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Waqf(Amendment) **Bill Introduced In LS** Referred To JPC, Oppn **Calls It Draconian**

New Delhi: Union Minority Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju on Thursday introduced The Waqf (Amendment) Bill and proposed sending it to a joint parliamentary committee after opposition parties objected to its provision. He also introduced The Mussalman Wakf (Repeal) Bill, 2024. Home Minister Amit Shah said since the Waqf Act of 1995

came into being, there was a need to repeal the Mussalman Wakf Act, 1923 which had lost its relevance.

He accused the opposition of "misleading" Muslims and saying that amendments had to be brought in as the present act had many mistakes and could not serve its purpose.

The Waqf (Amendment) Bill also aims at renaming the Waqf Act, 1995, as the Unified Waqf Management, Empowerment, Efficiency and Development Act, 1995.

The bill was circulated among Lok Sabha members on Tuesday night ahead of its introduction.

Soon after Rijiju sought leave to introduce the bill, many opposition MPs, who had given notices to oppose the bill, alleged that the proposed legislation was an "attack on the Constitution and federalism".

J&K's Statehood **To Be Restored Before October?**

Srinagar: Union Minister of State for Social Justice and Empowerment Ramdas Athawale on Thursday said that the Centre may announce restoration of statehood to Jammu and Kashmir before October this year.

Addressing a press conference here, the minister said that the legislative assembly elections may also be held in October.

"Polls are scheduled to be held in Maharashtra, Jharkhand and Chhattisgarh before October. I think before October, statehood can be restored and elections may also happen in October," he said while appealing to people to ensure record breaking turnout.

He reiterated that the home minister had announced at the time of abrogation of Article 370 that assembly elections and statehood will be restored. He hailed the high voter turnout in Lok Sabha and lauded people for strengthening democracy.

Speaking about his half an hour meeting with Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha in Srinagar, Athawale said tourism has flourished since the abrogation of Article 370.

"More than 2.11 crore tourists including foreigners have visited here. People don't fear going to Kashmir now.

BJP as a political party is prepared for the next assembly elections in Jammu and Kashmir, for which the preparations have been started far in advance, I&K BIP general secretary, Sunil Sharma said at a press conference here. "Holding elections is the prerogative of the Election Commission of India (ECI), and the Bhartiya Janata Party (BJP) as a political party is prepared to contest elections anytime the poll body makes an announcement," Sharma said. 6th Schedule Demand Ladakh Councils Have **Decision-making Powers: Govt**

New Delhi: The democratic representation and decisionmaking powers of the Ladakh Autonomous Hill Development Councils (LAHDCs) have been retained following the formation of the Union Territory of Ladakh in 2019, the government informed Parliament on Thursday.

These LAHDCs continue to exercise executive powers over different subjects within their respective districts, the government also said in response to a query regarding the extension of tribal area status to the Union Territory (UT).

The LAHDCs in Leh and Kargil function as District Planning and Development

Boards and prepare plans for different programmes and

policies. They reflect the demands and aspirations of the local population, Union Minister of State for Tribal Affairs Durgadas Uikey said in response to a question by Congress MPs Saptagiri Sankar Ulaka and Tanuj Punia.

Ulaka and Punia had asked whether the government intends to extend the provisions of the Sixth Schedule of the Indian Constitution to Ladakh, and the reasons behind the delay in granting tribal area status to the UT.

AI-Powered Antibiotic Breakthrough Offers Hope For Drug Development

n a major advancement for tackling antibiotic resistance, researchers at The University of Texas at Austin have developed a promising new antibiotic using artificial intelligence. The research, published in Nature Biomedical Engineering, marks a significant step forward in creating safer and more effective treatments. The research team employed a large language model (LLM), similar to the technology behind ChatGPT, to re-engineer Protegrin-1. This potent antibiotic, naturally produced by pigs, was effective in killing bacteria but



was previously too toxic for

cells. To achieve this, the team generated over 7,000 variations of Protegrin-1 through a high-throughput method, allowing them to quickly identify which modifications could enhance safety. They then used the LLM to evaluate these variations for their ability to selectively target bacterial membranes, effectively kill bacteria, and avoid harming human red

blood cells. This Al-guided

approach led to the creation

of a refined version known as bacterially selective Protegrin-1.2 (bsPG-1.2).

In preliminary animal trials, mice treated with bsPG-1.2 and infected with multidrug-resistant bacteria showed a significant reduction in bacterial levels in their organs within six hours. These promising results suggest that bsPG-1.2

could potentially advance to human trials.

Claus Wilke, a professor of integrative biology and cosenior author of the study, highlighted the transformative impact of AI on drug development.

"Large language models are revolutionising protein and peptide engineering, making it possible to develop new drugs and improve existing ones more efficiently. This technology not only identifies potential new treatments but also speeds up their path to clinical application," Wilke said. The breakthrough underscores how AI is being harnessed to address critical health challenges.

Go Beyond Gulmarg, Pahalgam

ike the last two years, Kashmir Valley is witnessing a massive tourist rush this year also. The government data over the past few shows an impressive growth in tourist arrivals: a total of 1,08,41,009 tourists visited Jammu and Kashmir between January to June 2024 and 2,11,24,674 in 2023, which is an all-time high so far, followed by the visit of 1,88,64,332 tourists in 2022, 1,13,14,884 in 2021 and 34,70,834 tourists in 2020. The growth, in a sense, maps the steady improvement in J&K situation since the abrogation of Article 370 in August 2019, persuading holidaymakers to visit the region. It also reflects the recovery from COVID-19 pandemic.

That said, the spike in tourism is creating a realization that it may not be environmentally sustainable in the long run. This was also acknowledged by the Union Minister for Tourism and Culture Gajendera Singh Shekhawat Wednesday while talking to the media on the sidelines of an event at the International Convention Centre (ICC) on the banks of Dal Lake here. Shekhawat said there was no denving the fact that the prominent tourist destinations were witnessing congestion due to the growing rush of tourists. The minister underlined a dire need "to divert both foreign as well as domestic tourists towards virgin and offbeat destinations across the country including J&K."

Kashmir desperately needs creation of more tourist destination to take pressure off the usual haunts like Gulmarg Pahalgam, and also Mughal gardens along Dal lake. There is no regulation of tourist numbers to these places. Moreover, the influx of tourists and the booming film industry can put pressure on local resources and infrastructure. This calls for prioritization of infrastructure development, including improved connectivity, efficient waste management systems, and the promotion of eco-friendly practices. Also, the roads leading to key tourist spots must be expanded and maintained to reduce traffic congestion and ensure safer travel. Investing in public transportation options, such as shuttle buses to major attractions, could also alleviate some of the pressure on the roadways.

But the excessive focus on fewer resorts are drawing tourists away from other equally scenic places. There is an urgent need to develop new tourists sites, so that the benefits of tourism reach people across the Valley. There are plenty of such places in the Valley - Bangus Valley in North Kashmir, for example. The government needs to invest in the infrastructure in these places to facilitate the tourists to travel to lesser known resorts.

However, in past two years, the UT government has increased the options for tourists by developing more resorts. For example, Aharbal, Yusmarg, Tosamaidan, Gurez, historic old city in Srinagar are finding a prominent place on the tourist map of Kashmir. These places need further development of tourist infrastructure and also wider publicity for people to visit. At the same time, the administration should ensure that the excessive tourism doesn't adversely impact the fragile ecology of the Valley. At some level we have to proactively work to regulate it.

However, Rosa Abraham from Azim Premji University highlights that much of this increase is driven by unpaid family work rather than paid employment. She calls this "distress-led employment," where financial pressures push more women into self-employment, with earnings remaining stagnant. Despite improvements

in primary and secondary education, women have missed out on opportunities in fast-growing sectors due to a growing demand for technically and digitally skilled labor, where men often have higher levels of tertiary education and vo-

access these new jobs, there must be targeted digital skill development programs.

Lack of digital skills has prevented many women from accessing many opportunities. To bridge this digital divide, there is an urgent need for initiatives that provide women with the necessary training and support. Without these steps, women risk being further marginalized in an increasingly digital world, facing lower standards of living.

Bridging the Digital Divide for Women?

Ensuring digital inclusion for women and girls is essential for equitable progress. Schools, as the first point of contact with technology for children, play a crucial role in this effort. It's important to ensure that girls have equal access to technical skills and digital literacy education, both in schools and through specialized training programs. They should be made aware of digital resources early on in their education. Unfortunately, nearly 70% of schools in Jammu and Kashmir lack digital devices, according to the Government of India, underscoring the need for urgent intervention. To make digital tools more accessible, especially for rural women and the urban poor, reducing the cost of devices and services through subsidies or free data is crucial. Enhancing network coverage and quality, as well as ensuring the safety and accessibility of public facilities, can significantly promote digital inclusion.

Digital technologies offer numerous opportunities for remote part-time work. Connecting women to online job platforms and freelance marketplaces can open new employment avenues. To support this, short-term courses and skill-building programs should be conducted in colleges and community centers, focusing on cybersecurity, online content reliability, and job-oriented skills to keep girls competitive in the job market.

One of the reasons girls face a digital divide is strict family values. Counseling sessions and workshops can encourage parents to change their attitudes and ensure there is no discrimination between men and women in the use of digital resources. These workshops should also focus on cybersecurity and can be conducted by community centers, schools

The Paradox of Digital Learning for Women

There's a paradox at the heart of digital learning: those who would benefit the most from it are often the least likely to have access. Women, in particular, are disproportionately affected by the digital divide, which impacts them the hardest. According to the Observer Research Foundation Indian women are 15% less likely to own a mobile phone and 33% less likely to use mobile internet than men. Jammu and Kashmir is amongst the top places having such poor and depressing status of women in relation to access to digital devices. Kavita Suri from Jammu

Women are often deterred from using digital resources due to hostile online environments filled with hate speech and harassment. Lower digital literacy and skills make them more vulnerable to cyberbullying and cyberstalking, which restricts their use of technology and widens the digital divide.

Women also face chalwith acquiring lenges technological skills and understanding how to use digital resources effectively. The ASER Report from 2021 shows that although 72% of students in Jammu and Kashmir have smartphones at home, only 40% can use them for academic purposes, highlighting a digital disparity in educational technology access.

study by Nikita sangwan and Farzana Afridi found that women are less likely to apply for jobs online. Even when they do, they often accept lower offers due to mobility restrictions and societal norms.

Take the case of Arbeena, a soon-to-be graduate from a top professional college in Kashmir. She has been searching for a parttime job but hasn't found any offline opportunities. Despite the availability of many online opportunities, Arbeen is hesitant to pursue them due to her unfamiliarity with online platforms and discomfort with sharing her personal details. She is also concerned about assessing the credibility of these platforms, which adds to her reluctance.

Similarly, digital illiteracy and unfamiliarity with online marketplaces have hindered women entrepreneurs and job seekers from tapping into opportunities in the gig economy and online workplaces, especially in the post-COVID-19 era. Many women entrepreneurs still do not use online methods for payments, marketing, and sales. The disparity in digital payments highlights this divide: 69% of men in India use digital payments and internet banking, compared to just 31% of women. While more than half of Indian women own cell phones, only 22.5% engage in financial activities through them.

show that wom largely concentrated in routine back-office services that require basic skills, while men dominate specialized jobs and managerial positions requiring advanced digital skills. Steven Kapsos's research found that less than 19% of new job opportunities in India's ten fastest-growing occupations were filled by women.

Moreover, many women in the digital labor force are engaged in part-time gig work rather than permanent positions that offer legal benefits. Gig workers often lack traditional employment benefits and social protections enjoyed by formal sector workers. This lack of a safety net is especially challenging for women, who may face additional vulnerabilities. Without access to maternity benefits, health insurance, compensation, allowances, or retirement benefits, wom-

en are exposed to greater risks and find it difficult to advance in their careers. This structural organization of women's work is particularly concerning. In the developed world, female workers in low-skill clerical, service, and sales jobs are at risk of being replaced by automation. The International Monetary Fund's 2018 "Gender, Technology, and the Future of Work" report warns about this issue. Dr. Sona Mitra from IWWAGE emphasizes that as automation rises, it will create a new class of jobs requiring different skill sets. To help women

and colleges.

There is a pressing need to familiarize women with existing programs run by the State, Central government, and nonprofit organizations. The Central government has launched several initiatives like Pradhan Mantri Gramin Digital Saksharta Abhiyaan (PMGDISHA) which aims to make six crore individuals in rural areas digitally literate, empowering them to use digital devices, access the internet and government services, send and receive emails, and make digital payments.

Similarly, the Jammu and Kashmir government has launched programs like Manzilein (jkcareerportal. org) and Aao Baat Karein (Tele Counseling Helpline). Manzilein, managed by SA-MAGRA Shiksha, offers students a personalized career dashboard with information on over 550 careers, 21,000 colleges, and numerous programs, entrance exams, and scholarship opportunities. Unfortunately, many women remain excluded from these benefits due to limited digital literacy. Connecting them to these initiatives is essential for promoting digital inclusion and empowerment.

When Personality Disorders Destroy Marriages

Numerous challenges can cause strain in somebody's marriage. Among such challenges that can cause issues in a marital relationship, a mental health issue known as personality disorder can contribute significantly. Personality disorders are long-lasting patterns of think-ing, feeling, and behaving that differ significantly from what is expected in a person's society. These patterns can cause significant distress or impairment in a person's individual life as well as their social relationships. Hence it is important to understand what these disorders are and how they can affect a person's married life so that their impact is reduced through proper interventions in order to have healthier marital relationship. This article talks about different types of Personality Disorders and how each of them can affect a marital relationship and the various ways to deal with them.

Types of Personality Disorders

Personality disorders have been broadly categorized into three clusters:

Marital relationship can get affected by each type of the above mentioned personality disorders, but each of them causes its own specific obstacles and disturbs the marital harmony. Let us now try to go in detail to understand how they can affect a marital relationship.

Communication Breakdown

A healthy marriage is highly dependent upon how effective the communication is between the two partners. This communication can get adversely affected by various types of PerNavigating the Challenge



flicts. For example, a person with Paranoid Personality Disorder can be highly suspicious towards their partner and can misinterpret their benign remarks as hostile or critical. This suspicious behavior and misinterpretation can result in constant arguments that can lead to sense of mistrust between them.

Similarly, intense and unstable emotions experienced by those with Borderline Personality Disorder can lead to erratic and unpredictable communication. Such people may idealizing their partner one moment and devalue them the next, thus creating a turbulent and unbalanced relationship dynamic.

Emotional Dysregulation

Poor emotional regulation is a common finding among various personality disorders. Borderline Personality Disorder, for example, is characterized by the presence of rapid and intense mood swings, and hence partners of such individuals may find it challenging to navigate through the relationship. It is like walking on eggshells for them while being in a marital relationship with individuals with Borderline Pernegative reactions.

Another personality disorder called Narcissistic Personality Disorder is characterized by a lack of empathy. Such people are in excessive need for praise and admiration. Lack of empathy and an excessive need for admiration can make it difficult for the narcissistic individual to recognize or validate their partner's emotions. This can result in the feelings of neglect and emotional distance in the relationship.

Trust and Intimacy Issues

A healthy marriage is highly dependent upon the level of trust partners have for each other. This basic sense of trust can get badly impacted by the presence of Personality disorders in one or both partners in various ways. For example, a person affected by Antisocial Personality Disorder may breach the trust of their partner by showing deceitful or manipulative behaviors. The relationship can get severely impacted if a person with Antisocial Personality Disorder continues to show their disregard for the rights and feelings of others.

For instance, individuals with Avoidant Personality Disorder may have difficulty in engaging in close relationships with their partner as they have a deep fear of rejection and criticism from their partner or from any person who wants to come close to them emotionally. This can create a significant emotional distance between partners, making it difficult to establish a deep and meaningful connection.

Control and Dependency

One more factor that can be detrimental to a marital relationship is an urge to have an extreme control or dependency on another person. For example, a person with Obsessive-Compulsive Personality Disorder may have a persistent urge for control and perfectionism. Such individuals may impose rigid standards and expectations on their partner, due to their tendency for perfectionism. This can lead to the buildup of frustration and resentment in their relationship.

On the other hand, individuals with Dependent Personality Disorder may show disproportionate dependence on their partner to fulfill their physical and emotional needs. It can result in the dependent partner being overly submissive and the other partner feeling overwhelmed by the responsibility, hence creating an imbalance in the relationship.

Conflict Resolution

It is important for maintaining a harmonious marriage that the conflicts that might arise from time to time are handled in a healthy way. However, this ability to handle and resolve conflicts constructively can get badly impaired by Personality disorders. For example, individuals with Histrionic Personality Disorder, with tendency for attention seeking and validation may show dramatic and exaggerated behaviors. This can lead to escalation of conflicts rather than resolving them.

Personality disorders that belong to cluster A, such as Schizoid Personality Disorder, may lead a person to withdraw from conflict and even from day to day affairs of the household completely as they prefer isolation over confrontation. This can cause longterm damage to the relationship as this approach can leave issues unresolved festering over time.

Impact on Parenting

Personality disorders do not affect only marital relationship, their effect can extend beyond that and can adversely affect parenting as well. Personality disorders can compromise patience, consistency, and emotional stability of parents and hence impair their parenting skills.

For instance, children of parents with Borderline Personality Disorder may feel confused and insecure as such parents may have difficulty in maintaining consistent boundaries and discipline while dealing with their children.

In addition, the stress that gets buildup while managing a partner's personality disorder, can affect parenting, thus impacting the overall family dynamics. Children from such households may get caught in the crossfire of conflicts between their parents or may get exposed to erratic and unpredictable behaviors, which can have long lasting impact on their psychological wellbeing.

Seeking Help and Intervention

First step towards recovery and change is to accept and recognize the impact of personality disorders on marriage. In this regard, couples therapy can be beneficial as it can provide a safe space for partners to understand each other's feelings and learn to communicate and resolve conflicts more effectively. It is equally important for one and/ or both the partners to go for Individual therapy, as it can help to develop better coping mechanisms and emotional regulation strategies. In some cases, particularly if there are co-occurring conditions such as anxiety or depression, a person may require medication to handle the situation.

3 Ways to Navigate an Ultra-Processed World

We live in an age where our food and media are ultraprocessed. There are too many calories that are too good to pass up, and there is more free (often clickbait) content than one could ever consume.

While abundant food and free media offer unparalleled ease and pleasure, they pose significant challenges to our health and well-being. New research suggests that ultra-processed foods (UPFs) raise the risk of cognitive impairment and strokes as well as other adverse health effects. Meanwhile, the amount of research on problematic use of social media has dramatically increased in the last decade.

I've met many people who are vigilant about their food, yet consume "media snacks" equivalent to Pringles–I bet you can't eat just one headline. On the other side are media "restrainers" who have forsaken the relentless digital news cycle in the name of mental health but consume ultra-processed snacks that are just as damaging to their brain.

We need to start thinking of media consumption like our food consumption, recognizing the parallels and developing strategies to manage both. As bestselling author Brad Stulburger says, "TikTok is like an endless bag of Skittles. Reality television is like fast food. Trending topics on the internet are akin to cheap whiskey." Consuming these things feels good in the short term but can undermine our health in the long run.

Navigating an Ultra-Processed World

I don't want to demonize ultra-processed food or media-I still consume my fair sharebut I want to examine how we can live healthfully with these facets of modern life. We must first acknowledge how food and information have been refined, packaged, and marketed for maximal consumption with minimal nutrition. We must also develop the skills for reclaiming control over what we consume-both physically and mentally-to enjoy the pleasures of an ultra-processed world while mitigating the dangers.

Here are three actionable strategies to help you navigate this ultra-processed world:

1. Know Your Source and Read Labels Critically

Identifying what is an ultraprocessed concoction is an important first step in skillfully balancing your consumption.

Food: Always check the ingredient list and nutritional information on food labels. If there are things you cannot pronounce or look like they belong in a chemistry lab instead of your kitchen, they're likely signs of ultra-processed ingredients. Emulsifiers, hydrogenated oils, and artificial additives are the

most common ultra-processed ingredients. Ask yourself, "Was this food grown or manufactured?" **Information:** Be wary of articles that rely heavily on clickbait headlines, lack sources, or display clear bias. If there are endBlandness and boredom are subjective. What appears bland or boring results from what you've conditioned your nervous system to interpret as enjoyable.

Navigating an ultra-processed world involves redefining your relationship with boremore rewarding by engaging all five senses as you eat. Smelling, touching, and looking deeply at your food helps you reconnect with the present moment and appreciate the subtler texture and flavors. Over time, if you eat slowly and

less one-sentence paragraphs, generic or vague information, or errors in context or coherence, you're probably dealing with an ultraprocessed piece of writing. Prioritize information from reputable sources offering deep insights—humans with a story and perspective you appreciate and trust. Ask yourself, "Who wrote this and why?"

2. Befriend the "Bland" and "Boring." dom. By intentionally engaging in "boring" activities—such as reading a book, gardening, gazing at the clouds, or practicing mindfulness—you can reset your tolerance for what you perceive as mundane.

Food: Forgo immediately slathering sauces and dressings on your meal and focus on emphasizing the flavors that are already present. While this might sound unappetizing at first, you can retrain your taste buds to find simpler foods that are mindfully, you may get way more enjoyment in a single unadulterated bite than you initially thought possible.

Information: Remember, boredom is a construct you create, and you can recreate it with training. Just like with food, you can retrain your brain to find less stimulating tasks more rewarding by embracing the simplicity and slowness of "boring." Regularly consuming longform writing (i.e., books over status updates) allows your mind to reset its "boring baseline," thus enhancing your ability to focus and process information critically.

3. Mind the Margins

"Minding the Margins" involves paying attention to how you mindlessly fill the gaps in your day with ultra-processed snacks or ultra-processed media bites. The issue is that ultraprocessed items require little preparation, little chewing (and often little critical thinking), perpetuating a cycle of overconsumption. Whether between meals or activities, reaching for another hit of mouthwatering flavor or inbox-clearing pleasure can fuel a compulsive pattern. Become aware of these moments at the margin so you can break the cycle and be more deliberate.

- Food: Recognize situations and times of day when you are most likely to reach for ultra-processed snacks. Is it during mid-afternoon energy slumps? Late-night cravings? Make lessprocessed alternatives like fruits and vegetables the obvious and convenient option. You'll soon discover how hard it is to mindlessly eat hundreds of calories of something like an orange or carrot.
- Information: Let the blank spaces in your day be precisely that: blank.

Set boundaries and create specific rules for when and where you check your phone. For instance, don't check your phone every time you're waiting in line. Don't look at your email as you're getting ready for bed. You'll soon find that you look forward to this white space as a fertile ground for creativity and introspection.

Finding Balance Between the Extremes:

No one can totally escape living in an ultra-processed world, nor should that necessarily be the goal. Cutting out all ultraprocessed food and information risks cutting yourself off from some of the pleasures and joys of modern life—snacking on bags of chips with friends while laughing at hilarious Instagram memes.

While there are dangers to over-consuming ultra-processed food and information (the very nature of ultra-processing makes overconsumption more likely), we don't want to swing compulsively in the other direction. Instead, we want to develop the awareness to recognize when we are indulging in ultra-processed items and do so mindfully so we can take full responsibility for the long-term impacts on our minds and bodies.

the concerns flagged by opposition members, Rijiju said there will be no interference with freedom of any religious body in the Waqf bill.

He also asserted that no provision of the Constitution has been violated in the draft law.

He said that the Waqf Act 1995 did not serve its purpose and told Congress members that the proposed amendments seek to achieve what the Congress government couldn't.

The minister told the House that a joint parliamentary committee had recommended that Waqf Act 1995 should be re-looked and said the opposition was opposing the measure for the sake of politics.

Rijiju said the opposition was trying to mislead people about intention of the Waqf bill. He said no law can be above Constitution but 1995 Waqf law has such provisions.

He claimed that many MPs have privately told him that Waqf boards have been captured by mafia.

He underlined that extensive consultations have taken place before the bill was drafted.

Rijiju claimed such MPS were opposing the bill due to party pressure. According to its statement of ob-

jects and reasons, the bill seeks to omit Section 40 of the current law relating to the powers of the board to decide if a property is Waqf property. It provides for a broad-based com-

position of the Central Waqf Council and the state Waqf boards and ensures the representation of Muslim women and non-Muslims in such bodies.

The bill also proposes the establishment of a separate board for the Boharas and Aghakhanis. The draft law provides for the representation of Shias, Sunnis, Bohras, Agakhanis and other backward classes among Muslim communities.

The bill also aims to clearly define Wanf as Wanf by any person practising Islam for at least five years and having ownership of such property." One of its objectives is streamlining the manner of registration of Waqfs through a central portal and database. A detailed procedure is established for mutation as per revenue laws with due notice to all concerned before recording any property as a Waqf property. The Wakf Act, 1995, was brought to regulate 'Augaf' (assets donated and notified as Waqf) by a 'wakif' (the person who dedicates a property for any purpose recognised by Muslim law as religious or charitable).

meant for," the court said, adding, "So, a particular party cannot be permitted to reap special benefit from such property at the expense of the interest of the people at large. It was expected of respondents (government authorities) that they would have borne this salutary principle in mind while bestowing any benefit upon an individual school".

A number of schools had filed petition before the court, claiming that they find themselves in a quandary in the context of the land site housing their respective school premises which in most of the case is shamlat or khachari land.

They had stated that the authorities concerned, including the Government itself, all along in the course of time had been well aware about the site status of the schools and still the affiliations and recognitions came to be granted and revised from time to time. However by virtue of S.O 177 of 2022, they said, the imminent fall out of the operation of S.O 177/2022 would mean that their existing recognition for class 9th, 10th, 11th and 12th was going to be held up, thereby exposing students' career to peril.

They had said that they will not be able to earn issuance of registration return forms (RRFs) from the State Board of School Education for lack of renewal of the permission.

The court also held that if the petitioner's contention is accepted that the amendment has prospective effect, it would amount to opening a floodgate and giving freehand to unscrupulous elements to grab Kahcharie/State land and show that Kahcharie/common land is in their possession since time immemorial.

"Such a practice and/or notion is unacceptable. The Government of J&K should not be loath and inert in implementation of the laws."

Ultimately, the court directed that where the schools are being run on Kahcharie/State/Shamilat etc. land, the petitioners (proprietors) can either acquire the proprietary land and/ or approach the Principal Secretary to Government, Department of School Education /J&K Board of School Education) with their plea as is made by them in their respective writ petitions for consideration which can also include the exchange of proprietary land in lieu of Kahcharie/State/ Shamilat etc. land, as may be available under and in terms of the Land Revenue Act or any other applicable law(s). "ÀlÍ these requests/applications shall be made by petitioners within four weeks from today," the court said, adding, "Principal Secretary to Government, Department of School Education, U.T. of J&K/J&K Board of School Education, on receipt of such application(s), shall decide the same either himself/itself or by constituting a Committee, comprising of senior officers of the School Education Department/J&K Board of School Education, Revenue Department or any other department(s) as may be thought appropriate by him/it. and get such applications decided within four months. While doing so, the petitioner(s) shall also be heard, the court said. With regard to the writ petitions/ cases, where Kahcharie/State/Shamilat land etc. is not involved, the court said, they (writ petitioners therein) can also approach Principal Secretary to Government, Department of School Education, U.T. of J&K/J&K Board of School Education, with their request/ plight within four weeks from today. "On receipt of such application(s), he/it shall either himself/itself decide or get such application(s) decided through the Committee, to be constituted by him/it, within a period of four months and while doing so, petitioner(s) shall also be heard,' the court said, adding, "Till then petitioner(s) be permitted to run the school(s) provided they are able to do so having regard to change of circumstances during pendency of instant matter as the students studying in those schools have been shifted to other schools".

Assembly polls have not been held in Jammu and Kashmir since 2014. The polls were due to be held in early 2019 following the dissolution of the legislative body of the erstwhile state in 2018.

However, after the bifurcation of Jammu and Kashmir into Union territories in August 2019, the Assembly polls could not be held due to various reasons, including a delimitation exercise that was completed in 2022.

Talking to reporters after party-wise meetings with the EC delegation, the leaders said they were unanimous in their demand for immediate Assembly polls in Jammu and Kashmir.

They also demanded that a levelplaying field should be ensured in the polls for the restoration of democracy in the Union Territory.

The Supreme Court has directed the Centre to conclude the election process by September 30. The poll schedule is yet to be announced by the EC, with just a little over seven weeks left for the deadline.

The BJP also batted for immediate Assembly polls. Its Jammu and Kashmir unit spokesperson R S Pathania said, "We told the EC that we want the election to be conducted as soon as possible." The party wants the polls to be held within the apex court's deadline. he added.

He said the MHA informed that "democratic representation and decision-making powers of the LAHDCs have been retained after the formation of the Union Territory.

"Periodic elections for the Hill Development Councils, Panchayati Raj institutions, and members of Parliament are being conducted to ensure continued democratic representation in the UT," he said

The minister said LAHDCs exercise executive powers over various subjects within their respective districts. According to the mandate of the Ladakh Autonomous Hill Development Council Act, 1997, the LAHDCs function as District Planning and Development Boards and independently prepare other purpose.

Kahcharie land, the court said, is meant for a particular purpose, that is, for common purpose, which cannot be permitted to be deviated.

"It is true that regularization in exceptional cases might have been given but that does relate to landless labourers or members of SC/ST or where there is already a school, dispensary or other public utility on the land," the court said, adding, "With respect to the petitioner-school, it cannot be said to be a public/government school but a "private school" and, therefore, does not come and fall within the ambit of exceptional cases."

The court also noted that all religions say that education is a must for human beings. "If an individual wants to do a good for human being, let him/ her establish a school on his/her proprietary land or on a self acquired land and provide free education," the court said, adding, "It is startling that the land meant for grazing and/or common purpose is being utilized by certain individuals for personal/private purpose. Such acts should be dealt with iron hands.'

Responding to another question "whether the recognition and affiliation of the private unaided schools for last several decades has the effect of the tacit consent of the Government authorizing establishment of these schools on Kahcharie etc land to be lawful and, therefore, under no circumstances affiliation and recognition can be denied to these schools, the court said: "Answer to this question is that establishment of private schools on Kachcharie/common land ought not to have been permitted muchless allowed to continue by the then authorities/functionaries/departments and, therefore, such practice should be arrested by the Government."

The court also directed the government that grant of affiliation or recognition to private school or schools, running, operating and functioning on Kahcharie land, should be stopped.

"The State holds landed property in trust and for ultimate benefit of its citizens in general; thus, the State/ Government is required to save, protect and preserve the Kahcharie/State land for the purpose for which it is

PARIS: Skipper Harmanpreet Singh rose to the occasion once again with twin strikes as the Indian hockey team beat Spain 2-1 to claim a second consecutive bronze medal at the Olympics and give a perfect send-off to veteran custodian P R Sreejesh here on Thursday.

The Indians recovered from the heartwrenching 2-3 defeat to Germany in the semifinal and played positive hockey for most part of the match to come out trumps.

Harmanpreet (30th, 33rd minutes) converted two penalty corners after Spain skipper Marc Miralles gave his side the lead against the run of play in the
