#### **Dry Run Conducted On National Highway**

Jammu: With just two days left for commencement of annual Shri Amarnath Ji Yatra, Jammu and Kashmir (J&K) administration, along with the police and security forces, successfully conducted a dry run of the Amarnath Yatra convoy on the Jammu-Srinagar National Highway on June 26.

The Dry run started from Jammu and successfully crossed Udhampur District. The dry run was aimed at assessing the security arrangements and logistical requirements for the Yatra convoy. It involved a mock movement of a convoy of vehicles, carrying pilgrims and supplies. The convoy was accompanied by security forces and medi-cal teams. The dry run was observed by senior officials from the J&K administration, the police, and the security forces

A multi-layer security cover deployed to secure highways and maintain a tight vigil during nights was chalked out by security agencies this year as yatra comes in the backdrop of a flip in militancy in the Jammu region, with back to back attacks and terror violence incidents.

This year's enhanced security measures follow the June 9 terror attack on a pilgrim bus in Reasi, which resulted in the deaths of nine individuals, including the driver and conductor, and left more than 33 others injured.

Subsequent attacks in Kathua and Doda further underscored the need for stringent security, with one CRPF trooper and two militants killed, alongside injuries to one civilian and six security personnel.

The J&K administration also set a cut-off timing for pilgrims who intended to travel by vehicles or by foot. | More on PO6



#### Killed In Doda **Encounter**

3 Terrorists

Jammu: Three terrorists, suspected to be affiliated with the Pakistan-based Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM) outfit, were killed in a gunfight that lasted for more than six hours in a forest area in Jammu and Kashmir's Doda district on Wednesday, police officials said.

A policeman was also injured in the gunfight that broke out in Bajaad village in the Gandoh area around 9:50 am amid an intensified cordon-and-search operation launched by the police, Army and Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF), following twin terrorist attacks in the hill district on June 11 and 12, the

officials added. Six security personnel were injured when terrorists attacked a joint check post at Chattargalla on June 11, while a policeman was hurt in a gunfight with terrorists at the Kota top in Gandoh the next day.

After the twin attacks, the security forces intensified their anti-terrorist operations and announced a cash reward of Rs 5 lakh each on information about four Pakistani terrorists believed to have infiltrated into the district.

During an operation in a village in Sinoo panchayat, the forces came under heavy fire from the terrorists hiding in a "dhok" (mud house) on a slope, the officials said, adding that one ultra was killed in the retaliatory fire after he came out and started firing on the search parties.

Heavy gunfire and explosions rattled the village as two more terrorists were eliminated by the security forces as the day progressed, the officials said, adding that a huge quantity of arms and ammunition, including two M4 carbines and an AK-series assault rifle, were seized from the possession | More on P06

#### Mian Qayoom Remanded **To Police Custody Till July 1**

Jammu: Mian Abdul Qayoom, a former president of the Jammu and Kashmir High Court Bar Association, was on Wednesday sent to police custody till July 1 by a special court in connection with the 2020 murder conspiracy of fellow advocate Babar Qadri.

Qayoom, who was arrested on Tuesday and brought to Iammu from Srinagar, appeared before the special court, which ordered his police remand during in-camera proceedings.

Officials said the police requested a 15-day remand to interrogate Qayoom but the judge granted remand till July 1 and directed that he be presented before a designated National Investigation Agency (NIA) judge, who is currently undergoing training, on Monday.

During the hearing, Qayoom claimed that he was not



informed about the grounds of his arrest. However, the claim was challenged by the police, which informed the court that the entire proceeding had been videographed and was part of

# Hope No Muslim MP Is Called Terrorist: Ruhullah In LS

Speaker Warns Him To Be Cautious When He Raises Art 370 Abrogation Issue

New Delhi: Aga Syed Ruhullah Mehdi, the newly-elected MP from Srinagar, on Wednesday urged Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla to ensure the sanctity of the House by restraining members from making disparaging remarks like dubbing a Muslim parliamentarian a "terrorist" or rushing legislations like the abrogation of Article 370.

In his two-minute inaugural address after Birla was elected Speaker, the National Conference member made a passionate appeal and emphasised, "I would request you that from today you are neither BJP nor Congress or Samajwadi, and you have only one party, and that is the Constitution of India."

He expressed hope that the Speaker would uphold the Constitution and lead the house as a beacon of democracy.



Ruhullah cryptically alluded to the Speaker's legacy, stating that his actions in handling both the government and opposition voices would define his tenure.

"This House would remember you for your actions whether you forced treasury benches to listen to the opposition or you silenced the opposition," he said. Ruhullah highlighted the im-

portance of respecting elected

how you silenced the voices in the House that called an elected Muslim MP a terrorist or did you allow those voices. If an elected MP is called a terrorist in this House, then I wonder what would be happening to other Muslims in the country," Ruhullah said after which Birla interrupted

Ruhullah stressed the significance of preventing instances where elected representatives are disparaged in the House, expressing concerns about the treatment of Muslims across the country if such behaviour goes unchecked.

Srinagar: As proposed assembly elections in Jammu and Kashmir approach, preparations for municipal elections have also commenced. The state is gearing up for fresh delimitation in its municipal bodies, with the State Election Commissioner in-

structing deputy commissioners from all twenty districts to actively participate in the delimitation process and provide their suggestions and pro-Municipal posals. elections are anticipated to be

held by the end of the year. As per a local news agency, State Election Commissioner BR Sharma held a one-and-ahalf-hour meeting via video

conference with the Deputy

Commissioners on Tuesday evening to discuss the civic election process. The primary focus of the meeting was on delimitation, which will see the expansion of many municipal bodies. These upcoming civic elections will be the first since Jammu and Kashmir was reconstituted as a Union Territory. In 2018, the last time munici-

pal elections were held, Jammu and Kashmir was a full state. However, following its reorganization in 2019, municipal elections were post-VOTE **√** poned. The terms of the municipal bodies

#### 80% Of New Drug Addicts At GMC **Srinagar Use Heroin: Experts**

Srinagar: Around 1,700 fresh drug addicts visited the Government Medical College (GMC) Srinagar's Drug De-Addiction Centre last year.

An official from the Department of Psychiatry at the Institute of Mental Health and Neurosciences (IMHANS), **GMC** Srinagar, said that around 1,700 new patients visited the centre between January 2023 and December 2023.

"Between March 2022 and March 2023, a total of 3,036 new drug addicts sought help at the centre's outpatient department (OPD). Additionally, hundreds of patients on followup visits continue to return annually," he said.

Dr Yasir Hassan Rather, a professor in the Department of Psychiatry at IMHANS, GMC Srinagar, said the number of fresh drug addicts visiting the centre is on the decline due to stringent government actions against drug peddlers.

The availability of drugs has decreased, making it less accessible than before," he said. Despite the de-

cline, the centre registered 856 new patients last year, with around 70 percent of heroin users suffering from hepatitis.

Dr Rather said that approximately 80 percent of drug abusers use heroin, with many now turning to synthetic heroin. "Synthetic opioids, such as fentanyl, methadone, pethidine, tramadol, | More on P06

# High Court Imposes Rs 50K Costs On Petitioner For Hiding Facts

Srinagar: The High Court of J&K and Ladakh has dismissed a petition by a resident of Baramulla regarding compensation for over 7 Kanals last at the rate of Rs.70 lakh per kanal in the north Kashmir district and imposed Rs 50.000 as costs on him for concealing material facts before it.

The petitioner's land, along with that of others, totalling over 26 kanals, had been acquired around a decade ago for expansion of the Kansipora Fruit & Vegetable Market having been established in 2006 on over 44 kanals and 14 marlas of land, for infrastructure requirement of the fruit growers of the area.

In his plea, the petitioner, M A Dar, had demanded price of the land under Acquisition Act and sought the award be passed and amount be fixed as per



Market rate of the land.

However, officials said that the petitioner has mislead the Court as his land came to be acquired pursuant to the private negotiations meeting held on 15 July, 2014, wherein the rate of the land of the petitioner came to be approved by the Private Negotiations Committee on 15 July 2014 itself at the rate Rs. 20 lacs per kanal and same came to be accepted and agreed by

him in person in the meeting without any pressure or coercion and that he also affixed his thumb impression on the minutes of the meeting as a token of acceptance.

After hearing both sides, a bench of Justice Javed Igbal Wani said that the petitioner cannot be allowed to turn around after having participated in the private negotiations undertaken in the matter by the officials and also agreeing to the amount of compensation assessed and determined and

subsequently received by him. "There is yet another angle of the controversy raised in the petition which cannot be overlooked by this Court, that being, that the petitioner admittedly has concealed, suppressed and misrepresented material facts before this Court not only in the instant petition | More on P06

## **Nearly 50% Adults In India Insufficiently Physically Active In 2022: Lancet**

lmost 50 per cent of adults in India engaged in insufficient levels of physical ac-Livity in 2022, according to a study published in The Lancet Global Health journal.

Far more women in India (57 per cent) were found to be insufficiently physically active, compared to men (42 per cent), in line with trends across the South Asian region, the study found.

The insufficient levels of physical activity in women in the region were, on average, 14 per cent higher than those in men, it said.

The South Asian region also ranked the second highest in terms of adults being insufficiently physically active after high-income Asia Pacific region, an international team of researchers, including those from the World Health Organization (WHO), said.

Globally, the authors found that about a third of the adults (31.3 per cent) were insufficiently physically active -- defined as not performing at least 150 minutes of moderateintensity physical activity per week or 75 minutes of vigourous-intensity physical activity per week.

This was up by five per cent from 26.4 per cent of the adults worldwide insufficiently engaging in physical activity in 2010, they found, and if the 2010-2022 trends continued, the authors said that the global target of improving physical activity engagement by 15 per cent would not be met.



In India, a little over 22 per cent of the adults engaged in insufficient physical activity in the year 2000, while in 2010, close to 34 per cent of the adults were insufficiently physically active, the researchers found.

They projected that in 2030, 60 per cent of the adults could be insufficiently engaging in physical activity,

should current trends continue. For the study, the researchers analysed data of physical activity reported by adults (aged at least 18 years) in population-based surveys to estimate the number of adults performing insufficient physical activity for 197 countries and territories from 2000 to 2022.

The team also found that around the world, older adults, both men and women, aged 60 years and above, were increasingly engaging in insufficient physical activity.

Physical inactivity is known to heighten risk of developing noncommunicable diseases, including diabetes and heart disease. Rising levels of physical activity, along with an increasingly sedentary lifestyle, are contributing to increase in cases of these diseases and burdening healthcare systems around the world, according to the WHO.

A 2023 Indian Council of Medical Research-India Diabetes (ICMR-IN-DIAB) study, published in The Lancet Diabetes and Endocrinology journal, estimated that 101 million people in India were diabetic in 2021, and about 315 million had hypertension the same year.

Further, 254 million were estimated to have obesity and 185 million estimated to have high levels of LDL or 'bad' cholesterol, according to the study.



# Perseverance of Kashmir Artisans Finally Recognized

From Creative City Network to World Craft Council Srinagar city gets acclaimed designation

> fter being designated as part of the Creative City Network by the United Nations Educational Scientific and Cultural Organization -UNESCO in November 2021, Srinagar has now been recognized as World Craft City. This was recently announced by the noted institution of international repute the World Craft Council. This acclaimed and esteemed designation is being celebrated as a great achievement for Jammu & Kashmir. This is not only an attainment and accomplishment for the artisans of Kashmir but this is recognition for our creativity and innovative work as well for which Government institutions and few NGOs have also done tremendous work especially Directorate of Handicrafts & Handlooms, Craft Development Institute-CDI & Indian National Trust for Art and Heritage -INTACH Jammu & Kashmir chapter.

> Pertinent to mention that Srinagar city was designated as the the creative city in the field of Crafts and Folk Arts by UNESCO few years back only second city in India in this category after Jaipur. The UNESCO recognition gave Srinagar city a recognition in the art and craft field as well and it entered the club of 295 creative cities network at global level. It is important to mention that every year UNESCO seeks applications for various cities across the globe for putting them under its UNESCO creative cities network UCCN project. The applications in India are routed through the Ministry of Culture. As mentioned above Jaipur was included in the UCCN project in the crafts and folk arts category and Varanasi and Chennai were included in this network in 2015 and 2017 respectively in the music category. In 2019 Hyderabad was included under Gastronomy (cooking, food etc) category and Mumbai was also included under creative cities network in film category in the same year.



Kashmir has been known for its natural beauty since ages. In Spite of the fact that we had so much to showcase vis a vis culture, heritage food arts and crafts etc but these were not recognized due to various reasons. Kashmir is like a treasure trove of multiple things but our own people in Government and other institutions failed to take Kashmir to the global level. We had so much to portray but we could only sell Dal Lake, Shalimar garden, Nishat garden, Pahalgam and Gulmarg to the tourists. Why are international tourists not visiting Kashmir now? It is not because of security concerns but the reality is that we didn't promote Kashmir in a way it should have been in the last 30 to 40 years. There are the best alps, lakes and mountains in other parts of the world especially Europe and foreign and high end domestic tourists don't come to Kashmir to see them now. These things would fascinate them maybe until late 1980's or early 1990's but not now? The people across the globe need to be made aware about our 4000 year old history. We have so much to offer in the categories of culture, arts, crafts, food etc. Our Srinagar old city is itself a heritage city but our governments in the past didn't know how to promote and project it? I must give credit to Mr Saleem Beg, former DG Tourism J&K who worked hard in the last 15 to 20 years to promote our culture and heritage. As head of INTACH Jammu & Kashmir chapter he has done great work. People like Dr Hakim Sameer Hamdani are also doing incredible work and very recently he organised first ever open exhibition in Srinagar on calligraphy and allied things. The calligraphic inscriptions on historic buildings, including khanqahs, mosques, temples, shrines, and mausoleums of Kashmir were portrayed before august audience at Emporium Gardens Srinagar.

The work done by Mr Mahmood Shah as Director Tourism and presently as Director Handicrafts and Handlooms is also remarkable. This has paved the way for Srinagar getting its recognition which it should have got decades back. Sometimes I wonder why Srinagar didn't get recognition under the Gastronomy (Food) category like Hyderabad in the creative cities network? We can compete in that category as well. Our Kashmiri wazwan is much richer culturally than Hyderabadi food?

Kashmir has much more to showcase but that couldn't happen in the past. We have been bestowed with everything like natural beauty arts, crafts, food etc etc. Why wasn't all this recognized in the past? The reason I see is that Govt officers in Handicrafts, Handlooms, Tourism and Culture didn't explore possibilities to showcase Kashmir in a more presentable way. Lack of technological interventions can also be a reason. Our officers in J&K worked in a typical babu style rather than doing research and development in the past. They didn't get a chance to participate in workshops and seminars at national and international level. They were not exposed to the outside world and this made them like a Frog in Well? unfortunately!

Same thing happened with our artisans as well. They had great skills but their talent remained hidden and unexplored for decades. We have people like Farooq Ahmad Mir from Srinagar old city who was conferred the prestigious Sant Kabir award in Handloom category (Kani Pashmina) in 2014 by the President of India, but how much was written about this great artisan in local press or media? Mir sahib is 5th generation Kanishawl weaver and he has kept the tradition alive that has now passed on to his 6th generation. His sons Majid, Altaf and Fayaz are also great artisans and Kani Shawl weavers who have been conferred national awards in this category but they also are like unsung heros. I believe during the last 10 to 15 years only most of our artisans were recognized at national level which is really unfortunate. We have many such people in Kashmir and I believe their talent will get exposed to the outside world now after Srinagar got recognized as World Craft City

What is World Craft City?
World Craft City is innovative

work that was launched in 2014 by the World Crafts Council also called WCC International. The Convener of Indian National Trust for Art and Cultural Heritage (INTAC) Jammu & Kashmir, Saleem Beg while interacting with media recently said the international jury of the World Crafts Council WCC were surprised by the art and crafts of Kashmir and were surprised to see the hidden treasures of Kashmiri arts and craft which according to them had remained hidden from the outside world. The WCC Jury had visited Srinagar in April this year and a number of craft products of Kashmir including Pashmina Shawls, Kani Shawls, Papier-Machie, Hand Knotted Carpets, Pashmina Shawls, and Sozni work were examined by them. The jury members were stunned and surprised to see the fine work done by our respected artisans.

#### Conclusion

As Srinagar gets recognized as the World Craft City, I appreciate the role played by 20,000 artisans of Srinagar. These are the people who kept the Kashmiri handicraft art alive even after facing huge challenges during last several decades. Infact many people belonging to traditional artisan communities shifted and switched their profession but we must applaud those who remained steadfast and kept the tradition alive. Farooq Ahmad Mir's educated sons Majid, Altaf and Fayaz could have opted for some other job but they worked like torch bearers of this sector. We have many such people like them in Kashmir who didn't give up. Now it is imperative upon the artisans and traders of handicrafts especially to promote and propagate genuine Kashmiri products and ensure no cheating is done with customers. There are reports that duplicate products are being sold in the market calling them Kashmiri handmade items. This illegal trade must end and Govt particularly the Handicrafts and Handlooms department plus Craft Development Institute have a more challenging task now to accomplish so that we maintain decorum and sanctity of our Kashmiri handicraft and handloom products.

## **Technology and Your Intuition**

n today's world, it's easy to fall prey to the flood of trivial ■information that bombards our brains. The ability to connect with so much information in such an immediate manner has introduced new challenges to our brain's ability to function; for example, the data come at a pace which far exceeds the brain's ability to adapt. One critical aspect which is often overlooked is the impact of digital overload on the brain's intuitive abilities.

Our exploration of technology's impact on the neuroscience of intuition, how digital overload affects it, and how we can harness technology to enhance intuition in a connected world begins with an alarming vignette.

#### **PIECES OF THE PUZZLE**

Meet Muhammad, a former professor and educator, now deeply invested in fostering his professional network and constantly connected and engaged with digital platforms. His mind once thrived on curiosity, but the allure of TikTok soon captivated his attention. Brain fog crept in, clouding his ability to synthesize complex information. The relentless stream of hypnotic social media posts dulled his ability to think deeply, transforming his cognition into a "click-and-enjoy" system rather than one of

deep reading and processing.

Muhammad began struggling to piece together intricate concepts both at work and in life. His professional network company required him to be an event organizer but he found it increasingly difficult to synchronize travel arrangements for speakers at an international medical conference, even booking a weeklong layover in Egypt for one professor by mistake.

#### **SCROLLING TO ETERNITY**

Each scroll through TikTok's endless feed further blurred his mental clarity, but he couldn't seem to stop. Even during bathroom breaks, his phone was ever-present. Longing for the days when his thoughts flowed freely, Muhammad realized the toll social media overexposure had taken on his cognitive abilities. He struggled to focus on tasks for extended periods and noticed a decline in memory retention.

Determined to reclaim his acuity, he limited his Tik-Tok time to morning coffee and after dinner for an hour. Though challenging at first, the fog gradually lifted, and clarity returned. Empowered by newfound focus, Muhammad rekindled his intellectual curiosity, even rediscovering the pleasure of reading books and highlighting a newfound understanding of the corruptible nature of his brain's intui-



tive function.

Like Muhammad, many of us experience shorter attention spans due to increased social media use, making it more challenging to tap into intuitive abilities. Intuition is the brain's ability to make decisions based on subconscious information processing and pattern recognition. It relies on the rapid and automatic activation of various neural networks and neurotransmitters, such as dopamine and serotonin. These neurotransmitters play significant roles in modulating attention, reward, and decisionmaking processes, all vital for intuitive reasoning.

What many people colloquially call their "gut" could also be called intuition — a natural instinct supported by dynamic neural networks across various brain regions. Dopamine and serotonin are two key neurotransmitters in this context. Dopamine, involved in the brain's reward system, sharpens focus and enhances attention, enabling rapid information processing and pattern recognition. Serotonin regulates mood, emotions, and social behavior, contributing to well-being and confidenceessential factors for intuitive decision-making. Optimal serotonin levels promote cognitive flexibility and creativity, necessary for generating novel

insights and solutions. The interplay between these neurotransmitters, along with diverse neural network activity, underpins the complex processes of intuitive reasoning. As information is rapidly processed and patterns recognized subconsciously, dopamine and serotonin modulate attention, enhance cognitive flexibility, and regulate emotional responses, ultimately influencing intuitive decision-making.

#### **THINK OR SINK**

Despite the challenges

posed by digital overload, recent advances in neuroscience suggest that technology can improve the brain's natural intuitive functions. By understanding the neural mechanisms underlying intuition, we can develop targeted interventions to boost attention, focus,

and decision-making. Strengthening neurotransmitter activity is crucial for enhancing intuition. A study by Baas et al. (2016) showed that individuals with higher dopamine synthesis capacity exhibited lower attentional control, suggesting that interventions enhancing dopamine transmission may improve intui-tive abilities. Similarly, mindfulness-based interventions have been shown to increase serotonin levels, contributing to better intuitive decisionmaking (Goldberg et al., 2018).

#### **OVERLOADING ATTENTION**

We can adopt various strategies to counteract the negative effects of digital overload and enhance attentional intelligence. One promising approach is digital detox, in which individuals disconnect from digital devices for a set period to reduce information overload and regain focus. Incorporating regular mindfulness practices into daily routines has also been shown to improve attentional functioning and coping strategies (Goldberg et al., 2015).

Emerging technologies like neurofeedback and brain stimulation can further enhance intuitive abilities. Neurofeedback trains individuals to alter brain activity patterns, leading to improvements in attention and decision-making. Brain stimulation can modulate neural activity in specific brain regions involved in intuitive reasoning, potentially enhancing intuitive capacity.

#### **FINAL THOUGHTS** Intuition emerges from the

intricate interplay of neural networks and neurotransmitters, enabling rapid and adaptive decision-making based on subconscious information processing and pattern recognition. Dopamine and serotonin play key roles in modulating attention, reward, and emotional states, influencing the intuitive reasoning process. While digital overload poses significant challenges to our intuitive abilities, recent neuroscience advances and technological solutions offer promising ways to counter these effects.

By harnessing the power of technology and incorporating targeted interventions into our lives, we can enhance the brain's intuitive function, leading to improved attention, decision-making, and overall well-being.

magine this! What would you do if a plane's canopy all of a sudden burst open midair? Fear and panic are likely to grip before figuring out how to manage the situation. Such a frightening situation happened with Dutch pilot Narine Melkumjan.

A video shared by the pilot on social media shocked the users. In the video, she struggled to maintain control of her Extra 330LX aircraft.

The aircraft's canopy, a transparent enclosure that protects the cockpit unexpectedly opened mid-air. The incident occurred a couple of years ago when Melkumjan was on her second aerobatic training flight.

In the video, she toiled to keep her eyes open against the wind. However, she applied all her skills to land the two-seater safely.

"It was a challenging experience that could have been avoided if I had made a proper visual check before taking off...



The canopy locking pin had never gone into the locked position, and I failed to notice it during my checks" she wrote.

"Additionally, flying without any eye protection made the flight even more challenging than it already was," she added. She explained that the flight

was a "distressing experience, filled with noise, breathing difficulties and impaired visibility.

"It took me nearly 28 hours to fully recover my vision. Aerodynamically, I've experienced some buffet and controllability challenges. Probably the most difficult part was to keep

the power in, thus trading my vision and breathing for kinetic energy," said Melkumjan.

Sharing the Melkumjan urged all her fellow pilots to be safe. "I hope that my story serves as a cautionary tale and that you will learn from my mistakes," she said.

The case was transferred to a Jammu court from Srinagar in January on grounds of ensuring a fair trial by the Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh High Court. The high court's decision had come

in response to Qadri's father citing the reluctance of Srinagar-based lawyers to render assistance due to the involvement of influential figures. Qayoom, who is the father-in-law of

Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh High Court judge Justice Javed Iqbal Wani, has been under scrutiny in multiple cases, including alleged grabbing of temple land and dishonouring the national flag. Throughout his career, Qayoom has

been a vocal advocate for Kashmir's integration with Pakistan, employing tactics such as protests and incitement of violence to further his separatist agenda, leading to tensions in the His association with banned terror organisations and unlawful as-

sociations led by the likes of Yasin Malik, Asiya Andrabi and Syed Ali Shah Geelani raised concerns over his role in propagating a secessionist narrative With a track record of criminal

#### PIB Srinagar Organizes 'Vartalap' **On Three New Criminal Laws**

**SRINAGAR:** Press Information Bureau, Ministry of Information & Broadcasting, Government of India, Srinagar organized a Media Workshop 'Vartalap' on the three new legislations 'Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita' (BNS), 'Bharatiya Nagrik Suraksha Sanhita' (BNSS) and 'Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam' (BSA) of 2023.

The 'Vartalap' was organized to sensitize the media in Kashmir about the spirit and intent behind the three new criminal laws. During the workshop, the speakers explained the rationale for the introduction of these laws and highlighted some of the important departures from the Indian Penal Code, the Criminal Procedure Code and the Indian Evidence Act.

In his welcome address, Qazi Salman Ibrahim, Joint Director, PIB Srinagar said that the main aim of these legislations is to 'decolonize' criminal laws of the British Era.

Speaking on the occasion, Dar Rashid, Senior Prosecuting Officer, J&K Prosecution Services said, the three new laws 'Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita'. 'Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita' & 'Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam will give a new direction to the criminal justice system in India. Describing these laws as a shift from an archaic colonial system, he said that these new laws have been designed and drafted by the Indians for the Indians and the system created by the Indian Parliament with the objective towards ensuring justice.

Advocate Sheikh Umar Faroog, Senior Advocate, J&K High Court in his address said, these new laws are in line with the Indian ethos as these have made a significant shift towards becoming more victim centric. He further said that the victim rights have been defined and protected in the Bharatiya Nagrik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 in multiple ways which make victims active participants of criminal proceedings than mere passive observers of the same.

Advocate Naveed Gul, Senior Advocate, J&K High Court in his address said, the three new criminal laws are an endeavour to make the criminal justice system more accessible, accountable, credible, and justice driven. He further said that with over 600 amendments, additions, and deletions, the criminal laws have been pushed into a transparent, modern, and technologically adept framework, equipped to address contemporary challenges that rig the criminal justice dispensation of India.

#### 1109 Substance Abusers **Identified In Kupwara**

SRINAGAR: Healthcare authorities in north Kashmir's Kupwara district have raised concerns following the identification of hundreds of substance abusers.

Data accessed reveals that 1,109 substance abusers were identified in the district until May 2024. Among them, 311 have recovered, while 605 are currently undergoing treatment.

An official told KNO that regular awareness programs and counselling sessions are being conducted in the district to combat the drug

He said the Deputy Commissioner Kupwara has implemented several measures to address this issue. "The Chief Medical Officer (CMO) Kupwara, Chief Education Officer (CEO) Kupwara, and Nodal Officer Colleges have been directed to organise awareness programmes, rallies and capacity-building counselling sessions on the harmful effects of drug abuse in all degree colleges," he said.

### Ten Children Per Day In **Gaza Have Their Legs Amputated: UNRWA**

The head of the UN Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East (UNRWA), Philippe Lazzarini, highlighted on 25 June the horrific injury and maiming of Palestinian children resulting from Israel's bombing of Gaza.

"Basically, we have, every day, 10 children who are losing one leg or two legs on average," Lazzarini told reporters in Geneva.

UNRWA used data from the UN children's agency UNICEF and noted that the figure mentioned "does not even include the arms and the hands, and we have many more" of these.

"Ten per day, that means around 2,000 children after the more than 260 days of this brutal war," Lazzarini added. He further noted that amputations are being carried out in "horrible conditions."

Separately, the US-based NGO Save the Children estimates that about 21,000 children are missing as a result of Israel's war on Gaza.

As of Monday, Israel's bombing

of the Gaza Strip has resulted in the death of 37,626 people, about 75 percent of whom are children, women, and the elderly. Over 15,821 of the dead are children, and over 10,475 are women.

Greece has demanded that the European states respond to this "tragedy" and accept children from Gaza to be treated for their injuries and other warrelated traumas.

"We need to face this tragedy very clearly," Greek Foreign Minister George Gerapetritis said last week. "Europe should be open to injured people from [Gaza] but also to children who are now facing famine or other sorts of dangers.

Gerapetritis spoke with Palestinian Prime Minister Mohammad Mustafa and is seeking the support of other nations to move forward with the project.

Brussels urged EU health and civil protection ministers to voice their readiness to accept Palestinian patients in a letter sent in May. Colombia has made it known that it will provide medical treatment for injured Palestinian children.

#### Iran's Presidential Hopefuls Hold **Last Debate Ahead Of Snap Elections**



Presidential candidates in the Islamic Republic of Iran held a debate on 25 June, two days ahead of a snap election that will determine a successor to Ebrahim Raisi, who died in a sudden helicopter crash last month

The candidates who have been chosen by Iran's Constitutional Council from 80 applicants seeking the Iranian presidency are Saeed Jalili, Alireza Zakani, Amir Hossein Qazizadeh Hashemi, Mostafa Pourmohammadi, Mohammad Baqer Qalibaf, and Masoud Pezeshkian.

Each taking an equal amount of time, the candidates presented their visions for Iran and solutions for its economic, political, and cultural issues. The leading theme of the debate was Iran's economic situation.

Jalili called during the debate for strengthening the country-

Pezeshkian discussed internal and external issues that Iran faces, including gaps between the government and the people and harsh western sanctions, which have been imposed on the country for decades.



## **UN Warns Of 'Catastrophic'** Threat To Region If Israel-**Hezbollah Fighting Escalates**

**NEW YORK CITY:** The UN on Tuesday expressed serious concerns about the risk of an escalation in the fighting between Israel and Hezbollah, warning that not only would it cause even more suffering and devastation to the people of Lebanon and Israel but also "more potentially catastrophic consequences for the region."

Tor Wennesland, the UN's special coordinator for the Middle East urged both sides to take urgent, immediate steps to deescalate the situa-

Tensions along the border between Israel and Lebanon continue to escalate. Crossborder exchanges of fire have increased in recent weeks, prompting UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres to warn that the risk of the conflict spreading to the wider region

"is real and must be avoided." Wennesland was speaking during a meeting of the Se-

implementation of Resolution 2334, which was adopted in 2016 and demands an end to all Israeli settlement activity, immediate steps to prevent violence and acts of terror against civilians, and calls on both sides to refrain from provocative actions, incitement and inflammatory rhetoric.

Wennesland said he was "deeply troubled" by continuing İsraeli settlement expansion in the occupied West Bank, including East Jerusalem, and reiterated that all settlements "have no legal validity and are in flagrant violation of international law." He called on Israel to cease all such activity immediately.

Escalating violence and tensions in the occupied West Bank, including East Jerusalem, are also deeply worrying, Wennesland said.

"Intensified armed exchanges between Palestinians and Israeli security forces, along-

Israeli settlers against Palestinians, have also exacerbated tensions and led to exceedingly high levels of casualties and detentions. All perpetrators of attacks must be held accountable," he added.

Wennesland blamed regional instability on the ongoing hostilities in Gaza and stressed the need for the immediate and unconditional release of all hostages, and an immediate humanitarian ceasefire.

"There is a deal on the table and it should be agreed," he told council members. "I welcome the efforts, including by Egypt, Qatar and the United States, to reach such deal."

He lamented the fact that effective mechanisms from Israel to provide humanitarian notifications, safe conditions for humanitarian operations, and sufficient access for aid workers to address humanitarian needs remain "sorely lacking and must be put in place with-

Kejriwal was produced before the court of vacation judge Amitabh Rawat in compliance with the production warrant issued by the court yesterday.

#### Israel Eyes Use Of Musk's Starlink In Event Of War With Hezbollah **Agencies**

JERUSALEM: Israel is looking to use Elon Musk's Starlink to maintain Internet connectivity should there be a potential all-out-war with Lebanese Hezbollah on the northern border that causes power outages in Israel, a newspaper report said on Tuesday.

The Calcalist said that the finance and communications ministries were seeking to utilize Starlink's 5,000 low-orbit satellites to ensure stable data and information flow for state authorities during emergencies.

Both ministries did not immediately comment to Reuters. In February, Communications Minister Shlomo Karhi gave permission to Starlink, the satellite unit of SpaceX, to operate

## **Bombay High Court Dismisses Students'** Petition Against College's Hijab Ban

**MUMBAI:** The Bombay High Court on Wednesday dismissed the plea filed by women students challenging the ban on wearing hijab, niqab, burkha, stole, cap, etc., on campus by a Mumbai college.

A division bench of Justices A S Chandurkar and Rajesh Patil of Bombay HC refused to interfere in the decision taken by a Mumbai city-based college and dismissed a petition filed by nine female students challenging the college authorities' decision.

Earlier in July, the students who have been studying in the second and third year of a science degree course moved against the directive issued by the Chembur Trombay Education Society's NG Acharya and DK Marathe College imposing a dress code barring the students from wearing hijab, niqab, burkha, stole, cap, etc. inside the premises.

The petitioners claimed such a directive was against their fundamental rights to practice their religion, right to privacy, and right to choice. The plea termed the college's ac-

tion as "arbitrary, unreasonable, bad-in-law and perverse". Advocate Altaf Khan, representing



case from the Karnataka High Court judgment on the hijab ban in junior colleges, noting that this case concerns senior college students who have a dress code but not a uniform. Khan argued that the dress code was imposed via WhatsApp without any legal authority, contrasting it with the Karnataka case where a pre-existing uniform policy was enforced. He claimed the dress code violates the petitioners' right to choice, bodi-

Earlier, the college authorities claimed that the decision was merely a disciplinary one and was not against the Muslim community.

Senior counsel Anil Anturkar, appearing for the college management, said the dress code was for all students belonging to every religion and caste.

The girls, however, claimed in their plea that such a directive was "nothing but colourable exercise of
