Bishkek Mob Violence MEA Urged To Facilitate Evacuation Of Kashmiri Students

Srinagar: The Jammu and Kashmir Students' Association (JKSA) on Friday wrote to External Affairs Minister S laishankar and requested that "proactive measures" be taken immediately to ensure the wellbeing of the Indian students in Kyrgyzstan.

The student body shot the letter following a recent report published in the Kashmir Observer titled 'Kashmiri Students In Kyrgyzstan Desperate To Return Home'.

Notably, Kashmiri students enrolled in different medical unito be evacuated following the mob violence against foreign students by Kyrgyz people in Bishkek, killing four Pakistani students while around a dozen Indians suffered critical injuries.

IKSA, in its letter has also highlighted that 180 students from other countries were successfully evacuated from Kyrgyzstan on May 19, but regrettably no Indian students, particularly those from Kashmir, have been brought

Centre-JK discuss truce plan Delhi asks J&K to prepare action plan on CBM's

RINAGAR Centre today asked the Jammu and Kash-mir Government to property mir Government to prepare a comprehensive time bound action plan to implement the Confidence Building Measures (CBM's) announced in India and Pakistan in the recent joint declaration and on the physical structures needed to implement them.

Meanwhile Centre and J&K government are actively considering a ceasefire with militants in the state. This was revealed by the union home secretary V K Duggal during a press conference here today.

Asked whether there would be a ceasefire between the security forces and the militants, he said; "That is the objective, and I have spoken to the state governor and the chief minister about this but it has to be a consultative process.'

"The main important CBM is dialogue process. Any CBM which involves the movement of people, transport, goods and services and implementation of trade needs a dialogue process... When can we start and how can we start." Mr Duggal said.

He said the central government would provide all infrastructure support to the state administration for opening meeting points between the Kashmiris of India and Pakistan, increasing bus services across the border and facilitating trade through the new routes.

He said the other important component of the CBMs is the infrastructure needed to implement them.

The slate government has been asked to prepare the report? What all it can handle and where it needs the support of the central government so that we can consider that." he added.

'PM Manmohan's intentions are very clear on this. We have specific instructions that these CBMs should be taken forward most-religiously and in a dedicated time-bound manner. Money and resources should not act as constraints in implementing these measures." he added.

On possible talks with separatist leaders. Duggal said Prime Minister Manmohan Singh was opposed to talks with Hurriyat Conference.

"The Prime Minister is most open to talks with anybody who has a concrete plan However, a mechanism has to be put in place for holding such talks," he told reporters. Duggal said important and positive steps were being taken in Kashmir-to restore normalcy. "The return Kashmiri Pandit migrants, and the Amarnath yatra are positive steps. I think Kashmir is on its way to peace. (Kashmir Observer, 25 May, 2005)

Teaching on a Tightrope The Plight of Underpaid Private School Teachers

While the profitability of private schools is important, it should not come at the expense of fair wages and job security for teachers. Like many private school teachers in the region, Far-han's dreams of a day when his hard work will be recognized and adequately compensated. Farhan is a fictional charac-

The education sector in India, over the years, has seen significant growth and diversification. But, not much has changed for teachers in private schools. According to official figures, there are approximately 7010 private schools in the region, with 2710 located in Kashmir and 4300 in Jammu. These institutions range from primary to higher secondary levels, collectively educating over 7.5 lakh students and employing around 40,000 teachers and 25,000 non-teaching staff, including drivers and helpers. Despite their critical role In shaping the future of ours, private school teachers face severe financial and job security challenges

The plight of private school teachers is often overshadowed by the broader discussions about educational quality and access. However, the well-being of these educators is intrinsically linked to the quality of education provided. The stark disparity in remuneration be-



tween private and government school teachers is disheartening. Despite possessing the same qualifications, private school teachers earn significantly less than their counterparts in government schools. This gap not only reflects a systemic undervaluation of their work but also perpetuates a cycle of dissatisfaction and demotivation among teachers.

Private school teachers in Kashmir and Jammu often face a precarious employment situation. Without job security, many teachers are hired on a temporary basis, with contracts that can be abruptly terminated. It has come to light that some schools employ teachers from March to October, only to dismiss them before the onset of winter to avoid paying their salaries during the colder months. This practice not only highlights the profit-driven motives of certain school administrations but also underscores a severe lack of respect for the teaching profession.

The economic plight of private school teachers is further exacerbated by the fact that they often earn less than dailywage workers employed by the government in the education sector. This disparity is a glaring indication of the systemic neglect and exploitation faced by private school teachers. The financial strain on these educators is immense, leading to a situation where many struggle to meet their basic needs and provide for their families. The resulting stress and discontent has a direct impact on their teaching performance and overall job satisfaction.

The question then arises: who cares for these underpaid private school teachers? The responsibility for addressing this issue lies with multiple significant role in advocating for the rights of private school teachers. These organizations should provide a platform for teachers to voice their concerns and demand better working conditions. Through collective bargaining and negotiations, they can push for improved salaries, job security, and other benefits for private school teachers.

Parents and students, too, can contribute to this effort. As primary stakeholders in the education system, they have the power to influence school policies by demanding better treatment for teachers. Parents should engage with school management to ensure that teachers are fairly compensated and that their rights are protected.

Let realization dawn upon us, the issue of underpaid private school teachers is not just a matter of economic justice but a fundamental question of educational equity and social responsibility. Ensuring fair treatment and adequate compensation for these educators is essential not only to uphold their dignity and well-being but also to safeguard the quality of education for generations to come. By collectively addressing the root causes of this issue, we are not only solving the problem of private teachers, but are raising our educational standards. Teachers are nation builders, therefore, teaching should be the most rewarding profession.

sold globally. These centers already account for over 50% of all GCCs globally, employing 1.66 million Indians and generating \$46 billion in annual revenues as of March 2023.

Kingdom) to become the world's fifthlargest economy. If it maintains its current growth rate of 6-7% per year, it will soon overtake stagnant Japan and Germany to take over third place.

But by 2050, India's workforce will start shrinking, owing to demographic aging. Growth will slow. That means India has only a narrow window in which to grow rich before it grows old: with per capita income of just \$2,500, the economy must grow by 9% per year for the next quarter-century. That is an extremely difficult task, and the current election may well determine whether it remains possible at all.

THE CHINA MODEL

In pursuit of rapid growth, the Indian government intends to follow a tested road map: the same path that Japan took in the immediate postwar decades, and that China took after the death of Mao Zedong. During the first stage of the journey, labor flows out of the traditional agriculture sector as employment increases in low-skilled manufacturing – typically stitching garments or assembling components into electronic goods. This output is then exported to the developed world to capture the benefits of producing at scale.

Cheap labor helps compensate for a country's other deficiencies, such as excessive bureaucracy, unreliable power (especially electricity), or poor roads. As firms profit from exports, they invest in equipment to make workers more productive; and as those workers are paid more, they can afford better schooling and health care for themselves and their children. Tax revenues also grow, providing the resources to upgrade the country's infrastructure.

The result is a virtuous cycle, because higher-skilled workers and better infrastructure enable firms to make more sophisticated, higher-value-added products. That is how China has moved from assembling components to producing worldleading electric vehicles in just four decades. Unfortunately, the same strategy is unlikely to work for India today.

WHY CHINA SURGED AHEAD

It is no accident that India failed to join China in shifting its economy to export-oriented manufacturing, even though the two countries were similarly poor in the late 1970s, when China started on that road. Even low-skilled factory employment requires a minimum level of education and skills. At the time, many Chinese workers met this standard, whereas most Indian workers did not. So, foreign employers found China and its cheap but capable workers more attractive.1

Moreover, China's factory workers acquired skills on the job, and their education allowed them to pick up the basic accounting needed to launch their own small enterprises making products like screws and door handles. This explosion of smaller firms contributed immensely to Chinese growth.

China had other advantages, too. Despite the outward perception of centralized rule by the Communist Party of China, provincial and municipal bosses have wielded a great deal of power. Mayors, hoping to be promoted for generating growth, helped local firms navigate the country's otherwise-stifling regulations, overriding a rule here and overlooking one there in the name of getting results. By contrast, Indian bureaucracy in the same period was neither decentralized nor incentivized to promote growth, so it instead became an additional burden on Indian business.

Finally, autocratic China could always favor manufacturing in ways that democratic India could not. For example, the Chinese government appropriated land for commercial purposes where necessary; pressured unions to limit wage demands even as labor productivity grew; paid depositors in state-owned banks minimal returns so that the funds could be lent out cheaply to firms; and kept the exchange rate undervalued to maintain local firms' international competitiveness. In India, attempts to do any of the above would have met fierce democratic resistance.

WRONG WAY

Nonetheless, the current Indian government wants to get on board the manufacturing bus. With many others looking to diversify away from producing in China, Indian economic policymakers see an opportunity to make up for lost time. Moreover, Indian infrastructure has improved markedly. Among other things, the country now boasts many world-class airports and ports, increased renewables capacity to bridge power deficits, and an excellent highway system.

But other impediments remain. Over the decade that the Modi administration has been in office, India's garment exports – the iconic bootstrapping good – have grown by less than 5%, while Bangladeshi and Vietnamese garment exports have grown by over 70%, such that their exports are now multiples of India's. Recognizing these continuing impediments, the Indian government has begun offering subsidies to incentivize production in India, as well as raising tariffs on imports (like cell phones) to enhance these manufacturers' profits from selling into the now-protected large Indian market.

While it is still early days, one should be skeptical of this strategy. Productionlinked subsidies might induce manufacturers to assemble in India, but those firms still will need to import most components. Moreover, margins will be small, because Indian workers now compete with modestly paid Bangladeshi and Vietnamese workers, not with well-paid workers in industrialized countries, as in the past. With little profit for firms to reinvest – and with less tax revenue, net of the subsidy – the virtuous circles needed to move India up the value chain will be much harder to achieve.

Worse, even if the Indian government were to scale up manufacturing, the world is not ready for another China-size exporting powerhouse. Given the widespread shift toward manufacturing protectionism and growing concerns about environmental sustainability, the government's emphasis on Chinese-style manufacturing-led development seems incompatible with where the world is headed.

PLAY TO YOUR STRENGTHS

There is another way. To drive growth, India could focus on the export of services provided by its well-educated and skilled population. Though this cohort represents a small fraction of the total population, it still numbers in the tens of millions. Such a strategy would build on India's strengths. The country is already well known for its role in the global software industry, and now it exports many other services, too, accounting for over 5% of the world's services exports while its goods exports account for less than 2%.

Multinational firms – from Goldman Sachs to Rolls-Royce – are hiring talented Indian graduates into India-based global capability centers (GCCs), where engineers, architects, consultants, and lawyers create designs, contracts, and content (and software) that are embedded in manufactured goods and services Following the pandemic-induced changes in work habits, and given improvements in communications technology, Indians also have started providing a much wider range of remote services, including consulting, telemedicine, and even yoga instruction. Once a service goes virtual, it matters little whether the provider is ten miles or 10,000 miles away. An Indian consultant in Hyderabad can now make a presentation to a client in Seattle on behalf of a team whose members span almost every continent. She not only is well trained and fluent in English; she also costs one-fourth of her US counterpart.

True, Indian manufacturing has also benefited from these changes, but this has happened in precisely those areas where engineering, innovation, and design matter more than just the manufacturing process itself. Hence, Agnikul, a Chennai-based firm working to launch small satellites into space, has dispensed entirely with manufacturing supply chains by 3D printing its customized rockets in its own facility. And Tilfi, which sells authentic hand-woven Banarasi silk sarees globally through its website, employs trained designers to create fresh fashions for traditional craftsmen, who in turn are encouraged to embrace innovation.

It would seem to be a no-brainer that India should build on its strength: millions of high-skilled, creative, educated workers, many of whom speak English. Unfortunately, it's running out of such workers. While India graduates 1.5 million engineers per year, only a minority attend institutions that impart the high-quality education that is in demand at a GCC or a company like Agnikul. Wheebox, a workskill assessment company, estimates that half of all graduates are unemployable.

Easy Access, Deadly Consequences The Dark Side of J&K's License Issuance

A mere five-minute driving test overlooks the assessment of an individual's overall driving prowess, patience, and road etiquette, potentially jeopardizing road safety.

y Valentine boy, Monty, turned 18 this year, and as soon as he did, he went to the Parivahan website managed by the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways to register for a driving license. To become a legal driver in this mountainous region, he needs to answer some multiple-choice questions to get a Learner's License, followed by a driving test overseen by officials from the Regional Transport Office.

Getting the Learner's License was a breeze for the teenager, as he easily answered most of the multiple-choice questions correctly, even though his responses were mostly guesses. Now, he focused on the road test, which was scheduled for a few months later. He appeared quite relaxed, as if he had been driving his whole life. As a responsible parent, I have never allowed my sons to drive my car without a license. The older one got his license two years ago.

Finally, the day arrived for my son's driving skills to be put to the ultimate test. If he passed, he would be legally allowed to drive, despite having only a few hours of practice. The brothers teamed up, with the older one giving him tips on how to maneuver through the "H" pattern in reverse gear to pass the test. As he headed to the track, an RTO official checked his documents, although not his ID. Monty navigated the track with ease. This track was a modified, easier version of its previous, more challenging "H" design.

Monty emerged from the track with a big smile. Passing the test meant he was now a qualified driver, legally permitted to drive any Light Motor Vehicle (LMV) across India. However, only he knows that his actual driving skills are still lacking and that his license would serve as his defense if he encountered any trouble while driving in the future.

About a week later, he received a flurry of messages from the Parivahan Department, with the final one congratulating him on becoming a legal driver. The SMS informed him that he could download his license on the DigiLocker and mParivahan mobile apps from RTO Kashmir. And that's all it takes. To become a legal driver in Jammu



and Kashmir, you only need to pass two straightforward tests: a multiple-choice exam to get your Learner's License and a brief track test where your reverse gear skills are evaluated for just a minute or two.

Some years back, I conducted an interview with a Deputy Commissioner for this publication, during which he openly acknowledged, "Here, licenses are issued to kill," alluding to the lax process of license issuance. He also highlighted widespread corruption within the system, resulting in inexperienced drivers being unleashed onto the roads, which he described as "potential hazards."

This includes various maneuvers such as parallel parking, three-point turns, and emergency stops, as well as driving on different types of roads including urban, rural, and dual carriageways. The examiner assesses the candidate's ability to control the vehicle safely, follow traffic signs and signals, and interact with other road users.

In addition to the practical test, there is also a theory test which assesses the candidate's knowledge of the Highway Code, road signs, and general driving theory. This test typically includes multiple-choice questions and a hazard perception test where candidates must identify potential hazards in video clips of driving scenarios. Obtaining a driving license in Dubai often involves a more stringent process. Aspiring drivers must undergo comprehensive training from approved driving schools before they are eligible to take the driving test. The training typically includes classroom sessions covering traffic rules, road signs, and driving theory, as well as practical driving lessons with certified instructors.

Once the training is complete, candidates must pass a series of tests administered by the Roads and Transport Authority (RTA). This includes a theory test to assess their knowledge of traffic regulations and a practical driving test to demonstrate their driving skills. The practical test in Dubai is known for its rigor, with examiners closely evaluating the candidate's ability to navigate through challenging traffic conditions, execute precise maneuvers, and adhere to strict safety standards.

the testing process. As a result, obtaining a driving license in Dubai is considered a significant achievement and a dream come true for many residents, reflecting the high standards of road safety and proficiency expected of drivers in the region.

It's ironic that although Indian traffic laws list every offense with hefty penalties for violations, genuine traffic awareness isn't adequately cultivated either by driving schools or by the Regional Transport Offices (RTOs).

tributes to 11 percent of global road accident deaths, according to a 2021 report from the World Bank. This makes India the country with the highest road accident death rate worldwide. Annually, the country experiences around 450,000 road crashes, resulting in 150,000 fatalities. Over the past decade, 1.3 million people lost their lives, and another 5 million were injured on Indian roads, as stated in the report.

According to a recent report released by the traffic police in Jammu and Kashmir, the alarming statistics paint a grim picture of road safety in the region. In the span of a year, a staggering total of 6,298 accidents were recorded, resulting in the loss of 893 lives. Tragically, these accidents also left 8,469 individuals injured, many of whom continue to grapple with the physical and emotional aftermath.

India is reportedly overhauling its driving license issuance process with new regulations effective June 1, this year. Authorized private driving centers will now conduct tests instead of government RTOs. Trainers must meet strict criteria, and schools must provide suitable testing facilities. Training durations are standardized: 29 hours for light vehicles and 38 hours for heavy vehicles. These changes aim to improve accessibility, efficiency, and road safety.

However, the continued use of the current format for issuing driving licenses in Jammu and Kashmir ensures that the process remains lackadaisical and riddled with inefficiencies. As the RTO Kashmir has confirmed, driving tests will not be skipped, and no private entities have been authorized to conduct these tests.

This means the traditional, government-run RTO system—characterized by minimal scrutiny and inadequate evaluation—will persist, and individuals like Monty will continue to obtain licenses through this process filled with loopholes, unleashing half-baked drivers onto the roads.

Why Are Screens Bad for Teens?

For psychologists, every month is Mental Health Awareness Month; in May, the general public joins us. This month is when we take extra time to reflect on psychological and emotional needs that often go unnoticed until there's a serious problem. That said, right now there's already a serious problem we need to pay attention to, because it's masquerading as "normal" behavior: teenagers overusing screens.

Recently, the surgeon general released an advisory statement warning that screentime, and social media use in particular, is threatening youth mental health to a degree that he considers it "the defining public health issue of our time."

I couldn't agree more. I routinely give presentations and webinars for middle and high schools all over the country, helping concerned parents and educators recognize the warning signs of screen addiction and learn to attend to mental health red flags in teens. I have witnessed first-hand how many caregivers are beside themselves wanting to do something to change the tide with teens and screens. Many administrators in education are launching new policies to limit smartphone use in schools, but is that enough to curb the disturbing trends we're seeing?

Probably not—although I applaud them for trying.

Unlike many other maladaptive behaviors teenagers are susceptible to, we can't issue a zero-tolerance policy on screens. For drugs or alcohol-it's easy to draw firmer lines in the sand. Vaping, for example, is never healthy for teens and can be avoided entirely. But smartphones and screens are a necessary evil in teenage life, and it's not all bad: they provide connection, ease of communication, assist with learning, and help teenagers gain independence at a critical time for learning such independence.

Unfortunately, they also are fraught with qualities that promote mental illness, especially in teenagers, so threading the needle is exceptionally difficult.

Social media, in particular, poses significant risks to teens, who, according to a recent Gallup survey, spend an average of five hours a day engaging in this online activity. The American Psychological Association (APA) released a health advisory about social media use in adolescents in 2023, as well as a follow-up last month on the certain features and functions that are most hazardous to teens' mental health. The group highlighted that "platforms built for adults are not inherently suitable for youth," in part due to the neurological and developmental differences between adolescents and adults. In particular, adolescents are more vulnerable to becoming obsessive or anxious about building likes and follower counts. and more impressionable and vulnerable to AI-driven content suggestions, paid advertisements, and suggestions to engage in illegal or harmful behavior. The APA also points out that youth are more vulnerable to excessive use when presented with features like an infinite scroll of content, to distraction when apps are enabled to push notifications to their phone, and to insomnia when they have access to their devices at night and use them instead of sleeping. Screens are also ways that teens access other potentially

Screens are also ways that teens access other potentially addictive behaviors. For example, recent research shows that about 85 percent of teenagers play video games regularly (including 97 percent of boys), for an average of nearly two hours daily. This trend is leading to a rise in internet gaming disorders, gaming addictions, and serious mental health decline. Results from the largest study to date on the longitudinal impact of gaming and teens demonstrated that 1 in 10 teens exhibited "pathological video gaming behavior." and the effects worsened over time-these teens showed markedly higher levels of depression, anxiety, and aggression. Video games are also gateways to gambling behavior, which can have long-term financial and mental health implications for teens.

But even when kids aren't gaming, using social media, experiencing cyber-bullying, compulsively texting, or generally impacted by the ill effects of screen use, there may be damage being done to the developing brain that isn't immediately apparent. Screen time-particularly in the evenings-can be linked to increased rates of insomnia in teenagers, which, in turn, has a host of side effects, including irritability, difficulty concentrating, a weakened immune system, and heightened anxiety. Research shows that even just having a screen-based device in the bedroom (even if it isn't on or being used) can impede sleep and increase stress levels. Nearly two-thirds of teens who report having technology in their bedrooms experience problems with sleep and subsequent health-related comorbidities.

So what can we do?

Despite the numerous pitfalls, the answer here isn't to bar kids from accessing technology—it's to teach them to use it. Michael Rich, of Boston Children's Hospital, writes in his new book, The Mediatrician's Guide, to think of technology like you would a power tool, like an electric drill:

"It is a tool that can provide possibilities and freedom but, used thoughtlessly, can hinder or harm the user and others. It should be provided when the child needs and can use that tool responsibly and with respect for themselves and others."

Harm can be done when smartphones, tablets, and computers are handed to kids without boundaries, directions, guidelines, or close supervision. Part of the problem is the way we think about the integration of screens into our daily lives, and part of the problem is not fully understanding the risks to our kids. We understand, for example, that letting a 13-year-old drive a car is dangerous and lifethreatening. Would you hand your teenagers the keys to the car without properly training them how to drive? Of course

not. However, fewer people are aware that heavy use of social media (more than two hours per day) has been associated with an increased risk of suicidal ideation and attempts.

Teenagers need to be taught, trained, and monitored for how to utilize screens safely to help offset the mental health implications that stem from accidental misuse and overuse.

A 2019 study suggests keeping the "4 M's" in mind when moderating screen use in teens:

- Manage screen use: parents need to be "present and engaged when screens are used," enforce parental controls and privacy settings, always hold the logins and passwords to their children's media accounts (and check them regularly), and engage in frequent conversations with teens about healthy online behaviors.
- Meaningful screen use: place emphasis on educational and social online experiences (e.g., facetiming with friends, taking an online class), and help teens choose developmentally appropriate content for engagement.
- Model healthy screen use: parents need to put screens away regularly.

Turn off TVs, silence cell phones, make "media free" time normalized in the household, not just a kids-only rule.

Monitor for unhealthy screen use: complaining about boredom without technology, fighting rules for limiting screen time, negative emotions following texting or other online activities, interference with sleep or social activities due to screens are all warning signs and need to be heeded.

Screens provide all of us with unparalleled access to information, entertainment and social connection, and it's understandable that teenagers would want to capitalize on these opportunities. However, now that we are aware that there are major mental health detriments associated with too much screen time, we can take action to do something about them. And while eliminating screens isn't the best option, we can reduce the harm that screens cause, and lean into the positive opportunities that thoughtful, wellmonitored screen time can provide for kids.

ranges. Criticism was levied against the delimitation process with Ghulam Nabi Azad of the Democratic Progressive Azad Party among others voicing concern over the methodology employed and suggesting a lack of consideration for geographical coherence.

In 2019, the Anantnag constituency had a turnout of just 9.8 per cent. And so perhaps, in a marked contrast to the fervent campaigning witnessed in other constituencies, the area has seen relatively subdued rallies.

However, the Poonch and Rajouri regions, known for high voter turnouts, have seen hectic campaigning with all parties getting their top leaders to campaign.

Political heavyweights such as National Conference's Farooq Abdullah and Omar Abdullah, PDP's Mehbooba Mufti and her daughter Iltija Mufti, Jammu and Kashmir Apni Party's Altaf Bukhari and Azad have spent considerable time in engaging with voters.

Azad, who was initially slated to contest under the DPAP banner, has fielded Mohammad Saleem Parray, prompting speculation of strategic candidate placements possibly influenced by the BJP to fracture opposition votes.

This Lok Sabha election, the first since Article 370 was abrogated in 2019 and the erstwhile state of Jammu and Kashmir was divided into the union territories of Jammu and Kashmir, and Ladakh, is crucial for Mehbooba Mufti.

She is grappling with internal party dissension with several former PDP members now contesting against the party. The most prominent among them perhaps is Manhas, who was earlier affiliated with the PDP.

Amid the political manoeuvring, National Conference's Omar Abdullah hinted at BJP support for Mehbooba Mufti in certain local pockets, a claim she chose not to address publicly.

Territory, with polling already completed in the other four constituencies. The newly created Anantnag-Rajouri Lok Sabha seat, covering the south Kashmir-Pir Panjal region, will cover the districts of Anantnag, Kulgam, Shopian, Rajouri and Poonch.

The polling parties and security forces are being dispatched for special polling stations set up for the Kashmiri Pandits in Jammu and Udhampur districts.

"Over 26,000 Kashmiri migrant voters will cast their ballots at special polling stations set up in Jammu, Udhampur and Delhi tomorrow. All arrangements have been made for free and fair polling tomorrow," Relief and Rehabilitation Commissioner Dr Arvind Karwani told PTI.

Dr Karwani reviewed the arrangements along with election officers at 21 polling booths and 8 auxiliary ones in Jammu, one in Udhampur and four in Delhi. Assistant Electoral Returning Officer (AERO) Dr Riaz Ahmed urged the Kashmiri migrant voters to

participate in the election. "All necessary facilities, including water and shelter, have been arranged. The Election Commission has also provided a pick-and-drop facility for the voters, available from 6 am to 6 pm, focusing on areas with higher concentrations of migrants," the AERO said.

The authorities, amid tight security, handed over polling materials, including EVMs, to polling parties at Women's College in Jammu. The security forces and election parties are being deployed to their respective stations, the officials said.

The Anantnag constituency is preparing for a competitive electoral showdown with nearly 18.36 lakh voters, including 9.02 lakh women, set to vote at 2.338 polling stations.

Twenty candidates are vying for the seat, with the main contest between PDP chief and former chief minister Mehbooba Mufti and prominent Gujjar leader and former minister Mian Altaf Ahmad of the National Conference (NC).

Apni Party's Zafar Ìqbal Manhas, backed by the BJP in the Pir Panjal region, hopes to challenge both the PDP and the NC.

The Democratic Progressive Azad Party (DPAP), led by former chief minister Ghulam Nabi Azad, has fielded Mohammad Saleem Parray for the seat.

After the intense campaigning on Anantnag Lok Sabha constituency, where candidates got 18 extra days to seek votes from people, after the polling date was postponed by the Election Commission of India (ECI) from May 7 to 25, over 18.30 lakh voters will be eligible to cast their votes during the 6th phase of the general elections.

The EC also provided 12 alternative documents other than Voter id card (EPIC) for identity verification at polling stations. If a voter is registered in the electoral roll, voting can be done by showing any of these documents.

Land measuring 03 Marlas situated at Wahighund, Kunzer under survey No. 216/73. Land measuring 10.05 Marlas situated at Wahigund, Kunzer under survey No. 215/73. Land measuring 13 Marlas situated at Wahigund, Kunzer under survey No.91. Land measuring 01 Kanal at Wahigund, Kunzer in the name of suspect's wife. Land measuring 04 Kanals & 04 Marlas situated at Wahigund, Kunzer. Land measuring 01 Kanal & 10 Marlas situatd at Wahigund, Kunzer in the name of suspect's son Ishfaq Majid. Land measuring 13 Marlas with single storey structure & two shops situated at Pattan, Baramulla in the name of suspect's wife. Land measuring 03 Marlas situated at Pattan," the statement reads.

It added that the verification conducted further revealed that he has also constructed a double-storey house having a plinth area of 600 sft at Wahigund, Kunzer on ancestral land & is also having huge doubtful transactions in his various Bank accounts, besides is in possession of other properties and assets. "The value of assets so accumulated as well as expenditure incurred by the suspect public servant were found disproportionate to his known sources of income for which he failed to satisfactorily give account. Accordingly, on culmination of the probe a Case FIR No 07/2024 under section 5(1)(e) r/w 5(2) J&K P.C Act. Svt; 2006 was registered in PS ACB Baramulla against Abdul Majid Sheikh @ Malla, the then Patwari (now posted as Girdawar Qanoongo Circle Nowshera Tehsil Boniyar) and investigation was initiated. Immediately after registration of the case searches were also conducted at the residence of the accused during which some cash of Rs 3.80 lakh beside other incriminating documents were also recovered which were seized on spot," it added.

"During the course of this DA verification it surfaced that the suspect has purchased immovable property in the shape of proprietary land of more than 16 Kanals from many persons falling under different survey Nos at Wahigund Kunzer from time to time and these properties have been fraudulently mutated by way of two oral gift deeds in order to evade applicable stamp duty & registration fee etc," the spokesman said.

"It was found that the accused Girdawar in league with revenue officers/officials namely 1) Bashir Ahmad Reshi S/o Ghulam Qadir Reshi R/o Kanloo, then Patwari Halqa Wailoo, Kralpor, 2) Manzoor Ahmad Khanday S/o Abdul Ahad Khanday R/o Ultkoo, Kawarhuma Tangmarg, then Patwari Halqa Wailoo Kralpora and 3) Altaf Hussain Khan S/o Saifullah Khan R/o House No. 112-A Balgarden, Srinagar, then Naib Tehsildar Wailoo Kralpora had illegally and fraudulently entered two different oral gift mutations vide No. 117 dated Nil & No. 123 dated 15.01.2015 in mutation register of the revenue record of Patwari Halqa, Wailoo Kralpora, Kunzer in utter violation of laid down norms in vogue," the statement reads.

"The verification conducted further revealed that the above named officers/officials in league with suspect beneficiary have made illegal insertions in revenue record by changing actual mutation No. 117 into 117/1, and then mutation No. 117 was fraudulently given to questioned oral gift mutation in the register, by incorporating additional page into original mutation register, thereby land measuring 05 Kanals & 07 Marlas was shown orally gifted to suspect, his wife as well as his son which was actually purchased by Abdul Majid Sheikh @ Malla against substantial consideration amounts," it added.

"It has also found that similarly, another oral gift mutation No. 123 was illegally and fraudulently inserted in Parti-Patwar register by said revenue officers/ officials by showing land measuring 14-Kanals & 05 Marlas orally gifted to suspect and to his brother which was too purchased by suspect Abdul Majid Sheikh @ Malla against substantial consideration amount. Therefore, in both the cases, the involved revenue officers/officials were having ample knowledge that the said land properties were not actually been orally gifted to the suspect beneficiary or to any one of his family members but have been purchased for consideration. As such, the entry in this regard in the revenue record by unduly showing them as orally gifted was illegal, fraudulent and in contravention to laid down norms," the statement further reads. "The verification conducted as such revealed that the above named revenue officers/officials, by abuse of their official positions and under a well-knit criminal conspiracy with the suspect beneficiary Abdul Majid Sheikh @ Malla have paved a way to evade the applicable stamp duty as well as registration charges, thereby conferred huge undue pecuniary gains upon themselves as well as to beneficiary with commensurate loss to Government exchequer. Accordingly, a separate FIR No 08 under section 5(1) (d) r/w 5(2) J&K PC Act Svt-2006 and sections 467, 468,471,120-B of RPC was registered at ACB PS Baramulla and investigations were initiated against all three revenue officials including the beneficiary accused namely Abdul Majid Sheikh @ Malla resident of Wahigund Tehsil Kunzer," the statement reads, adding that further investigations in both cases are going on.

Among others, people have been asked to stay hydrated by drinking plenty of water throughout the day, even if one doesn't feel thirsty. "Avoid caffeinated beverages, as they can lead to dehydration."

Persons working under the conditions of high temperature and humidity should assuredly drink cold water, the advisory said.

"Regulation of work: The duration of exposure to hot environments should be reduced."

Further, it said, periods of rest should be ensured between intense work sessions or one can take cool showers or baths at home to lower body temperature, however, doing the same in deep and fast flowing water bodies should be avoided at all cost to discourage drowning etc.

"Wear Appropriate Clothing: Wear lightweight, loose-fitting and light colored clothing." Use widebrimmed hats and sunglasses, shields and umbrellas to protect skin from sunburn, it said.

The DHSK also urged people to limit outdoor activities. "Avoid strenuous activities during the hottest parts of the day, typically between 10 AM to 04 PM," it said, adding, "If you must be outside, take frequent breaks in the shade of a cool environment or better to stay indoors."

It also urged people to apply sunscreen to protect skin from sunburn. In a specific advisory for children, it urged people to not leave children in parked cars, even with the windows down. Ensure they play in shaded areas and take breaks to cool down and hydrate, it said. "Dress children in appropriate clothing and apply

sunscreen regularly." It urged people to encourage frequent water breaks. "Offer water-rich snacks like fruits."

Schools should refrain from holding outdoor activities such as assemblies, sports events during extreme hot and humid weather, it said. "They should also ensure good hydration of children by providing multiple safe drinking water stations.

Elderly have been asked to ensure they have access to cool environments.

Regarding signs of heat-related Illness, the DHSK asked people to watch for symptoms like dizziness, heavy sweating or lack of sweating, and in that case, seek medical attention immediately from nearby Government Health Care Facilities.

maintains that the heatwaves in Jammu and Kashmir pose significant challenges to public health, agriculture, and infrastructure, necessitating a comprehensive heatwave action plan to mitigate their impacts.

The Heatwave Vulnerability Map of J&K shows Jammu, Udhampur, Reasi, Kathua and Samba in "High" Vulnerability index of heatwave while, Srinagar, Budgam, Pulwama, Poonch, Rajouri, Ramban, Doda and Kishtwar in "Medium" index.

Shopian, Kupwara, Bandipora, Ganderbal, Kulgam, Anantnag and Baramulla have been put in low Vulnerability index of heatwave.

The report has put five districts of Jammu Division - Jammu, Udhampur, Reasi, Kathua, Samba in the "Heatwave Hotspots" category. These places are most likely to get the temperatures above 40 degrees and are highly vulnerable to heatwaves in the current Hotweather season.

The JKDMA has issued short, medium and long term goals to escape the heat wave.

Authorities had received more than 2,200 applications from the contesting candidates and political parties, seeking permission for various electioneering activities.

While 1,920 applications for rallies, roadshows and meetings were approved, 303 pleas were rejected on various grounds.

The 18.36 lakh voters enrolled in the five districts of Kulgam, Anantnag, Poonch, Shopian and Rajouri of the parliamentary constituency include 9.33 lakh men, 9.02 women and 27 third-gender voters.

Around 18,000 differently-abled people and 540 people aged above 100 years are eligible to cast their ballots. Polling will be held from 7 am to 6 pm. Before that, there will be a mock poll in the presence of polling agents. Voting will continue after 6 pm if voters are found standing in queues outside polling booths.

Seventeen polling booths ('pink' polling stations) will be managed by women, 15 by differently-abled people and eight by youngsters. Also, there will be 15 'green' polling stations to spread the message about environment awareness.

All the polling stations in Anantnag-Rajouri will have CCTV cameras for live webcasting to the control rooms set up at the district and CEO office. The cameras will be positioned in such a way so that they do not violate the secrecy of vote.

The constituency, spanning diverse regions like Pahalgam, Poonch-Rajouri, and Kulgam-Shopian, reflects a stark contrast to its troubled past. The elections, initially scheduled for May 7, were postponed to May 25 at the request of various political entities. The inclusion of the Rajouri region has drastically increased the Hindu voter base. This could alter the electoral equation in this previously Muslimmajority seat.

Economic and Social Revival

In cities like Kulgam, the sight of open fruit shops

of which 1094743 are from Kashmir side whereas 735551 are from Rajouri and Poonch.

The majority of voters in twin districts of Rajouri and Poonch consist of Gujjars and Paharis and they never get together. This time it was seen that Gujjars seem to be aligned towards a particular candidate, who has been the religious leader as well, whereas Paharis are inclined towards the other side. This has put an end to issue based politics and campaigning.

"When you have an ethnic divide visible on the ground, locals get buried and people vote for the leaders who are from their own tribe and ethnicity. This election is no different and both Gujjars and Paharis have made their mind as to where they will vote," said Shafiq Mir, Chairman of All Jammu and Kashmir Panchayat Conference. Mir, who is a former Block Development Council (BDC) Chairman, believed that in absence of BJP's candidate, Pahari people are looking for the candidate who has the best chance of winning. "They may not follow the diktats of BJP and their leaders to vote for a particular party, who doesn't have much chance of winning. I believe it is a two-way contest between the National Conference and Peoples Democratic Party (PDP)," he added.

Gujjars leaders also believe that there is a direct contest between NC and PDP and no other party has any chance. "It is expected that around 80 percent votes of Gujjar community will go to Mian Altaf of NC whereas the rest will go to PDP, whereas Paharis may vote for PDP. But it will be interesting to watch what will be the polling percentage in 11 segments of south Kashmir," said a Gujjar leader, on the condition of anonymity.

There is also a factor of nomad population that may not be able to vote as most of them have already left for higher reaches where they will not have any polling station. "This will also hurt the NC candidate as nomads are either heading towards hills or have reached there," the Gujjar leader added. (KNO)

23,659 voters above the age of 100 will cast their votes. At least 9.58 lakh persons with disabilities voters have been provided the option to vote from the comfort of their homes.

At least 20 special trains were deployed to ferry security personnel for the elections. A total of 184 observers have already reached their constituencies days before the voting. These include 66 General Observers, 35 Police Observers, 83 Expenditure Observers. As per the poll panel, 2,222 Flying Squads, 2,295 Static Surveillance Teams, 819 Video Surveillance Teams and 569 Video Viewing Teams are keeping surveillance round the clock.

To ensure security during elections, 257 international Border check posts and 927 inter-state border check posts are keeping strict vigil on any illicit flow of liquor, drugs, cash and freebies. Strict surveillance has been kept at sea and air routes, the Election

Meanwhile, night temperature also continued to witness the increasing trend with Srinagar recording a low of 15.4°C against 15.0°C on the previous night and it was 3.7°C above normal for the summer capital of JK for this time of the year.

Qazigund recorded a minimum of 12.0°C against 11.8°C on the previous night and it was 1.7°C above normal for the gateway town of Kashmir, he said.

Pahalgam recorded a low of 8.5°C against 7.7°C on the previous night and it was 2.3°C normal for the famous resort in south Kashmir.

Kokernag, also in south Kashmir, recorded a minimum of 13.0°C against 12.3°C and it was 2.9°C above normal, the official said.

Kupwara town recorded a minimum of 12.0° C against 11.5° C on the previous night and it was above normal by 1.6° C for the place, the official said.

Gulmarg recorded a minimum of 11.8°C against 11.0°C on the previous night and it was above normal

a heat wave as five or more consecutive days during which the daily maximum temperature exceeds the average maximum temperature by five degrees Celsius.

If the maximum temperature of any place continues to be more than 45°C consecutively for two days, it is called a heat wave condition. Different countries define heatwave differently in context of their local conditions.

In India, as per Indian Meteorological Department (IMD) classification, heat wave is considered if the maximum temperature of a station reaches at least 40°C or more for plains, 37°C or more for coastal stations and at least 30°C or more for hilly regions.

The local meteorologist has forecasted more hot and dry weather conditions for the upcoming week.

The JKDMA has issued a slew of preventive measures for Heat Wave. These include listening to Radio, watching TV, and reading Newspapers for local weather forecasts to know if a heat wave is on the way.

It has urged people to drink sufficient water and as often as possible, even if not thirsty or wear lightweight, light-coloured, loose, and porous cotton clothes. The JKDMA also urges people to use protective goggles, umbrellas/hats, shoes or chappals while going out in the sun or while traveling, carrying water with them.

"If you work outside, use a hat or an umbrella and also use a damp cloth on your head, neck, face and limbs or use ORS, homemade drinks like lassi, torani (rice water), lemon water, buttermilk, etc. which help to re-hydrate the body," the plan reads.

It also urges people to recognize the signs of heat stroke, heat rash or heat cramps such as weakness, dizziness, headache, nausea, sweating and seizures.

The District Magistrates of every district have been authorized to focus on capacity building, participation and empowerment of these stakeholders in disaster management at local level. It has also directed the health department to be on alert and take preparedness measures for managing heat related Illness. The report noted that heat related illness is avoidable. It can be best prevented if the vulnerable populations/communities are made aware of prevention tips, basic Do's and Don'ts through effective use of various media. "Knowledge of effective prevention and first-aid treatment, besides an awareness of potential side-effects of prescription drugs during hot weather, is crucial for physicians and pharmacists to best mitigate the effects of heat illnesses," it reads.

Notably, the MeT department on Friday urged people, especially vulnerable sections, to avoid exposure to heat and drink a lot of fluids, saying that the heat wave will continue for next five days in Jammu and Kashmir.

"Heat wave over plains of Jammu & Kashmir Divisions is likely to continue during next 5 days," a meteorological department official said, adding, "He said hot and dry weather was also likely over hilly districts during these five days."

Hospitals Threaten To Halt 'Golden Card' Services Over Unpaid Funds

SRINAGAR: The empanelled private hospitals of Jammu and Kashmir have threatened to halt their services under the Ayushman Bharat scheme from June 1, 2024, due to non-receipt of funds since March this year.

According to details available with the news agency, the association of empanelled private hospitals has written to the Chief Secretary of J&K, stating their inability to continue services beyond the end of May 2024.

"The private hospitals and dialysis centres empanelled under the SEHAT scheme have not received any payment since March 15, 2024. We will be unable to continue with the said scheme beyond June 1, 2024," reads the letter, a copy of which is with KNO.

Private hospital owners have stated that they have exhausted



J&K, informed SHA authorities of their Pradhan decision not to renew the contract after its expiry on March 14, 2025. Initially, the scheme was implemented through Bajaj Allianz GIC.

whose contract ended in 2022. IFFCO-TOKIO was subsequently brought in but attempted to exit the scheme citing financial losses. Despite SHA's requests for them to continue in the interest of patient care, the company refused.

The SHA approached the High Court to stay the exit, but the peti-

tion was dismissed on February 2, complicating matters further for both SHA and beneficiaries across the union territory. The government has since approached the division bench to stay

financial strain, affecting their ability to provide services under the scheme. Hospital owners have

stated that starting June 1, they will not accept golden cards, and patients will need to pay for services. They have urged higher authorities to address the issue and release pending funds promptly. Officials from SHA assured that the scheme is functioning normally and that the ongoing dispute with the insurance company does not affect its implementation. Empanelled hospitals are aware that funds are allocated for them, though delays are expected due to the dispute.

Approximately 1,500 patients benefit from this scheme daily in J&K, and services will continue for these patients, according to officials.

Sanjiv M Gadkar, Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the State Health Agency, Jammu and Kashmir, told KNO that the matter is being resolved. "The matter is being resolved and will be done shortly," he said.

Fire Services Issue Fire Prevention Advisory Amid Heat Wave

Over 2500 Trout Fish Perish Due

SRINAGAR: Taking stock of situation and daily rise in fire incidents, Director Fire and Emergency Services (FES), Alok Kumar issued strict directions and advisory keeping in view the increasing temperatures and heat wave across UT especially Jammu province.

In view of the warning issued by the Jammu & Kashmir Disaster Management Authority (JKDMA), the FES department issued advisory for preventive measures to be taken from Fire Safety point of view in the public interest to minimize the losses due to fires.

The advisory reads as; Remove flammable materials such as piles of dust, leaves, sticks and cardboard from your living area as they may ignite under strong direct sunlight

Keep your cables tidy and do not overload sockets; Give the electric panels/ gadgets rest and cooling breaks after intervals. Trip off the electricity of the

houses when out of the premises. Avoid placing electric cables under furniture, carpets etc and near plastic sheets or flammable objects. Store matches and lighters out of children's sight and reach to avoid any mischief by children.

Avoid cooking during peak hours. Open doors and windows to ventilate cooking area adequately. Douse the cigarette butts with water and place them in a fire-proof container to safely dispose of after you are sure they have gone out.

Don't toss them on the ground. Extinguish fire pits and campfires when done. Pay attention to local ordinances for trash burning. Use caution when using flammable liquids.

Don't throw lit cigarettes carelessly out of your moving car.

Don't leave the trash/stubble in burning condition. Farmers shall avoid burning of trash/stubble. In case of urgency it shall be completely burnt in their presence and ensure that there is no chance of its re-ignition of fire.

MUMBAI: BCCI secretary Jay Shah on Friday rejected claims that the Board has approached any former Australian cricketer to be India's next head coach and hinted that Rahul Dravid's successor could be an Indian by saying that he should have a "deep understanding" of the game's structure in the country.

"Neither I nor the BCCI have approached any former Australian cricketer with a coaching offer. The reports circulating in certain media sections are completely incorrect," Shah said in a statement.

"I'd love to be a senior coach of a national team, but with the other things that I have in my life and wanting to have a bit of time at home...everyone knows if you take a job working with the Indian team you can't be involved in an IPL team, so it would take that out of it as well," he said.

ropean sides.
