Govt To Establish 2000 **Start-ups In 3 Yrs: Govt**

Approves Start-up Policy 2024-27 For J&K

Administrative lammu: Council (AC) which met here under the chairmanship of Lieutenant Governor, Manoj Sinha, approved J&K start-up policy 2024-27 in superses-sion to the Start-up Policy notified in the year 2018. The policy has the objective of setting up 2000 new Startups in Jammu & Kashmir in the next 5 years.

Rajeev Rai Bhatnagar, Advisor to the Lieutenant Governor; Atal Dulloo, Chief Secretary; Mandeep Kumar Bhandari, Principal Secretary to Lieutenant Governor attended the meeting.

The Government of Jammu & Kashmir will set up a Venture Capital Fund of Rs. 250 Crores and will infuse a maximum of Rs. 25 Crores as an initial fund to this venture capital fund.

The venture capital fund so created shall invest primarily in recognized start-ups of Jammu & Kashmir. The Department shall work out detailed modalities for creation of venture fund and its usage in consultation with the Finance Department.

The department may also work out a mechanism to facilitate allotment of land to start-ups having good poten-tial for growth. | More on P6

7 New Industrial **Estates To** Come Up In J&K **Press Trust Of India**

Jammu: The Jammu and Kashmir administration has approved the setting up of seven new industrial estates at a cost of Rs 304.51 crore, an official spokesperson said on Thursday.

The estimated investment in these industrial estates, spread over 5,290 kanal across six districts, is Rs 8,700.16 crore with employment potential of 28,376 people, the spokesperson said.

He said the administrative approval for the development of seven new industrial estates was accorded by the administrative council that met here under the chairmanship of Lt Governor Manoj Sinha.

The seven new industrial estates will be developed at Sempora Medicity and Khunmoh-Panthachowk in Srinagar, Banderpora in Budgam, Bhagthali in Kathua, Karandi in Samba, Trenz in Shopian, and Hariparigam Tral in Pulwama.

The new industrial estate at Sempora on 517 kanal of state land shall be developed by IRCON at an estimated cost of Rs 22.60 crore, and the project will attract an investment of Rs 1,825.45 crore, having an employment generation potential of around 11,643.

The industrial estate at Khunmoh, Pantha Chowk, on 600 kanal of land shall be developed at an estimated cost of Rs 45.36 crore by IRCON, he said, adding | More on P6

Russian Skier

Gulmarg: A Russian skier died while seven others, including a local guide, were rescued as an avalanche struck the ski slopes of Gulmarg in Jammu and Kashmir on Thursday, officials said.

Notably, there have been reports of significant decline in saffron production in the valley from the last ten years.

The decline has been mainly attributed to climate changes, drought, market challenges, orthodox cultivation methods coupled with various biotic and abiotic stresses and poor plant stand.

Keeping in view of the serious threat to the spice and to give a boost to Saffron production and to mitigate the sufferings of the saffron growers, the central government decided to uplift the sector and announced Rs 400 crore under the NSM.

Srinagar: The Health and Medical Education (H&ME) department has ordered the constitution of Hospital Management Equipment Committee (HEMC) for equipment audit and preventive maintenance at CHCs and District Hospitals.

As per an order, the committee comprises Facility In-charge, senior most consultant, Dy.MS or Medical Officer, stores or senior most MO, head pharmacist or in-charge storekeeper and Head/ Sup./ Sr. Lab Technician and Head/ Sup./ Sr. Radiographer Head/Sup. /Sr. Pharmacist/ Lab-technician/ Radiographer (Paramedical staff) as per the availability at the CHC and DH.

The committee has been asked to adhere to the guidelines that receive proposals from the respective departments, evaluation of the proposals received from the department for procurement/ induction of new equipment and the justification provided after need analysis and costbenefit analysis, Receipt, Installation & Commissioning of new equipment at the hospital, Training of the user staff in operation & maintenance of the equipment, Preparation of Equipment Master Maintenance Plan consisting of the scheduled preventive maintenance & calibration of the equipment, Undertake review of equipment inventory (Equipment census) available and their

utilization once in a year. "List out functional, dysfunctional & repairable or BER equipment, Carry out equipment audit and review the asset base with addition of new equipment and its valuation, deletion of BER/Condemned equipment from the asset base and monitoring the activities of the maintenance service provider (in PPP), complaint management, equipment downtime, and ensuring preventive maintenance & calibration are carried out as per the OEM recommendations. the committee has been asked as per the order.

Cricket Legend Sachin Tendulkar, His Family Enjoys Shikara Ride In Dal Lake

Srinagar: Legendary cricketer and former Indian skipper Sachin Ramesh Tendulkar, who along with his family is on a visit to Kashmir, was on Thursday spotted in Srinagar, enjoying a Shikara ride at the world-famous Dal Lake.

Tendulkar, accompanied by his family, arrived in Kashmir last week. After being spotted playing gully cricket with the locals in the surroundings of Gulmarg area, he was seen in Srinagar today for a brief time.

Sachin was seen enjoying the Shikara ride along with his wife and daughter in Dal Lake, saying he enjoyed the visit while heaping praises on Kashmir.

Notably, on arrival in the valley, Tendulkar first visited a bat factory in south Kashmir, and then later reminisced about his first

Kashmir willow, a gift from his sister, highlighting the deep personal connections that cricket fosters within him.

"The first bat given to me was by my sister and it was a Kashmir willow bat. Ab main yahan hoon to Kashmir willow ko to milna banta hai! P.S.: An interesting fact; some of my favourite bats had only about 5-6 grains. How many grains do your bats have?" Sachin wrote on X.

On his arrival, Tendulkar explored the beauty of Pahalgam, revelling in the scenic vistas of Betab Valley, following which he moved to world famous ski-destination Gulmarg where he expressed his excitement and extended his best wishes to the organizers and athletes of Khelo India Winter Games.

Cricket legend Tendulkar also paid a visit to a temple in South Kashmir and to the Aman Setu bridge, situated at the Line of Con-

trol (LoC) in the Uri sector of Jammu and Kashmir.

Notably, Sachin is currently on his first-ever visit to Kashmir and the Indian cricketing legend seems to be enjoying his time, and posting regular updates about his visit on his social media handles.

In one such social media interaction shared on X, Sachin gets out of his car and talks to the locals, asking if he can play cricket with them on the street, to which the locals readily agreed.

In a style that may remind Indian cricket fans of the glory days of the sport, Sachin takes to the crease and asks the locals "Kaun hai tumhara bowler (Who is your bowler)".

During his brief stint at the crease, Sachin executed some of his signature shots. like as the leg glance, and even guarded the ball with ease while complimenting the local boy's delivery.

Fragile opposition unity

hen INDIA Alliance was formed in June 2023, it held the promise of offering a tough political challenge to the dominance of the ruling BJP led by the overarching figure of the prime minister Narendra Modi. Apart from Rahul Gandhi's Congress Party which continues to enjoy a national footprint - albeit drastically shrunken in the last decade - the regional parties with their committed support bases made the alliance a force to reckon with. But with the exit of Nitish Kumar, one of the alliance's key architects, and the growing rumblings over pre-election seat-sharing the alliance has started unraveling

But with the seat-sharing agreements between SP and Congress in the UP and the AAP and Congress in Punjab and Delhi, things finally seem to be turning around for the alliance. For example, the SP president, Akhilesh Yadav had recently decided to skip Rahul Gandhi's Bharat Jodo Nyay Yatra in Amethi and Raebareli. Now he might be joining it. Akhilesh's unilateral announcement of 11 Lok Sabha seats for the Congress in UP had earlier caught the Congress off guard, leading to a scramble to address the discord. The subsequent announcement of candidates for 16 seats by the SP further complicated matters. Now the deal has been sealed with Yadav giving the Congress 17 seats.

However, there is much that isn't going well for the alliance. In West Bengal, the seat arrangement talks between Trinamool Congress and the Congress have hit a dead-end. There are other issues too. The alliance, which had initially projected a united front against the ruling BJP, now finds itself grappling with internal discord, jeopardizing its ability to present a formidable challenge not only in the crucial state of Uttar Pradesh but also at the national level.

The Congress, facing demands for more seats and navigating the delicate dance of coalition politics, must recognize the urgency of presenting a united front against the BJP. In the face of these internal fissures, the need for opposition parties to prioritize democracy over individual interests becomes paramount.

The defection of Jayant Chaudhary to the BJP further underlines the fragility of opposition alliances. The INDIA Alliance must heed this warning and prioritize a collective effort to safeguard the democratic values that bind them together. The upcoming Lok Sabha elections are not just a battle for individual seats; they are a test of the opposition's ability to present a cohesive, united front against the BJP's formidable electoral machinery.

In the midst of these challenges, it is imperative for the opposition leaders to rise above individual differences, prioritize the greater goal of countering the ruling party, and forge a unified strategy. Any internal discord only weakens their collective ability to stand against the BJP's electoral juggernaut.

Children's Plight in Family-In-Law Discord

Greening Growth

he provision of Environmental Clearance (EC) un-der the Environment Impact Assessment (EIA) rules — notified in 2006 under the Environmental (Protection) Act — was meant to strike the right balance between the imperatives of growth and development and the environment. The EC is meant to be mandatory for various projects, including mining, thermal plants, those in river valleys, and infrastructure and industrial programmes. Unfortunately, as a report in this newspaper has shown, the balance between environment and industry seems to be tilting far too much towards the latter.

In 2017, the government brought in a loophole to the EIA and gave a six-month moratorium to all the companies that had not complied with the requirements to receive an EC. This one-time window was made indefinite under the revised Standard Operating Procedures in 2021. The notification was challenged before the Madras High Court, which granted a stay order. The Centre, however, interpreted the order as applying only to Tamil Nadu. Then, in January 2024, the Supreme Court stayed the notification, and the Court's final decision is pending. In essence, between 2017 and 2024, over 100 projects - they include coal, iron and bauxite mines, steel and iron factories, cement plants and limestone quarries — have been granted ex post facto environmental clearance under the diluted EIA, their original lack of EC notwithstanding.

Environmental clearances for business and infrastructure projects have been a fraught issue for decades. Under multiple governments and environment ministers of varying ideological leanings, the pendulum has swung both ways: At different points, the Environment Ministry has been dubbed either "anti-business" or "anti-environment". However, by any standard, the weakening of the EIA, and the National Green Tribunal, is a matter of deep concern that needs to be addressed urgently - in 2020, an Environmental Performance Index of Yale University ranked India 168 amongst 220 countries. Perhaps the only sustainable way to do this is to not see "environment" and "development" locked in an inevitably zero-sum game.

It's time to move to environmentalism as development and development as environmentalism. As climate change and sustainability increasingly become a part of the global business conversation, India has the opportunity to be a leader in this regard. This will, however, require a robust policy and regulatory framework, which while facilitating business, allows for a careful assessment of the adverse impacts of projects, and does not constantly search for and seize the loopholes.

young woman, just out of college, is teaching at my son's play school. She works from 10:00 – 3:00 pm. Young toddlers such as mine are very difficult to handle and one would think that these teachers would be compensated fairly for their work. Would you believe me if I say that these teachers who take care of so many toddlers and give a full working day worth of time every single day a week in every month. are paid as low as three thou sand rupees a month!

While we often applaud teachers for their dedication and contributions to society, it is disheartening to witness the exploitation of these

educators, particularly in the critical early childhood education sector.

Play schools serve as the foundation for a child's educational journey, where teachers play a pivotal role in shaping young minds. However, the teachers in Srinagar's play schools are facing dire financial circumstances due to inadequate compensation. Most of these play schools aren't even registered! These educators, responsible for nurturing the intellectual and emotional growth of our children, are often subjected to meager salaries that do not align with the value of their work.

Low wages not only lead to financial stress for teachers but also hinder their ability to provide quality education. Underpaid teachers may struggle to make ends meet, resulting in reduced motivation and, ultimately, a decline in the quality of early childhood education. This vicious cycle affects the very foundation of a child's learning experience.

It is essential for the government, educational institutions, and society as a whole to recognize the significance of early childhood education and the vital role teachers play in it. Adequate compensation is not only a matter of fairness but also an investment in the future of our children. Well-paid and motivated teachers are more likely to deliver high-quality

education, ensuring that our youngest learners receive the best possible start in their educational journey.

I urge the relevant authorities and stakeholders in Srinagar to address this issue promptly by implementing fair compensation packages for play school teachers. It is time to acknowledge their dedication and hard work by providing them with wages that reflect the importance of their role in shaping the future of our children and our society.

ost people consider decision-making to be a means to an end. They encounter a choice situation (e.g., how to spend their afternoon off), consider the options (e.g., yoga class, meeting friends, or bingewatching "Game of Thrones" for the third time), and reach a conclusion (e.g., bingewatching it is!). The decision process typically follows one of two approaches. On the one hand, people may use a quick approach that involves reacting instinctively and simply going with what feels right. This is often referred to as "System 1," "intuitive" or "gut" decision-making. On the other hand, people may use a slow, deliberate approach that includes careful consideration of all options. This is often called "System 2," "analytical" or "head" decision-making. No matter which approach people follow-be it an instinctive reach for the TV remote or a careful weighing of pros and cons-the decisionmaking process helps to get them where they want to be (e.g., sprawled out on the sofa, comfortably watching Jon Snow slaughter White Walkers and wildlings). It is a necessity, ideally resulting in a pleasant outcome. Recent research, however, offers an entirely new perspective. Rather than viewing decision-making as a chore, psychologists suggest that the act of making a choice may be intrinsically pleasurable and could increase people's well-being.

EMOTIONAL BENEFITS OF DECISION-MAKING

A team of researchers from Germany and Switzerland conducted a two-week decision-making study (currently a preprint). During this period, 256 participants kept regular decision journals. Whenever they faced a decision, they logged on to the online study site and answered a series of questions.

First, they rated their general mood and provided information about the type of decision they were about to make. Then, participants received instructions to either use their gut or their head to make the decision. Once they'd made their choice, participants were asked to rate their mood again and state how easy and how "right" the

decision felt to them. This completed the initial process of journaling, but participants were able to go back into their journals at a later time and provide follow-up details. For example, they could specify whether or not they had acted upon the decision made.

The study produced several surprising results. Firstly, people's happiness ratings increased after they made a choice. It thus appeared that decision-making improved people's moods.

Additionally, the findings showed some interesting differences in the effects of intuitive gut choices and analytical head choices. The emotional boost of decisionmaking was greater if participants had made their choice quickly using their gut. Also,

intuitive approach. This led the researchers to conclude that making fast, instinctive choices was beneficial to people's well-being.

ADVANTAGES OF GOING WITH YOUR GUT

Should people avoid lengthy rumination or procrastination to help them feel better? According to recent evidence, quick gut decisions could be an underexplored tool to promote well-being. There are several potential

reasons for the surprising benefits of intuitive choices. First, efficiency and decisiveness help to get things done, thereby playing into inherent human preferences for completing tasks, which I discussed in a related post. Also, the subjective ease experienced during instinctive decision-making could trigger positive emotions. Finally, the process of turning inward and listening to one's gut may increase personal

There is also a provision of one-time assistance as Seed Funding up to Rs.20 lakhs (4 equal instalments) to be provided to start-ups recognized by [KEDI which is nodal agency for start -ups. For seed funding there is capping of 25 start-ups per year which is a decision based upon available budget and desire to support a manageable number of start-ups effectively.

The Government is committed to establish 2000 start-ups in three years but by providing seed funding to a smaller number of carefully selected start-ups, the Government can prioritize quantity over quality for long term economic growth. This will also ensure that the resources are utilized efficiently. The budgetary support for implementation of Start-up Policy for a period of three years will be Rs. 39.60 Crores.

Labour killed in Ramban landslide

worker of a construction company was killed in a landslide along the Jammu-Srinagar national highway which remained closed for the fourth consecutive day on Thursday, officials said.

The construction worker identified as Deshpaul (31), a resident of Uttar Pradesh, was hit by the landslide outside his company headquarters near Seri in Ramban district around 8.30 am, police officials said.

They said the deceased was moving towards the mess of the company for breakfast when the incident occurred. His body was retrieved and shifted to hospital for postmortem.

An official of the traffic department said the 270km long highway, the only all weather road linking Kashmir with the rest of the country, remained closed for the fourth day following a fresh landslide at Kishtwari Pather near Banihal.

"The restoration work is in progress and will take some time," he said. The traffic on the strate-

gic highway was suspended on Monday following multiple landslides triggered by heavy rains at over a dozen places between Ramban and Banihal.

Never Seen Something Like That Before: England Skipper Ben Stokes On Ranchi Pitch Ahead Of 4th Test Against India

RANCHI: England captain Ben Stokes added spice to the talks on Ranchi pitch for the fourth Test against India, saying he has not seen anything remotely like the 22-yard strip here in the past.

India are leading the five-match series 2-1 and the penultimate Test will start here on Friday.

However, discussion about the "platey cracks" on the pitch as described by England batter Ollie Pope has dominated the build-up to this Test.

Stokes added a touch of intrigue as well. "It looked interesting, didn't it? I don't know. I can't say much. I don't know, I've never seen something like that before so I have no idea. I don't know what could happen," Stokes was quoted as saying by ESPNCricinfo. It indeed was an ominous

reading of the playing surface, if you are from the England camp. But then Stokes had a reason for it as well.

"If you looked down one side of opposite ends it just looked different to what I am used to seeing, especially out in India.

It looked green and grassy up in the changing-rooms, but then you go out there, it looked different. Very dark and crumbly and quite a few cracks in it," Stokes offered.

The nature of the pitch also delayed England making a decision on their playing 11.



Pacer Ollie Robinson will come in for Mark Wood but the call to add fourth spinner in Shoaib Bashir or an extra batter in Dan Lawrence will have to wait for now. Lawrence can also double up as a handy off-spinner.

"He's (Robinson) got unbelievable skills to be a successful bowler anywhere in the world.
What we've seen in England is he's very skillful, but we've seen more than that in Pakistan.

"It's similar but different here,

but the skill he possesses, he can find any movement, and his release point is always going to be dangerous," said Stokes.

So, will Stokes finally wear his bowling cloak? The Durham man remained a bit secretive.

"My knee itself was absolutely fine today bowling. It was just good to push past that 20-minute barrier, which is what I've been working around at the moment. It might be a bit stiff but we'll wait and see," he noted.

As per the format, 10 teams are divided into two groups of five. In the group stage, each team plays 14 games facing the other



four sides in their group two times each (home and away basis, four teams in the other group once, and the remaining team two times.
