occasions we intentionally use such words to undermine other people or to ridicule them.

DFOs calling his official 'Shepherd' A few days back, I came across an official communication issued by the Divisional Forest Officer (DFO) Langate in Kupwara district wherein he made a casteist remark which was like undermining the other community.

The forest officer had gone for an inspection of a forest check post in Langate area and found a Forest Guard dressed 'improperly'. The official was wearing a Kashmiri Pheran (Long woollen cloak) and DFO reprimanded him and called him a 'Shepherd'.

The grammatically poor official letter making these remarks was deeply casteist. This letter issued by the Divisional Forest Officer Langate on February 17th 2024 reads as: "During my surprise inspection of the forest check post Langate on 17.02.2024 at 12:25 PM one forest official named Bashir Ahmad Dhobi, Forest Guard, was found wearing Pheran and looking like a Shepherd. The territorial forest officials are part of a disciplined force and are always duty bound to wear proper dress code while performing their duties at sensitive postings.

Therefore, pending departmental enquiry Shri Bashir Ahmad Dhobi Forest Guard is hereby placed under suspension attached with Range Office Rafiabad with immediate effect. The Range Officer Mawar will make an internal arrangements in place of suspended official till suitable staff is posted in the said check post."

This author got hold of this official communication and I posted this on social media and sought an apology from the said Divisional Forest Officer (DFO). Several people commented and demanded a written apology and some even demanded the officer's suspension for hurting Shepherd communities like Gujjars, Bakerwals or Chopans of J&K. Infact, many Gujjar, Chopan and tribal activists like Guftar Chowdhary, Ghulam Mohiudin Chopan, Abdul Ahad Chopan, Chowdhary Javaid from Rajouri condemned the DFO Langate for making such derogatory comments on an official document.

By February 20th 2024 afternoon the DFO issued a corrigendum and sought an apology on social media as well. The officer in his fresh official communication said:

"The word Shepherd inadvertently crept is hereby expunged from the records as mentioned in the forest order no: 43 of 2023-24 dated

Kashmiris ridicule our officials for wearing this dress at the workplace.

If the pheran of the forest guard was really shabby and looked awkward, the DFO shouldn't have mentioned the word Pheran in the official letter. He could have said that the official was not in a proper dress. The DFO not only called his official

The officer didn't seek an apology through this corrigendum but recorded his video byte which was carried on social media wherein he sought an apology from people who were hurt and also added that he used the word Shepherd unintentionally.

Let us be proud of our Pheran Centuries of colonial rule taught us to look upon ourselves as an inferior race. In Kashmiri context, we would feel awkward wearing a Pheran in Govt offices or public places or during different social gatherings.

Things changed gradually and now the same pheran is not only worn by many men and women in Kashmir proudly but even the former US Secretary of State wore it in India after she was gifted one by noted Kashmiri handicrafts businessman Manzoor Wangnoo when she visited New Delhi some decades back. The pheran is now worn by many elite women across India as well. Unfortunately, we still have people in our society take this dress as a sign of inferiority or backwardness. We need to get rid of this mindset.

The DFO Langate called his Forest Guard a 'shepherd' because he was wearing a Pheran at his workplace. I won't argue whether Pheran should be allowed in Govt offices or not but the DFO's derogatory comments were unwarranted.

Had this blunder been committed by some non-Kashmiri officer it would have been a huge news but unfortunately our own officers and people are undermining our rich heritage and culture. The imposition of English culture has impacted our mental growth and this continues to be prevalent in our society even now which is a matter of serious concern. US and British citizens feel proud wearing a Kashmiri pheran and we

shepherd but also undermined the Kashmiri dress Pheran as well.

Conclusion

The intention of writing this piece is not to make a personal attack on the Divisional Forest Officer Langate for his derogatory comments against the Shepherd community or Kashmiri Pheran but the idea is to make people aware about our mental slavery which continues to prevail in our society.

We should be proud of our pastoralist community which infact has been a prophetic profession. We should also be proud of our culture, food and dress as well. Never undermine this even if you don't like your own dress or food. There are many people in our society who make casteist comments intentionally but as far as the DFO Langate is concerned I believe his comments were unintentional. Had this been intentional, he wouldn't have mentioned it in an official document.

Let us pledge to respect our working class - the Chopans, Gujjars, Bakerwals, Fishermen, Sweeper community, Carpenters, Blacksmiths etc.

We need to respect our dress and culture as well and come out of this colonial mindset and thinking. We should feel proud of our heritage, our culture, and our forefathers. Red Sea blues

For the second successive month, India's goods exports grew last month, albeit with a mild 3.1% uptick from a 1% rise in December. This marks only the fourth month of growth in outbound shipments in 2023-24, and the overall value of merchandise exports this year is down 4.9% at about \$354 billion. While January's \$36.9 billion exports are above this year's monthly average, they are 4% lower than December's tally. To be clear, such sequential, post-Christmas demand dip is not unusual and all of the decline cannot be ascribed to the elephant haunting global trade corridors - the Houthi rebels' orchestrated disruptions of shipping lines' operations around the Red Sea hitting goods flow to the European and U.S. markets. January's trade numbers, to that extent, suggest that the impact so far is not overtly worrying, although a few key segments seem to be feeling some pain. Engineering goods' exports growth faltered to a little over 4% in January while the labour-intensive gems and jewellery slipped into a mild contraction, dropping 1.3%.

Apart from the lack of a broader discernible impact from the Red Sea shenanigans yet, the sharp decline in the goods trade deficit is notable as it hit a nine-month low of \$17.5 billion - just three months after touching a record high of nearly \$30 billion. The flip side is that the recent import bill compression has been driven by some slack in imports of items such as project goods and electronics which suggest weakening of investment and consumption impulses in the economy. The government has exuded confidence that India will match its record export performance of \$776 billion in 2022-23, this year as well, despite multiple global headwinds. On the goods front, though, attaining last year's \$451 billion tally looks difficult, especially with cooling commodity prices. Exports of services, reckoned to be up 6.3% this year, may still help bring the overall export figure for the year close to \$760-odd billion if they sustain this pace. The outlook for the coming year remains mired in uncertainty and risks. There are weak or mixed signals about demand trends from economies such as the U.S. and Germany, even as the U.K. recorded the sharpest sequential jump in retail sales since July 2020. Interest rate cuts remain elusive for now. Finally, despite the U.S.-led Operation Prosperity Guardian to protect commercial traffic through the Red Sea, shippers have warned that the Houthi factor could compel the use of longer routes for several more months. Longer delivery times apart, the spiked shipping rates and operational costs of exports could force some price hikes and deter already frail demand in some markets and make prospective buyers look for more competitive options for Indian wares.

New Data On Physical Activity As An Antidote To Depression

When you wake up and begin to plan your day, how much do you factor in time for exercise? Perhaps you're saddled with obligations, not only for work, but also for childcare, housekeeping, and/or the many little nuisances that can invade your waking hours. A dedicated time for physical activity seems like a luxury that you might get around to at the end of the day, maybe.

You know that logically you should exercise and that there are myriad benefits to putting your body through various forms of being in motion. You're not happy with yourself for not finding time for it in your schedule, but you feel you have no choice.

As stressed and frantic as you feel at times about your hectic life, has it ever occurred to you that exercise could do more than build your bodily strength and vitality? Could it be worth carving out those chunks of time to get up and move?

PHYSICAL ACTIVITY AND MENTAL HEALTH

According to Central China Normal University's Fei Tian and colleagues (2024), there is reason to believe that physical activity could indeed play an important role in combatting not only the development of chronic health problems but also depression. Prior research supporting this possibility used observational methods to show an overall association

between physical activity and depression but failed to zoom in on the precise nature of this relationship. What was lacking was the demonstration that changes in physical activity could be linked with changes in depressive symptoms. Furthermore, these studies failed to control for initial levels of depressive symptoms in the samples. They also did not sufficiently represent low- and middle-income countries, limiting the generalizability of the findings.

Before turning to the details of the Chinese study, it's a good idea to take a step back and try to understand why exercise could have this beneficial effect. The authors did not specifically address this issue, but there is ample evidence in the research literature to suggest several possible mechanisms. Physiologically, exercise creates its own internal set of mood boosters by activating some "happy" neurotransmitters, which induces a natural high. Psychologically, as you move your body, you also gain a sense of competence and efficacy. Maybe you thought you couldn't do that deadlift with more weight than you used in the past, but, surprisingly enough, you did. Practicing yoga and flexibility exercises can also alleviate joint pain while also helping you establish a connection with your body's inner workings.

Evidence for the effectiveness of exercise as an alternative treatment for depression has accumulated over the past



30 years. However, it has been slow to catch on compared to the focus in the mental health literature on medications and psychotherapy. The Tian et al. study therefore could provide important new data to refocus attention on physical activity's benefits in its own right.

TESTING THE PHYSICAL ACTIVITY-DEPRESSION RELATIONSHIP

Using the Chinese Family Panel Survey (CFPS), the research team had access to longitudinal data from a nationally representative sample of 7,633 adults studied over the years of 2016 to 2020. Through online survey software, the participants reported over the course of three test occasions on their depressive symptoms and two on their engagement in physical activity (frequency

and duration). The tracking over time allowed Tian and colleagues to estimate the effects of changes in activity as they corresponded to changes in depressive symptoms.

The findings supported the study's prediction not only that regular participation in exercise would be related to lower depression scores but also that people who ceased physical activity were more likely to develop depression across the years from 2016 to 2020. Unlike previous researchers, the author team eliminated participants with baseline depressive symptoms, wiping out the possibility of "reverse causation" of depressive symptoms on fluctuations in activity.

Over the course of the study, 20 percent of participants de-

veloped significant depressive symptoms. However, these rates varied by physical activity fluctuations with those who persisted in the same levels of activity over time less likely to develop symptoms (16 percent) compared to those who infrequently exercised (22 percent). These differences were maintained after the researchers controlled for demographic factors as well as health status and lifestyle, but, additionally, with these controls in place, the authors found higher rates of depressive symptoms developing in those who ceased physical activity altogether.

As the authors concluded, "These findings suggested that persistent participation in regular physical activity (PA) may have a protective effect against

the incidence of depressive symptoms." Importantly, the intensity of activity didn't seem to matter as much as did persistence: "adults who engage in even low-intensity regular PA, such as walking or jogging, will have a notable antidepressant effect as long as they persist."

TURNING ON YOUR OWN MOOD BOOSTERS

The moral of the story from this large and well-controlled study is that persistence matters when it comes to boosting your mood through exercise. The authors also supported the position from prior work in the mood-exercise link that by moving your body, you can feel better about yourself, both in terms of your sense of self-esteem and feelings of self-efficacy. Exercise has the additional advantage of bringing you into contact with other people, expanding your social support network as well as just plain socializing. From an overall health perspective, when you exercise, you are healthier, and so are better able to withstand some of the stresses that could come from the development of a chronic disease such as hypertension or reduced mobility.

Alright, you say, "I promise I will start to exercise. Really!" How can you turn this vague assertion into action? Based on the study's findings, your commitment has to begin with an exercise program you can maintain. Gym owners are all too familiar with

the January surge in memberships, which eventually falls off in the ensuing weeks. You need to avoid becoming one of those casualties.

Because exercise can be moderate, as Than et al. showed, making a decision as simple as not taking the elevator when you could take the stairs, not parking as close as you can when you're out shopping, or not taking public transportation to the stop nearest your destination. If your mobility is limited, you can get your exercise minutes in by stretching, working on your balance, or doing chair exercises with weights. The regular physical activity in the Chinese study amounted to 30 minutes a day for at least three days a week. Although more is generally better according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention guidelines, anything is better than zero. Surely you can take a half hour every other day to devote to some form of exercise.

To sum up, it may seem like an impossibility for you to become a regular exerciser, but by making the commitment for this hour and a half a week (and maybe more), you can lessen the time and effort needed to alleviate the stress associated with your day-to-day life. Fulfilling your body's need to move can, in time, fulfill your mind's ability to free itself of those stresses.

"We have seen the days when only disappointing news used to come from J.K. Bomb, guns, kidnapping and separatism had become its misfortune. Today, we are seeing a new J-K with balanced and holistic development," Modi said in his speech which he began in Dogri language.

Despite rain, thousands of locals attended the rally. It was Modi's second visit to the Jammu region after the abrogation of Article 370 in August 2019. Earlier he had addressed a public rally in Samba district in April 2022.

Expressing his vision for a flourishing Jammu and Kashmir, Modi vowed to construct infrastructure to rival international destinations like Switzerland.

"We have pledged a developed J&K and I have full faith that we will make Jammu and Kashmir more developed and fulfill all your dreams within the next few years...We will create such infrastructure in Kashmir that people will forget going to Switzerland," he said.

The prime minister lauded the newfound spirit of the youth in the region, highlighting the transition from desolation to vibrancy in everyday life and also shared his optimism regarding investments from Gulf countries, underscoring the positive reception towards the erstwhile state.

Modi urged the nation to grant his party 370 seats in the upcoming Parliamentary elections, marking the significance of the Article 370 annulment.

Stating that J-K was a victim of "dynastic rule" with those at the helm of affairs only working for their self-interest, the prime minister said he is happy that the UT is getting freed of this.

Kohli shared his story about the manner in which his remote village got connected through piped water under Jal Jeevan Mission to provide water supply to their village.

"We have got water connections for the first time since Independence. We got benefited from the forest rights law after the abrogation of Article 370. We thank you, Sir. I never thought about talking to the PM like this. We are fortunate to talk to you," he said.

2009, the 18-km Banihal-Qazigund section in June 2013 and the 25-km Udhampur-Katra section in July 2014.

Development works are happening simultaneously, unlike in the past when work was done in the rest of India but its benefits were either not available to the people of Jammu and Kashmir or were made available very late, the prime minister said here while addressing a public rally.

"Today new airports are being built across the country. Jammu and Kashmir is also not behind. Today the expansion work of the Jammu airport has started. The dream of connecting Kashmir to Kanyakumari by rail has also moved forward today with the commissioning of the (48.1-km) section between Baramulla and Sangaldan," he said.

Officials said the work on the Katra-Sangaldan section is likely to be completed by May or June.

Prime Minister Modi said that "the day is not far when people will be able to travel across the country by taking a train from Kashmir".

"Today such a big campaign for electrification of the railways is going on in the entire country, and this region has got a big benefit from it," said Modi, who also flagged off the first electric train in Kashmir from Baramulla to Sangaldan.

This is going to help a lot in keeping pollution down, he highlighted.

He said when a modern train service in the form of 'Vande Bharat' was started in the country, one of its initial routes was in Jammu and Kashmir.

"We made it easier to reach the Mata Vaishno Devi shrine (at Katra in Jammu) and I am happy that two Vande Bharat trains are presently running on this route," Modi said.

The prime minister, who also inaugurated many roads and laid the foundation for new ones, said road-connectivity across Jammu and Kashmir, including in villages, cities and national highways, has been given due priority.

"The second phase of the Srinagar Ring Road on completion will make it easier for people to visit the Manasbal Lake and the Kheerbhawani temple, while the completed works on the Srinagar-Baramulla-Uri highway will benefit farmers and the tourism sector," he said.

He said the expansion of the Delhi-Amritsar-Katra Expressway will further improve connectivity and the travel between Jammu and Delhi will become easier.

India's Longest

flagged off two electrified trains simultaneously -- one from Srinagar to Sangaldan in the down direction and the other from Sangaldan to Srinagar in the up direction," a railway official said.

He added that the prime minister also inaugurated the 48.1-km-long

Banihal-Khari-Sumber-Sangaldan section. "This longest tunnel, which is 12.77-km long and known as T-50, falls between the Khari-Sumber section," the official said.

According to the Northern Railway (NR), trains can now run from Baramulla to Sangaldan via Banihal, which used to be the last or originating station earlier.

T-50 is supposed to be the most challenging of the 11 tunnels in the Banihal-Khari-Sumber-Sangaldan section.

According to railway officials associated with the project, the tunnel work started around 2010 and it took almost 14 years to operationalise it.

"All safety measures have been taken inside the tunnel to meet emergency situations. An escape tunnel has been constructed parallel to T-50 to evacuate passengers in case of any emergency," an official said.

"At every 375 metres, a connecting passage between the escape tunnel and T-50 has been made so that the passengers can be brought to the escape tunnel and then, carried to their desired destinations in vehicles," he added.

The official told PTI that in order to tackle a fire incident, water pipes have been laid on both sides of the tunnel with an opening valve provided at every 375 metres so that water can be sprayed on a train from both sides to douse the flames.

"Escape tunnels have been created for other bigger tunnels too," he said.

According to NR officials, the opening up of the Banihal-Khari-Sumber-Sangaldan section has brought them a step closer to achieving the dream of running a train from the Kashmir valley in the north to Kanyakumari on the southern tip of the country.

"Earlier, eight diesel trains (four each from one side) were operating between Baramulla and Banihal. Today, Prime Minister Modi not only inaugurated the extension of the Banihal route to Sangaldan via Khari and Samber, but also flagged off the first electrified trains on the whole route from Baramulla to Sangaldan," the official said.

Now, eight electrified trains have started running between Baramulla and Banihal and four of those have been extended to Sangaldan.

"The four other trains will also be extended up to Sangaldan after a couple of months," the official added.

According to experts associated with the project, the first section of the USBRL -- the Qazigund-Baramulla section -- was operationalised by the Congress-led United Progressive Alliance (UPA) government in 2009. In July 2013, the Banihal-Qazigund section, which included the operationalisation of the 11.2-km-long T-80 Pir Panjal tunnel, was opened.

"Once the complete USBRL opens in the coming months, passengers will enjoy infrastructural marvels, such as the Chenab bridge, the highest railway bridge in the world, and the Anji bridge, which is the first cable-stayed bridge of the Indian Railways," an NR official said, adding that the total length of the USBRL is 272 km and the cost of the project is Rs 41,119 crore.

"The Jammu and Kashmir Local Bodies Laws (Amendment) Bill, 2024 seeks to amend certain provisions of the Jammu and Kashmir Panchayati Raj Act, 1989, the Jammu and Kashmir Municipal Corporation Act, 2000 and the Jammu and Kashmir Municipal Corporation Act, 2000 in consonance with the provisions of the Constitution," according to the statement of objects and reasons of the legislation.

The act was passed by Parliament recently.

'People Won't

AIIMS Jammu, the prime minister said the Union government has added 15 new AIIMS in the last 10 years, including two in J&K alone.

"After the commissioning of AIIMS Jammu, people of Jammu will no longer have to leave for Delhi to avail specialised medical treatment, which will help them save valuable time and resources," he said.

The prime minister highlighted the rapid speed of transformation of infrastructure in all the sectors of the country.

He reiterated his vision of India to become Viksit Bharat by 2047 and appealed to the people to work towards that vision.

He said a Viksit Jammu & Kashmir is a pre-requisite to Viksit Bharat and the various developmental and upliftment projects of the central government in J&K are aimed at fulfilling that vision into reality.

Lt Governor Manoj Sinha thanked the Union government for fulfilling many long-cherished aspirations of the people of J&K, be it in bringing development and benefits of central schemes to the marginalised sections or in provisioning two AIIMS to the region.

"The last five years have witnessed a transformation in J&K especially in improving the health, education, security and infrastructure landscape of the region which is evident in the decline of terrorism by 75 per cent and growth of investment and new opportunities," he said.

Sinha also pointed out that "under the leadership of Modi, J&K has become the only region in India having AIIMS, IIT, IIM and other institutions of eminence".

Union Minister Jitendra Singh highlighted the importance that the government has given towards enhancing infrastructure development in

the country and especially in J&K.

He said many of these development projects were very ambitious from the start and credited the prime minister for pro-actively pursuing them to ensure that development reaches the last mile.

The AIIMS Jammu is set to offer comprehensive medical services, with an expected daily footfall of 2000-3000 patients in the outpatient department. The Phase-1 consists of establishing 750 beds, including 193 ICU beds catering to trauma care, general care and super-specialties, an official spokesman said.

He said AIIMS Jammu plans to build approximately 50 departments, encompassing both general and specialised care.

Advanced facilities like Nuclear Medicine, 20 Modular OTs, MRI and CT Scan operating round-the-clock will ensure that humane and continuous care is readily available, he said.

Additionally, the spokesman said AIIMS Jammu's dedicated two-storey 'Ayush Block' with 30 beds alongside other facilities and partnerships, reflects a holistic healthcare approach merging traditional and modern medicine to enhance regional health outcomes.

AIIMS Jammu will have an annual intake of 100 students for its MBBS programme and 60 students for nursing. It will also introduce post-graduate programmes in Medical, Dental (MD/MS/MDS), Nursing, Super Specialisation programmes (DM/MCh), Doctorate (PhD) degrees, and more in the future.

With 54 per cent of its faculty and nearly 80 per cent nursing officers being women, AIIMS Jammu prioritises women empowerment through equal opportunities, supportive work environments and gender-sensitive policies, the spokesman said.

PM Inaugurates

Rs 13,375 crore, including permanent campuses for three IITs, 20 Kendriya Vidyalayas and 13 Navodaya schools.

The prime minister dedicated, inaugurated and laid the foundation stone of the campuses and buildings at a public function at the Maulana Azad Stadium in Jammu.

"The advancement of education and skill development sectors on such a scale was a distant reality 10 years ago. But this is the new India... The government of the day indulges in maximum expenditure for modern education of the present and future generations," he said on the occasion.

"In the last 10 years, the country has witnessed a record number of schools, colleges and universities, including 50 new degree colleges in Jammu and Kashmir. As many as 45,000 children, who did not attend schools, have now been admitted to schools and girl students need not travel far for education. There was a time when schools were run while today, schools are enhanced," Modi added.

The projects that were dedicated to the nation include permanent campuses for the Indian Institute of Technology-Bhubaneswar, IIT-Tirupati, IIT-Jammu, IIITDM-Kancheepuram, Indian Institute of Skills (IIS) -- a pioneering skill-training institute on advanced technologies -- in Kanpur and two campuses for the Central Sanskrit University in Uttarakhanda's Devprayag and Agartala, Tripura.

Modi also inaugurated 20 new buildings for Kendriya Vidyalayas (KV) and 13 new Navodaya Vidyalaya (NV) buildings across the country. The prime minister will also lay the foundation stone of five KV campuses, one NV campus and five multi-purpose halls for NVs across the country.

Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan attended the event virtually from the PM-SHRI Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalaya at Goshala in Odisha's Sambalpur.

For Bihar, the prime minister inaugurated 24 new academic and residential buildings of the IIT-Patna, constructed at an estimated cost of Rs 466 crore. The facilities include a central library, an auditorium, a central lecture hall and academic buildings, a students' activity centre, hostels and residential quarters for teachers and employees.

The IIT-Patna campus was inaugurated by Modi on July 25, 2015.

Modi also inaugurated the newly-constructed permanent campus of the IIM-Bodh Gaya.

Established in 2015, the institute was functioning from a makeshift campus.

The full-fledged new campus has been developed in an area spanning more than 60,000 square metres at an estimated cost of over Rs 400 crore.

The prime minister also inaugurated the IIT-Bhubaneswar and two newly-constructed KV buildings in Chhattisgarh.

At present, the IIT-Bhubaneswar has a strength of 1,250 students and in the next three-four years, its capacity will be increased to accommodate nearly 2,500 students, an official said, after Modi dedicated the institute and two KVs to the nation via video-conferencing from Jammu.

Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Vishnu Deo Sai, Durg MP Vijay Baghel, Chairman of the IIT-Bhubaneswar board of governors K Venkatraman and the institute's director, Professor Rajiv Prakash, were present at the inaugural ceremony on the campus.

The prime minister also inaugurated the Academic Complex East and Academic Complex West at IIT-Delhi. Union Minister of State for External Affairs Meenakshi Lekhi attended the event in the national capital.

The two multi-storey complexes have been developed at a cost of Rs 260 crore, with a plinth area of more than 60,000 square metres, and have come up as an addition to the existing academic area on the campus.

"The establishment of premier educational institutions, such as the IIM-Jammu, exemplifies a transformative approach, bringing quality education closer to home and empowering the youngsters of Jammu and Kashmir on a national scale," Modi said.

He said that earlier, the youths of Jammu and Kashmir had to go outside for higher education and professional courses but now the Union Territory "is becoming a hub of education and skill development with the establishment of various educational institutes like IITs and IIMs as per promise."

"The mission of modernising the education sector is expanding further," Modi said and referred to the inauguration of various IITs, IIMs, academic blocks, hostels, libraries, auditoriums and many such facilities across the country.

Forest Official's 'Shepherd' Remarks Spark Outrage

Expunge Mention As 'Inadvertent'

SRINAGAR: A senior forest official's derogatory remarks against a particular community and disregarding the significance of "Pheran," traditional Kashmiri winter attire, in an official order, on Tuesday triggered backlash from politicians and netizens, prompting him to 'expunge' the mention.

It may be in place to mention that the Divisional Forest Officer (DFO), Langate Forest Division, placed an on duty Forest Guard posted at forest check-post Langate under suspension and attached him with Range Officer Rafiabad for not adhering to the official dress code.

The DFO concerned, in his order, referred to the suspended Forest Guard as a 'shepherd'. The insulting remarks made against a particular community, however, did not augur well with some politicians, who referred to the terminology as 'insulting' and demanded an action against him.

PDP president, Mehbooba Mufti demanded immediate action against the DFO concerned.

The former Chief Minister also lashed at the DFO Langate for disregarding the importance of 'Pheran'.

"During my surprise inspection of forest check-post Langate on Feb 17, at 12:25 pm, one forest official namely Bashir Ahmad Dhobi, Forest Guard was found wearing Pheran and looking like a shepherd. The territorial forest officials are part of the disciplined force and are always duty bound to wear proper dress code while performing their duties at sensitive postings," reads the order, copy of which lies with Kashmir observer.

The disciplinary action against the erring forest official was initiated on 17th of this month.

The order for suspension and subsequent attachment of the forest guard, identified as Bashir Ahmad Dhobi, was issued by the DFO concerned, who as per the order, has claimed to have found Dhobi wearing a Pheran, instead of a proper uniform during office hours.



"Therefore, pending departmental enquiry, Shri Bashir Ahmad Dhobi forest guard is hereby placed under suspension and is attached with Range Officer Rafiabad with immediate effect. The range officer Mawar shall make internal arrangements in place of the suspended official till suitable staff is posted in the said check-post, it adds.

After facing a backlash, the concerned DFO obliterated the word shepherd later and issued a rebuttal, claiming the mention inadvertently crept is hereby expunged from the records.

"As mentioned in forest order No 43 of 2023-24 dated 17.02.2024 issued under endorsement No.DFO/LGT / Estt/ 2023-24/3628-32 dated 17.02.2024. Further Range Officer Mawar is directed to expedite his enquiry report in the matter within five days for taking appropriate action as warranted under rules at this end in this regard," reads revised order of the DFO Langate Forest Division.

Health Department Probes Dental Assistants' Malpractice in Kashmir

SRINAGAR: The directorate of Health service, Kashmir have asked the Chief Medical Officers of all the districts to provide comprehensive, factual reports regarding a complaint lodged against Dental Assistants and Technicians suspected of engaging in malpractice within the valley.

The complaint, according to the health department, has been filed by the Divisional Secretary, All India Dental Surgeon Association J&K, that the Dental Assistants in Kashmir Division are performing dental procedures without proper qualifications and licenses and that improper infection control and sterilization procedures are posing significant health risk to patients.

The complaint further says that the Dental Assistants are over charging for dental services from the poor patients.

It further says that certain

Dental Surgeons have sold their registration to the Technicians and a number of Dental Clinics are not registered in Kashmir.

Notably, the valley is witnessing the dearth of dentists with reports suggesting that there has been no appointment of dental surgeons in Jammu and



Kashmir's over the past 15 years

Taking advantage of the shortage of the dentists, many Dental Assistants and Technicians are illegally running the clinics across Kashmir putting the life of the patients at risk.

Since 2008, the J&K Public Services Commission has failed to create the posts for dental surgeons due to many reasons

and the matter is pending in the court of Law.

Last year, the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare's Dental Education Section wrote to J&K Health and Medical Education Department regarding the unemployment of dental surgeons and urging them to take appropriate action.

However, as of now no "action" was taken.

As per a report, there are more than 10,000 Bachelor of Dental Surgery (BDS) and approximately 2,000 Master of Dental Surgery (MDS) students in union territory who remain unemployed due to the dearth of opportunities in the government sector, despite the existing shortage of dental surgeons.

Meanwhile, according to an order from the department, a copy of which lies with Kashmir Observer, the medical chiefs of the districts have been asked to furnish a "factual detailed" report in the matter for further "course of action".

HC Rejects Ex-Councillor's Bail Plea for 'Cheating' to Secure Brother's Release

SRINAGAR: The High Court of J&K and Ladakh on Tuesday rejected anticipatory bail plea of a former Municipal Councillor in Baramulla facing "serious allegations" of receiving huge money from a complainant to release his brother arrested on charges of killing an army soldier.

"The allegations against the applicant are very serious in nature and in light of the amount transferred in his account, as is evident from the bank statement, it is, prima facie, established that the applicant has received an amount of Rs.3 lakh from the complainant," a bench of Rajesh Oswal said, while rejecting bail plea by the former councillor Ashiq Hussain Ganai.

"The applicant (Ganie) has himself admitted that he is an accused in FIRs Nos.63/2021, 155/2016, 65/2022 and 283/2016. FIR bearing No.319/2016 was registered under Section 420, 427 and 473 RPC and FIR No.65/2022 was also registered for commission of offence under Section 420 IPC," court said and rejected contention of Ganie's counsel he did not receive any amount from the complainant in view of the record of the Bank procured by the Investigating Officer.

"There are very serious allegations against the petitioner in respect of receipt of money for procuring release of brother of the complainant," the court said, adding, "No doubt offence under section 420 IPC is punishable with maximum imprisonment of seven years but the antecedents of the applicant are also not clear enough for grant of bail in anticipation of arrest."

The court observed that Ganie only appeared once before the investigation officer and thereafter never appeared as urged police.

"... the antecedents of the accused (Ganie) and the conduct of the accused are also the relevant considerations for grant of bail in anticipation of arrest," the court said while referring to a judgment of Supreme Court.

The Court said that the applicant did not deserve to be admitted to bail in anticipation of arrest and accordingly, dismissed the application being "misconceived".



Case history

The complainant had filed an application before Senior Superintendent of Police, Baramulla, against Ganai and others, alleging therein that his brother was lodged in Jail at Jagadari Haryana under Section 302 IPC in connection with killing of an Army soldier. Three persons including Ganie, claiming to have high political and bureaucratic influence, assured the complainant that they could secure release of his brother and demanded an amount of Rs.5.50 lakh.

Believing the assurance of the accused, the complainant said that he made a payment of Rs.3 lakh Ganie and Rs.1 lakh to another person while the remaining amount of Rs.1.50 lakh was handed over to Ganie in cash. However, he said, despite receiving the payment, the accused persons failed to get his brother released from the custody and demanded an additional amount of Rs.1 lakh which the complainant flatly refused. On his request to do the needful pursuant to the settlement, the accused persons threatened the complainant of dire consequences, the complainant said. The application was forwarded to concerned Police Station and an FIR No.152/2023 for commission of offences under Section 420 and 384 IPC was registered against Ganie and other accused persons.

Ganie had sought bail in anticipation of arrest after a similar request made by him through the medium of an application for grant of bail in anticipation of arrest was turned down by the Sessions Judge, Baramulla on 19 August last year.

Snow Disrupts Normal Life In Kashmir Valley

SRINAGAR: Normal life came to a standstill on Tuesday after the fresh snowfall across the valley led to the cancellation of nearly two dozen flight operations and also the closure of main roads and highways in Jammu and Kashmir. The weatherman however, has predicted the improvement in weather conditions from Wednesday afternoon.

According to the news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO), the Kashmir valley and some parts of Jammu division continued to experience fresh snowfall including the summer capital of the Union Territory, Srinagar where a snowfall of 5.5 mm was recorded till 05:30 PM.

A fresh Western Disturbance (WD) started affecting J&K on February 18 and under its influence, many areas received fresh snowfall for the third consecutive day while after receiving rains for two straight days, Srinagar experienced a fresh snowfall today.

According to the local Meteorological department, Gulmarg, a famous ski-resort and Kokernag in south Kashmir recorded a snowfall of 28.0 mm today till 05:30 PM while Pahalgam received a snowfall of 27.7 mm today.

As per the reports, Sonamarg has recorded a snow depth of 5 ft in the last two days while Gulmarg has recorded a snow depth of 3.5 to 4 feet.

In plains of south Kashmir, snow depth ranged from 3 inches to 9 inches today, reports said.

At least 23 flight operations were cancelled in wake of the fresh snowfall and low visibility in Srinagar.

Director Srinagar International Airport, Javid Anjum told KNO that 11 flights were operated while 23 were cancelled due to the bad weather conditions. The flight operation has been completely suspended now, he said.

Due to the fresh wet spell, the major roads and highways including Srinagar-Jammu National Highway, Mughal Road, Bandipora-Gurez Road and others continued to remain closed for vehicular movement.

The officials had said that heavy rains triggered landslides and shooting stones along NH-44. The landslides blocked the road at Dalwas, Mehad-Cafeteria, Ramban, Chamlwah and Gangroo while the shooting stones occurred at T2, Jaiswal bridge, Gangro, Marog and other places along

IPL 2024 To Begin March 22

RANCHI: The much-anticipated Indian Premier League is all set to kick start on March 22 and despite the coinciding 2024 Lok Sabha Elections, it will be held entirely in India, league chairman Arun Dhumal told PTI on Tuesday.

According to details, the Lok Sabha elections are expected to be held in April and May. This is the main reason why the schedule for the IPL's 17th edition has not been unveiled yet.

Dhumal said only the schedule of the first 15 days will be announced and the roster for the remaining games will be decided after the announcement of

the general election dates. The dates of the Lok Sabha polls are expected to be announced early next month.

"We are looking at a March 22 start for the tournament. We are working closely with the government agencies and we will first release the initial schedule. The entire tournament will be held in India," PTI quoted Dhumal as saying.

The IPL was held overseas (South Africa) in 2009 and the 2014 edition was partially held in the UAE due to the general elections. While the tournament was held in India in 2029 despite the elections. The final is likely to be held on May 26, considering

the T20 World Cup begins within days of the cash-rich league's conclusion.

India will play their opening World Cup fixture against Ireland in New York on June 5 while the ICC showpiece begins with the USA and Canada clash on June 1.

As is the norm, the IPL opener will be played between the last year's finalists, the winners Chennai Super Kings in this case and runners-up Gujarat Titans.

Australian pacer Mitchell Starc became the most expensive player in the history of the league after being bought by Kolkata Knight Riders for ₹24.75 crore in the players' auction for the 2024 season was held in December last year.

an online betting app with an AI-generated voiceover.

The manipulated footage stems from Kohli's 2018 interview with Graham Bensinger, raising concerns about credibility.

The misleading content falsely claims Kohli earned Rs 81,000 by investing just Rs 1,000 in three days, promising a '2000% win'.

This misuse of AI follows a similar scam involving cricket icon Sachin Tendulkar, emphasising the dangers of deepfake videos exploiting celebrities' influence on their global fanbase.

8-Year-Old Beats Polish Grandmaster, Breaks Record

SINGAPORE: An eight-year-old Indian-origin boy defeated Polish chess grandmaster (GM) Jacek Stopa at the Burgdorfer Stadthaus Open in Switzerland on Sunday, becoming the youngest player to defeat a GM in classical chess.

Ashwath Kaushik, who represented Singapore, defeated Stopa, who at 37 is nearly five times older than him, according to a Channel News Asia report.

The previous record was set only a few weeks earlier when Serbia's Leonid Ivanovic, who is several months older than Ashwath, beat 60-year-old Bulgarian grandmaster Milko Popchev at the Belgrade Open.

Currently ranked World No. 37,338 on FIDE, the international chess federation, the Indian citizen, who moved to

Singapore in 2017, said, "I felt proud of my game and how I played, especially since I was worse at one point but managed to come back from that".

Singaporean grandmaster and CEO of the Singapore Chess Federation Kevin Goh lauded Ashwath's feat on X, saying, "Dad is super supportive, boy is dedicated, school allows flexibility and of course he has natural talent."

"Remains to be seen how far he can go as interests can change as the boy gets older. Still, we are hopeful."

Goh also joked that as he is only eight years old, Ashwath still "needs a booster cushion to reach the other side of the board".

He also attributed Ashwath's success to the "many other coaches and supporters" on his journey.

Palestine To Become Member Of International Climbing Federation

The Palestine Social Sport Climbing Club Association (PCCA) is to become a member of the International Federation of Sport Climbing (IFSC), officials said on Tuesday, providing recognition to the state in the fast growing Olympic sport. The executive board of the IFSC voted to include the Palestine organisation, along with federations representing Bolivia, Guam and Nigeria, in a decision that will be ratified at the IFSC General Assembly in Chile on March 22 and 23.

"The PCA is the 26th IFSC

member federation on the Asian continent, and is led by president Hiba Shaheen, vice president Tawfiq Alnejada and secretary general Taher Sharaf," the IFSC said in a statement. IFSC has 98 members, including Israel. Russia and Belarus are currently suspended due to the conflict in Ukraine.

Palestine's inclusion in the IFSC comes amid the backdrop of Israel's military war in Gaza, which has since killed more than 29,000 Palestinians, mostly women and children, say health authorities in the enclave.

Sport climbing is part of the programme at the Paris 2024 Olympic Games with the final field in the men's and women's competitions still to be decided. There are two remaining qualifier series events to be staged in Shanghai (May 16-19) and Budapest (June 20-23). The sport made its Olympic debut at Tokyo 2020.

Mbappe Agrees Deal To Join Real Madrid

PARIS/MADRID: France captain Kylian Mbappe has agreed to join Real Madrid on a five-year deal.

The striker had already informed his club Paris St Germain that he is leaving the club as a free agent after his contract expires in June seven years after joining them.

Mbappe, a member of France's 2018 World Cup-winning team, signed for PSG from Monaco in 2017 for 180 million euros (\$194 million) to become the second most expensive player ever after Brazilian Neymar, who joined the French champions the same year for 222 million euros.

The 25-year-old striker, who helped the capital club win five Ligue 1 titles and three French Cups, is PSG's all-time leading scorer with 243 goals in 290 appearances.

Mbappe last year sent a letter to PSG stating that he would not take up the option to extend his contract by a year



when it expires in June.

He has long been linked with Real Madrid, reportedly rejecting a 200 million euro (\$215.36 million) offer in 2021. He was

again set for a move to the LaLiga side in 2022 before announcing a contract extension with PSG before the transfer window opened.

Liverpool's Jota Out For Months, Says Klopp

LIVERPOOL: Liverpool forward Diogo Jota will be missing for months because of injury, manager Jurgen Klopp said on Tuesday.

The Portugal international hurt his right knee in the first half of Liverpool's 4-1 win at Brentford in the English Premier League on Saturday. "We have Diogo with a knee issue ruled out - it will obviously take months," Klopp said ahead of Liverpool's home match against Luton on Wednesday.

The injury potentially threatens Jota's involvement in the European Championship in Germany starting in June.

Liverpool's injury crisis has deepened, with nine senior players unavailable heading into a key

period of the season that includes the English League Cup final against Chelsea on Sunday.

Klopp didn't give a return date for injured pair Curtis Jones or Alisson Becker and he described Trent Alexander-Arnold and Dominik Szoboszlai as "longer term" problems. Striker Darwin Nunez was replaced at halftime against Brentford as a precaution.

CHELSEA TARGETS BRIGHTON FOR ITS HEAD OF RECRUITMENT

Chelsea has targeted English Premier League rival Brighton once again to strengthen its technical staff. Brighton said on Tuesday its head of recruitment, Sam Jewell, was placed on leave after accepting a new position at Chelsea. (AP)
