




Noted interior designer Sunita Kohli has come out with a book that collates recipes from her friends that highlight the immense variety of food in India as well as from across the border.

Among the recipes, Kohli writes how malpua has been passed down five generations.

"This is considered India's oldest dessert. Malpuas are small deepfried pancakes that are soaked in honey. Interestingly, this dessert is first mentioned in the Rig Veda, the oldest of the four Vedas, where it is called apupa and its recipe is also included,' she writes.

She describes north Indian cuisine as a culinary treasure trove that reflects the rich heritage of the region.

"It has been influenced by history and has evolved over centuries. It blends indigenous ingredients and cooking techniques with Persian, Mughal and Central Asian influences. This culinary heritage has a unique depth and complexity and is also visually appealing," Kohli writes.

aising a child in the current circumstances is both an experience to cherish and at the same time quite demanding as well. Parents have to invest both time and finances to let their child realise their actualized potential. To hone the skills of their children as per demand and requirement, the first priority for a

parent is to offer quality education. Parents are ready to sacrifice everything to safeguard the education of their children. So, the first priority for a modern parent is to choose the right kind of school for their child which can cater to a diverse set of learning needs. To access quality driven educational institutions, a parent has to move from pillar to post to explore available options.

The author, like any other parent, was excited and at the same anxious to look for the best possible schooling options to get my child enrolled in kindergarten. I explored ample options in South Kashmir and finally zeroed in on certain viable options for which I had received positive feedback. Therefore, I made up my mind to get my ward admitted into one of these so-called innovation and futuristic driven schools. With excitement, I went along with my child for an "assessment" where they would deduce whether the child fits in their self created criteria of learning environment. In the school premises, I was given a time slot for the said assessment, an assessment which is otherwise strongly discouraged by the renowned educationists all over the world. Infact, the Honorable Supreme Court had passed clear directions and had abstained school authorities from putting children to any psychological discomfort in the name of assessments. Even the Ministry of Education and Literacy came up with detailed guidelines and issued instructions in this regard to do away with any kind of assessment in determining the admission especially at the pre-primary level.

At first, I thought the school authorities would hold a sort of informal interaction with parents to discuss the attainment of age –appropriate developmental milestones. But to my utter shock and disbelief, we were asked to hand over the child to the assessment team and the child was taken to solitary confinement in a locked room and we were not allowed to accompany the child and were left guessing outside the room.

Imagine the psychological discomfort a child had had to go through on being subjected to this torturous assessment by faces unfamiliar to him. When the child came out of the room, the author went to school authorities to discuss certain reservations he had in his mind. Why was there a need to assess the child even for admission to a pre-primary class? The authorities in a confident tone replied that it is integral to assess the child to gauge the level of attainment of developmental milestones and to check whether the child

is suffering from any kind of disability. With eyes wide open, I asked if children with special needs would be accommodated in the school. Their response was literally a bolt from blue. The protested as to how they could enroll such children in an "elite" institution and such children are to be admitted in special schools. T

The landmark legislation enacted in 2016 titled Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPwD) Act 2016 vociferously advocates enrolling children with special needs in mainstream education systems instead of establishing special schools. The act even makes it clear that if any school deprives any specially-abled child from his legitimate right to access quality education, the school can face de-recognition and hefty fine if found violating the provisions of the Act. However, the elitist private schools in our part of the world have taken these legislations and circulars for a toss. The modus operandi of these institutions is to access a desired lot of students through

the assessment and they do not stop here: then they demand hefty amounts in the name of annual fee, franchise fee, school development fee, capitation fee besides the normalized tuition fee and transportation fee.

The elitist school, author is talking about is receiving a capitation fee to the

tune of Rupees 80,000. They are selling education rather than rendering it accessible to all. The circulars and orders from the school education department categorically ask to do away with any assessment at the time of admission and charging capitation fee of any kind but these instructions are hardly seen implemented by these elitist vendors of

NEP 2020 and ECCE:

The essence of NEP 2020 lies in shifting the paradigm of education from content memorization to attainment of competencies. The skill of hard memorization is now considered as a redundant and obsolete skill, as this skill is not sufficient enough to mitigate the challenges of the 21st century. The challenges posed by the 21st century are quite varied and complex as compared to the challenges encountered in previous centuries. The educational institutions therefore have to strive towards creating congenial learning atmosphere which in the longer run

learners, who can in turn meaningfully contribute to society. Are our schools ready to embrace the provisions of NEP 2020? Or will our schools still stick to the traditional way of schooling? In that case, what will be the fate of such a meticulously crafted policy. The effective implementation of any ground breaking intervention is determined by the sincere will and commitment of all the relevant stakeholders. One of the standout recommendations of NEP 2020 is the conceptualization of Early Childhood care and education (ECCE) which was previously unheard of in earlier policies. ECCE is crucial to the overall development of children, with impacts on their learning. Evidence on Early childhood education suggests that children who engage in early and play based learning activities have better developmental outcomes than those who don't. According to National curriculum Framework (2022) for foundational stage education of children in the three to eight years, research from across the world on education, neurosciences and economics demonstrates clearly that ensuring free, accessible, high quality early childhood care education is perhaps the very best investment that any country can make for its future. It further elaborated that brain development is most rapid in the first eight years of a child's life, indicating the critical importance of cognitive and socio-emotional simulation in early years. The National Curriculum Framework for Foundational stage (2022) has listed the 'panchakosha' concept for education of children and its five integral domains are physical development, development of life energy, emotional and mental development intellectual development and spiritual development. The ECCE model relies on play based, inquiry based learning with focus on cognitive, affective, psychomotor abilities and early literacy and numeracy. The design of teaching -learning instructional pedagogy therefore is to hone physical and motor development, cognitive development socio-emotional ethical development cultural /artistic development and at the same time acquisition of effective communication, language, early literacy and numeracy at the preparatory stage The ultimate aim of ECCE is to attain optimal outcomes in different domains. Somehow early childhood education has remained both under invested and under explored over decades. The argument for increased investment in early childhood care and education is a basic one – human resources are the bedrock of a nation, and early childhood is the bedrock of a

The Economic Consequences of Legal Behavior

he way people navigate traffic can tell us a lot about their respective cultures. Recently, while walking to my office in midtown Manhattan, I stopped at a red light when an elderly woman with a walking stick caught my attention as she cautiously looked both left and right. When she saw that no car was close enough to hit her – assuming they adhered to New York's speed-limit laws - she gave me a puzzled look and crossed the street. I must admit, I felt a bit foolish.

Such an incident would be unthinkable in Japan. Years ago, on the first night of a weeklong visit to Tokyo, my young, jet-lagged children, who had lived only in India and the United States, were amazed by the law-abiding Japanese. Peering out of our apartment window at midnight, they observed a man standing alone at a crosswalk. Even with no cars in sight, he waited patiently for the light to turn green.

While these normative differences may seem trivial, societal attitudes toward the law can significantly affect a country's economic performance. Whereas the New Yorker's actions could be interpreted as aligning with the spirit of the law, the Tokyo pedestrian adhered to its letter.

A system that emphasizes the spirit of the law gives individuals discretionary power, leading to potential misuse or abuse. When individuals have latitude to decide how to behave, they might, for example, choose to disrupt traffic. This is evident in the streets of New York and, to a greater extent, in my hometown of Kolkata (formerly

Calcutta). While the city is gradually adopting the Western model, during my youth Kolkata was a pedestrian's paradise, where crossing the street required

no more than a simple hand gesture. It is crucial to understand the strengths and weaknesses of both systems. economic growth and overall development. Consider, for example, an orchestra: without a conductor to guide them, the musicians onstage may still make music, but it would not be the

Salzburg Opera. The same is true for many other aspects of daily life. In a 2002 paper I co-authored with Jörgen Weibull, we argued that punctuality is not a genetic trait but a behavior cultivated through coordination. Sticking to a fixed schedule becomes valuable when everyone is expected to do so. It is reminiscent of the stag hunt game described by Jean-Jacques Rousseau in his Discourse on Inequality, in which two hunters could kill a stag by cooperating but only a hare if they go it alone. Contemporary century has been facilitated by a social transformation which enabled its economy to grow at an unprecedented rate.

Nevertheless, the New York model, where individuals are given leeway to interpret the law, has its merits. After all, pedestrian traffic lights are designed to facilitate the smooth flow of traffic and occasionally allow pedestrians to cross. When the road is empty, ignoring the red light does not run counter to the law's purpose. It facilitates what economists refer to as a Pareto improvement, whereby some people are better off without hurting anybody else's well-being.

While enacting laws that accommodate every individual's unique circumstances and preferences is not feasible,

leaving laws open to some degree of individual interpretation can encourage creativity and enhance efficiency. This approach, which cultivates a culture conducive to technological and artistic innovation, has enabled the United States to become the world's growth engine and magnet for talent.

To be sure, attempting to bring about a normative transition from adherence to the letter of the law to realizing its spirit could backfire, producing cacophony in the proverbial orchestra pit. Economists and legal scholars can play a crucial role in facilitating such a shift while mitigating potential risks. This cannot be achieved through precise policy prescription - that would in fact be self-contradictory. The key to achieving this is in the realm of ideas that John Maynard Keynes emphasized. We need to be aware of the two distinct modes of law enforcement, and, despite the risks, the surprising advantages of moving from following the letter of the law to the spirit.

As the British conductor Charles Hazlewood observed, for good music you need individual musicians to follow the conductor's instructions exactly. Great music, however, relies on "trust" and "personal freedom for the members of the orchestra." They need space for judgment and creativity.

A Guide to Ibadah During the Last Ten Nights of Ramazan

s we come into the last ten nights of Ramazan, many of us will be reflecting on how our Ramazan has gone so far, possibly asking ourselves the following questions:

Have I made the most of my Ramazan? Did I reach the goals I set out before Ramazan? Have I prayed every Salah? Have I made the most of my time? And the list goes on.

And dependent on what the answers are to those questions, some may be humbly content with the progress they have made whilst others may feel they could have done more.

What is beautiful about the blessed month of Ramazan is that Allah (SWT) gifted us a special night in the last ten nights of Ramazan, the Night of Power which is 'greater than a thousand months [of worship]. (Surah Al-Qadr, 97:3).

What is the reason for this gift? The Prophet (**) was shown the lifespans of the previous nations which were hundreds to thousands of years, and the ones of his Ummah were such that they would pass away in their sixties and seventies. Upon learning this, he was concerned that his Ummah would not be able to compete with the previous nations, so Allah (SWT) gifted the Night of Power to his (#) Ummah for him.

Ziyad related to me from Malik that he had heard a man he trusted of the people of knowledge say, "The Messenger of Allah, may Allah bless him and grant him peace, was shown the lifespans of the people (who had gone) before him, or what Allah willed of that, and it was as if the lives of the people of his community had become too short for them to be able to do as many good actions as others before them had been able to do with their long lives, so Allah gave him Laylat al- Qadr, which is better than a thousand months." (Malik)

Abu Hurairah (ra) narrates, "The Messenger of Allah (**) said, 'The lifespan of my nation is between sixty to seventy, and the least of them are those who surpass that." (Ibn Majah)

If we were to ponder on the magnitude of the verse 'greater than a thousand months [of worship]' then this could be interpreted as more than 83 years of worship, and in essence more than a lifetime. With these abundant blessings gifted to us from Allah (SWT) for the taking, there is no question as to why Muslims strive to find this blessed night, which is placed on one of the odd nights in the last ten days of Ramazan.

From this, we know Allah (SWT) wants us to succeed when the Messenger of Allah (#) used to say, 'Do as many deeds as you are capable of doing, for Allah will not become weary (of giving you reward), but you would be tired (of doing good deeds).' (Muslim)

He (#) also used to say, 'The most beloved deed to Allah is one to which the doer adheres constantly even if it is small.' [Muslim]

On knowing about this incredible gift, a renewed sense of purpose should be back on the cards again. A Muslim still has hope that it is not too late to finish Ramazan strong, to push hard to the end like a race.

On the authority of 'Aishah (ra) who said, 'When the last ten days (of Ramazan) started, the Prophet (saw) would tighten his waist belt (i.e. work hard), he would give life to its nights (i.e. pray all night) and he would awaken his family (for prayers).'

In light of this beautiful narration, you will find below ten tips on how to elevate your worship during the last ten nights of Ramazan, so that when these 30 days pass, you will rejoice in knowing you tried your best insha'Allah.

1. DON'T WASTE TIME

The Night of Power is better than a thousand months of worship, which means each second is equal to more than 24 hours of worship! Subhan'Allah! This includes limiting the amount of time you are spending on social media and being intentional with your goals.



The Messenger of Allah (**) said, 'There is no intelligence like planning.' (Ibn Majah)

To give you a heads up on important dates in your planning, this year the final ten nights are estimated to begin at Maghrib on Saturday 30th March. Interestingly, in the UK the Easter school holidays begin on Friday 29th March (Bank Holidays: Good Friday and Easter Monday is 1st April) and the summer term begins Monday 15th April. Alhamdulillah, this means the last ten nights are all in this year's Easter holidays, which is great especially for families with school children.

2. GIVE CHARITY

The Messenger of Allah (**) was the most generous of people and was described in Ramazan as being, 'more generous in giving charity than the blowing wind.' (Muslim)

Muslim Hands Best Ten Nights donation tool ensures that you don't miss out on the rewards of donating on the Night of Power. You can split your donations in the following three ways: (1) evenly across all ten nights, (2) give double on the odd nights and (3) even give double on odd nights and triple on the 27th night.

The reason the Best Ten Night tool puts emphasis on donations towards the odd nights, especially the 27th is from the following hadith narrations:

On the authority of 'Aishah (ra) that the Messenger of Allah (**) said, 'Search for the Night of Power in the odd nights of the last ten days of Ramazan.' (Bukhari)

On the authority of Mu'awiyah ibn Abu Sufyan (ra) that the Prophet (*) said concerning the Night of Power, 'The Night of Power is the twenty-seventh (night of Ramazan).' (Abu Dawud)

If it is the Night of Power, donating £10 would be like donating £10 for over 83.3 years or over 29,500 days (83.3 x 355 lunar days of an Islamic year) - or if we are talking figures, it is as though you have donated over £295,000! So splitting your donations to ensure you don't miss this blessed night is a must! You can also diversify your donations by choosing from the following five funds: (1) Gaza Emergency Fund, (2) Zakat Fund, (3) Where Most Needed Fund, (4) Water Fund and (5) Iftar Fund.

3. BEFRIENDING THE QUR'AN BY LISTENING AND READING

Ramazan is the month of the Our'an and other scripture revelations like the Scrolls of Ibrahim (AS), the Torah and the Gospel were also revealed in Ramazan [Ahmad] to serve as guidance for mankind.

A person gets ten rewards for reciting each letter of Arabic in the Qur'an (Tirmidhi) and there are approximately 327,792 letters in the Qur'an – which means massive rewards are on offer! Beautifully, the Our'an is divided into 30 Juz, correlating with the 30 days that Ramazan is made up of, making it possible to aim to read one Juz a day. Each Juz is divided into two Hizb and each Hizb is divided into quarters to make the Qur'an easier to read so you can reach the milestone of completing the Qur'an.

You may ask, is there a pre-

ferred time to read the Qur'an? Yes, especially at the time of Fajr as Allah states.

'Establish prayer from the declining of the sun to the darkness of the night; and hold fast to the recitation of the Qur'an at Fajr (dawn), for the recitation of the Qur'an at Fajr is witnessed.' (Surah Al-Isra 17:78)

4. PRAY TAHAJJUD BEFORE SUHOOR When you wake up for Suhoor



The Night of Power is better than a thousand months of worship, which means each second is equal to more than 24 hours of worship! Subhan'Allah! This includes limiting the amount of time you are spending on social media and being intentional with your goals

(the pre-dawn meal), wake up early enough to also pray the Tahajjud prayer (which literally means 'avoiding sleep') - minimum 2 x 2 rak'ahs nafl prayer before Fajr.

It is a unique blessing for this Ummah that we have a pre-dawn meal before we commence fasting and the Prophet (**) said, 'Take the pre-dawn meal (Suhoor), for indeed there is a blessing in it.' (Bukhari)

The last third of the night before Fajr is truly a blessed time, the Messenger of Allah (**) said,

'Our Lord, Blessed and Exalted be He, comes down every night to the nearest Heaven when the last third of the night remains, saying, 'Is there anyone to invoke Me, so that I may respond to him? Is there anyone to ask Me, so that I may grant him his request? Is there anyone seeking My forgiveness, so that I may

forgive him?' (Bukhari) Seeking forgiveness from Allah at this blessed time is further emphasised in the Qur'an that Allah's true servants are those who '(those) who are patient, truthful, obedient, and charitable, and who pray for forgiveness before dawn' (Surah Ali 'Imran 3:17)

5. PERFORM THE NIGHT PRAYERS

These are called Taraweeh, which literally means to take rest and take pauses between each two units of prayer. There is immense barakah associated with performing qiyam al lail (night prayers) during Ramazan. Praying in the Masjid in congregation multiplies your reward by twenty-seven times (Bukhari). Additionally, one is encouraged to engage in Dhikr between each set of four units of prayer.

The blessing of Ramazan this year is that the fasts are shorter

and the nights are longer than previous years. Hence, you can make the most of the nights in worship by doing a variety of worship as it is difficult to sustain one act of worship.

6. PERFORM ITIKAF

Try to perform Itikaf in your local masjid in the last ten nights or a few days that you are available to do so. Women have the option to do this in their homes in a specified room.

On the authority of 'Aishah (RA) who said, 'The Messenger of Allah (**) used to practise 'Itikaf in the last ten nights of Ramazan and used to say, 'Search for the Night of Power in the last ten nights of Ramazan." (Bukhari)

7. DON'T EAT TOO MUCH AND KEEP

The Messenger of Allah (*) said, 'A human being does not fill any container that is worse than (his) stomach. It is sufficient for the son of Adam to eat what will support his back. But if this is not possible, then a third for his food, a third for his drink and a third for his breath.' (Tirmidhi)

Try to opt for wholesome foods including fruit and vegetables and keep hydrated with plenty of water Movement is also key so we can look after our bodies as they are an amanah, a trust placed in us by Allah (SWT), and caring for our bodies and our health is a beautiful way to please our Creator. The Prophet (##) advised us that,

'Indeed, your body has a right over you.' (Bukhari)

For ideas for engaging in exercise and earning great rewards, vou can check out Muslim Hands event Walk For The Children Of War.

8. MAKE DU'A AND DHIKR The Prophet (*) said, 'Du'a is the

essence of worship.' (Tirmidhi).

Making du'a during the last ten days should not be taken lightly and therefore preparing a list is important, even jotting these

down with a notepad and pen. Du'a is like a conversation with Allah (SWT) in which we put our needs before Him and ask His help in resolving our problems. Du'a not only allows us to submit to Allah (SWT) but it is also a form of worship and a way to build our relationship with our Creator.

The benefit of making du'a is famously mentioned in The Noble Our'an.

'When My servants ask you (O Prophet) about Me: I am truly near. I respond to one's prayer when they call upon Me. So let them respond to Me and believe in Me, perhaps they will be guided.' (Surah Al Baqarah 2:186)

It is profound to note that this verse appears directly after the verse that commanded the fasting of Ramazan. Scholars therefore have said there is a direct connection between fasting and making du'a and we should use every opportunity to make du'a during this blessed month, especially in the last ten nights.

The Prophetic Du'a for these nights is,

Allahumma! Innaka 'Afuwwun Karimun tuHibbul-'Afwa

"O Allah! Indeed, You are the

Generous and Pardoning One. You love to pardon, so pardon me!" (Tirmidĥi)

The Prophet (*) also advised us in Ramazan to make the following du'a, 'You should ask Allah for Jannah and ask for refuge in Him from Jahannam.' (Ibn Khuzaimah)

9. WORK ON YOUR CHARACTER

The primary mission of the Prophet (*) was to teach us how to be people of good character, 'I have been sent to perfect good character.' (Muwatta). The traits of good character include modesty, courage, forgiveness, generosity and kindness.

Tools to improve your character can include studying the Seerah of the Prophet (**) and the life of the Sahabah (RA) to understand how they lived a life of righteousness. Being conscious of the types of people you surround yourself with as they can have a huge influence on you either positively or negatively.

The Prophet (*) said 'Verily, the parable of good and bad company is that of a seller of musk and a blacksmith. The seller of musk will give you perfume, you will buy some, or you will notice a pleasant smell. As for the blacksmith, he will burn your clothes, or you will notice a bad smell.

So in the last ten nights, reflect on how you dealt with certain situations, did you strive to be more patient, avoid anger, and lend a helping hand, among other virtues.

10. FINISH STRONG

The Prophet (**) split Ramazan into three equal parts,

'And it is a month, the first of which is mercy, its middle is forgiveness and its last (part) is freedom from the Fire.' (Mishkat al-Masabih)

We want to finish strong to attain this eternal freeing from the hellfire inshaAllah. Even if we have had a poor start to Ramazan we must push ourselves down to its last week as the Prophet (*) advised,

'Seek it in the last ten (nights). i.e. the Night of Power. If one of vou shows slackness and weakness (in the earlier part of Ramazan), it should not be allowed to prevail upon him in the last week.' (Muslim)

Imam Ibn al-Qayyim al-Jawzi (RH) said, 'When the race horse knows that it is nearing the end of the track it exerts all of its effort to win the race. Do not allow the race horse to be more clever than you. For verily deeds are judged by their conclusions. So if you didn't do so well with welcoming Ramazan then perhaps you will do better in bidding it farewell.'

This is based upon the advice of the Prophet (*) who said, 'Indeed, deeds are only (judged) by their endings.' (Bukhari)

We pray for a good end as we strive for Paradise and its delights, 'whose seal is musk, so let those who want to compete for that, compete!' (Surah Al-Mutaffifin 83:26)

We pray that Allah (SWT) accepts all our worship this Ramazan and that we emerge with all our sins forgiven, Ameen!

Kejriwal said that he was born to wage struggles and is destined for bigger challenges in future as well, so he was not surprised by his arrest.

He asserted that India has to be shaped into the strongest and greatest country in the world.

"Together, we have to make India a great country, the strongest and number one country in the world. There are many forces inside and outside India that are weakening the country. We need to be cautious so as to identify these forces and defeat them," she said reading Keiriwal's message

There are numerous people and forces in the country that are patriots. India must be made to move forward and these forces need to be united and strengthened, read the Delhi chief minister's message.

"I have received a lot of love from you. I must have done virtuous actions in my previous birth that I was born in a great country like India. I have blessings of crores of people that is my strength," said the message.

Kejriwal also appealed to AAP volunteers that the work of social and public service should not stop because he was in custody.

"Also, the BJP people need not be

hated for this. They are our brothers and sisters. I will return soon," Kejriwal was quoted as saying by his wife, who had the Indian flag and pictures of B R Ambedkar and Bhagat Singh in the backdrop - also seen during video address by Arvind Kejriwal and his Punjab counterpart Bhagwant

The Delhi chief minister in his message also assured the women of Delhi that he will fulfil the promise of providing them monthly Rs 1000 honorarium announced in the budget, after coming back.

"The mothers and sisters in Delhi could be thinking that Kejriwal has gone inside and whether they will get Rs 1000 honorarium or not. I appeal to all my mothers and sisters to have faith in me...'

"I will soon come out and fulfil my promise. Has it ever happened that Kejriwal did not fulfil any promise. Your brother and son is made of iron," he said in the message.

Kejriwal urged the women to go to temples at least once to seek god's blessings for him.

The AAP chief is in ED custody till March 28, following his arrest on May 21st evening by the agency in connection with a money-laundering case linked to Delhi's now-scrapped excise policy.

His latest wealth included Rs 45,000 cash in hand (self) and Rs 55,000 (wife), six banks accounts for self having over Rs 1.11 crore, three bank accounts with over Rs 8.37 lakh in the name of his wife, besides nearly four dozen Fixed Deposit Receipts (FDRs) worth over Rs two crore together.

The assets also included a residential house in Jammu on the name of Singh and a flat in Delhi and non-agricultural land (in Garhwal) in the name of his wife, and two private vehicles including one luxury car and 40 and 50 tolas of gold worth Rs 13.30 lakh and Rs 16.50 lakhs by husband and wife, respectively.

In 2019, the movable assets of the minister stood at Rs 1.84 crore and his spouse's at Rs 57.87 lakh, while the immovable assets were Rs 4.02 crore for himself and Rs 63.20 lakh in the name of his wife.

According to the latest affidavit, Singh had filed his income tax returns for the last five financial years - Rs 33,17,330 (2022-23), Rs 31,65,330 (2021-22), Rs 25,75,940 (2020-21), Rs 29,58,240 (2019-20) and Rs 29,49,872 (2018-19). His wife has also filed her income tax returns ranging between Rs 4-6 lakhs during the same period.

The minister has no criminal case pending against him and also has no liability.

Functionally, the Assistant Commissioner, Relief (Migrant), Jammu in the Office of Relief and Rehabilitation Commissioner, Jammu is made responsible for the receipt of applications from the electors who wish to vote at the special polling stations at Jammu. He shall also be the ARO responsible for the issuance of a Postal Ballot to all those who opt for

Likewise, the Deputy Director, Horticulture, Planning & Marketing, Delhi and Deputy Secretary, office of Resident Commissioner, New Delhi, are appointed as the ARO for the receipt of applications, conduct of poll, etc., at the special polling station(s) to be provided in Delhi. Collector, Northern Railways, Udhampur is appointed as ARO in respect of the special polling station(s) at Udhampur.

For the General Elections to Lok Sabha - 2024, the Election Commission has advised the migrant voters to send their forms, Form M for voting in person at any of the 'Special Polling Stations' or Form 12 C for using the postal ballot to the concerned Assistant Returning Officers to reach them on or 10 days before the date of poll separately for each phase of the polling.

Kashmiri migrant voters, who are residing at various relief camps in Delhi, Jammu, and Udhampur and who opt to cast their votes in person through Electronic Voting Machines at the forthcoming General Elections to the Lok Sabha, 2024 can do so at polling stations across Jammu, Udhampur and Delhi.

Army Cancels

Indian Army has remained apolitical & areligious. This ill-advised UCC seminar is a threat to both these basic tenets," Abdullah said in a post on X.

systemic changes, but unfortunately the seminar by the India Army as an institution depicts how far the lines between politics and security apparatus have blurred in J&K," he added.

Saqib said this is a "very dangerous trend" and is a "manifestation of larger systemic erosion of the Constitution".

After the backlash, the Army cancelled the event "due to implementation of the Model Code of Conduct".

"The Legal Awareness Seminar on March 26 by Kashmir Jurist in Kashmir University has been cancelled due to implementation of the Model Code of Conduct," Srinagar-based Defence Spokesman Lt Col Manoj Sahu said.

Centre Empowers

Government declared the Jammu Kashmir National Front (JKNF), as an unlawful association vide notification number S.O. 1296(E) dated March 12, 2024, published in the Gazette of India, Extraordinary, Part-II, Section-3, Sub-section (ii), dated the 12th March, 2024," the notification stated.

The Ministry issued a notification pointing out that the JKNF, chaired by Nayeem Ahmad Khan, is indulging in "unlawful activities, which are prejudicial to the integrity, sovereignty, and security of the country."

Tampering With Smart Meters: Govt Mulls To Lodge FIR Against Consumers

SRINAGAR: The government has initiated the process of registering FIR against 272 consumers across Srinagar for tampering with the smart meters, officials said on Saturday.

For the last several months, the Kashmir Power Distribution Corporation Limited (KPDCL) has been taking action against illegal hooking and tampering of smart meters across Kashmir. Several videos were uploaded on X by KPDCL wherein it could be seen that many consumers were found tempering with the smart meters.

Now, according to the news agency—, the KPDCL has taken a step further and has issued a list of consumers, who were found tampering with the smart meters to the administration for taking legal action against them.

In this regard, a Technical Officer has issued an official communiqué to the Chief Engineer confirming 70 cases of smart meter tampering.

'Your immediate attention is invited towards the abovecaptioned subject and enclosed reference received from Central Inspection Squad (CIS), KPDCL, regarding the tampering of smart meters installed, it reads.

As can be seen from the list, CIS has confirmed 70 cases of smart meter tampering, after which they were confiscated during inspections, it added.

It further added that "in this connection, I have been directed to inform you to direct the concerned SDOs of 11 Subdivisions detailed below to immediately lodge FIR for tampering with Smart Meters in the Police Stations falling under the juris-



diction of the concerned Subdivision and furnishing of ATR at an earliest."

As per the official communiqué, 3 consumers are from Zakura, 21 from Baghat, 9 from Chanapora, 16 from Watalkadal, 3 from Hawal, 2 from Khunmoh, 9 from Huzuribagh. 3 from Zainakote, 1 from Karan Nagar, 2 from Nawa Kadal and 1 from Raj Bagh.

In another communiqué, the KPDCL has mentioned the list framed on the basis of 'meter cover-open' tamper alerts received by the HES (Head End System) of the concerned AMISP.

In the same communiqué, 54 connections from Watalkadal and 148 from Chanapora area have been mentioned

It has now been directed to officers to direct the concerned SDOs of the following 02 Subdivisions to immediately lodge FIRS for tampering of Smart Meters in the Police Stations falling under the jurisdiction, it read.

Despite the high stakes, the first half was characterised by a cautious approach from both teams. Neither side was willing to risk conceding space that could be exploited by the opposition. As a result, it led to limited goal-scoring opportunities.

And the chances that did arise were squandered by the forwards from both teams. It also underscored the intensity and pressure of the encounter as players like Real Kashmir's Shaher Shaheen and Gnohere Krizo and Mohammedan Sporting's Eddie Hernandez and Bento direct their shots on target and break the deadlock in the first 45 minutes.

The first significant test for the goalkeepers arrived in the 60th minute. Real Kashmir's Krizo won the ball in the midfield and played a quick pass to Kamal Issah, who released Jeremy Laldinpuia on the left flank. The agile winger advanced with the ball before taking a shot at goal.

It marked the first real challenge for Mohammedan Sporting's goalkeeper, Padam Chettri, in the match. And he passed with flying colours as he fisted away the ball. The ensuing rebound fell to Issah, who had an opportunity to convert but unfortunately couldn't guide his header on target. (IANS)

Punjab Kings Beat Delhi Capitals By 4 Wickets In Chandigarh

CHANDIGARH: It was not the comeback Rishabh Pant had wished for as English all-rounder Sam Curran's counterattacking half-century powered Punjab Kings to a four-wicket win over Delhi Capitals in their Indian Premier League (IPL) opener here on Saturday.

Curran blazed away to a 47ball 63 and got excellent support from compatriot Liam Livingstone (38 not out off 21 balls), as Punjab completed a chase of 175 with four balls to spare.

This was after the returning Pant failed to set the stage on fire as Punjab Kings rallied to stop Delhi Capitals at 174 for nine.

Batting at number nine, Abhishek Porel top-scored for DC with an unbeaten 32 off only 10 balls, helping the side to a total that did not pose any problem for Punjab on a pitch with no demons.

Punjab Kings began their chase in earnest and raced to 34 in three overs when Shikhar Dhawan (22 off 16 balls) charged down the wicket only to miss and see his middle stump getting disturbed by Ishant Sharma.

Impact Sub Prabhsimran walked in at number three and

that hit the perfect length and left the batter in two minds. Prabhsimran's riposte was a boundary through mid-off as the batter showed aggressive intent.

Harshal Patel (2/47) got the big wicket of Warner in his first over as comeback-man Pant (18 off 13 balls) arrived at the crease

RR have a solid batting lineup, boosting of the likes of in-form Yashasvi Jaiswal, Jos Buttler, besides skipper Sansom. They also have a finisher in Dhruv Jurel, who made an impressive India debut in the recent five-match Test series against England.

LSG, on the other hand, would depend on Quinton de Kock, Marcus Stonis and Nicholas Pooran to do bulk of the scoring apart from skipper Rahul.

Chhetri Set For 150th Int'l Cap; To Be Feted By AIFF

Nearly two decades after he made his senior debut against Pakistan, Indian talisman Sunil Chhetri is set for another milestone as he will appear in his 150th international match in the World Cup qualifier against Afghanistan in Guwahati on Tuesday. By achieving the feat, Chhetri will become the 40th player in the world to play 150 or more international matches in the list led by Portuguese superstar Cristiano Ronaldo (205). He has made 149 appearances for the national team, netting a record 93 goals.

Mumbai Association To Top Up BCCI's Domestic Per Match Fee

The Mumbai Cricket Association on Saturday announced that it will top up BCCI's existing match fee in domestic cricket by equal amount for its senior team players from the upcoming 2024-25 season.

The BCCI had revised the match-fee structure for First-Class cricket in 2021 to Rs 40,000 per day for 1-20 matches, Rs 50,000 for 21-40 matches and Rs 60,000 for 50 or more matches. So a Mumbai player, who gets Rs 2.40 lakh per Ranji match will now get Rs 4.80 lakh from next season.

Sri Lanka Leads Bangladesh By 211 Runs In 1st Test

Opener Dimuth Karunaratne hit a half-century to help Sri Lanka tighten its grip on the series-opening Test against Bangladesh on Saturday.

Sri Lanka extended its lead to 211 after reaching 119 for five at stumps on Day 2.

Pacer Vishwa Fernando claimed 4-48 in helping the visitors take a 92-run lead in the first innings when Bangladesh was bowled out for 188 in reply to Sri Lanka's 280 all out.

Russia Cancels Paraguay Friendly **After Moscow Shooting Attack**

Dussia have cancelled Monday's friendly international Against Paraguay in Moscow following Friday's shooting rampage near the capital city, the Russian Football Union (RFU) said on Saturday. At least 115 people were killed after gunmen opened fire with automatic weapons in a concert hall near Moscow, with Islamic State militant group apparently claiming responsibility.

Russia, banned from FIFA and UEFA competitions in February 2022 following the country's invasion of Ukraine, can only play friendly games and defeated Serbia 4-0 on Thursday at Moscow's VTB Arena.

AHMEDABAD: Hardik Pandya will aim to build on the rich legacy of his predecessor Rohit Sharma when he begins his Mumbai Indians captaincy stint with a match against Gujarat Titans, a team that the star allrounder himself marshalled over last two seasons, in the IPL here on Sunday. Such are the professional ways of IPL that Pandya, having led Titans to the title and runners-up finish in the previous two seasons, has gone to back to the Mumbai Indians where he made a name for himself.

The tournament also marks Pandya's comeback from a 'freak' ankle injury he picked up in the middle of the ODI World Cup in October. The form of the injury-prone all-rounder with both bat and ball will be closely tracked in the tournament that precedes the T20 World Cup in the USA and Caribbean. With Pandya moving on to the other side, Titans will be



led by Shubman Gill, who assumes the responsibility with very little captaincy experience. Left-arm pacers Jason Behrendorff and Dilshan Madushanka are already ruled out of the IPL while new recruit Gerald Coetzee, nursing a groin injury, might not be available for the first few

Having led Mumbai to as many as five IPL titles, India skipper Rohit will be turning up as a player this season and would be expected to hit top form ahead of the ICC event in June. Another player whose performance will be scrutinised is Ishan Kishan, who will have a point to prove after losing his BCCI central contract for defying the Board's diktat on domestic cricket.

The southpaw, who missed the entire Test series against England, preferred to train on his own for the IPL and did not turn for his state side Jharkhand in the Ranji Trophy. The fight for the wicket-keeper batter's slot in the World Cup squad will be intense and Kishan needs to be at the top of his game over the next two months. Besides Pandya, Mo-

hammad Nabi and Romario Shepherd are the other quality all-round options Mumbai possess. Domestic players like Akash Madhwal and Nehal Wadhera will be looking to build on their performances of the previous season.

On the Titans' front, Gill has been tasked to ensure that the team maintains the remarkable consistency it showed in its first two seasons. Gill could be one of the future leaders for India but for that to happen, he must prove himself on the IPL stage.

He was the leading rungetter last season and the franchise would be hoping that captaincy doesn't impact his batting in anyway.

Titans are bound to miss the services of Mohammed Shami, who recently underwent a surgery to repair Achillies tendon and will be back only in the second half of the year.
