Rain Brings Mercury Down In Kashmir

Srinagar: The parts of Kashmir continued to receive rainfall for the second straight day while the maximum temperature settled below normal on Saturday.

The light rainfall lashed the southern districts of Kashmir today again, bringing down the mercury here.

As per the details, the day temperature remained below normal today with Srinagar recording a maximum temperature of 24.8 degree Celsius while Qazigund, a gateway of Kashmir, recorded 24.4 degree Celsius today.

Pahalgam, a famous tourist destination, has recorded a maximum temperature of 21.4 degree Celsius while Kupwara in north Kashmir, has recorded 26.6 degree Celsius. In Kokernag, the mercury settled at 22.5 degree Celsius while Gulmarg, a famous ski-resort, recorded 15.4 degree Celsius.

The three stations of Jammu division have recorded above 30 degree Celsius temperature today including Jammu, Banihal and Katra where the maximum temperature settled at 39.7 degree Celsius, 30.4 degree Celsius and 36.5 degree Celsius respectively.

While the day temperature continued to settle below normal in Kashmir parts, there is a possibility of more rainfall at isolated places for the next 48 hours.

Jammu and Kashmir has recorded a deficient rainfall till June 20.

There was a deficient rainfall of 45 per cent in J&K from June 01 to June 20, the data reveals, adding that Kupwara is the only station where a normal rainfall of 35.2 degree Celsius was recorded

LG Urges Support From All Faiths For Amarnath Yatra

Says Security Arrangements Have Been Tightened & Facilities Improved

Srinagar: As the annual Amarnath Yatra 2024 is set to begin on June 29, Jammu and Kashmir Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha Saturday appealed to the people of all faiths to continue their age-old custom of supporting the religious journey and providing care for devotees this year as well.

The J&K administration, LG said, besides putting in place heightened security arrangements to ensure a peaceful Yatra, has improved facilities for the pilgrims' en-route cave shrine.

In an effort to make the Yatra more comfortable this year, Sinha said, the Border Roads Organization (BRO) has also expanded the route leading to the cave shrine.

Jammu Additional Director General of Police Anand Jain has reviewed security arrangements along the Jammu-Srinagar national highway, emphasising the need for the highest level of alertness to scuttle any



attempt by terrorists to disrupt the pilgrimage, officials said on Saturday.

Taking part in the virtual 'Pratham Puja' of the Amarnath Yatra at the Raj Bhavan in Srinagar on Saturday morning, Sinha said, "Darshan for the pilgrims across the country will begin from June 29. The (Shri Amarnath) Shrine Board and the J&K administration have made special arrangements for the pilgrims. In the last two years, the facilities for the yatris have improved a lot."

First Batch Of Hajj Pilgrims Return To Kashmir

Srinagar: As the annual Hajj-2024 concluded earlier this week, the first batch of pilgrims from Jammu and Kashmir landed at Srinagar International Airport on Saturday evening.

The first batch of 320 pilgrims from Jammu and Kashmir returned from the Hajj pilgrimage in Saudi Arabia on Saturday, officials said.

Executive Officer J&K Hajj Committee, Dr. Shujahat Qureshi told the news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO) that the first batch of 320 Hajj pilgrims returned today and were received at the Srinagar International Airport by J&K Hajj Committee members, Airport authorities and senior officials from police and civil administration.

"One flight was scheduled today, in which 320 pilgrims—166 males and 156 females—returned and landed here at around 9.15 PM," a senior Airport official said.

Dr. Qureshi said that upon arrival of pilgrims at Srinagar International Airport and after necessary formalities including immigration, the Hajjis will go directly to their homes with their relatives.'

"Vehicle passes have already been issued online for those intending to receive the pilgrims. Immigration staff too has been deployed by J&K police, staff of J&K Hajj committee will also be present," he added.

According to the officials, this year, over 7000 pilgrims from the region undertook the Hajj pilgrimage to Mecca and Madina. Of these, approximately 6800 pilgrims departed through the Srinagar embarkation point, while over 500 pilgrims traveled from other airports.

J&K's Political Landscape Heats Up Again

Parties Gear Up For High-Stakes Assembly Elections

Srinagar In a decisive move, Prime Minister Narendra Modi announced the forthcoming assembly elections in Jammu and Kashmir, setting the stage for a significant political showdown. This declaration follows a series of terrorist attacks in the region, with the latest incidents targeting civilians and security forces.

On June 9, just before Prime Minister Modi's swearing-in, terrorists attacked a bus of pilgrims in Shivkhori, resulting in nine deaths and over 33 injuries. This was followed by another incident in Saida Sohal village, Hiranagar, where terrorists attempted to take hostages, leading to the deaths of two terrorists and injuries to a civilian and a CRPF jawan. Additionally, multiple attacks on security personnel have raised

concerns about the ongoing threat of terrorism in the region.

The Prime Minister's announcement has effectively put an end to the decade-long speculation about the timing of assembly elections in Jammu and Kashmir. In response, political parties are mobilizing their resources and strategizing for the upcoming elections. The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has appointed Union Minister G Kishan Reddy as the election incharge for the region, indicating their serious commitment to the electoral process.

On the other hand, the Indian National Congress is preparing for a crucial meeting in New Delhi on June 27 to discuss election strategies. There is speculation that a senior Congress leader from Punjab may be assigned the role of election in-charge for Jammu and Kashmir, highlighting the party's focus on regaining political ground in the region.

UAPA Tribunal Upholds Ban On Tehreek-e-Hurriyat, Muslim League

New Delhi: A tribunal set up under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA) on Saturday confirmed the Centre's decision to impose a five-year ban on the Muslim League Jammu Kashmir (Masarat Alam faction) and Tehreek-e-Hurriyat, Jammu and Kashmir.

The one-member tribunal of Delhi High Court judge Sachin Datta was constituted under the stringent anti-terror law in January to assess whether there was "sufficient cause" behind the imposition of the ban.

Upholding the ban, the tribunal held the two organisations were carrying out secessionist activities in the valley with help from across the border to realise the merger of Jammu and Kashmir with Pakistan and establish Islamic rule in the Union Territory.

The tribunal also upheld the Centre's contention that the organisations were acting on behalf of Pakistan-based terrorist organisations such as Lashkare-Taiba (LeT) and Hizbul

New Delhi: Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Saturday said the intention of the central government has always been to bring petrol and diesel under GST, and it is now up to the states to come together and decide on the rate.

She said a provision has already been made by former Finance Minister Arun Jaitley by including petrol and diesel into GST law. What is remaining is for the states to come together to discuss and decide on the rate of the levy.

the rate of the levy.

"The intention of the GST, as was brought in by former Finance Minister Arun Jaitley, was to have petrol and diesel in GST. It is up to the states now... to decide on the rate. The intent of my predecessor was very clear, we want petrol and diesel to come into GST,"

Sitharaman said. When GST was introduced



on July 1, 2017, amalgamating over a dozen central and state levies, five commodities -- crude oil, natural gas, petrol, diesel, and aviation turbine fuel (ATF) -- were included in GST law but it was decided that it would be taxed under GST at a later date.

This meant that the central government continued to levy excise duty on them, while state governments charged VAT. These taxes, with excise

duty, in particular, have been raised periodically. Sitharaman said the intent

of the Central Government when GST was implemented was that eventually sometime (later) petrol and diesel can be brought into GST.

"Provision has already been made that it can be brought into GST. One and only decision which is expected is for the states to agree and come to the GST Council and then decide what rate they will agree on.
"Once the states agree in

the council, they will have to decide what will be the rate of taxation. Once that decision is taken it will be put in the Act," Sitharaman told reporters after the 53rd GST Council meeting.

Including oil products in GST will not just help companies set off tax that they paid on input but will also bring about uniformity in taxation on fuels in the country.

'Family History Could Affect Development Of Siblings Of Children With Autism'

ounger siblings of children with autism could experience more developmental difficulties, especially if they have relatives with conditions such as delayed speech, anxiety or schizophrenia, a study has found. Researchers found that the younger siblings showed more severe difficulties in social communication, a common symptom of the neurodevelopmental disorder autism. Other symptoms could include repetitive behaviours and a heightened sensitivity of senses.

"(Knowledge about) family history of these disorders may improve efforts to predict long-term outcomes in younger siblings of children with autism and inform about factors contributing to (varied observable traits and behaviours among them)," said senior author Katarzyna Chawarska, a professor of child psychiatry at Yale School of Medicine, USA.

Information about family history could also guide parents and pediatricians in monitoring and supporting the development of infants with risk factors for disorders such as autism, according to Chawarska.



The findings are published in the journal Autism Research.

For the study, the researchers included 229 children having at least one elder sibling with autism and assessed their social, cognitive, language and adaptive skills. The children had an average age of about two years and were enrolled between March 2006 and May 2022.

Parents of the 229 children were interviewed for knowing about

They were asked if relatives of their children, including grandparents and cousins, were affected by neurodevelopmental conditions such as delayed speech requiring therapy or intellectual disability, or by psychiatric ones such as anxiety, depression, bipolar disorder or schizophrenia.

Using statistical methods of analysis, the researchers found an increased presence of both kinds of disorders in the immediate and extended family members of the children with autism.

"Among neurodevelopmental disorders, the most frequently reported condition was speech delay requiring therapy (64 per cent), followed by attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (41 per cent) and intellectual disability (11 per cent)," the authors wrote.

"Among neuropsychiatric disorders, the most common were anxiety disorders (44 per cent), depression (43 per cent), bipolar disorder (17 per cent) and schizophrenia (8 per cent)," they wrote.

Future studies could help understand the biological basis for how family history impacts the development of younger siblings of children with autism, said Chawarska.

Responsibility Towards Kashmir's Environment

ashmir, with its charming, soothing, and beautiful landscapes, is rightly called a paradise on Earth. Its weather, streams, waterfalls, mountains, culture, and unparalleled hospitality are treasures that poets, writers, and intellectuals have long celebrated. Allah Almighty has blessed this land with immense natural beauty and has entrusted humanity with the responsibility to protect and appreciate these gifts. The distinction between good and evil is inspired in man, and it is our duty to safeguard the environment that sustains us.

Take, for instance, the world-famous Dal Lake. Had its cleanliness been maintained from the outset, the government would not need to spend crores of rupees annually for its preservation-funds that could instead have furthered Kashmir's development. Unfortunately, Dal Lake, like many other water bodies such as Wullar Lake and Manasbal Lake, has suffered significant environmental degradation. Environmentalists reveal that 75% of Dal Lake has been destroyed, and the aquatic life severely affected. The Lakes and Waterways Development Authority (LAWDA), established to restore Dal Lake's splendor, has failed at various levels.

My hometown panderathan is located on the banks of the Jhelum River. My father reminisces about a time, thirty years ago, when Jhelum's water was safe to drink without filtration. Today, we are wary of using even tap water without filtering it first. This decline reflects the broader environmental crisis we face, one that demands immediate and sustained action

According to a poignant verse: "The house caught fire with its own lamp." We have, indeed, inflicted damage upon ourselves through negligence. Tourism, a vital component of Kashmir's economy, hinges on our ability to preserve the natural beauty that attracts visitors. With the upcoming Amarnath Yatra, it is imperative that government departments implement effective measures to keep Pahalgam Valley clean and free from environmental pollution.

Two years ago, the government issued an advisory directing the Forest Department to create a digital inventory and geo-spatial database of Jammu and Kashmir's wetlands. This initiative aimed to profile various wetlands and recommend their notification under the Environment Protection Act, 1986, and the Wetland (Conservation & Management) Rules, 2017. Despite having 3,754 water bodies regulated by different departments, significant progress remains unseen.

World Environment Day, celebrated annually on June 5th, aims to raise awareness about environmental protection. This year's theme, "Land restoration, desertification, and drought resilience," and the slogan "Our Land, Our Future." underline the urgent need for collective action. As Saudi Arabia hosts the global celebrations, over 143 countries will collaborate to formulate sustainable policies and address pressing environmental challenges.

The health of humans is intrinsically linked to a clean and healthy environment, which provides essential resources like clean air, pure water, and nutritious food. These are fundamental to life, and their disturbance profoundly impacts human health. The quality of our environment significantly contributes to all sectors of life in Jammu and Kashmir. However, over the last two decades, the region has faced alarming environ-



mental challenges such as global warming, climate change, glacier melting, water crises, pollution. deforestation, and land degradation.

Unbridled anthropogenic activities, including urbanization, technological advancement, agricultural expansion, and industrialization, have exerted tremendous pressure on our natural resources. This reckless exploitation has led to significant environmental degradation. The ecofragile region of Jammu and Kashmir is teetering on the brink of an ecological disaster, evidenced by the devastation of forests, mountains, glaciers, water bodies, and wetlands.

We must remember the devastating floods of September 2014 and the recent flash floods, landslides, and land sinking incidents-nature's stark warnings. Increasing unregulated construction in eco-fragile areas is transforming our mesmerizing landscapes into urban jungles. Furthermore, outdated industries, brick kilns, cement factories, and stone crushers pose severe threats to air quality and the environment.

Illegal mining activities have damaged fertile Karewa lands and Nallahs, resulting in the loss of aquatic life and jobs for thousands of people. The recent fish deaths in Sukhnag Nallah highlight the severe impact of pollution and illegal mining. It is the collective responsibility of all stakeholders, including NGOs, civil society, religious leaders, teachers, and students, to ensure the protection and preservation of our environment.

Islamic teachings emphasize the importance of environmental stewardship. The Quran states, "And do not commit abuse on the earth, spreading corruption" (Quran 2:60). This verse underlines our duty to prevent environmental harm. antosh, a small farmer in Uttar Pradesh, is eagerly awaiting harvest season. He recently acquired an artificial intelligence (AI)-powered farm advisory device that was distributed in his village as part of a pilot by a global agri-tech firm. The device runs on a software that assesses weather, soil, and water conditions to predict crop patterns. Having proved useful for farmers in the American Midwest, the technology has generated great excitement in this UP hamlet. A week before harvest, however, Santosh finds that his fields have been destroyed by pests endemic to the region. The software, he learns, is built on data based on North American topography. Santosh now has to rely on informal jobs in the nearest city to make ends meet till the next sowing season.

This scenario illustrates the dangers of positioning AI technologies as transformative without ensuring the accuracy and reliability of the data on which it is built. In March, the European Union approved the Artificial Intelligence Act, which could help address such concerns — including in sectors that have a direct impact on people's lives and livelihoods such as agriculture, healthcare, or education. The pioneering legislation defines four risk levels for AI and poses strict obligations on "high-risk" systems, which include ensuring quality data sets to minimise discriminatory outcomes and biases.

The approval of the law is timely, given that we are increasingly seeing off-the-shelf AI solutions that are trained on western and non-diverse data sets being deployed in developing countries. The new regulation — and the impetus it offers other

regions to draft their own laws — is a useful backdrop against which AI developers and impact institutions could work together to reverse this trend.

Assessing Al bias

Thinking back to Santosh's predicament, if the inaccurate data used by the tech firm had been detected early on or the AI advisory had been supplemented with locally relevant information, it could have helped him avert disaster. In order for this to happen, people and organisations building AI systems need to introduce an additional layer of testing for bias assessment. Fortunately, there are several frameworks they can choose from.

For instance, retrieval-augmented generation assessment or RAGA, coined by researchers from Facebook AI Research, University College London, and New York University. Retrieval-augmented generation refers to a group of large language model (LLMs) applications that use external data. They have two components: retrieval, the extraction of information from external contexts; and generation of a response based on that information.

Another popular framework, recall-oriented understudy for gisting evaluation, or ROUGE, uses human output as a metric. This is primarily useful for LLM applications that generate textbased output such as summaries or translations.

Equally important is establishing regular feedback loops through human oversight — what is known as reinforcement learning from human feedback or RLHF. This is indispensable as it allows AI systems to get better at mimicking human output over time so it can perform more layered tasks. Such AI bias assessment frameworks need to be rigorously applied by all stakeholders that have a hand in creating AI tools. Further, productising these frameworks could introduce an even greater degree of compliance within the private sector.

But if well-developed solutions already exist, why is uptake not up to the mark?

Funding support Tools that aid rigorous stress-testing of AI models before deployment require large-scale investment. While comprehensive data on AI funding is limited, we know the private sector tends to hold back from investing in areas that do not have demonstrable proof of return on investment. Impact institutions such as philanthropies and international development organisations can play a key role in bridging the funding gap.

Social impact institutions are increasingly engaging with AI innovations. For instance, US-AID supports GeoKRISHI, a web application that integrates government, geographical information system, and crowdsourced data to provide evaluations of crop suitability for key stages. It has also invested in Dimagi, which has an open-source platform combining mobile health data and machine learning-based satellite image analysis to identify and forecast Zika virus hotspots. Similarly, the World Bank Group is backing Project Artemis, which is building an AI model to forecast famine risk at a local level.

While this is promising, the scope of support needs to expand to include risk and bias assessment. Dalberg analysis of 10 leading global philanthropic organisations showed that only 23% of the grants towards AI are directed towards addressing concerns around risks and ethics. With a greater push by social impact institutions and the right incentives for the private sector, we can ensure that AI systems become more inclusive of the people they seek to serve. And that the conversation driven by a handful of large institutions in the Global North do not impact the course of action in

Teresa Amabile, a Harvard scientist. developed a model that specifies the factors that are important for people to become creative as early as the 1980s. She specified three variables. The first is expertise, which includes technical, procedural, and intellectual knowledge of the domain in which one works. The second factor is motivation, or the willingness to complete a task. Finally, the third factor is creative thinking abilities, which refer to how effectively and imaginatively people can approach problems. According to the Amabile arc, all three of these factors are required for creativity to emerge. So, rather than having just one of them, you need to have all three to some extent in order to be creative.

Let's take a closer look at these three components. When people consider expertise, they frequently believe that there is such a thing as too much knowledge. And perhaps this is true

in the sense that some people have been working in a job for too long and have learned so much that they can no longer think outside the box. But, in all honesty, what is far more of a problem is a lack of knowledge. Why is a lack of knowledge such ideas that are completely unrelated. It is therefore difficult to be creative unless you have sufficient knowledge and expertise to speak for these four elements.

Let's take a look at the second aspect of motivation. People frequently distinguish between

you work because you want money or a promotion, or maybe you work to keep your house from being foreclosed on because you owe money on it. All of this is an example of extrinsic motivation. You engage in an activity, but you do so in exchange

advantages. For instance, if you are more intrinsically motivated, you are more likely to overcome obstacles that arise. You are more willing to overcome them and go the extra mile. You are more willing to continue after a failure, and this is an important aspect of

creativity. So, if you want to be creative, it helps to be intrinsically motivated.

Let's take a look at the final aspect of creativity. The final component is called creative thinking skills, and it is all about how adaptable and imaginative you can be when approaching problems. This is difficult because many people live their lives like robots, as if everything is preprogrammed for them, which makes sense because it is very efficient. For example, when we say goodbye to someone, we simply wave and say bye bye. This is something we do automatically. We don't have to consider it. This is also true for many of the things we do. We don't consider them; we just do them. While this is beneficial because it is efficient, it works against you if you want to come up with a creative solution. Being creative may be difficult if you behave like a robot. When you use automatic scripts and schemas from your head, you stop thinking too soon before you find the best solution. You also make far too many assumptions about what is going on. In some ways, it's better to think like a child, like someone who hasn't learned all of these assumptions, all of these automatic scripts and schemas, a person who sees a box and thinks it's more than just a box.

It's a fortress. It's a ship. That kind of thinking, thinking outside of the box, is exactly what it takes to create and be creative. So, let's sum it up. What inspires people to be creative? Is this insane? Perhaps for some, but for others, there are three critical elements. Having enough knowledge, being intrinsically motivated, and having creative thinking skills are all necessary for being creative. Creativity is the generation of novel and useful ideas, while innovation is the successful implementation of these ideas within a company. In other words, every innovation begins with a creative idea, and with the mentioned three elements of creativity, the good news is that everyone has the ability to be creative.

health and social care assessments, and the promotion of communities. age-friendly based on a survey conducted across 136 countries.

Israel pounds Rafah tent camps, killing at least 25: Gaza officials

Israeli forces shelled tent camps for displaced Palestinians north of Rafah on Friday, killing at least 25 people and wounding another 50 according to Gaza's Heath Ministry and emergency workers, in the latest deadly attack in the tiny Palestinian territory where hundreds of thousands have fled fighting between Israel and Hamas.

According to Ahmed Radwan, a spokesperson for the Civil Defence first responders in Rafah, witnesses told rescue workers about the shelling at two locations in a coastal area that has become filled with tents. The Health Ministry reported the number of people killed and wounded in the attacks.

The locations of the attacks provided by Civil Defence were just outside an Israelidesignated safe zone. The Israeli military said they were looking into the strikes at the reported coordinates. Israel has previously bombed locations in the vicinity of the humanitarian zone in Muwasi, a rural area on



the Mediterranean coast that has filled with sprawling tent camps in recent months.

The strikes came as Israel pushed ahead with its military operation in Rafah, where over a million Palestinians had sought refuge from fighting elsewhere in Gaza. Most have now fled Rafah, but the United Nations says no place in Gaza is safe and humanitarian conditions are dire as families shelter in tents and cramped apartments without adequate food, water, or medical supplies.

Friday's strikes took place less

than a month after an Israeli bombing triggered a deadly fire that tore through a camp for displaced Palestinians in southern Gaza, drawing widespread international outrage including from some of Israel's closest allies over the military's expanding offensive into Rafah.

Israel says it is targeting Hamas fighters and infrastructure and that it tries to minimize civilian deaths. It blames the large number of civilian casualties on militants and says it's because they operate among the population.

With Israel's war against Hamas now in its ninth month, international criticism is growing over Israel's campaign of systematic destruction in Gaza, at a huge cost in civilian lives. The top United Nations court has concluded there is a plausible risk of genocide in Gaza a charge Israel strongly denies.

Israeli ground offensives and bombardments have killed more than 37,100 people in Gaza, according to the territory's Health Ministry, which does not distinguish between combatants and civilians in its count.

Israel-Hezbollah tensions

Lebanon cannot become another Gaza, says UN chief Guterres

Amid the escalating tensions between Israel and Hezbollah. United Nations Secretary-General Antonio Guterres on Friday said that Lebanon cannot become another Gaza.

Guterres expressed his profound concerns regarding the intensifying Israel-Lebanon tensions. He said that the UN is working to calm the situation.

While speaking to the reporters, Guterres said "One rash move - one miscalculation - could trigger a catastrophe that goes far beyond the border, and frankly, beyond imagination."

"Let's be clear: The people of the region and the people of the world cannot afford Lebanon to become another Gaza," he added.

Since the Gaza war erupted in October, Hezbollah has been attacking Israel in solidarity with the Hamas. Thousands of people, especially in the border regions had fled due to the intensified attacks.

With Hezbollah's new threat

of waging another war, people are gripped with fear and concerns. Tens of thousands of Lebanese have fled their homes following Israeli strikes in south Lebanon.

Meanwhile, Iran's mission to the UN said on Friday that Hezbollah has the capability to defend itself and Lebanon against Israel, warning that "perhaps the time for the selfannihilation of this illegitimate regime has come". "Any imprudent decision by the occupying Israeli regime to save itself could plunge the region into a new war," Iran's UN mission posted on X.

"UN peacekeepers are on the ground working to de-escalate tensions and help prevent miscalculation," Guterres said."The world must say loudly and clearly: immediate deescalation is not only possible it is essential," he added.

The US has also urged Israel to avoid further escalation in Lebanon. Secretary of State Antony Blinken on Thursday told Israeli officials of the need to avoid further escalation in Lebanon amid the war in Gaza. New Hezbollah threats

The recent Hezbollah leader Hassan Nasrallah's threat to Cyprus has sent waves of uncertainty in the country. Nasrallah in its threat told the Middle-East country not to allow Israel's military to use its airports on the island to bomb Lebanon should a full-blown war break out between Israel and the Iran-backed Hezbollah.

Over 400 people, including civilians, have died along the Lebanon-Israel border since the Gaza war began last year.

With the recent killing of Hezbollah's most senior commander by Israel, the tensions have intensified. Hezbollah retaliated by firing hundreds of rockets into northern Israel.

Cyprus and Lebanon have had close and historic relations for decades and the island became a refuge for thousands of Lebanese who resided on the island during Lebanon's 1975-90 civil war. Following the economic meltdown in Lebanon in late 2019 too many Lebanese citizens moved to Cyprus.

the newly constructed electrified line section (Reasi-Sangaldan), covering a route length of 46 kilometers on the Udhampur-Srinagar-Baramula Rail Link (USBRL) project, at a speed of 40 kmph. Notably, this trial marked the first time a full train crossed over the iconic Chenab River bridge between Dugga and Bakkal stations. This bridge is the world's highest railway bridge, featuring a central span of 467 meters at an impressive height of 359 meters. The USBRL project has been pro-

gressing in phases, with 209 kilometers out of the total 272 kilometers already commissioned. The phases include the 118-kilometer Qazigund-Baramulla section commissioned in October 2009, the 18-kilometer Banihal-Qazigund section in June 2013, the 25-kilometer Udhampur-Katra section in July 2014, and the 48.1-kilometer Banihal-Sangaldan

stretch in February this year. With the commissioning of the 46-kilometer Sangaldan-Reasi section, only the 17-kilometer stretch between Reasi and Katra remains to be completed. This segment is expected to be finished by the end of the year, connecting Kashmir with the rest of the country by train. Work on the project began in 1997 and has faced numerous delays due to geological, topographical, and meteorological challenges.

The 1.3-kilometer Chenab rail bridge, located 359 meters above the riverbed and 35 meters higher than the Eiffel Tower in Paris, forms a crucial link in the project. The Jammu and Kashmir Administration has already announced plans to develop the bridge as a tourist spot. The base of the steel and concrete arch bridge between Bakkal and Kauri, 42 kilometers from Reasi town was completed in November 2017.

Construction of the main arch was finished in April 2021, and the overarch deck was completed in August 2022 with the 'Golden Joint', paving the way for track laying which was completed the following year.

As the project nears its final stages, the anticipation and optimism surrounding the USBRL project are palpable, with expectations that it will significantly transform Jammu and Kashmir's transportation landscape.

53rd GST Council meeting on Saturday recommended the reduction of Goods and Service Tax (GST) on all kinds of carton boxes from 18 per cent to 12 per cent.

Himachal Pradesh has been persistently pleading for the reduction of GST on apple carton boxes and this reduction will help both horticulturists and the industry in saving costs, a statement issued here said.

Industries Minister Harshwardhan Chauhan, representing the State, thanked the council for taking the decision unanimously on the proposal of the state. He said that the decision would also help the industry reduce working capital costs.

The Council took a number of decisions to ease the compliance burden and grievances of small and medium taxpayers.

A monetary limit has been set for tax department appeals: Rs 20 lakh for GST Appellate Tribunal, Rs 1 crore for the High Court, and Rs 2 crore for the Supreme Court. The tax department generally won't appeal if the amount is below these limits.

The maximum pre-deposit amount for filing an appeal has been reduced to Rs 20 crore for both CGST and SGST. Services provided by Indian Railways, like platform tickets and retiring rooms, are exempted from GST.

Hostel accommodation services outside educational institutions are exempt from GST if the cost is up to Rs 20,000. It is meant for students or working class and exemption can be availed only if the stay is up to 90 days.

The panel also includes former AIIMS Delhi director Randeep Guleria, Central University of Hyderabad Vice-Chancellor B I Rao, Professor Emeritus in the Department of Civil Engineering at IIT Madras K Ramamurthy, People Strong co-founder and Karmayogi Bharat board member Pankaj Bansal, IIT Delhi Dean of Student Affairs Aditya Mittal and Ministry of Education Joint

Secretary Govind Jaiswal. "The panel will analyse the end-toend examination process and suggest measures to improve efficiency of the system and to forestall any possible breach. It will conduct a thorough review of the Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) and protocols of the NTA, and suggest measures to strengthen these procedures and protocols along with monitoring mechanism to ensure compliance at every level," the Ministry of Education said in a statement.

The committee has also been tasked with examining the existing security protocols related to the setting of the papers and other processes for different examinations and making recommendations to enhance the robustness of the system.

The NTA, which is under fire over the lapses in the conduct of NEET and UGC-NET, is gearing up to conduct on Sunday a retest for the medical entrance exam for 1,563 candidates who were earlier awarded grace marks to make up for the loss of time at six centres.

While medical NEET is under scanner over several irregularities, including alleged leaks, the UGC-NET was cancelled a day after it was conducted as the ministry received inputs that the integrity of the exam was compromised.

Govt Removes

the alleged irregularities in NEET-UG and the cancellation of the UGC-NET Exam.

In a statement on Saturday, the Ministry of Personnel announced that Subodh Kumar Singh, who was the director general of the NTA, has been replaced by retired Indian Administration Service (IAS) officer Pradeep Singh Kharola, Mr Kharola is the Chairman and Managing Editor of the India Trade Promotion Organisation and has been given additional charge as the Director General of the NTA "till the appointment of a regular incumbent or until further orders".

The move comes hours after the government constituted a committee which will give recommendations to improve the functioning of the agency and a day before around 1,500 students who had been given grace marks for NEET-UG will take a retest.

The CSIR UGC NET exam - scheduled to be held from June 25 to June 27 - also had to be postponed due to "logistical reasons" on Friday and the NEET-PG exam, scheduled for Sunday, was rescheduled late on Saturday.

Sources told NDTV that the repeated allegations of leaks in exams conducted by the NTA and the inconvenience caused to students, as well as the outpouring of anger among them, had made Mr Singh's position tenuous. Pressure from a resurgent opposition as well as adverse remarks by the Supreme Court against the NTA also

played a role in the decision. The move is also part of a promised overhaul of the National Testing Agency, which has been spoken about by Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan as well. Sources said that at a recent Cabinet meeting, Prime Minister Narendra Modi had asked Mr Pradhan to take action, and the crackdown has now begun.

Punishing The Guilty

The priority for the government now, they said, is to get to the bottom of the alleged paper leaks and bring the guilty to book. This is especially important since the NTA organises several key examinations, including the NEET and IEE, for which lakhs of students appear. The Supreme Court is also scheduled to hear petitions on the issue on July 8.

Earlier on Saturday, the government constituted a seven-member committee to look at ways of improving the functioning of the NTA. The panel will be led by Dr K Radhakrishnan, a former ISRO chief and the current chairperson of the board of governors of IIT Kanpur, and will have former AIIMS director Dr Randeep Guleria as one of the members.

After the committee was formed, Pradhan said it was the first in a series of steps to improve the efficiency of the examination process.

"Transparent, tamper-free and zeroerror examinations is a commitment. Setting up of the high-level committee of experts is the first of a series of step to improve efficiency of the examination process, put an end to all possible malpractices, strengthen data security protocols and overhaul and reform the NTA. Student interests and their bright future will always be our govt's top priority," he posted on X.

the previous year, only expenditure to the tune of Rs.12.05 Crores, has been incurred till date, as per PFMS Portal."

"Ministry of Education, Gol has issued communication to the Principal Secretary, School Education, J&K for delay in submission of proposal for release of 1st installment under PM POSHAN Scheme," it reads.

According to the official communiqué, it is a prerequisite for submission of proposals that the expenditure must be above 75 percent of available funds.

"În this regard, DSEK are requested to ask the Chief Education officers under their control to incur the expenditure, against the released funds immediately making us eligible for submission of proposal for release of 1st installment of financial year 2024-25," it reads—(KNO)

Transit Accommodation For Migrant Employees In Budgam Witnesses Rapid Progress

SRINAGAR: The construction of a transit accommodation colony in the Kakanmaran area of central Kashmir's Budgam district is progressing rapidly. The colony, consisting of 12 blocks (with 2 blocks yet to receive approval), features 16 flats per block.

The project, initiated under the Prime Minister's package by the Roads and Buildings (R&B) Department of Budgam, began in March 2023 and is scheduled for completion in 2025.

MA Construction Builders and Contractors, the construction agency in charge, informed that eight blocks are expected to be handed over by September 2024, ahead of the stipulated deadline. The colony is being built on 42 kanals of land and is designed to provide all necessary facilities for migrant employees.

Sunil Bhatt, President of the Migrant Pandit Colony, praised the project, said, "The construction of transit accommodation is commendable, and it is an



honour that the Deputy Commissioner Budgam and district administration are doing everything possible to accommodate migrant employees."

Bhatt requested the district administration to consider providing more than 1 BHK accommodation to prevent space shortages for families living in these colonies.

Local residents of Kakanmaran Budgam have also expressed their satisfaction with the project, saying it is necessary to ensure that migrant employees receive all necessary facilities to help them return to the lifestyle they had decades ago. The executive engineer of the

R&B department said, "We were given a deadline to complete construction by 2025. Thanks to the rapid work by the construction agency and the oversight by the R&B department, eight blocks will be handed over by September this year. Each block includes 16 flats with 1 BHK capacity."—(KNO)

Kavach Safety System Still Inactive In J&K Trains

SRINAGAR: Despite being heralded as a groundbreaking safety measure, the 'Kavach' security system remains unused in trains operating from Jammu, languishing in government files. The ambitious scheme, designed to prevent rail accidents, has yet to see implementation, raising concerns about passenger safety.

Following rail accidents, authorities often make lofty promises to enhance safety standards. However, these promises frequently fade over time. The 'Kavach' security system, which could significantly improve rail safety, is one such example. Despite its potential to prevent collisions by ensuring trains on the same track do not meet, it remains absent from Jammu's rail network.

A senior railway officer confirmed the inaction, citing a lack of directives from the Rail-

way Board. "We have not received any guidelines regarding the use of the 'Kavach' security system," the officer stated. The system, which operates via GPS and is attached to the train's engine, is designed to avert accidents, especially in scenarios where two trains are on a collision course.

With 25 to 30 trains arriving and departing from Jammu daily, the implementation of the 'Kavach' system could play a crucial role in ensuring passenger safety. Yet, despite its importance, the system remains unutilized, buried in bureaucratic red tape.

Railway passengers and safety advocates are urging the authorities to expedite the rollout of the 'Kavach' system. The inaction highlights a persistent gap between safety promises and their fulfillment, underscoring the need for immediate intervention to prioritize passenger safety—(KNO)

Virat Kohli First Player To Hit 3,000 Runs Across T20, **ODI World Cups**

₹tar India batter Virat Kohli made history on Saturday, becoming the first-ever cricketer to score 3,000 runs across both 20-over and 50-over Cricket World Cups. Virat accomplished this milestone during his side's T20 World Cup Super Eights clash against Bangladesh in Antigua.

During the match, after a few poor games, Virat showed glimpses of his vintage self, scoring 37 runs in 28 deliveries. His knock had a four and three big sixes. Virat scored his runs at a strike rate of 132.14. Virat is the leading run-scorer in the history of the ICC T20 World Cup, scoring 1.207 runs in 32 matches and 30 innings at an average of 63.52 and a strike rate of 129.78. Ending unbeaten 11 times, Virat has scored 14 half-centuries in tournament history, with the best score of 89*. He also won 'Player of the Tournament' in 2014 and 2016 for his per-

formances. Virat's top campaign in the T20 World Cup was in 2014, scoring 319 runs in six matches at an average of 106.33 with four half-centuries. His strike rate was 129.15. In the ongo-

ing tournament, Virat has scored 66 runs in five games at an average of 13.20 and a strike rate of 108.19, with the best score of 37.

Coming to the 50-over World Cup, Virat also has a fine record in the larger format. He is the second-highest run-scorer in tournament history, with 1,795 runs in 37 matches and 37 innings at an average of 59.83 and a strike rate of 88.20, with five centuries and 12 fifties. His best score is 117. In a career-best performance during the 2023 50-over World Cup in India, Virat notably top-scored and secured the 'Player of the Tournament' award, scoring 765 runs in 11 matches at an average of above 95, with three centuries and six fifties. His best score was 117. He also registered the most runs by a batter in a single World Cup edition, breaking Sachin Tendulkar's record of 673 runs in 2003.


Afghanistan Prepares For T20 Showdown Against Formidable Australia
