Balancing Memory And Modernity: The Evolution Of Ramazan In Kashmir

Srinagar: Zoona Begum's calloused hands, stained with henna, delicately passed platters to other family members gathered around the Iftar Dastarkhwan. Its surface, adorned with dates, fruits, drinks, snacks, and pudding reflected the care poured into the meal. Yet, amidst the abundance, a wistful sigh escaped her lips as she surveyed

the spread. "There's a lot of food, but it doesn't have the same joy it

once held," Zoona said. "In those days, Ramazan wasn't just about fasting and prayers; it was a time when families gathered around the Iftar Dastarkhwan, creating bonds that transcended blood ties," she recalled.

An old city resident in her late seventies, Zoona painted



a vivid picture of a time when an unparalleled sense of community and togetherness. She the arrival of Ramazan brought

vividly remembers the vibrant atmosphere of her neighborhood, where the entire Mohalla felt like one extended family. The simple act of one person rising for Suhoor (pre-dawn meals) would ripple through the entire community, awakening each household in unison.

"A single person would take it as a responsibility to wake everybody for fasting, considered mandatory in Islam. He

would knock doors and call on top of his voice to wake up his neighbors," she said.

She is of the belief that there was simplicity in every aspect of life including Ramazan and, now, all that has changed. "Even though ordinary people were not very well versed with Islamic knowledge that people nowadays have, their fundamental beliefs were strong and they would fast and feast simply."

"The era of Sharm (chastity) and Haya (modesty) is gone and youngsters don't have a great deal of respect for faith. Nowadays, even though people fast, it seems that aaz kal chi laej ti tchoor ti gaej ti tchoor,'meaning that everyone is a thief these days," she said. However, Zoona isn't the

PROBABLE 3RD TERM PM Sets Ambitious India Economic Goals

New Delhi: Prime Minister Narendra Modi, confident of winning the national election starting this month, has set an ambitious target of roughly doubling the economy and exports this decade, according to a government document seen by news agency Reuters

PM Modi has highlighted economic growth as one of his biggest achievements in election rallies and has "guaranteed" making the economy the third-largest in the world from fifth now if he wins a third term in a row as polls predict.

He has already asked officials to finalise plans by around May to expand the economy to \$6.69 trillion in nominal terms by 2030, from around \$3.51 trillion currently, according to the October document. Though short on concrete details of how to achieve that, it has been a basis for officials' meetings.

When he took office for a second term five years ago, PM Modi promised to take the economy to \$5 trillion by the current fiscal year, but | More on P6



App-Based Data Collection Found To Help Detect Dementia At Genetic Level In New Study

n a new research, data collected via a mobile app, including voice recordings and body movements. was found to help researchers develop new tests for detecting dementia. They said the newly developed testing method is "comparable to goldstandard methods" and could detect frontotemporal dementia (FTD) - a common cause of dementia - at the genetic level before symptoms start.

The smartphone app, developed by the researchers in collaboration with a software company, included tests of executive function, such as planning and prioritising, filtering distractions and controlling impulses. Executive functioning is known to degrade as FTD advances.

"We developed the capability to record speech while participants engaged with several different tests," said first author Adam Staffaroni, clinical neuropsychologist and associate professor in the Department of Neurology, University of California San Francisco (UCSF), US.

"We also created tests of walking, balance and slowed movements, as well as different aspects of language,"

said Staffaroni.

The team said patients having this condition are believed to be most responsive to early treatment, ideally before symptoms start to emerge. Multiple variants of FTD are known and comprehension.

However, most patients are diagnosed "relatively late in the disease, because they are young, and their symptoms are mistaken for psychiatric disorders," according to Adam Boxer, professor in memory and aging at the UCSF Department of Neurology, and senior author of the study published in The Journal of the American Medical Association (JAMA) Network Open.

For the study, the researchers tracked 360 participants with an average age of 54 enrolled in ongoing studies, of whom about 90 per cent had app data on disease stage. These participants included those not having FTD or were gene carriers presenting no symptoms, those displaying early signs, and those presenting symptoms.

The team found the tests to be as sensitive as clinical evaluations employed to diagnose the disease.

"Eventually, the app may be used to monitor treatment effects, replacing many or most in-person visits to clinical trials' sites," said Staffaroni. While the team has no current plans of making the app public, they said that such assessments could pave the way for new trials of "promising" therapies.


The atmosphere was charged with religious fervor as men and women from different walks of life offered prayers and paid homage to the saint known for his teachings of peace, harmony, and spirituality.



DC Srinagar For Strict Vigil Around Drug Hotspots, Educational Institutions Chairs NCORD Meeting On PDA&NT

Srinagar: Deputy Commissioner (DC) Srinagar, Dr Bilal Mohi-ud-Din Bhat on Thursday directed the members of NCORD Committee to keep vigil on vulnerable target groups and places particularly around educational Institutions to prevent spread of drugs and save the young generation from drug menace.

In order to review the measures taken by Law Enforcement Agencies and other stakeholders to curb the menace of drug abuse and drug peddling in Srinagar, a meeting on District Level meeting on Prevention of Drug Abuse Narcotics Trade (NCORD) was

held under the Chairmanship DC at Meeting Hall of DC Office Complex, here.

At the outset, the DC took a detailed appraisal and action taken with regard to the directions passed in the last meeting from the concerned members of NCORD Committee. He also reviewed the deterrence measures taken and progress achieved to eliminate drug abuse and its peddling from the Srinagar District.

The DC also reviewed the progress and impact of the antidrugs awareness campaign in the district.

Dr Bilal stressed upon the Officers of all the line departments to further intensify the deterrence measures to control the harmful effects of drug menace so that youth is discouraged from tempting towards drugs.

Biscoe Holds Annual Cross Country Run

The show started soon with the chief minister raising the flag for the first batch of students which comprised those of class XI and XII, followed by the senior department, the middle, the junior and lastly the lower primary department.

But the real excitement was on the way. The students raced with each other raising slogans to encourage their House mates. The partly wet road and the muddy and slippery track made no impact on their high spirits. The gods also seemed to be kind as the weather was clear and sunny Although it was a long and tiring one, the run joined by over 1500 students, was completed in less than two hours.

Gaza Catastrophe

Al Quds Day and its Importance

The religious and historical significance of Masjid alAqsa, (The Farthest Mosque), also known as Bait al Maqdis is not lost on any Muslim. It occupies an important place in Muslim history, heritage, culture and religion. Located in Jerusalem, it is the third holiest place for Muslims. In fact it is important and sacred for followers of all the three Abrahimic faiths: Islam, Christianity and Judaism. The Mosque with a silver colour dome is situated on the Temple Mount. Throughout its history, the city of Jerusalem has been ruled by Muslims, Christians and now Jews.

For Muslims, Al Aqsa is not only their first Qibla, the place facing which they would offer prayers, but is significant also because Prophet Muhammad (Pbuh), started his miraculous night Journey, Al-Isra from Mecca to Masjid al Aqsa and then his heavenly ascension. This journey has linked Masjid al Aqsa and Jerusalem to the hearts and minds of Muslims worldwide. As Quran says, Glory to Allah who did take His Servant for a journey by night from the Sacred Mosque (in Makkah) to the Al-Aqsa (in Jerusalem) whose precincts We did bless - (Al-Isra 17:1).

Its importance for Muslims has been impressed upon by making Al-Aqsa an important part of the Prophet's journey. As per the Muslim tradition, before his ascension, Prophet Muhammad (Pbuh) led congregational prayer in the mosque in which all previous Prophets of Allah participated. Al-Aqsa therefore holds the unique distinction of being the only mosque where all the prophets performed their Namaz in congregation. The importance and sacredness of Jerusalem is emphasised in the Quran and various Muslim traditions. For Muslims, like Masjid alHaram and Masjid al Nabwi, the virtues of praying in Al-Aqsa are also exalted. It also holds the distinction of being the second mosque on the surface of the earth, after the Sacred Mosque in Makkah.

Muslims laid siege to Jerusalem, during the rule of Umar ibn Al Khatab. But he was not leading the army. The inhabitants of the city agreed to surrender if Umar ibn al Khatab himself came to the city in person. He arrived in the city and received the keys to the city in 637 CE. He concluded a peace treaty with the people of the city which allowed the Jews to enter the city who were denied access to the city by its Christian rulers. Under the Muslim rule the city became free to followers of all the three faiths: Christianity, Islam and Judaism. The Muslim rule really helped the city to remain prosperous and peaceful where followers of all the religions lived with peace and harmony and were free to perform their religious duties and obligations.

But after Israel occupied east Jerusalem in 1967, Palestinian Muslims have got restricted access to the mosque. The Waqf Ministry of Jordan had control of the Masjid till the 1967 war between Israel and the Arabs. After their victory, the Israeli authorities didn't take direct control of the mosque, but transferred it to the Islamic Waqf Trust. But this transfer did not stop the Israeli Security Forces, IDF from conducting searches and patrol within the premises of Al Aqsa. Israeli authorities have also enlarged the prayer plaza at the Western Wall in Jerusalem's old city. Despite a Jerusalem court order against such a move, which the court said would violate the status quo, Israeli authorities went ahead with the expansion. Various encroachments by Israel on the Islamic authority at the site have triggered clashes between clashes between Israeli police and Palestinians. In 1996, Prime Minister Netanyahu opened the Western Wall tunnel, another excavation close to the mosque compound, resulting in clashes in which 75 Palestinians and 15 Israeli soldiers were killed. Knowing its importance and sensitivity to Muslims, Israel has often acted provocatively and added to the anger and frustration of Palestinian Muslims.

Common Muslims take out processions and impress upon the world on the last day of Ramazan by observing it as the Al Quds Day. It was initiated in 1979 by Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini to express solidarity with the people of Palestine and oppose Zionism and Israeli occupation, most notably that of Jerusalem. Iran is perhaps the only Muslim country where the Govt sponsors rallies and protests on this day.

Ramazan over the decades. Zareef Ahmad Zareef, a poet and oral historian, also said that the charisma around Ramazan has diminished.

Zareef, known for his keen observations and wit, delved into the transformations he has witnessed in Ramazan. He reminisced about the bygone days when Ramazan in Kashmir was marked by a unique vibrancy and communal fervor.

"While the essence of fasting remains intact for most, the communal spirit that once defined this month seems to have waned. Ramazan was a time of profound spiritual reflection intertwined with communal gatherings, shared meals and an unmistakable sense of camaraderie," Zareef said.

He said in his childhood people would wait for the holy month a month before, purifying their hearts and minds for the holy month. For sighting the moon, people would get on their rooftops, swarm roads and bridges in Srinagar.

"Some people would satirically say Hey biyapori ma wouchuckh (Has the moon been sighted at Biyaripora?), a locality near Eidgah, where people would usually go and sight the moon."

The moon sighting would give happiness beyond bounds for the people and the atmosphere would turn festive. Kashmiris would usually sing the couplet on Ramazan's arrival.

Mah-e- Ramazan Aamay Mah-e-Ramazan

adorned and my wish is fulfilled

According to Zareef, in Shahr-e-Khaas, a lone Sahar Khan would single handedly cover large distances and wake up people for Suhoor.

"The drum beating and the loud cries of waqte-sahar would resonate in every street of the old city. He would usually walk from Khanyar to Chattabal. Children would peep from their windows to get a glimpse of him, considering him an angelic person," Zareef said.

Unlike today, during suhoor, meals were kept simpler, and children were encouraged to participate in fasting. If they felt hungry during the day, they were encouraged to engage in 'Taap Sahar', instilling in them the sense that they were still observing the fast.

As Iftar approached, it became a time of joyous celebration. Women would gather to perform the Rouph (a traditional Kashmiri dance), imbuing the atmosphere with the vibrant essence of our cultural heritage, keeping it alive and thriving.

Zareef pointed to a couple of factors leading to the fading charisma saying. Earlier, he said, society revolved around the Mohalla, where elders took it upon themselves to guide the youth by pointing out their mistakes.

"Over the time all that has changed and society has become individualistic."

As the holy month of Ramazan would draw to a close, the air would be filled with the melodious strains of traditional Kashmiri songs, echoing the joyous anticipation of Eid. With voices lifted in celebration, women would sing "Eid Aayi Ras Ras Edi Gah wasae waey," marking the arrival of this auspicious occasion. The call to gather at Eidgah resonated symbolizing not just the end of fasting but also the beginning of festivities and communal rejoicing.

After Ramazan women would often sing the following couplets-

Yeti haey Ous Ramzan Yeti Koutey Goum Shobwun Ramazan Yeti Koutuy Goum

Ramazan, the month of grace, where did it go Zareef opined that amidst the passage of time, what seems to have proliferated most is the rhetoric and noise from loudspeakers. He emphasizes that the call to Allah ought to be rendered in accordance with his prescribed manner, rather than being diluted by personal preferences or exces-

atmosphere would play a major role in Kashmiri society, but with the advent of mass communication, a kind of individualism has taken place.

"There has been a shift from collectivism to individualism; that is the reason people feel Ramazan has lost its charisma."

According to Dr Hussain, such changes are more prevalent and conspicuous in developed countries and as society progresses towards development, more changes will likely occur.

There are, however, embers of hope that flicker amidst the fading light. Mosques still see a surge in attendance during Ramazan, a testament to the enduring power of faith. People continue to provide sustenance for the less fortunate, reminding us of the core message of compassion and charity.

"No doubt the charisma of the holy month has been diminished in a sense but what is important is that faith has not been lost and people are observing fast in record numbers," Dr Hussain said.

"Ramazan for me is about connecting with my faith on a personal level. It's a different kind of togetherness. Maybe it's not the same as the old ways, but Ramazan still helps me focus on being a better person," Fatima, a university student said.

She expressed her nostalgia upon hearing Ramazan stories, reminiscing about the simplicity of life decades ago." We are more dependent on technology than ever before. Back then life would have been simple but beautiful."

The changing cultural sphere of Ramazan isn't necessarily negative, Adnan Subzar, 20, said. "Technology has actually brought us closer during Ramazan. There are special Ramazan groups on social media where we share recipes, inspirational quotes, and even organize iftars. We can't all physically gather for Suhoor or Iftar anymore, but video calls with cousins who live abroad make it feel like they're right here. While traditions might evolve, the sense of community definitely finds new ways to express itself."

The Union minister had retained the Udhampur Lok Sabha seat in 2019, defeating Congress candidate Vikramaditya Singh, the grandson of erstwhile Maharaja Hari Singh. In 2014, Jitendra Singh had defeated former Union minister Ghulam Nabi Azad from the Lok Sabha seat.

Lal Singh, who rejoined the Congress on March 20, had won the Udhampur seat twice on the party ticket in 2004 and 2009.

Saroori, vice chairman of Ghulam Nabi Azadled DPAP, is a former J-K minister who had won Inderwal assembly constituency in Kishtwar thrice between 2002 and 2014.

Polling will be held for the Udhampur-Kathua seat in the first phase on April 19, officials said.

As many as 16,23,195 registered voters --8,45,283 men, 7,77,899 women and 13 transgender persons -- will vote at 2,637 polling stations across the constituency which is spread over five districts of Kishtwar, Doda, Ramban, Udhampur and Kathua, the officials said.

For the next six years, PM Modi's goal is to raise per capita income to \$4,418 from around \$2,500, the document says, without specifying the spending or reforms needed to achieve that.

PM Modi's office and the finance ministry did not reply to requests seeking comment.

Independent economist Saugata Bhattacharya said doubling the economy by the end of the decade would be a "very difficult feat" requiring 6 per cent-6.5 per cent growth for the next seven years along with inflation of 4.5 per cent.

The economy is, however, expected to have grown by around 8 per cent in the last fiscal year ended March 31, the fastest among major countries, on the back of strong manufacturing and construction activity driven by government spending.

A former senior finance ministry official, Subhash Chandra Garg, said growth projections like those in the document are mostly based on "backward arithmetical calculations" and lack any "reform and investment plan".

"Usually such mental gymnastics based on arithmetic calculations and assumptions are meaningless unless there is serious reform and investment plan to test it for real economy dynamics," said Mr Garg, the Modi government's finance secretary until 2019.

The opposition Congress says India's economic growth in the past few years under PM Modi has done little to create jobs and alleviate rural distress, while the disparity between rich and poor has widened. The document says PM Modi's government wants exports of goods and services to jump to \$1.58 trillion by 2030 from around \$700 billion, which could double the share of Indian exports in global trade to more than 4 per cent.

The government also plans to focus on 70 areas of improvement including workforce skills and vocational training, critical demands of industry leaders who often complain about the skill levels of the labour force. It wants the literacy rate to rise to 82 per cent by 2030 from about 78 per cent now, unemployment to fall to less than 5 per cent from 8 per cent, and labour force participation rate to jump to more than 50 per cent from 46 per cent now.

PM Modi has said in rallies he needs to remain in power to implement measures to take India towards a developed economy by 2047, the 100th year of Independence, from mid-income levels now. He has not spelt out the measures.

Opinion polls show he will win big in the elections starting on April 19 and ending after seven phases on June 1, with vote counting on June 4.

A coalition led by PM Modi[†]s BJP could win nearly three-fourths of parliamentary seats, according to a survey on Wednesday, while the Congress could hit a record low.

He would be the first person since Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru to win three consecutive terms.

NC Will Win

after People's Democratic Party chief Mehbooba Mufti on Wednesday said the National Conference left her party with no option but to contest on three Lok Sabha seats, including Anantnag-Rajouri, in Kashmir.

The People's Democratic Party and the National Conference are both constituents of the opposition INDIA bloc.

"I am not the owner of the People's Democratic Party. Please go and ask them," Abdullah said when asked about Mehbooba's remarks.

Replying to another question about the National Conference's fate in Anantnag-Rajouri after Ghulam Nabi Azad, the Democratic Progressive Azad Party chief and former chief minister of the erstwhile state, threw his hat in the ring, Abdullah said, "Inshallah, we will win. I will give it to you in writing."

Abdullah on Wednesday chaired a meeting of National Conference workers the in Ramban district.

He also campaigned for the Congress candidate in the Udhampur-Kathua seat, saying, "We are standing strong in favour of the INDIA block to save the Constitution of India".

Calling the Lok Sabha elections a "collective fight" to protect India's Constitution and unity, he said, "They (BJP) want to scrap the Constitution of India on one side. On the other side are people who have put their lives at stake to save the Constitution. It is our collective fight to save India."

Abdullah warned against the dangers of division, saying, "If, today, we do not unite, we cannot save this nation."

He also criticised attempts to divide Muslims for votes, referencing the historical promise of reservation for Paharis.

"We have to show the country our collective power. They (BJP) are trying to promote one religion. How can they decide what you eat, how you dress? We will not be cowed," Abdullah said.

Reiterating his support for the Congress candidate in Udhampur-Kathua as the united choice against divisive forces, Abdullah urged people to vote for him to protect the country's values and identity.

"I have come here to request you to take a decision and fight against such forces unitedly. The Congress candidate is our united candidate. We have to vote for him to defeat those forces," he said.

his independent political stance, emphasising the need for self-reflection among these parties before casting aspersions.

"I have never taken any support. In (Prime Minister Narendra) Modi's time, I was the leader of opposition, not the minister. When I was chief minister, I did not get any support from the BJP. You know who those political parties are and they also must know that before pointing fingers at others, they should look at themselves first."

The PDP had a political alliance with the BJP, with both late Mufti Mohammed Sayeed and Mehbooba Mufti serving as chief ministers and Omar Abdullah of National Conference was a Minister of State in the Vajpayee-led government in 1999.

Azad criticised the practice of labelling opponents as A, B, or C teams, attributing it to fear and asserting the importance of voter choice in elections.

"... People who fear a particular person, they start attacking him. It's survival of he fittest. people vote for me, let them vote. Let them select who can represent them in the Parliament," he said. With the Supreme Court's directive to conduct assembly elections by September 30, Azad's decision to prioritise the Lok Sabha polls underscores his commitment to engaging with critical issues in the region which included complete restoration of statehood, land and job rights and electricity issues. On his decision to file nomination, Azad, who severed his five-decade-long ties with the Congress, reasoned that he was not sure when the assembly elections in Jammu and Kashmir will be held and hence decided to contest the Lok Sabha polls "I have one habit of taking risks and I've anoth-er habit of fighting from the front. I don't escape beyond the shadow of somebody else. I fight from the front, whatever the consequences may be," he asserted. He said that while his agenda was assembly elections but in-between so many developments had taken place and he thought parliamentary elections are approaching and he should focus on that first.

aligned with the BJP, Azad refuted these claims, asserting his independent stance and history of non-collaboration with the BJP during his tenures.

Asked about the allegation that the BJP is trying to divide the votes in (south) through DPAP, the veteran politician said he can pose a counter question to those leveling such allegations that they were cutting the votes of the DPAP.

Criticising the delimitation process in Jammu and Kashmir, Azad labeled it as impractical, particularly questioning the formation of the Anantnag-Poonch-Rajouri constituency, which he termed as a "non-practical exercise and done without any application of mind".

"I've been told that it was done on Google. Thank God, there are not the parts from the other side (Pakistan). If you're doing delimitation on the basis of Google, then God save us.

"It takes 18 hours to reach from Poonch district headquarters to Anantnag, including night halt. Which constituency in the world is where two areas are so far away from each other," he said.

On his electoral prospects from the newlycarved Lok Sabha seat, Azad said he welcomed all the political parties who were participating in the elections. "I want democracy to flourish and reach out to the public. Now the voters have more choices to elect their leader."

Besides restoration of statehood, he said the party would like to address the power crisis in Jammu and Kashmir.

"Thermal power projects are the need of the hour and this is the issue I want to raise in Parliament. Otherwise no industry will opt for this place."

Notable candidates from the constituency are Jugal Kishore Sharma from the BJP and Raman Bhalli from the Congress, indicating a diverse field of contenders vying for the parliamentary seat.

The entry of candidates like Shikha Bandral from the National Awami United Party and religious preacher Swami Divyanand adds further dimension to the electoral landscape.

Following delimitation, the Jammu parliamentary constituency now comprises 18 assembly constituencies, reflecting a significant voter base of 17.66 lakh spread across diverse regions. From Bishnah and Suchetgarh to Kalakot-Sunderbani, the constituency embodies the rich tapestry of Jammu's socio-political fabric.

The candidates can withdraw their nomination before 03:00 pm on April 08, 2024 in the office of Returning Officer. (inputs from KNO)

Allah would listen to their whispers as well. 55-year-old Jameela Akhtar said that cooking in kitchens during Ramazan has also evolved over the years. Busy lifestyles have led to an increase in the popularity of pre-packaged iftar items and ready-to-eat meals. "In earlier times, the air in the kitchen during Ramazan was filled with the aroma of home-cooked meals simmering with love and tradition. But now even a simpler dish as Phirni is available on streets," she said.

Jameela observed that the rise of social media platforms has brought both creativity and a downside to meal planning and presentation during Ramazan. While it has sparked innovation and experimentation, allowing individuals to share culinary creations, it has also fostered a culture of showmanship and comparison among people.

"There is this pressure to compete, to make everything look perfect. Sometimes, I miss the simpler times when we just cooked for the joy of it, not the likes."

"Whatever is cooked in households often finds its way onto social media platforms rather than being shared directly with neighbors," Jameela grinned.

Sociologists say that in every society change is inevitable, with reference to Ramazan they attribute the changing cultural sphere to a number of factors like modernisation, shifting family structures, globalisation, technological advancements etc.

Dr. Manzoor Hussain, Assistant Professor in the Department of Sociology at Kashmir University, said that some of these changes have occurred globally, leading to the diminishing charisma of the holy month.

He said that earlier people would take occasions like Iftar as group activities; over the course of a few decades, joint families have been changed into nuclear families but all that has changed owing to modernization.

"Iftar would provide a sense of community and belonging. Busy life, modernization, and globalization have played an important role in this aspect. The impact of modern education cannot be neglected." Dr Hussain said.

He further said that the neighborhood

From Traditional to Trendy: Kashmir's Apple Growers Embrace Exotic Varieties

SRINAGAR: A remarkable trend is unfolding in Kashmir with farmers and horticulturists embracing exotic apple plant vari-eties over traditional ones.

This surge in interest is reshaping the agricultural landscape of the region, known for its traditional apple cultivation.

In recent years, there has been a noticeable shift towards cultivating exotic varieties of apples, spurred by changing consumer preferences and evolving market dynamics.

Varieties, including Red Ve-lox, Pink Lady, Redlum Gala, Scarlet II, Golden Delicious and Jeromine, are ruling the roost in Kashmir these days.

These varieties, known for their distinctive flavors, textures, and extended shelf life. are increasingly finding favour among consumers both domestically and internationally.

Aarif Bhat, a progressive farmer from Baramulla district, shares his experience, "I have been cultivating traditional apple varieties for decades, but I decided to diversify my orchard by introducing exotic varieties. The response has been overwhelming, with buyers showing great interest in these apples."

The shift towards exotic apple varieties is not only driven by



consumer demand but also by economic factors. Farmers are recognizing the potential for higher returns associated with cultivating these premium varieties. "A box of Red Velox apples costs almost 30 percent more than the traditional variety. So, growers are increasingly shifting from traditional to exotic varieties to make more money," said Mohammad Shahbaz, an apple dealer.

As such various entrepreneurs have emerged in the valley who grow the nurseries of such varieties to sell growers during the season. "We grow varieties of apple

plants in the nursery. For the last five years we have been associated with the farming of these varieties and growers come from various districts to buy saplings

from our nursery," said Abdul Quyoom Bhat, an entrepreneur.

Pertinently, the government too is encouraging and promoting the high density apple plantation in Kashmir to grow the income of farmers. The department of horticul-

ture has set a target to bring 5500 hectares of land under the Modified High-Density Plantation Scheme in Jammu and Kashmir by 2026.

According to government figures, Kashmir exports more than 20 lakh metric tonnes of apples every year, and the horticulture industry is pegged to be worth around 9.000 to 10.000 crore including the employment it generates. Kashmir produces 75 per cent of the total apple production in the country.

'The relaxation to the age limit is a onetime exception and shall remain effective for the forthcoming academic session only," it reads.

Meanwhile, Director of School Education Jammu in a circular said that it received a number of representations from parents of some students stating that their wards are being denied admission in class 1st by the respec-

tive schools for the reason of being less than 06 years of age and hence Ineligible for admission as per the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020.

"The Issue has also been projected by some schools. The matter has been examined and it is felt that strict implementation of these provisions will lead to loss of academic year for some students who have already been admitted in pre-



however DSEJ said that an upper ceiling has to be fixed and the relaxation cannot be unending.

"It has accordingly been decided to gradually Implement the NEP and relax the age criteria for admission to class-1st for the academic session 2024-25, in view of the transition period," reads the circular.

IPL Records Highest Ever TV Viewership In First 10 Matches

MUMBAI: The Indian Premier League recorded a TV viewership of 35 crore in its first 10 matches, which is higher than any previous edition of the tournament including the seasons played during the COVID-19 pandemic, the event's official broadcaster claimed on Thursday.

As per BARC data released by Disney Star, the overall watchtime for the tournament has sky-rocketed to 8028 crore minutes which is 20 per cent higher than last year.

"We are overwhelmed with the record-breaking viewing figures for TATA IPL 2024. Disney Star has started the 17th season from where it left off last year, doubling down on fan-centred initiatives that seek to drive passion and fandom for the tournament," Sanjog Gupta, Head of Disney Star (Sports) said in a press release.

of any season. The watch-time minutes are a compilation of the time spent by each viewer in watching the game.

POLICE BUST MASSIVE IPL BET-TING OPERATION IN INDORE

The Indore police claimed to have busted a racket involving betting of crores of rupees on the ongoing Indian Premier League (IPL) cricket matches and arrested eight persons in this connection, an official said on Thursday.

Based on a tip-off, the eight persons were apprehended on Wednesday night from a flat in a multi-storey building in Lasudia area here in Madhya Pradesh when they were making people place bets online on the IPL matches through a website, Additional Deputy Commissioner of Police, Crime Branch, Rajesh Dandotia said.

The accused had obtained mobile phone SIM cards in fake names and used to take betting amounts from people through OR codes, the official said.

The police seized 22 mobile phones, 17 cheque books, five laptops, 21 bank passbooks and 31 ATM cards along with registers containing account of crores of rupees of online betting from their possession, he said.
