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Rains End Scorching Heat In Kashmir

MeT Predicts More Till June 8

Srinagar: The persistent dry spell for the last couple of weeks has come to an end as the light and intermittent rainfall has been recorded since last evening, bringing a relief from the scorching heat in Kashmir.

There is a forecast of more rains in the next three days as the weatherman has predicted that the light rains would continue to occur till June 08.

The maximum temperature in Srinagar and elsewhere has plummeted today as the weather conditions have witnessed a shift since last evening.

Although there was occasional sunshine in the afternoon, the intermittent rainfall continued to occur since morning, bringing down the mercury some degrees across all the Kashmir stations, thereby giving a relief to the people from scorching heat. According to the details

shared by MeT, Srinagar, the summer capital of J&K recorded a maximum temperature of 22.3 degree Celsius while in Qazigund, gateway of Kashmir, it settled at 22.5 degree Celsius.

As per the data, Pahalgam and Kokernag recorded a maximum temperature of 19.6 degree Celsius and 20.8 degree Celsius respectively while in Kupwara and Gulmarg, it settled at 15.6 degree Celsius and 11.2 degree Celsius respectively. | More on P10

44°C Forecast In Makkah **During Hajj** Agencies

Riyadh: The Saudi government said on Tuesday pilgrims can expect average high temperatures of 44 degrees Celsius during Hajj, which last year saw thousands of cases of heat stress.

"The expected climate for Hajj this year will witness an increase in average temperatures of one-and-a-half to two degrees above normal in Makkah and Madina," national meteorology centre chief Ayman Ghulam told a press conference. The forecast indicates "rela-

tive humidity of 25 per cent, rain rates close to zero, average maximum temperature 44 degrees", he said.

There was "a need for sufficient quantities of water to cover daily consumption as temperatures rise", the meteorology chief said. He said food for pilgrims should be transported in refrigerators so that it does not spoil.

Last year more than 1.8 million pilgrims performed Hajj, official figures showed. More than 2,000 people suffered heat stress after temperatures soared to 48 degrees Celsius.

However, the real number of heat stress cases - which includes heatstroke, exhaustion, cramps and rashes - was probably far higher, as many sufferers were not admitted to hospitals or clinics.

At least 240 people, many from Indonesia, died during the pilgrimage, according to figures announced by various countries which did not | More on P10

God's Will? **BJP's Ram Temple Pitch Fails In Ayodhya**

Ayodhya: The construction of the Ram temple was a main plank of the BJP campaign across the country. Ironically, the poll pitch didn't work in Ayodhya itself.

The Faizabad Lok Sabha constituency, in which the temple city falls, rejected its twotime MP Lallu Singh in the Lok Sabha polls. Samajwadi Party's Awadhesh Prasad defeated him by 54,567 votes. The Ayodhya defeat comes in the backdrop of setbacks to the ruling BJP across the state - it won just 33 seats this time compared to the 62 in 2019. One reason could have been the demolition of houses to make way for wider roads. But some local people couldn't resist invoking the Ramayana for this BJP debacle. "Who is Lallu Šingh when

candidate didn't care for the business community, and told them that if he didn't get their votes, "it won't be a problem". Singh also claimed that the BJP MP didn't take his campaign seriously.

The Election Commission declared the results of the Lok Sabha polls on Tuesday. While radical Sikh preacher Åmritpal Singh won Punjab's Khadoor Sahib seat, terror financing accused Sheikh Abdul Rashid, popularly known as Engineer Rashid, won from Jammu and Kashmir's Baramulla seat.

Engineer Rashid has been lodged in Tihar jail since August 9, 2019, on terror funding charges. Amritpal Singh was arrested in April 2023 under the National Security Act and sent to Assam's Dibrugarh prison.

The question now arises if these jailed newly-elected MPs

will be allowed to take the oath. and if yes, how.

Explaining the legalities involved, Constitution expert and former Lok Sabha secretary general PDT Achari stressed the importance of following the constitutional provisions in such cases.

Being sworn in as a Member of Parliament is a constitutional right, he said.

But because they are currently in prison, Engineer Rashid and Singh must seek permission from authorities to be escorted to Parliament for the oath ceremony.

Groundwater to heat over 3 degrees C by century end, risking safety: Report

Groundwater is projected to warm by 2-3.5 degrees Celsius before the turn of this century, potentially risking water quality and safety, apart from threatening ecosystems depending on the resource, a new research has found.

The "world's first global groundwater temperature model" predicted the highest warming rates in Central Russia, Northern China and parts of North America, and the Amazon rainforest in South America.

A team of researchers, led by those from the Karlsruhe Institute of Technology, Germany, said while a lot of focus on climate change concerns weather events and water availability, we also need to think about how it impacts groundwater, critical to life on the planet.

Warming of groundwater can adversely impact ecosystems relying on them, they said.

"Rivers rely on groundwater to keep flowing during dry times. Warm waters hold less dissolved oxygen," explained study co-author

The model also estimated that by 2100, 60-600 million people globally could be living in areas where groundwater exceeds the highest threshold for drinking water temperature guidelines set by any country.

According to the World Health Organization, currently only 18 out of 125 countries have temperature guidelines for drinking water.

Warmer groundwater raises the

risk of disease-causing microbial growth, thereby, affecting drinking water quality and potentially the lives of people, said Rau.

Based on how heat spreads in water, the researchers modelled current groundwater temperatures and also projected changes

world. Groundwater is present beneath the Earth's surface in pore spaces in rocks and soils. "We show that groundwater at

the depth of the water table (excluding permafrost regions) is conservatively projected to warm on average by 2.1 degrees Celsius between 2000 and 2100 under a medium emissions (scenario)," the authors wrote in the study published in the journal Nature Geoscience. Under this scenario, emissions trends do not markedly change from historical patterns.

The model, however, showed that under a high-emissions scenario, or fossil fuel-driven development, the groundwater temperature could rise by 3.5 degrees Celsius.

The warming of groundwater can be a cause for concern, although it depends on whether the climate change issue can be mitigated by cutting down greenhouse gas emissions, the researchers said.

Warmer groundwater can also impact water quality by affecting its chemistry and microbiology, they said.



Election Results 2024

All Seats Declared, Check Which Party Won How Many

Press Trust Of India

New Delhi: The Election Commission of India has declared results for 542 of the 543 Lok Sabha constituencies, with the BJP winning 240 seats and the Congress 99.

The result for the Beed constituency in Maharashtra -- where the NCP (Sharad Pawar) candidate Bajrang Manohar Sonwane is leading the BJP's Pankaja Munde -- is still awaited.

While the Lok Sabha has 543 members, counting was held for 542 seats after the BJP's Surat candidate Mukesh Dalal was elected unopposed.

According to the results declared early on Wednesday, Prime Minister Narendra Modi is poised to form the government for a third consecutive term with the BJP-led National Democratic Alliance (NDA) getting a majority in the Lok Sabha, notwithstanding crushing losses in three Hindi heartland states after a bitterly fought election that was projected as a referendum on his popularity.

The BJP, whose candidates contested in the name of Modi, won in 240 seats, falling short of the 272 majority mark and needing the support of allies in the party-led NDA for government formation. a far crv from the 303 and 282 seats it had won in 2019 and 2014, respectively, to have a majority on its own

With support from key allies N Chandrababu Naidu's Telugu Desam Party (TDP) and Nitish Kumar's JD(U), which won 16 and 12 seats in Andhra Pradesh and Bihar, respectively, and other alliance partners, the NDA crossed the halfway mark.

The Congress, which is part of the opposition INDIA bloc, won 99 seats compared to 52 it won in 2019, eating into the BJP's share in Rajasthan and Haryana.

As the Samajwadi Party kept the INDIA bloc's morale high in Uttar Pradesh with 37 seats, the Trinamool Congress (TMC), another key member of the opposition alliance, won 29 seats in West Bengal, higher than its 2019 tally of 22. The BJP, which had won 18 seats in the last Lok Sabha elections, won 12 seats.

The results did not throw up a landslide victory the BJP-led NDA had hoped for and what was projected by the exit polls.

More than 640 million votes were to be counted in the world's largest democratic exercise, conducted from April 19 to June 1 in seven phases.

The Congress, which secured only 52 seats in the 2019 Lok Sabha polls, has won 99 seats.

ew Delhi: Samajwadi Party chief Akhilesh Yadav along with four other members of his family won their respective constituencies in the Lok Sabha polls as the party established itself as the largest one in Uttar Pradesh by winning 37 seats.

Akhilesh Yadav defeated his rival Subrat Pathak of the BJP by a margin of 1,70,922 votes while his wife Dimple Yadav secured a comfortable victory over her nearest rival BJP's Jayveer Singh with a margin of 2,21,639 in Mainpuri.

BSP candidate in Mainpuri Shiv Prasad Yadav bagged 66,814 votes and stood third.

The SP chief's three cousins Akshay Yadav, Dharmendra Yadav and Aditya Yadav -- won in Firozabad, Aazamgarh and Badaun, respectively.

In Azamgarh, Dharmendra Yadav defeated his nearest rival Dinesh Lal Yadav Nirahua of the BJP by a margin of 1,61,035 votes. While Dharmendra Yadav polled 5,08,239 votes, Nirahua got 3,47,204 and BSP candidate Mohammad Sabeeha Ansari got 1,79,839 votes.

In Firozabad, Akshay Yadav polled 5,43,037 votes, while his opponent BJP's Vishwadeep Singh got 4,53,725 votes.

Akhilesh Yadav's uncle and SP leader Shivpal Yadav's son Aditya Yadav got 5,01,855 votes in Badaun, defeating BJP's Durvijay Singh Shakya by a margin of 34,991votes.

The party had initially given ticket to Shivpal Yadav for this seat but later fielded his son Aditya.

Fruit Growers Clash With Cold Storage Owners Over Exorbitant Service Charges

SRINAGAR: Not all is well between fruit growers and Controlled Atmosphere (CA) and cold storage owners with former alleging the facility owners for charging them exorbitant rates for various services.

Fruit growers and dealers accused the owners of charging exorbitant rates for various services, including cardboard boxes, storage fees, tape charges,

and bin/crate charges. "Exorbitant rates are charged by CA/cold store owners for cardboard boxes, which are quite inferior. In fact a good quality type of cardboard material is available in the open market, which is 30 percent cheaper that the ones sold by the CA/ cold store owners," chairman Kashmir Valley Fruit Growers (KVFG) Union Bashir Ahmad

Bashir told news agency. "The CA/cold store owners do

not allow us to procure cardboard boxes and other packing material from the open market. They force us to buy from them at exorbitant rates, which is unfair and 🚄 exploitative," he added.

months at a time," Bashir said. The KVFG claims to have held several meetings with the managing body of JKPICCA, headed by its president, seeking the execution of a fresh agreement to fix norms and uniform rates in the interest of the horticulture industry and fruit growers/dealers. "However, despite commit-

ments, JKPICCA has failed to respond or execute any such agreement.' The KVFG has appealed to

the government to intervene and address their grievances.

They demanded that the excessive rates of Rs. 30-40 per box collected by JKPICCA owners from valley-based fruit growers/dealers for the storage of apple crops during the 2023-24 fruit season be returned.

The union has sought the constitution of a regulatory committee comprising representatives from KVFG Union, JKPICCA, and independent ex-

perts nominated by the government to determine fair and uniform cold storage rates, ensuring transparency and preventing exploitation.

"We urge the government to ensure an open option for valley-based fruit growers/dealers to procure cardboard material and other packing charges from sources of their choice, without being forced to purchase from JKPICCA at inflated rates," Bashir said–(KNO)

Rejection Of Political Timidity

he defeat of former chief ministers Omar Abdullah and Mehbooba Mufti, and the victory of the jailed Engineer Rashid in the parliament polls, came as contrary to expectations in Kashmir. It gave a certain hint of which way the political wind is blowing in the Valley.

Rashid's win in the Baramulla constituency is particularly telling. Despite being incarcerated under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, his victory against political stalwarts like Abdullah and the People's Conference leader Sajjad Lone speaks volumes about the electorate's discontent with their politics. Garnering nearly 470,000 votes, Rashid's victory wasn't just a political win; it was a call for genuine representation and a rejection of the political timidity that has often characterized the region's leadership.

It is true that sympathy wave played a role in Rashid's triumph but that alone doesn't explain it. Rashid, a twotime MLA from Awami Ittehad Party (AIP), has been in jail over the past five years. He was arrested by the NIA in the run up to the abrogation of Article 370 and charged under various sections of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA). The NIA has accused Rashid of receiving money from Pakistan to fund separatist activities in Jammu and Kashmir. He has denied the charges.

But as his victory highlights, his supporters believe he has been unjustly targeted. The abrogation of Article 370 and the bifurcation of the state into two Union Territories in August 2019 was a significant turning point. And Rashid's extended incarceration is being seen as a consequence of the rescinding of this constitutional provision. The verdict is a stark repudiation of how some politicians responded to these historic changes. Instead of robust advocacy for the people's rights and dignity, many local leaders appeared complacent, further alienating their constituencies. The people's choice shows a yearning for leaders who are unafraid to challenge the prevailing narrative and genuinely strive for their community's rights and dignity.

In Srinagar, the choice was tough, with the both leaders Ruhullah Mehdi, who won, and Waheed Parra, who was earlier jailed, equally fitting the bill. Similarly In the Anantnag constituency, while the NC candidate Mian Altaf eventually secured the win, Mufti made a notable impact throughout the race. The BJP's retention of seats in Udhampur and Jammu, despite perceived anti-incumbency, and the independent win in Ladakh by Haji Muhammad Haneefa, have more or less been along expected lines.

That said, the mandate in Kashmir is clear: people seek leaders who are not mere pawns in the larger political game but genuine advocates of their unique identity and rights.

Coalition Dharma and the New BJP

Narendra Modi appears set to begin his third consecutive term as Prime Minister (PM). But unlike in 2014 and 2019, the allies in the National Democratic Alliance (NDA) are in a position to demand their space, in fact, even force their agenda on the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP). Thirty two seats short of a simple majority, the BJP will need to rewire its relations with allies and reformat the NDA, perhaps, along the lines it existed two decades ago. The post June 4 BJP, in office, may need to think about coalition dharma, a much-discussed phrase between 1996 and 2004, when the NDA came into being and Atal Bihari Vajpayee headed multiple coalition governments.

As it stands, the Telugu Desam Party (TDP) and Janata Dal (United) are central to the NDA's numbers with 16 and 12 MPs, respectively. Their leaders, N Chandrababu Naidu of the TDP and Nitish Kumar of the JD(U), are experienced, shrewd and demanding politicians who are masters at manoeuvring coalitions. Accommodating their interests will be a challenge that the BJP needs to negotiate before it begins the business of governance. Pet ideological projects may have to be shelved or negotiated for the sake of coalition dharma as the BJP did in the 1990s. Consensus building will have to be the bedrock of governance even though Modi, as PM and chief minister of Gujarat, never had to negotiate the minefield of coalition politics. The BJP may also have to recalibrate its expansion plans and tailor its tactics to be on the same page with allies to let the government run smoothly. The NDA may need a seasoned politician as convenor — George Fernandes did the job for Vajpayee - to iron out wrinkles, if any become visible. All this is important since assembly elections are due in Haryana, Jharkhand and Maharashtra later this year, and in Bihar next year. The BJP has not done well in these states, and it has a mess in Maharashtra to sort out, where the Congress, given up for dead not too long ago, won more seats (13) than the BJP (11). The losses in Maharashtra, where the BJP is in office, have as much to do with drought and farm distress as with poor coalition management. Rising unemployment and food inflation are pan-Indian phenomena, which can singe the NDA in general, and the BJP in particular. Much depends on how the BJP leadership interprets the results and what change of course the party will take up to reconcile with the electoral losses.

After a decade of single-party dominance, which led to successive majority verdicts in elections characterised by a pan-India theme, LS 2024 reverted to an earlier pattern. There wasn't a single overriding issue that animated the electorate. Neither did candidates fade into near-irrelevance in a presidential type of contest. In that sense, LS polls went back to being normal and should lead to the restoration of democracy's checks and balances.

For the first time since 2009, a new govt will be a coalition. Unlike the last two occasions, allies cannot be brushed aside. They will have a say in critical decisions. Managing inconsistent demands from allies will be a skill that will have to take centre stage again. Therefore, we are now unlikely to see hugely disruptive decisions introducedat short notice. But that doesn't preclude the likelihood of reforms, as coalition govts earlier have carried out significant changes.

This was a coalition that seemed to be falling apart in the months leading up to the election. Notwithstanding early setbacks, INDIA played its cards well. In UP it defied all odds. A state that was regarded as BJP's trump card turned out to be its weakness. That was the case in Maharashtra too, giving INDIA a huge boost in the two largest states. In both states, the alliance played a tactically smart game.

its regional and local leadership. These factors, and the accumulated anti-incumbency of two terms, caught up with the BJP. Still, that it won a third term, though in alliance, is remarkable. Its ideological agenda has taken deep roots in its strongholds, enabling it to win what it has even amid clamour about inflation, unemployment and other livelihood issues. By winning a seat in Kerala, the BJP breached a fortress, and by defeating the BJD in Odisha, the party has captured the imagination of a new terrain. That said, the people did not take kindly to its strategy of portraying its return to power as an inevitable fate of Indian democracy.

The Congress strategy of making livelihood issues and equity questions the core of its campaign seemed to have worked well in its direct contests with the BJP in Karnataka and Rajasthan. Both parties that operate at the national level should learn the right lessons from this verdict. The lifeblood of Indian democracy is its diversity and the BJP has been less than respectful of that in the last 10 years. The new government will be required to deal with two particular questions that

placed Congress as its centrepiece, India is set to have coalitions on both sides of the government-Opposition divide. The people of this diverse country have spoken and they have said that they are not one but many. And that they will not be straitjacketed by the homogenising political project that imposes One Leader, One Party, One Religion.

In days to come, this verdict will be decoded and its many strands parsed by players — on all sides in ways that are sometimes selfserving. But it seems already clear that Scoreboard 2024 punctures the concentration of power and the thinning of checks and balances that had become normalised and institutionalised in the Modi government for 10 years, with the consequent shrinking and stifling of breathing spaces for the political Opposition as well as civil society institutions. The BJPled NDA is poised to form the government again, and a third consecutive term in power is an undoubted achievement. But it would do well to acknowledge that its mandate this time is both quantitatively and qualitatively different: It opens up room in the system for other players. And carries a warning the BJP can ill af-

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Where's the American Democracy is Headed?

The last week brought some rather perplexing developments from the US. The developments related to the former president Donald Trump, who became the first president of the United States, sitting or former, to be convicted as a felon

The former American president Donald trump was convicted on all 34 counts in the 'hush money case' for falsifying business records to cover a \$130,000 payment to adult actor Stormy Daniels to buy her silence regarding an alleged affair.

Immediately after the verdict was announced, several American billionaires, including those who had distanced from Donald Trump in recent years, pledged support to him or have indirectly backed him in recent days. From Bill Ackman to Stephen Schwarzman, the American billionaires including the tech czar Elon Musk supported Trump despite his conviction. Some of the figures that have

Some of the figures that have pledged support to Trump now, had publicly rejected him in the past over his role in the January 6, 2021 attack on the US Capitol Hill, but things have now changed and they seem to have flocked to him again.

The conviction or the baggage that Trump carries, ranging from the January 6 attack on the US Capitol to three other cases against him, has not stopped many Wall Street billionaires from coming to his support. While some have said they are disillusioned with President Joe Biden, other have said they are concerned about rising anti-semitism in the country under his presidency.

Last week, billionaire Steve Schwarzman, the Co-founder and CEO of Blackstone, said he will support Trump and will donate to him. Blackstone is an investment and real estate giant with a market cap of 144.27 billion, according to Yahoo Finance. It has assets under management of more than \$1 trillion.

Omeed Malik, President of 1789 Capital, has also supported Trump. He is one of the leaders of a fundraiser at New York for Trump where donations of up to \$25 million were sought, as per a report.

Robert Bigelow, the owner of Bigelow Aerospace and Budget Suites of America, has also supported Trump. He has even paid Trump \$1 million for his legal fees, as per Reuters.

Billionaire Bill Ackman, the CEO of hedge fund Pershing Square, has said he will not vote for Biden and has indicated he is backing Trump. He denounced Biden as a wave of anti-Israel protests swept across the United States, which many criticised as being anti-semitic.

Jamie Dimon, the Chairman and CEO of JPMorgan Chase, has also indicated his support for Trump in recent days. Trump has also been increasingly finding support among venture capitalists in the Silicon Valley, which has long been a bastion of Democrats, according to The New York Times.

Prominent among the Silicon Valley supporters was Tesla and SpaceX boss Elon Musk, who has said he will support a candidate in the 2024 US presidential election, The Wall Street Journal has reported that he has become close with Trump in recent months and is holding multiple private telephonic conversations with him in a month.

Musk, a known supporter of Trump, believes the conviction was driven by political agendas rather than a genuine pursuit of justice. This sentiment echoes the reactions



of many Trump supporters who view the charges related to hush money payments as a minor offence blown out of proportion.

Why this sudden support for Trump?

This apparent shift of loyalty also makes us wonder to the basic logic of the decision made by these billionaires. And as usual when you start removing layers then the ultimate answer found at the base or rationale for every so-what illogical move is: Money. Trump has promised to cut taxes for the wealthy and eliminate regulations. President Joe Biden

wants the opposite.

While some billionaires have cited disillusionment with Biden's policies and the rising anti-semitism in the country as reasons for ditching him to support Trump, commentators have said the major reason is Trump's proposed tax cuts.

Some of these business leaders have harshly criticised Trump in recent years. Following the January 6 attack on the US Capitol, JPMorgan Chase boss Dimon had said that he "strongly condemn the violence in our nation's capital" and "our elected leaders have a responsibility to call for an end to the violence" and accept

the election results. Blackstone boss Schwarzman called it "an affront to the democratic values we hold dear as Americans" and later said he would not back Trump.

Now, however, Schwarzman has said the US under Biden was heading in the 'wrong direction'. He further said that the 'dramatic rise of anti-semitism' made him to support Trump.

tism' made him to support Trump. Writing in *The New Republic*, Timothy Noah highlighted that the issue of anti-semitism does not entirely address the support for Trump, as he has been associated with the movement for years. Whitney Tilson, who previously ran hedge fund Kase Capital Management, told Bloomberg that business leaders were supporting Trump out of self-interest.

Meanwhile, in a rather bizarre and related development as the Trump's hush-money trial inched towards conclusion, the former US president compared himself to saint Mother Teresa further calling the charges 'rigged'. "Mother Teresa could not beat these charges. The charges are rigged. The whole thing is rigged," he said. The comments came in as he was leaving the court after the trial ended.

This sentiment brings us back home where we have our own god man, claiming he thinks that he was not biologically born. In fact, it proves the old dictum that religion continues to be the last refuge of scoundrels in power because it provides some sort of legitimacy and a cover against criticism by their opponents and world powers. It further confirms the view that political elites co-opt religion for their political gain.

However, despite the conviction, Trump, currently campaigning for reelection in 2024, remains eligible to both run for and be elected President. Trump himself has dismissed the verdict, asserting that the American people in the upcoming presidential election will deliver the true judgement. Most surveys so far have shown that Trump may win the US presidential election.

The whole episode and the connected developments, makes us wonder whither the American democracy is headed?

Avoiding Communication Backfires Strategies for effective messaging

he best graduation speeches dispense wisdom you find yourself returning to long after the graduation tassels are turned. Take the feelgood life advice in Baz Luhrmann's song to a class that graduated 25 years ago. Only on a recent relisten did I realize it also captures one of the research-based strategies I teach for avoiding communication that backfires.

The tip is hiding in plain sight in the song's title, Everybody's Free (to Wear Sunscreen). Communication aimed at promoting a certain behavior can have the opposite effect when the message is perceived as a threat to individual autonomy.

Health campaigns frequently use strongly worded messages that end up backfiring. For example, strongly worded messages promoting dental flossing made people angry and more likely to resist flossing their teeth. Coercive alcohol prevention messages, with language like any reasonable person must acknowledge these conclusions, instead increased alcohol consumption. In contrast, the wording of the title Everybody's Free (to Wear Sunscreen) is less likely to backfire by emphasizing liberty of choice.

Research reveals lots of reasons why well-meaning attempts to inform, persuade or correct misinformation go awry. Despite the ubiquity of backfires, formal instruction about why they happen and how to avoid them is rare. The omission inspired my new book, Beyond the Sage on the Stage: Communicating Science and Contemporary Issues Effectively, which translates scholarship from across disciplines into practical strategies that anyone can use to improve communication.

When new info challenges your identity

Backfires are often a response to communication of unwelcome information.

In addition to threats to autonomy, information can be unwelcome because it appears to conflict with how you think about

yourself. Consider a study that asked people to read a message about genetically modified foods. Participants for whom purity, health and conscientiousness of their diet was an important part of how they defined themselves had more negative attitudes after reading a message intended to refute their views about GM food. Those who did not have a strong

The same resistance can rise up when you're confronted with something counter to the beliefs of a group you feel a strong affiliation with. Emotional and identity attachment to a group such as a political party can cause people to subjugate their own values to align with the group.

Against the backdrop of protests and an impending election, communication breakdowns are increasingly blamed on political polarization, with more than a hint of fatalism. But the current heavy focus on ideological differences serves only to fuel a vicious cycle that amplifies them. To halt the cycle, the focus needs to shift away from the differences. Divides are not always what they seem, and even when they are, there are often ways to bridge them.

Every person contains multitudes Encouragingly, a study re-

cently published by the Pew Research Center found that just 11% of Americans consider it very or extremely important that they get their news from journalists who share their political views. Less than 40% of Americans said that it was even somewhat important. The study is a reminder that we

are all complex mixes of identities, and those distinct identities can offer fruitful starting points for a conversation.

As the various identities within people interact, the context can bring a particular identity to the fore. For example, a study that examined the importance of voters' identity as parents revealed that when thinking about their children, people were more willing to oppose the policies of their own political party. Animal lover is another example of an identity that researchers have time and again seen relegate party identity to the background.

Therefore, appealing to a shared identity is a strategy for bridging the divide.

Another strategy is to make it safe to go against the group without damaging an individual's connection to it. For example, people may act anonymously, which is what happened during the pandemic when some people reportedly chose to wear disguises when getting their COVID-19 vaccine.

Do We Have More Empathy For People Who Are Similar To Us?

ow do people success fully interact with those who are completely different from them? And can these differences create social barriers? Social scientists are struggling with these questions because the mental processes underlying social interactions are not well understood.

One recent concept that has become increasingly popular is the double-empathy problem. This draws on research looking at people who are known to experience social difficulties, such as autistic people.

The theory proposes that people who have very different identities and communication styles from each other which is often the case for autistic and non-autistic people can find it harder to empathise with one another. This twoway difficulty is what they mean by the double-empathy problem.

This idea is getting a lot of attention. Research on the doubleempathy problem has rapidly grown over the past decade. This

But is this idea accurate? Our recent paper suggests that things might be much more complicated than that.

Our analysis suggests that the double-empathy theory has many shortcomings. It highlights that there is widespread confusion surrounding the very fuzzy concept of double empathy.

The research has also narrowly focused on social difficulties in autism without considering other social identity factors that affect empathy between different groups, such as gender.

The theory also fails to incorporate the psychological neurosciexperiments testing it are muddled. Many researchers claim to be studying double empathy when they do not measure empathy. Meanwhile, other studies are being used as evidence of double empathy despite never having set out to test this theory.

Double-empathy research has also heavily relied on subjective reports of people's experiences (rather than evaluation by experts), which may not tell the whole story.

Altogether, the analysis of existing research indicates that the central claim of the double-empathy theory is not well supported. That is, being similar in identity to other people does not necessarily mean that you have more empathy for them.

This is an important issue that needs urgent attention. There are already signs that the double-empathy theory is being put into practice, despite lacking evidence.

Modi 3.0 **Moody's Expects Policy Continuity But Delays In Far-Reaching Reforms**

NEW DELHI: The BJP-led National Democratic Alliance's (NDA) slim majority in Lok Sabha may delay more farreaching economic and fiscal reforms that could impede progress on fiscal consolidation, Moody's Ratings said on Wednesday.

NDA securing a majority in the general elections will give a historic third term for Narendra Modi as Prime Minister of India.

"We expect policy continuity, especially with regards to budgetary emphasis on infrastructure spending and boosting domestic manufacturing, to support robust economic growth.

"However, the NDA's relatively slim margin of victory, as well as the BJP's loss of its outright majority in parliament, may delay more farreaching economic and fiscal reforms that could impede progress on fiscal consolidation," Moody's said in a note. India's fiscal outcomes will

remain weaker than Baarated peers, even as the final budget for the fiscal year ending March 2025 (fiscal 2024-25) to be released in the next few weeks provides some indications of India's fiscal policy over the course of the term of the incoming government through 2029, it said. In fiscal 2023-24, India's

Domestic Air Traffic Likely To Touch 164 **Mn In FY25**

NEW DELHI: India's domestic air traffic is expected to rise 6 to 8 per cent to 161 to 164 million in the current financial year, according to a report. Aviation advisory firm CAPA India in a report on Wednesday said international air traffic is projected to jump 9-11 per

cent to 75 to 78 million in the fiscal ending March 2025. The domestic carriers are

projected to report consolidated losses in the range of USD 0.4 to 0.6 billion this financial vear. The losses are estimated at USD 1.3 to 1.5 billion, excluding IndiGo, which is profitable. One of the reasons for the losses would be on account of capacity shortage due to the grounding of aircraft.

At present, around 130 planes are grounded due to various reasons, and the number would be about 180, including the aircraft of Go First, it said. Go First stopped flying last year.

In terms of the total fleet, CAPA India said net inductions are expected to be 84, taking the total number of planes with domestic carriers to 812 at the end of March 2025.

Last fiscal, the fleet count stood at 728.

"Over 1,700 aircraft are on order as of February 2024. The current Indian order book is more than twice the size of the number of aircraft in service. This is by far the highest ratio in the world, reflecting the optimism about future growth," it said.

Gold Slips Rs 80; Silver Plunges Rs 1,200 Amid Weak Global Cues

NEW DELHI: Gold prices slipped Rs 80 to Rs 72,820 per 10 grams in the national capital on Wednesday in line with weak trends globally, according to HDFC Securities.

The precious metal had closed at Rs 72,900 per 10 grams in the previous session. Silver prices also plunged Rs 1,200 to Rs 91,900 per kg. In the previous session, it had settled at Rs 93,100 per kg.

In the international markets, spot gold at Comex was trading at USD 2,332 per ounce, down USD 3 from the previous close.

"Gold prices dropped due to a firm US dollar and technical selling pressure, even though there were indications of a weakening US labour market. "This has further strengthened the expectations that the US Federal Reserve will lower interest rates soon," Saumil Gandhi, Senior Analyst of Commodities at HDFC Securities, said.

In addition, silver also dropped to USD 29.75 per ounce.

Moving forward, traders will focus on macroeconomic data. including ADP non-farm employment and ISM non-manufacturing PMI data, which will be released later on Wednesday, Gandhi added.

According to Jateen Trivedi, VP Research Analyst of Commodity and Currency at LKP Securities, nonfarm payroll and unemployment data are also due later this week. "...the primary focus remains on the US Federal Reserve's policy decision on June 12th which will further provide more direction on the bullion prices," Trivedi said.

Sebi Mulls Raising Threshold For Basic Service Demat Account To Rs 10 Lakh

NEW DELHI: Capital markets regulator Sebi on Wednesday proposed to enhance the threshold for the basic service demat account (BSDA) to Rs 10 lakh from the current Rs 2 lakh in a bid to boost the participation of retail investors

in the securities market. A basic service demat account, or BSDA, is a more

basic version of a regular demat account. The facility was introduced by Sebi in 2012 for reducing the burden of demat charges on investors with small portfolios.

Listing out eligibility criteria, Sebi said an individual needs to have only one demat account where he/she is the sole or first holder and the individual needs to have only one BSDA in his/her name across all depositories.

Additionally, the regulator has proposed to review the maximum annual maintenance charges (AMC) for BSDA.

For portfolio values up to Rs 4, Sebi has proposed that annual maintenance charge for a BDSA should be nil and for portfolio values of between over Rs 4 lakh and up to Rs 10 lakh, the charges should be Rs 100.

Avoiding communication backfires: Strategies for effective messaging

The best graduation speeches dispense wisdom you find yourself returning to long after the graduation tassels are turned. Take the feel-good life advice in Baz Luhrmann's song to a class that graduated 25 years ago. Only on a recent relisten did I realize it also captures one of the research-based strategies I teach for avoiding communication that backfires.

The tip is hiding in plain sight in the song's title, Everybody's Free (to Wear Sunscreen). Communication aimed at promoting a certain behavior can have the opposite effect when the message is perceived as a threat to individual autonomy.

Health campaigns frequently use strongly worded messages that end up backfiring. For example, strongly worded messages promoting dental flossing made people angry and more likely to resist flossing their teeth. Coercive alcohol prevention messages, with language like any reasonable person must acknowledge these conclusions, instead increased alcohol consumption. In contrast, the wording of the title Everybody's Free (to Wear Sunscreen) is less likely to backfire by emphasizing liberty of choice.

Research reveals lots of reasons why well-meaning attempts to inform, persuade or correct misinformation go awry. Despite the ubiquity of backfires, formal instruction about why they happen and how to avoid them is rare. The omission inspired my new book, Beyond the Sage on the Stage: Communicating Science and Contemporary Issues Effectively, which translates scholarship from across disciplines into practical strategies that anyone can use to improve communication. When new info challenges your

identity Backfires are often a response

to communication of unwelcome information.

In addition to threats to autonomy, information can be unwelcome because it appears to conflict with how you think about yourself. Consider a study that asked people to read a message about genetically modified foods. Participants for whom purity, health and conscientiousness of their diet was an important part of how they defined themselves had more negative attitudes after reading a message intended to refute their views about GM food. Those who did not have a strong dietary self-concept did not react negatively to the message.

The same resistance can rise up when you're confronted with something counter to the beliefs of a group you feel a strong affiliation with. Emotional and identity attachment to a group such as a political party can cause people to subjugate their own values to align with the group, a phenomenon called cultural cognition. Reactions to messages about climate change often exemplify this phenomenon.

Against the backdrop of protests and an impending election, communication breakdowns are increasingly blamed on political polarization, with more than a hint of fatalism. But the current heavy focus on ideological differences serves only to fuel a vicious cycle that amplifies them. To halt the cycle, the focus needs to shift away from the differences. Divides are not always what they seem, and even when they are, there are often ways to bridge them.

Every person contains multitudes

Encouragingly, a study recently published by the Pew Research Center found that just 11% of Americans consider it very or extremely important that they get their news from journalists who share their political views. Less than 40% of Americans said that it was even somewhat important. The study is a reminder that we are all complex mixes of identities, and those distinct identities can offer fruitful starting points for a conversation.

As the various identities within people interact, the context can bring a particular identity to the fore. For example, a study that examined the importance of voters' identity as parents revealed that when thinking about their children, people were more willing to oppose the policies of their own political party. Animal lover is another example of an identity that researchers have time and again seen relegate party identity to the background.

Therefore, appealing to a shared

identity is a strategy for bridging the divide.

Another strategy is to make it safe to go against the group without damaging an individual's connection to it. For example, people may act anonymously, which is what happened during the pandemic when some people reportedly chose to wear disguises when getting their COVID-19 vaccine.

Accidentally conveying what you don't mean

As in the case of threats to autonomy, the language you choose can minimize backfires caused by threats to group affiliations. People may agree that a proposed action is sound and consistent with their party's beliefs but still reject it if it contains even small polarizing cues. Triggers, such as words associated with the opposing party such as tax for a conservative or deregulation for a liberal, lead people to judge that their party would reject a policy. The fix is to remove both real and perceived threats to group identity by using

party-neutral language. Surprisingly, communication need not be threatening or unwelcome to backfire. It can happen when communication contains hidden unintended messages or when it inadvertently makes an undesired behavior seem normal. For example, messages from a utility about reducing energy use caused low-energy users to consume more energy when their consumption was compared with others, and anti-littering posters emphasizing the extent of the problem increased littering

problem increased littering. Another intuitive communication strategy that backfires is presenting information in a myth-versus-fact format. You've probably seen this format used in communications aimed at debunking myths about health, science, technology, culture and more. Yet, research demonstrates that the state-andnegate format makes it more likely people will remember myths as facts. A facts-only approach improves retention of the correct information.

Research finds where instincts lead you astray

Everybody's Free (to Wear Sunscreen), originally penned as a newspaper column by journalist Mary Schmich, doesn't tell graduates to trust their instincts, but that is commonly dispensed commencement advice.

The research demonstrates that when it comes to effective communication strategies, trusting your instincts can lead you astray. The same research provides insight into why you may instinctively react in certain ways to some messages.

So, if I were to offer this year's graduates just one tip for the future, I would encourage them to check their communication instincts against evidence-based recommendations. I would call my speech Everybody's Free (to Beat Backfire).

To further explain the legalities, Achari cited Article 101(4) of the Constitution which deals with the absence of members from both Houses of Parliament without prior sanction of the Chair.

He said that after they have taken the oath, they will write to the Speaker, informing about their inability to attend the House. The Speaker will then refer their requests to the House Committee on Absence of Members.

The committee will recommend whether the member should be allowed to remain absent from House proceedings. The recommendation is then put to vote in the House by the Speaker.

If Engineer Rashid or Singh are to be convicted and jailed for a minimum of two years, they would lose their seats in the Lok Sabha immediately as per the Supreme Court judgment of 2013, which holds that MPs and MLAs would be disqualified in such cases.

This decision struck down section 8(4) of the Representation of the People Act, which earlier allowed convicted MPs and MLAs three months to appeal against their convictions.

Assembly-wise leads from Srinagar LS Seat: From the Srinagar Parliamentary seat, NC is leading in 16 assembly constituencies, followed by PDP with leads in two assembly segments. PDP is winning from the Rajpora assembly constituency with 16,615 votes and also from Shopian with 21,040 votes. More shocking is to find Syed Altaf Bukhari's own constituency, Chanapora, where NC's Aga Ruhullah Mehdi has received 11,951 votes, while Bukhari's own party has a mere 3,101 votes. Assembly-wise leads from Anantnag-Raiouri LS Seat: From the Anantnag-Rajouri Parliamentary seat, the National Conference has a lead in 15 out of 18 assembly segments, while the PDP, which considers South Kashmir as its bastion, has managed only three seats in Anantnag, Anantnag West and Bijbehara assembly segments. Overall, based on the numbers from the parliamentary poll results, if assembly elections were held today in Kashmir, NC would emerge as the single largest party with 35 seats, followed by Engineer Rashid's Awami Ittehad party with 14 seats. PDP and PC would lag behind with five and one seat, respectively.

"In view of the exclusive privilege of the Government in sale/manufacture of liquor, the scope of judicial review in administrative decisions concerning the same is extremely limited," the court said while summarizing its conclusions and findings.

"No vested right is accrued to a bidder simply by virtue of the fact that he/she has been declared as the highest bidder provisionally and subject to fulfillment of certain conditions in a given auction."

Bearing in mind the nature of the liquor trade, the Court said that it being a constitutional court, should be slow in interfering with the executive decisions taken by the State as they are essentially a matter of economic policy in which the "Government must be afforded a greater latitude and fair play in the joints." "The mere existence of a provision for Minimum Guaranteed Revenue or Minimum Reserve Bid Price in the Excise policy 2024-25, vide SO 85, does not disentitle the Government from cancelling the auction/re-auctioning on germane considerations having a logical nexus with the policy objectives," the court further said, adding, "The decision to cancel the auction and the subsequent order for reauctioning cannot be termed as arbitrary, discriminatory, or mala fide so as to warrant judicial interference.' In any event, the Bench said that the Court cannot interfere with an administrative decision, merely on the premise that any other decision would have been fairer, wiser, or more logical especially, when it relates to the Excise policy. "The cause projected by the petitioners does not subserve an overwhelming public interest, which must be borne in mind to decide whether judicial intervention is called for or not," the court adding, "The petitioners, being fully aware of the said auction conditions participated in the same without any demur and after having participated in the auction, cannot turn around and challenge or impugn an auction condition unless there is a foundation of manifest arbitrariness or mala fide, which is conspicuously absent in the instant case.' After examining the original record, the court said the reasoning provided by the Government for cancelling the auction cannot be termed as unreasonable or arbitrary. ...in so far as the reasoning behind cancellation of the auction based on poor response and less competition of the auction, the same does not seem implausible or mala fide, as suggested by the counsels for the petitioners, more so, when it is a fact on record that the some of the vends under auction did in fact receive a single bid, the court said, adding, "In these circumstances, this Court discerns no arbitrariness or irrationality in the decision of the Government. Therefore, this Court holds that the decision of the respondent Government cannot be faulted with."

Naidu's TDP won 16 Lok Sabha seats in Andhra Pradesh (and a simultaneous Assembly election to return as Chief Minister) and Nitish Kumar's JDU picked up 12 seats in Bihar.

There has been speculation Naidu and Nitish Kumar could be approached by the opposition INDIA bloc, which finished with 232 seats (40 shy of majority) and is exploring a government formation bid.

To offset that, the BJP has secured written letters of support from the TDP and JDU bosses.

Modi and the BJP are well-aware of their importance to the NDA; he made special mention of the TDP and JDU bosses during his victory speech Tuesday night at the party HQ in Delhi.

As early as Tuesday evening, when it became clear the BJP would not be able to form the government on its own, sources had said Naidu and Nitish Kumar - veteran leaders wellversed in the art of coalition politics - could be courted by the Congress in a bid to stake claim itself.

Neither has revealed their hand so far, but sources have said a variety of 'demands', including special status for their states and a pick of ministerial berths are on the table.

On Tuesday the INDIA bloc defied exit pollsters to mount a real challenge to the BJP in a national election - a first since the 'Modi wave' swept it to power in 2014.

The opposition alliance finished with 232 seats - 40 short of the 272-majority mark.

INDIA leaders, including Congress boss Mallikarjun Kharge, have been coy about reaching out to either Naidu or Nitish Kumar, but the intent is there, sources have said.

The Congress produced its best performance since 2009 to win 99 seats. In 2019 the party won only 52 seats (and Rahul Gandhi quit as boss), while it managed just 44 in 2014.

Meanwhile, earlier Modi met President Murmu to resign ahead of the dissolution of this government on June 16. Modi was asked to continue till a new government is appointed.

This morning, he chaired the final cabinet meet of his second term, and downplayed any

With support from Naidu's TDP and Nitish Kumar's JD(U), which won 16 and 12 seats in Andhra Pradesh and Bihar, respectively, and other alliance partners, the NDA has crossed the halfway mark.

The TDP and JDU have already dismissed suggestions of defecting to the opposition alliance and have clearly stated that they will remain with the NDA. Sources, however, said the Congress and some other party leaders are already trying to woo them and have been in touch.

New York prepares for India-Pakistan **T20: 'Super Bowl on steroids'**

EAST MEADOW: New York officials are preparing for the "Super Bowl on steroids" as thousands descend upon Nassau County for the clash of archrivals India and Pakistan in the group stage of the T20 World Cup on Sunday.

The two sides form one of the most intense rivalries in sport and the temporary, 34,000seat stadium in East Meadow, New York, will be bursting at the seams, with millions more watching on TV.

"India vs. Pakistan is like the Super Bowl on steroids. We had no idea how huge it was," Nassau County Executive Bruce Blakeman said. "We want to put our best foot forward."

That has meant an extraordinary safety effort, with security personnel from every level in the region working in conjunction in the county, which sits adjacent to New York City.

Italy Held To Goalless Draw In Euro 2024 Warm-Up With Turkey

Taly were held to a goalless draw by Turkey on Tuesday as the Azzurri gear up for their European Championship title defence later this month. Luciano Spalletti's side were frustrated by Turkey in a lowkey friendly in Bologna which featured little in the way of goalmouth action. Italy play one more friendly against Bosnia and Herzegovina in Empoli on Sunday before travelling to Germany for Euro 2024. They begin their campaign on June 15 against Albania in Group B, where they have also been drawn with Spain and Croatia.

"We'll take all the time we need to make the necessary decisions (for the Euros)."

There was little on display on Tuesday to suggest a repeat of Italy's thrilling triumph at

Euro 2024: Underdogs Albania Ready To Take On Top Guns Italy, Spain, Croatia

Outsiders Albania could hard-ly have asked for a tougher group at Euro 2024, but they plan to rely on "soul" and "sacrifice" when they go head to head with Italy, Spain and Croatia at the tournament in Germany.

"They are very strong teams, used to being favourites, prepared to go to the final and win" said Albania's coach Sylvinho, the Brazilian former Arsenal and Barcelona full-back.

Sylvinho, who previously had spells at Lyon and Corinthians, takes huge credit for leading the Balkan country into their second appearance at the European Championship after being appointed as coach at the beginning of last year.

His squad lacks superstars but there are players who ply their trade in major European leagues, led by Berat Djimsiti, the defender who has just helped Atalanta win the Europa League.

There is also the striker Ar-

"Our strength is not one footballer or two. Our strength is the team," Sylvinho, now aged 50, told AFP.

"Albania is a young country which is participating for the second time in such an important tournament," he added, saying the team possessed a lot of "heart, soul, and a sense of sacrifice".

"We have worked hard to achieve this state of mind on the pitch," added Sylvinho as he leads the country back to a competition they first graced in 2016.

"We have done a good job together but a big challenge awaits us," said the coach, who obtained Albanian nationality after helping secure the country's place at Euro 2024.

Sylvinho's dedication to the squad has led him and his staff

including ex-Argentina defender Pablo Zabaleta -- to relocate full-time to the Albanian capital Tirana.

"We are the first technical team to do so, and it makes a big difference," he explained.

"The players look at you and say 'you have a family, a wife, a child, but you don't live with them, you live in Tirana'. People call me and ask me 'where are you?', I answer: 'in Tirana'," added the man who replaced the Italian Edoardo Reja as coach.

"When we do a job, we do it well, that's the message that gets across. That's how I see it, I have to be here, work from here. Someone says 'he's a foreigner but he lives here, he's already Albanian'. I am an Albanian citizen."

Time spent in the country has allowed him greater insights into its values, which he says are "loyalty, respect for people ... going on the field and representing the country without saving your strength".

Mumbai: White collar hiring has begun improving steadily on the back of major sectors like Oil and Gas, Banking and FMCG, a report said on Wednesday.

From Kangana Ranaut To Arun Govil: Many **Celebrities In New Parliament**

New Delhi: With voters favouring many celebrity faces -- trusted and new -- this election season, eyes will be on the performance of firsttime MPs like Kangana Ranaut and Arun Govil as they take their place in the 18th Lok Sabha along with returning star politicians Hema Malini and Manoj Tiwari.

The country went to the polls from April 19 to June 1 in seven phases to elect the 543 members in the lower house of the Parliament and many from the showbiz were in the fray.

Ms Ranaut, a popular face from Bollywood and a long-time supporter of Prime Minister Narendra Modi won her first-ever election as she was elected from Mandi in Himachal Pradesh, her home state. She defeated Vikramaditya Singh, the son of six-time chief minister Virbhadra Singh and state Congress chief Pratibha Singh.

The actor, who has often found herself at the centre of controversies and always vocal about her opinions, had spoken about devoting her life to public service post her win. There is a lot of curiosity about Ranaut's tenure as an MP.

Not just Ms Ranaut, "Ramayan" star Arun Govil was another celebrity face fielded by the BJP. He emerged victorious from the Meerut seat in Uttar Pradesh in a close battle with Samajwadi Party's Sunita Yadav. The winning margin was just 10,585 votes and for a time it looked like Mr Govil would lose but his image of lord Ram from the classic TV serial seems to have worked in his favour.

Hema Malini, another popular face from Hindi cinema, was elected for a straight third term in Lok Sabha from Mathura (Uttar Pradesh) against her nearest rival, Mukesh Dhangar of the Congress.

Ms Malini's third win shows the sway the actor-politician and a self-confessed Krishna devotee has on the electoral public in the temple town of Mathura, regarded as the birthplace of the Hindu god. Mr Tiwari, a former Bhoipuri cinema star-singer and the BJP's candidate from North East Delhi, bested Congress rival Kanhaiya Kumar, a popular youth leader.

This is also Mr Tiwari's third win in a row from the seat. He was the only sitting MP from Delhi retained by the BJP for the 18th Lok Sabha polls.

Ravi Kishan, another popular Bhojpuri cinema star and the BJP contender from Gorakhpur in Uttar Pradesh, was elected for a second consecutive term. He defeated Kajal Nishad from the Samajwadi Party to retain his constituency.

Actor-turned-politician Suresh Gopi, another BJP candidate, finally made inroads for the party in Kerala's Thrissur constituency. Gopi defeated VS Sunilkumar of the Communist Party of India to claim the Lok Sabha seat in the state.

Veteran actor Shatrughan Sinha, who was fielded as the Trinamool Congress candidate from West Bengal's Asansol, defeated his nearest rival, BJP's S S Ahluwalia. Sinha, who has had political stints under the BJP and Congress, joined the TMC in 2022 to contest in the by-election for the Asansol Lok Sabha constituency.

UN agency predicts that 1.5-degree Celsius target limit likely to be surpassed by 2028

The UN weather agency is predicting an 80 per cent chance that average global temperatures will surpass the 1.5 Celsius (2.7 Fahrenheit) target laid out in the landmark Paris climate accord within the

next five years. The World Meteorological Organisation said Wednesday that the global mean near-surface temperature for each year from 2024 to 2028 is expected to range between 1.1 and 1.9 degrees Celsius hotter than at the

It also estimated that there's nearly a one-in-two chance -47 per cent - that the average global temperatures over that entire five-year span could top 1.5 C. an increase from just under a one-in-three chance projected for the 2023-2027 span.

The report was cited in a sweeping speech about the threat of climate change by UN Secretary-General António Guterres to mark World Environment Day.

Meanwhile, the European Union's climate service says

last month marked the hottest May ever, capping 12 straight months of average monthly temperature records amid high and rising concerns about global warming. The EU's Copernicus climate change service, a global reference for tracking world temperatures, cited an average surface air temperature of 15.9 C (60.6 F) last month – or 1.52 C higher than the estimated May average before industrial times.

The burning of fossil fuels – oil, gas and coal – is the main contributor to global warming caused by human activity.


