J&K Bank Q2 Net Profit Rises 44.6%

Srinagar: J&K Bank's net profit rose substantially by 44.6 % Yearon-Year (YoY) to Rs 550.92 Cr for the September Quarter (Q2) of current financial year (CFY) when compared to Rs 381.07 Cr recorded for the corresponding quarter of previous year. The Bank's net profit for half-year (H1) grew 36.6% to Rs 966.41 Cr from Rs 707.52 Cr recorded for H1 last FY.

The Bank announced financial numbers today after its Board-of-Directors reviewed and approved the quarterly and half-yearly figures during a meeting held at the Bank's Corporate Headquarters.

Key Highlights

Backed by both core and noncore income growth, the Bank's operating profit for Q2 rose more than 47% YoY and 32% QoQ to Rs 787 Cr. The Bank's Net Interest Income (NII) is up by 7.7 % YoY to Rs 1435.93 Cr for the September guarter from Rs 1333.83 Cr and has increased by 7.2 % to Rs 2805.15 Cr for the H1 when compared to corresponding periods of previous year. The Bank's other income surged 55.6% YoY to Rs 296.08 Cr for the September quarter. The Bank's NIM improved to

3.90% QoQ from 3.86% recorded for the Q1 of CFY, while as the Cost to Income Ratio has improved significantly to 54.56% YoY from 64.93% and in sequential terms from 61.96% recorded in June quarter, 2024.

Commenting on the Bank's Q2 numbers, MD & CEO Baldev Prakash said, "Our Q2 results are almost in line with our expectations. The | More on P6

Rise In Terror Attacks In J&K: 13 Killed In 2 Weeks

Srinagar: Over the last two weeks, Jammu and Kashmir has been struck by seven terror attacks, with the most recent one being on October 24 evening in Gulmarg which claimed five lives.

On Thursday evening, a ter-ror attack targeted an Army vehicle just a few kilometers from the tourist hotspot in north Kashmir's Baramulla district. Three soldiers and two civilian porters engaged by the Army were killed in an attack on an army vehicle in Gulmarg on Thursday.

uberculosis disrupts glucose metabolism in the liver, thereby potentially pushing vulnerable patients towards developing related diseases such as diabetes, a study has found.

Using lab models, researchers found that during the early stages of the bacterial infection, an immune response was triggered in liver cells that changed how glucose was broken down in the body.

In the next stage, the researchers from the University of Leicester, UK, analysed metabolismrelated data of individuals from the PubMed database, which is maintained by the US National Institutes of Health. Glucose metabolism in the liver was disrupted in people who advanced to tuberculosis from latent or asymptomatic infection, the team found. The findings comple-

mented the current understanding that diabetes worsens symptoms of tuberculosis, the au-

thors said.

Experts Advocate Using Activated Charcoal For Skin Benefits Amid Rising Pollution

As air pollution rises in the national capital, experts have advocated the use of activated charcoal as a natural remedy for preventing clogging of skin pores and keep out toxins. The experts said activated charcoal masks are effective in reducing sebum (oily substance) from the face skin, thus helping treat acne as they have good absorbing properties.

Dr R P Parasher, the national president of the Integrated Medical Association (Ayush), said that activated charcoal -- dubbed as 'Black Diamond' has good sebum absorbing properties.

As pollution levels escalate, it causes concern for the skin as particulate matter ranging from PM2.5 to PM10 may lead to the blockage of the skin pores and lead to breakouts, Dr Parasher said. Further, chemicals like lead and nitrogen which increase in the atmosphere during the pollution surge, may damage the skin and may even enter the blood stream through the skin pores which may further damage organs in the body in the long term, he said. "Activated charcoal is not absorbed in the skin but absorbs the toxic elements as well as microbes present in the acne and in this way it saves the skin from



Activated charcoal can help balance and control sebum production which can otherwise lead to breakout and acne, Dr Parasher said.

A study "Review of Green Synthesis: Activated Charcoal to Reduce Sebum Levels in Oily Facial Skin" by researchers from Indonesia stated that the porous texture of activated charcoal positively captures and attracts negatively charged molecules.

Since activated charcoal is not absorbed by the body, it carries its surface-bound toxins out of the body. Director of Ayouthveda, a skin-

care brand, Dr Sanchit Sharma, said that the process of creating activated charcoal involves carbonising harvested bamboo at very high temperatures, enhancing its surface area to weight ratio of about 1200:1.

This method not only maximises its effectiveness in absorbing toxins but also makes it a powerful ally in the fight against acne, he said.

As awareness grows, several varieties of charcoal products are gaining popularity in Asian and European markets, promising a natural solution to many skin issues exacerbated by pollution, Sharma said.

Talking about his facewash product, he said, "Ayouthveda charcoal face wash prepared from activated bamboo charcoal effectively cleanses the skin by removing dirt and impurities.

"It protects the skin from pollution and absorbs excess oil, making it easy to remove makeup. It also eliminates sweat and toxins accumulated, for instance, during workouts or after a long day." Though charcoal face wash are generally safe, overuse can cause some skin dryness, Dr Parasher pointed out.





Should Government Abolish Interviews for Class I and Class II Jobs Now?

nterviews have long been a point of contention in government job selections, especially when compared to the more objective format of written exams. While interviews allow for a face-to-face evaluation of candidates, the lack of transparency, subjectivity, and potential for bias have led many to question their utility in hiring processes for Class I and Class II jobs in the Indian government. Given the 2016 decision by the Government of India to abolish interviews for Class III and IV government jobs, the question now arises whether this move should be extended to Class I and Class II jobs. The answer, quite evidently, is yes.

Lack of Transparency in Interviews

One of the primary concerns regarding interviews in government job selections is the lack of transparency. While written exams are evaluated based on clear criteria-such as the number of correct answers, negative marking, or other established guidelines-interviews do not offer the same level of clarity. Candidates often leave the interview with little understanding of how their performance was judged. Unlike exams, where a candidate can receive a scorecard or marksheet that objectively shows where they excelled or fell short, interviews do not typically provide detailed feedback.

This lack of transparency fosters a sense of arbitrariness in the selection process. For example, candidates frequently express frustration over not understanding the criteria used by interviewers. The panel may consider factors such as communication skills, attitude, or general demeanor, but how these are quantified remains ambiguous. In competitive scenarios, where candidates are often distinguished by slim margins, the absence of clear evaluation standards can lead to confusion and mistrust in the process.

Subjectivity and Bias

Interviews, by their very nature, are highly subjective. While they are intended to assess a candidate's suitability for a role beyond their academic or professional qualifications, the human element involved opens the door to biases-both conscious and unconscious. Several psychological studies indicate that factors like physical appearance, gender, socio-economic background, or even regional accent can influence the interviewer's perception of a candidate, despite being irrelevant to



the job at hand.

The release of final marks for 761 selected candidates in the 2020 Civil Services Examination ignited debates about potential bias against reserved category candidates in interviews. Despite scoring well in the written exam, candidates from OBC, SC, ST, and EWS categories received lower interview scores compared to general category candidates. A statistical analysis of written and interview marks revealed a weak negative correlation for OBC candidates and moderate negative correlation for SC, ST, and EWS candidates, suggesting higher written marks correspond to lower interview scores for these groups. In contrast, general category candidates exhibit a positive correlation, indicating higher written scores often lead to better interview performance. This reflects interviewers unconsciously judge candidates based on their social and educational backgrounds disclosed in the Detailed Application Form (DAF), po-

tentially influencing scores. Similarly, the Chhattisgarh Public Service Commission (CGPSC) 2021 exam l became the center of a controversy over alleged nepotism, sparking demands for transparency in

the selection process. Concerns arose after the results revealed that top ranks were secured by the relatives of bureaucrats and politicians, including sons, daughters, and in-laws.

There have been numerous other such accounts and allegations in India where candidates with lesser qualifications were favored in interviews due to their personal connections or influence.

The subjective nature of interviews always leaves room for nepotism and favoritism. Candidates with influential connections may receive preferential treatment, allowing them to secure positions for which they may not be the most qualified. This not only perpetuates inequality in government job selections but also erodes public trust in the system. Deserving candidates, particularly those from disadvantaged backgrounds, are often overlooked in favor of those with the right connections, further entrenching systemic inequalities

Corruption and Lack of Accountability

The interview process for government jobs in India has often been criticized for being susceptible to corruption. With little oversight and minimal accountability, interview panels have a significant amount of discretion in determining which candidates are selected. In many cases, this power has been exploited, leading to instances where candidates with personal or political connections are favored over others.

Interviews are typically conducted behind closed doors, there is often no mechanism to ensure accountability. While written exams can be reevaluated to check for errors or discrepancies, the interview process offers no such recourse. Once a decision is made, candidates have little to no opportunity to challenge the outcome, further deepening concerns about the opacity and fairness of the process.

Tail piece

Given the issues associated with interviews, there is a strong case to be made for replacing or at least minimizing their role in government job selections. Written exams and other objective assessments provide a much more transparent and equitable process. By using measurable criteria, such as a candidate's knowledge, skills, and abilities, objective assessments reduce the potential for bias and favoritism.

Objective assessments can also help create a more merit-based system. In India, where government jobs are highly sought after, competition is fierce, and even small differences in performance can determine success or failure. By relying on quantifiable measures, such as exam scores, rather than subjective judgments, the government can ensure that the most qualified candidates are selected based on their merit, rather than their connections or influence.

While the Government of India has made strides in addressing these issues by abolishing interviews for Class III and IV jobs, it is time to extend this policy to Class I and II jobs as well. By relying on objective assessments. such as written exams, the government can create a more transparent, equitable, and merit-based selection process, ensuring that the most qualified candidates are chosen for these crucial roles.

chieving high growth is not easy. But sustaining it is much more difficult. Which is why instances of sustained high growth are fewer than those of growth faltering after a few years. Most countries hit a wall at middle-income levels, failing to catch up with rich nations like the United States of America, Japan, South Korea or the European ones. In its World Development Report 2024, the World Bank stated that only 34 economies ever managed to cross over to the high-income group since 1990 while the average per-person income of these countries never exceeded 10% of that of America. Earlier, in 2008, the Commission on Growth and Development, a body of 19 developing country leaders and two academics that focused on sustainable economic growth, observed that only 13 economies had grown 7% a year on average for 25 years or longer.

These hits and misses explain the periodic global attention on sustaining high growth rates, which can enable faster poverty reduction, generate employment, achieve better living standards and much else. The recent examination of success stories for insights by the World Bank focuses on the 'middle-income trap' and how some countries avoided it. Its past publication, the Growth Report, 2008, on behalf of the abovementioned body, had studied 'catch-up' growth or convergence to rich country levels. The analysis noted that rapid sustained growth of the kind seen in the second half of the 20th century was unheard of earlier. However, it was distinctly possible because of an open and integrated world economy, which enabled sourcing direct investments, knowledge and rapid learning from abroad while markets could be stretched beyond domestic boundaries.

Understanding the causes, consequences, and internal dynamics of the successful cases of sustained rapid growth (the 2008 exercise) or why countries got stuck or failed to become rich is a

reasonable attempt to identify mistakes and challenges over time and across countries. The idea is to look for common underpinnings and distil useful features and policy tips for leaders and policymakers who are directly involved in crafting growth strategies for their countries. The more aware they are, the better the caution about pitfalls and the lesser the tendency to take the sustained high growth rate for granted.

Based on its research understandings, the World Bank proposes a sequenced, three-pronged plan. First, low-income countries traverse the path of attracting investment to move up the income ladder. Then, at the lower-middle-income stage, adopt foreign technology to export more. Because technology diffusion, know-how and learning need skilled people, investing in these and expanding the skilled labour pool by increasing female participation (a noticeable drawback of this country group) are critical requirements. The US's growth in half a century, 1960-2010, is proof of this: more than a third of this came from lowered racial and gender discrimination in education and the workforce without which per-person annual income in the US today (\$80,000) would be \$30,000 less. Finally, catapulting to high-income level demands global innovation. Here, South Korea's outstanding economic performance — a 27.5 times increase in perperson income in 63 years to \$33,000 by the end of 2023 — remains unmatched.

2047, to name a few. How seriously should they take such proposals? Or heed the warnings? Or should they dismiss these altogether considering the 'middle-income trap' concept is not without its critics?

For one, the reasons why growth rates plateaued or slipped to lower trend vary vastly - from economic shocks and crises, especially financial, to political conflict and instability, policy failures, inability to shift course or modify economic structures for fresh impetus and investment opportunities, amongst others. While cross-country experiences offer insights and perspectives, it isn't clear or straightforward whether these are transferable

or replicable for similar success. Contexts, histories, institutions, structures, handicaps, comparative advantages and so on are not fully mappable from one country to another.

To be sure, such learnings and proposals are non-binding, with a caveat that adoption be country-specific. They do however provide a framework, given the observed historical patterns.

Yet it would be difficult to say that the ideas and the lessons are not influential because economic growth is an immensely desirable ideal. Not merely as an end, but for everything it can enable. Lessons and policy prescriptions for accelerating and sustaining rapid growth can therefore be catchy. For example, the observation that exceptional public investment rates went together with sustainable economic growth proved extremely powerful in its acceptance. This is because the global financial crisis sucked out world demand, leaving countries dependent on domestic demand, thereby enhancing its appeal. Many countries, including India, embarked on public infrastructure spending to fill the deficit and stimulate investments and growth. Yet, as India's case shows, years of public capex have supported growth but the crowding-in of private investment remains elusive. The investment drought persists for more than one decade.

That said, the repeatedly observed sources of sustained high growth over time and across the world are expanding markets and trade, which have reaped competitiveness and prosperity for all countries that engaged in it. This includes China and before that, the east Asian tigers, Japan, and so on. It is no coincidence that the World Bank's research finds that more than one-third of the countries that crossed into the high-income region after 1990 either on account of their integration with the European Union (market expansion) or through the discovery of oil. The case rests there

here is a peculiar madness that has gripped our Kashmiri society, a grotesque theater where stupidity and excess have joined hands with arrogance and ignorance. These modern marriages, not bound by the warmth of union but shackled by the cold chains of ostentation, bear living testimony to erosion of human values. What are we celebrating? Love, or the gluttony of wealth? It is Nietzsche's eternal question of values that we must ponder-what has happened to the spirit of our people, where humility was once a mark of honor, and now, pride wears the crown?

Marriage, once a sacred covenant, has devolved into a competition, a vulgar race to outdo, to outshine, and to outspend. The overindulgence, the wastage, the spectacle! It is as if we are determined to prove to the world that we can consume beyond measure, that we can drape ourselves in luxury while pretending this charade is the culmination of love. Yet, the truth, like a whispered shame, is evident: we are not celebrating love; we are entombing it beneath layers of silk, gold, and glittering emptiness.

The question then rises like the bitter smoke of an overcooked Wazwan: for whom are these grandiose displays? Do we truly find joy in parading our wealth before others, forcing them into the same cycle of debt, or is it that we find solace in the misery we inflict? A thousand dishes, yet not a morsel of sincerity. We throw money at florists, decorators, caterers, and musicians, thinking the more we pay, the more we elevate ourselves. But all we are doing is feeding a hollow beast-one that grows fatter with our pride, and hungrier with our soul's emptiness.

Nietzsche once spoke of the "slave morality," the way in which the masses are driven not by inner purpose but by the external judgments of others. This is exactly what we witness in Kashmir's pompous marriages. We are enslaved by the gaze



In the end, what matters more: a wedding that costs a fortune, or a marriage that lasts a lifetime? The choice is ours, but if we continue down this path of extravagance, we may find that we have nothing left but the fading memories of a pompous wedding and an empty soul of the crowd, by the whispers of relatives, by the approval of strangers. Our actions are not free but dictated by an unspoken code of material grandeur. How did we, people with such a rich and ancient culture-Kashmiris (who claim proudly we are from Reshwar/Peereywar) descend into this pit of artificiality?

Let us speak the truth plainly: these extravagant marriages are not just financially ruinous, but morally bankrupt. The bride and groom, decked like mannequins, often become mere props in their own wedding. What meaning can be found in a marriage where the concern is not the union of two souls, but the number of zeros on a bill? Love, real love, requires nothing of the kind. It grows in simplicity, in shared moments of connection, in the warmth of being known deeply and accepted completely. And yet, we cover this love with layers of finery, as though ashamed of its purity, as though true wealth cannot be measured in laughter or the quiet exchange of promises.

We must ask ourselves, what legacy are we leaving for the next generation? Do we want our children to believe that happiness comes in the form of a grand feast or a glittering stage? That worth is measured by the opulence of the wedding banquet? If this is what we teach them, then they too will follow in our footsteps, and the cycle of extravagance will continue, hollowing out the meaning of love and union. Nietzsche would argue that we have allowed the "herd mentality" to take over, that we have lost our individuality, that we are no longer guided by our own inner sense of value but by what others expect from us.

The cost of these pompous marriages is not just monetary, though that alone is staggering. Families go into debt, savings are drained, and for what? A fleeting moment of grandeur that is forgotten as soon as the last guest leaves? Okay till evening or other day till they completely nitpick it! But the true cost is deeper—it is spiritual. We are losing the essence of what it means to come together, to build a life, to celebrate love in its purest form. Instead, we celebrate wealth, status, and a false sense of superiority.

However, it is vital to understand that honoring our culture and traditions does not equate to succumbing to frivolous extravagance. We must respect our heritage, cherishing the beauty of our customs while ensuring they do not become burdensome. There are far better ways to pay homage to our culture than through grandiose displays that drown the true essence of our celebrations. We can engage with our traditions in meaningful, respectful ways that foster community and connection, rather than inflating egos or promoting competition.

There is, of course, a way out of this madness, a return to something more authentic, more meaningful. We must reclaim the sacredness of marriage, strip it of its pomp and pompousness, and let it breathe again as the beautiful union it was meant to be. Let us not be ashamed to have simple weddings, where love and sincerity should be the only focus, not wealth or spectacle. Let us teach our children that their worth is not tied to the price of their wedding, but to the depth of their character, the strength of their relationships, and the authenticity of their love.

In the end, what matters more: a wedding that costs a fortune, or a marriage that lasts a lifetime? The choice is ours, but if we continue down this path of extravagance, we may find that we have nothing left but the fading memories of a pompous wed-ding and an empty soul. Let us, as a society, rise above this madness, this "will to grandeur," and rediscover the true meaning of marriage-a bond of love, simplicity, and shared life. Only then can we truly honor the institution, and in doing so, reclaim a part of our collective soul that we have so carelessly lost.

Women at a Higher Risk of Heart Attacks

A simple difference in the genetic code – two X chromosomes versus one X chromosome and one Y chromosome – can lead to major differences in heart disease. It turns out that these genetic differences influence more than just sex organs and sex assigned at birth – they fundamentally alter the way cardiovascular disease develops and presents.

While sex influences the mechanisms behind how cardiovascular disease develops, gender plays a role in how health care providers recognize and manage it. Sex refers to biological characteristics such as genetics, hormones, anatomy and physiology, while gender refers to social, psychological and cultural constructs. Women are more likely to die after a first heart attack or stroke than men. Women are also more likely to have additional or different heart attack symptoms that go beyond chest pain, such as nausea, jaw pain, dizziness and fatigue. It is often difficult to fully disentangle the influences of sex on cardiovascular disease outcomes versus the influences of gender.

While women who haven't entered menopause have a lower risk of cardiovascular disease than men, their cardiovascular risk accelerates dramatically after menopause. In addition, if a woman has Type 2 diabetes, her risk of heart attack accelerates to be equivalent to that of men, even if the woman with diabetes has not yet gone through menopause. Further data is needed to better understand differences in cardiovascular disease risk among nonbinary and transgender patients

Despite these differences,

one key thing is the same: Heart attack, stroke and other forms of cardiovascular disease are the leading cause of death for all people, regardless of sex or gender.

We are researchers who study women's health and the way cardiovascular disease develops and presents differently in women and men. Our work has identified a crucial need to update medical guidelines with more sex-specific approaches to diagnosis and treatment in order to improve health outcomes for all.

Gender differences in heart disease

The reasons behind sex and gender differences in cardiovascular disease are not completely known. Nor are the distinct biological effects of sex, such as hormonal and genetic factors, versus gender, such as social, cultural and psychological factors, clearly differentiated.

What researchers do know is that the accumulated evidence of what good heart care should look like for women compared with men has as many holes in it as Swiss cheese. Medical evidence for treating cardiovascular disease often comes from trials that excluded women, since women for the most part weren't included in scientific research until the NIH Revitalization Act of 1993. For example, current guidelines to treat cardiovascular risk factors such as high blood pressure are based primarily on data from men. This is despite evidence that differences in the way that cardiovascular disease develops leads women to experience cardiovascular disease differently.

In addition to sex differences, implicit gender biases among providers and gendered social norms among patients



lead clinicians to underestimate the risk of cardiac events in women compared with men. These biases play a role in why women are more likely than men to die from cardiac events. For example, for patients with symptoms that are borderline for cardiovascular disease, clinicians tend to be more aggressive in ordering artery imaging for men than for women. One study linked this tendency to order less aggressive tests for women partly to a gender bias that men are more open than women to taking risks.

In a study of about 3,000 patients with a recent heart attack, women were less likely than men to think that their heart attack symptoms were due to a heart condition. Additionally, most women do not know that cardiovascular disease is the No. 1 cause of death among women. Overall, women's misperceptions of their own risk may hold them back from getting a doctor to check out possible symptoms of a heart attack or stroke.

These issues are further exacerbated for women of color. Lack of access to health care and additional challenges drive health disparities among underrepresented racial and ethnic minority populations.

Sex difference in heart disease

Cardiovascular disease physically looks different for women and men, specifically in the plaque buildup on artery walls that contributes to illness.

Women have fewer cholesterol crystals and fewer calcium deposits in their artery plaque than men do. Physiological differences in the smallest blood vessels feeding the heart also play a role in cardiovascular outcomes.

Women are more likely than men to have cardiovascular disease that presents as multiple narrowed arteries that are not fully "clogged," resulting in chest pain because blood flow can't ratchet up enough to meet higher oxygen demands with exercise, much like a low-flow showerhead. When chest pain presents in this way, doctors call this condition ischemia and no obstructive coronary arteries. In comparison, men are more likely to have a "clogged" artery in a concentrated area that can be opened up with a stent or with cardiac bypass surgery. Options for multiple narrowed arteries have lagged behind treatment options for typical "clogged" arteries, which puts women at a disadvantage.

In addition, in the early stages of a heart attack, the levels of blood markers that indicate damage to the heart are lower in women than in men. This can lead to more missed diagnoses of coronary artery disease in women compared with men. The reasons for these dif-

ferences are not fully clear. Some potential factors include differences in artery plaque composition that make men's plaque more likely to rupture or burst and women's plaque more likely to erode. Women also have lower heart mass and smaller arteries than men even after taking body size into consideration.

Reducing sex disparities

Too often, women with symptoms of cardiovascular disease are sent away from doctor's offices because of gender biases that "women don't get heart disease."

Considering how symptoms of cardiovascular disease vary by sex and gender could help doctors better care for all patients.

One way that the rubber is meeting the road is with regard to better approaches to diagnosing heart attacks for women and men. Specifically, when diagnosing heart attacks, using sex-specific cutoffs for blood tests that measure heart damage – called high-sensitivity troponin tests – can improve their accuracy, decreasing missed diagnoses, or false negatives, in women while also decreasing overdiagnoses, or false positives, in men.

Our research laboratory's leaders, collaborators and other internationally recognized research colleagues – some of whom partner with our Ludeman Family Center for Women's Health Research on the University of Colorado Anschutz Medical Campus - will continue this important work to close this gap between the sexes in health care. Research in this field is critical to shine a light on ways clinicians can better address sex-specific symptoms and to bring forward more tailored treatments.

The Biden administration's recent executive order to advance women's health research is paving the way for research to go beyond just understanding what causes sex differences in cardiovascular disease. Developing and testing rightsized approaches to care for each patient can help achieve better health for all.

India and China reached a patrolling agreement last week for these regions only - that will, hopefully, put an end to over four years of military and diplomatic tension arising from the Line of Actual Control.

That tension was fuelled by a series of military skirmishes in the Pangong Lake area in May 2020 and included the clash in Ladakh's Galwan in June, in which 20 Indian soldiers died for their country.

In the weeks and months following the Galwan violence



both countries ramped up military presence along the LAC, the de facto international border; in August last year it was reported that Delhi had airlifted nearly 70,000 soldiers, over 90 tanks, and hundreds of infantry combat vehicles, as well as deploying Sukhoi and Jaguar fighter jets in eastern Ladakh, for rapid deployment in the region.

India-China LAC Agreement

Beijing had similarly deployed soldiers "in considerable numbers all across Eastern Ladakh and the Northern Front, right up to (India's) Eastern Command", the Army had said earlier.

On the disengagement and de-escalation process, Army Chief General Upendra Dwivedi said this week that the Indian military is "trying to restore trust" in its Chinese counterpart.

"This (rebuilding of trust) will happen once we are able to see each other, and convince and reassure each other, that we are not creeping into buffer zones that have been created," the General said.

The patrolling agreement was announced - hours before Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Russia for the BRICS summit where he would hold a bilateral

Speaking after it was confirmed, Modi told the Chinese

leader, "It should be our priority to ensure there is peace and stability along our border", and stressed the need for "mutual trust, mutual respect".

Earlier External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar said the agreement was the result of 'patient and persevering diplomacy". Speaking at NDTV's World Summit, he said, "I think it creates a basis for peace and tranquillity along the border, which was there before 2020...'

De-escalation is still a concern in other areas, including the Gogra-Hot Springs area in Ladakh, after Indian and Chinese forces backed down in September last year. However, intel indicates China continues to hold large swathes of Indian territory to the north, in the Depsang plains area.

Depsang is seen as critical for India since it provides access to the airstrip at Daulat Beg Oldie and prevents Chinese troops from threatening vital logistics centres in the area. Demchok, meanwhile is divided in two by the LAC; India controls the western part, which is claimed by China.

The man was shot nearly a dozen times, and the bullet-riddled body was found in the Wachi area of Zainapora, lying in a field. In another attack, the bullet-riddled body of a territorial Army soldier was found in Jammu and Kashmir's Anantnag on October 9. The soldier, identified as Hilal Ahmad Bhath, was abducted along with one of his colleagues who managed to escape the terrorists. Earlier this year, terrorists attacked the house of a Village Development Committee (VDC) Jammu and Kashmir's Rajouri in the middle of a firefight with security forces. One terrorist was killed in the encounter. In July, five soldiers were killed in the Kathua district after terrorists hurled a grenade and opened fire at two army vehicles. The attack took place on the Machedi-Kindli-Malhar mountainous, and the Indian Army retaliated

by firing 5000 rounds at the attacking terrorists.

'How Is My Son?

Why should someone be killed for trying to earn a living, asked another family member.

In Nowshera, a village located around 18 kilometres away from the district headquarters Baramulla, the slain porter's friends and neighbours remember him as a hardworking young man who took on the role of porter to support his family.

"His financial condition was never good," shared Sheikh Muneeb, a neighbour. "He was the only breadwinner, struggling to provide for his ailing father and young son. He had just received a 20-day salary."

Meanwhile, the villagers expressed a hope that authorities will take steps to ensure the safety of civilians and prevent such tragedies from recurring. "These incidents should not happen. We want justice for Mushtaq and hope such tragedies, which devastate families, do not repeat in the future," grieving villagers said. (KNO)

720 Terrorists

There is a huge challenge along the International Border and Line of Control. There is nearly 210 kilometres of International Border and about same in LoC,"

Intense Search Op Launched

Gangabugh." ARTO Budgam emphasized strict adherence to the new routes by all transporters to facilitate smooth transit and minimize disruption.

J&K's Troubles Will End **Only After India, Pak Become Friends: Farooq**

SRINAGAR: Following a series of terror attacks in the past two weeks in the Valley, National Conference president Farooq Abdullah on Friday said Jammu and Kashmir will never be a part of Pakistan and called for an end to the country's promotion of terrorism in the region. He said that the attacks will

keep happening until a solution is found, adding that he has seen this for 30 years.

"Attacks like the one in Gulmarg would continue to occur until India and Pakistan found a way to be friends and that would end Jammu and Kashmir's troubles," he said.

Two soldiers and two Army porters were killed on Thursday after terrorists ambushed a force vehicle near Gulmarg in north Kashmir's Baramulla district. Another soldier and a porter were injured in the attack.

"Such attacks will continue to take place in this state. You know where they come from and it will not stop until some way is found to get out of this trouble. I have been witnessing it for the last 30 years, innocent people are getting killed," Abdullah told reporters.

"We are not going to become a part of Pakistan. So, why are they doing this? To disrupt our future? To make us poorer?" he asked.

The former chief minister of the erstwhile Jammu and Kashmir state said rather than fomenting trouble in the Union Territory, Pakistan should look towards its own plight and work for its betterment. "They are getting ruined



themselves but are ruining us as well," he said. Abdullah appealed to Paki-

stan to stop the violence and find a way to form a friendship with India.

"If they don't find a way, the future will be very difficult," he said.

National Conference The president also paid tribute to the two porters and the two soldiers killed in Thursday's attack. "I pay my tribute to those who

have been martyred. I apologise to their families," he said. Asked if he thought Pakistan was frustrated by the record turnout in the recent assembly

elections, Abdullah said he did not know what happened. "People voted in the assembly polls and now the assembly will work for the people.


Syed Salim Geelani, a Sunni social activist, described Maulana Ansari as a man devoted to the unity of the Muslim Ummah

Continuous Dry Spell Likely To Impact Saffron Production

SRINAGAR: The continuous dry spell in Kashmir over the past several months is likely to impact saffron production this year. Saffron growers from the Pampore area of south Kashmir's Pulwama district said that the lack of sufficient rainfall this autumn will adversely affect saffron yields.

Ghulam Rasool, a grower In 1987 Molvi Abbas became from Dusoo Pampore, said founding convenor of Muslim United Front (MUF) which while there was light rain in changed the political land-September, it was inadequate for proper saffron cultivation. He spent years behind bars for his relentless politi-

"The ongoing dry conditions have affected the majority of crops this year, and saffron will also be impacted," Rasool said, adding that moderate rain in the next week could still ben-

efit the crop. Khursheed Ahmad, another grower, said countries like Iran, Spain and Afghanistan enjoy good saffron yields every year due to their effective irrigation systems, which are lacking in Pampore. "We typically experience good autumn rains, but this year we have had almost none, and that will certainly affect production," he remarked.

Ahmad said the government has invested crores of rupees to boost saffron production in Pampore, yet the vital drip irrigation facilities remain nonfunctional.

Other growers said while these systems were installed years ago, most have never been operational due to unclear reasons. They said if drip irrigation facilities were made functional growers would not have



Chief Minister Omar Abdullah to address this issue and enhance saffron production.

Saffron production has declined by over 67% from 2010 to 2023.

According to details obtained by KNO, saffron production in Jammu and Kashmir has declined from 8.0 metric tons (MT) in 2010-11 to 2.6 MT in 2023-24, marking an overall decrease of approximately 67.5%. However, there was a slight recovery in the last year, with a marginal increase of 4% from 2022-23 to 2023-24. Officials said that in 2013-14,

saffron production was 14.01 MT, with a yield of 3.82 quintals per hectare. This fell to 5.57 MT in 2014-15, with a yield of 1.52 quintals per hectare. In 2015-16, production rose to 16.17 MT, yielding 4.41 quintals per hectare, and increased further to 16.45 MT in 2016-17, with a yield of 4.49 quintals per hectare.

However, production took a downturn in 2017-18, dropping to 5.20 MT with a yield of 1.42 quintals per hectare. In 2018-19, production slightly increased to 5.65 MT, yielding 1.54 quintals per hectare. By 2019-20, production fell drastically to just 0.02 MT, with a yield of 4.44 quintals per hectare.

Er Rashid Wants 'Durbar Move' To Continue

"Today, we want to remind (Chief Minister) Omar Abdullah through this protest that he had promised that as soon as the government is formed, the tradition of Darbar move will be restored," he said.

The Lok Sabha MP said our

only demand is that people should be told which city was the capital of J-K. "Our people do not know whether they have to go to Srinagar or Jammu.

There is no solution to people's issues, people are worried whether their files are in Jammu or Srinagar," he said. The AIP chief said either Darbar move should be restored, or Srinagar should be made the permanent capital of the Union territory.

"Our protest today is to seek that either Srinagar should be made the capital or Darbar move should be restored. But Abdullah's method is wrong, he only makes promises and goes back on them," he added.

Haroon Rashid (55), a resident of Vehil village of Shopian has been growing saffron in a big hall of his house as well on the slab of his house with positive results.

Haroon said that he has been growing different kinds of vegetables, fruits and even some medicinal plants on the slab of his two-storey house for the last seven years now.

He said that while growing different kinds of vegetables and fruits, he has always sought attention and guidance from concerned officials of Horticulture and Agriculture departments, who have always supported him. Haroon said that last year

while meeting officials, he came to know about indoor saffron and with the help of KVK Balpora Shopian and India International Kashmir Saffron Trade Centre (IIKSTC) Dusoo Pampore, he gave try to indoor saffron and that showed very positively results. He said that on his own with

guidance of some officials, he also started growing outdoor saffron using hydroponic technique and that too has shown very positive results. This year, both indoor and outdoor saffron has been grown again and the results are much better, he said.

Pune Test: Santner, Latham Put NZ On Top With 301-Run Lead

PUNE: India's inadequacies against quality spin bowling stood thoroughly exposed, leaving the side staring at its first ever home Test series loss to New Zealand after the visitors claimed a formidable 301run lead on day two of the second Test here on Friday.

Tom Latham (86) led New Zealand's charge with the bat after Mitchell Santner's brilliant 7/53 destroyed India.

His knock consolidated a handy 103-run first-innings lead that the Kiwis had grabbed before reaching 198/5

at stumps. Tom Blundell (30 not out) had Glenn Phillips (7 not out) for company when stumps were drawn.

The only silver lining for In-dia was Washington Sundar's continuing good show.

He completed 11 wickets in the match, adding four more to his career-best first-innings



haul of seven. New Zealand are looking at a historic maiden Test series win in India, having first come here in 1955-56.

None of the New Zealand batters faced any apparent trouble batting on the pitch shortly after the star-studded Indian line-up cut a sorry fig-

ure for the second time in this series, making elementary mistakes. In the last Test in Bengalu-

ru, their all-time lowest score

at home of 46 all-out caused India's first loss to New Zealand in 36 years in their own backyard.

India haven't lost a Test series at home since their defeat to England in the 2012-13 season and their unbeaten record in 18 series since then is under serious threat now.

India's highest successful chase in Tests at home was 387 against England at Chennai in December 2008. On Friday afternoon, India

folded at a mere 156 in 45.3 overs as spunky New Zealand continued to perform way better than the hosts.

As India endured yet another 'one bad session of play', six wickets fell in the morning for a mere 91 runs which made the pitch look unfavourable for batting when it was not the case.

Skipper Latham led from the front as he blunted the Indian spinners with ease but New Zealand batters deserved full credit for executing their plans.
