LPG Price Up Rs 50, CNG By Re 1 **Excise Duty Hiked On Petrol, Diesel**

New Delhi: The domestic cooking gas LPG price on Monday was hiked by a steep Rs 50 per cylinder across India and CNG by Re 1 per kg, while the government raised taxes on petrol and diesel to shore up its revenues.

The increase in cooking gas price will be for the Ujjawala poor beneficiaries who got LPG connection free of cost - and general users, and will be effective from April 8 and has been necessitated due to the rise in input cost, Oil Minister Hardeep Singh Puri said.

Cooking gas for Ujjawala us-ers will cost Rs 553 per 14.2-kg cylinder from the current Rs 503 in the national capital. The same for general users will now cost Rs 853.

The rates, which vary from state to state depending on local incidence of taxes, were last revised in March last year when they were cut by Rs 100.

Also, CNG prices were hiked by Re 1 per kg in the national capital and adjoining cities after the government last week raised input natural gas prices by almost 4 per cent.

Study Suggests Humans Could Have Lower Threshold For Extreme Heat Than Earlier Thought

umans could have a lower threshold for extreme heat than previously thought, researchers have found - a study result that they said can help cities prepare for summers in a warmer world.

The team from the University of Ottawa, Canada, exposed 12 volunteers to extreme heat and humidity to identify the point at which thermoregulation -- how one is able to maintain a

stable body temperature -- becomes impossible. The participants were subjected to

42 degrees Celsius with 57 per cent humidity, representing a humidex, or 'real feel', of 62 degrees Celsius. "The results were clear. The participants' core temperature streamed upwards unabated, and many participants were unable to finish the nineĥour exposure. These data provide the first direct validation of thermal step protocols, which have been used to estimate upper limits for thermoregulation for nearly 50 years," lead researcher Robert D Meade, former senior postdoctoral fellow at the University of Ottawa, said. "It was projected that core temperatures associated with heat stroke (40.2 degrees Celsius) would occur within 10 hours," the authors wrote in the study published in the journal 'Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences'. 'Thermal-step protocols' involve exposing individuals to controlled, increasing temperatures and humidity to assess their thermoregulation and survivability limits.

The study can help understand humans' limits to withstanding extreme heat, thereby guiding health policies



and public safety measures, and help cities prepare for hotter summers, the team said

"Our findings (are) especially timely, given estimated limits for thermoregulation are being increasingly incorporated into large scale climate modelling. They also underscore the physiological strain experienced during prolonged exposure to extreme heat, which is becoming more common due to climate change," Meade said.

"By integrating physiological data with climate models, we hope to better predict and prepare for heat-related health issues," co-lead researcher Glen Kenny, a professor of physiology at the University of Ottawa's Faculty of Health Sciences, said. Many of the world's regions have been projected to experience heat

and humidity levels exceeding what is considered safe for humans. A study, led by King's College London, estimated that about six per cent of the world's land could see hot conditions exceeding tolerable limits for young adults, with older ones at more risk. South Asia is expected to be among the worst-affected regions, according to the study published in February in 'Nature Reviews Earth and Environment'.

Kenny said, "Our research provided important data supporting recent suggestions that the conditions under which humans can effectively regulate their body temperature are actually much lower than earlier models suggested."

"This is critical information as we face increasing global temperatures," Kenny added.



Why Saudi Temporarily **Banned Visas For India**, **13 Other Countries**

Srinagar: In a bid to streamline travel and reduce logistical bottlenecks ahead of the upcoming Hajj season, Saudi Arabia has revised its visa issuance policies, significantly narrowing eligibility for its electronic transit visa (e-stopover visa) and temporarily suspending short-term visas for citizens of 14 countries.

The Saudi Civil Aviation Authority has announced that the e-stopover visa — a convenient option for travelers transiting through the Kingdom — will now be issued only to passengers arriving from or departing to countries designated as "Group A." The revised list includes 18 countries:

Canada, United States, Austria, Cyprus, France, Germany, Greece, Italy, Netherlands, Spain, Switzerland, United Kingdom, China (including Hong Kong and Macau), Malaysia, Maldives, Singapore, Thailand, Turkey, and Mauritius.

Travelers from these nations will continue to benefit from the streamlined e-stopover visa process, while others are now excluded under the updated policy.

Temporary Visa Suspension for 14 Countries

In a separate but related move, Saudi authorities have imposed a temporary halt on issuing new short-term visas — including single- and multiple-entry business visit visas, e-tourist visas, and family visit visas - to nationals of the following 14 countries:

India, Egypt, Pakistan, Yemen, Tunisia, Morocco, Jordan, Nigeria, Algeria, Indonesia, Iraq,

Sudan, Bangladesh, and Libya. The suspension will take

effect from April 13, 2025, and remains in place as part of measures to manage crowd control and ensure safety during the Hajj period. Individuals from the affected countries who already possess valid visas may still enter the Kingdom up to April 13 but must exit by April 29, 2025.

Preventing Hajj Misuse of Non-Pilgrimage Visas

These new regulations follow challenges observed during the last Hajj season, where many pilgrims reportedly entered Saudi Arabia using non-Hajj visas, contributing to severe overcrowding and logistical difficulties.

Basil Al Sisi, a member of Egypt's Chamber of Tourism Companies, stated in a televised interview that the policy reflects lessons learned from the previous vear's pilgrimage chaos. "Authorities have identified the countries that contributed to the crisis last year," he noted, emphasizing the misuse of tourist or visit visas for Hajj purposes.

New Umrah Visa Timeline

Further clarifying pilgrimage travel, Saudi officials announced a standardized timeline for Umrah visa issuance:

Start: 14th of Dhu Al Hijjah End: 1st of Shawwal

The new guidelines form part of the Kingdom's broader efforts to maintain order, enhance pilgrim safety, and ensure that all religious travel is properly coordinated through appropriate channels.



Muslim Law Board Moves Supreme Court Against Waqf Bill

New Delhi: The All India Muslim Personal Law Board has moved the Supreme Court against the constitutional validity of the

Waqf (Amendment) Act, 2025. Earlier in the day, a bench comprising Chief Justice Sanjiv Khanna and Justices Sanjay Kumar and K V Viswanathan agreed to consider, listing for an urgent hearing, the plea of Jamiat Ulama-i-Hind, AIMIM leader Asaduddin Owaisi and others, including Congress MP Moham-

mad Jawed and AAP MLA Amanatullah Khan on the issue. President Droupadi Murmu on April 5 gave her assent to the Waqf (Amendment) Bill,

2025, which was passed by Parliament after heated debates in both houses. The All India Muslim Personal Law Board (AIMPLB) filed the

plea in the top court late April 6. In a press statement, SQR Ilyas, the AIMPLB spokesperson, said the petition strongly objected to the amendments passed by Parliament for being "arbitrary, discriminatory and based on exclusion"

The amendments, it said, not only violated the fundamental rights guaranteed under Articles 25 and 26 of the Constitution of India but also clearly revealed the government's intention to take complete control over the administration of Waqf, therefore, sidelining the Muslim minority from managing their own religious endowments

Articles 25 and 26 of the Constitution ensure freedom of conscience, the right to practice, propagate religion, and the right to establish and manage institutions for religious and charitable purposes, it said.

The newly-enacted law deprives Muslims of these fundamental rights, it added.

"The amendments regarding the selection of members of the Central Waqf Council and Waqf Boards stand as stark proof of this deprivation. Additionally, the five-year requirement for a

waqif (donor) to be a practising Muslim contradicts both the Indian legal framework and Article 14 and 25 of the Constitution, as well as Islamic Shariah principles," the statement said.

Describing the law as discriminatory and inconsistent with Article 14 of the Constitution, the press release said the rights and protections afforded to the endowments of other recommunities-Hindus, ligious Sikhs, Christians, Jains and Buddhists-were denied to Muslim Waqf, Awqaf.

The board said the top court being "the guardian of constitutional rights" should annul these "controversial amendments, uphold the sanctity of the Constitution" and the Muslim minority rights from "being trampled upon".

The plea is settled by advocate M R Shamshad, with advocate-on-record Talha Abdul Rahman representing the Muslim personal law board, through its General Secretary Maulana Fazlur Raheem Mujaddidi.

"Through widespread, deliberate destruction, the military laid the groundwork for future Israeli control of the area," said the group.

"Be it summer or winter. we follow a proper plan for the inmates according to the Tihar Jail manual. We will provide

two lemons every day to each inmate for three months --April, May, and June -- to help keep their bodies hydrated,

the official told PTI. A sufficient quantity of Oral Rehydration Solution (ORS) has been procured to keep prisoners hydrated, he added.

The jail authorities have also planned to install heat-resistant sheets inside the cells to help maintain the temperature a few degrees lower.

"These sheets are very helpful during the summer as they keep the cell temperature

Minister Rekha Gupta has announced plans to shift Tihar Jail to the outskirts of the city, allocating Rs 10 crore in the 2025-26 budget for surveys and consultancy services related to the relocation.

The official said that no inmate is treated as "special" inside the prison.

"We strictly follow the jail manual. We don't provide any special facilities to any of the inmates. However, we closely monitor inmates aged 60 and above. Doctors check them daily," he said.

Inmates get only roomtemperature water, and no water coolers are allowed inside the premises.

FIR Against 'Fake' Cardiologist After 7 Deaths In MP Hospital

olice have registered a case against a 'fake' cardiologist at a missionary hospital in Madhva Pradesh's Damoh district, following the deaths of seven persons who were allegedly being treated by him, officials said on Monday.

A team from the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) will reach Damoh on Monday and camp till Wednesday to investigate the matter.

The police registered a First Information Report (FIR) on Sunday midnight against the accused, identified as Dr Narendra John Camm, based on a complaint lodged by Damoh district's Chief Medical and Health Officer (CMHO) MK Jain, the officials said.

According to the complaint, Camm performed angiography and angioplasty procedures at Mission Hospital without being registered with the Madhya Pradesh Medical Council.

"The doctor's registration number is not displayed on any of his medical documents, which appears to be suspicious prima facie. No doctor can provide services in Madhya Pradesh without registration," the FIR stated.

A team of doctors launched an investigated following a letter from the district collector, and the hospital management said Camm had already left the medical facility, it mentioned.

The hospital manager provided documents related to the doctor's degree. However, the investigation team prima facie could not find the registration number of any medical council or university, which is generally mentioned in the documents.



As per documents of the doctor concerned presented by the Mission Hospital, his medical registration certificate has been issued by the Andhra Pradesh Medical Council. But the name of Dr Narendra John Camm does not appear in the registration on the council's official website, thus it seems suspicious at first sight, the FIR stated.

The case has been registered against the accused under Sections 315 (4) (dishonest misappropriation), 338 (forgery), 336 (3) (creating or altering documents or electronic records with fraudulent intent). 340 (2) (forged documents and electronic records) and 3 (5) (joint criminal liability when a criminal act is committed by several persons in furtherance of a common intention) under the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita.

As per a complaint lodged earlier by a local resident with the NHRC, the person, using the name Dr N John Camm, who was said to be working at the hospital, had shown himself to be educated and trained from abroad.

Man Steals Rs 2.45 Lakh From Madhya **Pradesh Shop, Leaves Apology Letter**

man who stole Rs 2.45 lakh from a shop in Madhya Pradesh's Khargone district left behind a letter seeking forgiveness for the act committed on Ram Navami, his struggles with debt and constant hounding by creditors as well a promise to return the amount in six months, a police official said on Monday.

The theft took place at the shop of Jujar Ali Bohra in Jamidar Mohalla under Kotwali police station limits in the intervening night of Sunday and Monday, Kotwali police station assistant sub-inspector Arshad Khan said.

"The thief left behind a typed letter in which he addressed the shop owner as Jujar Bhai. The shop owner has told us he had kept Rs 2.84 lakh in a bag, of which around Rs 2.45 lakh was stolen, while Rs 38,000 remained. In the letter, the culprit has sought forgiveness for the act, which he committed on Ram Navami," inspector Khan said.

"He has said he stays in the neighbourhood. He claimed he had a lot of debt and creditors were visiting him daily. He wrote that he didn't want to resort to stealing but had no option. He has claimed he has taken only what he required while leaving the rest in the bag itself. He has promised to pay back in six months and said the shop owner was free to hand him over to police then," inspector Khan informed.

The man emphasised that everything he had written in the letter was true, adding that "right now it is very important for me to steal money", inspector Khan said.

The thief left behind a typed letter in which he addressed the shop owner as Jujar Bhai. The shop owner has told us he had kept Rs 2.84 lakh in a bag, of which around Rs 2.45 lakh was stolen, while Rs 38,000 remained

Amid Pandemonium, **Statehood Resolutions Lapse** In JK Assembly

JAMMU: Amid noisy scenes and disruption in the Jammu & Kashmir Legislative Assembly on Monday, three key resolutions seeking restoration of statehood to the region lapsed without discussion.

The House was unable to conduct any business as members of the ruling alliance staged protests over the rejection of an adjournment motion related to the Waqf Bill. As a result, the resolutions listed for discussion and voting could not be taken up.

The resolutions were submitted by National Conference legislators Hilal Akbar Lone, Qaiser Jamsheed Lone, and indepen-

Saudi Job Scam Leaves Kashmiri Youth Depressed

SRINAGAR: A growing number of youth from Kashmir valley are falling prey to a job scam that promises employment in Saudi Arabia but leaves them stranded with low wages, long working hours, and broken promises, an investigation has found.

Not only are they forced into menial jobs with little pay and long shifts, but they're also bound by harsh two-year contracts that strip them of the right to leave or return home. Local agents, operating mainly from Srinagar and north Kashmir, are charging hefty sums while assuring well-paying jobs, only to send the youth into exploitative

conditions abroad. A tentative survey conducted has revealed that around 233 youth from Kashmir are currently stuck in similar exploitative conditions across

various Gulf countries. Of them, over 75 percent are earning just 1,100 Saudi Riyals (around Rs 25,000) per month—far less than what they were promised.

Moreover, about 55 percent said they didn't receive any salary during the first three months of work, pushing them into financial distress. Many remain bound by restrictive contracts, with no way to leave or return home.

Tariq Ahmad, a resident of Arin in Bandipora, is among the victims. "I gave 70,000 rupees to a Srinagar agent who said I'd be working in a zaitoon company," he said. "But when I reached Mumbai, I was made to sign a contract that mentioned a much lower salary. I called the agent, and he told me to go ahead, promising ev-

erything would be fine." However, since arriving in Saudi Arabia three months ago, Tariq has been made to work 15 hours a day and hasn't

received any salary. "I've spent everything to come here. I've been working day and night, and there's no money, no help," he said. In a



video that has gone viral online, he says he's losing hope and may take his own life along with his wife if nothing changes.

Mustafa, another youth from Baramulla, was also promised a respectable job in Saudi Arabia. "They told me it was a good position with a decent salary. But after arriving here, they gave me a delivery job. I've already signed a two-year contract. I feel stuck," he said.

Imran from Kupwara shared a similar account. "I was told I'd work in a hotel. I now clean toilets for 14 hours a day. I didn't come here for this. I just want to return home."

"I'm not the only one, there are hundreds of Kashmiris like me who were promised decent jobs in golf clubs, but ended up doing menial work in harsh conditions. We all want to come back, but these twoyear contracts have turned our hopes into a trap," Imran added. He urged the youth not to fall prey to these agents, say-

Makhdoom Sahib's Ancestral Shrine Freed From Waqf Clutches: Renzu

SRINAGAR: In a landmark spiritual and legal assertion, the historic shrine of Tujar Sharief, linked to the Raina dynasty and ancestral family of Hazrat Makhdoom Sahib, has been declared spiritually and administratively independent of all central and state Waqf boards. The announcement was made by Khwaja Farooq Renzushah, Chief Patron of the Makhdoom Trust, during his visit to the shrine. According to Mohammad Sultan Makhdoomi, Sajada Nasheen of the shrine and General Secretary of the Trust, repeated attempts were made over the years by the former Kashmir Waqf Board and the newly formed Union Territorylevel Waqf body to bring the shrine under their control. However, he noted that the shrine's foundation-laid in the presence of thousands of devotees by Renzushah, late Shah Sahib, and Peer Mohammad Yaseen of Harwan-was legally registered as a private Awqaf, making such takeovers a contempt of court. Kashmir Faces Acute Healthcare Crisis: Study

SRINAGAR: As the world marks World Health Day, a recent study published in the European Journal of Medical and Health Research paints a grim picture of healthcare in Kashmir, highlighting doctor shortages, mental health challenges, and alarming rural-urban disparities.

According to the study, Kashmir has only one doctor for every 4,000 patients, far worse than the national average. Mental health concerns are even more staggering, with nearly half of the population report-edly suffering from depression, anxiety, or post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), especially among women and children. The availability of psychiatric

care remains critically low. In rural regions, only 45% of households have access to clean drinking water, leading to outbreaks of waterborne diseases like cholera and diarrhoea. Overcrowded hospitals, high maternal mortality, child malnutrition, and poor immunisation further underscore the region's failing healthcare infrastructure.

While NGOs such as Médecins Sans Frontières are filling some gaps in services, the study stresses the need for urgent government investment in rural healthcare infrastructure, expansion of mental health services, environmental protection measures, and publicprivate partnerships to improve care delivery.

'ACP Proposal For 10+2 Lecturers **Under Consideration'**

SRINAGAR: The Jammu and Kashmir government on Monday informed the Legislative Assembly that a proposal for Assured Career Progression (ACP) for 10+2 lecturers appointed through the Jammu and Kashmir Public Service Commission (JKPSC) is currently under active consideration.

The response was given to a question raised by MLA Ch. Vikram Randhawa during the ongoing session of the J&K Legislative Assembly.

In response to concerns regarding stagnation and limited promotional avenues, the gov-ernment clarified that 10+2 lecturers appointed through JKPSC are promoted to the post of Senior Lecturer with two advance increments.

Subsequently, they are elevated to the positions of Principals and their equivalents under Pay Level-10A (Rs 56,600–1,79,800), as per the rules. Eligible Principals are

further promoted to the posts of Chief Education Officers or equivalent positions.

Regarding the demand for Functional Upgradation (NFU) or ACP on the lines of Assistant Surgeons, Dental and Veterinary Doctors, and ISM doctors, the School Education Department has proposed the introduction of ACP. The proposal was deliberated in the Establishment-cum-Selection Committee meeting held on June 5, 2024.

"A sub-committee was constituted by the General Administration Department (GAD) vide Government Order No. 1339-JK(GAD) of 2024 dated July 9, 2024, to examine the proposals of various departments. Additionally, an internal committee was constituted by the School Education Department vide Government Order No. 357-JK(Edu) of 2024 dated September 11, 2024, to further examine the matter," the government stated, adding that the issue is currently under active consideration of the department-(KNO)

Govt Forms Panel To Address Concerns

JAMMU: The Jammu and Kashmir Government has acknowledged concerns over the 'alleged arbitrary supersession' of senior JKAS officers by their juniors from departmental or feeding services, and has constituted a committee to streamline the career progression within the premier administrative service.

Responding to a question by legislator Muzaffar Iqbal Khan during the ongoing session of the J&K Legislative Assembly, the government cited Rule 11(1) of the JKAS Rules, 2008, which governs promotions to time scale posts.

As per the rules, 50% of the time scale posts are to be filled by promotion from directly recruited junior scale officers, while the remaining 50% are filled from feeding services in

wara, the government said that Handwara lies entirely within Municipal Limits, while Braipora lies partially in rural limits, as per the existing rules.

For urban areas, compensation is multiplied by a factor of 1 while for rural areas, compensation is multiplied by a factor of 2, it said.

Affidavit Row

fter taking a principled position on the contentious reservations issue, the elected Jammu & Kashmir government submitted an affidavit in the High Court, calling a writ petition against the reservation policy "frivolous" and "mischievous." This has generated fresh controversy with the opposition accusing the government of hypocrisy.

It was only weeks ago that the government in response to growing public protests and civil society pressure, set up a cabinet sub-committee to look into the issue of unfair job quotas. The sub-committee, headed by Social Welfare Minister Sakina Itoo, was meant to recommend reform to the existing quotas, which are believed to disproportionately favour the underprivileged classes. But the affidavit tells another story altogether: it goes against the government position.

The government in damage control mode has said it will file a fresh affidavit, if need be. Addressing a press conference in Anantnag. Itoo termed the affidavit in question as vague, The National Conference, on the other hand, has distanced itself from the affidavit. The NC spokesman Imran Nabi Dar has made it clear that the affidavit has been "submitted in a distorted way, without taking into consideration the ground realities."

But this has not convinced the opposition. The Peoples Democratic Party legislator Waheed Para said that the cabinet sub-committee on reservations "seems to be a façade." And the People's Conference leader Sajad Lone tweeted the lack of the mention of the sub-committee in the affidavit, terming this "a legal mystery."

The petition in the court argues that the 2024 amendments made by the Jammu and Kashmir Union Territory government are unconstitutional and violate principles of equity and fairness. According to the petition, the amendments have restructured reservation percentages, reducing the open merit category from 57% to 33% and the Resident of Backward Areas (RBA) category from 20% to 10%. In contrast, reservations for Scheduled Tribes have been increased from 10% to 20%, social castes from 2% to 8%, the Area Line of Control from 3% to 4%, and physically handicapped candidates from 2% to 4%. New categories introduced include children of defense personnel (3%), police personnel (1%), and sports achievers (2%), among others.

The issue also dominated the budget session of J&K Assembly, with opposition parties, except the BJP, aggressively raising the issue. This calls for the elected government to take the issue seriously. Any backpedaling on the issue and it risks alienating a substantial part of its support base in the Valley.

ducation is the soul of any enlightened society. No society can truly thrive without significant advancements in its educational infrastructure. In Jammu and Kashmir, government schools have long been the backbone of education for children from economically weaker sections who cannot afford the high fees of private institutions. Imagine a student from a remote rural area, with no literate family members and limited resources-how would such a child ever dream of becoming a doctor or a teacher if government schools were taken out of the equation?

I speak from experience. Coming from a village and growing up with financial hardships, I completed an M.Sc. in Biochemistry and pursued research before becoming a teacher. This journey would

Trouble in Kashmir's Trade Heartland

Historic Lal Chowk, once a thriving business hub of Valley, is now in crisis.

Hild Ahmad can't shake the feeling of being jobless despite running a garment store in Lal Chowk. His tribe has served customers for decades, but now they're losing their livelihoods. If this trend continues, Hilal fears, Lal Chowk may soon become a shadow of its past.

Before the COVID-19 pandemic, Hilal had two employees and a stable clientele. But when the lockdowns hit, his business was badly affected. Just as things began to recover, the Smart City project brought a new set of challenges. Constant road construction and barricades outside his shop reduced footfall drastically. "Even if someone wanted to come, the dust and blocked roads kept them away," he said.

Then came the flood of online sellers many of them unregistered, selling cheaper and often unauthentic products through Instagram and Facebook. "They don't pay taxes or rent, yet sell at low prices. People think they're getting a deal, but they don't realize the hidden costs," Hilal explained.

To make things worse, the closure of Sumo services a couple of years ago cut off a significant portion of daily shoppers who used to travel from nearby areas. Now, Hilal sits idle most of the day, seeing a maximum of six to seven customers—on a good day.

With no choice, he had to let go of his employees. "Now I handle everything myself, but the expenses keep piling up—shop rent, electricity, school fees for my children, medical bills for my parents, and daily needs for my family," he said. "On top of that, I still have to pay taxes, EMIs, and debts to suppliers."

The weight of this pressure has gone beyond financial pain—it's affected his mental health. "We are not just losing income, we are losing peace of mind," Hilal said quietly. He, like many others, has started experiencing anxiety and signs of depression. "There are people who think this is all our fault—that we used to overcharge. But they don't see the full picture. Running a shop isn't just about sales, it's about surviving after paying everyone else first," he added.



Recently, Hilal placed his last hope in the government. "Trader associations have had meetings, but we haven't seen any change. Right now, all I have is faith in God. I pray that things get better for Kashmir."

Shopkeepers in Lal Chowk bear heavy costs—rent, electricity, employee salaries, and taxes—while many online sellers operate without such burdens. "We have been paying taxes and following government regulations for years, but now these online pages sell the same products at lower prices without any accountability," says Abdul Rahim, another garment shop owner in Lal Chowk.

Online sellers who avoid GST and business registration enjoy an unfair edge, drawing cus-

tomers away from physical markets. COVID-19 further accelerated this trend, pushing people online while local shops bore the brunt.

According to the Centre for Monitoring Indian Economy (CMIE), Jammu & Kashmir has the highest unemployment rate in India-reaching 45.3% in December 2023. With limited job opportunities, many young Kashmiris have turned to social media to start informal businesses.

While this offers a form of self-employment, it's also deeply hurting traditional shopkeepers like Hilal who cannot compete without government support. "Earlier, I employed two workers in my shop, but now I can't afford them," says Mohammad Yasin, a footwear seller. "They lost their jobs because business has collapsed."

This domino-effect shows how online markets are not only affecting shopkeepers but increasing unemployment as well.

Some recent viral videos show empty markets and frustrated traders speaking about their losses. Yet, authorities have taken little action to regulate these online sellers or support those struggling in the physical market.

Many blame the changing consumer habits for the growing trouble in Kashmir's iconic trade centre. They argue that people now prefer lower prices from online sellers, the convenience of home delivery and a wider variety

of options online.

Without intervention, it's said, physical shopkeepers are being pushed out of business. If this crisis is not addressed, the heart of Kashmir's economy—Lal Chowk—may not survive. "The government must ensure fair competition and regulate online sellers by registering and taxing social media businesses, and by creating policies that ensure fair pricing and accountability," argues another Lal Chowk trader.

Local traders, the shopkeeper said, should be supported through subsidies or relief packages and must be offered digital marketing and e-commerce training. "As a welfare initiative," he said, "government must promote hybrid models and help shopkeepers blend online and offline sales, besides given access to platforms and tools to expand reach."

Lal Chowk is not just a market—it's a symbol of Kashmir's resilience, economy, and culture. But without action, these shops may fade away, taking with them not just livelihoods, but a way of life.

As Hilal Ahmed rightly concluded, "We can't survive just by sitting in our shops hoping to make a few hundred rupees a day. We need help before it's too late."

Mothers, Masters of Kitchen Chemistry

Every day, a series of scientific experiments take place in the kitchen, showcasing the fascinating applications of chemistry.

A mother is usually engaged in kitchen chores, and cooking is one of the tasks that involves both physical and chemical processes. Every day, a series of scientific experiments take place in the kitchen, showcasing the fascinating applications of chemistry. However, our mothers may not always observe these processes while cooking, as they were never formally taught about them. Knowledge is a tool that masters art, and it can be acquired both formally and informally. Everything our mother prepares in the kitchen operates on principles of chemistry.

Achieving mastery over cooking requires a series of steps, and chemistry plays a fundamental role in this process. Although chemistry has a vast scope, many of us fail to recognize its true worth and applications. where one can observe countless science experiments. Every morning and evening, our mothers engage in cooking, which is nothing but a practical demonstration of chemistry. Most of the time, they unknowingly perform basic chemistry experiments. Cooking is not just a daily chore; it is a process deeply connected to the person who plays a key role in the kitchen—our mother.

The kitchen is the best laboratory

She eagerly waits in the kitchen to prepare multiple cuisines with the help of her loyal friend—chemistry. She learns chemistry by sharing her social learning experiences with it. As we know, cooking consists of both physical and chemical processes, which follow a series of steps: washing (a physical process involving cleaning), boiling (a chemical and physical process where heat causes water absorption and softens the rice) and decantation (the process of separating the boiled wa-

ter from rice after vigorous heating).

Similarly, cooking vegetables and meat involves several chemical changes that occur when food is heated and prepared for consumption.

Another common process in the kitchen is the dissolution of sugar in water to form a sugar solution. Our mothers perform this task effortlessly, combining two different substances—a solvent (water) and a solute (sugar or salt)—to create a solution. Although they may not be aware of the scientific terms, they instinctively understand the process.

Dilution is another simple physical process where the concentration of sugar or salt is reduced by adding more water. This process helps adjust the taste of food. In chemistry, concentration refers to the amount of solute in a solution. This is a fundamental concept that connects chemistry with kitchen chores, especially cooking.

We, as students, can help our mothers

learn basic chemistry terms in a simple and engaging way. Teaching them about solvents, solutes, dilution, concentration, and decantation can enhance their understanding of what they already do daily. There should be no hesitation in introducing them to scientific concepts. Cultivating a habit of learning in the kitchen can make cooking a more scientific and insightful process for our mothers. Basic chemistry knowledge can help them understand solutions, mixtures, sieving, and decantation—all of which involve physical and chemical changes. These concepts are fascinating and easy to grasp when connected to real-life kitchen activities.

Our mothers are truly kitchen-scientists, engaging in daily experiments without realizing it. Every day, they handle chemical reactions while cooking, just as a laboratory scientist performs experiments in a lab. While a lab scientist follows scientific procedures, a kitchen scientist carries out experiments through simple steps, using heat, mixing, and separation techniques. The kitchen is like a mini-laboratory, where chemistry plays an essential role in food preparation. An educated son or daughter can greatly assist their mother by teaching her basic terms.

Let's expose our mothers to the world of chemistry. There is no hard-and-fast rule for learning scientific concepts but daily practice and observation can make a difference. Chemistry is a loyal friend to our mothers, guiding them in their cooking journeys. We should not hesitate to teach them new scientific terms. Providing them with scientific awareness in cooking will not only make their work more meaningful but will also enhance their learning experience.

Ants In Your House? Here's How They Get Everywhere – Even High Up In Tall Buildings

nts are among nature's greatest success stories, with an estimated 22,000 species worldwide.

Tropical Australia in particular is a global hotspot for ant diversity. Some researchers believe it could hold some of the richest ant biodiversity on the planet, with an estimated 5,000 species in the tropics alone.

But if ants are so successful out in nature, why do they so often turn up in our homes and even upper-level apartments?

And what can we do to keep them out?

There's probably an ant near you right now Ants dominate the planet in terms of sheer abundance

At any given moment, there are an estimated 20 quadrillion ants alive — that's 20 followed by 15 zeros

In fact, for every human being, there are roughly 2.5 million ants.

So the short answer to "Why are there ants in my house?" is simply this: there are a lot of ants.

We live on a planet where ants outnumber us by an almost unimaginable margin. The fact that a few occasionally wander into our homes shouldn't come as a surprise.

Ants work from home (yours, that is) Ants owe much of their success to their high-

ly social nature.

Within the colony, some individuals (female queens and male drones) are responsible for reproduction, while others (workers) are busy car ing for the young, cleaning or foraging for food. Workers ants are always female.

Ant colonies do not have leaders. They are an excellent example of collective behaviour and swarm intelligence, where individuals following relatively simple rules can collectively achieve far more than any individual could alone.

Just as the individual neurons in your brain can't compose music, play football, or read articles, the brain as a whole can achieve all these feats and more.

Colonies of co-operating ants are capable of amazingly sophisticated behaviours such as: -building efficient trail networks

-building living bridges with their bodies, and -"farming" fungi and aphids (small, sap-

sucking insects that feed on plants). Ants even outperform humans on some co-

operative cognition tasks. The highly social nature of ants is a big part of their success — and a key reason why they are

so good at finding their way into our homes. Each colony contains thousands of intrepid workers, many of which are constantly searching for new food sources. If even a single ant discovers a valuable resource in your home, it can quickly share that information with its nest mates.



Different ant species use different methods of communication, but the ones that most often invade our homes tend to use "pheromone trails'

When an ant finds a food source, she returns to her nest leaving little drops of pheromones as she goes; this trail guides other ants from their nest directly to the food source.

This highly efficient communication system means a single ant can rapidly recruit thousands of its nest mates to any food it finds.

Ants may also come inside in search of water, particularly when the weather is hot.

Some species prefer to build their nests in

humid environments, which might explain why they are often found in bathrooms.

I once discovered an entire colony of sugar ants nesting inside my aquarium filter! The combination of high humidity and an enclosed structure made it an ideal place to build a nest.

On the flip side, heavy rains can flood ant sometimes leading them straight into our homes. I live in an upper-floor apartment. How did

ants get in?

Many ant species are exceptional climbers, thanks to tiny adhesive pads and fine hairs on their feet.

These specialised structures allow ants to stick to walls and find footholds even on surfaces that appear smooth to the human eye.

Remarkably, some canopy-dwelling ants have evolved a behaviour known as "controlled descent" which protects them when they fall. By adjusting the position of their abdomens, falling ants can steer their trajectory, directing themselves back toward the tree trunk and safety.

How do I keep ants out of my house?

Well, good luck. No matter what you do. ants will probably enter your house at one time or another.

Finding a few ants in your home doesn't mean your house is dirty. We simply live on a planet that is absolutely teeming with ants.

To minimise unwanted ant visits, start by eliminating any potential food sources that could feed a hungry ant.

Store all food in sealed airtight containers, clean behind the fridge and inside/under the toaster, avoid leaving pet food out longer than needed and make sure your bins are securely sealed.

Ants have tiny stomachs, so even small crumbs or the residue from spilled sugary drinks can be enough to entice them back.

If ants seem to be following each other in a line, try disrupting their chemical trail using vinegar or bleach. Be warned, however: ants are very good at repairing broken trail networks.

'Increased Screen Time Found To Increase Depression Risk In Teen Girls By Disrupting Sleep'

xcessive screen time can affect one's sleep, thereby increasing risk of depressive symptoms especially among teenage girls, according to a new study.

Studies have consistently linked use of screens and devices with a poorer quality of sleep and a higher chance of mental health conditions, such as anxiety and depression.

However, researchers from Sweden's Karolinska Institutet said that sleep problems and depression can often coincide, and the direction of these links has been unclear. For the study, findings of which are published in the journal 'PLOS Global Public Health', the team tracked 4.810 Swedish students aged 12-16, collecting data on sleep quality and quantity, depressive symptoms,



aspects of the human sleep-wake and screen usage over the course cycle at once. An increased screen time

Further, the researchers found that among boys, screen time directly increased their risk of depression after twelve months, while among girls the depressive effect was caused through sleep disturbances. Sleep was found to explain

about 38 per cent to 57 per cent of the link between screen time and depression in girls.

Boys who spent more time on screens also experienced sleep disruptions, but these were not strongly associated to later depression, the researchers said.

The study showed that "screen-sleep displacements impact several aspects of sleep simultaneously. Displacements led to elevated depressive symptoms among girls but not boys," the authors wrote.

"Boys may be more prone to externalising symptoms due to sleep loss," they wrote.

In September 2024, the Swedish Public Health Agency announced guidelines that teenagers should not use no more than two-to-three hours of daily leisure screen time, partly to promote better sleep.

Trump's Tariff 'Medicine' Injects Turmoil Into Global Markets

TOKYO- US President Donald Trump warned foreign governments they would have to pay "a lot of money" to lift sweeping tariffs, characterising the duties as "medicine" and triggering further carnage across global financial markets on Monday.

Asian stocks posted steep losses in early trading and US stock market futures opened sharply lower as investors registered concerns that Trump's tariffs could lead to higher prices, weaker demand, lower confidence and potentially a global recession. Speaking to reporters aboard

Air Force One on Sunday, Trump indicated he was not concerned about losses that have already wiped out trillions of dollars in value from share markets around the world.

"I don't want anything to go down. But sometimes you have to take medicine to fix something," he said as he returned from a weekend of golf in Florida.

Trump said he had spoken to leaders from Europe and Asia over the weekend, who hope to convince him to lower tariffs as high as 50% due to take effect this week. "They are coming to the table. They want to talk but

there's no talk unless they pay us a lot of money on a yearly basis," Trump said. Trump's tariff announcement last week jolted economies around the world, triggering retaliatory levies

from China and sparking



fears of a global trade war

Investors and political leaders have struggled to determine whether Trump's tariffs are here to stay, or part of a permanent new regime or a negotiating tactic to win concessions from other countries.

On Sunday morning talk shows, Trump's top economic advisers sought to portray the tariffs as a savvy repositioning of the U.S. in the global trade order.

Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent said more than 50 nations had started negotiations with the U.S. since last Wednesday's announcement. Commerce Secretary Howard Lutnick said on CBS News' 'Face the Nation' the tariffs would remain in place "for days and weeks."

Japan, one of Washington's closest allies in Asia, is among countries hoping to strike some deal but its leader Shigeru Ishiba said on Monday results "won't come overnight". Investors, however, are

JPMorgan economists now estimate the tariffs will result in full-year U.S. gross domestic product declining by 0.3%, down from an earlier estimate of 1.3% growth, and that the unemployment rate will climb to 5.3% from 4.2% now.

Indian Banks Recovered Over Rs 14,000 Crore, Twice What He **Owed, Claims Vijay Mallya**

NEW DELHI- Fugitive liquor baron Vijay Mallya has claimed that Indian banks have got ac-cess to his properties worth Rs 14,131.6 crore, more than twice the amount that he owed to public sector banks.

Mallya cited purported ref-erence to the details of restoration done by the Enforcement Directorate against wilful defaulters in the Finance Ministry's annual report 2024-25 to say that banks have already recovered Rs 14,131.8 crore against Rs 6,203 crore awarded by the Debt Recovery Tribunal. "Finally, against a DRT judg-ment debt of Rs 6,203 crore,

admitted recovery of Rs 14,131.8 crore, which will be evidence in my UK bankruptcy annulment application. Wonder what banks will say in an English Court,"

Mallya said in a post on X. Sharing details of fugitive economic offenders, including Mallya and 10 others, the report said a total of 44 extradition requests have been sent to various countries in respect of 36 individuals.

As per the annual report of the ministry, a complete amount of attached properties worth Rs 14,131.6 crore has been successfully restored to the Public Sector Banks in the case of Vijay Mallaya.

The efforts of the ED have resulted in successful representation before Competent Court abroad in the extradition of



various fugitive economic offenders and other accused, the report said.

"In this regard, it is pertinent to mention that the UK Court has approved extradition of few high profile accused per-sons to India following effective representation of the Directorate in coordination with other LEAs (law enforcement agencies) and Indian mission abroad," it said.

The DRT bench of Bengaluru in 2017 had ordered the SBI-led consortium of banks to start the process of recovering Rs 6,203 crore, at an annual inter-est rate of 11.5 per cent, from embattled Mallya and his companies in the Kingfisher Air-Îines case.

Mallya, who fled to the UK in March 2016, is wanted in India over a default of Rs 9,000 crore that was loaned to esrtwhile Kingfisher Airlines (KFA) by several banks.

India has been seeking Mallya's extradition from the UK.

He had in the past offered to repay 100 per cent of "public money" but accused the banks and government of refusing his offer.

Rupee Drops 32 Paise To Settle At 85.76 Against US Dollar

MUMBAI- The rupee declined 32 paise to settle at \$5.76 against the US dollar on Monday amid the widespread global turbulence over escalated tariff war and fear of a global economic slowdown.

A steep decline in crude prices and a weaker American currency failed to arrest the fall in domestic currency due to the withdrawal rush by foreign as well as domestic equity investors, forex traders said.

They said the currency exchange markets globally faced extreme volatility as investors tried to escape risks, following the US administration's sweeping reciprocal tariffs on multiple countries and China's retaliatory move on the American imports.

On the domestic macroeconomic front, market participants were watchful as the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI's) monetary policy committee began its three-day deliberations on key interest rates. The decision of the six-member ratesetting panel will be announced on Wednesday.

At the interbank foreign exchange, the rupee opened at 85.79 and moved in a wide range between the high of 85.57 and the low of 85.90 against the greenback during the day. The unit ended the session at 85.76 against the dollar, registering a loss of 32 paise from its previous closing level.

On Friday, the rupee settled 14 paise lower at 85.44 against the US dollar, a day after gaining 22 paise on Thursday, following the implementation of the US' reciprocal tariff on about 60 countries.

Anuj Choudhary, Research Analyst at Mirae Asset Sharekhan, said the rupee declined on risk-off sentiments in global markets and a strong US dollar.

He said the rupee is expected to trade with a negative bias due to weak global markets and ongoing uncertainty around trade tariffs.

India, Portugal Agree To Deepen **Trade & Investment Ties**

LISBON- India and Portugal have agreed to deepen bilateral ties, particularly in trade and investment, renewable energy and connectivity, as President Droupadi Murmu and her Portuguese counterpart Marcelo Rebelo de Sousa held talks here on Monday.

During the talks held at the Portuguese President's official residence, Palácio de Belém, the two sides also agreed to strengthen cooperation in the United Nations and other multilateral forums.

"We also discussed global and regional issues of common interest. We resolved to build further on our longstanding bilateral ties, especially in trade and investment, science and technology, information and digital technologies, renewable energy, connectivity and mobility, and to promote people-to-people contacts further," Murmu said.

Her visit comes in the backdrop of

significant global economic change, with trade tariffs recently imposed by the US reshaping international commerce and India's growing engagement with Europe.

Trade between India and Portugal is valued at USD 1.5 billion and has been growing steadily, with a 50 per cent increase over the last five years. A statement issued after their meeting said the two leaders dis-

cussed "all important aspects of our bilateral relationship"

President Murmu, who is on a two-day State Visit to Portugal, held a tete-a-tete with her Portuguese counterpart followed by delegationlevel talks during which all matters pertaining to "mutual interests" were discussed.

"We agreed to strengthen our coordination and cooperation in the United Nations and other multilateral fora," she said.

The President said she had "a constructive and productive meeting" with President Marcelo Rebelo.

'Manufacturers In India Not Overly **Concerned With US Tariffs'**

NEW DELHI- The electronics and IT sector manufacturers are not "overly" concerned about the recent hikes in import duty by India's largest trading partner the US, a top government official said on Monday.

However, the impact will depend on how the tariff situation plays out ahead, Electronics and IT Secretary S Krishnan said.

'We've been in regular consultation with manufacturers in India. That is something that we are speaking to them on an ongoing basis. They are not overly concerned right now, but it also depends on how this whole situation plays out. It's a dynamic situation," Krishnan told reporters at a Cert-In event.

The US on April 3 imposed an additional 26 per cent tariff on Indian goods, effective April 9.

The sector players are of the view that the Indian industries are better placed as compared to their competitors in the electronics segment.

While the US has imposed an additional 26 per cent import duty on India, its competitor Vietnam is facing a 46 per cent tariff, China 34 per cent, Indonesia 32 per cent, Taiwan 32 per cent and Thailand 36 per cent.

Mobile phone is the biggest contributor to India's electronics manufacturing landscape, with Apple and Samsung being the top exporter in the country. The majority of iPhones are made in

China followed by India, while Samsung has its biggest factory in Vietnam after India. Commenting on the possible impact of these tariffs, telecom gear maker GX Group CEO Paritosh Prajapati said the 26 per cent tariff will impose a notable cost barrier on Indian hardware exports to the US.

However, this remains comparatively lower than tariffs levied on other major Asian manufacturing hubs. As a result, India-based manufacturing still holds a competitive edge -- given that there is already a significant focus on scale, quality, and 'Make in India' incentives," Prajapati said.

was formally submitted by nine members from the NC, Congress, and Independents.

"This concerns our faith. There is no matter more urgent than this," said Tanvir Sadiq during the uproar. NC's Kaiser Jamshed Lone also demanded a half-hour discussion on the issue.

Deputy Chief Minister Surinder Choudhary supported the demand for open expression, stating, "If members want to speak, they should be allowed to.'

As the Speaker instructed legislators to return to their seats, tempers flared. NC and Congress members raised slogans like "BJP haay haay" and "Bill wapis karo." BJP members responded with chants of "Bharat Mata Ki Jai," "Vande Mataram," and "Jahan hua balidan Mukherjee, woh Kashmir hamara hai." Counterslogans of "Allah hu Akbar" and "Nara-e-Takbeer" followed from the NC, Congress, and PDP benches.

In the heat of the moment, NC legislators Salman Sagar and Aijaz Jan tore question papers and flung them into the air.

Amid the chaos, Speaker Rather invoked Rule 58, sub-section 7, stating that issues currently under judicial consideration cannot be discussed in the Assembly. "The Bill is sub judice before the Supreme Court. I have received writ petitions related to it. We cannot debate it here," he said, adding that the constitutional validity of the Bill lies within the court's domain.

PDP's Wahid Para argued that the matter's religious sensitivity warranted Assembly attention. "It is a significant issue. Even the Tamil Nadu Assembly passed a resolution on it. We should do the same," he urged.

In response, the Speaker clarified that Tamil Nadu's resolution predated the case's judicial proceedings. "It is now under court consideration. I cannot allow an adjournment," he reiterated.

The situation escalated further when NC member Majid Larmi's black achkan was torn during the melee. Party members raised the torn garment in protest while shouting, "Bill wapis lo, kanoon ko khatam karo," to which BJP legislators countered with, "Dramabazi ko bandh karo.'

Gurezi maintained that the issue is religious at its core. "We are ready to sacrifice anything for our faith. If we are not allowed to speak, we will not let the House function," he said.

Peoples' Democratic Party (PDP) chief Mehbooba Mufti also accused the National Conference government of yielding to the BJP's "anti-Muslim" agenda, after an adjournment motion on the Waqf Amendment Act was rejected in the Jammu and Kashmir Assembly.

Lashing out at Omar Abdullah, she said Muslims in the country expected that a Muslim chief minister in the only Muslim-majority state "would raise his voice or at least say that they will not implement this law in J&K".

"It's profoundly disappointing that the Speaker J&K Assembly has rejected the motion on the Waqf Bill," she said in a post on X.

The former chief minister of the erstwhile state of J&K said the NC could learn from the Tamil Nadu government which has "firmly opposed" the Waqf Bill.

"Despite securing a strong mandate, the government appears to have completely yielded to the BJP's anti-Muslim agenda, cynically at-tempting to appease both sides," Mehbboba Mufti said in her post.

"In J&K, the only Muslim-majority region, it's alarming that a supposedly people-centric government lacks the courage even to debate this critical issue," she added.

Speaking to reporters here, the PDP president said Chief Minister Omar Abdullah has failed to come up to the expectations of the Muslims of the country.

"Muslims across the country today expected that a Muslim chief minister, having 50 seats, in the only Muslim majority state, would raise his voice or at least say that they will not implement this law in J&K. But, nothing like that happened. I feel ashamed today," she said.

Tillo area of Jammu, also met Shah. Abrol was among the seven workers of a construction company killed in a terror attack at Gagangir in Ganderbal district in October last year.

BSF," he said.

Shah said over 26 initiatives related to technology are currently being tested, including anti-drone technology, tunnel identification technology and electronic surveillance, as he expressed confidence that the results would be achieved by next March, which would make it easier for the soldiers to fulfil their duties.

During his visit, the Home Minister paid tribute to BSF Commandant Vinay Assistant Prasad, who made the ultimate sacrifice while on duty at the international border in Kathua district in 2019.

Earlier, in 2021, Shah had also visited the Makwal Border Post along the Jammu frontier.

He also inspected the forward border post and inaugurated newly built facilities at the border, including eight women's barracks, highmast lights, a G+1 tower and a composite BOP, all constructed at a cost of Rs 47.22 crore.

These initiatives have strengthened the security arrangements during the Border Security Force personnel's duties and have also improved their living conditions.

During his interaction with the soldiers, Shah said that after visiting this place one realises the difficult conditions under which the BSF personnel ensure the security of the country's borders.

He said that "despite extreme cold, heavy rainfall or temperatures reaching 45 degrees Celsius, and regardless of the geographical or climatic challenges, our soldiers remain vigilant and dedicated to securing the borders with preparedness and alertness"

"The BSF has a glorious history when it comes to the country's security," he said, adding that the entire nation knows that the BSF is the first line of defence and it has always fulfilled this responsibility exceptionally well.

He noted that in every war with Pakistan, the contribution of our BSF soldiers has been as significant as that of the Indian Army.

"The Modi government is working to reduce the difficulties faced by soldiers in the discharge of their duties and will continue to do so." he said.

Shah emphasised that under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the central government is fully committed to the welfare of security forces and their families.

The Centre has launched several welfare schemes for security forces, including Ayushman CAPF, exgratia payments, accidental death insurance coverage under the CAPF salary package scheme, the Unified Pension Scheme, the Prime Minister Scholarship Scheme (PMSS) and E-Housing, he said.

The average Saudi CP - the international benchmark used for LPG pricing since India is majorly import-dependent to meet its needs has risen by 63 per cent to USD 629 per tonne in February 2025 from USD 385 in July 2023, he said.

This necessitates LPG to be priced at Rs 1,028.50 per 14.2-kg cylinder in Delhi.

"But the public sector oil marketing companies have been so far modulating the prices," he said, adding that the oil PSUs suffered under-recoveries or loss of Rs 41,338 crore in the fiscal year ended March 31 (2024-25) on account of selling LPG below cost.

In view of the mounting losses, the prices have been moderately increased.

"At current prices, the cost of cooking per day using LPG for Ujjawala households is around Rs 6.10 and that for general users is Rs 14.58, which is reasonable," Puri noted.

The rates, he said, will be reviewed every month and any softening will be passed on to consumers.

The Rs 50 per cylinder hike will only cover the future cost and for the past cost, the oil ministry will seek budgetary support from the finance ministry.

The additional accruals from the excise duty hike can be used to compensate the oil companies for their losses, he said.

"It is our commitment to make good their losses.'

As much as 16,000 crore litres of petrol and diesel is consumed annually in the country and the Rs 2 a litre excise hike could yield up to Rs 32,000 crore to the government.

While the mop up from excise duty hike on petrol and diesel will be solely at the disposal of the central government, as SAED is out of the divisible pool with the states, the LPG price hike of Rs 50 per cylinder is likely to mop up Rs 5,000-7.000 crore.

'The #ExciseDuty increase of Rs 2 per litre on #petrol and #diesel by the Central Government will not be passed on to the consumers. On the one hand, this will insulate the customers from the price hike, while on the other hand, the collected amount may be utilised towards under-recovery of #LPG, providing relief to Oil Marketing Companies, Indian Oil Corporation (IOC) - the nation's largest oil firm - said in a post on X.

The increase in duties will "come into force on the 8th day of April 2025", an official order on the excise duty hike said.

While any change in taxes is normally passed on to consumers, there will be no change in retail selling price of petrol and diesel as the excise hike will be set off against the

This follows the price of input natural gas being hiked from USD 6.50 per million British thermal units to USD 6.75 from April 1.

Alongside, the government hiked excise duty on petrol and diesel by Rs 2 per litre each to raise about Rs 32,000 crore additional tax revenue. However, there will be no change in retail prices as the increase will be adjusted against the price cut that was warranted because of falling international oil prices.

Puri said prices of crude oil which is turned into petrol and diesel in refineries - have fallen to about USD 60 per barrel from USD 70-75, and a reduction in the retail selling price of petrol and diesel is possible if the international oil prices stay at those levels.

The special additional excise duty (SAED) on petrol has been increased from Rs 11 per litre to Rs 13, and that on diesel from Rs 8 to Rs 10 a litre. With this, the total incidence of taxes imposed by the central government on petrol has increased to Rs 21.9 a litre (Rs 1.40 a litre basis excise duty, Rs 13 SAED, Rs 2.50 agriculture cess and Rs 5 road and infrastructure cess) from Rs 19.9 a litre.

On diesel, the total incidence has gone up from Rs 15.80 per litre to Rs 17.80 (Rs 1.80 per litre basic excise duty, Rs 10 special additional excise duty, Rs 4 agriculture cess and Rs 2 road and infra cess).

Puri defended the move, saying oil companies had been incurring losses on LPG sales and the increase

India is 85 per cent dependent on imports to meet its oil needs.

"PSU Oil Marketing Companies have informed that there will be no increase in retail prices of #Petrol and #Diesel, subsequent to the increase effected in Excise Duty Rates today." the oil ministry said in a post on X.

The Modi government during its 11-year rule hiked excise duty whenever international oil prices fell.

The government had between November 2014 and January 2016, raised excise duty on petrol and diesel on nine occasions to take away gains arising from plummeting global oil prices.

In all, duty on petrol rate was hiked Rs 11.77 per litre and that on diesel by 13.47 a litre in those 15 months helped the government's excise mop-up more than double to Rs 2,42,000 crore in 2016-17 from Rs 99,000 crore in 2014-15.

The government cut excise duty by Rs 2 in October 2017 and by Rs 1.50 a year later. But, it raised excise duty by Rs 2 per litre in July 2019. It again hiked excise duty in March 2020 by Rs 3 per litre each.

The excise duty was raised by Rs 13 and Rs 16 per litre on petrol and diesel between March 2020 and May 2020.

But in the following years, it rolled back the Rs 13 and Rs 16 per litre excise duty hike, as international oil prices soared. This helped bring down petrol prices from a record hike of Rs 105.41 a litre in Delhi and the highest-ever diesel rate of Rs 96.67. Just before general elections were

Virat Kohli on Monday became the first Indian to complete 13,000 runs in T20 cricket during the Indian Premier League contest between Royal Challengers Bengaluru and Mumbai Indians here. Kohli reached the landmark with his second half-

century this IPL season to become only the fifth batter overall to have scored 13,000 runs in the shortest format of the game.

The right-handed modern day great achieved the feat in a little over 400 matches in his career.

Refreshed & Ready, Arsenal Star Saka Gunning For Real Madrid

njury lay-offs are rarely welcomed by players but Arsenal winger Bukayo Saka believes his enforced break could benefit him and his club as they prepare to face holders Real Madrid in the quarter-finals of the Champions League on Tuesday.

Saka has emerged as arguably the most irreplaceable player in Mikel Arteta's squad and while his return from a serious hamstring injury has probably come too late to salvage Arsenal's Premier League title hopes, European glory is a realistic aim.

"I think mentally it was really good for me," the 23-year-old Saka, who missed more than three months after sustaining an injury before Christmas, said on Monday.

"Obviously it was really tough for me initially to find out the extent of my injury, that I was going to have surgery, it was really tough for me to hear the news at first but once it was done and successful I was just focused on coming back stronger and I had a lot of time."

Saka missed England's opening two World Cup qualifiers last month but scored on his return for Arsenal in the Premier League win against Fulham last week.

If Arsenal are to stun Real Madrid, they will need Saka firing on all cylinders and he believes his relative freshness will give him an edge against the Spanish giants.

"The past five years I've been playing game after game so it was the first proper break I've had," he said. "It was really good for me. I got to do a lot of things that I don't normally do. It's really nice to be back and I feel fresh mentally.

"I'm just focused now on the positives and I couldn't ask to come back at a better time of the season than now."

Saka's importance to Arsenal is underlined by his statistics this season -- 10 goals and 14 assists in 26 matches in all competitions, including four goals in the Champions League.

Arsenal were stopped at the quarter-final stage last year by Bayern Munich when they were still neck and neck with Manchester City in the battle for the Premier League title.

This time, all their eggs are in their European basket and



Saka says Tuesday's first leg could be one of the best occasions ever witnessed at the Emirates Stadium. 'It's a very big night and the stakes are high against one of the best teams in the competition." he said.

"It's the first time the club has

been in back-to-back Champions League quarter-finals for a while, so tomorrow night we want to take the next step and try and get over the line.'

Arsenal Will Go For It Against **Real Madrid, Says Arteta**

Arsenal have not made it past

the Champions League semifinals since 2009, but manager Mikel Arteta wants his side to write their own history when they host Real Madrid for the first leg of their quarter-final at the Emirates on Tuesday.

Madrid, the record 15-times European champions, have won

six Champions League titles since 2009 while Arsenal continue their hunt for a first crown. Arteta, whose team last year bowed out of the competition after a quarter-final loss to German side Bayern Munich, urged his side to back themselves. "It's a club (Madrid) that has

set new standards in world football. This is where we want to be, where we want to belong," Arteta told reporters on Monday.

"It's part of their history. We have to write our own history. We have to focus on our thing. They can hurt us a lot but we can too.

"With a lot of hope that we can get a result, that we can do it. We need to be convinced that we can do it. We need to just enjoy it.

"It will be just the first leg, the intention is clear for tomorrow. We're going to go for it."

Winger Bukayo Saka did not start in Arsenal's 1-1 Premier League draw at 15th-placed Everton on Saturday, only coming on in the 46th minute.

The 23-year-old England international, who has scored 10 goals and provided 14 assists in 26 matches in all competitions for Arsenal this season, had only made his long-awaited return from a hamstring injury on Tuesday.

Arteta said Saka was in a much better place now.

"We have built his minutes and he's coped with that really well," the Spaniard added.

Delhi's rickshaw pullers, roadside vendors suffer as heat, pollution take a toll

As we observe World Health Day under the theme "My health, My right", thousands of outdoor workers across the national capital — from auto-rickshaw drivers and rickshaw pullers to roadside vendors — are grappling with a growing health crisis due to extreme heat and air pollution.

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has issued a yellow alert for the city, forecasting a heatwave to persist until Wednesday. Delhi's maximum temperature settled at 38.2 degrees Celsius, 3.1 degrees above the seasonal average on Sunday. The minimum temperature was 18.5 degrees Celsius, and the Air Quality Index (AQI) remained in the 'poor' category at 209.

Highlighting the physical toll of the heatwave, auto-rickshaw driver Santosh Hazra said, "Skin gets burnt during a heatwave; loo also affects health. There's ample availability of free water in Delhi but there's a shortage of shaded areas to rest." Another auto driver, Prashant Kumar (24), complained of feeling drowsy during the hot season.

Sarabjeet Singh, 45, who runs a fruit cart near Red Fort, complained of heatwave impacting his income. "Due to the scorching heat, we get tired very easily. It impacts our income. Also, there are no customers from 12 to 4 pm." On the other hand, 42-yearold Mohammad Haseem said the compounded effects of heat and humidity reduce work and increase costs. "There's low income because people don't step out. We also end up spending money on buying water and lemon juice." Highlighting the environmental factors contributing to rising temperatures, environmentalist Bhavreen Kandhari told PTI, "The expansion of concrete landscapes at the expense of tree cover has intensified the urban heat island effect, aggravating temperature to extremes." Kandhari suggested that a comprehensive, long-term strategy is needed that includes the protection and expansion of tree cover to enhance biodiversity and sustainable urban planning to mitigate excessive concretisation.

Meanwhile, a report by the NGO Sustainable Futures Collaborative has warned that while cities are taking short-term emergency actions like distributing water and adjusting work hours, long-term heat resilience strategies remain weak or absent. These include occupational cooling, insurance for lost wages, heat mapping of urban hot spots and improving electricity reliability, their recently-released report suggested.

The IMD's yellow alert also signals moderate health concerns, particularly for vulnerable groups such as the elderly, infants, and those with chronic conditions. Thirty-four-year-old Jaspreet

Singh, who has been running a food cart in the Red Fort area for 11 years, said, "We are habituated to this heat now, but we witness people fainting now and then due to the weather." Narendra Shah, a 70-year-old rickshaw puller, is among the vulnerable populations most affected during heatwaves.

"This time, the weather has become worse very early. I'm the sole breadwinner in the family, and earnings get affected during this time. However, I must mention that there is ample availability of free water across the city," Shah told PTI. Medical professionals have also warned that the impact of such heat exposure is often underestimated.

Dr Vivek Nangia, a senior pulmonologist, said, "First, the stage is heat cramps, second is heat exhaustion wherein people could develop dizziness, nausea, vomiting, and stage three is heat stroke, where people land up in hospitals and ICUs. It's like a medical emergency. The overall impact is dehydration, loss of salt and minerals from the body." He added that extreme heat can worsen preexisting heart, lung or kidney diseases, and, in severe cases, it may lead to confusion, organ failure or even death.

IIM, IIT study slams global ranking race in B-schools as echo of capitalist imperialism

Anagement academia's obsession with rankings contributes to imperialistic aspects of capitalism, particularly in the Global South, and reinforces condemnable scholarly practices, according to a research by faculty members from IIM Lucknow, IIM Calcutta, and IIT Delhi.

The research published in the journal "Management Learning" argues that the pursuit of globally ranked excellence is at the core of contemporary management education, often at the expense of generating knowledge that is significant and pertinent to the society.

"Indian management institutes attempt to create an 'Indian' identity internationally while simultaneously seeking global recognition through rankings. This obsession with rankings results in a series of academic challenges," Priyanshu Gupta, assistant professor of business sustainability, IIM Lucknow, said.

The researchers argued that




rankings create an artificial scarcity of excellence, focusing only on elite institutions, while ignoring the need for stronger academic infrastructure across thousands of higher education institutes in the country. cusing on the pressing contextual issues.

"Academic research is built on voluntary labour, with scholars spending unpaid hours writing, reviewing and editing for corporate publishing houses that make massive profits while the faculty members increasingly struggle with job insecurity," Gupta said. The research was conducted af-

The research was conducted after the faculty noticed a troubling pattern in everyday conversations among academics, he said.

"We no longer talk about what we are working on but about the ranked journal where our work is getting published. And we noted that this often detracts the question of whether the work itself is important for our society, to a question of whether it can get published in top journals," Gupta said.

The research recommends a shift in management education, advocating for scholars to challenge rigid academic norms, reject ranking-driven pressures, and focus on producing contextually relevant and impactful research.
