Alliance With NC A Compulsion: Congress

ECI Shifts Counting Date To Oct 8

The Election Commission on Saturday deferred the Haryana assembly poll date to October 5 from October 1, saying the decision was taken keeping in mind a centuries-old festival of the Bishnoi commu-nity. According to an order, a copy of which lies with Kashmir Observer, The counting of votes for Jammu and Kashmir and Haryana assembly polls will now be held on October 8 instead of October 4.

It has been a practice of the EC to hold the counting of votes on the same day for assemblies which go to polls together as the results of one state could affect trends in others.

Before the revision of the date, the Haryana polls were to be held along with the third and last phase of the Jammu and Kashmir elections.

The decision to postpone the Haryana elections has been taken to honour both the voting rights and traditions of the Bishnoi | More on P6

Srinagar: The Congress was ready to contest on its own at all 90 seats in the Jammu and Kashmir assembly elections and the alliance with the National Conference was forged under a "national compulsion", Pradesh Congress Committee chief Tariq Hameed Karra said on Saturday. The alliance was forged for

the stability and betterment of the people of Jammu and Kashmir, he added.

The National Conference and the Congress Monday have finalised a seat-share formula, with the parties set to contest 51 and 32 seats, respectively.

"The Congress will become stronger in the future. We had some alliance compulsions, the coalition was forged under a national mood, national compulsion. If those parameters of the alliance were not followed, then the Congress was ready to contest all 90 seats." Karra said.



He was speaking to reporters on the sidelines of a function at the Jammu and Kashmir Pradesh Congress Committee headquarters during which former Kokernag MLA Abdul Rahim Rather and activist Irfan Hafeez Lone joined the party. Karra said the coalition was forged by adhering to the alliance principles.

"The alliance has been forged for stability, it has been forged by adhering to the alliance principles, and for the betterment of the people of Jammu and Kashmir," he added.

Asked for his comment about the situation in the BJP in Jammu, with many of its leaders resigning from the party following the distribution of tickets, the Congress' Jammu and Kashmir chief said there was a conflict of ideology in the BJP. "That is their issue. Their


besides, Expenditure Observer and Assistant Expenditure Observers of all 8 Assembly Constituencies attended the meeting.

Besides they directed to sensitize and educate candidates in fray after the last date of withdrawal of nomination so they too shall remain aware regarding the expenditure guidelines.

The EOs stressed on maintaining shadow registers by AEOs for accounting of expenditure of candidates for recon-

ciliation later on, They urged AEOs to remain updated with expenditure rules and execution of policies on the ground besides being well informed about the boundaries of Assembly Constituencies, Electorates, important public places and political activities.

LMD Srinagar Imposes Rs 1.5L **Fine On LPG Dealer For Cheating**

Srinagar: The Enforcement unit of Legal Metrology Department (LMD) Srinagar which is entrusted with the mandate of ensuring accurate quantity of goods and services to Consumers today realized a fine of Rs. 1.5 lakh from LPG distributor for selling underweight Cylinders to Consumers. The LPG Cylinders which were

earlier found underweight by 400 grams against the declared quantity of 14.2 Kg were seized by the department from Srinagar after which the matter was raised with the supplier of these Cylinders who pleaded for compounding of this offence at departmental level.

Acting in terms of the provisions of Legal Metrology Act 2009, the office of Legal Metrology Enforcement Srinagar imposed and realized Rs. 1.5 Lacs as fine after an undertaking was submitted by the offender that he will abide by the provisions of Legal Metrology Act in letter and spirit.

It is pertinent to mention that during the Current Financial year (2024-25), the Legal Metrology Department J&K has acted tough upon the erring LPG distributors by way of imposing the penalty of Rs. 7.14 Lacs so far.

Along with the fine, the LPG suppliers and agencies are being apprised about the issue of sale of underweight cylinders and have been instructed to ensure that customers are provided gas delivery as per the amount they have contracted for and any lapse in this regard will be strictly dealt with in

terms of the provisions of the Legal Metrology Act, 2009 and LPG Regulation (Supply and Distribution Order) 2000.

It is worth mentioning that it is the duty of every LPG Agency to ensure the weight of LPG Cylinders in presence of the Consumer before delivering it to them. The weight needs to be conducted only by using the weighing scale which is duly verified by the Legal Metrology Department.

The Consumers have also been repeatedly requested to check the price of the LPG which keeps changing every month by the Oil Marketing Companies and in case of any overcharging or underweight they may lodge their complaint before the Legal Metrology Department in this regard.


This event aligned with the university's mission to extend educational and societal outreach in accordance with the objectives of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020.

e announcement of the longoverdue Assembly elections has shaken up Kashmir's political scene. The three phase exercise has sent political parties scrambling to put their house in order and field the right candidates. It has also brought about a familiar spectacle of the known political turncoats engaging in one more round of this unedifying practice. They don't bother to even put up a pretense of any political ideology or conviction. Should one expect them to stand for any worthwhile cause in power? The answer is anybody's guess. The parties have also started poaching on their rivals. Almost everyday, groups of ground-level political workers are shown switching sides. In an election season, however, these activities are par for the course. More so, in Kashmir which is witnessing an Assembly election after a decade.

That said, in the first flush of the election campaign, some important developments have taken place which have the potential to alter the outcome. The National Conference and the Congress have entered into an alliance. Under the terms of the agreement, the two parties have finalized a seat-sharing agreement on all 90 seats in the union

territory, leaving, however, one seat to the CPI(M)'s M Y Tarigami, who will contest from his South Kashmir hometown Kulgam. The NC will fight on a predominant majority of 47 seats in Kashmir Valley and the Congress will contest a lion's share of 43 seats in Jammu. This, the parties expect, will ensure that the votes are not split which would give advantage to the BJP, a force to reckon with in Jammu division - that is, despite some recent disaffection in the region with the saffron party's policies. The Congress-NC alliance leaves out the PDP which otherwise is a member of the INDIA bloc. This is believed to have been done at the urging of the NC which doesn't want the PDP further nibble away at its Valley share of seats. But this also leaves the PDP free to contest on all seats in the UT. The party could especially be a challenge in South Kashmir which remains its stronghold. In the District Development Council polls in 2020, the PDP had won 27 seats while the NC had secured 67.

Another consequential development is the re-appointment of the senior BJP leader Ram Madhav as the party's co-poll incharge along with Union Minister G Kishan Reddy, for the Assembly elections. The advantage of Madhav, the architect behind the PDP-BJP 'Agenda of Alliance' in 2015, is that he knows leaders across the parties and will thus be able to keep the lines of communication open with them until after the elections are over and the government formation begins.

Incidentally, Madhav was also in Kashmir around the time Gandhi and Kharge were here. His appointment shows that like the Congress, the BJP may also be looking for alliance partners in the UT, more so in the valley. Although the saffron party is supposed to have an understanding with some local parties, none of them is willing to publicly acknowledge it for fear of losing public support. All these parties not just failed to win a single seat in the recent parliamentary elections but also couldn't enthuse Kashmiri voters. In terms of vote tallies they finished last in the seats they contested from.

But more than a pre-election alliance, Madhav could be expected to look at a post-election scenario. Should the BJP win a majority of seats in Jammu division, where it retains significant following despite a rejuvenated Congress making inroads recently, Madhav could be hoped to explore options with the parties in the Valley.

The People's Alliance for Gupkar Declaration (PAGD) is now a distant memory. It is as if it didn't exist in the first place. The PAGD's experience of fighting jointly during the District Development Council polls in 2020 didn't encourage much confidence. The parties squabbled with one another over seat-sharing and later also fielded proxy candidates against each other. Though the PAGD still managed to win a majority of seats in the DDC elections, it left a bad taste among the partners. Soon after the elections were over, the People's Conference led by Sajjad Gani Lone quit the PAGD citing the issue of proxy candidates. Or so he claimed.

Overall, the election holds interesting possibilities for Jammu and Kashmir. The NC expects to secure a majority of its own or atleast emerge as the largest single party. The BJP hopes to repeat the 2014 performance. In fact, with fresh delimitation giving it an edge in many more constituencies in Jammu, the party expects to even better its 2014 tally of 25 seats. It is also possible that the re-energised Congress under Rahul would undercut the BJP in Jammu. In that case, the BJP would no longer be able to assert a role in the future elected government. That said, in the Valley, the NC could face a tough challenge from the PDP, which remains relevant and also from Rashid's Awami Ittehad Party. The field as of now is wide open.

Hello Hindenburg: 'Hum Aapke Hain Kaun?'

ow that India is on their target map, the folks at Hindenburg Research can consider a crash course in Hindi, the language spoken in many parts of the country. More on that later.

Of the two "Research Reports," the first was aimed at an industrialist. India is a nation that's emotion and sentiment-driven, and negative reports are the first to get read. The January 2023 report led to expected outcomes – a drop in valuation, a fall in stock prices in the flagship and subsidiary companies, and a call from the opposition to probe the alleged nexus between the government and the industrialist.

Fortunately, our core sector, industry pillars, and captains are not of the house of cards or sandcastle variety. The group in focus regained relevance and overcame what turned out to be a storm in the research teacup.

For the sake of simplicity and greater clarity, let's break down this narrative into three parts:

Research firm in focus

Hindenburg is known for taking a 'short position' on companies that are the subject of its research. While disclosure of such a stance is appreciated, investors should also be aware that the research firm may have a vested interest in the exercise.

Let's understand going short on a stock: According to the Corporate Finance Institute, USA, short selling is the practice of selling borrowed securities – such as stocks – hoping to make a profit by repurchasing them at a price lower than the selling price. When you sell short a stock, you can profit from a decline – rather than an increase – in price.

There are multiple ways of going short – for example, one can take a position in the options market. Further, a research firm shares its report with hedge funds and the fund may decide to buy or sell a stock based on the analysis. In this case, the key observation of the industrialist's group was stocks were manipulated and there were undisclosed related party transactions. Which explains the tumble in price. However, no one could factor, fathom, or predict the India story, rather our history of resilience.

Let's take a parallel incident as proof of the axiom: A report was released in 2011 by another research firm, also a short seller, on an outdoor media company operating in China. Some of the accusations in the report led to a drop of 75% in valuation in three days. The research firm profited and so did their clients.

- The allegations were about investments made by the regulatory body chief and her husband in an offshore fund – but the Chief Investment Officer of the fund in question has declared he had not invested in any of the companies against which the first report was centered (even if we don't take his word for it, until such time proof emerges to the contrary his affirmation stands good).
- The connection seemed convoluted the CIO happened to be a childhood friend of the husband and interconnecting his role

Regulator in focus

More recently, the report writers, who could be avid fans of Oscar Wilde's 'The Importance of Being Earnest,' or at least the title, hit at another institution in all earnest – a market regulator this time – and the claim was about the bureaucrat heading it. as a past director on one of the group companies of an industry captain seemed quite a stretch.

India in focus

For corporate India, the repeated exercise by Hindenburg Research seems to be an effort to create ripples in the stock market, and in American style, try to fix something that ain't broke. Engaging in the Indian stock market has its benefits – you find the ammo, fire it in the form of an in-depth research report, and the stock slides, and there could be those in the know who can buy at low levels and sell when the stock returns to its earlier level.

The above reasoning does not discount the value of investigative financial research. For decades, market analysts have been putting out warnings on overvalued companies. However, the credibility of recommendations and revelations depends on the neutrality of the research firm. When the company has a parallel activity stream of short-selling, the open market investor must exercise discretion.

Let's look at the big picture – our economy, stock market, and growth indices. Compare our situation with some nations with whom we share land borders and some who are a ship ride away. We have excellent and enviable infrastructure, sustained increase in industrial production, and are home to businesses that are booming and attracting foreign investment. On the socio-economic path, we have come a long way in the last ten years – in healthcare, health insurance for the underprivileged, education, sanitation and much more.

If our rise as a global power irks some outsiders, it's no skin off our nose, because we know we will scale to a higher ranking than where we are now – the world's 5th largest economy. To the research firms of the world, we say, look at the bright side of Bharat and let us know if you can find a comparable country in terms of stability, growth, and non-interference. If you insist on unveiling more trivialities in your reports, we will in Oscar Wilde style, treat all that you present as serious accusations with a sincere and studied triviality.

As for the Hindi lesson – we have a question – are we that important you must constantly poke your nose in our matters... or as Ms. Madhabi, I meant Madhuri, might say, "Hum Aapke Hain Kaun"?

Pesticide Residues in Milk and Its Possible Mitigation

ampant globalization, urbanization, overpopula-Ntion, global warming and climate change is posing serious threats to the agricultural sustainability and the food producing systems ought to be safeguarded at any cost for the future generations. Use of pesticides across the globe is one such step towards it as their use increases the crop yield and fights against various crop diseases, however, the higher efficiency and lower cost of pesticides leads to its simultaneous over-utilization. The synthetic pesticides are classified into four major classes, namely organochlorine pesticides (OC), organophosphorus pesticides (OP), carbamate pesticides (CB), and pyrethroid pesticides (PY). Organochlorine pesticides are usually used as insecticides, herbicides and fungicides against a broad range of insects and fungi in the agriculture sector. They have been detected in milk and dairy products over the past three decades, particularly in the form of Dichlorodiphenyltrichloroethane (DDT) and Hexachlorocychlohexane (HCH). These were banned in different time periods in different countries because of the harmful effects and their persistence within the environment. Organophosphorus pesticides have been used increasingly in agriculture after banning or restricting the use of organochlorines. Organophosphorus pesticides including malathion, dimethoate, coumaphos, dichlorvos and parathion methyl; are highly toxic to mammals and are considered as mutagens, carcinogens and teratogenic substances. Carbamates are organic pesticides that include carbaryl, carbofuran and aldicarb. Their degradation is easy in the natural environment. Synthetic-pyrethroid including permethrin, cypermethrin, deltamethrin, cyhalothrin and bifenthrin can affect brain dopaminergic and serotonergic systems and provoke neurobehavioral changes in Wistar rats. They can also affect learning, memory-related characteristics, and reduce the homing ability of Apis mellifera bee or inhibit the acetylcholinesterase at the synaptic junction of the fish Odontesthes bonariensis, which provoke lethal effects.



The inclusion of the pesticide residues in the food chain is seen when animals consume water, grass or feed and fodder contaminated with pesticide residues; also whenever the pesticides are sprayed over the animals in the barns inorder to relieve them from the ectoparasites and vector borne-diseases. After feeding and ingestion, these residues inevitably assimilate into the animal body systems. Pesticide bio-concentration and bio-accumulation in animal tissues is possible to reach the toxic levels even if the exposure was low. Once ingested, lipophilic pesticides are absorbed from the intestines into the systematic circulation. High lipid solubility of pesticides and their metabolites tend to accumulate in high fat content tissues such as adipose

tissue, brain, liver, kidney and subsequently translocated and excreted through milk or other excrements. Additionally, an increasing amount of pesticides and their residues are entering into our environment, which is undoubtedly hazardous to human, animals and ecosystems health. Humans-beings being on the top of tropic level or in the food chain, are bigger consumers of pesticides. Livestock products: meat, fish, eggs and especially dairy products are main source of OCPs and OPPs intake in general public.

Most pesticide residues in milk being fat-soluble can affect human health at low doses, even though they are considered as not harmful by health authorities. Many pesticides and their residues that enter the human

body through the food chains are recognized as stimulants, causative agents or primarily contributory factors in several serious human diseases such as disruption of the endocrine system, neurological and immune system disorders, sterility, different cancer types (breast, lung, cervix, and prostate), heart diseases, Alzheimer's and Parkinsonism. Children and older people being more prone as this specific age group is more sensitive to several pesticides due to their high intake of milk and dairy products in relation to their body weight and to the immaturity of their defence systems against chemical stressors.

European Commission has established Maximum Residue Levels (MRL) as a measure to evaluate the maximum residue

levels of pesticides in or on food and feed of plant and animal origin. The MRLs for milk and dairy products is ranged between 0.8 and 2000 μ g/kg for the European Commission or range between 0.4 and 1000 μ g/kg according to FAO and WHO. Moreover, a specific regulation for food consumed by children, and infants have been established by the European Commission (2013) to restrict the use of pesticides in infant formulas as much as possible. The chemical pesticides, however, cannot be outrightly banned but a risk benefit assessment should be performed before suggesting that a particular chemical treatment is to be stopped due to the risk of contaminating the food chain. For example: Organochlorine pesticides, particularly dichlotrichloroethane rordiphenyl (DDT) and hexachlorocyclohexane (HCH), were the highly used pesticides in Punjab region of India until restrictions on their use were enacted in the late 1990s. Nevertheless, a substantial amount of DDT and c-HCH (lindane) chemicals are being permitted for use in the malariacontrol program and in agriculture, respectively.

The development and use of mitigation strategies should be a priority which includes:-Standardizing the quantity of pesticides to be used inorder to reduce the indiscriminate pesticide application; training farmers' the correct method of applying pesticides; stringent standards for the application of pesticides; need for continuous monitoring of pesticide residues in milk and its products; to introduce non-chemical pest control alternatives such as ladybirds and parasitoid wasps; introducing bio-pesticides which involves micro-organisms like bacteria and fungus (the most utilized microbial pesticides are strains of Bacillus thuringiensis that produces a mix of proteins capable of killing several related species of insect larvae).

Karpathy believes AI can solve a long-standing challenge: the scarcity of good teachers who are also subject experts.

And he's not alone. OpenAI CEO Sam Altman, Khan Academy CEO Sal Khan, venture capitalist Marc Andreessen and University of California, Berkeley computer scientist Stuart Russell also dream of bots becoming ondemand tutors, guidance counselors and perhaps even replacements for human teachers.

As a researcher focused on AI and other new writing technologies, I've seen many cases of high-tech "solutions" for teaching problems that fizzled. AI certainly may enhance aspects of education, but history shows that bots probably won't be an effective substitute for humans. That's because students have long shown resistance to machines, however sophisticated, and a natural preference to connect with and be inspired by fellow humans.

The costly challenge of teaching writing to the masses

As the director of the English Composition program at the University of Pittsburgh, I oversee instruction for some 7,000 students a year. Programs like mine have long wrestled with how to teach writing efficiently and effectively to so many people at once.

The best answer so far is to keep class sizes to no more than 15 students. Research shows that students learn writing better in smaller classes because they are more engaged.

Yet small classes require more instructors, and that can get expensive for school districts and colleges.

Resuscitating dead scholars

Enter AI. Imagine, Karpathy posits, that the great theoretical physicist Richard Feynman, who has been dead for over 35 years, could be brought back to life as a bot to tutor students.

For Karpathy, an ideal learning experience would be working through physics material



"together with Feynman, who is there to guide you every step of the way." Feynman, renowned for his accessible way of presenting theoretical physics, could work with an unlimited number of students at the same time.

In this vision, human teachers still design course materials, but they are supported by an AI teaching assistant. This teacher-AI team "could run an entire curriculum of courses on a common platform," Karpathy wrote. "If we are successful, it will be easy for anyone to learn anything," whether it be a lot of people learning about one subject, or one person learning about many subjects.

Other efforts to personalize learning fall short Yet technologies for personal learning aren't new. Exactly 100 years ago, at the 1924 meeting of the American Psychological Association, inventor Sidney Pressey unveiled an "automatic teacher" made out of typewriter parts that asked multiple-choice questions.

In the 1950s, the psychologist B. F. Skinner designed "teaching machines." If a student answered a question correctly, the machine advanced to ask about the problem's next step. If not, the student stayed on that step of the problem until they solved it.

In both cases, students received positive feedback for correct answers. This gave them confidence as well as skills in the subject. The problem was that students didn't learn much – they also found these nonhuman approaches boring, education writer Audrey Watters documents in "Teaching Machines."

More recently, the world of education saw the rise and fall of "massive open online courses," or MOOCs. These classes, which delivered video and quizzes, were heralded by The New York Times and others for their promise of democratizing education. Again, students lost interest and logged off.

Other web-based efforts have popped up, including course platforms like Coursera and Outlier. But the same problem persists: There's no genuine interactivity to keep students engaged. One of the latest casualties in online learning was 2U, which acquired leading MOOC company edX in 2021 and in July 2024 filed for bankruptcy restructuring to reduce its US\$945 million debt load. The culprit: falling demand for services.

Now comes the proliferation of AI-fueled platforms. Khanmigo deploys AI tutors to, as Sal Khan writes in his latest book, "personalize and customize coaching, as well as adapt to an individual's needs while hovering beside our learners as they work."

The educational publisher Pearson, too, is integrating AI into its educational materials. More than 1,000 universities are adopting these materials for fall 2024.

AI in education isn't just coming; it's here. The question is how effective it will be.

Drawbacks in Al learning

Some tech leaders believe bots can customize teaching and replace human teachers and tutors, but they're likely to face the same problem as these earlier attempts: Students may not like it.

There are important reasons why, too. Students are unlikely to be inspired and excited the way they can be by a live instructor. Students in crisis often turn to trusted adults like teachers and coaches for help. Would they do the same with a bot? And what would the bot do if they did? We don't know yet.

A lack of data privacy and security can also be a deterrent. These platforms collect volumes of information on students and their academic performance that can be misused or sold. Legislation may try to prevent this, but some popular platforms are based in China, out of reach of U.S. law.

Finally, there are concerns even if AI tutors and teachers become popular. If a bot teaches millions of students at once, we may lose diversity of thought. Where does originality come from when everyone receives the same teachings, especially if "academic success" relies on regurgitating what the AI instructor says?

The idea of an AI tutor in every pocket sounds exciting. I would love to learn physics from Richard Feynman or writing from Maya Angelou or astronomy from Carl Sagan. But history reminds us to be cautious and keep a close eye on whether students are actually learning. The promises of personalized learning are no guarantee for positive results.

Talat Majeed Wani, a former member of Jamaat-e-Islami who is contesting as an independent after being associated with the April Party, might also attract a substantial number of votes that could sway the results, analvsts believe.

Historically, the Pulwama seat has seen various representatives, including Master Sanaullah Sheikh in 1962. Sonaullah Dar of Congress in 1967 and 1972, Mohammad Ibrahim Dar of NC in 1977 and 1983, and Bashir Ahmad Nengro of NC in 1987 and 1996. Since then, Khalil Bhand has held the seat for the PDP.

Independents Challenge Traditional Parties In South Kashmir

SRINAGAR: Several independent candidates in south Kashmir are set to challenge traditional party candidates in the upcoming assembly elections.

These independent candidates are expected to offer significant competition in their respective constituencies.

Shabir Kullay, who left the National Conference (NC) after being denied a party ticket, is running as an independent candidate in Shopian. In the 2014 elections, Kullay secured 12,000 votes, more than twice the number of votes received by the NC candidate at that time.

Supported by two District Development Council (DDC) members and civil society members from Shopian, Kullay is considered a strong contender in this election. The current competition in Shopian involves Yawar Banday of the PDP, Sheikh Rafi of NC, and independent candidate Shabir Kullay.

Former MLA Aijaz Ahmad Mir, who left the PDP after being denied a ticket, is a notable candidate for the Zainapora seat. Mir has the backing of the DDC Chairperson, other DDC members, and some independent candidates, making him a strong contender against NC's Showkat Ganie and PDP's Gh Mohiudin Wani.

In Anantnag, a four-cornered contest is unfolding between Congress candidate Peerzada Mohammad Sayeed, PDP's Dr Mehboob Beg, Apni Party's Hilal Shah, and independent candidate Peer Mansoor. Previously associated with the PDP

and later with the People's Conference, Peer Mansoor is now contesting as an independent and is expected to provide a tough challenge to the other candidates.

Dr Gh Nabi Bhat, NC's constituency in-charge for Tral, is running as an independent after the Tral seat was allocated to Congress in the NC-Congress alliance. The notification for Phase I was issued on August 20, 2024, and the deadline for filing nominations was August 27, 2024. The scrutiny of nomination papers was conducted on August 28, 2024, and candidates were allowed to withdraw their nominations by August 30, 2024.(KNO)

Jadeja Is A Complete All-Round Fielder, Raina Too Was Brilliant: Jonty Rhodes

NEW DELHI: South African cricket legend Jonty Rhodes on Saturday called Ravindra Jadeja a "complete all-round" fielder in the world right now, and also spoke highly about former India player Suresh Raina's abilities on the ground.

The 55-year-old Rhodes, regarded as one of the greatest fielders of all time who became the first South African cricketer to take 100 ODI catches, played for the national team from 1992 till 2003.

Post retirement, Rhodes became associated with several IPL teams, including Mumbai Indians, Punjab Kings and most recently Lucknow Super Giants, as fielding coach.

"I am a big fan of Suresh



Raina. I enjoyed his playing days but now he has retired. In the past in India, the cricketing infrastructure wasn't there to support the passion and love for cricket. Suresh Raina was some-

one who used to throw himself around the field," said Rhodes, who was roped in as the brand ambassador of the Hero Pro Corporate League cricket tournament on Saturday.

"Unlike Raina, I had a very fortunate upbringing. I played football, hockey and cricket on good grounds. So I was very fortunate. I think Jadeja is at the next level, he doesn't dive as much but he is so fast to the ball. And his accuracy at throwing down the stumps is somewhat like Ricky Ponting. He fields on the boundary, he fields on the circle. He is a complete all-round fielder," said Rhodes. Rhodes also gave a meaning-

ful insight on what it takes to become a good fielder.

"It has nothing to do with the hands; it's actually all about the legs because if you use your legs and be there at the right time, you can get your hands in good position. You can have the best hands in the world and the most magnetic hands but if you

don't have the legs you cannot get there. It's more about quick body positions. It' all about technique," he added.

Rhodes said that at 55 he still doesn't think twice about diving on the field.

"Flying is not the problem for me right now, the landing is the problem. When I am on the field I am not thinking about 'should I dive or should I not'. I think that's what made me successful on the field," he said.

"So, if you are thinking about (not) diving you can never stop the ball. My father, who was my coach, and and a school principal used to tell me that the saying 'practice makes perfect 'is not correct but what matters is perfect practice. Practice like you play in the match." he highlighted.

Bellingham's Real Madrid and Rodri's Manchester City have more games in a deeper Champions League schedule through January, and both teams qualified for a new month-long FIFA club tournament in the United States to end the season.

The relentless two-games-perweek schedule – almost routine in top-level European football since the pandemic-delayed 2019-20 season — is fueling concern about burning out the best players with expanded international events.

Bellingham was sidelined 10 days into Madrid's competitive season which started just one month after he was on the losing England team against Spain in the European Championship final.

Announcing his muscle injury

on Aug. 23, the 21-year-old star acknowledged "maybe my body is telling me it needs a bit more rest after a busy year."

Rodri was essential last season. the Euro 2024 player of the tournament who never lost a game with Spain, nor in the Premier League to help Man City win a fourth straight title.

"I do need a rest," Rodri famously said in April after a 3-3 draw at Madrid in the Champions League quarterfinals. Man City's title defence ended in a penalty shootout after the second leg also was drawn.

Now Rodri is resting in Manchester, missing the first two rounds in the English Premier League. His club said he is being eased back after on a personal training program after a 63game season. Man City's intense August-to-July schedule was highlighted by Portugal defender Rúben Dias in a social media post with a laughter emoji.

"It's impossible to maintain an optimal level of performance," Dani Carvajal, the Madrid and Spain defender, said this month. "I think that should be analyzed by the people in charge of football."



As European champion, Madrid also must play a FIFA Intercontinental Cup game in December, possibly in Qatar.

European football body UEFA agreed to a new and bigger Champions League format that starts

September 17 after being pressured for years by storied and wealthy clubs like Madrid.

"The need to play regular matches in Europe is a need from the clubs, it's not a need for UEFA," one of its senior officials, Giorgio Marchetti, said Wednesday in Monaco ahead of the Champions League draw.

The influential European Club Association, now led by Paris Saint-Germain president Nasser al-Khelaifi, pushed hard for more

high-profile games to drive up revenue. That typically pays for higher transfer fees and player salaries.

"It's amazing also for the players," Al-Khelaifi told reporters in Monaco. "They prefer to play matches than to train."

PSG, Madrid and Man City are among the 12 European clubs that qualified for the 32-team Club World Cup that FIFA will relaunch in June.

European clubs once did not want the Club World Cup, also seeing a risk to the status of the Champions League though FIFA scheduled it only in 2025 and 2029.

The clubs have long expected to earn tens of millions of dollars in FIFA prize money from playing up to seven games, though the tournament's commercial strategy is still unclear even with Saudi Arabian backing.

The Club World Cup has become a legal dispute. The global player union FIFPRO's European division joined national leagues to file a complaint against FIFA with the European Commission in Brussels.

"Players are being pushed be-

yond their limits, with significant injury risks and impacts on their welfare and fundamental rights," FIFPRO warned FIFA in May.

The union targeted the FIFA event though not UEFA's expanded club events which will steer hundreds of millions of euros (dollars) more to the 108 European clubs playing in the three annual club competitions.

For clubs, the need to be in high-profile, lucrative international events is pressing.

Manchester United is taking a nine-figure revenue hit this season by not playing in the Champions League or Club World Cup. It still has a packed domestic program and the second-tier Europa League.

"The intensity of the Premier League and the two domestic cup competitions that we have does add a little bit more," Man United sporting director Dan Ashworth said Friday in Monaco. "But we will be well-equipped, we are pleased with the squad.'

United is not in the Club World Cup because it did not win the Champions League in the past four years. Man City and Chelsea did to earn England's two entries.
