Srinagar: Two terrorists, including a top "commander" of Lashkar-e-Taiba offshoot TRF who was involved in several cases of killing of policemen and civilians, were eliminated by security forces in an encounter in Jammu and Kashmir's Kulgam district on Tuesday, officials said. One of the slain terrorists has

been identified as Basit Dar, an "A" category terrorist who belonged to The Resistance Front (TRF), according to Inspector General of Police (IGP), Kashmir, V K Birdhi.

He said security forces got inputs about the movement of terrorists in Redwani village following which a cordon and search operation was launched there on Monday night.

"There was firing from the other side," he told reporters in Kulgam.

Birdhi said the terrorists were given an opportunity to surrender, but they continued their firing on the security personnel.

Srinagar, the summer capital of Jammu & Kashmir recorded the hottest day of season at 29.2 degree Celsius while the winter capital of the Union territory, Jammu, has also recorded the hottest day of the season at 38.5 degree Celsius.

As per the details, all the stations across Kashmir have recorded the hottest day of the season with Qazigund recording 28.2 degree Celsius while Kupwara and Kokernag recorded 27.7 degree Celsius and 26.6 de-

> **Public Figures Liable For Misleading Ads: SC**

New Delhi: It is imperative for celebrities and public figures to act responsibly while endorsing a consumer product as advertisers and endorsers are equally responsible for issuing misleading advertisements, the Supreme Court said

on Tuesday. Clamping down on misleading advertisements, the apex court directed that before an advertisement is permitted to be issued. a self-declaration be ob-

tained from the advertisers on the line of the Cable Television Networks Rules, 1994.

Rule 7 of the 1994 rules deals with advertisement code and stipulates that advertisements carried in the cable service shall be designed to be in conformity with the laws and should not offend morality, decency and religious susceptibilities of the subscribers.

"We are of the opinion that advertisers, advertising agencies and endorsers are equally responsible for issuing false and misleading advertisements," a bench of

New All-In-One Vaccine May Prove Effective Against All Coronaviruses

A team of scientists from the world's leading universities have developed a new all-in-one vaccine that they hope can protect humans against a broad range of coronaviruses, including ones that are yet to emerge.

The research published in Nature Nanotechnology' on Monday is based on a new approach to vac-cine development called proactive vaccinology, where scientists build a vaccine before the diseasecausing pathogen even emerges, which has shown promising results in mice.

The study by the Universi-ties of Oxford and Cambridge in the UK and Caltech in the US says the vaccine works by training the body's immune system to recognise specific regions of eight different coronaviruses, including SARS-CoV-2 which caused the CO-VID-19 outbreak, and several that

are currently circulating in bats and have potential to jump to humans and cause a pandemic.

Our focus is to create a vaccine that will protect us against the next coronavirus pandemic, and have it ready before the pandemic has even started, said Rory Hills, a graduate researcher in the University of Cambridge's Department of Pharmacology and first author of the report.

For example, the new vaccine does not include the SARS-CoV-1 coronavirus, which caused the 2003 SARS outbreak, yet it still induces an immune response to that virus.

We've created a vaccine that provides protection against a broad range of different coronaviruses including ones we don't even know about vet, said Hills.

Key to its effectiveness is that the specific virus regions the vaccine targets also appear in many related coronaviruses. By train-



ing the immune system to attack these regions, it gives protection against other coronaviruses not represented in the vaccine, including ones that haven't even been identified yet.

We don't have to wait for new coronaviruses to emerge. We know enough about coronaviruses, and different immune

effective COVID vaccine during the last pandemic, but the world still had a massive crisis with a huge number of deaths. We need to work out how we can do even better than that in the future, and a powerful component of that is starting to build the vaccines in advance, he said.

The new Quartet Nanocage' vaccine is based on a structure called a nanoparticle a ball of proteins held together by incredibly strong interactions. Chains of different viral antigens are attached to this nanoparticle using a novel "protein superglue". Multiple antigens are included in these chains, which trains the immune system to target specific regions shared across a broad range of coronaviruses.

The latest study demonstrated that the new vaccine raises a broad immune response, even in mice that were pre-immunised with SARS-CoV-2.



From KO Archives Minister Gheroad In Pulwama Town

Villagers Cry For Bijli, Sadak, Pani Observer News Service

RINAGAR- Hundreds of people protesting against the lack of basic facilities in the Litar area of Pulwama staged a sit-in before the deputy commissioner's office on Monday and held the local MLA and minister of state for works hostage for several hours.

A large number of people from a number of villages adjacent of the Litar area converged on the Pulwama township on Monday morning, and held angry protests before the deputy commissioner's office.

The demonstrators said that the local hospital was seriously short of staff, the ration depots were empty, and there was no sign of electricity for the past one month while the roads were in an extremely bad shape. The slogan-shouting crowd spotted the local MLA and minister of state for R&B, Khalil Muhammad Bandh, in the premises, and instantly gheraoed him, denouncing him in their chants. They accused him of touring the area after being elected to the legislature, and showing no interest in the progress and development of the villages where, according to them, thousands of people were deprived of basic amenities.

When the minister got a chance to speak amid the barrage of accusations, he cited militancy as the reason for not having visited his home turf.

The reply infuriated his accusers who reminded him that every inch of Kashmir was affected by militancy, and asked whether that meant that developmental work was taking place nowhere.

Facing uncomfortable questions from his electorate for long embarrassing moments, the minister was finally rescued by the security personnel present on the scene and his personal guards who somehow managed to extricate him from the crush of the people.

Surge In Violence

he attack on the Indian Air Force convoy in Poonch comes as a grim reminder of the persistent threat that militancy poses to the region's security. Despite concerted efforts by security forces, militants continue to find ways to infiltrate the region and carry out attacks on security personnel and civilians. The Poonch attack followed the killing of a Village Defense Guard in Udhampur.

On Tuesday, security forces killed two militants including Basit Dar, an active operative of the Resistance Front (TRF) in Kulgam's Redwani area. Dar was on the 'most wanted list' of security agencies with a bounty of Rs 10 lakh on his head

The sudden surge in violence has taken place despite new data on militancy indicating a drastic reduction in the number of militants in the union territory. According to recent figures, 111 active militants are now operating in the region out of which just 40 are local youth. This is for the first time in years that the ratio of active militants in J&K has changed in favour of the foreigners. While the decline in the number of local militants will be regarded as a positive development by the security agencies, the rise in the influx of foreign militants is troubling. It once again points out the perennial challenge of fighting militancy in the Valley: when the local militancy is reigned in, foreign militants step in to fill up the shortfall. As a result, the militancy goes on

The rise of militancy in twin districts of Rajouri and Poonch in Jammu division, and which is largely led by foreign militants attests to this fact. More than a decade ago, the twin districts were declared free of militancy by the government. However, since October 2021, the region has witnessed a surge in militant attacks. Although an uneasy calm prevailed in Jammu in 2022, this year the region has once again become a hotspot for militancy, with around ten security personnel being killed in two ambushes. The dense forests of the region have made it difficult for security forces to trace them. The situation has been made even more concerning by the fact that the forest area where the militants are hiding extends to the districts in South Kashmir, which have been a hotbed of militancy in recent years.

That said, the militancy may be down but it is not out. And it is likely to linger on as long as the fresh recruitment and the infiltration continue to replenish the depleted militant ranks. And to achieve this, the government needs to also work on a political outreach in addition to a security approach which may not deliver results beyond a point.

ue to population growth and urbanisation, Srinagar city is expanding day by day. The areas located in Srinagar outskirts including the rural areas which are located on the tail ends of Budgam, Baramulla, Pulwama or Ganderbal are getting urbanised. The property rates in these areas have gone very high. The land in Rangil, Nagbal areas of Ganderbal district or Mirgund in Baramulla is not less than Rs 50 lakhs per kanal as on date. Similarly, the land rates in Kralpora, Gopalpora or Wathoora in Chadoora area of Budgam are also too high since the last 5 to 10 years.

As per 2035 Srinagar Master Plan, the total area limits of Greater Srinagar have been extended from 416 sq. km to 766 sq. km i.e.; 84% increase from the 2021 Master Plan limits. The areas include Srinagar Municipal Corporation, Cantonment Board and four municipalities of Budgam, Ganderbal, Pampore, Khrew towns- notified as the Local Area Limits of Srinagar Development Authority -SDA. These areas and small towns and villages located between 10 to 15 kms from Srinagar city centre Lal Chowk have been designated as Srinagar Metropolitan Region or SMR.

In this connection, the J & K Government passed an act around 6 vears back which is known as the Jammu and Kashmir Metropolitan Region Development Authorities Act, 2018. Under this act, two regional authorities are to be set up which will be known as Srinagar Metropolitan Region Development Authority-SMRDA and Jammu Metropolitan Region Development Authority -JMRDA. These authorities have been set up in Srinagar and Jammu but that is mostly paperwork only.

No full time CEOs ?

There are no full time Chief Executive Officers-CEOs for both the metropolitan authorities and the charge is held by the Commissioner Secretary Housing and Urban Development Department -HUDD J&K Govt. The Srinagar office of SMRDA operates from the office of Divisional Commissioner Kashmir who is designated as Additional CEO. An Executive Engineer posted in Sringgar Municipal Corporation -SMC has been given additional charge of SMRA. There is one Chief Accounts Officer and few clerical staff. As per the preamble of Jammu and Kashmir Metropolitan Region Development Authorities Act, 2018 this law has been enacted to provide for the establishment of Metropolitan Region Development Authorities, for the Metropolitan Regions of Jammu and Kashmir for the purposes of coordinating and supervising the proper, orderly and rapid development of the areas in such Regions and executing plans, projects and schemes for such development, and to provide for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto. These authorities are supposed to work for infrastructural development outside the municipal limits as per the master plan. The Infrastructure Development Work as per this act means development of infrastructure such as roads, water supply systems and water treatment, sewerage systems, sewerage treatment and disposal, drainage, electricity transmission and distribution systems, solid waste management facility, metro railway systems, piped natural gas, communications or such other urban infrastructure which connects two or more sectors, municipal colonies or villages or which provides for the infrastructure needs of the region. The Metropolitan Region Development Authority shall be deemed to be a local authority within the meaning of the term "Local Authority" as defined in General Clauses Act 1897.



There are many areas in Srinagar outgrowths which neither come under SMC nor other local bodies and these areas are included under Srinagar Metropolitan Region Development Authority. This authority has to execute works in these areas through different executing agencies but that isn't happening

Development, Minister for Transport, Members of Parliament in the Metropolitan Region, Minister of State for Housing and Urban Development, Mayor of the Municipal Corporation concerned, Presidents of the Municipal Committees and Municipal Council within the Metropolitan Region. The Chairpersons of the District Planning and Development Boards in the Metropolitan Region are also members of this authority along with Four Members of the Legislative Assembly, representing constituencies falling wholly or partly within the limits of the Metropolitan Region, to be nominated by the Government. The other members include

Chief Secretary, Administrative Secretary, Housing and Urban Development Department, Chief Executive Officer-CEO. Divisional Commissioner and Inspector General of Police of the respective Region, Municipal Commissioner of the Municipal Corporation within the Capital City along with experts of eminence, not exceeding six, as the Government may from time to time nominate from the field of urban infrastructure, public administration, finance, management, urban forestry, environment, engineering, town planning. Vice-Chairperson(s)/ Chief Executive Officer(s) of the Development Authorities and Deputy Commissioner(s) of the District(s) falling in the Metropolitan Region. The Chief Minister of the Union territory of Jammu and Kashmir shall be the Chairperson and the Chief Executive Officer-CEO shall be the Member-Secretary of the Authority.

ropolitan Region Development Authorities Act, 2018 says that the Government shall appoint a Chief Executive Officer-CEO for the Authority who shall be an officer not below the rank of PrincipalSecretary to the Government. The Government on a request being made by the Executive Committee, appoints one or more Additional/Deputy/ Assistant Chief Executive Officers who shall be officer(s) not below the rank of Secretary/Special Secretary/Additional Secretary to the Government. As of now the charge of CEO is held by the Commissioner Secretary to Govt HUDD but the officer is not of the rank of Principal Secretary to Government.

Powers and Functions of the Authority

The main objective of this act as per section 14 is to secure the development of the Metropolitan Region according to the Development Plan and for that purpose, the functions of the Authority is as under:

- (i) To review any physical, financial and economic plan any project or scheme for development which may be proposed or may be in the course of execution or may be completed in the Metropolitan Region
- (iii) To formulate Schemes for the development of the Metropolitan Region or any part thereof and to execute projects and schemes
 (v) To recommend to the Government any matter or proposal requiring action by the Government or any other authority for the overall development of the Metropolitan Region and to participate with any other authority for inter-regional development
- (vii) To finance any project or scheme for the development of the Metropolitan Region and to coordinate execution of the projects or schemes for the development of the Metropolitan Region and to supervise or otherwise ensure adequate supervision over the planning and execution of any project or scheme, the expenses of which, in whole or in part, are to be met from the Metropolitan Region Development Fund.
- (x) To prepare schemes and advise the concerned authorities in formulating and undertaking schemes for development of social economic and industrial

The power of compounding will work its magic, and you will soon be earning Rs 2 lakh per month without having to lift a finger after 20 years , regular income , that's called planning , wise investment.

It is about having the patience to let our money grow, rather than constantly chasing the next big thing.

Hallmarks of a Great Teacher

The teacher has a central role in shap-ing the future of the child and the smooth progression and transition of the child towards actualization of his innate potential is largely attributed to the efforts laid down by the teachers .The role of teacher nowadays is no more confined to be the facilitator of transmission of black and white information within the four walls of the classroom. Infact he has a multifaceted role keeping in mind the challenges thrown by the 21st century. To prepare the modern day learner to effectively embrace the challenges of 21st century, it is the core responsibility of the 21st century teacher to create a sort of conducive learning atmosphere which in the long run can materialize the acquisition of 21st skills in modern day learner: be it critical thinking, creativity, collaboration and communication. It is imperative on the part of the teacher to update and fine polish his pedagogical skills to render his students viable and competitive as per need and demand of 21st century

Essential Ingredients of a good teacher: In the current scheme of global compulsions, a teacher has the most arduous job to ensure his learners get grossly engaged in learning activities designed and executed by the teacher. In the meaningful classroom teaching -learning transaction, the teacher must have well thought out strategy to arouse interest and 'readiness to learn' among learners. Once the learner is motivated to learn, the job of the teacher becomes easier to disseminate the requisite knowledge with reasonable expectation of attainment of desired learning outcomes. What goes into the making of an exceptional teacher ? What are the hallmarks of a great teacher?

The prerequisite ingredients of a good teacher are:

1)

Learners as co-creators of knowledge: Teachers have to shun the obsolete notion of being the sole figure in the classroom and have to equally accommodate the learners as pivotal and relevant stakeholders of teaching -learning transaction. To remain relevant in the eyes of modern day learner, teacher has to move away from 'Chalk and Talk method' to certainly a more inclusive approach. Modern day learners are no more empty vessels to be filled with the content irrelevant to their lives. NEP 2020 and National Curricular Framework for school Education 2023 (NCFSE 2023) strongly emphasizes on shifting from behaviorist model of teaching learning to constructivist model of teaching –learning . The constructivist model of teaching learning vociferously advocates for considering students as co-creaters of new knowledge rather than mere recipients of black and white information, where in the role of the teacher is to ignite the mind of the learner and create a conducive learning environment: The learner in the thriving and enabling environment will construct new knowledge based on prior knowledge. This will truly catalyze in finding solution to most daunting and burning issues both locally and globally: be it climate change, solid waste management drug mena cyber security, financial fraud etc.

journey. Educators must engage in their own learning and then only they can visualize its replication among their learners. A modern era teacher is expected to have in depth understanding not only in his/her subject but in other subjects as well. NEP 2020 strongly denounces hard separation of subjects and prioritizes multi-disciplinary approach. Modern day educator is left with no choice but to read diverse literature to evolve himself / herself as real repository of knowledge. Great teachers are not born, but made. The process is long and herculean but the outcome is rewarding .While grounded in their own respective disciplines, the teachers need to be acutely conscious that knowledge is whole and therefore , undertake inter - and multidisciplinary projects

pedagogy: Teachers are supposed to experiment with their pedagogical tools to render teaching -learning process fun-centric and desirable learning outcome based. Teachers need to take risks in the academic ventures and should not shy away from trying out different methodologies to teach a particular concept .Teacher should not shun innovation for the fear of failure. A versatile teacher is the one who is willing to 'take the road less travelled by' despite potential threats and failures when it comes to designing and executing innovative teaching - learning strategies .

studies and research problems .Case study is truly a dynamic learning methodology as it involves asking students to delve into complex real -world issues and encourages them to propose viable solutions. If executed in its real spirit, case studies can act as a potent tool for learning across diverse disciplines. Case studies act as a crucial link between theoretical knowledge and its practical application, fostering an engaging and stimulating learning experience. Practising teachers strive to find answers to classroom problems through action research projects needs to overwhelmingly welcomed.

Mastery over Technological tools : The hallmark feature of the 21st century teacher is the in -depth know how of technological tools to be employed in classroom setting for effective teaching -learning transaction. To render himself as an effective teacher, he has to acquaint himself with all the digital interventions in the realm of education and has to continuously hone and update his technological skills. The teacher being the facilitator has to regulate a fine balance between the traditional pedagogical approach and technological in-build pedagogy. In the era of Artificial intelligence (AI), where Augmented reality(AR) and virtual reality (VR) have literally disrunted the landscape of educ and are setting the tone of new educational discourse , therefore a teacher can not merely relay on past traditional practices and has to find a way to make space for blended mode of learning (hybrid mode of learning).

Self reflection: Self reflection on part of the teacher is truly a catalyzing tool in the hands of teacher to delve deep in introspecting the achievements and the grey areas where he further needs to improve .Versatile teachers regularly reflect on their professional and academic pursuits. They constantly need to ask themselves: did my students learn anything today? Is there any area I could have done better? Was pedagogic strategy appro-priate and fruitful? Did I collect my students feedback and thoroughly analyzed it? This kind of introspection and self-reflection will definitely enable teachers to look back and forth and become better educators. A teacher on the other hand , who does not introspect on his/her everyday academic pursuits lacks the propulsion to move forward.

Are You a Perfectionist?

When a job interviewer asks, "What's your greatest weakness?" many job seekers think the most strategic answer is, "I'm a perfectionist."

Yes, workers who are perfectionistic tend to exhibit a variety of positive traits, like being honest, loyal, attentive to detail, and conscientious.1 But perfectionism comes with many negative effects that harm a workplace and cause an organization's productivity to slow to a grinding halt. In other words, it's not the savvy interview response interviewees think it is.

There are a variety of ways that perfectionism prevents workers from advancing in their careers. Below are three overarching categories of negative characteristics of perfectionism that disrupt the workplace and obstruct a worker's career progression.

1. Dysfunctional Emphasis Framework

The Emphasis Framework characterizes the ways in which we allocate effort and value to life's tasks.2 The framework is characterized by three types of effort/value allocation: Emphasis A, B, and C. Emphasis A refers to an "all out" approach—we give the task everything we've got because it's important to us (consistent with our values). For example, if we are trying to get licensed as a Speech Language Therapist, we might opt to use an Emphasis A approach to study for the licensing exam because of its importance to our career.

Emphasis B, on the other hand, is the "git 'er done" strategy. Effort needs to be sufficient to get the task completed but not necessarily with excellence. The finished product doesn't need to be superb, but it doesn't need to be awful, either. Most tasks in life necessitate an Emphasis B strategy.

Emphasis C is the "don't do it at all" strategy—the decision not to allocate any attention to a task. In a healthy emphasis framework, Emphasis C is strategic. We opt not to complete a task because it's not important to us and isn't worth our resources. For example, we might choose not to open our junk mail because we don't see the value in doing so. There's an appropriate time

and place for all three of these effort strategies; there is no inherent judgment to any of them. The approach we choose for a given task in a given circumstance is based on our val-

ues and needs.

Here's the problem with perfectionists—they try to use Emphasis A for everything. Non-perfectionists have a higher use of Emphasis B relative to Emphasis A, whereas the perfectionist exhibits the reverse. Trying to adopt Emphasis A for everything is impossible, as there just isn't enough time or resources.

Perfectionists have a difficult time discerning which emphasis strategy to use, default to Emphasis A as a result, and then have a hard time switching to a different strategy (because of cognitive rigidity-see the section below). When we try to use Emphasis A for everything, we inevitably fail and need to delay or avoid other tasks. That is, tasks from Emphasis A get forced to Emphasis C. When this happens, instead of our values and needs determining our Emphasis C selection, it's the perfectionism doing so.

A dysfunctional emphasis 2. Cognitive

framework sabotages workplace well-being and functioning because of all this. Deadlines are chronically missed, and tasks don't get completed due to avoidance and procrastination.3 This pattern also saps worker productivity.

The dysfunction in emphasis selection also occurs in plan-

ning tasks, which is called process paralysis. Perfectionists want to identify the optimal strategy for completing tasks or the ideal order of operations for completing tasks. They get stuck landing on the "perfect" strategy and as a result never even get started on the required task in the first place.

In addition, others in the workplace get sucked into the pattern via safety behaviors.3 These refer to the coping techniques perfectionists use to calm their anxiety, such as seeking considerable reassurance from others (e.g., "Does this email sound okay?"), excessively creating overly detailed lists, checking their work for the gazillionth time, and seeking deadline extensions and other exceptions (read: special treatment). These types of behaviors rope in everyone around the perfectionist and cause exhaustion and resentment.

2. Cognitive Rigidity

Of all the features of perfectionism, this is probably its hallmark characteristic.3 Cognitive rigidity refers to difficulties with shifting mindsets. It's an inflexible approach to life. We might get stuck on a perspective or with using a behavior and have a difficult time pivoting to new ones, even in the face of evidence suggesting that we do so. This can look like stubbornness or narrowmindedness. Often this means that perfectionists get stuck in the details of a task and have a difficult time zooming out to see the big picture. Sometimes this cognitive ri-

gidity takes the form of getting overfocused on rules instead of prioritizing the underlying principles that undergird those rules. In fact, a perfectionist might even get stuck abiding by a rule, even at the expense of the underlying principle.

For example, they might get stuck making sure there are no errors in their work before submitting (the rule: "check your work for errors before turning it in"), even if this causes them to miss the deadline and not get the project completed on time (e.g., the principle: "produce quality work"). In this case, the perfectionist was so stuck on the rule of not turning in a product with errors that they undermined the underlying principle of producing quality work (i.e., the work never got produced because it was not submitted on time).

Cognitive rigidity can be devastating for a perfectionist's career. It's associated with less creativity and inis hyper-focused on rules and tends to struggle with flexing rules as needed. Because of their inflexibility, perfectionists tend to be seen by others as stubborn and unaffected by evidence contradicting their viewpoints and behavior. They often struggle to change based on feedback. When workers with perfectionism get stuck in the details, they often miss big-picture concepts that drive important business needs.

3. Other-Oriented Moralism

Sometimes perfectionism presents in an other-oriented manner; perfectionistic expectations are projected outward and applied to others.3 This means holding other people in the workplace to excessive and rigid standards. This is especially problematic when holding others to rigid and excessive moral standards.

When this type of tendency shows up, it can look a lot like the perfectionist policing others in the workplace when it's not their job to do so. They can come across as self-righteous, and coworkers feel like they must walk on eggshells around them. Coworkers often try to avoid this type of perfectionistic peer and see it as a major source of job dissatisfaction. In other words, other-oriented moralism can create a highly toxic work environment and result in tremendous damage to a team dynamic.

Conclusion

Perfectionism is a complex construct; it comes with good qualities (e.g., loyalty, conscientiousness) but also many characteristics that adversely affect the office environment. Three areas of perfectionism in particular drive much of the damage to a career trajectory: a dysfunctional emphasis framework, cognitive rigidity, and other-oriented moralism. These three not only impair a perfectionist's ability to progress in their career, but they also disrupt the entire workplace.

Luckily, there are strategies that can help perfectionists and those who work with them. A future post will delve into some of these strategies, or you can get a comprehensive overview in my new book, Flawed.2 In the meantime, please consider the pitfalls of perfectionism in the career advancement process and remember that "I'm a perfectionist" might be a more loaded job interview response than we realize.

been retrieved, but the search operation is going on," he said.

Describing Dar's killing as a significant achievement, Birdhi said he was involved in 18 cases including in Srinagar city.

"He was involved in the killing of police personnel and innocent civilians.He was involved in planning and carrying out attacks including on minority community members,' the IGP added.

In 2022, the National Investigation Agency (NIA) announced a bounty of Rs 10 lakh on Dar.

"He was an A category terrorist carrying a bounty of Rs 10 lakh on his head from the NIA with separate reward from the Police. Basit was active since 2021. He was involved in over 18 cases including attacks on security forces and minority members in Srinagar and South Kashmir," the IGP said.

The second terrorist was identified as Faheem, a hybrid terrorism cum Over Ground Worker (OGW) from Redwani, Payeen area of south Kashmir's Kulgam.

The IGP said that police will not allow anyone to disrupt the peaceful atmosphere and election festivity in Kashmir. "We are alert and ready to foil all nefarious attempts," he said.

Search Ops The agencies have also expanded the scope of operation to various areas of Doda, Udhampur, and Kathua districts to track down two groups of terrorists involved in the killing of a village defence guard (VDG) in the Basangarh area on April 28.

Terrorists targeted an Indian Air Force (IAF) convoy in the Shaistar area of Poonch district, resulting in the killing of an IAF corporal and injuries to four others on Saturday.

Armed with surveillance equipment, including drones and sniffer dogs, the search operation, which entered the fourth day on Tuesday, has been intensified in Shahsitar, Gursai, Sanai, Lasana, and Sheendara top in the Surankote belt and adjoining areas in Poonch district, officials said.

While some dense forest areas have been scanned and routes towards Kashmir have been plugged, there has been no trace of the terrorists involved in the attacks so far, they added.

Twenty-two people have been detained for questioning and the authorities are reviewing some CCTV footage for leads, they said.

Posters offering a cash reward of Rs 20 lakh for any information leading to the arrest of the two individuals, believed to be the prime suspects, have been put up in Surankote, they said.

In Rajouri, security forces have launched a fresh search operation and put troops on alert following reports of suspected movement of two people in Sada and Kandi areas that have been cordoned off.

Security measures have been tightened with increased checking of vehicles on busy roads, especially on the Jammu Rajouri-Poonch national highway, which is vital for the twin districts of Rajouri and Poonch -part of the Anantnag parliamentary constituency going to polls on May 25, they said.

On April 28, a village defence guard (VDG) was killed in a brief encounter with terrorists in the remote Panara village in Udhampur district.

Security agencies have expanded the scope of the search operation to various areas of Doda, Udhampur, and Kathua districts to track down the terrorists.

The awareness campaign with the initiative 'Cast Vote and Eat Ice-Cream Free' was organised in Hubballi city. Likewise, food establishments in Maharashtra offered discounts to customers who simply showed an ink mark on their fingers, indicating they'd voted.

Prominent leaders contesting today's poll battle included Union Home Minister Amit Shah, former Madhya Pradesh chief ministers Shivraj Singh Chouhan and Digvijaya Singh, Civil Aviation Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia, Union Health Minister Mansukh Mandaviya, Samajwadi Party leader Dimple Yadav, and NCP (SP) leader Supriya Sule, among others.

Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Assam, West Bengal, Bihar, Dadra and Nagar Haveli, Daman and Diu, Karnataka, Uttar Pradesh, Goa and Chhattisgarh are the States /UTs where polling took place in this phase. Voting in the Anantnag-Rajouri PC in Jammu and Kashmir was rescheduled to Phase 6. Also, Surat PC in Gujarat did not go to the polls as the candidate was elected unopposed. The next phase (phase 4) polling is scheduled on May 13, 2024, in 96 constituencies in 10 States/UTs. In the 2019 general election, the BJP won 72 of the 93 seats that go to the polls today. The counting of votes will be held on June 4. (ANI)

PM Modi said the conduct of elections in India and their management can be a learning process for other democracies, and added that leading universities in the world should carry out a case study on the country's polls. He also underlined the importance of voting as he called it a special gift.

PM Modi, who arrived in Ahmedabad on Monday night, reached the polling booth at Nishan Public School in Ranip locality of Ahmedabad city soon after polling began at 7 am, and cast his vote. Shah accompanied the

PM when he arrived there to cast his vote. Modi greeted people, gave autographs to them on his way to the polling booth. He shook hands with many members of the public. He also lifted a baby girl who was being carried by her mother in the crowd and spent some light moments with the child. A woman from the crowd tied a 'rakhi' to him as a token of sisterly affection.

Before entering the polling booth, the prime minister bowed down to his elder brother Somabhai Modi. He cast his vote after getting his finger inked.

After coming out of the polling booth, Modi waved to the crowd and showed his inked finger.

Modi is a registered voter from Ranip area Somabhai Modi lives near Nishan School, which falls under Sabarmati assembly segment of Gandhinagar Lok Sabha constituency.

Talking to reporters later, the PM appealed to people to come out in large numbers to vote.

"Matdaan samanya daan nahi. Hamare desh main daan ka mahatva hai (Voting is not a common gift. In our country, a lot of importance is attached to giving donations). People of the country should vote in large numbers keeping this feeling in their hearts," Modi said.

India's pride," Shah told media persons after casting his votes.

"Choose a government that is against corruption, that wants to eradicate poverty, make a self-reliant, developed India, and wants to take India to number one in every field in the entire world," he said.

constituent of the opposition INDIA bloc. "INDI alliance partners are not bothered about the fate of masses...they are fighting elections to save their dynasty," Modi maintained, targeting the opposition.

He sought to know whether a concept like vote jihad" was acceptable in a democracy.

"Terrorists in Pakistan are threatening jihad against India. And here, those in the Congress have also announced to do vote jihad against Modi...that means people of a particular religion are being asked to vote unitedly against Modi. Imagine what level the Congress has stooped to," he said.

The BJP stalwart asked the crowd, "Do you accept the concept of vote jihad? Can this thing work in a democracy? Does the Indian Constitution allow this?"

The PM alleged the Congress had terrible intentions and quoted statements made by party leaders.

"To understand this, you will have to listen to people who have been Congress workers and leaders for 20-25 years and are now leaving the party. A woman (leader) recently said after she went to the Ram temple, she was harassed so much that she had to leave the Congress," Modi said.

Another person who left the Congress said the party has been "captured by the Muslim League and Maoists," he stated.

"Another leader who left the Congress exposed another deep conspiracy, saying the shehzada (prince) of Congress intends to overturn the Supreme Court's decision on the Ram Temple like his father did in the Shah Bano case," he said.

In 1985, the Supreme Court ruled in favour of Shah Bano, a Muslim woman from Indore who had sought maintenance from her husband after divorce, but the then-Congress government under PM Rajiv Gandhi overturned the judgement through an Act.

The PM alleged the main opposition party's "love for Pakistan" is reaching its peak after every phase of voting and added "There is a competition among Congress people over (making) anti-national statements.'

"A former Congress CM said our Army carries out terrorist attacks, Pakistan is innocent. Look at the shamelessness of another big Congress leader, who said Pakistan had no role in the Mumbai terror attacks (26/11)," he noted.

A leader of another Congress ally threatens India, saying Pakistan is not wearing bangles, he further said.

"I ask the prince of Congress (a reference to Rahul Gandhi) what is the intention of your colleagues who are speaking (like that)? Why so much love for Pakistan and so much hatred for our Army? That's why people say – Congress ka haath (Congress' hand)...," he said to which members of the gathering added "Pakistan ke saath" (with Pakistan).

He said, "They think that by showing their love for Pakistan, they will consolidate their vote-bank but it will be hard for them to save their deposits".

The top BJP leader alleged the Congress wanted to plunder people's property and tinker with the reservation in jobs and education given by B R Ambedkar, the chief architect of the Constitution.

473 Postal Ballots

Casting votes through the postal ballots is exclusively for Kashmiri Pandit voters who have been living their life in exile and Election Commission of India (ECI) has kept a special provision for them to vote through postal ballots.

Giving details, an official associated with the electioneering process said that the postal ballot process was completed today and these ballots have been sent to the RO (Deputy Commissioner Srinagar).

"Apart from these postal ballots, more than 13000 Kashmiri Pandit voters are registered for Srinagar Parliamentary constituency who will be exercising their franchise in 23 polling stations established in different parts of Jammu," the official informed.

The ECI has established 21 polling stations for KP voters in Jammu but two auxiliary polling stations have been established by the local authorities as two polling stations have more than 1500 votes and as per the laid guidelines these auxiliary polling stations needed to be established.

The Srinagar parliamentary constituency will be going for polls on May 13 during the fourth phase of elections and the main contest for this seat is between National Conference's Aga Ruhullah Mehdi, Peoples Democratic Party's Waheed-ur-Rehman Parra and J&K Apni Party's Muhammad Ashraf Mir. (KNO)

there (Kargil) because we clearly told our colleagues in Kargil that if we have to support anyone and help anyone to win, it should be Congress candidate T Namgyal.

He said the NC's colleagues in Kargil unfortunately did not accept it and decided to leave the party en masse. Expressing regret over the development, he said he had repeatedly visited Kargil after 2019 and rebuilt the NC there with a lot of difficulty.

The entire Kargil unit of the NC on Monday resigned from the party saying the party high command was pressurising them to support Congress candidate Namgyal.

Qamar Ali Akhoon, who was the additional general secretary and party in-charge for Kargil, said the political and religious organisations in Kargil had decided to support independent candidate Haji Hanifa for the Lok Sabha election. He said it was not possible for him to go against the "local consensus".

Under the seat-sharing agreement between the Congress and the NC, the two parties had agreed to field three candidates each for the six Lok Sabha seats in Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh. While the NC has fielded candidates on three seats in the Kashmir valley, the Congress has fielded its candidates on two seats in Jammu and one in Ladakh.

Information and Broadcasting. Regarding advertisements in the print media, the bench said the ministry shall create a portal within four weeks and advertisers shall file self-declaration before issuing any advertisements.

The bench said the proof of filing self-declaration has to be made available by the advertiser to the broadcaster or publisher.

It also asked the health ministry to file an affidavit regarding complaints received from 2018 onwards by the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India on misleading advertisements concerning food products and also details of action taken or proposed to be taken on them.

The bench referred to the Central Consumer Protection Authority guidelines including those related to children-targeted advertisements and duties of the manufacturer, service provider, advertiser and advertising agency.

It also perused the affidavits filed by the ministries of Ayush, consumer affairs and information and broadcasting.

During the hearing, the bench questioned the Centre over an August 29, 2023 letter by the Ministry of Ayush asking the licensing authorities not to initiate or take any action under rule 170 of Drugs and Cosmetics Rules, 1945.

"How can you say that don't implement a law till it is a good law?" the bench asked,

adding, "It is glaring". The bench told Additional Solicitor General K M Nataraj that the ministry shall "forthwith" withdraw the August 29 last year letter. Referring to the affidavit filed by the min-

istry of information and broadcasting, the bench said it has given data about the action taken on complaints received against TV channels since 2018 till May 3 this year.

"A summary of action taken against broadcasters for violation of advertising code since 2018 shows a dismal picture," it said.

During the hearing, the bench observed there should be a proper and effective procedure for consumers to lodge their complaints regarding misleading advertisements.

'When we say consumer is king.. what if the consumer becomes simply a complainant and does not know what is happening to his complaint?" the bench asked.

Observing that it is looking at the matter with a point of view of the consumer, the bench said if there is a system in place, it should work effectively.

The bench observed advertisement is a "paid commercial venture" and has nothing to do with the freedom of press.

"You can't mute the press. At the same time, there has to be a balance," it said.

The bench also asked the counsel for the states and Union Territories to file affidavits of the relevant licensing authority regarding action taken by them in respect of misleading advertisements published or displayed which run contrary to the Drug and Magic Remedies (Objectionable Advertisements) Act, 1954 and rules, the Drug and Cosmetics Act, 1940 and the Consumer Protection Act, 1986.

The Uttarakhand State Licensing Authority (SLA) had earlier told the top court that manufacturing licenses of 14 products of Patanjali Ayurved Ltd and Divya Pharmacy have been suspended with immediate effect.

During the hearing on Tuesday, the bench asked the counsel appearing for Patanjali as to what they have done to withdraw the advertisements of these products.

The bench said advertisements of these products were still available on the internet, websites and channels.

The Shimoga Zilla Panchayat in Karnataka unveiled a polling booth that has majestic thrones reserved for voters. Mooting the idea that in a democracy, citizens are the lords, the unique polling station has put up thrones for voters, depicting them as kings and queens. Also, the proprietors of an ice cream shop in the Hubbali city of Dharwad offered ice creams free of charge paigning will go on for almost three weeks and four more phases of voting will be held, he said.

"As a voter from Gujarat, I have been voting from here (Nishan School) for the last many years, and our Amitbhai (Shah) is the candidate of BJP from here," Modi said.

"Today is the day of celebrations of democracy. I will congratulate the Election Commission, security forces and officials involved in conducting the first two phases of polls almost violence-free. In the past, violence during elections was very common," he said.

Special Judge for CBI and ED matters Kaveri Baweja extended Kejriwal's custody after the AAP leader was produced before the court through a video conference on the expiry of his remand granted earlier.

Kejriwal was arrested on March 21 and is currently lodged in Tihar Jail under judicial custody.

On April 9, the Delhi High Court had upheld Kejriwal's arrest, saying there was no illegality and the ED was left with "little option" after he skipped repeated summonses and refused to join the investigation.

The matter relates to alleged corruption and money laundering in the formulation and execution of the Delhi government's nowscrapped excise policy for 2021-22.

SRINAGAR: The Ministry of Education (MoE) has asked the Jammu and Kashmir School Education Department to reassess the 'previously approved education labs' that were permitted years before the Samagra Shiksha scheme here.

Besides, the ministry further directed to develop a list of proposed new roles that could be created in accordance with the requirements.

According to the official documents available with the news agency, MoE while reviewing the skill education said, "It was observed that a total of 1315 skill education labs were approved to the UT, out of which 553 are functional and 762 are pending in the UT of Jammu and Kashmir including the pre-Samagra Shiksha years." Further, the MoE empha-

sized that the National Education Policy 2020 underscores the importance of skill education for all students, especially

those in the secondary stage of schooling.

"States and UTs are urged to reassess these previous approvals in light of the changing job roles and develop a list of proposed new roles that could be created in accordance with the requirements," it reads.

In the meantime, MoE said that displaying photographs of teachers is one of the priority areas of the 3rd Chief Secretaries Conference for addressing the issue of proxy teachers and teacher absenteeism.

"It was underlined that this is a continuous process and the photographs of teachers should be displayed in a public area in the school premises. Moreover, provision should be there in the schools where the photographs are displayed for changing the photographs in case of transfer or retirement of a teacher," MoE said-(KNO)

Traffic To Hold Lok Adalat For Pending Violations On May 11

SRINAGAR: As a concerted effort to tackle the mounting issue of pending traffic violations, the Special Mobile Magistrate Traffic Court Kashmir has announced Lok Adalat for May 11.

A closer examination of the challan data by the news agency, has shown thousands of individuals have been asked to address their pending challans. These infractions encompass a wide spectrum of offences with fines ranging from a nominal Rs. 100 to Rs 10,000 and beyond per person. Further, the data showed some

individuals find themselves with as many as 12, 10 or 9 outstanding challans, signifying recurrent violations of traffic laws. The cumulative sum of fines accrued by these offenders is estimated to run into lakhs.

The Lok Adalat serves as the final recourse for individuals burdened with multiple pending traffic challans. "Failure to appear on the specified date could result in the drastic measure of recommending the cancellation of vehicle registration certificates (RCs) for the violators," reads an official public notice, issued by Traffic Police Rural Kashmir, as accessed by KNO.

"In emphasizing the paramount importance of adhering to traffic regulations, the court underscores the critical role of motorists in maintaining road safety. All summoned individuals are urged to ensure their presence on the designated date to resolve their pending challans," it reads further-(KNO)

Man Killed Over Land **Dispute In Jammu**

JAMMU: The Jammu and Kashmir police has stepped up their efforts in the ongoing investigation into the murder of a person over a land dispute here and have conducted multiple raids at the residences of suspects, officials said on Wednesday.

The incident occurred on May 1, when Avtar Singh (40), son of Balbir Singh, was hit on his head with an iron rod and died because of excessive bleeding during a scuffle between two groups, who staked their claim over the piece of land in Greater Kailash locality. An angry mob, including the family and relatives of the deceased, blocked Kalu-Chak road

probe into the killing, police said. "Continuing crackdown on suspects and accused involved in the Greater Kailash murder case, police seized two vehicles involved in the commission of crime along with raids at houses of suspects to affect their arrest, " a police spokesman said.

He said that the police examined the CCTV footage of the area around the crime spot and digitally picked up relevant evidence, he said

Police remain committed to solving the crime and attacking its root causes, he said.

Eight people have been detained in connection with the case so far, he said. Two police officials were suspended in connection with the murder and a departmental inquiry was ordered.

Rohit Sharma Advised To Consider Sabbatical Ahead Of T20I World Cup

MUMBAI: Former Australia captain Michael Clarke does not read much into Rohit Sharma's string of poor scores, but suggests that the "fatigued" Indian skipper take a break to freshen up ahead of the T20I World Cup.

Rohit, who will lead India in the next month's 20-team global showpiece, has four single-digit scores in his last five outings for his franchise Mumbai Indians in the ongoing IPL.

The 37-year-old has had a busy season this year with an intense five-Test series preceding the IPL for Mumbai Indians, who are all but eliminated from the race to the playoffs this year. "Rohit, being the wise judge of his own performances, will undoubtedly be disappointed,

especially considering his strong start. In my view, he might be feeling a bit fatigued as well," Clarke told

Star Sports. "A break to freshen up could do wonders for him, but as the Indian captain and a key player for Mumbai Indians, you're not getting a break. He's going to have to find form," Clarke continued

Rohit played as an impact substitute in their match against Kolkata Knight Riders last week, raising some concerns for the Indian camp. However, he played a full game against Sunrisers Hyderabad three days later.

Clarke said it is only a matter of time before Rohit gets back to his usual elements as a batter. "He was in a great mood. He's happy, which is a really good sign. He doesn't seem to be struggling with

his timing; it's just a matter of getting out," he said. "With someone like Rohit, it's only a matter of time before he finds his form again. Hopefully, he stresses less and focuses on his game because he's too talented to keep missing out. He's at his best when he's timing the ball, rather than trying to force it,' he added.

Clarke, meanwhile, also had praise in store for Rohit's deputy for the World Cup and MI skipper Hardik Pandya, who returned with 4-0-31-3 in their seven-wicket win over SRH on Monday.

"In the last couple of games, he's been taking wickets with his bowling, making some adjustments along the way. For an all-rounder, success in one department boosts confidence across the board," Clarke said.

England Fans Told To Use 'Common Sense' At Euro 2024

LONDON: English police said soccer fans travelling to the Euro 2024 tournament in Germany later this year should use their common sense about culturally sensitive behaviour to avoid falling foul of German public order laws

Britain will send its largest ever deployment of officers to work with their German counterparts to help



police the tournament with more than 300,000 fans expected to travel, many without tickets. The exact size of the police deployment was not disclosed. British police, the foreign office and supporter groups will offer guidance to fans to help them avoid them breaking German law, warning that local police could issue on-the-spot fines and escort offenders to the nearest bank to ensure payment.

But, the majority of fans knew what was right and wrong, said Mark Roberts, the National Police Chiefs' Council's Lead for Football Policing

"Let's be realistic, some of this stuff you really don't need telling that's its going to be a criminal offence in any normal Western democracy, so there is an element of common sense here," Roberts said at a briefing alongside German police in London.

"You don't really have to get your almanac out to check the finer points of German legislation, just go and be a good guest and have a good time." When England played against Germany in a 2017

friendly in Dortmund, it resulted in the English Football Association condemning the behaviour of some fans, who were seen making Nazi salutes.

Ancelotti Demands Pace & Intensity From Real Madrid Against Bayern

MADRID: Manager Carlo Ancelotti urged Real Madrid to play with more pace and intensity if they want to keep alive their hopes of securing the LaLiga-European Cup double by beating Bayern Munich in the return leg of their Champions League semi-final on Wednesday.

Real wrapped up the LaLiga title over the weekend with four matches to spare but that has not stopped Ancelotti from being extremely critical of his team's performance in their 2-2 draw in the first-leg of the Champions League semi in Germany.

He has warned his players



that they cannot afford another sub par performance if they want to contest the June 1 final at Wembley Stadium.

"We need a match with intensity, with pace... Looking at the

first leg, defensively we could have done a lot more," Ancelotti told a press conference on

Tuesday, insisting that his side cannot afford to underestimate the challenge posed by Bayern despite the German side's disappointing domestic campaign.

Bayer Leverkusen ended Bayern's 11-year Bundesliga reign by securing the league crown last month but Ancelotti said the six-times European Cup winners will have extra motivation to win the only trophy they can still fight for this season.

"(Bayern and Real) are similar clubs because they have a great history and a lot of success. We have to respect our opponents because they did very well and better than us in the first leg," Ancelotti said.

"We are very excited because it could be another magical night for us, but there is no optimism.

We are aware of the difficulties that we are going to face.'

Defender Dani Carvajal, one of most experienced players in Real's changing room and winner of five Champions League titles with the Spanish giants, admitted that they feel the fans remain confident about their chances of reaching the final due to their unbeaten run in the competition this season.

He joked that Ancelotti was "getting more and more fearful" over the years, but praised his coach's role in keeping the changing room focused on winning a record-extending 15th title in Europe's premier club competition.
