

Sonamarg: In a public display of bonhomie, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday exchanged warm gestures with Chief Minister Omar Abdullah who is an ally of the opposition INDIA bloc.

Modi was in Sonamarg to inaugurate the 6.5-km Z-Morh tunnel in Ganderbal district to provide round-the-year connectivity to the hill resort along the 434-km Srinagar-Leh national highway.

This was the first visit of the prime minister to J&K after the formation of the Omar-led National Conference government in October last year.

On reaching the stage after dedicating the tunnel to the people of J&K, Modi was presented Kashmir's famous Sozni shawl by Lt Governor Manoj Sinha and a papier mache painting by the chief minister.

Omar was the first to address the well-attended gathering and was warmly

clapped by the prime minister who also shook hands with him before he returned to his seat close to Modi.

The chief minister, in his speech, praised Prime Minister Modi for his efforts in bridging the gap between "Dil (heart) and Delhi" and holding assembly polls in the Union Territory while exuding confidence that the statehood restoration promise would soon be fulfilled.

Omar referred to Modi's speech made on International Yoga Day last year and said, "You gave three very important points in your programme. You talked about 'dil ki duri' (distance between hearts) and 'Dilli se duri' (distance of people of Jammu and Kashmir with Delhi) and said you are trying to eliminate both these things."

ACB Files Case Against Ex PWD Engineer

Srinagar: Jammu and Anti-Corruption Kashmir Bureau (ACB) on Monday said to have registered a Disproportionate Assets (DA) case against the retired Superintending Engineer of PWD (R&B).

"Jammu and Kashmir Anti Corruption Bureau conducted a verification into the allegation that Riyaz Ahmad Parray, Superintending retired Engineer PWD (R&B), resident of Hygam Baramulla has amassed huge assets, by indulging in corrupt practices," a statement reads.

The verification revealed that the suspect public servant during service period has acquired properties in shape of immovable/movable at Hygam, Srinagar, Jammu and Delhi and has also made huge investments/ expenditures which are disproportionate to his known sources of income, the state-

ment reads. "It was found during probe that the accused public servant has intentionally enriched himself illicitly during the period of his office & the expenditures incurred and the value of assets acquired/ raised by the accused during service period have been found prima facie disproportionate to his known sources of income. Accordingly, a Case FIR No. 01/2025 under section 13 (1) (b) r/w 13 (2) of Prevention of Corruption Act 1988 (As amended in 2018) was registered at PS ACB Baramulla against the accused Riyaz Ahmad Parrey, Superintendent retired Engineer, PWD (R&B) and the investigation of the case was initiated," the ACB statement added. | More on P6

80% Terrorists In J&K Are **Pakistanis: Army Chief**

New Delhi:Indian Army chief Gen Upendra Dwivedi on Monday termed Pakistan as the epicentre of terrorism and said that 80 percent of terrorists active in Jammu and Kashmir are Pakistanis.

In his annual Army Day press conference, Gen Dwivedi blamed Pakistan for the violence levels in the Union Territory saying it was being orchestrated by the epicentre of terrorism that is Pakistan.

"If the support is not forthcoming the way India is looking at it, this kind of terrorist infiltration will continue to be



there," he said. The Army Chief said that the parliamentary elections

Union Territory both had nearly 60% voting.

"It means that the local population is going with peace. People of Jammu and Kashmir are shunning violence and violence is being orchestrated by our Western adversary Pakistan," the chief said.

'Surgical Infection Rate Higher In India Than Many High-Income Countries'

The Surgical Site Infections (SSIs) rate among three major hospitals in India was found to be higher than in many high-income countries, an ICMR study has revealed. The study was conducted in a cohort of 3,020 patients from three hospitals. SSIs are among the most prevalent healthcare-associated infections.

Debridement surgery, carried out with either an amputation, open reduction internal fixation surgery (ORIF), or closed reduction internal fixation (CRIF) surgery, had the highest SSI rate of 54.2 per cent.

SSIs cause significant morbidity, leading to excess health expenditures and increased length of hospital stay.

There is a lack of data on postdischarge SSIs from low-and middle-income countries. In India, there exists no surveillance system of SSIs that covers the post-discharge period.

"Therefore, we proposed a multicentric analysis to estimate the proportion and identify the risk factors associated with SSIs occurring during hospital stay and after discharge," the study said.

A prospective multicentric cohort study was conducted Jai Prakash Narayan Apex Trauma Centre (JPNATC), Kasturba Hospital (KMC) in Manipal, and Tata Memorial Hospital (TMH) in Mumbai.



"The rate in our study was lower than that reported in Gujarat (8.95 per cent) and higher than the one from Dehradun (5 per cent) in India, as well as Iran (17.4 per cent), Egypt (17 per cent) and Pakistan (7.3 per cent)," one of the researchers said.

A total of 161 out of 3,090 patients acquired SSI, resulting in a 5.2 per cent SSI incidence.

Clean, polluted wound class and surgeries lasting longer than 120 minutes were substantially linked to an increased risk of SSI. The study revealed that patients who developed SSIs experienced longer hospital stays.

Post-discharge surveillance helped with the detection of 66 per cent of SSI cases.

Combination surgeries were seen to increase the risk of SSIs in patients. So post-discharge surveillance assisted in diagnosing 50 per cent of SSI patients.

Police Arrests 2 Drug Peddlers With Contraband Substances

Srinagar: In its relentless efforts to contain the drug menace, Police in Srinagar have arrested two drug peddlers and recovered contraband substances from their possession.

A Police team of PS Chanapora at a checkpoint established at Chanpora intercepted a vehicle (Tempo Traveller) bearing registration number JK02AF-1776, with two persons on board. They have been identified as Umer Manzoor Rather resident of Natipora and Yawer Ahmad Bhat resident of Baghat Kanipora. During the search, a substantial quantity of contraband substance was recovered from their possession.

Accordingly, a case vide FIR No. 03/2025 under NDPS Act has been registered at PS Chanapora and investigation initiated.

More Arrests, Raids Expected As Probe Deepens

Srinagar: The recent arrest of two senior officials from Srinagar Smart City Limited (SSCL) on corruption charges has unveiled a web of financial irregularities, with investigators signaling the possibility of more arrests in the coming days.

The Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) is reportedly digging deep into suspicious bank transactions linked to the two officials, Executive Engineer Zahoor Dar and Chief Financial Officer Sajid Yousuf Bhat. Reliable sources within the

In several cases, the designs implemented were subsequently reversed following complaints from citizens, but not before substantial sums of money

As investigators delve deeper into the case, they have identified additional individuals potentially linked to the corruption scandal. These individuals, some of whom are believed to be relatives or close associates of the arrested officials, are suspected of receiving public funds through fraudulent means.

Sources added that a thorough and unbiased investigation is underway, with further arrests anticipated as new evidence comes to light. [KNT]

Only PM Can Represent Us: Farooq

'AMMU- Chief Minister, Dr. Farooq Abdullah today questioned the usefulness of Hurriyat delegation to Paki¬stan in sorting out problems in Kashmir and said only direct talks between prime minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee and Pakistan chief executive General Pervez Musharraf would he purposeful for bringing peace in the region.

'Kashmir is part of India and only the prime minister can represent us in any dia¬logue', Dr. Abdullah said after inaugurating a B. Ed college in private sector at Tarore, 22 kilometers from here this morning. He however, added that no authority, even the prime minister, can never af-ford to think of parting with an inch of Kashmir, 'which was, is and will remain proud

The chief minister said that after failing to annex Kashmir in favour wars, Islamabad has switched over to proxy war for the past about 12 years. He said the foreigners are attacking se-curity pickets and targeting nationalist forces. Everyday National Conference workers, village defence committee members and SPOs are killed. They are also after those who have laid their arms after real¬ising the futility of gun, Dr. Abdullah said.

"Pakistanis out to eliminate those carrying tricolour in Kashmir thereby snapping the relationship the people of the valley have tied with rest of the nation, but we are determined to give them a befitting fight 'Even if Farooq is killed, Kash¬mir will never go to Pakistan', he declared. According to NAFA, the chief minister said APHC lacked

mass support. "It has only militant support. If that support is withdrawn, it will collapse. Why are they eager to go to Pakistan? They are already in touch with Pak through its mission in India. In fact, the APHC is the creation of Pakistan, he said. (KASHMIR OBSERVER, 14 JANUARY, 2001)

PM opens Z-Morh

rime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the muchanticipated Z-Morh Tunnel in Sonamarg, Ganderbal district, on Monday, marking a significant milestone in Jammu and Kashmir's infrastructure development. Z-Morh project comprises a 6.5-km tunnel, a 6-km approach road, two major bridges and one minor bridge. It includes a 14.15-km tunnel, an 18-km approach road between Z-Morh and Zoji-la tunnel as a single integrated package, besides carriageway, two snow galleries, four major bridges and 18 avalanche-protection dams. Though the work on the tunnel had been ongoing for several years, it came to a sudden stop in September 2018 after the non-banking finance company IL&FS that financed it went bust. However, in January NHIDCL awarded the Z-Morh Tunnel to APCO Amarnathji Tunnelway Pvt Ltd An all-weather road has become critical for India's access to Ladakh in recent years, more so in the wake of new developments along the LAC with China. In the absence of a tunnel, the road to Ladakh remains buried under 10 feet of snow in winter, disconnecting the region from the rest of the country for six months.

That said, the prime minister's inauguration of the project was a big occasion. Accompanied by Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha, Chief Minister Omar Abdullah, and Union Minister Nitin Gadkari, Modi highlighted the project's strategic importance and potential to boost tourism. "This tunnel is a testament to India's commitment to modern infrastructure and development in Jammu and Kashmir,' he remarked. As the PM rightly said the tunnel has both economic and strategic dimensions: It is poised to transform Sonamarg into a year-round destination, bolstering winter tourism and local economic development. Strategically, it strengthens connectivity to Ladakh, crucial for both civilian and military movement.

With CM Abdullah also broaching the statehood issue,in his speech on the occasion the tunnel inauguration acquired a political dimension. In response, the Prime Minister reaffirmed his promises to the people of Jammu and Kashmir. "This is Modi, and he keeps his promises. The right things will happen at the right time," he said, without directly addressing the statehood demand. This was a reiteration of the PM's oft-repeated assurance about the restoration of statehood to J&K "at an appropriate time." What, however, the central government has not given so far is a timeline. So, there is a section of people in J&K who believe that statehood might take longer than expected. There is thus an urgent need for a timeline. The crown of India, as the Prime Minister aptly described Jammu and Kashmir, will shine brightest when its people are politically and economically empowered and their dignity upheld.



Deadlock Ends on Singhpora Vailoo Tunnel Project

ith the inauguration of the Z Morh Tunnel in Sonamarg today, a new era of infrastructure development has begun. This longawaited project which commenced in 2015, has now reached its significant milestone opening its doors to traffic. The event was graced by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Union Cabinet Minister for Road Transport and Highways Nitin Gadkari, MOS, Lieutenant Governor of Jammu and Kashmir, the Chief Minister of J&K, Chairman NHIDCL and other distinguished guests

During the ceremony, several dignitaries shared their perspectives on the ongoing and future development projects in Jammu and Kashmir. Chief Minister UT of J&K, Omar Abdullah began by honoring the victims of a terrorist attack near the Z-Morh Tunnel project site last year, paying tribute to their sacrifices. P.M Narendra Modi underscored the significance of infrastructure projects in the region's development. He highlighted that Jammu and Kashmir is transforming into a hub for tunnels, bridges, and ropeways, with projects like the world's highest tunnel, railroad bridge, and rail lines being constructed. PM Modi expressed his desire to see Jammu and Kashmir as a "beautiful and prosperous" region, referring to

it as the "Crown of the Country." In his speech, Minister Nitin Gadkari praised the newly completed Sonamarg Tunnel, which was built at a remarkable cost of ₹2,717 crore. He emphasized that the tunnel not only reduces travel distances but also ensures all-weather connectivity for the region. Gadkari also highlighted several major infrastructure projects that are either underway or in the pipeline, including the Shankaracharya Ropeway in Srinagar, a modern bus stand in Jammu, and various tunnels along NH-44. These projects, along with initiatives like the Srinagar Ring Road, Jammu Ring Road, and the Delhi-Amritsar-Katra Expressway, aim to bolster the region's connectivity.

Many newspapers have failed to fully quote Minister Nitin Gadkari's recent remarks about the infrastructure projects in Jammu and Kashmir. While they reported on his discussion about ongoing and future developments, they overlooked a crucial part of his speech regarding specific road corridors. Gadkari began by mentioning the various road corridors currently under execution, including the Khanabal-Anantnag-Chenani corridor on NH-244. He indirectly referred to five upcoming tunnels planned for this corridor, including the Sudhmahadev Twin Tube Tunnels and the Singhpora Vailoo Twin Tube Tunnel.



The Singhpora Vailoo Tunnel Project was quoted by TLL-Evrascon JV at a 26% lower price than the tendered cost. This ambitious project involves the construction of a twin-tube tunnel spanning 10.3 km, along with an approach road of 13 km on the Anantnag side and 18 km on the Kishtwar side. The estimated cost of the project at that time was ₹3500 Cr. Following its initial tender in 2023, the project faced cancellation in 2024 for unspecified reasons leaving its future uncer-

tain. However, with Union Minister Nitin Gadkari's remarks today and the positive developments on the Parivesh Portal, it appears that the deadlock has been resolved. According to the Parivesh Portal, the first stage of forest land clearance has already been granted by the end of 2024, while the second stage approval is expected by the end of February 2025. The tendering process will begin in March 2025 with construction slated to start by June 2025

Can Food Change Your Personality?

ersonality often feels like an unchanging foundation of who we are—whether we're extroverted, agreeable, or open to new experiences. But what if personality is more malleable than we think? Emerging research suggests that diet may influence personality traits through its influence on the gut, neuroplasticity, and immunity. This raises fascinating questions about how the food we eat might shape who we are.

Personality: Dynamic and Changeable

Personality encompasses enduring patterns in thoughts, emotions, and behaviors, influencing everything from relationships to career success. While often perceived as fixed, research shows personality traits can change over time. Traits like conscientiousness and emotional stability increase into middle adulthood. and major events, like the COV-ID-19 pandemic, have been linked to shifts in traits such as extraversion and conscientiousness.

Genetics account for 30-40 percent of personality, but environmental factors—including diet—play a substantial role. This opens the door to exploring how the foods we consume may impact personality.

The Gut-Brain Axis and **Personality**

The gut-brain axis, a communication network between the gut and brain, is central to understanding diet's influence on personality. The gut microbiome trillions of microorganisms in

the digestive system—plays a key role in regulating mood, stress, and inflammation. Healthy gut microbiomes are associated with lower anxiety and better emotional stability, while imbalances can contribute to irritability and

Foods rich in omega-3 fatty acids, like salmon, promote neuronal growth, while antioxidants from fruits and vegetables may protect brain cells. These nutrients may foster traits such as adaptability, creativity, and emo-

tional resilience. Emerging research on psyche-

delics underscores diet's potential to influence personality. Psilocybin, which can be consumed in certain mushrooms, has been shown to increase openness to experience and reduce neuroticism, potentially through its effects on neuroplasticity.

Metabolism, Diet, and

Personality Diet affects metabolism, which in turn influences personality. Blood sugar regulation, a key aspect of metabolic health, impacts brain function and mood. Dvsregulated blood sugar, common in conditions like diabetes, has been linked to higher neuroticism and lower openness to experience. Notably, personality traits such as impulsivity may increase following significant weight gain, further illustrating the connection between metabolic health and personality.

Inflammation and Personality

Chronic low-grade inflammation, often driven by poor diet,

impacts brain health and may shape personality. Studies link higher inflammation levels to lower conscientiousness and extraversion. Conversely, reducing inflammation through a healthy diet might support positive personality traits.

Recent findings suggest the relationship is bidirectional: personality traits can predict future inflammation levels, and inflammation-related genetic variants may influence personality. This dynamic highlights the complex interplay between diet, immunity, and personality.

The Extent of Change

While diet's effects on mood and behavior are well-established, its influence on long-term personality traits is still being explored. Most studies show correlations rather than causation, making it difficult to determine the exact extent to which diet can change personality.

Nonetheless, nourishing the body with the right nutrients creates biological conditions that support psychological well-being, potentially fostering subtle shifts in personality over time.

In summary, the relationship between diet and personality is an emerging area of science that underscores our capacity for change. By making thoughtful dietary choices, we may not only improve physical health but also shape the traits that define who we are. Next time you choose a meal, consider that it's not just feeding your body-it might also be influencing your mind.

When we floated the tender for the project for the fifth time, the government had fixed its cost at Rs 12,000 crore. However, I am happy to tell you (PM) that we are completing it under Rs 6,800 crore and have saved around Rs 5,000 crore," the minister said.

"Zojila tunnel is the highest tunnel in Asia, which will reduce the travel time between Srinagar and Leh by 3.5 hours and will give the people an all-season connectivity which will bring ease in their lives."

Speaking about other developmental proj-

ects in J-K, Gadkari said his ministry is building four corridors in the Union Territory at the cost of Rs 50,000 crore. Jammu-Udhampur-Srinagar corridor, which is 250 km long, will be built at a cost of Rs 16,000 crores. We are trying to finish

the project by the end of this year.

"There will be 33 tunnels in this corridor, out of which 15 have been completed, while 18 more are to be built in which the work is underway. It will reduce the distance by 70 km and save five hours of journey time. The 9 tunnels will be completed by December 2025," he said.

The second corridor is Jammu-Chenani-Anantnag, which is 202 km long and is being built at Rs 14,000 crore. It will be completed by December 2025, the minister said.

Five tunnels in this project will reduce the distance by 68 km, he added.

The third corridor is the Surankote-Shopian-Baramulla-Uri, which is 303 km long, being constructed at the cost of Rs 10,000 crore and will be completed by 2027, Codlericaid

Gadkari said.

The fourth one is the Jammu-Akhnoor-Surankote-Poonch corridor, which is 203 km, and the project cost is Rs 5,000 crore. The DPR process has been started, he said, adding that all these corridors will be the lifeline of I&K.

He also announced that the DPR process has been started for another important corridor -- Kathua-Basohli-Bhaderwah-Doda.

It is a four-lane, 250 km long project at the cost of Rs 3,400 crore. People from Punjab can go directly from Kathua to Srinagar without having to go to Jammu once it is completed, the minister informed.

He also mentioned that the Srinagar ring road is to be built at a cost of Rs 7,200 crore. It is a 104-km four-lane road and will be completed by this year-end, the minister announced.

People going to Gurez, Baramulla, or Ladakh will not have to enter Srinagar once this project is completed, Gadkari said.

Referring to Modi's dream of connecting Kashmir with Delhi and reducing the distance between hearts, Gadkari said the Delhi-Amritsar-Katra greenfield express highway, which is being constructed at a cost of Rs 41,000 crore and is 670 km long, will be completed by the year-end.

We are working to have you dedicate it to the nation by this year-end, he added.

"On your assurance to the people of J&K to reduce the distance between them and Delhi, I assure you that this dream will be realised soon and the road journey between Delhi to Srinagar will be completed in 8-8.5 hours soon, and this project will be completed in 1.5 years," Gadkari added.

He also said the government is undertaking five ropeway projects in J&K, including the Shankaracharya ropeway in Srinagar, Baltal to Amarnath cave shrine ropeway, and Sonamarg-Thajiwas ropeway.

The work will start soon, he said.

"Your (PM's) focus is on improving road and rail connectivity. The people here say they had never even dreamt of having such a road and railway network, which has been done under your leadership," Gadkari said.

J&K Lacks Robotic Surgical Systems


SRINAGAR: Amid a revolution wide, Jammu and Kashmir continues to lack a robotic surgical system, forcing patients to seek advanced treatment outside the Union Territory. Robot-assisted surgery uses

specialised technology that enhances a surgeon's capabilities by enabling precise movements, improved magnification and access to hard-to-reach areas through small incisions.

Several doctors said robotic surgical systems are urgently needed at tertiary care health facilities in J&K. They said that advanced procedures such as heart surgery, gastrointestinal surgery, general surgery, gynecologic surgery, thoracic surgery, urologic surgery and others could benefit from this technology.

Doctors suggested that establishing robotic surgical systems at institutions such as SKIMS, GMC Srinagar and other tertiary care hospitals would eliminate the need for patients to travel outside J&K for treatment.

Noted urologist Dr Sajad said robotic surgical systems offer numerous benefits, including precision, miniaturisation, small incisions, reduced blood loss, less pain and quicker healing times. "It is the need of the hour to have such a system in



Dr Sajad added that robotic surgical systems are highly effective for urological, gynaecological, colorectal, neurosurgical and cardiothoracic procedures, delivering excellent results. "Even kidney transplants and open-heart surgeries are performed with superior outcomes using robotic systems," he added.

Dr Sushil, a surgeon, said robotic-assisted surgery is revolutionising healthcare globally. "Robots enable surgeons to perform more accurate and precise surgeries, focusing on patient care with greater efficiency. For instance, a surgeon can perform an eight-hour robotic-assisted surgery without experiencing fatigue," he said.

Dr Showkat from GMC Srinagar highlighted the role of

artificial intelligence in roboticassisted surgery, saying it supports better patient outcomes and enhances surgical efficiency. "These advanced technologies lead to quicker recoveries, minimal complications, shorter hospital stays, and affordable treatment options for patients in J&K," he said.

Several doctors revealed that their departments have repeatedly requested the government to procure robotic surgical systems for J&K. Notably, SKIMS, GMC Srinagar and GMC Jammu virtually trained surgeons for robotic-assisted surgeries last year; however, the facilities are yet to be implemented.

Meanwhile, a senior official said that tenders for procuring robotic surgical systems at GMC were floated a few years ago but did not materialise. "Efforts are underway to bring these advanced facilities to J&K at the earliest," he said—(KNO)
