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COUNTDOWN TO LOK SABHA VERDICT Modi Eyes Record-equalling Feat, **Oppn Hopes For Rebound**

New Delhi: Prime Minister Narendra Modi eyes a recordequalling third straight term in power amid the INDIA opposition bloc's hope of springing a surprise as the counting of votes for the Lok Sabha election is set for Tuesday, bringing an end to a marathon polling exercise stretching over 80 days.

While most experts have long seen the BJP-led National Democratic Alliance (NDA) as the favourite in the polls, a lot is at stake for the ruling combine in terms of the scale of victory it can pull off and new territories it can conquer. The opposition's stakes are higher still amid its reducing national footprint.

Exit polls have been, however, unanimous in their prediction that the NDA is closer to realising Modi's ambitious target of "400 paar" for his alliance than the INDIA bloc is to crossing even the 180 mark, one-third of the total number of seats.

Though electoral verdicts have historically been accepted, even though grudgingly, by all parties, there has been a sharper edge to the questions being raised by opposition parties this time over



the polling process, including the Election Commission (EC).

In the run-up to the counting, the campaign acrimony between the two battling camps has spilled over into the post-poll trading of accusations after the exit polls predicted a massive win for the incumbent alliance, a forecast summarily dismissed by Congress leader Rahul Gandhi as "Modi media poll".

INDIA bloc leaders, who have been raising doubts over the electronic voting machines (EVMs), have accused the prime minister of sending a signal to the bureaucracy through these "fantasy" exit polls and marched to the EC, urging the poll watchdog to follow the counting guidelines.

In its counter-attack, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has accused its rivals of trying to undermine the integrity of India's electoral process and asked the EC to prevent any attempt of "violence and unrest" during the counting of votes.

Here's How Votes Are Counted

New Delhi: The counting of votes for the Lok Sabha elections will be taken up on Tuesday. Here is a brief overview of the counting process.

Under Rule 54 A of the Conduct of Elections Rules 1961, the counting of postal ballot papers shall be started first at the Returning Officer's (RO) table.

- Only such postal ballot papers shall be taken up for counting which are received by the RO before the hour fixed for the commencement of counting.
- After 30 minutes of the commencement of counting of postal ballots, the counting of votes from EVMs should be started.
- Counting of votes from EVMs can begin on scheduled time if there is no postal ballot paper in the constituency.
- Only Control Unit (CU) of the EVM used in polling station is required for counting of votes along with Form 17C.
- Before ascertaining the result from CUs of EVMs, counting officials shall ensure that the paper seal on them is intact and total votes polled tally with those mentioned in Form 17C.
- The result of the control unit shall be noted in Part-II of Form 17C after showing it to counting supervisor, micro observer and counting agents of candidates.
- In case of non-display of results in the display panel of the control unit, VVPAT slips of the respective VVPAT shall be counted after completion of all CUs count.
- Candidate-wise result of each CU shall be noted in Part II of Form 17C and signed by the counting supervisor and counting agents of candidates present at the counting table. More on P10

Stray Dog Issue Complicated, **Needs Coordinated Action: HC**

Says Authorities Can't Leave It Entirely On NGOs, Seeks Compliance Of Various Decisions Taken By Them

Srinagar: Observing that the issue relating to stray dogs is "complicated", the High Court of J&K and Ladakh has called for "very coordinated action" from various agencies and authorities including NGOs working in the field to deal with it.

However, a division bench of Chief Justice N. Kotiswar Singh and Justice Wasim Sadiq underlined that it cannot entirely be left in the hands of the NGOs to cope with it.

Hearing a Public Interest Litigation, the Division Bench directed authorities to report to the court as to how effectively various decisions taken can be carried out.

"The issue relating to stray dogs is certainly a complicated one, which would require very coordinated action from various agencies and authorities including NGOs working in the field and cannot be dealt with in a simple manner," the court said, observing that as far as UT of Jammu and Kashmir was concerned, a State Implementation Level

Monitoring and Committee has been constituted to monitor the various issues relating to street dogs and its 3rd Meeting was held on 13 February this year.

The committee, comprising commissioners of SMC and JMC, took a number of decisions and were reproduced by the court in its order.

SRINAGAR: The Returning Officer (RO) for 02-Srinagar Lok-Sabha constituency, Dr Bilal Mohi-ud-Din Bhat Monday assured transparent vote counting in Srinagar, saying Election Commission of India (ECI) guidelines specifically address the need for transparent, free, and fair counting. Addressing media at Sheri Kash-

mir International Convocation Centre (SKICC), the ECI designated counting centre for Srinagar PC, the RO said that elaborate security arrangements have been put in place in and around the venue to

ensure peaceful counting. A five member ECI team has also arrived here to inspect the arrangements, according to Dr Bilal, who is also the Deputy Commissioner (DC) Srinagar, adding 18 counting halls have been set up at SKICC and that the Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs) of all eighteen assembly constituencies have been safelt stored in a strong room.

As overseers, it is our responsibility to conduct the vote counting in compliance with ECI guidelines and it must be made sure the process ends peacefully. Besides intricate security arrangements, special facilities for polling staff and polling agents have also been made,



the RO said.

He said the counting for 02-Srinagar parliamentary constituency will begin at 8am tomorrow with counting to be started from ETPPS and postal ballot boxes.

"Polling staff consisting of 800 members will oversee the process. 18 halls have been set up at SKICC, each of which has eight counting tables. A micro observer, a counting assistant and a supervisor would be stationed at each table. 800 permits were provided by the administration to the polling agents of the contesting candidates so they could witness the exceptionally transparent table-by-table

counting," said Dr Bilal.

He said all the preparations necessary for a counting centre as per ECI guidelines, whether from the RO side or security viewpoint, have been completed.

The candidates who contested the just concluded Lok-Sabha elections, he said, were allowed to assign one agent to each counting table, and that agents were required to report to SKICC by 6:30 am.

'We have made elaborate arrangements for them (polling agents) as well. Given the intense heat, a temporary tent has been erected for them. Lunch, juice, and water will also be provided," the RO said.



Gaza Conditions 'Unspeakable' As 1 Million Flee Rafah: UN

Gaza: The city of Rafah on Gaza's southern border with Egypt had been home to well over a million forcibly displaced by nearly eight months of daily bombardment by the Israeli military, in response to Hamas-led terror attack in southern Israel on 7 October.

"Thousands of families now shelter in damaged and destroyed facilities in Khan Younis, where UNRWA keeps providing essential services, despite increasing challenges Conditions are unspeakable,' the UN agency said in a post on X, formerly Twitter.

The development comes three days since US President Joe Biden unveiled a ceasefire proposal based on a phased end to the war, reportedly involving the withdrawal of Israeli forces from built-up areas, the release of Israeli hostages and Palestinian prisoners, along with a plan for Gaza reconstruction.

According to UNRWA, thousands of families have been forced to seek shelter in badly damaged buildings in Khan Younis. The city, which is just north of Rafah, is estimated to be home to some 1.7 million people. All 36 of UNRWA's shelters in Rafah are now empty, it reported.

The UN agency has con-

tinued to provide basic humanitarian relief despite the increasingly difficult conditions, illustrated by one photograph of a young girl sitting alone on a rubble-strewn stairwell and another showing huge mounds of rubble and twisted metal next to a largely unscathed building.

Some 690,000 women and girls are believed to lack basic menstrual hygiene kits, privacy and drinking water, UNRWA said.

Ex-BrahMos Engineer Gets Life Imprisonment For Spying For Pak's ISI

Nagpur: The Nagpur district court on Monday handed life imprisonment to former BrahMos Aerospace Pvt Ltd engineer Nishant Agarwal under the Official Secrets Act for spying for Pakistan's intelligence agency ISI

Agarwal will also have to undergo rigorous imprisonment (RI) for 14 years and was also fined 3,000.

Additional sessions court judge MV Deshpande stated in the order that Agarwal was convicted under section 235 of the Criminal Procedure Code for an offence punishable under section 66 (f) of the IT Act and various sections of the Official Secrets Act (OSA).

"The court sentenced Agarwal to life imprisonment and for 14 years under the Official Secrets Act and fined him

New Delhi: After a marginal dip in the maximum temperature, the mercury again started rising as the capital recorded a high of 44.7 degrees Celsius, five notches above normal, on Monday, according to the India Meteorological Department (IMD).

On Sunday, the city recorded a maximum temperature of 42.8 degrees Celsius and was on vellow alert, according to the IMD bulletin.

In Delhi, the other weather stations recorded the following temperatures: Najafgarh 46.9 degrees Celsius, Narela 46.9 degrees Celsius, Aya Nagar

45.1 degrees Celsius, Ridge 44.9 degrees Celsius and Palam 44.8 degrees Celsius

Relative humidity oscillated between 20 per cent and 39 per cent on Monday.

The maximum and minimum temperatures on Monday are likely to reach 44 and 31 degrees Celsius, respectively.

The weather office has predicted a partly cloudy sky with heatwave conditions in many places, the possibility of a thunderstorm or dust storm with very light rain, accompanied by strong surface winds with speed of 25 to 35 kmph on Tuesday.

The capital will be on orange alert on Tuesday.

GENEVA: A group of United Nations experts called on Monday for all countries to recognize a Palestinian state to ensure peace in the Middle East.

The call came less than a week after Spain, Ireland and Norway officially recognized

a Palestinian state, prompting anger from Israel, which has found itself increasingly isolated after nearly eight months of war in Gaza. The experts, including the UN Special Rapporteur on the

human rights situation in the Palestinian territories, said recognition of a Palestinian state was an important acknowledgement of the rights of the Palestinian people and their struggle toward freedom and independence.

"This is a pre-condition for lasting peace in Palestine and the entire Middle East - beginning with the immediate declaration of a ceasefire in Gaza and no further military incursions into Rafah," they said.

"A two-state solution remains the only internationally agreed path to peace and security for both Palestine and Israel and a way out of generational cycles of violence and resentment.'

Israel's Foreign Ministry did not respond immediately to a request for comment.

With their recognition of a Palestinian state, Spain, Ireland and Norway said they sought to accelerate efforts to secure a ceasefire in Israel's war with Hamas in Gaza. The three countries say

they hope their decision will spur other European Union states to follow suit. Denmark's parliament later rejected a proposal to recognize a Palestinian state.

Israel has repeatedly condemned moves to recognize a Palestinian state, saying they bolster Hamas, the militant Islamist group that led the deadly Oct. 7 attack on Israel which sparked the Israeli offensive in the Gaza Strip.

The conflict has killed more than 36,000 Palestinians, according to Gaza's health ministry. Israel says the Oct. 7 attack, the worst in its 75-year history, killed 1,200 people, with more than 250 hostages taken.

He said that questions were raised on flaws in the electoral rolls, on the efficacy of the EVMs and the alleged fudging of voter turnout figures. The CEC said while the one making allegations was present in the court (kachahari), there was no "gavah"

Sericulture Deptt issues Advisory for Silkworm Rearers

SRINAGAR: The rise in day temperatures has raised concerns about potential outbreaks of diseases affecting silkworm larvae in various areas of the Kashmir Division.

As silkworm rearing is at its peak stage, extra care is essential until cocoon formation. In response, an advisory has been issued for silkworm rearers, providing critical recommendations for successful silkworm rearing and cocoon production.

As per the statement issued here, rearers are advised to avoid overcrowding the silkworm larvae and ensure adequate spacing for healthy growth. It is crucial to feed the larvae with fresh, quality mulberry leaves while avoid-ing soiled, over-stored, or dirty leaves. Additionally, insecticidesprayed leaves should not be fed to the silkworms. Harvesting or picking of mulberry leaves from plants in and around orchards is



NHAI's Revised Toll Rates Come To Effect Across Highways



NEW DELHI: The revised toll charges for motorists on national highways across the country have come to effect from Monday, an official said.

The National Highways Au-thority of India (NHAI) has hiked the toll charges by an average of 5 per cent.

The hike is part of NHAI's annual exercise where the stateowned body calculates new rates factoring in several parameters, the senior NHAI official told PTI.

Every year, it is implemented from April 1 but this year the implementation was deferred due to general elections. The average hike this time was 5 per cent. The revised user fee has been implemented from today, the official said.

From Monday, motorists using

national highways/expressways will have to shell out more money for their road journeys.

The fuel costs were already high. The increased toll rates will make road journeys costlier for people," said Ankur Saxena, an advertising professional who frequently travels through Delhi-Lucknow route.

The toll fee is revised annually, taking into accounts the changes in the wholesale price index (CPI)-based inflation.

There are around 855 user fee plazas on the national highway network on which user fee is levied as per the National Highways Fee (Determination of Rates and Collection) Rules, 2008.

Out of these, around 675 are public-funded fee plazas and 180 are operated by concessionaires.

JAMMU: The traffic on 270km Jammu-Srinagar national highway remained suspended between Ramban and Banihal stretch on Monday night for urgent repairs, a traffic department official said ..

The vehicular traffic from both sides on the highway, the only all weather road linking Kashmir with rest of the country, will remain suspended from 6 pm Monday till the completion of the repair work, the official said.

He said the decision was taken on the intimation of the National Highway Authority of India (NHAI) which is carrying out urgent repair and maintenance work between Ramban and Banihal during the intervening night of Monday and Tuesday.

"All type of vehicular movement will remain suspended tonight. No movement of any kind of vehicle, including those carrying perishable items or livestock will be allowed on NH-44 after 6 pm from Qazigund towards Ramban," the official said.

"Similarly, vehicular no movement shall be allowed from Nagrota (Jammu) after pm and Udhampur at 6 pm. Commuters are advised to avoid journey on NH-44 till the work is completed," he added. A high-level combined team

of officers from the NHAI, traffic, police and Ramban district administration recently inspected the highway and identified 17 vulnerable points between Nashri and Banihal for urgent repairs to ensure free flow of traffic.

On May 30, Chief Secretary Atal Dulloo set deadline of June 10 for streamlining of riding surface and ensuring two way traffic movement on the highway in view of the upcoming annual Amarnath yatra and fruit season in the Union Territory.





IMAM KHOMEINI AND ISLAMIC UNITY

ne of the great divine blessings and favours of mankind is the subject of 'Human Unity and Solidarity'. Unity and solidarity are intrinsic, rational, religious, political and social necessities that are of the most critical factors for the survival of a society, and the human civilization. It is difficult to write about the subject of great importance - Imam Khomeini and Islamic Unity - as it is very hard to judge the conduct of those who change the course of history. The ones who climb to the roof of the world's history and usher marvellous events that affect the destiny of millions of people at their era and beyond. They thus not only rid themselves of the dark and tiring of a Boring Life, but lead their societies to 'peaks of pride and dignity'.

Very often the reality of great men remains undiscovered, either amid the extreme light of hollow praise and admiration of their devotees, or lost in the deep and frightening darkness of their so worn enemies' poisonous propagation and even curses. One among them is the Imam Khomeini. The depth of the souls of multifaceted personalities, like Imam Khomeini, who became founder of consequential evolutions in the course of the development of human thought and Islamic Unity remains concealed. At a time when the world is full of fake information spread through the web, there is another side which can introduce concealed personalities like Imam Khomeini to the world. Recent misinformation and even disrespect by an academic publication towards this historical figure of the 20th Century needs thorough research and correction by academia. Calling Imam Khomeini an "evil" itself speaks a lot about how truth is concealed or presented with *distortion* to the larger masses of the globe.

Imam Khomeini repeatedly emphasized on the rational and spiritual need for unity and solidarity among humans in general and Muslims and Islamic societies in particular and at times referred to unity as "Divine Obligation". In his view, discord and disunity is considered to be among the most important factors for deviation, defeat, weakness and backwardness of society. This issue can be proven and analysed both from historic as well as the theoretical aspects. In the present globalised world too, the Islamic world has suffered from profound and suicidal differences as a result of the 'Alien Conspiracies' and numerous other factors which facilitated the circumstances for their influence on Muslim Societies

In the last few centuries, efforts towards unifying Muslims were begun by ideologies such as Sayyed Jamalludin Asadabadi and Muhammad Abduh and various other prominent personalities from across the Islamic societies rose in support of these two men and chanted the slogan of 'Unity'. As a great theoretician, philosopher, theologian as well as the leader of the oppressed, Imam Khomeini has analysed this issue on various dimensions from a unique perspective and has taken practical steps towards realization of unity in Islamic societies.

Among the steps and efforts made by Imam Khomeini on the subject of Islamic Unity, one can mention various verdicts on this issue, especially the Treatise on Solidarity with other Sects, Revival of the Joint Friday Congregational Prayer, and Declaration of the Global Al-Quds Day.

Meaning of Unity

While defining unity, Imam Khomeini considers:

"Unity and Unanimity as gathering, becoming One, moving in One Single Direction, possessing Unified Objective together on a Single Issue".

He regards Muslims to have a mission to establish friendship, ties of kinship and to do well to one another as well as establish camaraderie and fraternity.

Essence of Unity

In order to analyse the essence of unity, one must take note of its characteristics and special features from the viewpoint of Imam Khomeini. Let's simply point some general characteristics of unity from his point of view:

1. Gripping at the rope of God.

- 2. Unity of Expression and Faith.
- 3. Unity of Action.

Levels of Unity

From the viewpoint of Imam Khomeini, Islamic Unity can be achieved under different levels:

- Unity at the Global level or Unity of Mankind.
- 2. Unity of the followers of the Divine religions or Unity of the Faithful.
- 3. Unity of the Weaker and the Oppressed Classes of the Society.
- Unity at the level of the Centre of Islam or Unity of Muslims in Islamic World.
- 5. Unity at the Country Level or Unity of Nationality.

Divine and Religious Obligation of the 'Sanctity of Unity'

Observance of Unity becomes a 'Religious Obligation' – especially in places where the more general interests are in danger. In special and critical circumstances, Imam Khomeini considers absence of unity to be a kind of 'Self-annihilation' and 'Mass Suicide'. At times, he also regards disunity and discord to be among the 'Cardinal Sins' and as betrayal of Islam because it creates a 'void of power of Islam 'that will result in the defeat of Islam and Muslims. Present situation in Palestine is the best example of the contemporary world.

Islamic Brotherhood

Based on the Islamic viewpoint, the relationship that is established between the faithful pious is known as '*Fraternity*' or *Brotherhood*'. By referring to Brotherhood, Imam Khomeini also stresses that, path to gain "liberation of mind" lies in the existence of such a brotherhood and fraternity. The path to preservation and perpetuation of civilization and the protection of the nation lies in the 'bond between brotherhood and real unity based on affinity among the individuals of the society', and this itself is a 'Socio-canonical Duty'. According to Imam Khomeini, the main foundation of Islamic Brotherhood is: 'General Expedience of the Islamic Nation'.

CONCLUSION.

Shunning weak and baseless differences that destroy the foundations, are rejected by every healthy mind and indeed, are one of 'the great sins of social and civic life' and are a factor of defeat and corruption in society. The world torn with disunity and discord needs healing. Based on what has been mentioned earlier, the essence of unity from the point of view of Imam Khomeini constitutes 'Unity that is essential for safeguarding the Human Values'. As Imam Khomeini says:

"Muslim nations should come together and compel their governments to stop sowing discord and stop safeguarding the interests of the foreign invaders. They should attain the path of honour and dignity, happiness, uniformity and brotherhood and above all Eternal Happiness".

Empathy is Complex

How do people successfully interact with those who are completely different from them? And can these differences create social barriers? Social scientists are struggling with these questions because the mental processes underlying social interactions are not well understood.


One recent concept that has become increasingly popular is the "double-empathy problem". This draws on research looking at people who are known to experience social difficulties, such as autistic people.

The theory proposes that people who have very different identities and communication styles from each other – which is often the case for autistic and non-autistic people – can find it harder to empathise with one another. This twoway difficulty is what they mean by the double-empathy problem.

This idea is getting a lot of attention. Research on the double-empathy problem has rapidly grown over the past decade. This is because it has the potential to explain why different people in society might struggle to empathise with one another, potentially leading to personal and societal problems; from poor mental health to inter-group tensions and systemic racism.

But is this idea accurate? Our recent paper suggests that things might be much more complicated than that.

Our analysis suggests that the doubleempathy theory has many shortcomings. It highlights that there is widespread confusion surrounding the very fuzzy concept of double empathy. The research has also narrowly focused on social difficulties in autism without considering other



social identity factors that affect empathy between different groups, such as gender.

The theory also fails to incorporate the psychological neuroscience of empathy. Instead, it confuses the concept of empathy – that is, psychologically feeling the emotions that other people are feeling – with similar but different phenomena, such as "mentalising" (understanding what people are thinking from a different perspective).

Because the double-empathy theory is not well developed, most experiments

testing it are muddled. Many researchers claim to be studying double empathy when they do not measure empathy. Meanwhile, other studies are being used as evidence of double empathy despite never having set out to test this theory.

Double-empathy research has also heavily relied on subjective reports of people's experiences (rather than evaluation by experts), which may not tell the whole story.

Altogether, the analysis of existing research indicates that the central claim of the double-empathy theory is not well supported. That is, being similar in identity to other people does not necessarily mean that you have more empathy for them.

This is an important issue that needs urgent attention. There are already signs that the double-empathy theory is being put into practice, despite lacking evidence. Certain researchers and doctors have started claiming that, because there is a double-empathy problem, healthcare professionals are generally unable to understand their patients with social difficulties. But there is no reliable evidence for this.

Looking ahead, there is a need for more neuroscientific research on social interaction. We expect that brain imaging technologies, such as "hyperscanning" – scanning multiple human brains at the same time – will help shed light on how different people's brains interact with each other. For example, this technique can be used to test how similarity between people who interact may influence their brain activity.

To make breakthroughs in this area, this technique could be used alongside artificial intelligence. Exploring whether machines can truly empathise with humans by seeing if they accurately interpret our brain waves will be of great interest.

The benefits of diversity

It is thought that people living in more socially diverse places, such as large cities, tend to be more tolerant of those who are different from them than people who live in socially homogeneous places. They ultimately perceive themselves and others as belonging to the same local community despite ethnic and cultural differences and appear to be better at considering the perspective of others.

This suggests that spending time with people who are different to us can perhaps boost our empathy – something that the double-empathy theory does not predict. Ultimately, empathy is not just down to our ability to understand someone through their similarity. Spending time with those from other social and cultural backgrounds may make us place less emphasis on differences – and discover common ground in other areas.

Human experience is vast and complex. Just because two people come from different cultures or have different communication styles does not mean they cannot be very similar in other ways. Perhaps their values align or they have similar interests. This insight could have the potential to remove some barriers that may otherwise make it difficult to understand and empathise with others.

And, sometimes, people from similar backgrounds struggle to understand each other, yet can have great empathy for people who are completely different from them (for example, refugees fleeing war-torn countries). Why? The doubleempathy theory may not be the best way to make progress, but it might serve as a springboard for future research to answer this and other questions.

We could really harness the social science of empathy to understand these incredibly complex social issues. This might ultimately reduce societal conflict and improve social cohesion – but we must get research on the right track to achieve this potential.

Cancer Patients Often Do Better With Less Intensive Treatment, New Research Finds

caling back treatment for three kinds of cancer can make life easier for patients without compromising outcomes, doctors reported at the world's largest cancer conference.

It's part of a long-term trend toward studying whether doing less — less surgery, less chemotherapy or less radia- $\operatorname{tion}-\operatorname{can}\operatorname{help}\operatorname{patients}\operatorname{live}\operatorname{longer}\operatorname{and}$ feel better. The latest studies involved ovarian and esophageal cancer and Hodgkin lymphoma.

Thirty years ago, cancer research was about doing more, not less. In one sobering example, women with advanced breast cancer were pushed to the brink of death with massive doses of chemotherapy and bone marrow transplants. The approach didn't work any better than chemotherapy and patients suffered.

Now, in a quest to optimise cancer care, researchers are asking: "Do we need all that treatment that we have used in the past?"

It's a question, "that should be asked over and over again," said Dr. Tatjana Kolevska, medical director for the Kaiser



Permanente National Cancer Excellence Programme, who was not involved in the new research.

Often, doing less works because of improved drugs. "The good news is that cancer treatment is not only becoming more effective, it's becoming easier to tolerate and associ-

ated with less short-term and long-term complications," said Dr. William G. Nelson of Johns Hopkins School of Medicine, who was also not involved in the new research.

Studies demonstrating the trend were discussed over the weekend at an American Society of Clinical Oncology conference in Chicago. Here are the highlights:

OVARIAN CANCER

French researchers found that it's safe to avoid removing lymph nodes that appear healthy during surgery for advanced ovarian cancer. The study compared the results for 379 patients — half had their lymph nodes removed and half did not. After nine years, there was no difference in how long the patients lived and those with lessextreme surgery had fewer complications, such as the need for blood transfusions. The research was funded by the National Institute of Cancer in France.

ESOPHAGEAL CANCER

This German study looked at 438 people with a type of cancer of the esophagus that can be treated with surgery. Half received a common treatment plan that included chemotherapy and surgery on the esophagus, the tube that carries food from the throat to the stomach. Half got another approach that includes radiation too. Both techniques are considered standard. Which one patients get can depend on where they get treatment.

After three years, 57 per cent of those who got chemo and surgery were alive, compared to 51 per cent of those who got chemo, surgery and radiation. The German Research Foundation funded the study.

HODGKIN LYMPHOMA

A comparison of two chemotherapy regimens for advanced Hodgkin lymphoma found the less intensive treatment was more effective for the blood cancer and caused fewer side effects.

After four years, the less harsh chemo kept the disease in check in 94 per cent of people, compared to 91 per cent of those who had the more intense treatment. The trial included 1,482 people in nine countries — Germany, Austria, Switzerland, the Netherlands, Denmark, Sweden, Norway, Australia and New Zealand - and was funded by Takeda Oncology, the maker of one of the drugs used in the gentler chemo that was studied.

Cut Marks On 4,000-Yr-Old Skulls Show Ancient Egyptians Tried To Treat Cancer

Ancient Egyptians attempted to operate on excessive tissue growth or learn more about cancerous disorders after a patient's death, revealed a study on

two 4,000-year-old skulls. Known to be the place of one of the early civilisations,

ancient Egyptians have been known to identify, describe, and treat diseases and traumatic injuries, build prostheses, and put in dental fillings. To understand their fur-

ther prowess, an international team of researchers studied two human skulls-male and female and each thousands of years old. The cut marks on the

skulls revealed the extent of traumatological and oncological treatments practised by the ancient Egyptians, they said in the paper published in the journal Frontiers in Medicine.

Edgard Camaros, a paleopathologist at the University of Santiago de Compostela in Spain called the discovery "unique and extraordinary" evidence of how ancient Egyptian medicine would have tried to deal with or explore cancer more than 4,000 years ago.

The two skulls-Skull and Mandible 236, dating from between 2687 and 2345 BCE, belonged to a male individual aged 30 to 35, while Skull E270, dating from between 663 and 343 BCE, belonged to



a female individual who was older than 50 years.

Microscopic observation of skull 236 showed a bigsized lesion consistent with excessive tissue destruction.

known as neoplasm. Further, there were also 30 or so small and round metastasised lesions scattered across the skull, with cut marks probably made by a

sharp object such as a metal instrument.

'When we first observed the cut marks under the microscope, we could not believe what was in front of us," said Tatiana Tondini, a researcher at the University of Tubingen in Germany.

Analysis of Skull E270 also showed a big lesion consistent with a cancerous tumour that led to bone destruction, and two lesions from traumatic injuries that received treatment.

"This may indicate that although today's lifestyle and cancer-causing substances in the environment increase cancer risk, it was also a common pathology in the past," the team said.

FSSAI Asks Food Biz To Remove Claim Of 100% Fruit Juice From Ads, Packaging Labels

NEW DELHI: Food regulator FSSAI has asked food business operators to immediately remove claims of 100 per cent fruit juices in advertisements as well as labels on packaged products.

According to an official state-ment, Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) has issued a "directive mandating all Food Business Operators (FBOs) to remove any claim of '100% fruit juices' from the labels and advertisements of reconstituted fruit juices with an immediate effect.

All the FBOs have also been instructed to exhaust all existing pre-printed packaging materials before 1st September 2024. "It has come to the attention of FSSAI that several FBOs have been inaccurately marketing various types of reconstituted fruit juices by claiming them to be 100 per cent fruit juices," the statement said.

Upon thorough examination, FSSAI has concluded that, according to the Food Safety and Standards (Advertising and Claims) Regulations, 2018, there is no provision for making a '100%' claim.

Such claims are misleading, particularly under conditions where the major ingredient of the fruit juice is water and the primary ingredient, for which the claim is made, is present only in limited concentrations, or when the fruit juice is reconstituted using water and fruit

concentrates or pulp," FSSAI

said. FBOs have been told to comply with the standards for fruit juices as specified under subregulation 2.3.6 of the Food Safety and Standards (Food Products Standards & Food Additives) Regulation, 2011.

"This regulation states that products covered by this standard must be labelled in accordance with the Food Safety and Standards (Labelling and Display) Regulations, 2020," the statement said.

Specifically, in the ingredient list, the word "reconstituted" must be mentioned against the name of the juice that is reconstituted from the concentrate. "Additionally, if added nutritive sweeteners exceed 15 gm/kg, the product must be labelled as 'Sweetened juice',"

the regulator said. FSSAI said it is dedicated to protecting and promoting public health through the regulation and supervision of food safety standards across the country.

Sensex, Nifty Log Biggest Single-Day Gain In 3 Yrs As Exit Polls **Predict 3rd Term For Modi Govt**

MUMBAI: After the exit polls predicted the return of the Modi government for the third straight term, benchmark Sensex and Nifty zoomed more than 3 per cent on Monday, recording their biggest single-day gain in three years and closing at lifetime highs. The 30-share BSE Sensex

soared by 2,507.47 points or 3.39 per cent to settle at a new closing peak of 76,468.78 points with 25 of its constituents ending in the green and five in the red. During the day, the barometer jumped 2,777.58 points or 3.75 per cent to hit a record intra-day peak of 76,738.89. The NSE Nifty climbed

733.20 points or 3.25 per cent to finish at 23,263.90. During the day, it soared 808 points or 3.58 per cent to hit a fresh intra-day all-time high of 23,338.70.

Sensex and Nifty logged their biggest single-day gains since February 1, 2021, when indices had jumped nearly 5% after the budget presentation. Interestingly, Sensex and Nifty had spurted more than 3 per cent on May 20, 2019, after the exit polls predicted a major win BJP-led NDA in the 2019 general elections.

Among sectors, PSUs, Power, Utilities, Oil, Energy, Capital Goods, and Realty indices soared up to 8 per cent.

A sharp rally in blue-chip stocks Reliance Industries, ICICI Bank, HDFC Bank and State Bank of India propelled the indices to lifetime high levels. Strong GDP data also added to the buoyancy in eq-

India's Manufacturing Sector Growth Eases In May: PMI Survey

NEW DELHI- India's manufacturing sector saw a slower growth rate for the second straight month in May but stayed firmly in expansion mode with global sales increasing to the greatest extent in over 13 years, a monthly survey said on Monday.

seasonally adjusted The India Manufacturing HSBC Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI) fell from 58.8 in April to 57.5 in May, signalling a slower but substantial improvement in the health of the sector.


The index had climbed to a 16-year high of 59.1 in March. In PMI parlance, a print above 50 means expansion while a score below 50 denotes



its long-run average.

May data showed a further upturn in Indian factory production, which stretched the current sequence of expansion to nearly three years.

Despite easing to a threemonth low, the rate of increase remained sharp. Growth was supported by new business gains, demand strength and successful marketing efforts, the report said. New orders rose at a substantial pace that was nonetheless the slowest in three months. The rise was associated with marketing efforts, demand strength and favourable economic conditions, as per the report. Growth was reportedly stymied by competitions and election-related disruptions, it said, adding that in contrast to the trend for total sales, new export orders rose at a faster pace in May. The upturn in international sales was the strongest in over 13 years as manufacturers witnessed gains from customers across several countries in Africa, Asia, the Americas, Europe, and the Middle East.

₹2,000 Notes Worth ₹7,755 Crore Still With Public: RBI

NEW DELHI: The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) on Monday said 97.82 per cent of the ₹2000 denomination banknotes have returned to the banking system, and only ₹7,755 crore worth of the withdrawn notes are still with the public.

On May 19, 2023, the RBI announced the withdrawal of ₹2000 denomina-



tion banknotes from circulation.

The total value of ₹2000 banknotes in circulation, which was ₹3.56 lakh crore at the close of business on May 19, 2023, has declined to ₹7,755 crore at the close of business on May 31, 2024

"Thus, 97.82 per cent of the ₹2000

banknotes in circulation as on May 19, 2023, has since been returned," the central bank said in a statement.

The facility for deposit and/or exchange of the ₹2000 banknotes was available at all bank branches in the country till October 7, 2023.

The facility for the exchange of the ₹2000 banknotes has been available at the 19 issue offices of the Reserve Bank since May 19, 2023.

From October 9, 2023, RBI issue offices are also accepting ₹2000 banknotes from individuals and entities for deposit into their bank accounts.

Further, members of the public are sending ₹2000 banknotes through India Post from any post office within the country to any of the RBI issue offices for credit to their bank accounts.

The 19 RBI offices depositing/exchanging the banknotes are in Ahmed-Bengaluru, Belapur, Bhopal, abad, Bhubaneswar, Chandigarh, Chennai, Guwahati, Hyderabad, Jaipur, Jammu, Kanpur, Kolkata, Lucknow, Mumbai, Nagpur, New Delhi, Patna and Thiruvananthapuram.

The ₹2000 banknotes were introduced in November 2016, following the demonetisation of the then-prevailing ₹1000 and ₹500 banknotes.

Modi Eyes Record

the opposition's "appeasement politics", accusing the Congress and its allies of handing over a chunk of the reservation meant for the Other Backward Classes (OBC) to Muslims and allegedly eying people's family assets to further its "redistribution of wealth" agenda.

The issues of national and cultural pride, the government's welfare schemes and the overall political stability and economic growth also figured prominently in the speeches of BJP leaders, even though they were accused by the opposition of running a divisive and communal campaign to polarise votes.

The EC has dismissed the opposition's attack on its conduct of polls, with Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) Rajiv Kumar daring it on Monday to share evidence of attempts to influence the polling process.

The results will show if the Congress has it in its organisation and leadership to challenge the BJP amid its reducing footprint across the country since 2014. It has failed to get even the main opposition party status in two consecutive Lok Sabha polls and has been reduced to a pale shadow of itself in a number of states, especially in the Hindi heartland.

Its leaders, including president Mallikarjun Kharge and principal campaigner Rahul Gandhi, have claimed that their alliance will get 295 seats in the 543-member Lok Sabha, marking an end of the Modi era.

INDIA bloc leaders believe that their alliance has been able to shape the poll narrative around its planks of welfarism and an alleged threat to the Constitution from an all-powerful saffron onslaught, and will get popular support.

Modi will equal the country's first prime minister Jawaharlal Nehru's record of leading his party to three straight electoral victories if the BJP retains power.

An uncertain future also hangs over the fate of the Left, besides many regional parties including the Trinamool Congress (TMC), Biju Janata Dal (BJD) and YSR Congress, which are in power in West Bengal, Odisha and Andhra Pradesh respectively.

Modi has spearheaded a concerted BJP push to gain further in strength in the two eastern states, where the party surprised everyone by emerging as the powerful second force in 2019, and the exit polls have suggested that it may topple the two regional parties from the top position in these polls.

Assembly polls were held in Odisha alongside the national election and the BJP and the BJD, which has been in power in the state since 2000 under Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik's leadership, are locked in a fierce battle for power. Assembly polls were also held simultaneously in the YSRCP-ruled Andhra Pradesh.

Another issue that has drawn the limelight is whether the BJP will be able to emerge as a strong force in Tamil Nadu and the Left-ruled Kerala, two states where it has currently no seats but is predicted to win a few this time.

A poor show by the Left will further darken its prospects nationwide as Kerala is the only state where it remains a strong force after being knocked of reckoning in its former strongholds of Bengal and Tripura.

Always confident of his return to power, Modi has already penned an article about his vision for the country, posted on X about people's support to the NDA and rejection of the opposition, and held a meeting with top officials on the "new government's agenda" for the first 100 days.

The results are also expected to spell out the people's verdict on the fate of regional stalwarts like Sharad Pawar and Uddhay Thackeray, whose parties have joined hands with the BJP and who have run an intense campaign to win over people's support for their factions. The verdict will also be out on a number of Union ministers, including Piyush Goyal, Bhupender Yaday, Sarbananda Sonowal and Dharmendra Pradhan, all Rajya Sabha members asked by the BJP to contest the polls, and former chief ministers, such as the BJP's Shivraj Singh Chouhan, Basavaraj Bommai, Trivendra Singh Rawat and the Congress's Digvijay Singh and Bhupesh Baghel. Besides Modi, who contested the election from Varanasi for a third straight term, senior members of his cabinet, such as Amit Shah and Rajnath Singh, are in the fray, and the margins of their win will be watched out for as well.

Section 144 has been imposed outside the counting centers, which will remain in effect until June 5. Jammu parliamentary seat will take place at MAM College Jammu and Polytechnic Vikram Chowk. Talking to reporters in Jammu on Saturday, Director General of Police (DGP) RR Swain had said that each counting centre is under the 24x7 surveillance of the CCTVs while there are at least two companies of security forces deployed for securing the counting centre. The DGP had stated that there will be multi-layer security cover at every counting centre.

A tight vigil has been maintained around the strong rooms where electronic voting machines have been kept since the close of polling in respective constituencies.

Polls for the five parliamentary constituencies in the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir were held in as many phases -- April 19, April 26, May 13, May 20 and May 25.

Ahead of the counting of votes, the Returning Officers of the constituencies have held meetings with contesting candidates, election agents and representatives of political parties contesting in each of the Lok Sabha seats to familiarise them with the standard procedure of counting process prescribed by the Election Commission of India (ECI).

The returning officer informed the participants about the sequence and procedures of the counting, including handling of EVMs, VVPATs, and the process of the Electronically Transmitted Postal Ballot System (ETPBS).

An official spokesman said regular announcements would be made through the public address system at the counting hall on the counting day.

There are 66 candidates in the fray for the three Lok Sabha seats of Kashmir valley. Among the key candidates for the three seats are president of PDP Mehbooba Mufti, vice president of National Conference Omar Abdullah, separatist turned mainstream politician Sajad Gani Lone and former MLA Sheikh Abdul Rashid alias Engineer Rashid, who is currently lodged in Tihar jail in a UAPA case.

While Mufti is up against prominent Gujjar and National Conference leader Mian Altaf Ahmad in Anantnag-Rajouri seat, Abdullah, Lone and Rashid are locked in a virtual triangular contest for the Baramulla Lok Sabha seat.

In the prestigious Srinagar Lok Sabha seat, both National Conference and the PDP have fielded young faces in Aga Roohullah and Waheed Para respectively.

Kashmir valley has witnessed record turnout in these Lok Sabha polls with more than 50 per cent of the electorate exercising their franchise.

Three-tier Security Deployed

A day ahead of the counting of votes for the Jammu and Udhampur Lok Sabha constituencies along with rest of the country, three-tier security has been activated in and around the counting centres in the two districts. problem on the security front, it should be immediately brought to our knowledge," he told reporters.

Choudhary said that enhanced security has been deployed along the International Border (IB) and inter-district checkpoints to monitor and prevent any anti-social or anti-national activities.

The counting center for Udhampur Lok Sabha seat is set up at the Government Degree College Kathua, equipped with multi-tier security and 24×7 CCTV surveillance.

"Votes from 18 assembly segments, including Kathua, Udhampur, Doda, Ramban and Kishtwar, will be counted in designated halls. Three halls are designated for counting Electronically Transmitted Postal Ballot System (ETPBS) votes," said Returning Officer Dr Rakesh Minhas.

A total of 225 tables, each staffed by three personnel, will facilitate the counting process. Sixty tables are designated for ETPBS votes, each with a counting agent, a micro observer, a supervisor and an Assistant Returning Officer (ARO), the officials said.

The CCTV footage of the EVM strong rooms has been shared with the political parties' representatives. Nearly 10,000 staff members will handle the entire counting process, including transferring Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs) from strong rooms to counting halls, they added.

The Udhampur-Doda parliamentary constituency recorded a 68.23 per cent voter turnout on April 19, with 16,23,195 eligible voters casting their ballots. Over 11.08 lakh votes will determine the fate of 12 candidates, including Union Minister Dr Jitendra Singh, who seeks a third consecutive win, competing against former minister and two-time MP Choudhary Lal Singh of the Congress.

Here's How Votes

- Form 17C of each polling station should be sent to the officer who is compiling the final result sheet in Form 20.
- Counting of VVPAT slips shall start only after completion of counting of votes from CUs.
- Mandatory verification of VVPAT slips of randomly selected five polling stations per assembly constituency/each assembly segment of a parliamentary constituency shall be done only after the completion of counting of votes.
- When the margin of victory is less than the number of postal ballot papers rejected, all such rejected postal ballot papers shall be mandatorily re-verified before declaration of the result.
- If two candidates get equal number of highest votes, the result will be declared by draw of lots.

Concurring with the May 25 open statement of Constitutional Conduct Group (CCG) of former civil servants, the former judges said, "We are constrained to agree with the scenario envisaged in the above statement: 'In the event of a hung parliament, onerous responsibilities will be placed upon the shoulders of the President of India.

"We are sure that she will follow the established democratic precedent of first inviting the pre-poll alliance that garnered the largest number of seats. Also, that she would endeavour to preempt the possibilities of horse-trading...." March, Kumar had said that holding assembly and parliamentary elections simultaneously was not practical due to logistical and security reasons.

Whenever assembly elections are held in Jammu and Kashmir, they will be the first since the August 2019 abrogation of Article 370 of the Constitution and the division of the erstwhile state into two union territories.

The electoral exercise in Jammu and Kashmir is usually spread over a month.

Following a delimitation exercise, the number of assembly seats in the union territory has gone up from 83 to 90, excluding those allocated to Pakistan-occupied Kashmir.

In December, the Supreme Court had directed the poll panel to hold assembly elections in Jammu and Kashmir by September 30

J&K Deploys Drones

from Udhampur, Poonch, Rajouri, and Samba districts while in Kashmir forest fires were reported from Ganderbal and other districts of the valley.

An official told Kashmir Observer that the department has procured a number of modern gadgets due to a spike in forest fires across.

In a recent incident in the Nowshera subdivision of Rajouri district, the department used drones to monitor a fire in the Chingus block and other forest areas, which was later extinguished within an hour. A massive fire also broke out on June 3rd in the Ramnagar forest of Jammu division and the Gangera hills in Udhampur district.

"With drones, we can easily pinpoint the exact location of the fire, even in dense forest areas," an official from the department said.

The official added that it used to be challenging to extinguish fires in hilly terrains. "Now the extinguishing process is easy and we get the locations quickly."

The modus operandi, according to the official, is to identify the fire through the drone images and then give a ring around the fire. "This restricts forest fire to a particular

area," said the official.

Animal Birth Control Rules 2023 must be ensured for running any ABC programme.

It said ABC Monitoring Committees be constituted at Local authority levels in accordance with Animal Birth Control Rules, 2023, schedule II rule 3.

Commissioner JMC/SMC and Director Urban Local Bodies Jammu and Kashmir shall frame ABC Camps calendar and circulate among District Administrations for necessary support and action, it said.

The ABC Program must be halted in the months when minimum temperature goes below 6 degrees Celsius and Corporations shall cross-verify that the agencies engaged for sterilization and implementation of the programme are recognized by the Animal Welfare Board of India and have obtained Project Recognition in accordance with the ABC Rules 2023.

If found non-compliant, the committee said the contract with the agency shall be terminated and a report to be submitted within 15 days.

Director ULBK and ULBJ have been asked to identify land or abandoned buildings in each district for operationalization of the ABC programme. "They shall run Mobile Hospitals in collaboration with District Administrations and Animal Husbandry Department for immediate stop-gap arrangement." They shall also send proposal for procuring subsidized mobile hospitals under the Government of India scheme immediately, it said.

JMC/SMC/DULBJ/DULBK,the committee said, shall submit a Monthly Progress Report to the State ABC Committee.

Also, IEC activities, Awareness Programmes to be carried out on regular basis and hoardings shall be put by Corporations for adoption of Stray animals, the committee said

JMC Commissioner shall prepare a roadmap for creation of an SPV for conducting ABC program throughout the J&K and submit the same within one month, the Committee said.

The Committee said a handbook for Animal Management, for ULBs of Jammu and Kashmir, must be drafted for circulation, which would cover all statutory duties of the local bodies with regard to animal management.

Assistance may be taken from AWBI and subject matter experts to prepare it, the committee said.

"Votes from the seven assembly constituencies will be counted at M A M College, while 11 constituencies will be tallied at Polytechnic College," he added.

The administration has fully trained the staff and sensitized all polling agents for the counting process. This includes a detailed examination of the deployment of paramilitary and police personnel as well as the set up for counting staff and agents.

"All counting staff are fully trained and all political parties and their agents have been briefed and issued I-cards. The arrangements are comprehensive, covering traffic and security," Vaishya said.

CCTV cameras have been installed and videography arrangements are in place at the counting centers.

Over 12.86 lakh votes (72.22 per cent) will be counted in the Jammu constituency, where BJP's sitting MP Jugal Kishore Sharma aims for a third consecutive victory against Raman Bhalla, the working president of the J&K Congress unit, among 22 other candidates.

Both BJP and Congress have expressed confidence of winning the seat.

"We are very confident that BJP will win this seat. It was predicted by the exit polls as well," Sharma said.

In Kathua, three-tier security is also in place for the Udhampur Lok Sabha constituency counting scheduled for Tuesday.

Kathua Superintendent of Police Anayat Ali Choudhary, who took a review visit of the area, said that elaborate security arrangements have been made.

"Three tier security has been deployed here. We urge everyone to coordinate with the security forces and police. If there is any It also urged the CJI and the CEC to uphold the Constitution in such an eventuality and ensure smooth transition of power.

"We, the people of India as citizens of a sovereign, socialist, secular, democratic republic hereby call upon the Supreme Court to ensure the presence and attendance of the top five esteemed justices of the Supreme Court even during the period of the ongoing summer vacation and be available to respond in the event of any constitutional crisis that might emerge in the present situation," the letter said.

It said the former judges hoped that their apprehensions were wrong and the elections would end smoothly but they believed that prevention is better than cure.

"We therefore, seek in humility to remind each of the authorities and institutions charged with the integrity of the process of democratic government formation of their paramount duty to abide by and uphold the Constitution," it added.

"Certain suggestions have also been made, which have been placed on record vide Annexure –XI and XII in the form of Strategic Framework for Establishing a Dedicated Animal Birth Control Entity in J&K's Urban Local Bodies, the authorities will examine the same and take into consideration the suggestions so made," the court added.

Party In The USA' But Pakistan And India Await For Co-Hosts

DALLAS: "Cricket? Erm, is it a team game?" asked the slightly puzzled Uber driver taking his passenger towards the Grand Prairie Cricket Stadium in Texas on Saturday.

Had the driver been one of the curious American-born spectators who ventured inside the venue and witnessed the USA's first ever T20 World Cup game – a pulsating seven-wicket victory over Canada – he would have had the answer.

Yes, team game it is, but in the shortest form it is also one that can be largely won by the brilliance of an individual.

For the USA's maiden victory, in front of a passionate crowd inside the purpose built, 7,000 capacity home of Major League Cricket, that individual was Aaron Jones.

Jones' unbeaten 94 of 40 balls, featuring 14 boundaries, 10 of them sixes, with the stadium PA blasting out Miley Cyrus' "Party in the USA" after the biggest hits, transformed what could have been a very low key American debut in elite cricket into a spectacular celebration.

"Especially because America is not really a 'cricketing country'. I wanted to win the first game of the tournament for our fans and we did that," a smiling Jones said after the game

Now the USA must prepare for a much bigger test of their credentials in the sport's elite, when they take on Pakistan, at the same venue, on Thursday.

But there is a bigger context to this tournament for the co-hosts because as much as organiser's play down the attempt to convert American sports fans to the pleasures of the old game, part of the whole idea of holding the biennial tournament in the USA is to establish some firmer roots for the sport here. 32 Wild Monkeys Drown In Irrigation Well While **Quenching Thirst In Jharkhand**

Medininagar (Jharkhand): As many as 32 wild monkeys were suspected to have drowned in an irrigation well in Jharkhand's Palamu district during their bid to quench their thirst, a forest official said on Monday.

It took place in Sorath village in Panki block and the corpses were found on Sunday, but officials were yet to ascertain the exact date of the incident. "A total of 32 wild monkeys

were found dead in an irrigation well in Sorath... the corpses were fished out," Medininagar Divisional Forest Officer (DFO) Kumar Ashish told PTI.

The entire area is reeling under heatwave conditions, with temperatures hovering around 44-45 degrees Celsius.

New Blood Test Can Predict Breast Cancer Return Much Before Scans

London: In a step that can en-sure earlier detection and treatment of breast cancer and help improve survival rates, British researchers have developed an "ultra-sensitive" new blood test which can predict if the cancer will return years before it shows up on scans.

The test works by detecting traces of the DNA of the tumour before the full relapse and was found to be 100 per cent accurate at predicting which patients would see their cancer return, the BBC reported.

While experts have termed the development "incredibly exciting", it is still in its early stages. Breast cancer is the most com-

mon form of the disease worldwide, with 2.26 million women diagnosed in 2020 and 685,000 deaths in the same year, according to Breast Cancer UK.

A team of researchers from the Institute of Cancer Research (ICR) London conducted the trial on 78 patients with different types of early breast cancer, with the test searching for 1,800 mutations in the patient's blood which are released by cancer cells.

These circulating tumour DNA were found in 11 women, who all saw their cancer relapse. No other women saw their cancer return. On average, the blood test detected cancer 15 months before symptoms appeared or the

illness showed up on scans, according to results presented at the American Society of Clinical Oncology conference in Chicago on Sunday. The earliest detection was 41

months.

Lead researcher Dr Isaac Garcia-Murillas, from the ICR, said: "Breast cancer cells can remain in the body after surgery and other treatments but there can be so few of these cells that they are undetectable on follow-up scans." However, they can cause patients to relapse many years after their initial treatment.

The study, which tested blood samples at the point of diagnosis, then again following surgery and chemotherapy, and repeated the process every three months for the next year and every six months for the next five years. lays the groundwork for better

post-treatment monitoring and potentially life-extending treatment, he added.

Researchers Dr Simon Vincent, director of research, support and influencing at Breast Cancer Now - which part-funded the study said: "Early detection is one of our greatest weapons against breast cancer and these initial findings, which suggests new tests could be able to detect signs of breast cancer recurrence over a year before symptoms emerge, are incredibly exciting." the research was still in its early stages, he said catching breast cancer recurrence earlier means treatment is much more likely to destroy the cancer and stop it spreading to other parts of the body and becoming incurable.

Woman Felt Drunk Without Drinking. Doctors Find Her Gut Produced Alcohol

New Delhi: In a rare case, doctors in Canada treated a 50-yearold woman with a syndrome that makes her gut produce alcohol, and feel intoxicated without getting drunk, according to a case report published in the Canadian Medical Association Journal on Monday.

Doctors at the University of Toronto and Mount Sinai diagnosed the woman with autobrewery syndrome -- a rare condition in which gut fungi create alcohol through fermentation.

For two years the woman suffered from extreme daytime sleepiness and slurred speech and, despite not drinking alcohol, had elevated blood alcohol levels and alcohol on her breath. However, every time doctors dismissed her case with a diag-



nosis of being drunk -- despite rantoin, as well as gastrointestisaying she had not been drinknal reflux disease, treated with ing. In the last 5 years, she had redexlansoprazole

In the past, she would drink a glass of wine on holidays; however, in recent years, she had stopped drinking altogether because of her religious beliefs.

Along with her husband and children, she visited the emergency department seven times before the correct diagnosis could be made, displaying a lack of awareness of the syndrome among physicians. "Auto-brewery syndrome

carries substantial social, legal, and medical consequences for patients and their loved ones," said Dr. Rahel Zewude, University of Toronto, with co-authors.

The doctors "suspect recurrent antibiotics for UTI and dexlansoprazole use led to gut dysbiosis with potential contribution of genetics" resulting in the rare syndrome.

The woman was treated with antifungal medication and lowcarbohydrate diets.

Auto-brewery syndrome occurs when microorganisms capable of fermenting alcohol from carbohydrates outgrow normal gut flora.

It is rare because it requires several host factors to interact with a substantial overpopulation of fermenting microorganisms and high carbohydrate consumption.
