# Waqf Act Sparks 2nd Day of Assembly Uproar

Jammu: The Jammu and Kashmir Assembly was adjourned by for the second time on Tuesday following a ruckus in the House by National Conference (NC), Congress, PDP and other members over the disallowance of adjournment of business to discuss the Waqf Amendment Act.

This is the second consecutive day on which treasury benches did not allow the

House to function. As the House assembled for the day, NC members led by Salman Sagar, Tanvir Sadiq and Peoples Conference member Sajad Gani Lone raised the issue of adjourning the Budget Session to discuss the Bill in the

As Speaker Abdul Rahim Rather asked them to allow the Question Hour to begin, members of NC, Congress, PDP, and Independents trooped into the well of the House, raising slogans and demanding the with-drawal of the "black law."

Amid the noisy scenes, PDP member Waheed-ur-Rehman Parra stormed into the well of the House, demanding the immediate passage of the resolution moved by his party.

As Parra, carrying a copy of the resolution in his hand, pressed for its passage, NC leader Abdul Majid Larmi accused him of being an "RSS agent," sparking a heated verbal exchange between NC members

# Diabetes Drug Shows Effectiveness In Lowering Heart-Related Complications In Study

Semaglutide, a common anti-diabetes drug, could lower risk of cardiovascular complications in diabetics, such as heart attacks and strokes, by up to 14 per cent, according to a study.

The drug used to treat diabetes works by helping people manage their blood sugar levels. Semaglutide has also shown effectiveness in weight loss and thus, is also used as an anti-obesity medication.

Researchers, including those at the University of North Carolina, US, found that the oral form of Semaglutide can significantly reduce cardiovascular events in people with Type 2 diabetes, atherosclerotic cardiovascular

"Heart attacks and strokes are among the most common and devastating complications of diabetes," endocrinologist and the study's lead author John Buse, a professor of medicine and director of the Dia-

betes Care Center, University of North Carolina, said.
"Semaglutide has been a main stay of our efforts to reduce heart attack and stroke in people with diabetes. Having an oral option to deliver this highly effective therapy is a big advance," Buse said.

For the study, 9,650 people

-- aged 50 years and above -- with Type 2 diabetes and known to have atherosclerotic cardiovascular disease, chronic kidney disease, or both, were recruited.

The participants were randomly assigned to receive either a once-daily oral Semaglutide (14 mg) or a placebo (an inactive substance).

Standard treatment for lowering glucose and cardiovascular risk was provided to the study group.

"Among persons with Type 2 diabetes and atherosclerotic cardiovascular disease, chronic kidney disease, or 
both, the use of oral Semaglutide was associated with 
a significantly lower risk of 
major adverse cardiovascular events than placebo," the 
authors wrote.



# **Free Bus Service Sees Over 3.5 Lakh Passengers**

Srinagar: The newly launched free bus service for women has witnessed a massive surge in ridership in Jammu and Kashmir with over 3.5 lakh women availing the facility within just a week of its launch on April 01.

The initiative, which aims to enhance women's mobility and ease of access to public transport, has received widespread appreciation. The female passengers from both urban and rural areas are using the service to travel to schools, colleges, offices and marketplaces.

Bus stops now witness large turnouts, especially during peak hours—8 to 10 AM, midday, and

According to Smart City data, the daily ridership on electric buses has doubled since the scheme began. "Where earlier we saw around 20,000 to 21,000 people using the service, the number has now risen to more than 40,000," said an official.

Presently, more than 95 plus air-conditioned electric buses operate on more than 30 plus routes, carrying nearly 50,000 women passengers every day.

# **Srinagar's Cycle Sharing Project Under Lens**

JAMMU: The ambitious public bicycle sharing project rolled out in Srinagar under the Smart City Mission has come under scrutiny after official figures revealed that the scheme, which became operational in May 2023, has generated a meagre revenue of Rs 4.48 lakh, despite infrastructure and viability gap funding totalling a hefty Rs

The details were revealed in responses submitted by the administration in the Jammu and Kashmir Legislative Assembly to questions raised by legislators Shamim Firdous and Mushtaq Guroo. The disclosures have raised concerns regarding the project's sustainability and public reception.

According to the official data, Rs 9.06 crore has been spent on constructing dedicated cycle tracks in the Srinagar constituencies of Batamaloo, Hazratbal, and Lal Chowk. These tracks form part of broader urban renewal initiatives under the Smart City umbrella, including the Lakefront Development along the northern foreshore of Dal Lake and the Complete Street projects in Batamaloo and Lal Chowk.

In addition to the cycling infrastructure, the government has approved Rs 4.14 crore as viability gap funding for the bicycle sharing initiative, which is being executed through a public-private partnership (PPP) model. Of the approved amount, Rs 1.2 crore has already been released to the private operator managing the project. This operator is tasked with maintaining a fleet of 900 bicycles and 100 docking stations under a five-year agreement.

The bike-sharing service was officially launched on May 20, 2023. From its inauguration until now, the project has only generated Rs 4,48,333 from user fees, raising questions about public uptake and

operational viability.

The docking stations have been strategically placed across several key city zones, including Lal Chowk, Dal Gate, Hazratbal, Eidgah, Chanapora, and Bemina. The highest concentrations of these stations are found in Lal Chowk, Hazratbal, and Chanapora, selected in line with the Smart City Mission's focus on promoting non-motorised transport and improving last-mile connectivity.

However, despite the scale of investment and the intent to create an eco-friendly urban transport solution, the low revenue figures have triggered debate over the project's effectiveness and long-term feasibility.

All financial and project-related figures have been officially documented in responses submitted in the ongoing budget session of the J&K Legislative Assembly. The disclosures were made in response to queries raised by three lawmakers from Srinagar.





# Home Minister's Visit

he home minister Amit Shah's three-day visit to J&K comes at a time when the situation in the union territory has been most normal in years. That is, except the parts of Jammu where militancy has reared its head in recent years - albeit the violence that has emanated from it has remained peripheral to daily life. Most of the disturbance has been confined to the border areas or the hills. The UT's cities, towns and villages have by and large remained peaceful.

In Kashmir on the last day the visit, Home Minister on Tuesday directed security forces to ensure "zero infiltration" and complete eradication of terrorism, Chairing the meeting attended by Lt Governor Manoj Sinha, senior Army commanders, paramilitary chiefs, and intelligence officials, Shah stressed unified action and seamless coordination among security agencies to eliminate terrorist threats, especially in the Jammu region.

Earlier in the day, Shah reviewed the progress of developmental projects in the Union Territory and met with top civil administration officials, including Chief Minister Omar Abdullah and Chief Secretary Atul Dulloo. He also held a one-on-one meeting with the chief minister before the broader review.

Incidentally, on the same day, the three more separatist organizations pledged allegiance to the Constitution, a development highlighted by the home minister in a social media post. He termed it an endorsement of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision of a "Naya Kashmir" free from violence and hatred.

It was a packed day for the home minister, during which he also visited the family of DySP Humayun Bhat, who was martyred in an anti-terror operation in September 2023, accompanied by the LG and CM.

That said, while the home minister expressed satisfaction with the prevailing normalcy in the UT, especially in the Valley, he isn't oblivious to the persisting challenge of the militancy. To address this, he has outlined technology-driven 26 initiatives including anti-drone technology, tunnel identification and electronic surveillance to plug the Line of Control with Pakistan.

In a conspicuous omission, the home minister didn't talk about restoration of J&K statehood, nor about talks with Pakistan. However, while the centre has often held out assurances about reinstating statehood, it has been resolute about not engaging Pakistan unless the latter stops fomenting violence in the UT. And as the steady pacification of Kashmir shows, the centre doesn't now even feel the need to reach out to Pakistan except on its terms. This marks a profound transformation in the situation of the UT, something that hardly seemed to be imaginable just a few years ago.

id you know that tariffs, often dismissed as dry policy tools, have evolved into powerful instruments shaping the global financial landscape? Once used simply to protect domestic industries by taxing imported goods, tariffs today serve as strategic levers in international diplomacy and economic planning.

Take, for instance, the U.S.-China trade tensions during the Trump administration. Tariffs were not just about boosting local manufacturing—they were employed to challenge trade imbalances and exert geopolitical pressure. This strategic use of tariffs sent ripples through global markets, impacting investor sentiment and reshaping trade alliances.

Whenever tariffs are introduced or adjusted, uncertainty seeps into the financial markets. Companies that rely on imported raw materials or finished goods face rising input costs, leading to tighter profit margins. As a result, stock markets often respond with volatility, triggering investor concern. In such an environment, many turn to safer investment avenues, seeking to preserve capital during periods of turbulence.

One notable shift is the move from equities to bonds. When equity markets become volatile, the demand for bonds tends to increase. This surge in demand pushes bond yields lower, effec tively reducing interest rates. Interestingly, while tariffs might be seen as restrictive, this movement in the bond market can lower borrowing costs across the economy, offering a surprising counterbalance to the initial disruption.

# **Lines That Divide**

A prominent Indian lawmaker warns that the upcoming delimitation may tilt power toward the North, sparking a political rift with the South and threatening the country's federal balance.

n recent weeks, Indian politics have been roiled by controversy over something that hasn't happened yet: the government's redrawing of the boundaries of parliamentary constituencies, which is likely to happen within the next few years, after a new census is carried out. The problem, India's southern states argue, is that this will unfairly shift the balance of political power to northern states.

In India's Lok Sabha (the lower house of parliament), seats are generally apportioned according to population: more people usually means more seats. Since whoever controls a majority of seats in the Lok Sabha gets to form the government, a larger population amounts to a major advantage.

But unbridled population growth can come at the expense of prosperity and social progress. So, in 1976, India froze delimitation (the process of redrawing constituency boundaries), thereby assuring states that they could seek slower population growth without sacrificing political influence. The freeze was initially set to last until 2001, but was extended by constitutional amendment, meaning that today's boundaries are based on the 1971 census.

Since the freeze, India's southern states have brought fertility rates down to or below replacement levels, and have made considerable progress on their human-development indicators, including literacy rates, health care, maternal and infant mortality, and gender equality. The north performs worse in these areas, as well as in terms of caste discrimination, unemployment, and economic growth, but its population has continued to grow.

The freeze on delimitation always had a time limit: until the first census after 2026. And the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has indicated that, rather than ex-

population. Similarly, the European Union grants smaller member countries more seats in the European Parliament than their population share would warrant, under a principle called "degressive proportionality." Even in India, Goa, the smaller states of the northeast, and territories like the Andamans, Diu, and Lakshadweep have more MPs per capita than larger states.

India contains a vast diversity of languages, religions, demographic profiles, and levels of development. Moreover, under India's "quasi-federal" system, states wield a certain amount of power themselves. So, while equal representation is important, state ment's decisions.

Led by Tamil Nadu's chief minister, M.K. Stalin, southern Indian states have formed a Joint Action Committee to demand that the current arrangement be extended for another 25 years. But this arrangement does make India less democratic, because representation per citizen would not be equal. The problem is that changing the formula on the basis of a population census alone would be equally bad for Indian democracy, not least because it would undermine national harmony and cohesion.

If southerners feel politically disenfranchised, they might start

Whear in lectures that your children are a trial for you. Nobody ever explains this and probably none of us think of it beyond a certain point. Probably, because we were never taught to ponder over the holy book and instructed just to keep reading it without comprehension. That there is no good deed written for you when you read tafseer instead of the text. Why it is said so? Is it because they are going to be defiant? Headstrong teenagers who will not listen to their parents anymore? Prefer friends over family? Bring you shame by asking difficult questions? Holding stronger opinions than our society can digest? Act out?

The first question a newly-wed couple is asked post-wedding is when are they planning to have kids, not the next vacation. Having kids is sold in our society as the ultimate fulfiller. The ultimate goal of a woman's life. Like life is empty without having one and the sole purpose of getting married is having children.

So many women hear "Ami warai tchenei shoobie", without once thinking that this is beyond a couple's control and is only by the divine decree. Now there are multiple things wrong with this.

First, a couple should be given enough time to understand each other before they decide to bring another life into the world. Do we not hear it enough that having children tests a marriage like nothing else? So why are we adamant on sitting the test without proper preparation?

Give the couple some time and some years before they venture onto the next adventure. Maybe they discover they do not like each other much and decide to part ways without having to think of compromise due to having kids. Maybe they have a bucket list and want to tick off a couple of them before getting bound down with kids, their schedules and requirements. What if a sensible couple decides to perform Hajj first before having kids and the lady losing most of her strength during pregnancy and the rest in children.

Secondly, the couple is never told the reality about having kids. Having kids is talked about as if it is the ultimate achievement of life. Like some elixir without which life is empty and with which everything magically falls into place and life suddenly has meaning. Why?

Why cannot a couple feel satisfied with



their work. Setting up a venture together? Working to make lives in society better? Travelling together or by getting a pet? Why the obsession with kids? Why cannot each other's company be enough for them? For the ones who quote religious reasons, Quran mentions marriage in terms of finding peace, not for the purpose of procreation. Allah has made marriage a means of permissible company and enjoyment so that the couple can roam around, go to dinner dates and trips together. But that's what today's relationships are for, right? Marriages are not for fun and enjoyment in our society, they are for slavery and kids.

So why the trial?

Allah calls the initial years of motherhood "Wahnan ala wahn" (31:14), which talks about the period of pregnancy and initial years of motherhood. Allah calls the period weakness upon weakness. Women get lightheaded, nauseous, bodyaches, joint-pain, backaches and post delivery these all are accompanied by the exhaustion of labour/C-Sec, caring for the

baby, sleepless nights.

Nobody tells the married couple this. Nobody acknowledges how hard it is going to be once the baby comes. People will say, "Aesi ti tche shiur rachmit, sarie ratchaan", "yi kos baid kath tche, asi aeis 5 5 shuir assan", "eman tche aazi diaper, aeis aeis iman kapar daij lagaan, dohas aeis timai pewaan chalnie". blah blah blah

mai pewaan chalnie", blah blah blah. The same people who used to be hellbent on when is the baby coming start taunting the mother now. For having surgery, for using diapers, for bottle feeding, for any and everything they can find a fault in. For anything that the new mother is doing differently than them. That's what partly makes it difficult too.

What makes these kids, children a trial for parents is the utter exhaustion. The sleepless nights, the need to cater to the child even before your body has recovered from the trauma of labour and childbirth. The pain a mother feels when she starts breastfeeding. The effort, dread and exhaustion of trying to latch the child for proper feeding. The howling cries when the child gets colic. Diaper blowouts, enough to cause an urgent bath for the baby. The cold nights so that mother keeps worrying whether the child is warm enough. That one random relative who had cold but would not leave the child alone. The sheer load of mentally prepping and planning for the child. Nobody talks about this.

Everyone comes to say "bache ke baad ye tez hogayee hai", nobody understands

that all her energy, tolerance and patience is getting exhausted caring for the baby and keeping herself sane when she has no schedule for a proper rest. Not even hope. Nobody tells her to go sleep, we will take care of things. She is expected to take care of things while they keep an eye on a happy, well-fed and fresh diaper wearing baby. So, when does she get to take a break? An eye shut? A little me time where she can feel like herself again, even if for half an hour?

Nobody talks about the loss of identity a new mother faces. Nobody tells her she would not get time to even wash up properly. That she will have to come to terms with a different body and that it will be difficult looking into the mirror for a while. That her hair will fall off like leaves in autumn. That a diet too soon will impact the feeding of the baby.

Inside the marriage, intimacy takes a hit, spending time with each other takes a hit, being each other's top priority takes a hit. After a child, keeping up a marriage is more effort than anyone is willing to admit. More so because the preferred parent has to do everything as per the baby's schedule, including washroom visits and the other parent gets to keep their life as it was. It does not seem so fair and that gives rise to even further distance in the marriage than was the baby's fault. Even with today's fathers pitching in and changing that occasional diaper, they need to do much more for the mother to not feel being down in the ditches.

That is why children are a trial. You put your efforts into keeping this sweat pea alive, even at the cost of your own health, sleep and social life. Then one fine day once they are three or four or five years old, they start seeing themselves as an individual instead of an extension of you. Start voicing their opinions and want to do things their own way. And a good parent would acknowledge that and give them that space.

A good parent will ask their opinion once they are in their teens and let them live their life once they are older. This letting go of the child is your trial. It starts when a mother starts weaning a child, and ends at marriage.

As good parents, how many of us are ready to do all that work? How many of us are ready for this trial Allah set for us?

# The Desert is Coming

Once India's agricultural powerhouse, Punjab now faces severe water scarcity and desertification due to over-reliance on paddy and excessive groundwater extraction.

rowing concerns about the possibility of Punjab turning into a desert later in this century can scarcely be dismissed as alarmist any longer. The declining water levels in all the five rivers in the state and the dams not storing water to their full capacity are eloquent testimony that something is very wrong.

Availability of water in the rivers has decreased from 17-million-acrefeet to 13-million-acrefeet in recent years. The per capita usage of water in the state is also higher than in the rest of the country, 380 litres per day as against 150 litres elsewhere.

Experts blame the crisis on the emphasis on paddy cultivation, which yields higher returns. Indiscriminate use of pesticides and fertiliser and the growing demand for water to cultivate paddy as more and more farmers took to it, they say, led to the present precarious situation. The demand for water for agriculture has grown to 43.7 lakh hectare meter and 73 per cent of it are raised from ground water.

During the hearing of a PIL in the Punjab and Haryana High Court, a survey conducted in each block by the Central Ground Water Board in 2020 was cited. The survey concluded that the state's groundwater level would go down below 300 meters from the surface by 2039. Punjab Agricultural University (PAU) has been warning about this for the past several years. By studying monsoon data and rainfall patterns between 1971 and 2020. a research paper on climate change by this university stated that crops that use more water are creating conditions for 'desertification' by overcultivation, excessive exploitation of ground water, relatively little rainfall in the state despite the monsoon extending to four long months.

Waterlogged fields, a necessary requirement for cultivating paddy, gets layers of saline deposited from pesticides and chemical fertiliser. In the next cycle of cultivation farmers need more or the same level of water to deal with the salinity. In case of shortage of water in the next cycle, the land can potentially become barren. The soil requires rest just as human beings do; and excessive grazing of land, over-cultivation, mechanised transportation on the land too weaken the fertility of the soil and impacts productivity.

of the country.

What is worse is that the crisis is not going to affect Punjab alone or only the availability of food grains. Agriculture in the state also provides employment to about six lakh migrant workers. The crisis will not just affect the economy of Punjab but also that of Bihar and Uttar Pradesh, which provide a bulk of the workers and depend on foodgrains

What is prescribed is to replace wheat and rice as the principal crops in the state. Projects to break the crop cycle and recharge groundwater should be a priority in every village. Immediate and long-term action to arrest the decreasing water flow and pollution in the rivers of the state, removal of encroachments from the rivers and a ban on mining are the other urgent priorities. Sand mining needs to be supervised and regulated and strict action taken against factories that are discharging pollutants and the local bodies which routinely fail to take action against them.

The danger is huge and the risks cannot be glossed over because once the desert spreads, retrieving the land would take up several centuries. Notably, in 1985, 85 per cent of

Punjab boasted of adequate availability of water. Just 33 years later by 2018, 45 per cent of it was reported to have very little water and 6 per cent of the state had almost no water at all. Today, tubewells are being dug to depths of 300 to 1,000 feet. More than 14 lakh tubewells are said to have been installed in the state. No wonder ground water level is going down by an average of 50 centimetres every year.

Paddy was cultivated in the state in just 2.27 hectares in 1960. Rice was not a staple diet of the people and coarse grains, wheat, gram etc were grown and the harvest was retained for household consumption before getting distributed to the rest of the country. Since then paddy cultivation has grown to more than 30 lakh hectares.

In 2019, when the government realised the extent of this crisis, it made a law for paddy sowing and the sowing month was shifted from the scorching heat of May to June, hoping that the farmers' need for water would be fulfilled by nature. This has also increased the problem of stubble burning.

To make a bad situation worse, the rainy season is not only becoming unpredictable and getting delayed, it's becoming erratic too.

The Bhakra Beas Management Board (BBMB) recently issued a warning that stated that there is alarmingly water scarcity in the dam due to scanty rainfall and snowfall. On 20 November, 2024, the water level in the Bhakra dam was recorded at 16.33 feet, which was 15 feet less than the previous year. At the end of

December, only 63 per cent of the total storage capacity of the dam was full. The Pong Dam, which is another major reservoir, had even less water up to just 50 per cent of its capacity. The water level at Pong Dam was said to be hovering around 1,343 feet at the end of the year, which was apparently 18 feet less than the previous year in 2023. Less water in the dams results into greater exploitation of groundwater for agriculture and do-

mestic purposes.

A joint satellite survey by Punjab Soil Conservation and Central Ground Water Level Board revealed that if the state continued to exploit ground water at the current pace, then in the next 18 years, only five per cent of the area would have ground water left. All ground water sources are completely exhausted. The looming drinking water crisis will be exacerbated by the land turning rapidly into sand.

A research paper by ISRO shows that the Thar Desert is spreading out of Rajasthan and taking roots in several neighbouring states. In 1996, the area of Thar was 1 lakh 96 thousand 150 square kilo meters which has now expanded to 2 lakh 8 thousand 110 square kilo meters. Out of the total 328.73 million acres of land in India, 105.19 million acres of land is in Thar. But barrenness has set in while 82.18 million hectares of land is turning into desert.

In Bhatinda, Mansa, Moga, Ferozepur, Muktsar and Faridkot, radioactive elements in the soil are reported to have crossed the acceptable limits and this is one of the telltale signs of the advancing desert. Government agencies, to be fair, are trying to make people aware of the water crisis arising largely due to paddy cultivation. This unfortunately is meeting with limited success.

### **Waqf Act Sparks**

opposition legislators, including Sheikh

When Parra attempted to enter the well of the House, the Speaker directed Marshals to evict him.

"I was demanding passage of the resolution in the House over the Bill. It is unfortunate on the part of the Speaker to remove me from the House. This is a Muslim majority region. We have over 60 Muslim legislators in the House, but we cannot discuss and pass the resolution," he told reporters outside the House.

Nine members of the NC, Congress, and Independent MLAs had submitted notices to the Speaker to adjourn business for holding a discussion on the issue on Monday. The House was adjourned for the day after two adjournments due to the pandemonium.

Amid noisy scenes, NC members Nazir Gurezi, Salman Sagar, and Tanvir Sadiq urged the Speaker to allow the discussion, considering the sentiments of the members as it pertained to a religious matter.

"We want to discuss the issue. It is our reli-

"We want to discuss the issue. It is our religious matter. This is a Muslim-majority state. Please allow the discussion," Gurezi said.

The Speaker said that the motion was disallowed as the matter was sub-judice. "You cannot undo what Parliament has done. No discussion can be held on this. I have not allowed any discussion," the Speaker said.

As pandemonium broke out in the House, the Speaker initially adjourned the proceedings for 30 minutes. The ruckus continued in the House for over 12 minutes.

When the House reassembled after the adjournment, treasury benches and PDP members continued to demand a discussion on the issue

Two BJP legislators also walked into the Well of the House and staged a sit-in amid chaotic scenes in the Jammu and Kashmir Assembly.

The MLAs -- Rajiv Jasrotia and Pawan Gupta -- staged the protest in front of the opposition benches, holding question papers in their hands even as the marshals were busy holding back several protesting members of the National Conference, Congress and PDP from entering the Well.

Speaker Abdul Rahim Rather tried to persuade the members to return to their seats, and later adjourned the House for the full day.

Jasrotia, a former minister and two-time MLA, accused the National Conference (NC) of deliberately creating a ruckus on the issue of the Waqf (Amendment) Act to disrupt private members' bills and resolutions.

"I forwarded a question having five parts concerning relief and rehabilitation of 1947, 1965 and 1971 refugees from Pakistan-occupied Jammu and Kashmir (PoJK). But the first four parts of the question were not answered by the government," he said.

The BJP leader also claimed that there were thousands of refugee families from PoJK who were not provided any relief by the government.

"I was planning to corner the government for the incomplete answers, but the continuous protest by the NC members stalled the Question Hour for the second day. This House has no mandate to discuss the Waqf law after Parliament passed the Bill and the president put her stamp on it," Jasrotia said.

He also accused the NC of playing to the gallery on the "name of religion", and trying to hoodwink the public.

The speaker should have acted tough against the protesting NC members and marshalled them out to facilitate smooth functioning of the House, the BJP MLA from Jasrota said.

"They (NC members) are challenging the authority of the speaker who had given his ruling on the adjournment motions moved by the members. Not taking action against them has fully exposed the NC before the public," he claimed.

Gupta, also a former minister and a twotime MLA, said he was disappointed after the Question Hour was "wasted" once again.

"I was supposed to get a reply from the government to my question related to public issues. We have been chosen by the people to resolve their issue, but adjourning the House serves no purpose. The speaker should have thrown them out to run the House smoothly," Gupta said.

Another BJP leader, Sham Lal Sharma, said important business has been lost over the past two days.

"We must respect the chair. It was unfortunate that the treasury benches were on their feet against the speaker's ruling. We feel it was a fixed match, as the speaker had the power to evict them like he did with us in the previous session in Srinagar," Sharma said.

Some important private member bills such as regularisation of unauthorised colonies were supposed to be presented in the House but now they have to wait for six more months, which is not in the interest of the public.

The Jammu and Kashmir government on Tuesday said it has concerns over the Waqf Amendment Act and urged Speaker Abdul Rahim Rather to hold a discussion on it in the House.

"This government is chosen by the people. Members have been elected by the people. If it is the concern of the members, it is the concern of the government too. We cannot say it is not the concern of the government," Deputy Chief Minister Surinder Choudhary told the House amid the uproar.

He said the members wanted a discussion on the issue as it concerned most members of the House. "We should listen to them. They should be allowed to speak on the issue," he said.

He was reacting to Speaker Abdul Rahim Rather's ruling in the House that the issue, apart from being sub-judice, cannot be taken up for discussion as it is not the concern of the government.

Referring to Section 58, sub-rule 9, the Speaker said, "The motion shall not relate to a matter which is not primarily the concern of the government. If it is not the concern of this government, the motion cannot be taken up."

This triggered massive protests from members, who thumped desks and raised slogans.

bers, who thumped desks and raised slogans. Responding to him, Minister for Agriculture Javed Dar and Minister Sakina Itoo said it is the concern of the government.

Nazir Gurezi of the NC said the Supreme Court has not admitted the matter as no notices have been issued. "Keeping this in view, a discussion can be held," he said.

However, BJP member Sham Lal Sharma and Peoples Conference member Sajad Lone told the protesting treasury benches to bring a noconfidence motion to remove the Speaker.

As the ruckus continued, the Speaker adjourned the House till 1 pm.

After House proceedings resumed, NC member Mubarak Gul stood up from his bench and urged the Speaker to allow a discussion on this important issue, saying that it involved religious sentiments.

"We seek debate. Let every member across the House speak on it. It is a sensitive issue. It is a religious issue. Some have protested in several places across the country. These are concerns for all of us," Gul said in the house.

Seeking a debate on the matter, he said it would be good to allow members to speak on

However, BJP member Sham Lal Sharma opposed the discussion and also the adjournment of the House, stating that the Speaker had given his ruling and rejected the adjournment motion according to the rule book.

"The government has also joined them, which wasn't the case in the past. The House is not being allowed to function by the treasury benches," he said.

Sharma said if members and the government do not have faith in the Speaker, they should bring a no-confidence motion to remove him. "Let a new Speaker decide over it," he said.

The treasury benches continued their protests, saying they wanted an adjournment and a discussion on the Act.

The BJP raised slogans like "Gundagardi nahi chalegi", "No scope for discussion" and "Dramabazi band karo", which were countered by the NC members for a few minutes.

The Speaker said his ruling was final and would not be changed. He then adjourned the House for the day.

#### **Lone Leads**

for the second straight day on the issue, prompting the Speaker to adjourn the House initially for 30 minutes shortly after the start of the day's business. The House was later adjourned till 1 pm.

On Monday when the House assembled after a 12-day recess, it descended into chaos with religious and jingoistic sloganeering after the Speaker rejected an adjournment motion, moved by the ruling National Conference members, to discuss the Waqf (Amendment) Act, saying the matter was sub-judice.

"In accordance with Rule 215(A) of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the Jammu & Kashmir Legislative Assembly, we hereby submit this notice of our intention to move a resolution for the removal of the Speaker of the Assembly.

"This decision stems from widespread outrage within the House over the Speaker's actions, including the rejection of discussions on an adjournment motion and the refusal to entertain a resolution brought forward by opposition parties. Such conduct undermines the democratic principles and procedures governing this esteemed institution, prompting this resolution to address the matter," Lone, MLA from Handwara, said in a letter addressed to the secretary of the Assembly.

PDP legislators Fayaz Ahmad Mir (Kupwara) and Rafiq Ahmad Naik (Tral) are the other two signatories of the letter.

"We have presented a no-confidence motion against the Speaker. He has become an impediment in voicing our opinion against the Waqf bill," Lone said in a post on X, also making the letter public.

Talking to reporters outside the Assembly, Lone requested protesting National Conference members to support the motion against the

"We appeal NC members to support the motion. If they don't (support), they will be exposed. How it can be tangible that a National Conference legislator who is the Speaker disallows the adjournment motion and other members of the party are protesting? The whole world is watching this drama," Lone said.

He said they are not saying "we are going to change the law but at least we can register our protest on behalf of the only Muslim-majority region of the country."

The National Conference made it clear that it would not support the no-confidence motion. Talking to reporters after the House was adjourned, NC legislator Salman Sagar said his party has no plans to back the motion. "No, not at all," Sagar replied bluntly when asked about their stance on the issue.

had decided to disallow it in line with the rules and will not change his ruling. Asked about the no-confidence motion moved by three opposition legislators led by Peoples Conference leader Sajad Gani Lone, Rather told reporters they are welcome to bring it before the House, which will decide.

"What is the problem? They have this right and the House will decide its fate. If the House has no confidence, then I have no right to be there," the Speaker said.

He advised the protesting members of the ruling National Conference-led alliance and opposition PDP and Peoples Conference besides some independents to allow the smooth functioning of the House in the larger interest of the public.

The Speaker adjourned the House for the second straight day amid pandemonium as members demanded a discussion on the Waqf Amendment act and protested against his decision to disallow notices of adjournment

On Deputy Chief Minister Surinder Choudhary and other ministers joining the protesting members in pressing for a discussion on the Act, he said it did not matter to him

who was raising the demand.

"Whether it is the government, minister, opposition members or somebody else, I have to weigh the statement as per the rules to take a call. If the rules do not allow it, it hardly

matters to me who is making the statement. I have made a decision after going through the rules and I will not change my decision," Rather said

The Speaker disallowed two notices of adjournment motions from nine members regarding discussion on the Waqf Amendment Act, citing that the matter is sub-judice.

"The matter has been challenged before the Supreme Court, so the notices cannot be admitted because as per rule 58(vii) (which states that) the motion shall not deal with any matter which is under adjudication by a court of law having jurisdiction in any part of India," the Speaker told the House on Monday, drawing protests from members.

Some members objected to this decision of the Speaker stating that the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly has passed a resolution against the proposed Waqf Bill and the House should act accordingly.

In response to this, the Speaker informed the House that the matter was not sub-judice at that point. (PTI)

advocate, and Jammu and Kashmir Freedom Movement, headed by Mohd Sharief Sartaj.

When the groups made the announcement on March 25, Shah had said the unifying policies of the Modi government have "tossed" separatism out of Jammu and Kashmir.

Two days later, two more constituents of Hurriyat Conference -- Jammu and Kashmir Tahreeqi Isteqlal and Jammu and Kashmir Tahreek-I-Istiqamat -- announced their disassociation from Hurriyat.

The J&K Tehreeqi Isteqlal is headed by Gulam Nabi Sofi and J&K Tehreek-I-Istiqaamat is led by Ghulam Nabi War.

#### Para's Bill On

rejected an adjournment motion moved by the National Conference to discuss the Waqf (Amendment) Act, saying the matter was subjudice.

In a notice to the assembly secretary, Para said he intended to move the Jammu and Kashmir Civil Services (Special Provisions for Regularization of Adhoc, Daily Wagers, Need Based and Other Temporary Workers Bill, 2025, under relevant provisions of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the Legislative Assembly.

In the preamble of the Bill, the Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) leader said thousands of daily wagers, ad hoc, contractual and other temporary employees had dedicated more than eight years or more of their lives in providing essential services, often under precarious and insecure employment conditions.

"...whereas their service has been crucial to the functioning of various government departments, making them integral to public welfare and development initiatives; it is a constitutional obligation and moral imperative to recognise and humanise their contributions by ensuring job security, financial stability, and social dignity as part of welfare, social security and social justice," according to the Bill.

In his order, Sinha has given his nod to the Bill for consideration by the assembly.

"In pursuance of Section 36(1) of the Jammu and Kashmir Reorganisation Act, 2019, I, Manoj Sinha, lieutenant governor of the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir, hereby recommend the introduction and consideration by the Legislative Assembly for the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir of the Bill styled as the Jammu and Kashmir Civil Services (Special Provisions for Regularization of Adhoc, Daily Wagers, Need Based and Other Temporary Workers Bill, 2025," according to the order.

be listed for hearing before a bench on April 15 though it is not reflected on the apex court website as of now.

On April 7, a bench headed by Chief Justice Sanjiv Khanna assured senior advocate Kapil Sibal, appearing for Jamiat Ulama-i-Hind, to consider listing the petitions.

President Droupadi Murmu on April 5 gave her assent to the Waqf (Amendment) Bill, 2025, which was passed by Parliament after heated debates in both houses.

he bill was passed in the Rajya Sabha with 128 members voting in favour and 95 opposing it. It was cleared by the Lok Sabha with 288 members supporting it and 232 against it.

The Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (DMK), Congress MPs Imran Pratapgarhi and Mohammad Jawed, AIMIM leader Asaduddin Owaisi, RJD MPs Manoj Jha and Faiyaz Ahmad, AAP MLA Amanatullah Khan have also filed petitions in the apex court challenging the validity of the Act.

The DMK moved the top court through its deputy general secretary A Raja and said in a press release, "Despite widespread opposition, the Waqf Amendment Bill, 2025 was passed by the union government without proper consideration of the objections raised by the members of the IPC and the other stakeholders."

The party said the immediate implementation of the Waqf (Amendment) Act, 2025 infringes and prejudices the rights of about 50 lakh Muslims in Tamil Nadu and 20 crore Muslims in the other parts of the country.

The AIMPLB filed the plea in the top court late April 6.

In a press statement, SQR Ilyas, the AIMPLB spokesperson, said the petition strongly objected to the amendments passed by Parliament for being "arbitrary, discriminatory and based on exclusion".

The amendments, it said, not only violated the fundamental rights guaranteed under Articles 25 and 26 of the Constitution of India but also clearly revealed the government's intention to take complete control over the administration of Waqf, therefore, sidelining the Muslim minority from managing their own religious endowments.

Articles 25 and 26 of the Constitution ensure freedom of conscience, the right to practice, propagate religion, and the right to establish and manage institu-

tions for religious and charitable purposes, it said.

The plea is settled by advocate M R Shamshad, with advocate-on-record Talha Abdul Rahman representing the Muslim personal law board, through its General Secretary Maulana Fazlur Raheem Mujaddidi.

Jamiat Ulamai-Hind also filed a
petition in the apex
court, claiming it
was a "dangerous
conspiracy" to strip
Muslims of their religious freedom.

In its petition, Jamiat said the law was a "direct attack on the country's Constitution, which not only provides equal rights to its citizens but also grants them complete religious freedom".

In its separate plea filed in the top court, Samastha Kerala Jamiathul Ulema, a religious organisation of Sunni Muslim scholars and clerics in Kerala, has claimed the Act was a "blatant intrusion" into the rights of a religious denomination to manage its own affairs in the matter of religion.

Jawed's plea alleged the Act imposed "arbitrary restrictions" on Waqf properties and their management, undermining the Muslim community's religious autonomy.

The petition, filed through advocate Anas

Tanwir, said the law discriminated against the Muslim community by "imposing restrictions that are not present in the governance of other religious endowments".

In a separate plea, Owaisi said the bill took away from Waqfs various protection which are accorded to Waqfs and Hindus, Jain and Sikh religious and charitable endowments alike.

"This diminishing of the protection given to Waqfs while retaining them for religious and charitable endowments of other religions constitutes hostile discrimination against Muslims and is violative of Articles 14 and 15 of the Constitution, which prohibit discrimination on the grounds of religion," said Owaisi's plea, filed through advocate Lzafeer Ahmad.

NGO Association for the Protection of Civil Rights also filed a petition in the apex court challenging the constitutional validity of the Act.

AAP MLA Amanatullah Khan sought the law declared as unconstitutional, being violative of "Articles 14, 15, 21, 25, 26, 29, 30 and 300-A of

# the Constitution". **J&K Logs Over**

The minister highlighted the steps taken by the H&ME Department, which include the implementation of the comprehensive Drug De-Addiction Policy (2019), issued via Government Order No. 41-HME of 2019 dated 11.01.2019. The policy outlines detailed measures to address the problem and defines the roles of all stakeholders and government departments.

Currently, there are 20 De-Addiction Centres across all districts of the UT of J&K—11 in the Kashmir Division and 9 in Jammu Division—providing wide coverage and easier access to treatment. OPD services are available in all these centres, and IPD facilities have been established in all nine Government Medical Colleges (GMCs) of the UT. All aspects of the National Action Plan for Drug Demand Reduction (NAPDDR 2018–23) are being implemented in J&K, she added.

Itoo said the Social Welfare Department has adopted an aggressive approach to eradicate the drug menace and ensure the rehabilitation of victims. "Three drug de-addiction centres, recognised by the government, are currently functional in Rajouri, Kulgam, and Bandipora districts, and are being run by NGOs in government institutions/buildings," she said.

The minister added that three ODICs (Outreach and Drop-in Centres) are functional—one each in Jammu, Srinagar, and Kupwara—and two CPLIs (Community Peer-Led Interventions) are operational in Jammu and Srinagar. She said proposals for the establishment of three more drug de-addiction centres in Udhampur, Reasi, and Ramban, to be run through District Red Cross Societies, have been submitted to the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India, for approval and sanction.

However, Itoo added that there is no exclusive drug addiction or rehabilitation centre established specifically for women. "Nevertheless, treatment and necessary support for rehabilitation is being provided to drug addicts, including both men and women," she

# J&K Sees 32% Rise In SC/ST Judges Since 2020: Union Law Ministry

SRINAGAR: Jammu and Kashmir has witnessed a steady increase in the number of Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST) judicial officers in its district and subordinate courts over the past five years, marking a 32 percent rise since 2020, according to data released by

the Union Law Ministry.
As per the figures, the total number of SC/ST judges rose from 40 in 2020 to 53 by April 2025, the highest recorded in

this time frame. As of December 31, 2020, the UT had 40 SC/ST judges: 9 SC and 6 ST Judges at the Civil Judge (Junior Division) level, 10 SC and 4 ST Judges at the Civil Judge (Senior Division) level and 5 SC and 6 ST Judges at the District Judge level.

The numbers remained unchanged in 2021, with minor

shifts in postings: 7 SC and 9 ST Judges at the Junior Division level, 5 SC and 6 ST Judges at the Senior Division, and 8 SC and 5 ST Judges as District

Judges. In 2022, there were 39 SC/ ST officers: 9 SC and 8 ST at Junior Division, 6 each from SC and ST at Senior Division, and 7 SC and 3 ST Judges in District

A slight decline was reported in 2023, with the strength reduced to 38-comprising

9 SC and 7 ST at Junior Division, 6 each at Senior Division, and 5 SC and 3 ST District Judges.

However, the representation rose again by the end of 2024 to 54 officers: 13 SC and 11 ST at Junior Division, 6 SC and 7 ST at Senior Division, and 9 SC and 8 ST as District Judges.

# **Over 4 Lakh Kanals Of State Land Under Illegal Occupation: Govt**

SRINAGAR: The Jammu and Kashmir government has revealed that an alarming 4,28,204 Kanals and 13 Marlas of state and kahcharai land is currently under illegal occupation across the Union Territory.

In a detailed response to a query raised by MLA Farooq Ahmad Shah, the Minister Incharge, while addressing the House, said that concrete steps have been initiated to reclaim the encroached land. "All en-

tries in the name of illegal occupants have been expunged," the minister stated.

The government informed that special eviction drives are being conducted on a continuous basis to retrieve encroached land. Furthermore, a total of 3,555 cases have been approved for land use change, allowing for its utilisation in commercial, industrial, and

residential projects. The minister also revealed that 40,151 Kanals and 17.5 Marlas of land have been transferred to the Industries and Commerce Department across various regions in Jammu and Kashmir.

Specifically, in the tourist hotspot of Gulmarg, 94 Kanals of land have been transferred-50 Kanals in Hardubani village and 44 Kanals in Lalpora village, the minister

These revelations highlight the extent of illegal occupation and the government's ongoing efforts to recover public land for developmental use.

# **CHC Tral Not Upgraded Despite Decade-Old Demand**

SRINAGAR: The Jammu and Kashmir government on Tuesday stated that the Community Health Centre (CHC) Tral in South Kashmir's Pulwama district has not yet been upgraded to the status of a Sub-District Hospital (SDH), despite the matter being raised nearly a decade ago during a District Board meeting. The government also clarified there is no shortage of medical staff at Primary Health Centres (PHCs)

in Aripal, Dadsara and Kahlil.
In response to a question
posed by MLA Tral Rafiq Ahmad Naik, the Minister for Health and Medical Education, Sakina Itoo, said that CHC Tral has not been granted SDH status.

"At present, austerity measures issued by the Finance Department are in force. Therefore, J&K is focusing on the consolidation of existing health facilities. Around 4,000 health institutes at various levels-Primary, Secondary, and Tertiary already exist. Jammu and Kashmir ranks among the top Union Territories and larger states in terms of health institution density," she said.

Citing a 2023 report of the Ministry of Health and Fam-

ily Welfare (MoHFW), Government of India, the minister said J&K has one health institution for every 3,500 persons, compared to the national average of one for every 6,000.

She added that feasibility surveys for creating new PHCs, NTPHCs, SDHs, and sub-centres are carried out by concerned offices, and if their findings align with the Indian Public Health Standards (IPHS) norms, the proposals are then forwarded for further consideration and approval.

Addressing concerns regarding vacancies at CHC Tral, the minister informed the House that two Medical Officers with postgraduate degrees in Surgery are currently working as consultant surgeons at the facility. Similarly, three Medical Officers with postgraduate degrees or diplomas in Gynaecology are delivering gynaecological services at the centre.

"As for the Radiologist post, it has not yet been sanctioned for CHC Tral. However, Dr Zaffer Iqbal, a Medical Officer trained in ultrasonography (USG), is presently handling the responsibility. In addition, Dr Irshad Ahmad Malik, a Radiologist posted at District Hospital Pulwama, visits CHC Tral every Saturday to provide USG services," she said.

The Minister further clarified that PHCs in Aripal, Dadsara and Kahlil do not face a shortage of medical or paramedical staff.

"Sanctioned posts at the respective NTPHCs have been filled, though there are a few vacancies including Senior Pharmacists at NTPHC Satoora and Batagund, FMPHW at NTPHC Noorpora, and a Safaiwala at NTPHC Chandrigam," she added.

On the matter of future staffing, the minister said that vacancies arising due to retirement or promotion will be referred to the concerned recruiting agencies for timely filling, to maintain optimal staff strength.

"There is no Trauma Centre sanctioned at Awantipora. However, a new G+3 type building for PHC Awantipora has been approved under KLC funds," she added.

Regarding the proposal for a dispensary at Bus Stand Tral, the Minister stated, "No such proposal could be moved or forwarded due to ineligibility under IPHS norms, as the CHC/ SDH Tral is located just 0.5 km away from Batagund, Tral."
