J&K Statehood: SC Refuses Early Hearing

Says Case Already Listed On Oct 10

New Delhi: The Supreme Court on Monday refused to advance the date of hearing on plea seeking restoration of statehood to Jammu and Kashmir, saying the matter is already listed for October 10.

On August 24, a bench headed by Chief Justice R B Gavai had issued notice to the Centre on a separate plea seeking restoration of statehood to Jammu and Kashmir.

"I am seeking only earliest date of a contempt petition relating to the abrogation of Article 370," the Statehood petitioner told the court in Jammu and Kashmir, "a lawyer told the bench also comprising Justice Jasti Chelameswar."

"It is listed already in October 10," the CJI said on Monday while adjourning the case to advance the date of hearing.

We are in the midst of a constitutional crisis and the only way to resolve it is to hear the bench in hearing a contempt petition relating to the abrogation of Article 370," the apex court held that Article 370, which was incorporated in 1949, was unconstitutional and failed to grant special status to Jammu and Kashmir, even as it ordered the assembly elections to be held by September 2024 and fixed the date for the next legislative session by September 2024 and its statehood be restored "at the earliest," the court said.

HC Takes Note Of Rotten Meat PIL, Seeks Govt Reply

Petitioner Flags Years Of Rotten Meat 'Smuggling' In Kashmir

Srinagar: The practice of "smuggling" rotten, diseased, and unhygienic poultry and meat products into Jammu and Kashmir Valley, has been prevalent for many years, a petition filed before the Supreme Court on August 23, said.

While taking the supplementary affidavit, the petitioner through advocate Shafiqul Islam and Justice Rajesh Kumar, said that the practice of smuggling began in 1996.

The court observed that the petitioner granted authorities to file responses to the PIL.

"However, despite the issuance of various notifications and concerned authorities failed to take any corrective or preventive measures to curb such smuggling and illegal practices," he said, adding, "It is pertinent to mention that the concerned departments passed by the Divisional Commissioners, Kashmir, came to be challenged in this case."

The order issued by M Akbar, Commissioner, Secretary, General Administration Department, was taken to enhance the cybersecurity posture of the Union Territory, protect sensitive information, and prevent unauthorized access and minimize the risks of data breaches, malware infections, and other security threats.

21,000 Stray Dogs To Be Sterilized In Srinagar

Srinagar: The Srinagar Municipal Corporation (SMC) has launched an ambitious sterilization and vaccination campaign to control the rising population of stray dogs in the summer capital.

"Under the Animal Birth Control programme, about 21,000 stray dogs will be sterilized in the next 16 months. Municipal Veterinary Department has been engaged with SMC for its implementation," Dr. Farid confirmed on Monday.

Speaking to *Kashmir Observer*, Hasmukh Ingthap Newari Service (KINS), Dr. Faiz said the programme would begin on August 14, 2025, in being carried out on a non-selective human manner.

"We have set a target of sterilizing 1,000 dogs every month, which comes to around 45,000 dogs per day. The programme will continue for 16 months and will be carried out in all 12 wards of Srinagar," he explained.

He said that the drive is being implemented in a non-selective manner.

"The project is aimed to provide reasonable shelter and respect for children of those who have served or sacrificed for the nation," he said.

During the visit, DC was accompanied by Inspector General of Police, Mr. Fayaz Ahmad Dar; Tabeer Ahmad Dar, Inspector of Police, 11th Divisional Headquarters of J&K, Zila Saink Welfare Officer, and other officials.

DC took round of the under-construction building and appreciated the ongoing construction work. He directed the concerned authorities to complete the work and expedite the pace of work to ensure timely completion of the project.

Srinagar district: He expressed his happiness to see aspiring youth across the state, especially becoming part of Mission Yuva.

To curb the effects of all stakeholder departments and banking partners, DC said, "We are ready to build a vibrant entrepreneurial ecosystem in Srinagar by providing of cases & monitoring and credit disbursement.

"The SMC has hired a professional agency for this task, and it is being implemented at a rapid pace in progress in time. The dogs are sterilized, administered anti-rabies vaccine, and then released at the same location from where they were picked up," Faiz said.

Calling the initiative a humane population control method, he added, "This is not just about numbers. It is about ensuring public safety while maintaining a balance between life and compassion in a dignified and compassionate way."

Dissipating public fears, Dr. Farid said, "The sterilization of stray dogs have been found in Srinagar's stray dogs."

He said, "In our municipal records, no dog of the dogs across the city have tested positive for rabies. If any dog is found to be rabid, it is confirmed and reported through medical authorities," he clarified.

According to Dr. Farid, the sterilization programme will be conducted using the Peterman Lincoln method, while the sterilized dogs will be monitored using the Peterson Lincoln method.

He said that the drive will be carried out in a non-selective manner and media reports suggest around 30,000 dogs in the city.

However, he said that the 2023 survey is not relevant at present as most dog bite cases occur during natural calamities. "Bites usually happen when dogs fight over female during mating season, when other dogs steal their puppies are unmet," he said.

Dr. Farid said that the sterilization teams face resistance from locals in areas like Batamaloo, Dharipora, and others.

"Recently, we have been killing them and selling the meat. This is a very bad practice. This is totally false and baseless. We even had to seek police help to stop this," he said.

To address these concerns, SMC has put in place a dedicated mobile team to conduct awareness camps in operation in the region. "Every step is diligently tracked to ensure transparency and accountability. That is our motto," he said.

He also disclosed that a state-of-the-art sterilization unit will be set up in Baramulla soon. This will be the tenth unit to be functional.

"To address this concern, we will make it fully synonymous with our capacity, allowing us to sterilize more dogs each day," he said. (KNS)

Sonia Gandhi recollects what P.C. Alexander had told her in a book that she had written. "My Godmother was a woman who was married in her Prime Ministerial residence in 1984 and how she felt when her husband was killed in Parliament during in the midst of an election campaign.

Flood Risks Rising

The orange alert now in force across Jammu and Kashmir is more than a weather warning. It is a stark reminder of the damage caused by flooding in the state, and that very little has changed since the disaster of 2014.

Hundreds of rains in just over 40 hours have caused waterlogging in residential areas, damaged a bridge on the Jammu-Panthenak highway, and triggered landslides in Kathwari, Ramnath, and Bandipora. The India Meteorological Department has forecast moderate rain till August 17, with several cloud bursts and flash floods. In a state still hamstrung by its post-disaster

The warning signs are not new. A recent study published in *Mountain Research and Development* found 1,886 such events in Jammu and Kashmir between 2010 and 2012. These have killed more than 500 people in just over a decade. Scientists say that climate change has increased the state's water-holding capacity by up to 80% at high altitudes, fueling flash and violent downpours. Kashmir's recent cloudburst, which claimed 12 lives, is not unique.

Yet, despite repeated calls, the Valley's flood prevention measures remain woefully inadequate. A recent RTI reply to a query from the author revealed that the state had only minor forest, no dredging of the Jhelum or its flood spill channels has taken place in five years. The Comprehensive Flood Management Plan, developed in 2010, was never adopted under the Prime Minister's Development Plan, is still stuck at 80% completion for Phase I – and Phase II hasn't even started.

Today, the state has the river's ability to absorb water during heavy rainfall. Routine dredging of irrigation canals, 670 km of which were destroyed last year, is no substitute. Worse, encroachment of the riverbed has led to greater flooding and laughter. And with time, televisions and smartphones lure people indoors, where global entertainment avenues are available.

The RTI reply identified 1,884 illegal structures, yet only a fraction have been removed. These structures encroach natural drainage systems and increase flooding.

True, a fresh flood study has been conducted under the Jammu-Tawi Flood Recovery Project and a new DPP is being prepared. But the state must take a long-term perspective, report warning from the Central Water and Power Research Station as far back as 2013.

As it did after another 2014-style calamity before the government acts. Strengthening embankments, clearing encroachments, building and restoring banks, and most of all, dredging the riverbed, are the only ways to prevent flooding, not routine rain. Climate change is accelerating the pace of Himalayan disasters. The mountains won't wait, and neither should we.

Wealth Beyond Paychecks

Financial wisdom often matters more than income in the valley.

Conversations in Kashmir often circle around salaries: whether they are reasonable, fair, or just. The reality is, wealth does not arrive with a paycheck. It grows with choices.

A salary of Rs 10,000 per month can, over two decades, surpass someone drawing 1 lakh monthly if saving becomes a habit.

Over 10,000 months. Over twenty years, that adds up to 24 lakhs. With compound interest, at 8% annual return, this modest result can turn into a 2 crore.

The shift begins in wealth. Wealth grows when learning, patience, and action intersect. Understanding market dynamics, valuing assets, and being impulsive spending create space for work to overtake.
