

JK AGRI-MED Science Congress Concludes At SKUAST

Srinagar: The JK AGRI-MED Science Congress being held at Sher-e-Kashmir University of Agricultural Sciences and Technology of Kashmir (SKUAST) concluded on Thursday.

The congress at the Shalimar campus, marked a significant collaboration between various organizations including the Department of Science and Technology, J&K Government, SKIMS and JK Research Consortium.

Man Dies, 4 Houses Damaged In Nawakadal Blaze

Srinagar: One person lost his life while four residential houses were damaged in a devastating blaze that broke out at Jamallata Nawakadal area in the old city here this evening.

Four residential structures comprising around 15 members lost their shelters in a massive blaze near Yarbali Masjid, a mosque situated along the banks of River Jhelum near Nawakadal Bridge, witnesses told Kashmir Observer.

The fire, officials claimed, broke out in the residential house of one Bashir Ahmad Bandyay son of Mohammad Yusuf Bandyay, and quickly spread to three nearby structures.

Bandyay, according to the witnesses, was trapped inside his house before his dead body was retrieved from under the debris. Matoo, they said, died of possible suffocation.

Property worth crores was destroyed in the fire incident, while firefighting operation was on when reports last came in. Officials said fire tenders

from several stations were rushed to the spot to douse off the flames as soon as the information regarding the incident was received.

Officials said that a number of persons including some females who had been trapped inside their homes were successfully rescued by a team of Fire and

dousing off the flames that destroyed four residential houses in the congested locality.

The four other houses that suffered damage in the incident belong to Bashir Ahmad Matoo, Noor Mohammad Matoo and Mohammad Sayeed.

Western Hypocrisy On Gaza

As Israel's invasion of Gaza continues, leaving around 30,000 Palestinians killed, most of them children and women, and with home demolitions in East Jerusalem has caught the world's attention. The Israeli authorities, seizing the global preoccupation with the Gaza war, have intensified their actions, leaving Palestinian families in anguish as they watch their homes reduced to rubble.

On the other hand, the situation in Gaza, as highlighted by UN Under-Secretary-General Martin Griffiths, is indeed a humanitarian crisis of immense proportions. The toll on human lives, the destruction of infrastructure, and the dire conditions faced by the people of Gaza demand urgent international attention and action. Griffiths has called for the G20 members to use their political leadership and influence to help end the war in Gaza.

That said, the humanitarian agencies are facing immense challenges in delivering aid, with obstacles ranging from security risks to the collapse of law and order. Despite their courageous efforts, the enormity of the crisis requires a more substantial and coordinated response. The urgency of the situation requires a swift and decisive response to prevent further loss of life and alleviate the suffering of the affected population.

But it seems unlikely to happen for now. The hypocrisy of Western countries and the political elite has pushed the purported "rules-based world order" they claim to champion to an irreversible point. The unequivocal backing of Israel's genocidal actions in Gaza, has laid bare the double standards of the West concerning human rights and international law. The West can only attribute this situation to its own arrogance, and there is no way to retreat from the consequences.

It is, however, heartening that tens of thousands are flooding the streets day after day, vehemently expressing their repulsion at what they perceive as Israeli atrocities, coupled with a growing disaffection with Western complicity. Faced with this mounting public outcry, western governments, including the United States, are belatedly adopting a cautious stance of marginal criticism towards Israeli actions. However, this last-minute shift in rhetoric appears to be too little, too late, as the damage to Western credibility seems irreversibly severe.

The desperate need to bring the ongoing war in Gaza to an end is a global moral imperative, and the West, if it wants to salvage its credibility, has a crucial role to play in leveraging its political influence for the greater good. The world's moral failure in the face of this crisis should serve as a collective call to action for all nations to unite in the pursuit of peace, justice, and humanitarian relief in Gaza.



Economic Possibilities for Our Overworked Grandchildren

In 1988, John Maynard Keynes published his short essay “Economic Possibilities for Our Grandchildren,” in which he outlined his vision of a future global economy characterized by leisure and abundance. As the rapid pace of artificial intelligence threatens to displace millions of workers, it is worth revisiting this brilliant, passionate work.

Keynes originally wrote his essay in 1928 for a lecture at a “Economic Club” in Hampshire, England, and spent two years revising it before its publication. Despite being taken aback by the 1929 stock market crash, he encouraged his readers to view it as a “temporary phase of maladjustment.” Demonstrating his characteristic foresight, Keynes avoided making predictions for the next five or ten years, instead focusing on the century to come.

Many of Keynes's insights were remarkably prescient. In a modern society, he observed, had we been “afflicted with a new disease,” whereby technological advances had reduced demand for labor, but he viewed this “technological unemployment” as a reason for hope, not despair, predicting that automation would drive rapid GDP growth and usher in an age of leisure. “The standard of life in progress countries one hundred years hence,” he speculated, “will be between four and eight times as high as it is. Despite the economic up and downs of the past century, this prediction has proven to be accurate.

But as frantically as he was, Keynes's other forecast was far off the mark. “Within a hundred years,” he asserted, humanity’s “economic problem” – the need to work in order to produce the goods that sustain us – would be solved. “While people may still work ‘three hours a day,’ mainly to satisfy the old Adam in the bowels of us,” both the poor and the rich would enjoy such prosperity that labor would become unnecessary.

Keynes has been rightly taken to task for his wildly optimistic predictions. Instead, Robert

noted in *The New Yorker*, the productivity gains of the past century have not translated into increased leisure time for all. To be sure, the economically disadvantaged work less now, both because there are fewer jobs and because life is less prosperous than it used to be. But the wealthy, driven by a culture of competitive greed, find themselves working more than ever.

Moreover, Keynes failed to balance work across regions and countries. The average American, for example, works 1600 hours more annually than the average British worker and 300 hours more than the average French employee. US workers also take fewer vacation days than their European counterparts, but are weekly entitled to at least four weeks of paid vacation per year.

But while Keynes failed to anticipate how the economic problems would evolve, his essay's underlying incentive argument is often cited today. One of the main reasons why he got his prediction wrong is that he projected his own ethical principles onto others. Much like his Bloomsbury Group peers, Keynes viewed good with disdain. In the same essay, he described the relentless pursuit of wealth for its own sake as a “distasteful morality.”

Keynes's mistake was to underestimate human greed and assume that a certain level of financial security would satisfy most people. He envisioned a more equitable world where individuals would enjoy unprecedented prosperity, free from economic anxieties. But, as Joseph E. Stiglitz has outlined, Keynes misjudged the balance between the desire for leisure and the appetite for consumption. After all, why settle for a single TV when you can work harder and install services “in every room and in both the front and the back of automobiles?”

Keynes's essay underestimated the competitive drive that fuels the relentless quest for wealth and enhanced status. The wealthy, in particular, are often motivated by a desire to maintain their relative standing in a constantly

evolving society. Keynes envisioned a world where a shift toward an equitable world would occur naturally, it has become clear that achieving this goal requires government intervention.

One way to bring about the equitable society Keynes envisioned is to tax the rich. In my recent book *Reasons to be Happy*, I propose a tax regime designed to redistribute income from the wealthy to the poor, leaving relative positions unchanged and without undermining individual incentives. This system, which I have dubbed the “accordion tax,” aims to narrow the income gap by taxing those with above average earnings and transferring these funds to those with below average wages, as a form of negative proportional tax.

This approach would enable billionaires like Elon Musk and Jeff Bezos to maintain their relative standing, even with substantially reduced post-tax earnings. Given that their primary concern is their ranking among the world's wealthiest individuals, their motivation to innovate and venture into new fields would not be diminished. Moreover, the economic well-being of lower-income households could significantly improve.

Contrary to Keynes's expectations, we cannot build a fair society by leaving people to their own devices. Fortunately, a growing number of people, including several of the world's billionaires, are committed to addressing today's extreme economic disparities, even though that would be to their own disadvantage. Nearly a century after Keynes outlined his vision of the future, the road to solving our economic problems remains long. Still, there is cause for hope.
